# HEAD COACH STEPHANIE WHITE

## Stephanie **WHITE**

Head Coach / First Season



Stephanie White was named the head coach for Vanderbilt women's basketball program on May 24, becoming just the fifth all-time head coach in the history of the Vanderbilt program.

Having enjoyed success at virtually every level of basketball as a player and coach, White arrived at Vanderbilt after spending two seasons as the head coach of WNBA's Indiana Fever. White took the Fever to the playoffs in each of her two seasons, including a trip to the WNBA finals in 2015.

"The opportunity to lead Vanderbilt's women's basketball program is an opportunity that I simply could not pass up," White said. "The combination of Vanderbilt's culture, where achievement -- both on and off the court - is so highly valued, together with the institution's fan support, and a legacy of winning basketball to build upon, is incredibly exciting to me. I appreciate the support and understanding that I have received from the Indiana Fever, from management to the players, regarding my passion to coach college basketball at an elite institution."

White -- who played five seasons in the WNBA after a decorated playing career at Purdue -- was named head coach for the Fever in September 2014. In 2015, she guided the Fever to the WNBA finals, becoming the first rookie coach in league history to lead a team to the finals.

As a collegiate player, White enjoyed a highly successful career at Purdue, where she earned national Player of the Year honors after helping lead the Boilermakers to the 1999 NCAA championship as a senior. That season, she also received the Wade Trophy (given to the nation's top female player) and was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Year.

"Stephanie White has been a winner in every phase of her career," Vanderbilt athletic director David Williams said. "She was the nation's high school player of the year, she was the NCAA's Player of the Year on a national championship team and she led her WNBA team into the finals in her first year. She was an outstanding scholar. She wants to coach at Vanderbilt and we believe she is just the person to lead our program back into national prominence."

White averaged double-figure scoring in all four seasons of her college career, including 20.2 points per game as a senior, and amassed 2,182 points for her career. White was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on April 21, 2006.

She was also a star in the classroom at Purdue. She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and was an Academic All-American.

White was an assistant coach with the Chicago Sky from 2007-2010, then joined the Fever staff as an assistant in 2011. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014 before being named head coach after Lin Dunn's retirement. While coaching in the WNBA, White served as a college basketball analyst for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. She also covered the NBA's Indiana Pacers for FOX Sports Indiana.

Prior to coaching in the WNBA, White coached in the college ranks, serving as an assistant at Toledo (2005-07), Kansas State (2004-05) and Ball State (2003-04).

Before beginning her coaching career, White enjoyed a productive five-year WNBA career, spending one season with the Charlotte Sting and four with the Indiana Fever, before retiring in 2004.

At the completion of her four seasons with the Fever, she ranked third in games played (112) and 3-pointers (92), and fourth in scoring (684). She was named to the Fever's All-Decade Team that was announced in 2009.

White and her wife, Michelle, have three boys: Landon, age 5, and twins, Aiden & Avery, age 2.

## THE LOWDOWN ON TODAY'S GAME

In need of a January jumpstart, the Vanderbilt women travel to Fayetteville, Ark., tonight to face the Razorbacks.

The Commodores (10-8, 0-5) come into the game on a seven-game skid that has featured a series of close-call losses in the past three weeks. The latest loss for the Commodores was a 74-68 setback against Missouri on Sunday afternoon at Memorial Gym.

Arkansas, meanwhile, earned its first conference win of the season on Sunday, as the Razorbacks (12-6, 1-4) downed Alabama, 68-50, in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

## UPDATE ON THE 'DORES

Although the Commodores are winless in SEC play, their record doesn't tell the whole story. Four of Vanderbilt's five SEC losses have been decided by a combined total of 18 points, and the Commodores trailed by three points or less in the final minute of each of those four games.

Vanderbilt enters Thursday's game with hopes of bouncing back from Sunday's frustrating loss to Missouri. The Commodores owned a three-point lead late in the game, but were outscored 13-4 in the final 2:15 and were sent to their seventh straight defeat.

In addition to Sunday's loss, Vanderbilt has also suffered a five-point loss to Texas A&M, a two-point loss to Georgia and a five-point loss to Auburn. The Commodores owned big leads in three of the games -- they had a 17-point lead in the third quarter against Auburn, a 13-point lead in the third quarter against TAMU and a 13-point lead in the second quarter against Georgia.

## COLD SNAP

After putting together some impressive numbers during the first six weeks of the season, Vanderbilt has endured a cold-shooting stretch over the past month. During their current seven-game skid, the Commodores are averaging 64.1 points per game, compared to 77.2 points during a nine-game winning streak that preceded the skid.

The Commodores are shooting 37.8 percent from the floor, 38.3 percent from 3-point range and 68.2 percent from the foul line during the losing streak. Through the first 11 games of the season, Vanderbilt was shooting 45.0 from the floor, 41.7 from 3-point range and 78.4 from the line.

## OVERBECK ON A ROLL

Freshman forward Kayla Overbeck has quickly established herself as one of the top newcomers in the SEC. She is Vanderbilt's leading scorer during SEC play at 12.6 points per game, and ranks second on the team in conference play in rebounding at 8.6 per game.

Overbeck has posted a double-double in each of the past two games, and has four double-doubles on the season. She has reached double figures in seven of the past nine games, including the past three games, and is shooting a team-high 57 percent from the floor for the season. Overbeck is averaging 14 points and nine rebounds per game over the past three contests.

## WEBB TO REPRESENT SEC AT NCAA CONVENTION

Marqu'es Webb has been selected to be one of three student-athletes to represent the SEC at the NCAA Convention in Nashville.

Webb, a four-year starter for the Commodores, will be joined by Brady Bramlett, a former member of the Ole Miss baseball team, and Antoine Marc, a former member of the Texas A&M men's swimming and diving team, as the SEC representatives on proposed governance rule changes under the NCAA's Division I autonomy process at the convention.

The three student-athletes will represent the SEC as part of the Autonomy Conferences (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac 12, SEC) efforts to engage and empower student-athletes by giving them both a voice and vote within a transparent decision-making process.

Webb, a senior from Montgomery, Ala., has been on the Dean's List at Vanderbilt and is a two-time recipient of the Women's Basketball Most Improved Academic Award. Webb, who majors in Sociology with a minor in Corporate Strategy, is chair of the SEC Women's Basketball Leadership Council.

The autonomy governance model grants flexibility to schools in the Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac 12 and Southeastern conferences to change specified rules within Division I. The legislative process for these 65 schools includes three student-athlete representatives from each conference who will vote on rule changes. Voting on autonomy issues includes 15 total student-athletes (three from each of the Autonomy Conferences) who, collectively, will cast votes in greater number than four of the five Autonomy Conferences.



## YOUNG GUNS

Vanderbilt's freshmen continue to shine for the Commodores, with the five-member class combining for 34 points, 17 rebounds and eight assists per game. The five players have accounted for 47.9 percent of Vanderbilt's scoring, 40.7 percent of VU's rebounds and 54.4 percent of the team's assists. The five players are also accounting for 49.2 percent of the Commodores' 3-pointers (making 65 of Vanderbilt's 132 total 3s).

## THE LEADERBOARD

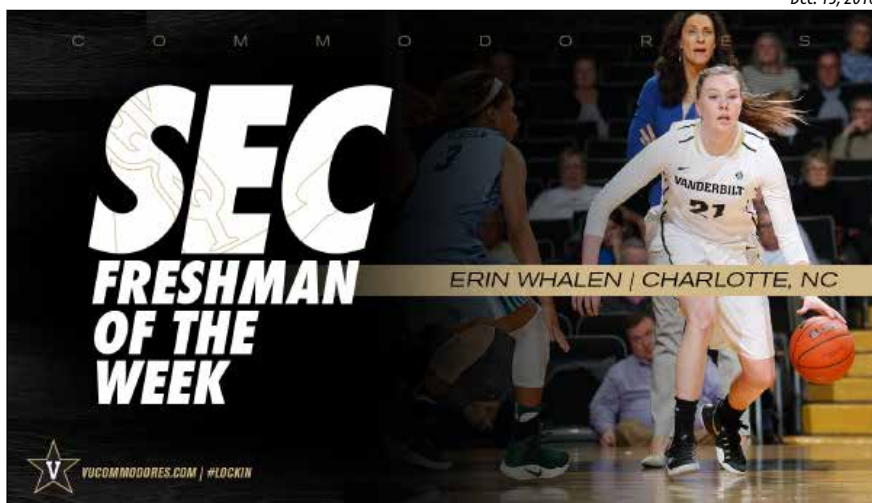
# VANDERBILT NEWS & NOTES

## BELL HAS BEEN RINGING FOR COMMODORES

Vanderbilt guard Rachel Bell is thriving in the up-tempo system that has been implemented by first-year head coach Stephanie White this season. Bell, a junior, has reached double figures in scoring in 13 of the Vanderbilt's first 18 games. She scored 10 or more points in seven straight games from Nov. 20 through Dec. 8, and averaged 15.3 points per game during that stretch. Bell leads the team in scoring at 12.2 points per game.

Marqu'es Webb is Vanderbilt's top rebounder, and ranks among the SEC's best, with 9.1 boards per game. Freshman Kayla Overbeck is having a terrific season, averaging 10.1 points and 7.2 rebounds per game.

### AMONG THE BEST

Through the first 18 games of the season, the Commodores have proven themselves to be one of the country's best-shooting teams from long range. They rank third in the nation -- and lead the SEC -- in 3-point accuracy at 40.5 percent. Vanderbilt is also third in the SEC in free throw percentage at 74.4.

The Commodores are 10th in the country in free throws made (285) and 16th in free throws attempted (383). . . . Vanderbilt leads the SEC in 3-pointers made per game (7.3) and total 3-pointers made (132).

### IN ELITE COMPANY

The Commodores have several players who rank among the best in the SEC

in multiple categories:

- ◆ Senior post player Marqu'es Webb ranks fifth in the SEC in rebounds per game at 9.1 and sixth in total rebounds (155).
- ◆ Freshman Cierra Walker ranks fifth in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.36.
- ◆ Freshman Kayla Overbeck ranks 12th in the conference in rebounds per game at 7.2.

### GOING DEEP

Vanderbilt is getting plenty of production off the bench this season. The Commodores, who routinely go 11 deep, have won the battle of the benches in 13 of the first 18 games, including a 21-7 advantage in last Thursday's loss to Auburn.

In their first two SEC games, Vanderbilt's reserves outscored the opponents' bench by a combined score of 55-8 (including 29-6 against UT and 26-2 against TAMU).

## VANDERBILT PLAYERS:

### No. 0 -- Kayla Overbeck (Freshman)

- ◆ Is the all-time leading scorer (1,988 points) and rebounder (1,355) in Newbury Park High's history, where she also starred in volleyball
- ◆ Is the first player in VU history to wear No. 0 (with a single zero)

### No. 1 -- Rebekah Dahlman (RS-Junior)

- ◆ Has recovered from a blood clot in her shoulder that required multiple surgeries and caused her to miss most of her freshman season.
- ◆ Grandfather, John Kundla, is in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame; he coached the NBA's Minneapolis Lakers and the University of Minnesota.

### No. 3 -- Rachel Bell (Junior)

- ◆ Ranked second on the team in both total points (279) and scoring average (9.0 ppg) last season.
- ◆ Worked an internship this summer with the Vanderbilt Police Department as part of the school's unique athlete internship program.

### No. 10 -- Cierra Walker (Freshman)

- ◆ Shot 45 percent from 3-point range in her high school career and is Oregon City High's all-time leader in 3-pointers (249) and assists (416).
- ◆ Was a three-time finalist in the national Punt, Pass and Kick competition and is a huge football fan.

### No. 12 Myka Dancy (Junior)

- ◆ Scored a basket in the final minute of VU's opening-round SEC Tournament victory over Ole Miss to provide the exclamation point on the win last season.
- ◆ Was a member of the All-District Basketball Team in 2014 and won the A.D. Hancock/ Walter Nipper Sportsmanship Award

### No. 21 -- Erin Whalen (Freshman)

- ◆ Multi-sport high school athlete who won three state championships -- two in basketball and one in volleyball.
- ◆ Was the 2016 North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year and averaged 18.2 points and 5.7 rebounds per game in her prep career.

### No. 22 -- Marqu'e Webb (Senior)

- ◆ Was named the chair of the SEC's first-ever Leadership Council; Was selected to the position by her peers.
- ◆ Pulled down her 500th career rebound early this season and ranks among the SEC's Top-10 in career rebounds.

### No. 23 -- Minta Spears (RS Senior)

- ◆ Was a member of the drama and debate teams during high school, and competed in regional competitions.
- ◆ Averaged 13.8 points per game over the final four games of last season, reaching double figures in three of those contests.

### No. 30 -- LeaLea Carter (Freshman)

- ◆ Member of the USA U-16 national team that captured a Gold Medal last summer.
- ◆ Former McDonald's All-American and considered one of the highest-rated recruits in Commodore WBB history.

### No. 33 -- Christa Reed (Junior)

### FRESH AND REFRESH

Vanderbilt captured SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice in December, with Erin Whalen and Kayla Overbeck each winning the honor. Overbeck was given the award on Dec. 13 after scoring 18 points and pulling down 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- during Vanderbilt's 80-72 road win over ETSU. Whalen was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 6 after averaging 17 points per game and shooting 59 percent from the floor -- making 16-of-27 shots -- during Vanderbilt's wins over Air Force, SIUE and Tulane.

### SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

- ◆ The Razorbacks are not especially explosive, ranking 10th in the conference in scoring at 69.6 points per game, but they rank fourth defensively, surrendering just 57.6 points per game.
- ◆ Jessica Jackson is one of the SEC's most dangerous players, and ranks 11th in the conference in scoring at 15.8 points per game. She also leads Arkansas in rebounding at 6.4 per game.
- ◆ Malica Monk averages 1.8 steals per game, which ranks 12th in the SEC.

### SERIES HISTORY

- ◆ Thursday's game will be the 31st all-time meeting between the teams, with the Commodores owning a 23-7 lead in the series.
- ◆ The most recent match-up came last year in Fayetteville, where the Razorbacks downed the Commodores, 57-56, on a last-second shot by Malica Monk (more on that game below).

## Commodores erase 22-point deficit, lose on buzzer-beater

**FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.** - After seeing the Vanderbilt women erase a 22-point deficit, Arkansas' Malica Monk didn't leave the Commodores with any time to come back again.

With Vanderbilt owning a one-point lead in the final seconds, Monk came up with a loose ball and converted a layup as the final buzzer sounded, giving the Razorbacks a 57-56 victory on Feb. 8, 2016.

Jessica Jackson finished with a game-high 18 points for Arkansas (10-14, 5-6) before fouling out.

Rachel Bell scored 12 points to lead the Commodores (15-8, 4-6), who trailed 47-25 late in the third quarter before roaring back with a 24-2 run and eventually taking a one-point lead on two occasions in the final two minutes.

With Arkansas seemingly in complete control late in the third quarter, the Commodores began chipping away at a 22-point deficit by closing the period on an 8-2 run to trim the margin to 49-33. Vanderbilt then opened the fourth quarter with a 16-0 run -- which started and ended with baskets by Jasmine Jenkins -- to forge a 49-49 tie with 3:32 remaining.

The Commodores, who entered the night ranked second in the SEC in field goal percentage, shot just 44 percent from the floor, and also struggled at the foul line, making just 8 of 17 attempts (47 percent). But the Vanderbilt defense held firm, limiting Arkansas to 22 percent shooting in the second half (6-of-27) and 35 percent for the game.

Vanderbilt's fourth-quarter rally set the stage for a frantic finish that featured three lead changes and two ties in the final three minutes.

The Commodores took their first lead of the night on a free throw by Marques Webb with 1:59 to go, but Arkansas quickly rebuilt a three-point lead after a basket by Jordan Danberry with 1:24 to go. Vanderbilt then fought back to tie the game again at 55-55 when Webb made two free throws with 55 seconds to play.

On Arkansas' next possession, Webb pulled down a defensive rebound with 31 seconds to go. After a timeout, Vanderbilt's Christa Reed was fouled with nine seconds to play.

Reed made the first free throw, but missed the second, and Arkansas' Khadijah West grabbed the rebound. On their final possession, the Razorbacks missed a pair of shots before Monk ended up with the ball after a loose-ball scramble, and she banked in her game-winner at the buzzer.

Former Vanderbilt great Caroline (Williams) Hipps has been named the Co-Chair of the 2018 SEC Tournament, which will be held in Nashville.

## Commodores come up empty against Mizzou

*Vanderbilt still searching for first conference win after hard fought battle with Tigers*

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt and Missouri combined to attempt 52 shots from 3-point range on Sunday afternoon. So it was only fitting that the game's biggest shot came from long range.

With the Commodores owning a one-point lead with just over a minute to play, Missouri's Amber Smith knocked down a 3-pointer that gave the Tigers the lead for good in an eventual 74-68 victory over Vanderbilt.

Missouri (12-7, 2-3), which finished 13-of-28 from 3-point range, closed the game on a 13-4 run over the final 2:15 to send the Commodores (10-8, 0-5) to their seventh straight loss.

The game featured 16 ties and 12 lead changes, and the teams were never separated by more than six points after the first quarter.

Sierra Michaelis finished with a game-high 19 points for the Tigers, who snapped a three-game losing streak.

Freshman Kayla Overbeck led the Commodores with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Senior Marquès Webb also registered a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for Vanderbilt, which went 10-of-24 from 3-point range in the loss.

The Commodores trailed 61-56 with 4:24 to play in the fourth quarter before putting together an 8-0 run -- capped by a pair of free throws by Webb -- to take a 64-61 lead with 2:15 to go. But Missouri answered with five quick points, including Smith's go-ahead 3-pointer with 1:17 to play, to take a 66-64 edge.

On Vanderbilt's ensuing possession, Rachel Bell's open 3-pointer spun off the rim, and Smith pulled the defensive rebound.

**NASHVILLE** -- Tulane's Kolby Morgan had a big night, but it was the Vanderbilt players who hit the biggest shots in the fourth quarter.

Erupting for 30 points in the final 10 minutes, the Commodores downed Tulane 74-63 on Monday night and extended their winning streak to seven games. Rachel Bell scored 14 points to lead five players in double figures for Vanderbilt (8-1), and Marqu'es Webb pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds.

Morgan poured in 34 points, going 14-of-26 from the floor, for Tulane (5-3). She also had seven rebounds and five steals. But Vanderbilt overcame Morgan's heroics by generating a dominating second-half performance, during which the Commodores outscored Tulane 48-30.

Vanderbilt was especially sharp in the fourth quarter, making 10-of-17 shots from the floor, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range. For the period, Vanderbilt outscored Tulane, 30-18.

The Commodores trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half and were down 45-44 entering the fourth quarter. But Cierra Walker's 3-pointer in the opening minute of the fourth quarter gave Vanderbilt the lead for good.

Christa Reed finished with 13 points and Walker had 12 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range.

Kayla Overbeck added 11 points and eight rebounds, and Erin Whalen scored 10 points and had a team-high four assists for the Commodores, who were playing their third game in the span of four days. (Vanderbilt won the Air Force Classic on Saturday with a win over SIUE after defeating Air Force on Friday).

Vanderbilt's defense limited Tulane to 37 percent shooting from the floor (26-of-70). The Green Wave entered the night shooting 48 percent from the floor -- which ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The Commodores also kept Tulane off the free throw line, as the Green Wave finished just 4-of-6.

**JOHNSON CITY, Tenn.** -- Freshman Kayla Overbeck had 18 points and 13 rebounds -- establishing new career highs in both categories -- to help Vanderbilt earn an 80-72 road win over ETSU on Thursday night.

The victory enabled the Commodores (9-1) to extend their winning streak to eight games.

Christa Reed scored a team-high 20 points and Rachel Bell added 19 for the Commodores, who withstood an explosive performance by ETSU's Tianna Tarter. The junior guard scored a game-high 35 points, going 15-of-28 from the floor, for the Bucs (5-5).

Vanderbilt dominated the glass during the comeback victory, winning the rebounding battle 53-27.

The Commodores trailed by as many as 12 points in the first quarter and were behind 50-43 with 6:58 left in the third. But Vanderbilt charged back with a 14-2 run -- which started with a jumper and a 3-pointer from Cierra Walker -- to take a 57-52 lead with 1:07 left in the quarter.

Miaya Seawright helped fuel the surge with a 3-pointer from the corner that gave the Commodores their first lead of the night, 51-50, with 4:53 remaining in the period.

After a pair of lead changes, Vanderbilt carried a 59-57 lead into the fourth quarter, and the Commodores stayed in front from there, outscoring ETSU 21-15 in the final 10 minutes. Vanderbilt made just four field goals in the fourth quarter, but went 12-of-15 from the foul line. VU finished 25-of-31 from the foul line for the game, while ETSU was 8-of-19.

Overbeck scored eight points and pulled down five rebounds in the fourth quarter, and Reed went 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final 10 minutes to help the Commodores secure the win.

For the night, Vanderbilt's bench outscored ETSU's reserves, 30-4.

The Commodores now have a long break for exams before playing their next game on Dec. 18, hosting Tennessee Tech.
