Game 24: Florida 57, Arkansas 53 February 9, 2017 * Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla. Six of Florida's last seven games have been decided by single digits and tonight's finally ended in favor of the Gators, who topped Arkansas, 57-53, and capped its mini two-game home stand at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Thursday evening.

Senior Ronni Williams scored 13 of her team-high 15 points in the second half to go along with 12 rebounds for the 20th double-double of her career. Junior Haley Lorenzen added 14 points, while freshman Sydney Morang tied her career-best of 12 points, all coming from beyond the arc.

Arkansas used a 12-0 run over a 2:09 span early in the third quarter that flipped a 30-23 Gator lead into a 35-30 Razorback advantage. Florida committed four turnovers during that span and couldn't even attempt a shot, as Arkansas assumed its largest lead of the game to that point and forced a Gator timeout with 5:35 remaining in the quarter

Florida regrouped and ended the third on a 9-3 run – that included the final seven points with **Dyandria Anderson** drilling a three-pointer – and held a 39-38 lead entering the final frame.

The Razorbacks scored the first four points of the fourth quarter before Morang hit a three that tied the score at 42 and sparked a 9-0 Gator run with Williams netting four points and Lorenzen two

The teams traded buckets for the next minute-plus before both teams went cold from the floor, the scoring drought lasting two minutes and 34 seconds. Arkansas broke free first and cut Florida's deficit to two points, 50-48, with 1:47 remaining.

Lorenzen followed with a jumper from the corner, but Jessica Jackson, who finished with a gamehigh 17 points, came back and scored 15 seconds later, as the it remaining a two-point game with

Both teams had fouls to give before the bonus and that took time off the clock. Williams broke the trend and scored a fall-away for a 54-50 lead and 44 seconds to go.

Arkansas' Jailyn Mason needed just 10 seconds to nail a three-pointer and Florida's lead was trimmed to one. Arkansas fouled again twice and then forced a Florida turnover when the Gators were trying to in-bound the ball with 20 seconds remaining.

Jackson's layup didn't fall and Anderson scrambled to the floor for the loose ball and corralled it before being fouled. She stepped to the line and coolly sank both free throw attempts for a 56-53 lead and seven seconds to go.

Anderson then came up with a steal and was fouled with 2.2 seconds to play. She missed the first, but hit the second to give Florida the 57-53 lead and the win.

Numbers of Note

- Florida held the 42-31 rebounding advantage that included 17 offensive boards.
- The Gators committed 25 turnovers that Arkansas converted into 27 points
- The last time Florida won a game scoring 57 or fewer points was Feb. 28, 2016, when the Gators defeated Auburn 56-49 in Gainesville.
- Aside from provided Florida's final three points from the free throw line with seven seconds remaining that iced the game, **Dyandria Anderson** finished with six points, seven assists, seven rebounds and four steals

Florida Head Coach Amanda Butler - Opening Statement: "You know, you try to predict what teams are going to do at the end of games. We spend a part of practice every day working on our specials and what we think their specials are, and tonight that paid off. I think our kids had a lot of defensive confidence because we ran through some of those scenarios. March 16, 1994 * College Station, Texas * NCAA West - First Round Florida, the No. 4 seed in the West, faced a tough Texas A&M squad on the road in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament in College Station. Texas.

The Lady Gators were unable to host the event due to a Rod Stewart concert scheduled in the O'Connell Center that weekend.

With the strong support of a vocal 2,573 fans, Texas A&M built an early lead and led by as many as 14 points in the first half before holding off a late Florida charge that tied the game with just over two minutes remaining to record a 78-76 upset over the visiting Lady Gators.

Florida was led by the efforts of junior Merlakia Jones, who played the entire 40 minutes. Jones, who scored 10 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the first half alone and finished with 20 points and a career-high 18 boards, kept the Lady Gators in the game.

UF shot only 36% from the floor in the opening half and turned the ball over 13 times, allowing the Aggies to build a nine-point halftime lead.

With improved ball protection (five turnovers) and shooting 50 percent from the floor, UF mounted a comeback in the second half in an attempt to overcome A&M's upset bid

Trailing by three with 2:31 remaining in the contest, senior guard Kerry Cremeans hit her first three-pointer of the evening on an assist from fellow senior **Amanda Butler** to tied the score at 74. Takilya Davis hit a jumper to put Florida up for the first time, 76-74, since the opening minutes of the game, before Lisa Branch hit a layup to deadlock the score again.

With a chance to break the tie, Florida turned the ball over with :21 seconds remaining on the clock. On the final possession with :04 left in the game, Branch, who was fouled on a drive to the basket, hit a pair of free throws for the final margin of victory to give Texas A&M the upset win.

The game marked the final appearance for Lady Gator seniors

Amanda Butler and Cremeans. Butler, who hit three bombs from beyond
the three-point arc in the second half, finished with 15 points and five assists.

Freshman DeLisha Milton finished with a double-double, recording 11 points and 12 rebounds. Takilya Davis was Florida's leading scorer with 21 points.

Freshman Delicia Washington scored a game-high 25 points to lead the Gators, who dropped an 84-76 decision to Texas A&M at Reed Arena Thursday evening.

Rebounding and an Aggie scoring run late in the third quarter were the keys to the game, as Florida dropped its second game this season to Texas A&M by single digits.

TAMU held a 44-28 rebounding advantage, Florida's largest rebound deficit of the year. 18 of the Aggies rebounds were on the offensive end.

It was a tough third quarter for the Gators, who were outscored, 24-16, during the frame. After **Haley Lorenzen** knocked down a three-pointer from the top of the arc, Texas A&M ripped off a game-changing 15-3 run, as Florida went from down two at 51-49, to trailing by 14 points, 66-52.

Washington ended the third with a three-point-play and the Gators were within 11 points entering

TAMU began the final frame with a three-pointer and extended its lead back to 14, before the Gators used a 9-0 spurt and cut their deficit to five points, 69-64. A turnover prevented an even longer run and the Aggies made them pay by scoring the next five points, with the second bucket appearing to be a dagger three that forced UF into a timeout.

The Gators never gave up and came out of the huddle with the next four points thanks to Washington and Lorenzen and were back within six, 74-68, with 3:39 remaining

The teams traded buckets, but Florida's two field goals where three-pointers, both by Gator freshman Sydney Morang, who knocked down her career-best fourth three-pointer of the game and Florida was within four points, 78-74, with 1:38 to go.

An Aggie miss on the other end gave Florida a chance to get even closer, but **Ronni Williams** missed two free throws with 61 seconds remaining and TAMU came down and knocked down a pair from the line for a six-point lead and 37 seconds on the clock

TAMU came back with three more points and Florida just couldn't get any of its final shots to fall, as the Aggies continued to connect from the free throw in the final moments to secure the win

Florida converted four more shots than Texas A&M, however, nine of the Aggies were from beyond the three-point arc and they used that to their advantage in a hard fought, 67-59, decision against the Gators at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Sunday afternoon.

Florida held a 36-35 halftime lead, the first time it has taken a lead into the locker room in a Southeastern Conference game this season, as there were three lead changes and four tied scores in the opening 20 minutes of action.

It was back and forth action to begin the second half and after Haley Lorenzen's jumper tied the score at 40 with 6:38 remaining in the third, Texas A&M mounted a 14-5 run over the next 5:01 for a 54-45 lead. Ronni Williams, who finished with a team-high 22 points on 11-of-19 shooting, ended the quarter's scoring with a layup and Florida was within seven points entering the fourth quarter.

Williams picked up where she left off and scored the first points of the final frame and the Gator deficit was down to five, 54-49, with 8:44 left

The Aggies came right back, pounding the defensive glass that limited Florida's second chance opportunities, and used a 12-2 run on the offensive end over a 3:43 span to build a 66-51 lead with 2:37 remaining in the game.

Danni Williams, who leads the SEC scoring, knocked down eight points during that game deciding run, including a pair of three-pointers, as she led the Aggies from beyond the arc by converted 5-of-9 en route to a game-high 25 points.

- The winner of the game between the Gators and Razorbacks will play 6-seed Texas A&M (19-10, 9-7 SEC) on Thursday at 8:30 p.m. ET
- SEC Network will broadcast every game in the first three rounds (the first 10 games) of the tournament, with Pam Ward & Gail Goestenkors calling the action on Florida's side of the bracket, with Gator great Steffi Sorensen serving as the sideline analyst throughout.

SEC Tournament Skinny

Notes from Florida's Last Game: defeated GEORGIA, 65-58 (Feb. 26)

- UF's seniors led the way, as Ronni Williams scored and game-high 31 points and Tyshara Fleming collected a game-high nine rebounds.
- The Gators used a 15-6 run to close the game and secure their first win at home against Georgia since Feb. 19, 2012.
- The victory also marked just the fourth time in the 70-game series between the two teams the Florida has won consecutive games. The last time the Gators earned back-to-back wins against their Southeastern Conference rivals was during the 2003-04 season.
- Florida took the 76-68 decision in Athens on January 22.

 In what has become a classic tight rivalry game where entering Sunday's battle 15 of the last 16 meetings between the two teams have been decided by 11 points or less, this one followed that trend as it featured 11 tied scores and five lead changes.

What's Next for the Gators

 Florida must win two games at the SEC Tournament to guarantee a .500 overall record to be eligible for the WNIT postseason tournament.

First Time for Everything

 After Sunday's 31-point performance over Georgia, Ronni Williams ended the SEC season with a scoring average of 20.1 per league game and became the first Gator ever to lead the SEC in scoring - in league games or overall!

Williams in Rare Gator Company

- Ronni Williams led UF in scoring as a sophomore and junior and is doing so again this season.
- Only two other Gators have been the Gator's leading scorer in three different seasons: U.S. Olympian Tammy Jackson led the team in 1981-82, 1982-83 and 1984-85; and WNBA star Merlakia Jones was UF's leading scorer in 1991-92, 1993-94 and 1994-85.
- Williams will become the first Gator ever to lead the team in scoring in three consecutive seasons.

Gator Watch

In addition to leading the Gators in scoring with 19.1 points per game (20.1 ppg in SEC games), **Ronni Williams** also leads the squad in rebounding (7.8 pg) and free throw percentage (74.2%) and is second for assists (67) and field goal percentage (54.0%).

- She has scored in every game she has played during her career.

Copeland Named to SEC Community Service Team

- Junior Brooke Copeland was honored with a spot on the SEC Community Service
- This the 19th year for the SEC Community Service Team for women's basketball and Copeland has been Florida's honoree each of the last three seasons, tying Sarah Lowe (2004, 2005, 2006) as the only other three-time recipient in program history.
- Copeland and fellow 2017 SEC Community Service Team member Lianna Doty of Missouri, are two of only seven women all-time who have been three-time honorees in league history, joining Blanche Alverson

(Auburn), Rebecca Kates (Mississippi State), Rebecca Rowsey (Georgia), Sarah Lowe and Sarah Pfeifer (Arkansas).

Class Act vs. Georgia

- The January 22 win at Georgia marked UF's sixth win ever against the Lady Bulldogs in Athens.
- Ronni Williams UF's lone four-year senior – and the current junior class of Dyandria Anderson, Brooke Copeland and Haley Lorenzen became the only Gators in program history to have defeated Georgia twice in Athens during their career.

Opened with 9 ... Then had 10 ... Back to 9 ... Down to 8

- The Gators opened the season with a 12-player roster, however just nine suited up for the first four games of the 2016-17 campaign.
- During the fifth game (at Northwestern, Nov. 25), freshman **Sydney Morang** suited up and played three minutes. Morang had not played prior to this due to concussion symptoms. After undergoing months of testing and observation, she was cleared by physicians to finally play in a game.
- Testing showed that freshman Elif Portakal broke a bone in her foot and was ruled out of game action beginning Dec. 8 at Florida State. She missed 10 games and returned to the court Jan. 22 at Georgia. Her return marked nine players ready for action!
- In the days following the FSU game, thenleading scorer Eleanna Christinaki parted ways with the team, leaving the Gators with eight players for their Dec. 11 game against N.C. A&T.
- Senior Simone Westbrook, a member of the 2016 SEC All-Defensive Team, tore her ACL in August and will miss the season.
- Junior Funda Nakkasoglu joined the Gators from Utah State and must sit out the year per NCAA rules for transfers.

Worth the Wait!

- After 8,799 round-trip miles traveled via 13 bus trips, seven airplane flights, 11 different hotels and 12 games played over a 48-day span, the Gators finally played a home game!
- Florida played host to and defeated Southeastern Louisiana on December 28, 102-51, after patiently waiting for the \$64.5 million renovations to be completed on the newly renamed Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Welcome Back

- Freshman Elif Portakal had been sidelined with an injury and missed the last 10 games prior to entering the January 22 contest against Georgia at the 5:13 mark of the second quarter.
- She needed just nine seconds to make her presence felt, finding her way to the free throw line where she made her first attempt and finished the half with three points.
- She is UF's only true point guard on the roster without a season-ending injury.

Senior Ronni Williams, junior Haley Lorenzen and sophomore Eleanna Christinaki each tallied 16, while senior Tyshara Fleming added 11 points, as all nine Gators who suited up scored in the 52-point win that was tied for the largest season-opening margin of victory in the program's 43-year

Junior Brooke Copeland and freshman Delicia Washington both scored eight points and both col-

Dyandria Anderson posted a game-high six assists with a career-best six steals

Florida dished 23 assists on its 38 baskets, with eight Gators having a least one. Christinaki tallied five assists, as did freshman Elif Portakal.

The potent Gator offense was a little slow getting on the board initially, as Christinaki was the first to score on a layup 2:37 into the game. South Alabama came right back just a jumper from LaNeetra Guillory, before Williams, who corralled 10 rebounds for her 14th double-double of her career, netted an inside bucket and the Gators ripped off 17-2 run to end the first quarter and never looked back, taking a 37-15 halftime lead.

Florida scored the first 20 point of the third quarter when it really blew the game open on the strength of its inside poise. Florida hit 63.2 percent (12-19) from the floor during the third period and extended their advantage in the paint, where they eventually earned a 56-4 differential

Defense was, however, what UF head coach Amanda Butler was most proud of during the game, as the Gators totaled 20 stelas and forced 32 turnovers that resulted in 36 points and helped account for 22 fast break points.

Christinaki's scoring output is the most by a Gator since Dec. 21, 2013 when Christin Mercer netted 31 against FIU.

Haley Lorenzen, who finished with 16 points and five rebounds, opened the scoring in the fourth. UTC countered with a three-point-play and tied the score at 54. The teams traded buckets for the next minute-plus, before Christinaki hit a turn-around eight-footer in the paint and Ronni Williams followed with a jumper from the corner that gave UF a 63-58 lead with 6:06 on the clock.

Williams ended the game with 10 points and eight rebounds.

Florida's height played a notable factor in the game, as the Gators swatted a season-high 10 shots – tied for the eighth-most in program history – from six different players, outscored the 49ers, 62-12, in the paint and won the rebounding battle, 55-35.

That height also played a role in Florida's dishing 30 assists on its 37 field goals. Eight different Gators had at least two of those assists, which was the second-most in program history. The last time the Gators dished as many was on Nov. 27, 2005 against Stetson. Junior **Brooke Copeland**'s career-best six assists led the team effort.

How it HappenedLong Beach State hit three consecutive three-pointers in a 9-0 run and took an early seven-point lead. **Delicia Washington** scored the next six points of the game and ignited a 20-5 run that gave Florida a 27-18 lead with 4:34 remaining in the first half.

During the run, Williams put back an offensive rebound that was her 1,000th career point, as she tied the game at 17 and the Gators never trailed again.

The teams traded buckets before the Gators closed the half with a 9-3 march and took a 38-26

Florida ripped out of the second half scoring the first nine points, the first six by Haley Lorenzen, who finished with 12 points, and the Gators upped their lead to 21 points, 47-26, and were never threatened again.

Florida led by 12 points entering the fourth quarter when Arizona State came alive and outscored the Gators by 18 and earned a 69-63 win in the Arizona State Classic title game.

Entering the deciding fourth quarter, the Sun Devils had shot a mere 26.4 percent (14-53) from the floor. During the final 10 minutes, ASU converted 13-of-14 from the floor (92.9 percent), held UF to 35.3 percent (6-17) and outrebounded the Gators, 10-5.

With UF leading 57-50 and five minutes to play, the Sun Devils ended the game with a 19-6 run.

The Gators frontcourt struggled with foul trouble all game long, as their three primary posts each had two personals less than 13 minutes into the game. That eventually caught up with their paint defense in the fourth quarter when the Sun Devils had their way inside

Eleanna Christinaki and **Sydney Searcy** were the only Gators to score in double-figures with 18 and 11, respectively. For Searcy, who hit all four of her field goal attempts, it was a career-best output.

How it Happened

With the game tied at halftime, Florida outscored ASU, 21-9, in the third quarter by converting 57.1 percent (8-14) of its shots and seemed to have the momentum, as the hosts managed to shoot just 13.3 percent (2-15).

The Sun Devils began the crucial fourth quarter scoring the first seven points and were within five points with 8:14 remaining. The team traded scores for the next three-plus minutes before Arizona State made its final game-ended run to capture its home tournament title.

Double-Digit Gators

- Christinaki's 18 points were a game-high and her 24th career double-figure scoring game
- Searcy's 11 points were two more than her previous career-best number for the first doublefigure scoring game of her young career

- Individual Numbers of Note

 Junior Haley Lorenzen topped the 600-point plateau during the game.
- Lorenzen just missed the first double-double of her career with nine points and a seasonhigh nine rebounds.

Our guards started getting a little bit tired and jogging. Arizona State is a good team and they made us pay when we took plays off."

December 28, 2016 * Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla. After a 12-game season-opening road trip, the Gators played their first home game of the 2016-17 season and looked every bit as excited and fresh as their newly renovated arena sparkled and

Senior Ronni Williams was honored in a pregame ceremony for topping the 1,000-career point plateau during the December 3 game against Long Beach State. She scored the first points in the newly renamed and put on a show for the Gator faithful, as she scored a career-best 34 points and led Florida to a 102-51 victory against Southeastern Louisiana

Early on, it looked like Williams was trying to net another 1,000 points during the actual game, scoring 20 points on 9-of-10 shooting in the first quarter alone and helping the Gators take a commanding 55-21 halftime lead.

Florida ended the first quarter with a 17-2 run for a 36-10 lead and never looked back en route to its second-largest margin of victory this season in its final non-conference game of the season.

All eight Gators who suited up during the game, scored, and all five starters recorded a double-digit offensive output

Junior Haley Lorenzen posted the first double-double of her career, netting with 15 points and tying a career-best 10 rebounds.

Freshman Delicia Washington added 14 points with a career-best six steals, tied for the most by a Gator this season, while senior Tyshara Fleming tallied 11 points and eight rebounds and junior

Freshman Sydney Searcy finished with nine points, while classmate Sydney Morang hit a three and collected five steals and junior Brooke Copeland added five points that included a three-pointer in her sixth consecutive game.

January 1, 2017 * Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla. Auburn's 11 three-pointers and its defensive intensity forced Florida into 26 turnovers that the Tigers converted into 28 points and defeated the Gators, 82-75, at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams on Sunday.

Eighteen of Florida's miscues came in the first half, yet the Gators were down just two at halftime. 36-34. The Tigers had jumped out to an early seven points lead, but the Gators came back in the second quarter and even held a three-point cushion after Brooke Copeland's three-pointer with just under three minutes to play.

The teams traded bucket to begin the third quarter before Auburn senior Katie Frerking got hot and nailed back-to-back three-pointers that launched a 15-2 run in just over three minutes. Frerking scored 10 points during that game-changing march, as the Tigers outscored the Gators, 28-19, during the quarter and turned six miscues into 12 points.

Senior Ronni Williams tried to put the Gators on her back during the fourth quarter, when she scored 13 of her team-best 24 points, hitting 6-of-8 shots from the floor during the frame, 10-of-13 in the game. She scored 10 of UF's first 11 points and had the Gators within five points, 69-64, with 3:51 remaining in the game.

Florida had the momentum and the crowd on its feet, but Frerking struck again with a jumper and followed with a free throw to start a 6-2 run and the Gators were down nine with 2:12 remaining.

Delicia Washington, who finished with 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting, scored the next four points and Florida was back within five, 75-70, with 29 seconds to go, however the Tigers hit timely, tough shots and their free throws when they needed to and took their first win in Gainesville since 2007.

Senior **Tyshara Fleming** stepped up for the Gators with 13 points and nine rebounds and junior **Haley Lorenzen** added 11 points and seven boards.

Auburn senior Brandy Montgomery led all scorers with 26 points, nailing 7-of-8 three-pointers, while Frerking finished with 24 points, 10 rebounds and five steals.

Florida, however, refused to bow down to the talented and nationally-ranked Gamecocks and outscored them 22-16 in the third quarter, as well as, 38-34 in the second half.

The Gators' third-quarter advantage could have been even greater if it hadn't been for a Gamecock three-point buzzer-beater shortly after UF freshman **Delicia Washington**'s layup in the lane that cut difference to 14 points.

Florida converted four more shots than Texas A&M, however, nine of the Aggies were from beyond the three-point arc and they used that to their advantage in a hard fought, 67-59, decision against the Gators at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Sunday afternoon.

Florida held a 36-35 halftime lead, the first time it has taken a lead into the locker room in a Southeastern Conference game this season, as there were three lead changes and four tied scores in the opening 20 minutes of action.

It was back and forth action to begin the second half and after Haley Lorenzen's jumper tied the score at 40 with 6:38 remaining in the third, Texas A&M mounted a 14-5 run over the next 5:01 for a 54-45 lead. Ronni Williams, who finished with a team-high 22 points on 11-of-19 shooting, ended the quarter's scoring with a layup and Florida was within seven points entering the fourth quarter.

Williams picked up where she left off and scored the first points of the final frame and the Gator deficit was down to five, 54-49, with 8:44 left.

The Aggies came right back, pounding the defensive glass that limited Florida's second chance opportunities, and used a 12-2 run on the offensive end over a 3:43 span to build a 66-51 lead with 2:37 remaining in the game.

Danni Williams, who leads the SEC scoring, knocked down eight points during that game deciding run, including a pair of three-pointers, as she led the Aggies from beyond the arc by converted 5-of-9 en route to a game-high 25 points.

Florida exploded out of the halftime locker room on an 18-3 lead and then withstood a Georgia's furious run late for a 76-68 victory at Stegeman Coliseum on Sunday.

The victory was the Gator's first in Southeastern Conference action, halting a five-game skid, while collecting just the program's sixth win ever against the Lady Bulldogs in Athens

During that big third-quarter run, six different Gators scored with only Dyandria Anderson hitting more than one field goal and the second one of hers was a three-point-play.

Florida's run continued into the fourth quarter where it scored the first four points, however, Georgia flipped the table on the Gators in the final period and scored 14 straight points and cut UF's 17-point lead to three, 60-57, with 5:32 remaining.

Haley Lorenzen's jump-hook in the paint ended UF's scoring draught, but UG came right back with four more points and the Gator lead was down to one, 62-61, with 4:17 on the clock.

Brooke Copeland then launched a high-arching three in front of Florida's bench and kept the Gators

Pachis Roberts, who finished with a game-high 26 points, made her first 14 free throw attempts of the game and finally missed one with 3:13 remaining, as Georgia was within three.

Ronni Williams came back with a tough jumper inside before Roberts drilled a three on the other end and had Georgia within two with 2:46 on the clock.

Freshman Delicia Washington then came back with a tough driving layup to answer the trey and keep Florida's advantage at four, 69-65, with 1:47 remaining.

Georgia followed with another three-pointer and cut UF's lead to one with 1:31 left to play.

From there, Williams took control. She first putback an offense rebound with 56 seconds remaining for a three-point cushion.

Georgia was forced to foul to stop the clock and the Gators converted from the line when they needed to the most, hitting 5-of-6 in the final 37.2 seconds, with Williams hitting all four of her tries and Anderson the other to seal the victory.

Class Act

With today's win, only Ronni Williams – UF's lone four-year senior – and the current junior class of Dyandria Anderson, Brooke Copeland and Haley Lorenzen are the only Gators in program history to have defeated Georgia twice in Athens during their career.

The Lady Vols used an 18-2 run over a 4:34 span in the first guarter and built a 23-6 lead with 3:03 remaining in the first period. During that march, Florida made just 1-of-8 field goals and committed three turnovers that were immediately converted into easy buckets.

While the Gators were seemingly down, they were certainly not ready to fold and regrouped to score the final nine points of the quarter and trailed just 27-19 after the initial 10 minutes.

Williams scored the first four points of the second quarter and had the Gators within four, 27-23.

Alexa Middleton halted UF's 13-0 run with one of UT's seven three-pointers during the game and began a 7-0 swing for the visitors, who took a double-digit lead.

Haley Lorenzen, who finished with 17 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, canned UF's only three-pointer of the game, but Middleton came right back with one for the Vols, as UT took a 48-34

Florida outscored Tennessee, 41-36, in the second half and even cut its deficit to eight points with 3:24 reaming and to within six points, 81-75, with 16 seconds remaining, however, the Lady Vols, closed out the game at the free throw line, converting 3-of-4 the rest of the way, capping a solid effort of 27-of-35 from the line during the game.

Ronni Williams scored a career-high 43 points and led the Gators to a 93-73 win against Vanderbilt at Memorial Gym Sunday afternoon.

Williams' offensive outburst was the third highest individual scoring total in program history, just behind the 45 points from Quientella Bonner on January 22, 1977 and the 44 by Merlakia Jones on January 25, 1995.

Not only did Williams lead Sunday's scoring efforts, she collected a season and game-high 14 rebounds, with five of those coming on the offensive end that helped the Gators corral 18 in the game that helped them to 19 second-chance points.

Frontcourt mate **Tyshara Fleming** helped inside and posted her second straight double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds, while freshman **Delicia Washington** added 20 points with seven

On Sunday, Florida used a 13-1 run that ended the first quarter and began the second to take a

The SEC's top three-point shooting team then began to find its stroke from long range and the Commodores next five buckets were from beyond the arc, as the hosts chipped away at Florida's advantage and cut it to five with under two minutes left in the first half.

Dyandria Anderson gave the Gators a little breathing room with four seconds remaining the first half when she knocked down their first three of the game and Florida took a 36-28 halftime lead.

Despite two early fouls, Williams still contributed 10 points in the first half, while Fleming also reached double-figures on 5-of-6 shooting from the floor to accompany five rebounds

Anderson's long-range bucket to end the first half gave the Gators the momentum into the second where they opened on a quick 8-2 run, with Washington and Williams both accounting for four points and Florida's lead was at 14 points, 44-30.

The teams went back and forth a bit before the Gators used a 6-0 spurt and grew their lead to 54-36 with 2:03 remaining in the third quarter. Vanderbilt again chipped away but Williams hit a jumper with six seconds left in the third and the Gators took a 15-point advantage into the fourth quarter.

Florida opened the final frame on a 7-3 march for a 65-46 cushion and the Gators needed it, as Vanderbilt heated up again from beyond the arc, using a pair during a 10-0 run that cut Florida's lead to nine points, 65-56, with 5:16 remaining.

The Gators maintained their composure and withstood the long-range barrage to earn their second SEC road win of the year.

Freshman Delicia Washington scored a game-high 25 points to lead the Gators, who dropped an 84-76 decision to Texas A&M at Reed Arena Thursday evening.

Rebounding and an Aggie scoring run late in the third quarter were the keys to the game, as Florida dropped its second game this season to Texas A&M by single digits.

TAMU held a 44-28 rebounding advantage, Florida's largest rebound deficit of the year. 18 of the Aggies rebounds were on the offensive end.

It was a tough third quarter for the Gators, who were outscored, 24-16, during the frame. After **Haley Lorenzen** knocked down a three-pointer from the top of the arc, Texas A&M ripped off a game-changing 15-3 run, as Florida went from down two at 51-49, to trailing by 14 points, 66-52.

Washington ended the third with a three-point-play and the Gators were within 11 points entering

TAMU began the final frame with a three-pointer and extended its lead back to 14, before the Gators used a 9-0 spurt and cut their deficit to five points, 69-64. A turnover prevented an even longer run and the Aggies made them pay by scoring the next five points, with the second bucket appearing to be a dagger three that forced UF into a timeout.

The Gators never gave up and came out of the huddle with the next four points thanks to Washington and Lorenzen and were back within six, 74-68, with 3:39 remaining.

The teams traded buckets, but Florida's two field goals where three-pointers, both by Gator freshman Sydney Morang, who knocked down her career-best fourth three-pointer of the game and Florida was within four points, 78-74, with 1:38 to go.

An Aggie miss on the other end gave Florida a chance to get even closer, but **Ronni Williams** missed two free throws with 61 seconds remaining and TAMU came down and knocked down a pair from the line for a six-point lead and 37 seconds on the clock.

TAMU came back with three more points and Florida just couldn't get any of its final shots to fall, as the Aggies continued to connect from the free throw in the final moments to secure the win.

- There were five lead changes and three tied scores in the first 20 minutes of play The game appeared to be tied heading into the halftime locker room, however, **Dyandria Anderson** was whistled for a foul on Danni Williams, who was launching a shot at the buzzer. The Rebels continued to match every Gator score until freshman Sydney Morang knocked down a three and Lorenzen followed with a jumper with 16 seconds left in the second quarter and Florida headed into the locker room down three, 42-39.

The teams continued to trade buckets for the majority of the third quarter and the Gators even tied the game twice and took a 58-57 lead with 48 seconds remaining on a pair of Lorenzen free throws. Just 16 seconds later, Erika Sisk drilled one of Ole Miss' 10 three-pointers during the game and the Rebels jumped back into the lead, holding a 60-58 edge entering the final quarter

Washington scored first to begin the fourth quarter and tied the game

Ole Miss, however, used a 13-4 run over the next 4:55 and held a 73-64 advantage with 3:52

Florida still battled and after consecutive buckets from Williams was within five points, 75-70, with

The Gator had struggled defensively all evening but needed to come up big on the ensuing Ole Miss possession and initially it appeared as though it had. Florida forced Madinah Muhammad into a tough attempt as the shot clock was at the end and the game clock at 70 seconds. The ball bounced out and Muhammad collected her own miss and put it back up for a layin that gave the

Six of Florida's last seven games have been decided by single digits and tonight's finally ended in favor of the Gators, who topped Arkansas, 57-53, and capped its mini two-game home stand at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Thursday evening.

Senior Ronni Williams scored 13 of her team-high 15 points in the second half to go along with 12 rebounds for the 20th double-double of her career. Junior Haley Lorenzen added 14 points, while freshman Sydney Morang tied her career-best of 12 points, all coming from beyond the arc.

Arkansas used a 12-0 run over a 2:09 span early in the third quarter that flipped a 30-23 Gator lead into a 35-30 Razorback advantage. Florida committed four turnovers during that span and couldn't even attempt a shot, as Arkansas assumed its largest lead of the game to that point and forced a Gator timeout with 5:35 remaining in the quarter.

Florida regrouped and ended the third on a 9-3 run - that included the final seven points with Dyandria Anderson drilling a three-pointer – and held a 39-38 lead entering the final fram

The Razorbacks scored the first four points of the fourth quarter before Morang hit a three that tied the score at 42 and sparked a 9-0 Gator run with Williams netting four points and Lorenzen two.

The teams traded buckets for the next minute-plus before both teams went cold from the floor, the scoring drought lasting two minutes and 34 seconds. Arkansas broke free first and cut Florida's deficit to two points, 50-48, with 1:47 remaining.

Lorenzen followed with a jumper from the corner, but Jessica Jackson, who finished with a gamehigh 17 points, came back and scored 15 seconds later, as the it remaining a two-point game with 61 seconds to go.

Both teams had fouls to give before the bonus and that took time off the clock. Williams broke the trend and scored a fall-away for a 54-50 lead and 44 seconds to go.

Arkansas' Jailyn Mason needed just 10 seconds to nail a three-pointer and Florida's lead was trimmed to one. Arkansas fouled again twice and then forced a Florida turnover when the Gators were trying to in-bound the ball with 20 seconds remaining.

A game of runs ended in Florida's favor as three Gators scored in double figures and the Gators topped the Tide 66-56 at Coleman Coliseum.

Florida dominated the rebounding battle outrebounding Alabama, 50-30, thanks to double-digit efforts from **Ronni Williams** and **Delicia Washington**.

Washington recorded her first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds while Williams picks her up second consecutive double-double and her eight of the season with her 19 points and 11 rebounds. Junior **Haley Lorenzen** added 18 points to the mix and helped to control the boards with her seven rebounds

The story of the game was a series of runs, as each of the first 35 points came during sprees by both teams with Alabama coming out on top 21-14, with 6:01 remaining in the first half and it was a lead the Tide maintained throughout the half, taking a 31-26 advantage into the locker room.

Florida came out of the locker room to start the second half on an 18-0 run over a 5:51 span. dominating the boards at both ends. Alabama quickly responded with another run of its own finally ending its second-half drought with a pair of free throws with 4:09 remaining that sparked a 10-0 march and closed within three points, 44-41 with 2:55 left in the third.

Washington then scored all of UF's points during ensuing 8-2 march and the Gator lead was back to nine, 52-43, with 22 seconds left Florida held that score through the end of the quarter.

Alabama opened the fourth with a 7-1 run and whittled Florida's lead to three, 53-50, with 7:22 on the clock, but Lorenzen and Dyandria Anderson hit back to back free throws that ignited a 8-0 run and the Gator's regained an 11-point advantage, 61-50, with 4:02 remaining.

For virtually the first time in the game, the teams exchanged points instead of runs and Florida captured its third SEC road win of the year.

February 16, 2017 * Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla. Missouri knocked down 13 three-pointers and converted 19-of-20 free throws to earn a 74-67 decision against Florida at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Thursday evening.

The second and fourth quarters belonged to the Tigers, who outscored the Gators during those two periods by 22 points thanks to a combined 9-of-15 effort from beyond the arc and a 10-of-11 performance at the free throw line.

Florida did hit 28 field goals to Missouri's 21 during the game, but it was the Tiger's shooting prowess that ultimately was the difference.

Ronni Williams' 17 points led four Gators in double-figure scoring, with Haley Lorenzen and Delicia Washington both netting 16 and Brooke Copeland adding 10 points off the bench.

Dyandria Anderson recorded her first double-double of the season and second of her career with rebounds and 11 assists, both career-bests

Florida led for the first 14:52 of the game until MU began warming up from beyond the arc.

Five of MU's six field goals to end the first half were three-pointers, as Mizzou flipped a 19-14 Gator lead with 7:15 remaining, into a 35-26 Tiger halftime advantage, as the visitors scored 13 straight points to end the period.

The teams traded buckets to open the second have and with Mizzou taking a 40-30 lead with 8:35 on the clock, Florida ripped off a 15-0 run and held a 45-40 lead with 5:09 remaining in the third.

The Tigers halted the run with a three and tacked on two more treys, however, Florida managed to hold a 55-53 lead entering the fourth guarter.

Mizzou ripped off an 11-1 run to start the final frame before Copeland drilled one of her three treys in the game with 4:54 remaining and the Gators were down just three, 62-59

Florida had a chance to get even closer, but couldn't convert a layup off an in-bound play and MU drove right down and hit a three. Copeland matched it for the Gators, who were back within three points, 65-62, with 3:23 remaining.

Amber Smith hit what may have been the dagger, as she came right back with her only points of the night – a three-pointer – and Florida wouldn't match that shot. The Gators missed another layup off an in-bound play under the basket and would eventually foul and send the Tigers to the free throw line, where they finished the game hitting 6-of-6 in the final 26 seconds to seal the win.

It seemed to be a game of alternating quarters – we would take one, they would take one. You just can't exchange baskets with a team that shoots that well from the three when that's not our forte as much, even though we shot the ball well. Haley (Lorenzen) had a great night and was incredibly efficient. Her teammates did a great job of getting her the ball. We rebounded the way we wanted to, but ultimately we had two critical breakdowns and that was defending the three-point ine after dribble-penetration and we allowed them to attack baseline a lot more than we had planned to. You have to

give them credit – they made plays."
"Well they hit shots, and we knew they could do that. We had a saying going into this game that we didn't want to be suckers. You know when they dribble penetrate it's to set up a three and we didn't really do a good job of holding to that."

We had a lot of unforced turnovers as well because we were trying so hard to get paint touches and those high percentage shots that we like to take and too many possessions where we flat threw it out of bounds.

On Kentucky outscoring them 25-5 down the stretch being part of that fight she wants...
"It's one of those areas where we don't look for excuses or anything. One of those areas where we really miss Haley Lorenzen. We're one of the best offensive rebounding teams in the league but one of our best offensive rebounders wasn't available tonight and our guards needed to pick up the slack more and that didn't happen. That, again, is where we are inexperienced and that we have to learn. Nobody is going to feel sorry for you when you have a player out or unexpected injuries. You have got to try to fill that hole with extra effort, extra fight and two or three percent of extra energy, whatever you need to do to contribute and we didn't do that. We left some of those holes open

Ronni Williams scored a game-high 22 points with nine rebounds but Tennessee ended the game on a 13-2 run and rallied for a 74-70 win at Thompson-Boling Arena Thursday evening.

Haley Lorenzen drilled a three-pointer and gave the Gators a 68-61 lead with 3:58 remaining. The Lady Vols countered with the next five points

Williams collected her fifth personal with 1:37 reaming and the Gators clinging to a 68-66 lead, but Florida was unable to pick-up for their sidelined leader, as Tennessee scored seven of its 13 points from the free throw line during the final 2:29 of the game to take the decision.

It was a disappointing final score for the Gators, who led for almost 26 minutes compared with the Vols 9:21 time lead.

- Ronni Williams' first bucket of the game that came 2:23 into the contest was the 1,400 point
- Williams also moved into sole possession of 14th on UF's all-tie scoring chart, passing Rhvonja Smith's (1987-91) total of 1,398. Next on the list is Tonya Washington (1997-00) and her 1,448 points.
- Williams recorded her 12th game this year with 20+ points 13th of her career Tyshara Fleming scored her 350th career point during the first quarter of the game.

Game 29: Florida 65, Georgia 58

February 26, 2017 * Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center * Gainesville, Fla. Florida's unquestioned leader this season has been Ronni Williams, who scored 31 points and led the Gators to a 65-58 victory against Georgia in the final home game of the 2016-17 season and of

The Gators used a 15-6 run to close the game and secure their first win at home against Georgia since Feb. 19, 2012.

The victory also marked just the fourth time in the 70-game series between the two teams the Florida has won consecutive games. The last time the Gators earned back-to-back wins against their Southeastern Conference rivals was during the 2003-04 season.

Florida took the 76-68 decision in Athens on January 22.

In what has become a classic tight rivalry game where entering Sunday's battle 15 of the last 16 meetings between the two teams have been decided by 11 points or less, this one followed that trend as it featured 11 tied scores and five lead changes.

Georgia held a 45-43 lead entering the fourth quarter but Williams scored the first points 28 seconds into the final frame. From there, the teams matched each other shot for shot over the next

Georgia's Pachis Roberts hit a three. Gator junior Brooke Copeland, who finished with 12 points, drilled one from beyond the arc.

Georgia converted two free throws. Williams followed with two from the line.

The Bulldogs hit an outside jumper. Gator senior **Tyshara Fleming** took a great feed from Copeland and finished inside to tie the game at 52 and 4:39 remaining.

That's when the Gators altered the script.

Fleming broke up the back-and-forth scoring by coolly converting a pair of free throws with 4:01 remaining and gave the Gators their first lead since there was 2:58 left in the second quarter.

The Gators didn't stop there, however, as the 'Dawgs missed a pair of three-point attempts on their next trip down the court and Copeland finally gathered the defensive board. Williams came through for Florida on the other end and the Gator lead was 56-52 with exactly three minutes on the clock.

Georgia fouled a driving Delicia Washington who was on her way to the basket and instead made two from the free throw line, as Florida's lead grew to six.

Roberts halted UF's 8-0 run, before Williams struck again with another jumper 21 seconds later and the Gator lead was back to six with 1:42 to play.

Fleming, who finished with a game-high nine rebounds, grabbed a defensive board on the very next possession and Florida was again on the move offensively.

Williams provided the honors with a tough layup inside, as she would go on to score Florida's final seven points in the last 58 seconds of the game en route to netting 13 points in the final quarter

The fourth quarter alone had four tied scores and one lead change and that lead change was in favor of the Gators, who finally halted the back-and-forth scoring in the final five minutes of the game.

Florida Head Coach Amanda Butler: Opening Statement:

This was an amazing win. You have to give Georgia a lot of credit for the way that they made the game look, but I could not be more proud of our upperclassmen and the way that they weathered the storms. They stayed together. They absolutely embodied the belief that Ronni (Williams) leads us with every day."
