THREE POINTERS

► Oklahoma heads west to Portland, Ore., for PK80 - an early-season tournament honoring the 80th birthday of Nike co-founder Phil Knight. The Sooners are one of 16 prestigious Nike schools competing in the event. The field combines for 23 national titles, 89 Final Four appearances and 391 NCAA Tournament invitations. OU is 14-5 during in-season tournament games under **Lon Kruger**, having won at least two games and finishing in third place or better in all six previous in-season tournaments under Kruger.

► OU's offense has lit up opponents in its first pair of games, defeating Omaha and Ball State by an average margin of 29.0 points. Oklahoma's 108.0 points per game are the second-highest in the nation. The Sooners also rank fifth in assists (23.0), eighth in field-goal percentage (.563) and eighth in rebounds (47.5).

► Freshman guard **Trae Young** leads the country in assists with 11.5 per contest. Only two games into his collegiate career, Young has already piled on Big 12 Player of the Week (Nov. 13) and Big 12 Newcomer of the Week (Nov. 20) honors. With a pair of double-doubles in both of Oklahoma's games, Young is the first Sooner to record consecutive points-assists double-doubles since John Ontjes in the 1994-95 season.

GAME OVERVIEW

Oklahoma (2-0) brings one of the nation's highest-scoring offenses to Portland, Ore., to open play in PK80 against **Arkansas (3-0)** on Thanksgiving Day at 4 p.m. CT. The matchup could see high-scoring efforts from both teams with Oklahoma (108.0) and Arkansas (93.0) boasting strong offensive numbers early in the season. The Sooners are 3-0 when playing on Thanksgiving Day under head coach **Lon Kruger** and are 6-0 in the opening round of early in-season tournaments during the Kruger era. The opening round game will be played inside Moda Center - home of the NBA's Portland Trail Blazers. The Blazers are coached by OU alum Terry Stotts, who ranks 34th in career points at Oklahoma with 1,104 (1976-80). Thursday's matchup will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KRXO 107.7 FM "The Franchise" in Oklahoma City; KTBZ 1430 AM in Tulsa) with **Toby Rowland** and **Kevin Henry** announcing. The game will be televised by ESPN2 with **Roxy Bernstein** and **Bill Walton** calling the action.

OKLAHOMA VS. ARKANSAS SERIES HISTORY

► Arkansas leads the overall series 15-12, but Oklahoma has won seven of the last 10 meetings (dating back to 1998). The Sooners are 1-1 against the Hogs during the Lon Kruger era, with the home team winning each of the contests.

► The Sooners and Razorbacks have met three times on a neutral court, most recently at the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, in 1994. Arkansas is 3-0 in the previous neutral-site meetings.

► Oklahoma is 8-7 against current SEC teams in the Lon Kruger era, including 6-3 against schools which were SEC members at the time of competition.

► Oklahoma reached triple-digits for the second straight game as it defeated Ball State, 108-69, on Wednesday at Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners, who are coming off a 108-89 season-opening win against Omaha, scored over 100 points in the first two games of the season for just the second time in program history.

► The Sooners were led by freshman guard Trae Young, who put together his second double-double in as many games. Young scored 22 points on 7-of-15 shooting (5-of-10 from 3-point range) while dishing out 13 assists. Young's 13 dimes tied the OU freshman record for assists in a game (Tim McAlister in 1984) and were the most by a Sooner since Terrell Everett served up 15 in 2006.

► Senior forward Khadeem Lattin scored a career-high 20 points on 9-of-10 shooting to go with eight rebounds in 20 minutes. The Sooners' lone senior helped lead a barrage of scoring down low that was highlighted by 48 paint points.

► Freshman forward Brady Manek shot 4-of-5 from 3-point range (6-of-8 overall) to score 16 points in his second game as a Sooner. Manek has posted double-digit points in both of his first collegiate games.

► OU shot 42-of-74 (.568) from the field, sinking its most field goals since making 44 against Colorado on Feb. 21, 1996. The Sooners shot 15-of-29 (.517) from 3-point range - their most triples since making 16 on Jan. 23, 2016 versus Baylor.

NEXT UP: NORTH CAROLINA OR PORTLAND

► Oklahoma continues play in Portland with the second round of PK80. The Sooners will play either North Carolina or Portland in the tournament's second round across the street at Veterans Memorial Coliseum.

► OU is 0-3 against North Carolina, with all three meetings coming on a neutral court. In their most recent two meetings, the Tar Heels eliminated the Sooners from the NCAA Tournament with an Elite Eight win in 2009 and a second-round victory in 1990. The lone regular-season contest between OU and UNC came at the 1982 Rainbow Classic in Hawaii.

► Should the Sooners and Tar Heels meet, it will be the first time OU has faced a defending NCAA champion in non-conference play since hosting and defeating Connecticut in 2004. Oklahoma is 6-8 all-time against defending champions and have won five of the last 10 such meetings.

► If Oklahoma faces Portland in the second round, it will be the first meeting between the two programs. The Sooners are 1-1 in the Lon Kruger era and 15-8 all-time against current members of the West Coast Conference.

► Of the 16 head coaches in the loaded PK80 field, Oklahoma's Lon Kruger and Portland's Terry Porter are the only two with experience as NBA head coaches. Kruger led the Atlanta Hawks in 2000-03 and Porter led the Milwaukee Bucks (2003-05) and Phoenix Suns (2008-08).

HOT START

► Oklahoma's offense has put together historic numbers through the first two games of the seasons, scoring 108 points in wins over Omaha (Nov. 12) and Ball State (Nov. 15). It's just the third time in program history that OU began a season with back-to-back games of at least 100 points. The Sooners' 216 combined points are their third-most through the first two games of the season and the most since a Billy Tubbs-led squad opened the season with 319 total points (not a typo) in the first two games of the 1989-90 campaign.

► OU has put up back-to-back games of triple-digit scoring for the first time since December 2001. It is just the third time since 1993 that the Sooners have put together consecutive 100-point showings.

► Through two games, Oklahoma is averaging 108.0 points, shooting .563 from the field and .426 from 3-point range while dishing out 23.0 assists per game (the Sooners never surpassed 21 assists in a game in 2016-17). OU's 108.0 points represent the third-highest scoring average in the country.

► The Sooners have scored at least 48 points in all four halves, including 60 points in the opening half against Ball State. Oklahoma failed to score 60 points in five games of the 2016-17 season.

► Oklahoma's offensive efforts have been led by the scoring and passing of freshman guard **Trae Young**. The Norman native has put together double-doubles in both games, averaging 18.5 points, 11.5 assists, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 blocks. Young is the first Oklahoma player to record consecutive points-assists double-doubles since John Ontjes in the 1994-95 season. The freshman is also the first Sooner to have multiple points-assists double-doubles in one season since Terrell Everett in 2005-06. He is one of only three freshmen in Division I to produce two double-doubles in his first two games of the 2017-18 season (Deandre Ayton of Arizona and Brandon McCoy of UNLV).

► As of Nov. 20, Young leads the nation with 11.5 assists per game. He is one of just three Division I players averaging double-digit assists. Since the 2010-11 season, Young boasts the fifth-most assists through two games (23) among all Division I players.

► Young's 13 dimes against Ball State tied an OU freshman record for assists in a game (Tim McAlister in 1984) and were the most by a Sooner since Terrell Everett served up 15 in 2006.

CONSISTENT KRUGER

► **Lon Kruger** has made his mark on the college basketball world as a master rebuild. Throughout his career, he has inherited struggling programs and taken them as far as the Final Four in a short number of years. While Kruger's turnarounds have traditionally occurred at new schools, the seventh-year head coach at Oklahoma now looks to continue his rebuilding success with his own program in Norman.

► Kruger's success at Oklahoma has been evident throughout the country, taking a Sooners team that went 27-36 (.429) in the two seasons prior to his arrival to reaching the Final Four just five years into the job. Since 2011, Kruger has racked up four NCAA Tournament appearances, coached three NBA Draft picks and a national player of the year (Buddy Hield) and was named the 2014 AP Big 12 Coach of the Year.

► Although a young Oklahoma team finished the 2016-17 season with an 11-20 record and missed the NCAA Tournament for the first time in five years, Kruger carries a track record of bouncing back throughout his career. Since 1986 (his first season as head coach at Kansas State), Kruger has never missed the postseason in consecutive seasons. Of the past six instances that Kruger failed to reach the postseason, five of his teams qualified for the NCAA Tournament the next year.

► Kruger's OU teams have surpassed their win total from each subsequent season in five of the last six years.

► Oklahoma was voted sixth in the Big 12 Conference's 2017-18 preseason poll. The Sooners have finished as well or better in the conference standings than predicted in four of the six seasons under Kruger.

GOING LOCAL

► Oklahoma has seen strong production from a pair of freshmen already known around the Norman area. Guard **Trae Young** (Norman) and forward **Brady Manek** (Harrah) are both local products with numerous high school accolades now in their first season as Sooners. Both local freshmen have scored in double figures in each game this season and are combining to average 32.0 points per contest.

► Attending high school less than three miles from the University of Oklahoma campus, Young is the first starter at OU to list Norman as his hometown since Steve Ayers in the 1967-68 season.

► In his first two collegiate games, Young has produced back-to-back double-doubles and is averaging 18.5 points, 11.5 assists, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 blocks. He has earned two Big 12 weekly honors in as many weeks, earning the conference's Player of the Week title in week one and Newcomer of the Week this past week. Young is just the second freshman in Big 12 history to be named the conference's Player of the Week in the opening week of the season, joining Michael Beasley of Kansas State in 2007.

► Young has been named to numerous preseason honors lists - including the Preseason Top 50 for the John R. Wooden Award and the 20-person watch list for the 2018 Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award. Young is also a Preseason All-Big 12 honorable mention selection.

► Named a five-star recruit according to 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, Young was named the second-best point guard in his national recruiting class by ESPN and third-best by 247Sports and Scout. Playing high school ball at Norman North HS, Young averaged 42.6 points, 4.1 assists and 5.8 rebounds during his senior year while shooting 48.9 percent from the field. He earned McDonald's All-America honors, becoming the fourth McDonald's All-American from Oklahoma to play for OU, joining Sooners legends Blake Griffin, Wayman Tisdale and Jeff Webster.

► Manek has also found success in his first two collegiate contests, putting together averages of 13.5 points and 5.5 rebounds while shooting 11-of-15 (.733) from the field and 5-of-8 (.625) from 3-point range.

► A four-star recruit according to 247Sports, ESPN and Scout and a three-star recruit by Rivals, Manek joined the Sooners from Harrah HS, a 35 mile drive from Norman. Manek averaged a double-double in his senior high school season with 24.3 points, 11.6 rebounds and 2.2 assists while shooting 47.1 percent from the field.

BACKCOURT WORTH WATCHING

► Oklahoma guards **Kameron McGusty** and **Trae Young** were voted by the Big 12 Conference's head coaches as Preseason All-Big 12 Team honorable mention selections. The Sooners were one of only two Big 12 teams with two guards on the conference's preseason honors list. The Sooners also hope to see junior **Christian James** continue his solid start in the early season.

► A sophomore from Katy, Texas, McGusty boasts the highest 2016-17 scoring average (10.9 points) among returning Sooners. The 6-5 guard upped his production to 14.4 points per game in Big 12 play last season - the fifth-most among all returning Big 12 players. McGusty's success in conference play was highlighted by 15 consecutive games of double-digit scoring. Following his rookie campaign, McGusty was named an All-Big 12 honorable mention and member of the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team. He is the first OU freshman to earn All-Big 12 honors and All-Newcomer status since Tommy Mason-Griffin in 2009-10.

► Coming off a summer that included shooting 12-of-13 (.923) from 3-point range during the team's trip to New Zealand and Australia, James is averaging 13.5 points through two games. James is working toward a bounce-back campaign after ending the 2016-17 season in a shooting slump. As a sophomore, James began the season averaging 11.3 points in his first 15 games, before scoring just 4.6 points per contest in the last 16 games.

LATTIN BLOCK PARTY

► For the second season in a row, senior forward **Khadeem Lattin** led the Big 12 in blocked shots per game during conference play. Lattin rejected 43 shots against Big 12 opponents (2.4 per game) in 2016-17, tying for first in the league with TCU's Vladimir Brodziansky. He is the fourth Big 12 player to lead in conference play block for back-to-back seasons.

► Lattin has proven himself as one of the top shot blockers in Oklahoma program history. In 104 career games for the Sooners, Lattin ranks fourth in the OU record book in career blocks with 177. With 66 total blocks in 2016-17, Lattin joined Stacey King and Wayman Tisdale as the only Sooners to produce multiple seasons of more than 60 blocked shots.

RASHARD RISING

► No returning Big 12 player saw a bigger increase in role last season than Oklahoma junior guard **Rashard Odomes**. After playing just 6.1 minutes per game in 18 contests of the 2015-16 season, Odomes averaged 26.8 minutes per game and started in 30 outings in 2016-17. His increase in minutes (20.7 per game) was by far the most in the Big 12. No other Big 12 returner averaged more than 16 additional minutes per game compared to their previous season.

► Offensively, Odomes averaged 1.9 points per game in 2015-16 before boosting his scoring to 10.1 points a night in 2016-17. He was the only returning Big 12 player to average under two points in 2015-16 and over 10 points in 2016-17. His increase in scoring (8.2 points per game) was the second-highest among any Big 12 returner.

► During his rookie season, Odomes totaled just 17 minutes in Big 12 games. His sophomore year, he started in 17 Big 12 contests and averaged 10.4 points, 5.2 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 1.9 steals in 28.8 minutes.

AP ASSOCIATED PRESS NAMES OKLAHOMA A TOP-20 ALL-TIME BASKETBALL PROGRAM

The Associated Press announced its All-Time Top 100 last spring, a ranking system to determine the top programs in men's college basketball since the AP poll began in 1949. Oklahoma ranked 20th in the All-Time Top 100 – the second highest of any team in the Big 12.

To determine the all-time Top 100, the AP formula counted poll appearances (one point each) to mark consistency and No. 1 rankings (two points each) to acknowledge elite programs. The AP doesn't release a poll after the NCAA Tournament, so eventual national champions are not factored into these rankings.

Below are numbers breaking down Oklahoma's history in the AP poll and the Sooners' place in the All-time Top 100.

► Oklahoma ranks second among Big 12 schools in the All-Time Top 100. Kansas (No. 5) is the only school in the conference ahead of the Sooners.

► Oklahoma's football program ranks second in the AP Football All-Time Top 100. OU is the only Big 12 school to finish in the top 20 of the All-Time Top 100 in both football and men's basketball.

► Of the four institutions from the state of Oklahoma listed in the All-Time Top 100, OU ranks the highest. Oklahoma State (34), Tulsa (83) and Oklahoma City (90) were also featured on the list.

► Since the mid-80s, the Sooners have appeared in a majority of all AP polls. Oklahoma has been voted a top-25 team in 55 percent of AP polls since the start of the 1984 season.

► The Sooners have gone nine seasons of being ranked in every AP poll of that season - most recently 2015-16 when Lon Kruger's squad was in the top 10 of every week's poll.

► Oklahoma has been ranked No. 1 in the country for a total of eight weeks, most recently claiming the top spot for three straight weeks in 2015-16. All eight No. 1 appearances have come since 1988.

► OU's best decade in the AP poll came in the 2000s, when the Sooners were ranked in 66.8 percent of that decade's polls.

► The Sooners have been ranked in 44 of the last 70 AP polls (57.1 percent), all under head coach Lon Kruger.

DOMINANCE DOWN UNDER

► Oklahoma's 2017-18 season started earlier – and much farther south – than normal as the Sooners headed to New Zealand and Australia for a foreign exhibition tour in August. The Sooners went 4-0 during their time Down Under, scoring 119.0 points per game and winning by an average margin of 40.0 points. The Sooners were led in scoring by **Trae Young** with 22.3 points per contest in 21.8 minutes.

► The Sooners collectively shot 50-of-117 (.427) from 3-point range, sinking an average of 12.5 treys a game. One of the keys to OU's 3-point barrage Down Under was guard **Christian James**. The junior was near unstoppable from behind the arc, shooting 12-of-13 (.923) during the trip and 10-for-10 in the final three games.

► Oklahoma pulled down 50.0 rebounds per game on the foreign tour - an average of 16.8 more boards than their opponents. Six players averaged at least four rebounds (while all playing under 21 minutes a game), led by **Rashard Odomes** with 7.3. **Khadeem Lattin**, **Jamuni McNeace** and **Brady Manek** all pulled down 5.3 boards per outing.

THEM BOYS UP TO SOMTHING...

► Jordan Brand continues to expand both on the court and on the field. On Nov. 9, 2017, the brand welcomed the University of Oklahoma to the family, making it just the fifth collegiate basketball program and third football program to represent the Jumpman. The Sooners' uniforms will begin to feature the Jumpman logo at the start of the 2018-19 season. The partnership will include the football team and the men's and women's basketball teams. Oklahoma will join Georgetown, Marquette, Michigan and North Carolina as the only schools to wear the Jumpman on its men's basketball uniforms.

► **Blake Griffin**, a long-time Jordan Brand family member, is a University of Oklahoma alum whose No. 23 jersey was recently honored by the university. Griffin was named the AP National Player of the Year in 2008-09 after averaging 22.7 points and 14.4 rebounds per game and leading the nation in rebounding and double-doubles. Griffin was on OU's campus the day of the announcement to tell the OU basketball team of the brand's new partnership and welcome the Sooners to the family.



GRIFFIN GIVES BACK

► The University of Oklahoma's athletics performance center at Lloyd Noble Center, which is expected to be completed in early 2018, will be named after former OU basketball player **Blake Griffin** in recognition of his financial gift, the largest ever to OU by a former Sooner basketball player. The Griffin Family Performance Center will be an 18,400-gross-square foot training center located just south of the men's and women's basketball's two existing practice gyms. The performance center will help enhance strength training facilities for both men's and women's programs, as well other Sooner student-athletes. Griffin was the 2009 consensus national player of the year and the No. 1 overall pick in that year's NBA Draft.

► Griffin on the Griffin Family Performance Center: "Being a Sooner is more than just what you do in competition. I am thankful to have had the opportunity to play OU basketball, which has a legacy of people that have made it great. College is such a critical time in an athlete's playing career and it's my honor to help give the men's and women's teams the resources and technology that will give them the best opportunity to succeed. I am humbled that OU has chosen to name this facility after me, and I am really excited to see this high-performance training center come to life."

ONLY COACH TO LEAD FIVE DIFFERENT PROGRAMS TO AN NCAA TOURNAMENT WIN
NINTH MOST WINS AMONG ACTIVE DIVISION I HEAD COACHES

Lon Kruger is in his seventh campaign as head coach of the Oklahoma Sooners and 32nd season of coaching college basketball. Kruger, who has been leaving his trademark rebuilding stamp on college basketball programs throughout his career, is the first Division I coach to ever take five different schools to the NCAA Tournament. In 2015 he became the first coach since the NCAA Tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1985 to take four programs to the Sweet 16 or beyond.

With a career record of 603-381, Kruger boasts the ninth most career wins among active coaches and is the 33rd head coach to win 600 Division I games in the history of college basketball. Kruger owns a 20-17 record in NCAA Tournament games and has compiled 16 20-plus-win seasons, including nine in the last 12 years.

In 2017, Kruger was honored with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Metropolitan Award for long and outstanding service to men's college basketball.

After inheriting a program that went 27-36 (.429) in the two seasons prior to his arrival, Kruger has coached the Sooners to a 124-77 (.617) record in his six years in Norman. Kruger has guided the Sooners to the NCAA Tournament four times, including a trip to the 2016 Final Four.

Oklahoma wasn't the first rapid turnaround under Kruger. When Kruger took over the Florida job in 1990, the Gators were coming off of a 7-21 season. Four years into the role, Kruger guided UF to the 1994 Final Four. Kruger is one of just two head coaches (also Rick Pitino with Kentucky and Louisville) to inherit two teams coming off a sub-.500 year and take both to a Final Four within the first five seasons as head coach.

A staple of the NCAA postseason, Kruger has taken five different schools to the Big Dance. His collegiate teams have made postseason appearances in 21 of the last 28 years. He has guided teams to 17 NCAA Tournaments, five Sweet 16s and two Final Fours.

Kruger rebuilt the Sooners upon his arrival in Norman. His 111 wins in the first five seasons are the second most through the first five seasons of coaching at OU (Billy Tubbs went 115-49 from 1980-85). He was the first coach in OU history to win six NCAA tournament games within his first five seasons. Following the 2013-14 season, he was voted the AP Big 12 Coach of the Year.

Under Kruger, Sooner players have earned First-Team All-Big 12 selections on three occasions and racked up 18 Academic All-Big 12 honors. Buddy Hield, who played four seasons for Kruger (2012-16), was named the winner of the 2016 Wooden Award, Naismith Trophy and the Oscar Robertson Trophy as the national player of the year (first consensus player of the year for OU since Blake Griffin in 2009). Hield was named Big 12 Player of the Year in both 2015 and 2016 (second player in conference history to win the award twice) and exited OU as the Big 12's all-time leading scorer.

Three Sooners have been drafted into the NBA during Kruger's tenure. Hield was selected as the sixth overall pick in the 2016 NBA Draft while Isaiah Cousins (2016) and Romero Osby (2013) were chosen in the second round of their respective drafts.
