### STARTING FIVE

• The Minnesota men's basketball returns to the non-conference schedule after a brief foray into Big Ten play, traveling to Arkansas on Saturday. The game is the second of a home-and-home series that began last year in Minneapolis, an 85-71 Gopher win. It is Minnesota's first road game at an SEC school since Dec. 7, 2001 (Georgia 77, Minnesota 55).

• Jordan Murphy is leading the team averaging 19.9 points (BIG: 2nd) and 12.8 rebounds (BIG: 1st/NCAA: 2nd) per game through the first 10 games. Murphy has posted 10 double-doubles (highest in the country) thus far this season, and the three-time Big Ten Player of the Week became the first Gopher to win the award in back-to-back weeks. Murphy is also just the second Gopher to win it three times in the same season. He is additionally leads the country in offensive rebounds (5.6) per game, as of Dec. 7.

• Reggie Lynch leads the country with 4.5 blocks per game, and this week, Lynch moved past Jeff Hagen (2002-05) and Michael Bauer (2000-04) to take sixth on the Gophers' all-time blocked shots list with 159. He needs just six more to tie Joel Przybilla for the most by any Gopher in two or fewer seasons of play in the Maroon and Gold (165).

• On Sunday, the Gophers snapped a four-game losing streak in BIG openers, winning its first since a 76-63 victory against Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2012. Last season, the Gophers dropped a 75-74 overtime decision versus the Spartans, and had previously lost conference-opening tilts at Ohio State, at Purdue during 2014-15, and at home versus Michigan. Since 1980-81, the Gophers are 12-20 in Big Ten openers (excluding vacated seasons).

• Head coach Richard Pitino won his 100th career game on Nov. 25 against Alabama. Pitino is one of five active Division I head coaches who have reached the 100 career victory mark in their sixth season or sooner.

## SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas is 6-2 on the season including a perfect 4-0 mark at home. The Razorbacks' two losses came vs. North Carolina (87-68) in the PK80 Invitational in Portland, and at Houston (91-65) a week ago.
- Jaylen Barford leads the five Razorbacks averaging double figures with 19.6 points per game, a figure that ranks third in the SEC.
- Arkansas leads the SEC and ranks 23rd in the nation with a turnover margin of +4.9.

## GOPHERS VS. THE SEC

- Minnesota has amassed a record of 19-14 against the current membership of the Southeastern Conference.
- That total includes the following individual opponent records: Alabama (1-2), Arkansas (2-3), Florida (1-1), Georgia (4-1), Kentucky (1-3), Ole Miss (2-0), Missouri (2-0), South Carolina (0-2), Tennessee (0-1), Texas A&M (1-1), Vanderbilt (5-0). Games that were later vacated are excluded from that list.
- The Gophers will face two SEC opponents this year in Alabama (Nov. 25) and Arkansas (Dec. 9). This is the second straight year of facing two SEC foes – prior to that, Minnesota hadn't played two SEC schools in the same year since 1997 (Alabama & Kentucky), results that were later vacated.
- Head coach Richard Pitino is facing a SEC opponent for the sixth time. He is no stranger to the conference, however, spending two seasons on Billy Donovan's staff at Florida.

## PITINO WINS #100

- With the Nov. 25 victory over Alabama in the Barclays Center Classic, Minnesota head coach Richard Pitino earned his 100th career victory.
- Pitino, who earned all but 18 of those wins with the Gophers after arriving in 2013, has accomplished the feat in just over five seasons as a college head coach.
- At 35, Pitino is the second-youngest Power Five head basketball coach, and has a career record of 100-75, translating to a winning percentage of .571. His Gopher record stands at 82-61, a mark of .573. Only five head coaches in the history of the program have a higher win-loss percentage at Minnesota.
- Pitino is one of five active Division I head coaches who have reached the 100 career victory mark in their sixth season or sooner, joining Kevin Ollie (UConn), Brad Underwood (Stephen F. Austin/Oklahoma State/Illinois), Dan Muller (Illinois State) and Pat Kelsey (Winthrop).

## LET'S HEAR IT FOR NEW YORK

- The Gophers made their first of three trips to New York City in November, but they are no strangers to playing in the nation's largest city.
- Minnesota last took the court in the five boroughs in 2014, when they went 1-1 at the NIT Season Tip Off in Madison Square Garden, defeating Georgia after falling to St. John's.
- The Gophers are 14-8 in New York City, with most of those games being played across town at the Garden (both its previous and current iterations). Minnesota fell at Columbia, 27-15, on Feb. 13, 1905, and went 2-1 against NYU with games in 1937, 1938, and 1940.
- The Gophers will return to the Big Apple twice more this season, taking on Ohio State on Jan. 20 as part of the BTN Super Saturday basketball/hockey doubleheader, and for the Big Ten Tournament from Feb. 28-March 4. Both will be played at the Garden.

## BLOCK NATION

- Redshirt senior Reggie Lynch continues his dominance around the rim into his final season.
- The Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year last season after ranking second in the nation in blocks, Lynch is off to a tremendous start this year. He leads the country with 4.5 blocks per game along with 45 total blocks.
- Lynch swatted nine shots against Niagara, tying his own mark (among others) for the fourth-most in school history. The Edina, Minn., native had four blocks in each of the first two games and five in the win over Western Carolina.
- He keys the Gopher blocking effort which is third in the country as of Dec. 7 at 7.8 blocks per game. Minnesota led the country in blocks a year ago.

## NEW SCHOOL RECORD

- As a team, Minnesota dished out a school-record 32 assists against Niagara, while only committing four turnovers.
- The total breaks the record of 30 assists, which Minnesota had versus Youngstown State on Dec. 2, 1991.
- Minnesota is second in the Big Ten and ranks seventh in the country in assist/turnover ratio at 1.7.

## "O" MY

- The first five Gophers games featured offensive fireworks in the second half by the Maroon and Gold.
- The Gophers had their most productive offensive start to the season in school history, with the 95.4 points per game average the highest in the first five games of any season.
- In the Nov. 21 win over Alabama A&M, Minnesota shot 61.4 percent from the field (43-70), their best since Jan. 22, 2011 (63.4 percent at Michigan).

## SKI-U-MURPH

- Junior forward Jordan Murphy could not have turned in two more more dominant performance to start the season.
- On Nov. 10, Murphy had career-high totals in five categories, finishing with his 22nd career double-double of 35 points and 15 rebounds.
- He was the first Minnesota player with 35 points in a game since Andre Hollins recorded a career-best 41 points vs. Memphis on Nov. 23, 2012. Additionally, his scoring was the most by a Gopher at Williams Arena since Quincy Lewis had 36 against Indiana in 1998, a game that was later vacated.
- Murphy's career-bests were for points, field goals made (13), field goals attempted (22), free throws made (9) and free throws attempted (15). His previous career-high had been 25 points versus Iowa on Feb. 8, 2017.
- At Providence, Murphy led all players with 23 points and 14 rebounds, adding three blocks in the win over the Friars.
- Including last season, Murphy has now scored in double figures in 13 straight games.
- The San Antonio native was named to the Karl Malone Award watch list for the nation's top power forward prior to the season.

## A GIVING SUNDAY

- On Nov. 5, The Gophers hosted a charity exhibition against Green Bay at Maturi Pavilion early in the afternoon, and then donned their best business attire for the third annual Coaches vs. Cancer Tipoff Dinner at Interlachen Country Club in Edina.
- Sunday's game saw the Gophers easily defeat Green Bay, 115-86, in front of a crowd of 2,381. All of the proceeds from ticket sales were donated to the American Red Cross as it continues to assist in the relief and rebuilding efforts from Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico. Head Coach Richard Pitino also pledged to add one dollar to the donation for every ticket sold. Additionally, Goldy's Locker Room donated 50 percent of its gross merchandise sales in venue, while 25 percent of Aramark's concessions sales were added to the donation as well. The donation totalled nearly \$16,000 after expenses.
- Later in the afternoon, the Gophers traded their home whites for their business suits, taking part in the annual dinner to raise money for the Richard M. Schulze Family American Cancer Society Hope Lodge in Minneapolis.
- All told, the Coaches vs. Cancer Tipoff Dinner grossed more than \$105,000 to the American Cancer Society's Hope Lodge.

## DRESS REHEARSALS

- The Gophers went 2-0 in their exhibition season, defeating Concordia-St. Paul, 106-58, on Nov. 2 at the Barn. Jordan Murphy scored a team-high 22 points for Minnesota on 9-10 shooting and added 11 rebounds to complete the double-double and lead the Gophers.
- Three days later, Minnesota topped Green Bay, 115-86, in an exhibition to raise funds for hurricane relief in Puerto Rico. Six Gophers scored in double-figures, led by 26 points from Amir Coffey and 24 points by freshman Isaiah Washington.
- Box scores from each of the games, along with the Gophers' scrimmage against Creighton on Oct. 22, can be found on page 26.

## SET YOUR WATCH (LISTS)

- A pair of Gophers were named to prestigious preseason watch lists recently.
- Senior Nate Mason was selected to the Bob Cousy Award watch

list for the nation's top point guard, while junior Jordan Murphy earned a spot on the Karl Malone Award watch list for the best Division I power forward.

- Both awards are given out by the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.
- Mason also earned a spot on the 2018 Citizen Naismith Trophy Watch List and the Wooden Award Watch List, one of 50 players vying for the top individual honor in the country.

## SIGNING DAY UPDATE

- Three standout student-athletes from the Twin Cities metro joined the Gophers earlier in early November.
- Guard Gabe Kalscheur (Edina, Minn./DeLaSalle HS), forward Jarvis Omersa (Orono, Minn./Orono HS), and center Daniel Oturu (Woodbury, Minn./Cretin-Derham Hall) signed their NLLs to join the team next season.
- Kalscheur, a 6-4, 180-pound combo guard, averaged 18.1 points per game last year for DeLaSalle, where he has helped lead the Islanders to three straight 3A state titles during his prep career. Kalscheur is a four-star prospect according to ESPN.com, who also has him ranked as the No. 3 prospect in the state of Minnesota and 33rd nationally at the shooting guard position.
- Omersa, is a 6-8, 220-pound forward. A three-star prospect who is listed among the nation's top 150 athletes, Omersa averaged 15.9 points and 10.5 rebounds per game on 61.6 percent field goal shooting for the Spartans, while also adding 3.3 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.9 blocks per game.
- A consensus four-star prospect among the top-40 in the nation, Oturu is a 6-10, 220-pound center who is one of the highest recruits in recent Gopher history dating back to current NBA star Kris Humphries. Oturu, who has led his Raiders squad to a preseason top ranking in the state, averaged a double-double of 18.6 points and 14.7 rebounds per game on 63.1 percent shooting last season. Oturu blocked six shots per game, while also dishing 62 assists (2.3 apg) and swiping 50 steals (1.9 spg). He led the metro in blocks and was second in rebounds per game last year, in which he was named to the Star Tribune All-Metro Second Team.

- When the calendar turns to 2018, the Gopher men's basketball team will shift its offices, practice court, locker room, weight room and more to the newly completed Charlie and Kathy Cunningham Basketball Development Center.
- The state-of-the-art facility is an integral part of the \$166 million Athletes Village project, which will additionally house the Land O'Lakes Center for Excellence, along with the David and Janis Larson Football Performance Center and indoor football practice facility.
- Beyond the basketball and football training facilities, Minnesota athletics' academic and student-athlete development centers, along with a new training table and other support areas will be housed in the new building, which is being constructed adjacent to the Bierman Field Athletic Building.

Richard Pitino is in his fifth season as the 17th head coach of the University of Minnesota's Golden Gopher men's basketball team.

The 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year as voted by the league's media and head coaches, Pitino led the Gophers to a school-record 23 regular season wins and an NCAA appearance for the first time since 2013. Earning a No. 5 seed in the tournament - the Gophers' highest since 1982 - Pitino guided the Gophers to an 11-win Big Ten season, the most since the 1990 campaign. Four Gophers received All-Big Ten honors, including First Team selection Nate Mason and Defensive Player of the Year Reggie Lynch along with third teamer Jordan Murphy and All-Freshman selection Amir Coffey.

Last season saw several accomplishments, including the selection of freshman Jordan Murphy to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. He was the Gophers' first honoree since 2005 and only the third ever. The Gophers also picked up signature victories over No. 6 Maryland at home, along with improving to 3-0 under Pitino in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge after a home victory over Clemson in November.

In 2015-16, the Gophers set a new school single-season record with 313 steals, passing the previous mark of 297 set in 2007-08. The team averaged 74.2 points per game, the highest since the 2001-02 season and the second straight season under head coach Richard Pitino that the Gophers have averaged more than 71 points per game. Two of his players garnered All-Big Ten honorable mentions in guard Andre Hollins (coaches & media) and Maurice Walker (media). In February, the Gophers defeated then-#25 and eventual Final Four team Michigan State in East Lansing for the first time since 1997 (later vacated) - the team's first road win over a top-25 team since 2012.

In year one, Pitino led the Gophers to their second National Invitation Tournament championship in program history, posting a school-record 25 wins in the process. Among those victories were three top-25 wins at home in Williams Arena, knocking off #9/8 Wisconsin, #11/9 Ohio State, and #20/19 Iowa. Those were part of the 20 home wins that the Gophers amassed during the season. Pitino's first Gopher team finished with eight Big Ten victories, seventh in the conference, along with an opening-round win in the Big Ten Tournament. The 2014-15 squad featured two All-Big Ten honorable mention players in junior guards Andre Hollins and DeAndre Mathieu, the latter one of four newcomers that arrived on campus with Pitino.

Pitino came to Gold Country after spending one season at the helm of the Florida International University (FIU) basketball program. Prior to his arrival in South Florida, FIU had not had a winning season since 1999-2000 and in the three seasons before his hiring posted a combined record of 26-65. In just one season, Pitino led the program to 18 wins, the fourth-most in program history, and its first appearance in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship game. FIU finished with 11 conference wins on the season, the most by a Panther team since joining the Sun Belt Conference.

Prior to leading FIU, Pitino served as the Associate Head Coach for one season and an assistant for two other seasons under his father, Rick, at Louisville. In three years overall with the Cardinals, he helped the program to a combined 88-25 record, a pair of NCAA Elite Eight berths (2008 and 2009) and one NCAA Final Four appearance (2012). His efforts also helped the Cards land two of top 15 recruiting classes in his three years (2007-08 and 2008-09). Pitino also spent time as an assistant for two seasons under Billy Donovan at Florida. In his time with the Gators, the club was a combined 50-20 with back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the 2011 NCAA Southeast Regional finals before falling to NCAA runner-up Butler.
