POSTGAME NOTES: AUBURN 30, ARKANSAS 28

PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, white jerseys and white pants.
- Auburn won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.
- Arkansas' captains were seniors Rakeem Boyd, Feleipe Franks, Grant Morgan and Jonathan Marshall. They will serve as captains for every game this season. Franks was the Razorback's coin toss representative.
- Weather 75 degrees, rain.

GENERAL NOTES

- Saturday marked the 29th consecutive season the Razorbacks and Tigers have met. Auburn improved to 18-11-1 in the all-time series and 9-5 in Auburn.
- Auburn led 20-12 at halftime, the first time this season Arkansas trailed at the intermission.
- Arkansas came back from a 17-0 deficit to start the game.
- The Razorbacks took a 28-27 lead with 5:29 remaining in the fourth quarter on a 30-yard touchdown reception by De'Vion Warren.
- The announced attendance for the game: 17,490

- On the offensive side of the ball Trelon Smith (RB) made his first career-start.
- On the defensive side of the ball Hudson Clark (CB) made his first career start.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Arkansas set season-highs of 437 total yards, 318 passing yards and 119 rushing yards.
- Arkansas had a 145-45 passing yard advantage at halftime.
- Arkansas scored points on its first drive of the second half for the third straight week.
- The Razorbacks scored touchdowns on back-to-back drives for the first time this season (second quarter).
- The Arkansas touchdown scoring drive in the third quarter was its longest in terms of plays (13) and time of possession (5:30) of the season.
- Totaled over 430 total yards for the first time since Week 4 of 2019 vs. San Jose State.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

• Arkansas recorded sacks on back-to-back plays for the first time this year on Auburn's opening drive in the third quarter. Jonathan Marshall and Hayden Henry both had solo sacks to combine for a loss of 15 yards and force a Tigers punt.

- Held an opponent to under 200 passing yards for the first time this season.
- Tied single-game season-high with 3.0 sacks and 4.0 tackles for loss.
- S Jalen Catalon paced the team with a career-high 14 tackles, his second straight double-digit tackle game.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Kicker A.J. Reed made his only field goal try of 23 yards in the fourth quarter.
- Arkansas punted six times for an average of 35.3 per kick with one punt that was downed inside the 20 yard line.

PLAYER NOTES

QB Feleipe Franks

- Completed a season-high 22-of-30 passes for 318 yards with four touchdowns.
- Became the first Razorback QB to throw for four touchdowns since Brandon Allen in 2015 against Mississippi State.
- Had a QB rating of 206.4, the highest for a Razorback when attempting at least 30 passes since Brandon Allen (202.8) in 2015 against Mississippi State.
- First Arkansas QB to throw for over 300 yards since Nick Starkel in Week 4 of 2019 against San Jose State (356).
- Threw for at least two touchdowns in back-to-back games.

QB Malik Hornsby

• Made collegiate debut in the fourth quarter, rushing two times in the red zone.

TE Blake Kern

- Earned his second career start, both coming this season, and hauled in a career-high four catches for a career-high 59 yards (14.8 ypc).
- Made the longest reception of his career of 35 yards in the third quarter.



RB Trelon Smith

- Set a career-high in both rushing (81) and receiving yards (78) and scored his first career touchdown on a five-yard pass reception in the third quarter.
- Rushed a career-high 21 times for 81 yards (3.9 ypc) and caught a career-high and team-leading six passes for 78 yards (13 ypc) with a touchdown.
- First Razorback since 2000 to have at least 70 rushing yards and 70 receiving yards in the same game.
- Led the team in rushing yards for the third straight game.
- Recorded a season-long rush of 15 yards in the second quarter.
- Hauled in a career-long 25 yard reception to convert a third down in the third quarter.
- Made his first career start.

• WR De'Vion Warren

• Led the team with 95 receiving yards on five catches (19.0 ypc).

• Became the first Razorback since C.J. O'Grady in 2018 to have two receiving touchdowns in a game. He is the first Hog to have two receiving touchdowns with at least 95 receiving yards since Jared Cornelius vs. Alcorn State in 2016.

• Scored three touchdowns in his last two games.tScored his first touchdown on a seven-yard reception in the second quarter. Caught his second score on a 30-yard reception in the fourth quarter.

• Hauled in a game-long 44-yard reception.

WR Mike Woods

- Tied career-high with six receptions and set a season-high with 81 receiving yards.
- Scored his first touchdown of the season, and fifth of his career, on a four-yard reception with 6:24 left in the second quarter.

NB Greg Brooks

- Made his 15th career start, including 15 straight. He has started every game he has played.
- Registered his first career tackle for loss.

S Jalen Catalon

- Paced the team and set a career-high with 14 tackles.
- Recorded his second straight double-digit tackle performance.
- Also broke up one pass.

CB Hudson Clark

- Made his first career start and set a career-high with seven tackles, all solo stops.
- Finished second on the team in tackles.
- Broke up one pass.

LB Hayden Henry

• Registered his first sack of the season, dropping Auburn QB Bo Nix for an eight-yard loss in the third quarter.

DT Jonathan Marshall

- Set a career-high with six tackles.
- Recorded his first sack of the season and first career solo sack, wrapping up Auburn QB Bo Nix for a seven-yard loss in the third quarter.
