POSTGAME NOTES SEPTEMBER 12, 2015 GAME 2: VS. TOLEDO

TEAM NOTES

- Before Toledo's touchdown in the first quarter, Arkansas had held opponents scoreless in the first quarter in seven consecutive games.
- Eight different Razorbacks had a reception. Six different players caught a pass in Arkansas' first game of the season vs. UTEP.
- Had a drive of 21 plays and 73 yards that elapsed 10:39 in the second half that led to a 25-yard field goal by Cole Hedlund. It's the longest drive of the season so far, and is longer than any other drive in the 2014 in terms of plays (17-Downs at Mississippi State) and time elapsed (9:10-End of Half at Texas Tech).
- When Toledo punter Nick Ellis deliberately ran out of the end zone in the fourth quarter, it marked the first time Arkansas has scored on a safety since Jerry Franklin at Ole Miss in 2011.
- Bret Bielema-coached teams are now 55-7 when holding opponents to 20 or fewer points.

QB BRANDON ALLEN

- Completed his first seven passes of the game.
- Streak of pass attempts without an interception was broken at 134, it was the second such streak of 100+ passes in his career.
- Threw for a career high 412 yards. After not throwing for 300+ yards in his first 29 games, he has now done so in the first two games of the season.
- 412 passing yards is the third-highest mark in program history. Only behind Tyler Wilson's 510-yard performance vs. Texas A&M in 2011 and Wilson's 419-yard performance vs. Rutgers in 2012
- With 32 completions on 53 attempts, he set new career highs in both (previous career highs were 28 completions on 45 attempts vs. Georgia last year).
- 32 completions in a game is tied for the most in program history, done once by Tyler Wilson vs. Mississippi State in 2011
- 53 passing attempts in a game is the second-most in program history. Tyler Wilson had 59 attempts at Texas A&M in 2012.

RB ALEX COLLINS

- With his 21-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter, he now has a run of 10+ yards in 24-of-27 career games, and a total of 72 in that span.
- With his 21-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter, he now has a run of 20+ yards in 9-of-10 career September games.
- Scored his 18th career rushing touchdown.

WR CODY HOLLISTER

- His 22-yard reception from Brandon Allen in the first quarter was a career-long.
- With four catches for 65 yards, he set a career high in receptions and yardage (previous career bests were three catches vs. Northern Illinois and 36 yards vs. UAB last year).

WR KEON HATCHER

Has caught a reception for a first down in 19 consecutive games dating back to 2013.

- Pulled in seven receptions to tie a career high (previously done twice, at Mississippi State in 2014 and at LSU in 2013).
- Has caught six passes in back-to-back games after doing so only three times in his first 33 career games.

WR DREW MORGAN

• With five catches for 77 yards, he set a career high in receptions and yardage (previous career bests were three catches for 51 yards at Mississippi State last year).

TE HUNTER HENRY

• With eight catches for 117 yards, he set a career high in receptions and yardage (previous career bests were seven catches for 110 yards at Missouri last year).

OL DAN SKIPPER

• Blocked a 26-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter. He last blocked a field goal last season at Missouri and now has five career blocked kicks.

DB HENRE' TOLLIVER

- Led the team with eight total tackles, including five solo tackles. He also added a tackle for loss and a team-high two pass breakups. In Arkansas' first game of the season vs. UTEP, he led the team with four solo tackles.
