TEAM NOTES

ABOUT ARKANSAS

- Arkansas has equaled its best 13-game start during the tenure of sixth-year head coach Mike Anderson, as the Razorbacks own an 11-2 record.
- Anderson was the head coach at Missouri from 2006-11, so he and Rick Barnes were Big 12 Conference contemporaries for several seasons.
- In a preseason poll of SEC and national media, Arkansas was picked to finish fifth in the league.
- Arkansas lost its SEC opener, 81-72, at 25th-ranked Florida Thursday in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
- The Razorbacks have pulled down at least 10 offensive rebounds in 14 straight games, the longest streak under Anderson.
- Junior Razorbacks guard Jaylen Barford (9.6 ppg) is a native of Jackson, Tennessee, and played the previous two seasons at Motlow State Community College in Smyrna, Tennessee. Barford was a first-team All-American as a sophomore at Motlow State last year while playing for head coach J.T. Burton, who was Tennessee's director of player development during the 2014-15 season.
- Senior forward Moses Kingsley (11.4 ppg, 8.7 rpg, 3.0 bpg) was selected as the preseason SEC Player of the Year and is projected to be a second-round NBA Draft pick by NBAdraft.net. He is the SEC's active leader with 20 double-doubles in his career.
- Senior guard Dusty Hannahs (14.6 ppg, .368 3FG%), who began his career at Texas Tech and is in his second season with the Hogs, is on pace to break the Arkansas school record for 3-point field-goal percentage in a career.

FAST BREAK

Senior guard **Robert Hubbs III** is on pace to become the 48th all-time member of Tennessee's 1,000-Point Club. He is currently 199 points shy of 1,000.

MEMORABLE VOL PERFORMANCES AGAINST ARKANSAS

- Bristol, Tennessee, native Bobby Hogsett scored eight points and added 10 rebounds as Tennessee won its first-ever game against Arkansas, 77-57, on Dec. 27, 1963, in Shreveport, Louisiana.
- Before 21,237 Orange-clad fans, UT knocked off Nolan Richardson's fifth-ranked Razorbacks 83-81 in Knoxville on Feb. 5, 1992. Lang Wiseman and Allan Houston both scored 26 points.
- The Vols upset No. 13 Arkansas in Fayetteville, 101-91, on Feb. 16, 1993, thanks to a double-double by LaMarcus Golden (22 points, 11 rebounds).
- Cleveland, Tenn., native JaJuan Smith dropped 32 points on the Hogs during a 93-71 win over Arkansas in Knoxville on Feb. 5, 2008.
- Jordan McRae powered Tennessee to an 81-74 win over Arkansas on Jan. 22, 2014, exploding for 34 points—including UT's final 13—at Thompson-Boling Arena.

LAST MEETING WITH ARKANSAS

- A fourth straight double-digit scoring performance from now-departed senior Armani Moore wasn't enough as Tennessee fell to Arkansas, 75-65, Feb. 27, 2016, at Thompson-Boling Arena
- Moore led the Volunteers with 17 points and 11 rebounds for his sixth double-double of the season.
 Admiral Schofield scored 15 points, while Shembari Phillips scored 13.
- The Vols, who played without the services of two of their three leading scorers in Kevin Punter Jr. and Robert Hubbs III, trailed by just a point at halftime, 34-33. UT scored the first four points of second half to seize a three-point lead, but a 3-pointer from Jabril Durham tied the game at 37-37 with 18:00 remaining and the Vols would not lead again.
- Arkansas did not lead by more than 11 points in the game, but despite a consistent fight in the final minutes, UT could draw no closer than seven points as the Razorbacks closed it out.
- UT dominated the boards, out-rebounding Arkansas, 42-33, and controlled points in the paint, 34-26.
- Moore became the 38th Vol ever to log at least 10 career double-doubles.
- Dusty Hannahs led Arkansas with 17 points, making 3-of-4 from beyond the arc. Anthlon Bell added 16 points, and Anton Beard had 11, in the Hogs victory.

TENNESSEE IN SEC HOME OPENERS

- The Volunteers 16-13 in SEC home openers at Thompson-Boling Arena and 5-5 in their last 10.
- The Vols had dropped three straight SEC home openers—falling to Alabama, Texas A&M and Ole Miss in 2015, 2014 and 2013, respectively—before dismantling Florida, 83-69, in last season's SEC home-opener on Jan. 6, 2016.
- This is the first time Tennessee's first home SEC game has come against Arkansas.

VOLS PICKED 13th IN SEC

- Tennessee was predicted to finish 13th in the 2017 SEC race by an SEC and national media voting panel.
- The Volunteers posted a 6-12 SEC record to finish 12th a season ago.

MOSTELLA PREFERS BENCH ROLE

- Junior wing **Detrick Mostella**, the Dec. 26 SEC Player of the Week, is one of only three upperclassmen on this year's Tennessee roster, but he prefers to make use of his experience while coming off the bench rather than as a member of UT's starting lineup.
- Mostella is UT's third-leading scorer at 10.2 ppg, and he has come off the bench to score in double figures seven times this season, including a pair of 20-point games).
- The Decatur, Alabama, native scored a career-high 25 points to carry the Vols to victory at ETSU Dec. 22, including a stretch of 13 straight points during a 2:33 span at the end of the first half.
- Over the last three games, Mostella is averaging 18.3 points and 3.7 rebounds while shooting .432 from the field, .346 from 3-point range and 100 percent from the free-throw line (8-8).

TENNESSEE PLAYING AT LEAST 20 GAMES IN-STATE THIS SEASON

- The Vols will play at least 20 games in the state of Tennessee this season (that includes at least one game at the SEC Tournament).
- Tuesday's Arkansas game in Knoxville will be UT's ninth in-state game of the year. The Vols are 6-2 in The Volunteer State thus far.

VOLS CLAMP DOWN ON DEFENSE TO WIN AT TEXAS A&M

- All-in, team defense powered Tennessee to a 10-point win in its SEC opener at Texas A&M Thursday.
- A&M entered the game ranked second in the SEC in field-goal percentage (.481), but Tennessee limited the Aggies to just .344 (21-of-61) shooting from the field—their lowest of the season. Twelve of A&M's 21 made field goals came from just two players, as D.J. Hogg's game-high 21 points came on 7-of-13 shooting and Admon Gilder's 14 came on 5-of-13 shooting.
- UT also forced 16 Texas A&M turnovers—the most committed by the Aggies in a game this season.
- The undersized Vols logged 10 blocks against only two for the Aggies, and UT freshman Grant Williams tied Tennessee's single-game record with six blocked shots.
- Aggies' center Tyler Davis entered the game leading A&M in scoring (15.1 ppg), and Tennessee held him to six points. Davis had just two points on 1-of-5 shooting in the first half, and he didn't score his final four points until the final four minutes of the game.

ALEXANDER EXHIBITING OFFENSIVE DEVELOPMENT

- Sophomore forward **Kyle Alexander** proved himself as a reliable rim-protector last season. This year, he is showing growth offensively.
- The soft-spoken Canadian is on pace to score 118 points this season, which would more than double his offensive output from a year ago (53 points).
- Alexander has started each of the last two games both Tennessee wins.

PARKER PROVIDING EFFICIENT MINUTES

- True freshman guard **Kwe Parker** is averaging 12.2 minutes off the bench in Tennessee's last five games.
- The Vols are 4-1 in that span, during which Parker has 11 assists and just one turnover.

BOWDEN VALUING THE BALL

- Freshman shooting guard Jordan Bowden—who earned an SEC Freshman of the Week award last month—owns a 1.50 assist-to-turnover ratio on the year. But over UT's last seven games he has taken even better care of the basketball.
- Bowden has committed just two turnovers in his last 162 minutes played, spanning the last eight games.

- Vols freshman Grant Williams said after UT's win at Texas A&M on Dec. 29 that one of the players he tries to emulate is Golden State Warriors' forward Draymond Green.
- Green and Williams both were rated by Rivals.com as three-star prospects. According to ESPN, Green was the nation's No. 21 power forward prospect in 2007, while Williams was the nation's No. 26 power forward in 2016.

THIS YEAR'S VOLS GETTING IT DONE WITHOUT "VOLUME" GUYS

- Lacking "volume shooters" and "volume scorers" but long on balance, Tennessee has seven players averaging at least 7.0 points per game.
- Returning leading scorer Robert Hubbs III leads the Vols in field-goal attempts, but he is only taking 11.2 shots per game (making 51 percent of them).
- No Vol has attempted 20 shots in a game this year.
- UT's scoring offense of 78.7 ppg ranks sixth in the SEC, and the Vols have scored 90+ points four times.
- UT is shooting .446 as a team through 13 games.

TENNESSEE'S FIVE LOSSES HAVE COME VS. TOP-25 CALIBER TEAMS

- The five teams that have defeated Tennessee this season combine to boast a 61-11 (.847) record.
- Chattanooga is 10-3 and was picked to repeat as the Southern Conference champion.
- Wisconsin is 12-2 and ranked 14th in the AP poll.
- Oregon is 13-2 and ranked 21st in the AP poll.
- UNC is 12-4 and ranked ninth in the AP poll.
- Gonzaga is 14-0 and ranked seventh in the AP poll.

TENNESSEE HAS ALREADY FACED FOUR TOP-20 OPPONENTS

- By the time the Vols had played their 11th game this season, they had already faced four top-20 teams.
- The Big Orange had good showings in losses to then-16th-ranked Wisconsin and then-13th-ranked Oregon (overtime) in November in Maui. Tennessee then led for more than 32 minutes at seventhranked North Carolina on Dec. 11 before falling 73-71.
- Most recently, the Vols dropped an 86-76 neutralsite game to unbeaten and then-eighth-ranked Gonzaga in Nashville on Dec. 18.
- Based on the current AP poll, Tennessee stands to potentially play at least three more games against ranked teams this season.

- Freshman point guard Jordan Bone returned to action Dec. 29 at Texas A&M after missing nine straight games with a stress fracture in his left foot.
- Prior to his injury—suffered during UT's first practice at the Maui Invitational—Bone appeared in the Vols' first three games, starting the first two.
- Bone recorded one assist in eight minutes off the bench at Texas A&M.
- When Bone was injured, point guard minutes were split between sophomore Shembari Phillips and freshmen Lamonté Turner and Kwe Parker.

VOLS RANKED 27th IN FT SHOOTING

- Tennessee ranks 27th among Division I teams (third in the SEC) with a .758 free-throw percentage.
- Among Vols with at least two attempts per game, four are shooting at least 79 percent.
- Jordan Bowden (.941), Robert Hubbs III (.889) and Lamonté Turner (.864) are the team's top free-throw shooters in terms of percentage.

BOOST FROM THE BENCH

- As head coach Rick Barnes predicted in the preseason, Tennessee's depth has proven to be a strength of this year's team.
- Through 12 contests, Tennessee's bench is averaging 30.7 points per game. The Vols' reserves are outscoring the opponents' reserves by 12.7 points per game, and the UT bench has accounted for more than 40 points in a game three times.
- A Vol has come off the bench to score in double figures 14 times, and eight different Vols are playing at least 16 minutes per game.

Tennessee has produced four of the top 10 all-time scorers in SEC history: **Allan Houston** (No. 2; 2,801 points), **Ernie Grunfeld** (No. 5; 2,249 points), **Tony White** (No. 6; 2,219 points) and **Chris Lofton** (No. 10; 2,131 points).

30-POINT NIGHT FOR WILLIAMS

- Freshman forward Grant Williams erupted for 30 points, six rebounds and a pair of blocks in UT's come-from-behind victory over Lipscomb Dec. 15.
- It was the highest points total by a Vol this season and made Williams the first UT freshman to drop 30 in a game since All-American **Chris Lofton** scored 30 at Arkansas on Feb. 26, 2005.
- Williams' 30-point game stands tied as the thirdhighest scoring total by an SEC player this season.

20-POINT GAMES BY FRESHMEN

- Tennessee has had <u>four</u> different freshmen score at least 20 points in a game this season. And it took only 10 games for that to happen.
- Media Relations staffers are researching the last time a Tennessee team had four different freshmen produce 20-point outings in season. A partial check of the archives shows it has not been done through the early 1980s (it's likely to never have happened).

HUBBS' EFFICIENCY ON FLEEK

- \bullet Had to work "fleek" into the game notes somehow.
- Through 13 games, senior Robert Hubbs III ranks seventh in the SEC in field-goal percentage, shooting .514 (75-of-146) for the season.
- Aiding Hubbs' cause on the scoring front has been his oustanding free-throw percentage. Hubbs ranks fifth in the SEC at the foul line (.889) and has missed just five freebies (40-of-45) this season.

ALEXANDER AN NABC GOOD WORKS TEAM CANDIDATE

- Sophomore forward **Kyle Alexander** is a candidate for the 2017 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- The team recognizes players whose charitable involvement and altruistic acts stand out amongst all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

FULKERSON ON THE SHELF

- After starting six straight games for the Vols and emerging as one of the team's top rebounders, freshman forward John Fulkerson saw his promising rookie season interrupted by injury.
- Early in Tennessee's win over Lipscomb Dec.
 15, Fulkerson suffered a dislocated elbow while attempting to take a charge. Two days later, it was estimated that he would be out for a minimum of six weeks.
- Fulkerson came off the bench to make a significant impact during his season-high 37 minutes vs. 13thranked Oregon in Maui. The Kingsport, Tennessee, native logged 12 points, 10 rebounds, five blocks and a pair of steals. That earned him a spot in the starting lineup, which he occupied until suffering the injury.

NINE EXPLOSIVE SCORERS

- What a difference a year can make. Last season, Tennessee entered the year with no players on its roster who had scored at least 20 points in a Division I game. Now the Vols have nine.
- The Vols entered this season with five different players who had done so—Lew Evans, Robert Hubbs III, Detrick Mostella, Shembari Phillips and Admiral Schofield.
- And just 10 games into Rick Barnes' second season on Rocky Top, four Vols freshmen already had 20-point games to their credit—Jordan Bone (21 vs. Chattanooga), Jordan Bowden (21 vs. Presbyterian), Lamonté Turner (24 vs. Presbyterian) and Grant Williams (30 vs. Lipscomb).

TENNESSEE AMONG YOUNGEST, SMALLEST TEAMS IN DIVISION I

- According to statistical analyst Ken Pomeroy (Ken. Pom.com), Tennessee ranks 331 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in terms of roster experience. Pomeroy's calculation weights the experience of each player on the roster based on minutes played. If seniors play many minutes for a team, that team's experience rank climbs.
- Through 13 games, freshmen have accounted for 45.6 percent of Tennessee's minutes played.
- In terms of under- and upperclassmen, this is the youngest Tennessee team in 20 years. Kevin O'Neill's 1996-97 Vols had only three upperclassmen, just like this current UT squad.
- Pomeroy also ranks teams based on average roster height, and the Vols land at 297 out of 351 teams (shortest in the SEC) with an average height of 75.9 inches (6-3).

ALEXANDER GIVES VOLS CANADIAN CONNECTION

- Forward Kyle Alexander last season became just the second Canadian ever to letter for the Vols (joining Hamilton, Ontario, native Bobby Croft, 1967-70).
- Alexander appeared in 32 games for the Vols last season, with 11 starts. He ranked second on the team with 31 total blocked shots.
- This season, Alexander has twice set new careerhighs for scoring, with seven points against Chattanooga (11/11) and 13 vs. App State (11/15).
- Rick Barnes boasts an impressive history of signing and developing Canadian standouts, including Cory Joseph (Toronto; now plays for the Toronto Raptors), Myck Kabongo (Toronto; now plays in the NBA D-League) and Tristan Thompson (Brampton, Ontario; now plays for the Cleveland Cavaliers).

JOHNSON, FLESCHMAN TO REDSHIRT

- Tennessee coach Rick Barnes announced during his postgame press conference on Nov. 15 that true freshmen Jalen Johnson and Jacob Fleschman will redshirt this season.
- Johnson is guard with great length and athleticism, but he needs to add strength. Fleschman is a walkon guard whose strength is his shooting.
- Barnes said of Johnson: "Lamonté Turner told me he thought the best thing that happened to him was to sit out (last season). So we think it's going to be a good thing for Jalen because we think he has a great future."

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

- Tennessee's roster features six players who won at least one state championship during their respective high school careers. And those six Vols combine to boast a total of eight state championship rings.
- Freshmen Jordan Bone and Jalen Johnson each won a pair of state titles during their prep careers. Vols with a single state title under their belt are: Lew Evans, Kwe Parker, Shembari Phillips and Grant Williams.
- Robert Hubbs III and Lamonté Turner each played in at least one state championship game during their prep career, but neither player's team captured a title.

6-9 FORWARD ZACH KENT SIGNS

- 6-9 forward **Zach Kent** signed with the Vols Nov. 9. He plans to enroll at UT next summer and pursue a degree in Communications. He will be a freshman for the Volunteers in 2017-18.
- A native of Magnolia, Delaware, Kent is currently a senior at Blair Academy in Blairstown, New Jersey.
- Prior to this year, Kent attended St. Andrew's School in Middleton, Delaware. As a junior there in 2015-16, Kent earned All-Conference and third-team All-State honors after averaging 17 points and nine rebounds per game.
- He will become the first Delaware native ever to suit up for the Vols.

EVANS BRINGS NCAA EXPERIENCE

- The summer addition of graduate transfer forward Lew Evans not only gave this Tennessee roster a much-needed boost in size, it also gave the Vols' locker room a presence with some NCAA Tournament experience.
- As a sophomore in 2013-14, Evans started 22 games for a Tulsa squad that exceeded 20 wins, captured the Conference USA crown and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where it fell to UCLA.
- "That experience was awesome," Evans said. "The game before ours was Stephen F. Austin against VCU. When SFA hit a buzzer-beater to go into overtime, that place was rocking. Right after that, we played UCLA in San Diego, so the whole crowd of 10,000 was against us. The whole thing from start to finish was awesome"
- Vols senior Robert Hubbs III was a true freshman when UT advanced all the way from the First Four to the Sweet Sixteen in 2014. But he had seasonending shoulder surgery in January and was unable to play in any of UT's four NCAA Tournament games.

VOLS IN THE NBA

- Tennessee alums enjoyed a noteworthy presence in the NBA during the 2015-16 season—highlighted by Jordan McRae (2010-14) winning an NBA Championship with the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- McRae made 17 appearances for the Cavs and also played in seven games with the Phoenix Suns last season. His regular-season averages included 4.5 points and 1.1 assists in 8.9 minutes per game. He shot .436 overall and .455 from 3-point range.
- Miami Heat guard Josh Richardson had a spectacular rookie campaign, playing a key role on Miami's run to the Eastern Conference semifinals. In 52 regularseason appearances, Richardson averaged 6.6 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 21.3 minutes per game. After the All-Star break, he led the entire NBA in 3-point percentage (.589), and he was named the NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for March.
- · Midway through his fifth NBA season, forward **Tobias Harris** was traded from the Orlando Magic to the Detroit Pistons, playing a starting role as Detroit surged into the playoffs. In 76 regular-season appearances (with both Orlando and Detroit), Harris averaged 14.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 33.1 minutes per game.
- · Point guard C.J. Watson completed his ninth NBA season as a member of the Orlando Magic. An injury limited him to just 33 appearances, during which he averaged 4.3 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists in 19.9 minutes per game.
- 2014 NBA Draft pick Jarnell Stokes, who has spent time with the Memphis Grizzlies and the Miami Heat during his first two professional seasons, made the Denver Nuggets roster out of training camp. He was waived however, on Nov. 15. Stokes was the 2016 NBA D-League MVP and also was selected as the D-League finals MVP after leading the Sioux Falls Skyforce to the league championship.
- A pair of Tennessee alums continue lengthy tenures as NBA front-office executives in 2016-17. Washington Wizards President Ernie Grunfeld completed his 13th season as the team's top executive. And New York Knicks Assistant General Manager Allan Houston continues to play a key insider's role in the resurgence of that storied franchise.

BARNES BEAT THREE MAJOR RIVALS IN FIRST SEASON WITH VOLS

Hoops a Priority on Rocky Top

The University of Tennessee has invested more than \$40 million into its basketball facilities since the end of the 2006-07 campaign.

Prior to the 2007-08 season, UT added a basketball-only practice facility and began the first phase of renovations to Thompson-Boling Arena.

The \$19 million first phase of renovations included the addition of 32 luxury suites that are located in the existing north balcony, a loge area just below the luxury suites that includes 166 side court seats, new seats for the entire arena, a \$3 million center-hung scoreboard and concourse refurbishments, such as graphics and other amenities.

The Vols' state-of-the-art basketball practice facility, Pratt Pavilion, houses two full-size gymnasiums, one for each of the men's and women's basketball teams, as well as an athletic training room, weight room and film-study room.

The athletic department renovated the men's and women's basketball offices at the arena during the 2010-11 campaign, creating a new and impressive "front door" for the basketball programs.

New to Thompson-Boling Arena in 2013-14 was the 360-degree LED ribbon board that runs along the bottom of the upper deck.

And in March of 2014, TBA became the third college arena to install an LED lighting system (joining Arizona State and Notre Dame).

- Rick Barnes' commitment to his players' academic achievement cannot be overstated. His teams have posted a perfect 1,000 score in five of the last six multi-year APR reports as well as perfect singleyear APR scores every year from 2005-06 through 2014-15.
- A total of 31 Tennessee men's basketball players have graduated in the last eight years. Those players are: Devon Baulkman, Josh Bone, Galen Campbell, Quinn Cannington, Quinton Chievous, Ryan Childress, Wayne Chism, D'Montre Edwards, John Fields, Melvin Goins, Kenny Hall, Tony Harris, Michael Hubert, Justin Jackson, Chris Lofton, Brandon Lopez, Jeronne Maymon, Skylar McBee, Jordan McRae, Dwight Miller, Armani Moore, Rob Murphy, Steven Pearl, J.P. Prince, Kevin Punter Jr., Josh Richardson, Tyler Summitt, Cameron Tatum, C.J. Watson, Tanner Wild and Renaldo Woolridge.
- Of those 31 graduates in the last eight years, 19 went on to sign professional basketball contracts and two have gone into coaching.

FOUR WEARING VOLSCHOLAR PATCH

- Four Vols have earned the privilege of wearing a "VOLScholar" patch on their game jersey: Kyle Alexander, Shembari Phillips, Lamonté Turner and Brad Woodson
- To be eligible to wear the patch, Tennessee studentathletes must achieve a 3.0 GPA in either of the two previous semesters, or they must own a cumulative 3.0 GPA (freshmen are not eligible for the patch).

LANIER GIVES VOLS ADDITIONAL HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

- **Rick Barnes** isn't the only person on Tennessee's bench with Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach Rob Lanier was the head coach at Siena from 2001-05.
- During that span, the Saints posted a 58-70 mark, and advanced to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT.
- Under Lanier, Siena also won the 2002 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament Championship.

USELESS (BUT INTERESTING) INFO

- Junior guard **Detrick Mostella** has the smallest shoe size on the team, as he wears a 10.5.
- Tennessee's student manager team rose as high as No. 6 in last year's national KPI rankings (KPIsports. net) and advanced to the Final Four in Houston where it fell to Michigan State. Kansas and Iowa State were the other two Final Four participants.
- At the "real" Final Four in Houston in 2011, Rick Barnes received the USBWA's "Good Guy Award" for coaching excellence and for cooperation with the media.

- Tennessee will make its second appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament next season. The 2017 field includes the Vols, Arizona, NC State, Northern lowa, Purdue, SMU, Villanova and Western Kentucky.
- The Battle 4 Atlantis takes place at the Atlantis Resort on Paradise Island, Bahamas.
- In Atlantis in 2013, Tennessee dropped its opening game to UTEP before bouncing back to defeat Xavier and Wake Forest.

TENNESSEE A.D. HART A TRUE BASKETBALL MAN

- Tennessee Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart is a true "basketball man," as he played collegiately at Alabama.
- A 1971 Alabama graduate, Hart played under legendary head coach C.M. Newton and earned a master's degree from UA in 1972 while working as a graduate assistant basketball coach.
- Hart is the only AD in the SEC who was a college basketball player.

STRENGTH COACH MEDENWALD WAS A TWO-SPORT STANDOUT

- Vols strength and conditioning coach Garrett Medenwald has an impressive history as a twosport collegiate student-athlete.
- At Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point, he was an outfielder for the baseball team, which won the Midwest Regional and finished fifth at the 2010 NCAA Division III College World Series.
- As a football running back at Division III Wisconsin-Whitewater, he helped lead the Warhawks to backto-back national championships in 2010 and 2011.
- Medenwald finished his football career at Whitewater holding several program weight room records in cleans, snatch, split jerk, bench press, pro agility, broad jump, vertical jump and 40-yard dash.
- Also an elite powerlifter, Medenwald was a national qualifier in Olympic weightlifting.

VOLS LOOKING TO EXTEND STREAK OF TOP-20 ATTENDANCE

- Tennessee finished 17th nationally in average regular-season home attendance last year, drawing an average of 14,233 fans to 16 games at Thompson-Boling Arena.
- The Vols have ranked among the top 20 in men's college basketball attendance for 12 consecutive years, including six of those seasons ranked in the top five nationally.

Robert Hubbs III led six players in double figures with 16 points as the Volunteers eclipsed the century mark in points for the first time since a 104-84 win against Memphis in 2011 Redshirt freshman guard Lamonté Turner scored 13 of his career-high 15 points in the second half and was one of five UT players to set career-highs in scoring. UT shot 56 percent (35-of-63) from the floor, including a 42 percent (8-of-19) clip from long distance.

 The Big Orange also passed the ball well throughout the game, recording 26 assists, their most since dishing out 26 helpers against North Carolina A&T on Dec. 23, 2009.

• Freshman guard Jordan Bone led the Vols with eight assists while also chipping in seven points. Kyle Alexander also had a big game for UT, leading the team with seven rebounds

and scoring a career-high 13 points.

Freshman guard and Knoxville native Jordan Bowden made his first-career start and led the Vols with 12 points at the break on 4-of-7 shooting. All four of Bowden's made field goals came from beyond the arc as UT shot 50 percent (6-of-12) from 3-point range in the first half.

 App State outscored the Vols, 56-53. The Mountaineers went on a 23-7 run to cut the lead to seven with just under a minute to play before UT iced the game at the free-throw line. App State's Ronshad Shabazz and Isaac Johnson led all scorers with 21 points.

- After UNC scored the first four points of the game, the Vols went on a 27-9 run—at one point scoring on 10 consecutive possessions. The Big Orange shot 65 percent as a team in the first half and were 3-of-6 from beyond the 3-point arc.

 A career-high 25 points from Detrick Mostella led Tennessee to its first true road win of the season, a 72-68 victory over ETSU on Dec. 22, 2016, at Freedom Hall in Johnson City.

Robert Hubbs III also finished in double figures, scoring 11 for the Vols. UT also got a defensive boost from true freshman forward Grant Williams, who finished the game with

a game-high nine rebounds (seven defensive) and four blocks.

A tight one throughout, the Vols (7-5) and Buccaneers (9-3) battled through nine ties and 12 lead changes. Tennessee took its largest lead of the game at the halftime break leading 32-23 after Mostella reeled of 13 straight points over the final 2:33 of the first half.

Playing in front of a sell-out crowd at Freedom Hall, ETSU responded quickly after intermission. The Bucs hit five of their first six shot attempts, leveling the score at 36-36 before the half's first media timeout. Tennessee was able to stave off the push from the home team, responding with layups from New Parker and Lew Evans to push the lead back to two posses-sions. That advantage would grow to as many as seven when Mostella hit yet another jumper to situate things at 51-44 near the 12-minute mark.

Refusing to go away, ETSU scored 11 of the game's next 15 points and took its first lead of the second half at 55-54 with nine minutes remaining.

The lead teeter-tottered from there, with neither side gaining more than a two-point ad-

vantage until Mostella broke a 65-65 deadlock with two free throws and then a pull-up jumper with 29 seconds to play. Mostella's final points, coupled with some strong defen-sive possessions down the stretch for the Vols, proved enough to settle the in-state battle.


