## Auburn Women's Basketball Ouick Hitters

- As of Feb. 24, Auburn ranks third in the nation in turnovers forced (22.5/game), is 10th in the nation in steals (11.7/ game), and third in turnover margin (+8.3)
- This is the 36th meeting between Auburn and Arkansas, the 34th since Arkansas joined the SEC in 1992
- Auburn is 21-14 all-time against Arkansas, but the teams are tied 8-8 in Fayetteville
- Auburn won its last meeting with Arkansas 71-60 in overtime at home last season
- The Tigers snapped a 6 -game losing streak with their win over LSU Thursday night, finishing the game on an $11-1$ run over the final 1:29 for a $54-49$ win
- Auburn is 8-0 this season and 36-6 under Coach Flo when forcing $25+$ turnovers; Auburn forced 38 vs. Troy, 27 at North Carolina A\&T, 30 at East Carolina, 27 vs. Ball State, 30 vs. Marist; 28 vs. Savannah State; 26 at Florida; 29 vs. LSU
- 21 of 29 Auburn opponents have committed at least 20 turnovers; Auburn is 15-6 in those games
- Auburn averages 24.0 points per game off opponent turnovers; the Tigers are $12-2$ when scoring at least 25
- Four of Auburn's opponents have been held to a season-low scoring total
- Senior Katie Frerking scored a career-high 32 points at Texas A\&M (2/5), her second 30-point game this year
- Frerking was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team last week and the SEC Community Service Team this week
- Senior Khady Dieng made her second start of the season as part of Senior Night
- Junior Tiffany Lewis made her first Auburn start against Ole Miss on Feb. 16; her last collegiate start came March 5,

2015, vs. Georgia Tech while playing at Clemson

- Sophomore Erica Sanders and senior Khady Dieng made their first starts of the season vs. Alabama on Jan. 29 while Jazmine and Jessica Jones came off the bench due to illness; it was Sanders' first career start
- In the Jan. 22 game vs. Kentucky, Brandy Montgomery passed Tyrese Tanner for 10th all-time in scoring at Auburn; she now has 1,598 points and ranks ninth in program history
- Auburn has three comeback wins from 17-point deficits this season: vs. Indiana (11/27), at Vanderbilt ( $1 / 12$ ) and vs. Tennessee (1/19)
- Auburn's win over Tennessee on Jan. 19 was its first over the Lady Vols since 2009 and the largest margin of victory in a regular-season game for Auburn against UT
- Auburn's $83-60$ win over Ole Miss (1/8) was its largest margin of victory and highest scoring total in SEC play under head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy
- Auburn scored 62 points in the second half vs. Drake; the most in a half since 2008 and two points shy of a school record for points in a half
- Auburn's 32 fourth-quarter points vs. Indiana were the Tigers' most in a single period since women's basketball went to a four-quarter game in 2015-16

## OPENING TIP

Auburn plays its final game of the 2016-17 regular season Sunday as the Tigers travel to Fayetteville, Ark., to face the Arkansas Razorbacks. Game time is 2 p.m. CT at Bud Walton Arena.
" Auburn is 16-13 overall, 6-9 SEC, and snapped a sixgame losing streak with a come-from-behind 54-49 win over LSU Thursday night. Arkansas is 13-15 overall, 2-13 SEC, after dropping a 66-64 heartbreaker at Vanderbilt.

## LAST TIME OUT

Auburn finished the game on an 11-1 run over the final 90 seconds to pull off a come-from-behind 54-49 win over LSU Thursday night in SEC women's basketball action at Auburn Arena.
" On a night when shots simply would not fall for Auburn, the Tigers ( $16-13,6-9$ SEC) found a way to win, getting key stops, forcing turnovers, taking charges and sinking free throws down the stretch to snap a six-game losing streak.
" Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 15 points on her Senior Night. The other two seniors, Katie Frerking and Khady Dieng, shared the team lead with six rebounds; Frerking also had 10 points. Sophomore Janiah McKay added 14 points to give Auburn three players in double-figures.
" Auburn shot just 29 percent for the game (19-of65), but made two more field goals than LSU (17-10, 7-8 SEC), who was 17-of-36 (38.6\%) from the field. But Auburn forced LSU into 29 turnovers - the second-most ever by an SEC opponent against Auburn - converting those into 28 points.

## UP NEXT

Auburn will play Thursday in the SEC Tournament. The Tigers' seed, opponent and game time are TBD.

## A WIN OVER ARKANSAS WOULD...

" Give Auburn its 17th win of the season, securing a winning record for the second-straight year.
" End the regular season on a two-game win streak.
" Be Auburn's second-straight win over Arkansas.
" Ensure Auburn plays in the 8-9 game in the SEC Tournament.

## SEC TOURNAMENT SCENARIOS

With a win over Arkansas, Auburn would be the No. 8 or No. 9 seed in the SEC Tournament. Depending on the outcomes of the Georgia-Florida and LSU-Vanderbilt games, Auburn will face either Georgia or LSU.
" If Auburn falls to Arkansas, the Tigers would be
either the 9th or 10th seed, depending on outcomes in the Missouri-Alabama and Ole Miss-Texas A\&M games. Regardless, Auburn will face either Georgia or LSU in its first game of the tournament.

## SERIES HISTORY

Auburn leads the all-time series with Arkansas 21-14. The teams have split the last 10 meetings, dating back to 2009. Auburn won last season's meeting in Auburn, 71-60, in overtime.
" The Tigers and Razorbacks have split the 16 alltime meetings in Fayetteville. Arkansas won Auburn's last visit to Bud Walton Arena 52-47 in 2015.

## LAST MEETING: AUBURN 71, ARKANSAS 60 (OT)

" A 3-pointer from Brandy Montgomery with 8.6 seconds left sent the game to overtime, and Auburn outscored Arkansas 15-4 in the extra period for a 71-60 win on Jan. 24, 2016, at Auburn Arena.
" The Tigers overcame a sluggish start and stayed close with Arkansas in a back-and-forth game that featured 12 ties and 11 lead changes. Turnovers were key - especially late in the game - as Auburn forced the Razorbacks into 28 turnovers.
" Auburn led 53-50 with just over a minute to play, but Arkansas tied the game on a 3-pointer from Devin Cosper at the 1:15 mark. After an Auburn turnover, the Razorbacks took the lead on a Kelsey Brooks trey with 15 seconds to play. The Tigers moved the ball into the frontcourt and called timeout to set up Montgomery's contested, overtime-forcing shot.

Auburn never trailed in the extra period, shooting $75 \%$ (6-of-8) and holding Arkansas to 2-of-8 shooting (25\%). The final margin was Auburn's largest lead of the game. Junior Katie Frerking - who had a monster game with 13 points, seven rebounds, six assists and six steals scored five of her 13 points in overtime.

## SCOUTING ARKANSAS

" Arkansas enters Sunday's season finale having lost nine straight and stand 13-15 overall, 2-13 in SEC play. Eight of the Razorbacks' losses in league play have been by single-digits.
" Jessica Jackson averages 14.9 points and 6.3 rebounds per game to lead Arkansas in both categories. " Arkansas is one of the SEC's best defensive teams, holding opponents to 59.7 points/game. The Razorbacks average 64.2/game.

## SCOUTING AUBURN

" Auburn is 16-13 for the season, 6-9 in SEC play.

## PRESEASON ALL-SEC: BRANDY MONTGOMERY

"Senior Brandy Montgomery was named preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches.
Montgomery was Auburn's leading scorer in 2015-16, averaging 14.0 points per game.

Nine of Auburn's losses have come to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls, and nine losses have been by six points or less.
" The Tigers are one of the nation's top teams in forcing turnovers with 22.5 per game (3rd in NCAA). Auburn is 10th in the nation in steals per game (11.7) and 4th nationwide in total steals (339). The Tigers lead the SEC and rank 3rd in the nation in turnover margin (+8.3). " Katie Frerking is Auburn's leading scorer with 16.0 points/game. She also leads the Tigers in rebounds (6.2) and steals (2.5). Her 2.5 steals per game are second in the SEC and rank 42nd in the nation. Frerking has posted five double-doubles this season and had a career-high 32 points at Texas A\&M on Feb. 5. She scored her 1,000th career point at Florida on Jan. 1 while picking up her fifth double-double of the year.
" Brandy Montgomery is Auburn's second-leading scorer with 13.8 points/game. She was named to the preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches. She has three games with $25+$ points this season: a season-high 28 (including 16 in the 4th quarter) to lead a comeback win over Indiana (11/27), 26 in a win at Florida that included a career-high seven 3 -pointers ( $1 / 1$ ), and 25 in a home victory over Ole Miss where she was 10-of-15 from the floor ( $1 / 8$ ).
" Junior forward Jessica Jones has been a force defensively for the Tigers, posting a career-high four blocks twice already this year and pulling down a careerhigh 11 rebounds vs. Drake. She leads the Tigers in blocks with $1.0 / \mathrm{game}$. She also had five steals in the opener vs. Troy, and she scored a career-high 15 points on her 21st birthday in Auburn's 53-41 win over Jacksonville on Dec. 28.
" Sophomore point guard Janiah McKay and junior forward Jazmine Jones are the Tigers' other two returning starters. McKay leads the Tigers in assists (3.5/game) and scored a career-high 29 points to lead Auburn's comeback victory over Tennessee on Jan. 19. She earned her first career double-double with 13 points and 13 rebounds vs. Ole Miss on Jan. 8, and she scored her 500th career point vs. South Carolina on Jan. 5.
" Jones started all 33 games as a sophomore and had one of the best shooting percentages on the team, shooting $52.6 \%$ from the floor. She scored a season-high 10 points and had a career-high five steals vs. Drake on Dec. 21.

## LUCKY NUMBER 17

" Three times this season, Auburn has trailed by 17 points and overcame that deficit to win the game: Nov. 27 vs. Indiana, Jan. 12 at Vanderbilt and Jan. 19 vs.

Tennessee
" Auburn trailed Indiana by 17 points early in the fourth quarter on Nov. 27, but outscored the Hoosiers 32-14 in the final period to earn a 71-67 victory at home. Brandy Montgomery scored 16 points in that fourth quarter, including 10 straight at one point, to lead the Auburn comeback. Erica Sanders hit the go-ahead jumper with 50 seconds left to give Auburn the lead for good.
" Vandy led $45-28$ with $5: 27$ left in the third quarter, but Auburn went on a 14-4 run to cut the deficit to 7 at the end of the third quarter, then outscored the Commodores 22-10 in the fourth to claim the victory. Montgomery scored 14 points in the fourth quarter and hit three free throws in the final seconds to seal the win.
" Tennessee jumped out to a 25-8 lead late in the first quarter, but Auburn went on an 18-1 run over the next five minutes to tie the game at 26 -26. A 3 -pointer from Katie Frerking at the halftime buzzer gave the Tigers a 38-36 lead, and they would never trail again.

## J-MAC ATTACK

" Sophomore Janiah McKay is continuing to come into her own as a top point guard in the SEC. She topped the career 500-point mark in her 49th game (vs. South Carolina, $1 / 5 / 17$ ) and will likely end up in the top 30 in career assists by the end of the 2017 season.
" McKay scored a career-high 29 points on Jan. 19 to lead Auburn to its first win over Tennessee since 2009. She scored 15 points in the second quarter alone to help the Tigers rally from a 17-point first-quarter deficit to take the lead at halftime.
" McKay had back-to-back 25-point games (28 vs. Virginia Tech; 25 vs. Drake) in December, the first back-to-back 25-point games for an Auburn player since Alli Smalley did so vs. Kentucky (26) and Florida (29) as a junior in 2010.
" In a win over Ole Miss, McKay got her first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 13 assists.

## ALL-SEC CANDIDATE: KATIE FRERKING

"Senior Katie Frerking has recorded five double-doubles this season, and she is Auburn's leader in scoring, rebounds and steals. She is second in the SEC and ranks 39th in the nation in steals (2.7/game).

## SHE'S FRERIKING AWESOME

" Through 29 games, senior Katie Frerking leads Auburn in three of five major categories: scoring (16.0 ppg ), rebounds (6.2/game), and steals (2.5/game).
" Frerking scored a career-high 32 points and was Auburn's leading rebounder with eight at Texas A\&M (2/5). It was the highest scoring output by an Auburn player since Blanche Alverson scored 32 vs. Mississippi State on 3/3/13.
" She scored a then-career high 30 points along with 11 rebounds in Auburn's win at Louisiana Tech (12/14). She was 9-14 from the field, 5-9 from 3-point range, and 7-8 at the free-throw line.
" She scored her 1,000th career point and picked up her 200th career steal, along with her fifth double-double of the season at Florida (1/1). She is one of two players in Auburn history with at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 250 assists and 200 steals (Mae Ola Bolton).

" Katie Frerking has two 30-point games this season, both on the road - 30 at Louisiana Tech $(12 / 14)$ and 32 at Texas A\&M (2/5). Those were the 37th and 38th 30-point performances in Auburn women's basketball history.
" Auburn has had five 30-point games under Coach Flo, and three by active players: Frerking's two this season, and a 30-point effort by Brandy Montgomery against Alabama in 2015.

## DOWNTOWN MONTGOMERY

" Senior Brandy Montgomery has turned into one of the SEC's top 3-point shooters, averaging 2.1 makes per game and shooting $34.3 \%$ from long distance. In SEC play, she leads in the league in 3-pointers made per game (2.2) and in percentage (44.6\%).

Against Florida on Jan. 1, Montgomery made a career-high seven 3-pointers (on just eight attempts), scoring 26 points to lead Auburn to an 82-75 road victory. She was one trey shy of the Auburn record (Tiffany

Krantz, 8 vs. Troy in 1997).
" In a win over Ole Miss on Jan. 8, she was 5-of-6 from 3-point range and scored 25 points to lead the Tigers in an 83-60 victory.

## EIGHT IS...GREAT?

" In the Dec. 28 win over Jacksonville, Auburn held the Dolphins to eight points in the first half. It's the first time for Auburn to hold an opponent to single-digits in a half since Dec. 19, 2006, at Maryland-Eastern Shore, when the Tigers held UMES to five first-half points.
" There are only three known instances of Auburn holding an opponent to single digits in a half dating back to the 1989-90 season. The other came Jan. 27, 1990, when Tuskegee scored nine second-half points.

## GETTING DEFENSIVE

" Through games of Feb. 23, Auburn is the nation's No. 4 team in total steals with 339 this season. The
Tigers are averaging 11.7 steals per game (10th NCAA) and forcing 22.5 opponent turnovers per game (3rd NCAA). Auburn has forced eight opponents into at least 25 giveaways this season and 21 of 29 into at least 20. " Auburn has held all but five opponents thus far under their season scoring average, and four have been held to their low scoring total of the season.

## SEEING DOUBLE

" Auburn has six double-doubles in 2016-17, five from senior Katie Frerking and one from sophomore Janiah McKay.
" Frerking had three double-doubles in four games from Nov. 20-24. She had 10 points and 13 rebounds in a win at East Carolina ( $11 / 20$ ), 13 points and 10 rebounds in Auburn's next game vs. Ball State (11/22), and 18 points and 10 rebounds in a close loss to No. 19 West Virginia (11/24).
" The last Auburn player to have back-to-back

" Frerking's fourth double-double came at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 14 when she scored a career-high 30 points and had 11 rebounds. It was Auburn's first double-double with 30 points scored since DeWanna Bonner had 32 points and 13 rebounds vs. Ole Miss on Feb. 5, 2009.
" She scored 24 points and had 10 rebounds in the Tigers' $82-75$ win at Florida on Jan. 1 for her fifth of the season.
" McKay picked up her first career double-double with 13 points and 13 assists in Auburn's $83-60$ win over Ole Miss. It was the first points/assists double-double for Auburn since Ouardad accomplished the feat vs. Samford in 2012 and the 22nd in Auburn history.

## CLUB PRESS STILL OPEN FOR BUSINESS

" Auburn has forced $25+$ turnovers in eight games this year ( 38 vs. Troy; 27 at NC A\&T; 30 at ECU, 27 vs. Ball State, 30 vs. Marist; 28 vs. Savannah State; 26 at Florida; 29 vs. LSU). The Tigers are 8-0 this season and 36-6 under Coach Flo when forcing $25+$ turnovers.
" The Tigers forced LSU into a season-high 29 turnovers, converting those into 28 points in a 54-49 come-from-behind victory on Feb. 23.
" In Auburn's season opener vs. Troy, the Tigers forced the Trojans into 38 turnovers, which ranks fifth alltime in Auburn history. Auburn had 22 steals in the game, two shy of the school record.
" Indiana's 20 turnovers on Nov. 27 were a seasonlow for an Auburn opponent at the time, but the Tigers capitalized with a then-season-high 33 points off turnovers.
" Auburn forced Virginia Tech into a season-high 22 turnovers, turning that into 34 points. VT ranked 3rd in the nation for fewest turnovers coming into the game, averaging 11 per game.
" Auburn forced an average of 21.1 turnovers per game last season, which ranked 12th in the nation. The Tigers were ninth nationally in steals, averaging 11.2 per game.

AUBURN --Auburn came within striking distance of a school record for turnovers, forcing 38 in a season-opening 61-52 victory over Troy at Auburn Arena Friday night.

The Tigers struggled to finish on the offensive end at times, shooting 31.9 percent from the floor, but the Auburn defense held the Trojans more than 28 points below their season average from a year ago, when they were the seventh-best scoring team in the nation.

The 38 forced turnovers were the most for an Auburn team in 13 years, dating back to Dec. 29, 2003, when the Tigers forced Alabama A\&M into 39 giveaways. That game - along with a 2001 game against Tennessee State - are the school records for turnovers by a Division I opponent; Auburn forced 40-plus against a pair of Division II foes.

Auburn also picked up 22 steals, two shy of the school record, led by five from junior Jessica Jones. Four players - Brandy Montgomery, Katie Frerking, Janiah McKay and Erica Sanders - had three apiece.

Auburn was only able to convert those turnovers into 25 points, letting the Trojans hang around much longer than they might have otherwise. Auburn led by as many as 14 late in the game but were unable to pull away further despite numerous fast-break opportunities.

Montgomery led the Tigers with 22 points, her 18th career game with 20 points or more. Frerking missed a double-double by one rebound, scoring 12 points and pulling down nine boards, along with three assists, three blocks and three steals. McKay contributed a 10-point outing.

Freshman Tyra Johnson and transfers Emari Jones, Ekiya Gray and Tiffany Lewis all saw their first action for the Tigers. Johnson and Jones found the scoresheet for the first time at the free-throw line.

It looked as though Auburn would pull away early, knocking down four 3-pointers in the first quarter. But the Tigers would hit just one long-range attempt - out of 17 - the rest of the night. Numerous missed layups in the second and third quarter prevented the Tigers from putting distance between themselves and the Trojans, despite a stellar defensive effort.

## Game 2: Nov. 17, 2016 Auburn 68, North Carolina AGT 36 Corbett Sports Center Greensboro, N.C.



GREENSBORO, N.C. --Sparked by a 25-2 run that spanned most of the second quarter, Auburn women's basketball pulled away early and cruised to a 68-36 victory at North Carolina A\&T Thursday night.

For the second straight game, the Tigers (2-0) forced their opponent into 25 -plus turnovers, pushing the Ag gies (1-2) into 27 giveaways turned into 26 Auburn points. The Tigers also held the Aggies to single-digit scoring in three of four quarters.

Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers for the second straight game with 18 points. Katie Frerking added 15 points, at least six rebounds, five assists and a career-high seven steals. Junior Tiffany Lewis found the scoresheet for the first time as a Tiger, knocking down three 3-pointers in the fourth quarter to finish with nine points.

The Tigers shot an even 50 percent from the floor (27-of-54) and were 5-of-15 (33.3\%) from 3-point range. Auburn out-rebounded the Aggies 42-34; Jessica Jones led the way with eight boards.
Auburn's starters were able to play fewer minutes in the second half with the game in hand, a goal of Wil-liams-Flournoy coming into tonight's game.

After a sluggish first quarter for both teams, Auburn opened the second period on a 10-0 run over the first five minutes, holding the Aggies scoreless until the 4:45 mark of the quarter. From there, Auburn would score 15 straight - many on fastbreak opportunities off Aggie turnovers - before A\&T knocked down a 3-pointer in the final seconds.
The run persisted well into the third quarter - Auburn opened that period on an 8-2 run - as the Tigers' lead swelled to 30 points at the 6:07 mark. North Carolina A\&T would get no closer than 25 the rest of the way.

Dana Brown led North Carolina A\&T with 16 points, and Kala Green added eight.

## Game 3: Nov. 20, 2016 Auburn 61, East Carolina 52 Minges Coliseum Greenville, N.C.



GREENVILLE, N.C. -- Katie Frerking picked up her third career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team kept up the defensive pressure to remain unbeaten with a 61-52 victory at East Carolina Sunday afternoon.

The Tigers (3-0) led by as many as 18 late in the third quarter but went cold late, going the final 6:40 of the game without a field goal. As such, East Carolina (3-1) was able to cut the Auburn lead to single-digits in the final two minutes. But clutch free-throw shooting sealed the win for Auburn as the Tigers went 7-for-10 in the fourth quarter and 15 -for- 20 at the line for the game.

Frerking recorded her third career double-double and Auburn's first of the season with 10 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. She also added three assists, three steals and a block. Janiah McKay led Auburn with 17 points, including five key free throws in the fourth quarter, and Brandy Montgomery added 10 points.

For the third straight game, Auburn forced 25 -plus opponent turnovers with 30 giveaways by ECU. Those turned into 32 Auburn points, a season-high in points off turnovers. Auburn also out-rebounded the Pirates 37-31, dominating the offensive glass with 17 offensive boards that turned into 16 second-chance points.

The Pirates outshot the Tigers 46 percent to 34 percent, but the Tigers got up 20 more attempts than did the Pirates. ECU managed just 39 field goal attempts for the game.

Auburn led 28-20 at halftime on the strength of scoring 17 points off 18 ECU turnovers. The Tigers shot just 33 percent in the opening half to ECU's 44 percent, but Auburn took 17 more shots, thanks to the turnovers and 10 offensive rebounds. An 8-0 run to start the second quarter and another burst late in the period pushed Auburn to as much as a 10-point lead before two late ECU free throws cut the halftime deficit to eight.

The Tigers saw their lead balloon to as many as 18 points in the third quarter. A seven-point burst from junior Tiffany Lewis helped spark a 21-point third period for the Tigers, and Auburn held a 49-33 lead after 30 minutes of play.

# Game 4: Nov. 22, 2016 Auburn 54, Ball State 40 Savannah Civic Center Savannah, Ga.

SAVANNAH, Ga. -- A second straight double-double for senior Katie Frerking and a big run to open the fourth quarter helped push the Auburn women's basketball team to a 54-40 win over Ball State at the Savannah Invitational.

Auburn forced 27 turnovers, the fourth straight time forcing at least that many. A lean second quarter gave way to some big shots in the second half, and a $13-0$ run to open the fourth quarter put the game away for the Tigers.

Frerking finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds, a mirror-image of her 10-point, 13 -rebound effort at East Carolina on Sunday. It was the fourth double-double of her career and the first time she's picked them up in back-to-back games.

Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers with 15 points, and Janiah McKay added nine and a game-high five assists. Jazmine Jones and Khady Dieng contributed five points each, and Jessica Jones pulled down a career-high nine rebounds.

Auburn shot 35.6 percent for the game, lowered by a dismal second quarter that saw the Tigers make just 3-of-16 shots from the field. That still outpaced the Cardinals' 34-percent night, and both teams knocked down five 3-pointers.

The Tigers out-rebounded a taller Ball State team 39-34 with 19 of those coming from Frerking and Jessica Jones.

Auburn led 17-11 after one period, turning eight Cardinal turnovers into 10 points in the opening 10 minutes. But the Tigers went cold in the second quarter, missing their first 10 shots of the period as Ball State briefly took a 23-20 lead. But Tyra Johnson connected on a 3-pointer to tie the game with 3:43 left, and the Tigers would never trail again.

From Johnson's 3-pointer through the midpoint of the third quarter, the Tigers went on a 17-2 run to take a 3725 lead. Ball State cut the margin to eight at the end of the third, but Auburn opened the fourth quarter on a 13-0 run to take a 52-31 lead.

## Game 5: Nov. 23, 2016 <br> Auburn 52, Marist 51 <br> Savannah Civic Center Savannah, Ga.



SAVANNAH, Ga. -- Auburn withstood a 3-point barrage from Marist and held on to remain unbeaten on the season with a 52-51 victory at the Savannah Invitational.

The Tigers saw Marist knock down 10 3-pointers - 10 of the Red Foxes' 13 field goals on the night were from long-range - and have a chance to tie the game on the last shot as Auburn led 52-49 with five seconds to play. But Marist's Maura Fitzpatrick drove to the basket and banked in a layup with 0.4 seconds left to cut the lead to one point, and the Red Foxes were unable to stop the clock as Auburn ran out the final ticks.

Auburn forced Marist into 30 turnovers - the third opponent in five games with at least 30 - turning those into 21 points. The Tigers scored 20 points in the paint to Marist's two.

Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 16 points and was one of four Tigers with three steals. She joined all three Joneses - Jazmine, Jessica and Emari - with three swipes on the night as the Tigers totaled 17 steals.

Jazmine Jones and Katie Frerking had eight points each, and Jones pulled down a season-high 10 rebounds. Frerking had seven boards and Jessica Jones had six. Tiffany Lewis also contributed eight points off the bench.

Despite only making three 2-point field goals, Marist out-shot Auburn 31.0 percent to 30.8 percent. The Tigers were 20-of-65 from the field, including a 26.7-percent mark in the second half. Auburn did out-rebound Marist, 39-37. The Red Foxes were lights-out at the free-throw line, knocking down 15-of-16 attempts while Auburn shot 8-of-14 at the stripe.

Several times it seemed as if Auburn would pull away, pushing the lead to as much as 10 in the second quarter. But every time Auburn had a seemingly comfortable lead, Marist answered with a 3-pointer. Marist briefly moved ahead 34-33 with 2:41 left in the third after making its first 2-point basket of the night. But Montgomery scored four straight, then Lewis added a jumper to push Auburn's lead back to five.

## Game 6: Nov. 24, 2016 \#19 West Virginia 56, Auburn 52 Savannah Civic Center Savannah, Ga.



SAVANNAH, Ga. -- Auburn fought back from a 14-point second-quarter deficit and pushed No. 19 West Virginia to the final seconds, but the Tigers fell just short in a 56-52 loss Thanksgiving night in the Savannah Invitational championship game.

The Tigers tied the game at 52-52 with just over a minute to go on a layup from Jessica Jones, then had an opportunity to take the lead in the final minute. Auburn's shot wouldn't fall, and WVU answered at the other end with 11 seconds left to take a 54-52 lead.

Auburn tried a 3-pointer with seven seconds left, but WVU got the rebound, and Auburn had to foul three times before the Mountaineers could get to the line with less than a second to play.

Katie Frerking was named to the All-Tournament Team after recording her third double-double in four games with 18 points and 10 rebounds. She knocked down five 3-pointers on the night to tie a career-high, and she also grabbed three steals.

Janiah McKay contributed 15 points to the Auburn effort, including a 5-for-6 night at the free-throw line. Sanders pulled down four rebounds and had a team-high four steals in 17 minutes off the bench.

Auburn again struggled from the field, shooting 27.6 percent for the night (16-of-58) but solid free-throw shooting - 15 -for-20 ( $75 \%$ ) - kept the Tigers in the game and helped spur the comeback in the second quarter. WVU out-rebounded Auburn 42-39, but Auburn had a season-low 14 turnovers and forced the Mountaineers into a season-high 22.

WVU jumped out to a big early lead, moving ahead 2213 at the end of one quarter and pushing that advantage to 14 points early in the second. But the Mountaineers got into foul trouble and Auburn was in the bonus for the last seven minutes or so of the quarter. Auburn took advantage, knocking down 7-of-10 free-throw attempts in the period.

Meanwhile, Frerking hit four 3-pointers in the half, and a layup from Montgomery briefly tied the game at 28-28, but the Mountaineers hit a 3-pointer in the closing seconds to take a 31-28 lead to halftime.


AUBURN -- Trailing by 17 with less than nine minutes to play, the Auburn women's basketball team mounted a furious fourth-quarter comeback to earn a 71-67 victory over Indiana Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers scored 32 points in the fourth quarter - 16 of them from senior Brandy Montgomery - and went 11-for-12 at the free-throw line in the final period to put the Hoosiers away in the closing seconds.

After a dismal third quarter where Auburn scored a season-low nine points, Indiana led 56-39 with just over nine minutes to play in the fourth. But Montgomery took over down the stretch as the Tigers gradually chipped away at the lead. She hit a 3 -pointer with 5:44 to play to cut the lead to single-digits at 60-52, then she scored 10 straight points over a two-minute stretch, tying the game at 63-all on a pair of free throws with 2:06 left.

After two misses by Indiana, Erica Sanders pulled down an offensive rebound from a Montgomery miss and knocked down a 5-foot jumper with 59 seconds to play to give Auburn its first lead since the first quarter at 65-63.

Katie Frerking then grabbed her seventh steal of the day and was fouled in short order, giving Auburn a 67-63 lead when she made two free throws. Indiana answered at the other end twice in the final 20 seconds, but both times Janiah McKay made two free throw attempts to keep it a two-possession game, icing it with 1.2 seconds to play.

Montgomery finished with a season-high 28 points, and Frerking added a season-high 21 and matched a career-high with seven steals. Frerking was also Auburn's leading rebounder with six. McKay finished with 12 points, including a perfect 6-for-6 night at the free-throw line.

Auburn shot 46.2 percent for the game, its sec-ond-best mark of the season, including a 64.3-percent mark (9-for-14) in the fourth quarter. The Tigers were also a season-best 18-of-22 (81.8\%) at the free-throw line. Auburn's 32 fourth-quarter points were the most scored by the Tigers in a single period since women's basketball went to a four-quarter game last season.

## Game 8: Dec. 1, 2016 <br> Kansas State 71, \#23 Auburn 66 Bramlage Coliseum Manhattan, Kan.



MANHATTAN, Kan. -- Senior Katie Frerking scored a season-high 22 points, but No. 23 Auburn could not overcome foul trouble and a big rebounding deficit Thursday night in a 71-66 loss at Kansas State in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.
The Tigers (6-2) had three players - two key rebounders - foul out and saw an early rebounding advantage turned into a big deficit by the end of the game. Despite that, the Tigers rallied to take a five-point lead midway through the fourth quarter but could not hang on.

Frerking's 22 points led all scorers as the Tigers shot 37 percent (23-of-62) from the field. Auburn hit a season-high eight 3-pointers, three of them from Brandy Montgomery, who finished with 11 points. Janiah McKay added 15, and Emari Jones finished with a season-high eight. Auburn also had its best free-throw shooting night of the season, hitting 12-of-14 attempts (85.7\%).

K-State (7-0) was 47 percent from the floor (24-of-51), led by a 16 -point night from Kindred Wesemann. The Wildcats pulled down 39 rebounds to Auburn's 25, and the much taller Wildcats scored 32 points in the paint to Auburn's 22.

Auburn moved ahead by five with just over five minutes to play after a sequence where McKay got a steal and a score, then Frerking got fouled and was the beneficiary of a K-State technical. She made all four free throws to put Auburn ahead 62-57. Wesemann answered quickly with a 3-pointer, and the Tigers made just one of their final seven field goal attempts as the Wildcats finished the game on a 15-4 run.

K-State led 34-32 after a first half that featured big runs by both teams. The Tigers, who outrebounded the Wildcats in the first quarter 14-3, led by as many as 10 early in the second quarter. However, the Wildcats stormed back with a 13-2 run to take a 26-25 lead with 4:00 to play. The teams traded buckets the rest of the way as the lead changed hands four times in the first half.

Auburn dealt with foul trouble as Jazmine Jones, Jessica Jones and Erica Sanders fouled out and Frerking finished with four fouls.

## Game 9: Dec. 11, 2016 Auburn 75, Savannah State 46 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN -- Brandy Montgomery scored 22 points, and Auburn's bench played extended minutes as the Tigers built a big early lead and cruised past Savannah State 75-46 Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (7-2), coming off a nine-day break for final exams, showed no signs of rust as they jumped on Savannah State (2-7) early and never looked back.

Montgomery scored her 22 points in 22 minutes, shooting 9-for-15 from the field. It was the third time this season for the Auburn senior to top the 20-point mark. Tiffany Lewis scored a season-high 12 points - her first double-digit effort since playing for Clemson two seasons ago - to lead a season-best 28 points from the Auburn bench.

All 10 players that suited up for the Tigers scored in the game, including season-highs from freshmen Tyra Johnson and Daisa Alexander.

Sophomore Janiah McKay had a career-high eight assists along with seven points, and Jazmine Jones and Katie Frerking had four steals apiece. Jessica Jones contributed five points, five rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a steal.

For the sixth time in nine games, Auburn forced its opponent into 25 or more turnovers, turning Savannah State over 28 times. They were able to convert those turnovers into 37 points, a season-high.

Offensively, Auburn matched a season-best shooting percentage at 50 percent ( 28 -for- 56 ) from the field. The Tigers also matched a season-high with eight made 3 -pointers and shot 84.6 percent from the free-throw line. Auburn's 75 points were also the high mark of the season.

Auburn jumped out to a 12-2 lead in the game's first four minutes, forcing a quick SSU timeout. SSU got back within eight right out of the timeout, but a Frerking jumper put Auburn back up by 10 . Savannah State would not get within single digits the rest of the way.

# Game 10: Dec. 14, 2016 Auburn 76, Louisiana Tech 66 Thomas Assembly Center Ruston, La. 



RUSTON, La. -- Senior Katie Frerking scored a ca-reer-high 30 points and picked up her fourth double-double of the season to lead the Auburn women's basketball team to a $76-66$ win at Louisiana Tech Wednesday night.

The Tigers (8-2) overcame a sloppy start to put up their season-high scoring figure and overcame late foul trouble to hold off a fourth-quarter run by the Lady Techsters (5-4).

Frerking's 30-point, 11-rebound effort marked her sixth career double-double and fourth of the season. It was Auburn's first 30-point game since Brandy Montgomery scored 30 against Alabama in the 2015 regular-season finale. Frerking was 9-of-14 from the floor, 5-of-9 from 3 -point range and was a perfect 7 -for-7 at the free-throw line while playing a season-high 37 minutes.
Auburn shot 42 percent for the game (24-57) and made a season-high nine 3-pointers, five of them from Frerking. The Tigers were also 19 -of-24 at the free-throw line and outrebounded Louisiana Tech 38-27.

Montgomery added 12 points for Auburn, and freshman Tyra Johnson had a season-high eight. Jazmine Jones pulled down eight rebounds.
A sluggish first quarter that saw Auburn score just eight points and shoot 17 percent gave way to a 28 -point second period, giving Auburn a 36-27 lead at the break. The Tigers missed their first seven shots of the game but bounced back for a 52 -percent second quarter. A Frerking 3 -pointer to open the second quarter gave Auburn its first lead, and the Tigers would never trail again.

After a Frerking jumper at the buzzer gave Auburn a 20-point lead after three quarters, the Lady Techsters opened the fourth quarter on a $7-0$ run. Tech would cut the Auburn lead to as little as 10 points as the Tigers found some late foul trouble and Tech scored 30 points in the fourth. But the Tigers were able to make free throws of their own and hold off the late rally.

Rochelle Vasquez led the Lady Techsters with 22 points, and Kierra Anthony added 14.

## Game 11: Dec. 18, 2016 <br> \#24 Virginia Tech 92, Auburn 87 (OT) Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN -- Auburn made a stunning fourth-quarter comeback to send its game with No. 24 Virginia Tech to overtime, but fell just short in a 92-87 loss.

The Tigers (8-3) shot a season-high 50.8 percent from the field, scored a season-high 87 points and overcame a nine-point deficit in the final three minutes to force overtime, but the hot-shooting Hokies (11-0) made 12 3-pointers throughout the game and won it at the freethrow line in the extra period.

Sophomore Janiah McKay scored a career-high 28 points - including seven points in the final 1:08 of regulation - and got a key steal, a layup and a free throw to tie the game with 10 seconds to play. But she was lost to fouls early in the overtime period, and the Tigers' leading scorer watched the final 4:08 from the bench.

In a back-and-forth game that saw the lead change hands 10 times, Auburn found itself down by as many as 11 midway through the fourth quarter. The Tigers were able to cut that to six with a little more than a minute to go.

Trailing 75-69 with 1:08 to play in regulation, McKay made two free throws to cut it to four. After a Hokie offensive foul, McKay then knocked down a jumper with 30 seconds left to make it a two-point game. Auburn then had four fouls to give to get Tech to the free-throw line - McKay committed three of them.

After a pair of Hokie free throws pushed the lead back to four, Lewis was fouled and made the first, then after a miss, McKay stole a pass off the defensive rebound under the basket, got the layup to go and was fouled. Her free throw tied the game at 77-all, and the Hokies' last-second attempt missed to send the game to overtime.

Auburn led 81-79 with just over three minutes to play and held a one-point lead at the 1:56 mark, but the Hokies made nine free throws in the extra period to pull away for the win.

Brandy Montgomery scored 20 points, and Katie Frerking added 15. Jessica Jones had a season-high eight points and led Auburn with six rebounds, and Jazmine Jones added a season-high nine.

Game 12: Dec. 21, 2016 Auburn 85, Drake 80<br>Fogelman Arena in Devlin Fieldhouse New Orleans, La.



NEW ORLEANS -- Auburn put together its high-est-scoring half in eight years and held off a late rally to earn an $85-80$ win over Drake in the opening game of the Tulane Classic.
The Tigers ( $9-3$ ) scored 62 points in the second half - two points shy of the school record for scoring in a half - to overtime a six-point halftime deficit and earn a hard-fought win. A key to the victory was holding Drake ( $6-4$ ), one of the nation's top 3 -point shooting teams, to a season-low four treys.
Four players scored in double-figures for Auburn, led by 26 from senior Katie Frerking and 25 from sophomore Janiah McKay. Frerking also had six rebounds, a career-high four blocks and three steals, and McKay made 10-of-14 free-throw attempts, both career-highs.

Brandy Montgomery added 12 points, and Jazmine Jones had 10 points along with six rebounds and five steals. Jessica Jones pulled down a career-high 11 rebounds. All 13 players saw action for the Tigers, including junior Sira Toure, who made her Auburn debut.

McKay has now scored 53 points over the last two games after a 28 -point effort against Virginia Tech on Sunday. Frerking, meanwhile, has 56 points in two games in the state of Louisiana this season; she scored 30 at Louisiana Tech last week.

Auburn shot 58 percent in the second half to finish at 45.2 percent for the game, a remarkable turnaround after a cold first half that saw the Tigers shoot 32.2 percent and score just 23 points.

The Tigers won despite Drake shooting 52.9 percent, thanks in large part to forcing the Bulldogs into a season-high 24 turnovers, which Auburn turned into 34 points. Auburn also pulled down 12 offensive rebounds, turning that into 17 second-chance points.

Auburn finally took the lead for good on a Frerking 3-pointer with 4:54 left in the third quarter, making it 4037 Tigers. That would become a seven-point advantage at the end of a 31-point third quarter. A 17-4 run over the first four minutes of the fourth quarter gave Auburn its largest lead at 71-53.

## Game 13: Dec. 22, 2016 <br> Tulane 61, Auburn 59 <br> Fogelman Arena in Devlin Fieldhouse New Orleans, La.



NEW ORLEANS -- Auburn fought back from a 14-point third-quarter deficit but came up just short Thursday night in a 61-59 loss to Tulane in the championship game of the Tulane Classic.

After a slow start, the Tigers (9-4) shot 51.8 percent in the second half and made a late charge to within one point midway through the fourth quarter, but Tulane (8-4) hit several clutch shots down the stretch to hold on for the win.

Auburn was led by Katie Frerking, who scored all 15 of her points in the second half. She also led the Tigers with six rebounds and six steals. Janiah McKay shook off a slow start to finish with 13 points, and Brandy Montgomery added 11. Erica Sanders matched a career-high with four steals; the Tigers had 15 as a team. Frerking and McKay were named to the all-tournament team.

After forcing just four Tulane turnovers in the first half, Auburn came away with 16 in the second half, turning the Green Wave's 20 turnovers into 27 points. But Tulane was able to control the offensive glass, pulling down 13 offensive rebounds and converting those into 11 points. Both teams made 22 field goals, and both teams made nine 3-pointers - matching a season-high for Auburn.

Auburn started ice-cold, shooting 21 percent in the first quarter and 30 percent in the half as the Green Wave ended the half on an 11-0 run for a 30-20 lead. Tulane would push their advantage to as many as 14 points at 40-26 midway through the third quarter.

But Auburn fought back, ending that quarter on a 14-5 run to cut the deficit to 45-40 after three periods. After Tulane answered a Frerking layup with a basket of its own, Sanders picked up a loose ball at midcourt and took it in for the layup to cut the deficit to one point at 52-51 with 4:08 to play.

Auburn had chances to take the lead on its next two possessions but couldn't get shots to fall. Tulane then hit back-to-back $3 s$ at the other end to push its lead back to seven at 58-51 with 90 seconds left. Auburn scored five points in the final 40 seconds and benefitted from three missed Tulane free throws and had a chance at a final shot with just over a second to play, but it missed short.


AUBURN -- On her 21st birthday, Auburn junior Jessica Jones scored a career-high 15 points to lead the Tigers to a 53-41 win over Jacksonville Wednesday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (10-4) closed out the non-conference portion of the schedule by winning a defensive battle that saw both teams struggle to shoot the ball. Auburn held the Dolphins (9-4) to just eight points in the first half and held on for the win despite getting outscored in the second half.

Jessica Jones led the Tigers with 15 points and five rebounds. Her previous career-high was 11 points, which came twice during her freshman season. It was also her first time to lead Auburn in scoring in her career.

Brandy Montgomery hit double-digits with 13 points, and freshman Daisa Alexander scored a career-high seven off the bench. Janiah McKay had a game-high six assists.

Auburn's defense was stellar in the first half, holding Jacksonville under 10 percent shooting and just eight points, the fewest against Auburn in a half since 2015 against Georgia when the Bulldogs scored 11 in the second half.

The Tigers had their best night at the free-throw line in nearly nine years, hitting 11-of-12 attempts (91.7\%). It was Auburn's first time over 90 percent at the line (minimum 10 attempts) since 2008, when the Tigers were 10-of-10 vs. Mississippi State. Jacksonville outrebounded Auburn 38-31, but the Tigers had 13 steals on the night.

After Jacksonville jumped out to a 6-2 lead, Auburn finished the first half on a 24-2 run over the last six minutes of the first quarter and the entirety of the second quarter to take a 26-8 halftime lead. Jacksonville, thanks in large part to strong offensive rebounding, would cut the Auburn advantage to as little as nine points late in the fourth, but a pair of breakaway layups for Jones and late free throws from McKay sealed the win.

# Game 15: Jan. 1, 2017 Auburn 82, Florida 75 Stephen C. O'Connell Center Gainesville, Fla. 



GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Senior Katie Frerking scored her 1,000th career point and picked up her fifth double-double of the season to lead Auburn to an 82-75 win at Florida to open SEC play on New Year's Day at the O'Connell Center.

The Tigers (11-4, 1-0 SEC) earned their first win in Gainesville since 2007, pushing ahead to as much as a 14-point lead in the third quarter and holding on late for the victory. It was the fourth win in an SEC opener in the last five seasons for Auburn.

Frerking scored 24 points - 18 in the second half and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. She also contributed five steals, four assists and a block in 37 minutes of action.

Brandy Montgomery led all scorers with 26 points and was 7-for-8 from 3-point range, a career-high 3-pointers for the Auburn senior. Janiah McKay added 16 points and five assists in her return to her hometown.

The Tigers pulled ahead by as many as 14 points late in the third quarter, thanks in large part to forcing Florida into 26 turnovers and converting those into 28 points. Auburn also pulled down 18 offensive rebounds on the day, scoring 15 second-chance points.

Auburn shot 41.5 percent for the game (27-of-65) but was a blistering 52.4 percent from 3-point range (11-of21). Free-throw shooting almost became an issue late as the Tigers were 17-of-30 from the line, but Auburn made just enough to hold off the Gator rally.

Florida (9-5, 0-1) shot 50 percent from the field and outrebounded the Tigers 38-34, but Auburn's 3-point shooting proved to be the difference as the Tigers knocked down 11 outside shots to the Gators' three.


AUBURN -- Katie Frerking scored 16 points, but Auburn could not dig out of a big early hole in a 73-47 loss to No. 5 South Carolina Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (11-5, 1-1 SEC) outscored the Gamecocks (12-1, 2-0) 33-29 through the second and third quarters. But Carolina's Kaela Davis hit five 3-pointers and scored 19 points in the first quarter to push the Gamecocks to an early 23-point lead that proved insurmountable for the Tigers.

Frerking was the only player in double-figures for Auburn. Tiffany Lewis scored nine points off the bench, and Jazmine Jones had eight points and a team-best eight rebounds.

Despite a major size disadvantage, Auburn only grabbed five fewer rebounds than Carolina (37-32). The Tigers pulled down 17 offensive rebounds, turning those into 12 second-chance points. Auburn also forced South Carolina into 15 turnovers, all in the final three quarters, converting those to 15 points.

Auburn was held to a season-low 27.6 percent from the field and was 3-of-15 from 3-point range. South Carolina was an even 50 percent overall (28-of-56) and from 3 -point range (14-of-28). Carolina's 143 s were the most by an Auburn opponent this season.

After trailing by as many as 25, Auburn outscored the Gamecocks 19-12 in the second quarter to cut the halftime deficit to 41-25. Auburn would get as close as 14 points in the third quarter, but the Gamecocks pulled away late.

Davis led the Gamecocks with 21 points, all in the first half. A'ja Wilson picked up her ninth double-double of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds, and Bianca Cuevas-Moore added 19 points and seven assists off the bench.


AUBURN -- Senior Brandy Montgomery scored 25 points, and sophomore Janiah McKay picked up her first career double-double as Auburn had its highest-scoring SEC game in six years Sunday, defeating Ole Miss 83-60 at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (12-5, 2-1 SEC) were strong in all phases of the game, scoring 30 points off turnovers while shooting 50 percent from the field and 53 percent on 3 -pointers. Auburn also shared the ball well, racking up 25 assists, the most in a game in three seasons.

Montgomery's 25 points came on her best shooting day of the season - 10-of-15 (66.7\%) from the field and 5-of-6 (83.3\%) from 3-point range. In Auburn's two SEC wins, Montgomery is 12-of-14 (85.7\%) on 3-pointers, and her 25 points today moved her up to 11th all-time at Auburn with 1,486 points.

McKay scored 13 points and had 13 assists for her first career double-double. It was the most assists by an Auburn player since Najat Ouardad had 14 vs. Ole Miss in 2013, and it was Auburn's first points/assists double-double since Ouardad accomplished the feat vs. Samford in 2012.

Katie Frerking added 11 points, and Erica Sanders scored a career-high nine off the bench. Jazmine Jones led Auburn with seven rebounds, and Jessica Jones had three of Auburn's 13 steals.

The Tigers jumped out to a 30-18 lead after one quarter - Auburn's highest-scoring first quarter of the season - on the strength of 15 points off eight Ole Miss turnovers. The Tigers also took advantage of early Rebel foul trouble, hitting 10-of-10 attempts at the line in the opening period.

Ole Miss (12-4, 1-2 SEC) would get no closer than 11 points the rest of the way as Auburn extended its lead to 46-31 at halftime. The Tigers then opened the second half on a 7-0 run and never looked back.

Auburn's 23-point margin of victory was its largest in an SEC game since the 2012-13 season when the Tigers picked up a 24-point win, also over Ole Miss.


NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Auburn overcame a 17-point third-quarter deficit to pick up its third SEC win of the season, defeating Vanderbilt 64-59 in SEC women's basketball action Thursday night at Memorial Gym.

Three players scored in double-figures for the Tigers (13-5, 3-1 SEC), led by 18 from senior Katie Frerking and 16 from senior Brandy Montgomery.

It was the second comeback of 17 points for Auburn this season; the Tigers also rallied from a 17-point deficit in the fourth quarter against Indiana on Nov. 27.

The Commodores (10-7, 0-4 SEC) led 45-28 with 5:27 to play in the third quarter, shooting 66.7 percent in the period. But aided by three straight Vandy turnovers, Auburn went on a 12-0 run to cut the deficit to as few as five points, ending the third quarter down seven at 49-42.

Auburn was ice-cold from 3-point range until the final minutes, missing their first 13 attempts. But Montgomery hit her first with 6:24 to play to cut the deficit to four points at 53-49. Another trey from Montgomery two minutes later made it a one-point game at 55-54, and a 3-point play just 30 seconds later gave Auburn its first lead in 30+ minutes at 56-55.

Vandy would tie the game on two more occasions down the stretch, but Auburn would never trail again. Janiah McKay split the defense for a layup with just under a minute to go to put Auburn up 61-59, and Montgomery made three free throws in the closing seconds to ice it. Of Montgomery's 16 points, 14 came in the fourth quarter.

Auburn forced Vanderbilt into 24 turnovers, converting those into 24 points - 17 of those points coming on 10 second-half turnovers. Frerking had three steals, while McKay, Erica Sanders and Jessica Jones had two apiece.

McKay finished with 13 points. Frerking led Auburn with eight rebounds while Jessica Jones had seven.

After 12 first-half turnovers, Auburn did not turn the ball over once in the second half. The Tigers shot 39.3 percent for the game but finished strong, shooting 50 percent in the fourth quarter.
Game 19: Jan. 19, 2017 Auburn 79, Tennessee 61 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN -- Sophomore Janiah McKay scored a ca-reer-high 29 points to lead Auburn women's basketball to its first win over Tennessee since 2009, a 79-61 victory at Auburn Arena Thursday night.

For the second straight game and third time this season, Auburn (14-5, 4-1 SEC) found itself down by 17 points, this time in the first quarter as the Lady Vols (11-7, 2-3) opened the game on a $25-8$ run. But for the second straight game and third time this season, the Tigers overcame that deficit - and this time it only took one quarter.

A 3-pointer from Katie Frerking at the halftime buzzer gave Auburn a 38-36 lead, and the Tigers would never trail again, increasing their lead to as many as 23 points in the fourth quarter.

McKay's 29 points were one more than her previous high, a 28-point effort against Virginia Tech on Dec. 18. She was a perfect 3-for-3 on 3-pointers and was 11-for-21 from the field, season-highs in all categories. Frerking added 22 points on 8-of-14 shooting and pulled down a team-leading seven rebounds.

Auburn's defense paced the comeback, forcing the Lady Vols into 22 turnovers that turned into 33 Auburn points - all but one turnover coming in the final three quarters. Jessica Jones and Erica Sanders led Auburn with four steals apiece, and Sanders added a career-high five assists.

The Lady Vols had just a one-rebound advantage on the boards, 31-30, as the Tigers pulled down 14 offensive rebounds on the night. The Tigers shot 50.8 percent from the floor; after missing their first five shots of the game, Auburn shot 56 percent the rest of the way. Auburn scored 46 points in the paint to Tennessee's 28.

It was Auburn's first win over Tennessee since the 2009 SEC Championship season when the Tigers beat the Lady Vols twice; the victory snapped a nine-game losing streak in the series. The 17-point margin was Auburn's largest over Tennessee in a regular-season game.


AUBURN -- Senior Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 22 points, but Auburn fell just short in a back-and-forth contest with Kentucky, 64-60, in SEC women's basketball action Sunday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (14-6, 4-2 SEC) saw a three-game winning streak snapped at the hands of the Wildcats (14-6, 5-2 SEC), who have now won four straight. The teams traded the lead nine times over the course of the game, including five times in the fourth quarter, but Auburn was unable to get a pair of key defensive stops late as Kentucky scored on its final two possessions to secure the victory.

Auburn was a perfect 14-for-14 at the free-throw line, the first time for the Tigers to make all of its attempts at the line since Dec. 1, 2000, when they were 12-for-12 against Ball State.

Montgomery's 22 points led all scorers and marked her sixth 20+ point effort of the season. She also led the Tigers with a season-high eight rebounds. Katie Frerking added 16 points, and Jazmine Jones and Janiah McKay had eight apiece.

The Tigers shot 37.3 percent from the field but struggled the most late, going just 4-for-14 in the crucial fourth quarter. Meanwhile, Kentucky put up a 58.3-percent fourth period, moving ahead by as many as five points. Auburn was just 2-of-17 from 3-point range while the Wildcats knocked down seven treys. Auburn forced Kentucky into 19 turnovers, turning those into 23 points.

Trailing 26-18 with just over 90 second to play in the first half, Montgomery scored eight straight points including back-to-back 3-pointers - to lead the Tigers on an 8-1 run to finish the half down just three at 29-26. Auburn would then open the third quarter on a $10-0$ run and grab its largest lead at 36-29 just two minutes into the period.

Auburn rallied to tie the game at 58-58 on a pair of Montgomery free throws with 1:22 left, but the Wildcats would answer again, scoring on each of their final two possessions to secure the victory.

## Game 21: Jan. 26, 2017

Missouri 68, Auburn 53

> Mizzou Arena Columbia, Mo.


COLUMBIA, Mo. -- Janiah McKay scored 14 points and Emari Jones added a career-high 11, but Auburn dropped its first SEC road game of the year, falling at Missouri 68-53 Thursday night.

Auburn (14-7, 4-3 SEC) went cold in the second half as Missouri's Cierra Porter scored a career-high 27 points to lead all scorers. Mizzou improved to 15-7 overall, 5-3 in the SEC.

Auburn shot 30.4 percent from the field while allowing Missouri to shoot 53.3 percent, the highest by an Auburn opponent this season. Known as a 3-point shooting team, Missouri took the ball inside, outscoring Auburn in the paint 36-16. Missouri also controlled the boards, outrebounding Auburn 40-27.

Eight of McKay's 14 points came at the free-throw line, but Auburn was just 13-of-22 at the stripe one game after hitting all 14 attempts against Kentucky. Katie Frerking added 10 points for Auburn, and Jessica Jones was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

Free throws kept Auburn in a foul-plagued game - a combined 47 fouls led to 42 free-throw attempts through a third quarter where the Tigers made just one field goal; Mizzou took a 47-37 lead after three. But the shooting woes continued until late in the fourth as Auburn made just three shots in the first eight minutes of the final period. Meanwhile, Missouri kept feeding Porter, who scored 13 of her 27 in the final 10 minutes, extending their lead to as many as 22 points late in the quarter.

Missouri maintained a slim lead for most of the first half, taking a 33-26 lead at the half. Mizzou, outrebounding Auburn 22-10 and shooting 58 percent from the field, led by as many as 11 late in the second quarter before Auburn ended the period on a 4-0 run.


TUSCALOOSA, Ala. -- A 26-point night from Janiah McKay and 20 points from Katie Frerking - including 12 in the fourth quarter - led Auburn to a comeback victory over Alabama, 66-55, Sunday night at Coleman Coliseum.

The Tigers (15-7, 5-3 SEC) trailed by as many as eight points in the third quarter before opening the fourth on a 16-4 run. A pair of Frerking 3-pointers to open the final period gave Auburn its first lead since early in the second quarter, and the Tigers never trailed again.

Frerking scored 12 of her 20 points in the fourth quarter as Auburn outscored Alabama (15-7, 3-6 SEC) 25-11 in the final 10 minutes. In Auburn's last three games with Alabama - all victories - Frerking has scored at least 20 points. Frerking also had four steals. McKay, meanwhile, was 10-of-19 from the field and 6-of-7 at the free-throw line for her second $20+$ point game in SEC play.

Erica Sanders and Khady Dieng made their first starts of the season in place of Jazmine and Jessica Jones, who had not practiced the last two days while suffering from flu-like symptoms. Sanders tallied six points in her first career start. Brandy Montgomery was held scoreless on the day but was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

Despite the illness, the Jones twins both played significant minutes - Jessica played 24 minutes with six points and three rebounds, and Jazmine had three rebounds and two assists in 13 minutes.

Auburn found itself down 37-29 midway through the third quarter after missing its first seven shots of the period. But the Tigers made five of their last seven in the third to cut the deficit to three points at 44-41 entering the fourth.

Frerking knocked down a 3-pointer on Auburn's first possession of the fourth to tie the game, then hit another less than a minute later to give Auburn a 47-44 lead it would never relinquish. It was a 16-2 run over the first five-plus minutes of the final period to push Auburn to a double-digit lead.

Auburn forced Alabama into 22 turnovers, converting those into 28 points. The Tigers had just 10 turnovers in the game and only three in the second half.


AUBURN -- Auburn got 17 points from Brandy Montgomery and 13 from Katie Frerking, but No. 5/4 Mississippi State pulled away in the fourth quarter to down the Tigers 77-47 Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (15-8, 5-4 SEC) cut what had been a 21-point first-quarter deficit to as few as six points in the third, but the Bulldogs (22-1, 8-1) used a big run over the end of the third and start of the fourth quarters to gain an insurmountable lead.

Montgomery's 17 points tied for the game-high with MSU's Victoria Vivians. Jazmine Jones, Erica Sanders and Emari Jones tied for the Auburn lead in rebounds with four apiece, and Khady Dieng contributed three steals.

MSU jumped out to a big early lead, leading by as many as 21 in the first quarter on the strength of its inside game. But Auburn fought back to cut the halftime deficit to 15 points at 39-24.

A pair of Montgomery 3-pointers sparked an 18-9 run over the first seven-plus minutes of the third quarter to cut the Bulldogs' lead to just six at 48-42. But State ended the third quarter on an 8-0 run, then started the fourth on a 9-0 run before a Montgomery jumper at the 6:52 mark ended a six-minute scoring drought for the Tigers.

MSU outrebounded Auburn 39-22 and held the Tigers to 35.3 -percent shooting. The Bulldogs were an even 50 percent from the floor and 9-of-20 (45\%) on 3-pointers. Auburn was outscored 28-26 in the paint and 26-22 off turnovers; it was the first time this season for an opponent to score more points off turnovers.

Victoria Vivians led MSU with 17 points while Chinwe Okorie had 16 and Teaira McCowan added 15 off the bench.


COLLEGE STATION, Texas -- Auburn's Katie Frerking scored a career-high 32 points, but the Tigers fell short at Texas A\&M Sunday afternoon, 66-61.

The Tigers (15-9, 5-5 SEC) shook off a slow start and led by as many as five points in the third quarter, but Texas A\&M (17-6, 7-3) made several key shots and was solid at the free-throw line down the stretch to secure the win.

Frerking was 13-of-22 from the floor and made three 3-pointers. She also attempted all four of Auburn's free throws in the game - all in the fourth quarter - hitting three. Frerking was also Auburn's leading rebounder with eight. Brandy Montgomery added with points, and three players finished with six.

Texas A\&M was 18-of-23 at the free-throw line and outrebounded Auburn 49-28. The Aggies turned 20 offensive rebounds into 23 second-chance points. Auburn was only able to force 14 A\&M turnovers, a season-low for an Auburn opponent, and converted those into a season-low 12 points.

Tied 47-47 after three periods, Montgomery hit a 3-pointer to give Auburn a 50-47 lead with 9:30 to play. But the Tigers would not score for the next six minutes while the Aggies took a three-point lead. Auburn got back within a point with less than two minutes to play, but the Aggies would not miss another shot the rest of the way, hitting their only field goal attempt and going 8-for-8 at the line in the final minutes.

A\&M led 15-7 after one quarter despite seven turnovers. The Aggies had 22 rebounds in the opening period to Auburn's six. But Auburn opened the second quarter on a 14-5 run - the first 10 points of which were scored by Frerking - to take a 21-20 lead at the media timeout. A layup from Jessica Jones at the 5:00 mark gave Auburn its first lead of the day.

An Erica Sanders steal in the final 10 seconds of the half led to a Frerking layup at the buzzer, her 14th point of the quarter, to give Auburn a 30-28 halftime lead.

Auburn out-shot the Aggies, 41.0 percent to 35.1 percent, and both teams hit eight 3-pointers. The Tigers committed a season-low eight turnovers.

COLUMBIA, S.C.-- Auburn held No. 6 South Carolina to its lowest scoring output of the season, but the Tigers came up short in a 60-41 loss to the Gamecocks Thursday night in SEC women's basketball action at Colonial Life Arena.

The Tigers (15-10, 5-6 SEC) could not overcome poor shooting through the first three quarters, and avoided a season-low shooting percentage by posting a 71-percent fourth quarter. Meanwhile, South Carolina (21-2, 11-1 SEC) took advantage of their massive edge in size, scoring 34 of its 60 points in the paint.

Katie Frerking led the Tigers with 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range. Freshman Tyra Johnson added a career-high 10 points on a ca-reer-most 19 minutes, hitting a pair of 3 -pointers as well. Seven of Auburn's 14 made field goals were 3-pointers. The Tigers' bench scored 19 points as Tiffany Lewis added five and Emari Jones had four.

Auburn trailed by just five after one period, 14-9, despite shooting just 25 percent in the opening 10 minutes. But the Tigers stayed cold in the second quarter, making just 2-of-12 shots and trailed 29-16 at the break.

The Gamecocks, however, broke things open early in the third quarter, hitting their first six shots and putting together a 14-5 run to extend the lead to 43-21. Carolina's largest lead would be 25 points, but Auburn outscored the Gamecocks 16-11 in the fourth quarter to cut the final margin under 20 points.

Carolina's post players led the way as A'ja Wilson scored 17 points and Alaina Coates had 16. The Gamecocks shot 56.8 percent from the floor, a season-high by an Auburn opponent.


AUBURN -- A season-high crowd of 3,464 fans saw Auburn fight to the very end with Ceorgia but come up short in a 57-51 loss Sunday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (15-11, 5-7 SEC) shot a season-low 24.6 percent and gave up 32 defensive rebounds to Georgia (13-12, 5-7), who overcame 22 turnovers to earn its second straight victory over Auburn.

Brandy Montgomery scored 16 points while Katie Frerking added 13 and Janiah McKay had 12. Frerking was the Tigers' leading rebounder with eight.

Auburn scored 16 points off 22 Ceorgia turnovers, but the Lady Bulldogs took advantage of 15 offensive rebounds, turning those into 19 second-chance points. The Tigers also had plenty of opportunities at the freethrow line in the second half but finished 16-of-25 (64\%) from the line.

Georgia led for the majority of the game, but neither team could gain a foothold until the Lady Bulldogs pulled away in the final minute. Georgia led by one after one quarter (14-13), again by one at halftime (26-25) and by four after three quarters (42-38).

A 3-pointer from Janiah McKay pulled the Tigers within a point at 48-47 with 4:27 to play, but the Tigers would make just one more field goal and two free throws the rest of the way

Georgia shot 40.4 percent from the field and connected on 16-of-20 free throw (80\%). The Lady Bulldogs outrebounded Auburn 47-30. Caliya Robinson led Ceorgia with 13 points off the bench, and Mackenzie Engram had 12 points and 10 rebounds.


OXFORD, Miss. -- Brandy Montgomery scored 19 points, but Auburn's comeback bid fell short at Ole Miss in a 63-59 loss Thursday night.

The Tigers trailed by as many as nine midway through the fourth quarter but cut the deficit to two points in the final minute. But Auburn missed six free throws in the fourth quarter and nine in the game, and could not complete the comeback.

Montgomery, who scored 11 points in the fourth quarter, was Auburn's only player in double figures. Katie Frerking, Tiffany Lewis and Jessica Jones had nine points each. Lewis made her first start at Auburn in tonight's game.

Jones finished with a game-high 10 rebounds as Auburn won the rebounding battle 42-38; it was the first time this season for Auburn to fall when outrebounding its opponent.

Ole Miss built its lead on the strength of 26 points from Shandricka Sessom, who hit six 3-pointers on the night. The Rebels sealed the win at the free-throw line with Alissa Alston hitting eight in the final minutes; she finished with 14 points.

Auburn found itself in a tie game at halftime, 26-26, for the first time this season. The Tigers trailed for most of the first half and were down eight with 6:22 to play in the second quarter. But Auburn went on a 9-0 run to take its first lead since the opening minute on a Montgomery tip-in that made it 21-20. Ole Miss pulled back ahead 26-21, but a 3-pointer from Lewis and a layup from an offensive rebound by Jessica Jones in the final seconds pulled Auburn back even at the break.

Auburn shot 34 percent from the field, but just 36 percent (5-14) at the free-throw line. Ole Miss was 41 percent from the floor and made $19-0 f-29$ free throws ( $66 \%$ ). The Tigers scored 22 points off 20 Ole Miss turnovers.


AUBURN -- Auburn sophomore Janiah McKay matched a career-high with 29 points, but an Alabama layup in the final seconds of overtime gave the Crimson Tide a 63-61 win at Auburn Arena Thursday night.

Alabama's Hannah Cook broke a 61-all tie with 5.6 seconds left in overtime, and McKay's driving attempt at the buzzer would not fall to force a second extra period. In a game that saw the lead change hands 16 times, Auburn gave up a six-point lead in the fourth quarter to an 11-0 Alabama run, then answered with a 7-0 run of its own to take a $53-51$ lead. Cook hit a shot-clock beating jumper with 39 seconds left to tie the game, then missed two free throws with 0.3 seconds remaining on the clock to send the game to overtime.

McKay's 29 points matched her effort in the Tigers' win over Tennessee earlier this season. She made 11 field goals, including one 3-pointer, and was 6-of-7 at the freethrow line. She also had a team-leading four steals.

Senior Katie Frerking was Auburn's only other player in double-figures with 16 points, including two big shots that tied the game in the extra period, and led the Tigers with four assists and three blocks. Jazmine Jones had eight rebounds to lead Auburn.

Auburn forced Alabama into 24 turnovers, converting those into 21 points. Both teams shot 33.3 percent from the field, but Alabama made 18-of-23 free throws while Auburn made 8-of-10.

The Tigers trailed by two at halftime, 27-25, but outscored the Tide 18-11 in the third, thanks in large part to 12 points from McKay. She scored the final six points of the quarter - two fast-break layups off steals and a pair of free throws - to put the Tigers ahead 43-38 headed to the final period.

Alabama held a 56-36 edge in rebounding and scored 21 points off 20 offensive rebounds. Cook finished with 15 points and 13 rebounds to lead Alabama in both categories. The Tide had four players in double figures. Cook led the Tide with 15 points and 13 rebounds.


AUBURN -- Auburn finished the game on an 11-1 run over the final 90 seconds to pull off a come-from-behind 54-49 win over LSU Thursday night in SEC women's basketball action at Auburn Arena.

On a night when shots simply would not fall for Auburn, the Tigers ( $16-13,6-9$ SEC) found a way to win, getting key stops, forcing turnovers, taking charges and sinking free throws down the stretch to snap a six-game losing streak.

Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 15 points on her Senior Night. The other two seniors, Katie Frerking and Khady Dieng, shared the team lead with six rebounds; Frerking also had 10 points. Sophomore Janiah McKay added 14 points to give Auburn three players in dou-ble-figures.

Auburn trailed 48-43 with 1:29 to play in the game. The comeback started with a pair of free throw from McKay to cut the lead to two, then she drove to the basket for a layup to make it a one-point game with 49 seconds left.

Just 16 seconds later, a steal from Erica Sanders led to a breakaway layup for Jessica Jones, giving Auburn its first lead since late in the third quarter, 49-48. LSU tied it at the free-throw line as Jones fouled out before any time ran off the clock. But LSU committed another foul to send Frerking to the line, where she made one to put Auburn back ahead 50-49.

At the other end, Jazmine Jones drew a charge to give Auburn the ball back, and Frerking and Montgomery each made two free throws in the final seconds to secure the win.

Auburn shot just 29 percent for the game (19-of-65), but made two more field goals than LSU ( $17-10,7-8$ SEC), who was 17-of-36 (38.6\%) from the field. But Auburn forced LSU into 29 turnovers - the second-most ever by an SEC opponent against Auburn - converting those into 28 points.

Auburn led 26-24 at halftime after Emari Jones dropped in a layup at the buzzer. The third quarter was an offensive struggle for both teams, but LSU pulled ahead 33-32 after outscoring Auburn 9-6 in the period.
