POSTGAME NOTES: ARKANSAS 21, NO. 16 MISSISSIPPI STATE 14

PREGAME NOTES

• The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, white jerseys and white pants.

- Arkansas won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.
- Arkansas' captains were seniors Rakeem Boyd, Feleipe Franks, Grant Morgan and Jonathan Marshall. They will serve as captains for every game this season. Boyd was the Razorback's coin toss representative.
- Weather 65 degrees, clear, no wind.

GENERAL NOTES

- Head coach Sam Pittman's first career FBS win.
- Saturday marked 29th consecutive season the Razorbacks and Bulldogs have met. With the win, Arkansas is now 17-13-1 against the Bulldogs and 8-7 in Starkville. Its the first time the winner scored less than 24 points since a 17-10 Mississippi State win in 2014.
- The announced attendance for the game: 13,564

- On the offensive side of the ball Blake Kern (TE) made his first career start.
- On the defensive side of the ball Zach Williams (DE), Eric Gregory (DE) and Myles Slusher (S) made their first career starts.
- Rakeem Boyd made his 22nd consecutive start, the most among all Razorbacks.
- Arkansas scored first in its first two games of the season and led both at halftime.
- Arkansas won its first SEC game since a 38-37 win over Ole Miss on Oct. 28, 2017.
- Arkansas won its first game over a ranked opponent since 2016 against No. 10 Florida (31-10)
- Arkansas won its first game over a ranked opponent on the road since 2016 at No. 15 TCU (41-38).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Arkansas totaled 275 total offensive yards with 63 on the ground and 212 through the air.
- Arkansas averaged 4.2 yards per play.
- Arkansas collected 17 first downs six rushing, 10 passing and one via penalty.
- Arkansas had a 100-yard receiver in De'Vion Warren which is a new career-best its second in as many weeks. Its the first 100-yard receiving game by a Hog against Mississippi State since Hunter Henry had 129 yards in 2015.
- Trelon Smith led the offense in both rushing yards (48) and receptions (5),
- Arkansas won its first SEC game when rushing for less than 100 yards since a 17-0 win over LSU (95 yds) on Nov. 15, 2014.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Bumper Pool set a career-high with 20 tackles, which is tied for the 10th most in a single game in school history. Jerry Franklin was the last Hog to have 20 in a game (Nov. 20, 2010 vs. Mississippi State). Pool is the sixth Razorback to have 20 or more total tackles in a game since 2000.
- Greg Brooks Jr. made his second career interception and returned it 69 yards for a touchdown on the game's opening possession. It was Arkansas first interception return for a touchdown since Santos Ramirez against Florida in 2016. Its the Razorbacks longest interception return since Henry Tolliver's 70-yard return against Alcorn State in 2016.
- Joe Foucha made two interceptions in a game for the first time in his career, with picks coming in the second and fourth quarters. Its the first time an Arkansas player has made two picks in a game since Dre Greenlaw in 2018 vs. Texas A&M.
- The duo of linebackers Pool and Grant Morgan combined for 35 of the team's 95 tackles.
- Arkansas made two stops on fourth down to force a turnover on downs when Mississippi State was inside the Arkansas 30-yard line.
- Arkansas limited Mississippi State to a 2-of-4 conversion rate in the red zone.
- Arkansas' three total interceptions is the most since the 2019 season-opener against Portland State (3).
- Arkansas made interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time since the San Jose State (Sept. 21) and Texas A&M (Sept. 28) contests in 2019.
- Arkansas held Mississippi State to 87 rushing yards.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

• A.J. Reed made his 65th consecutive PAT - has not missed since he was a freshman at Duke in 2016.

PLAYER NOTES

QB Feleipe Franks

- Completed 20-of-28 passes for 212 yards with two touchdown passes.
- Improved to 2-0 against Mississippi State in his career (13-6 win in 2018 with Florida).
- In the first half, completed 9-of-13 passes for 123 yards and one touchdown. He completed a season-best eight consecutive passes.



TE Hudson Henry

- Made his first career touchdown reception on a 12-yard catch from Franks with 11:21 to go in the third quarter to extend Arkansas' lead to, 21-7.
- Registered a career-best four receptions and totaled 20 yards.

RB Trelon Smith

- Was the team's leading rusher for the second straight game.
- Ran for a career-best 48 yards on 14 carries (3.4 ypc).
- Five receptions led the team. Five catches went for 22 yards.

WR De'Vion Warren

- Registered career-bests of four receptions and 100 receiving yards. Also had a career-long 53 yard catch.
- Scored his second career touchdown, and first since 2018, on a 19-yard grab.

S Simeon Blair

• Made a career-high six tackles.

NB Greg Brooks

- Made his 14th career start, including 14 straight. He has started every game he has played.
- Hauled in his second career interception and returned it 69 yards for a touchdown on the game's opening possession. It was Arkansas first interception return for a touchdown since Santos Ramirez against Florida in 2016. It is the Razorbacks longest interception return since Henry Tolliver's 70-yard run back against Alcorn State in 2016.
- Finished the game with five tackles, which tied a career-high.

S Jalen Catalon

- Registered a career-best 13 tackles, which ranked second on the team.
- Tallied nine or more tackles for the second straight game.

S Joe Foucha

- Registered his first career two interception game.
- Finished with two tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss and two interceptions.
- Picked off his first pass of the night at the Mississippi State 46-yard line in second quarter.
- Made his second interception at the Arkansas 32 yard-line in the third quarter.

DL Eric Gregory

- Recorded first career sack in the first half, creating an intentional grounding penalty for Mississippi State QB KJ Costello.
- · Finished with three tackles.

LB Grant Morgan

- The senior captain made his second start of the season and second career start.
- Set a career-high with 15 total tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup.
- Registered back-to-back double-digit tackle games for the first time in his career.
- Teamed with Greg Brooks Jr. for a 3rd &4 stop in the fourth quarter to force a Mississippi State punt.

LB Bumper Pool

- Made his 18th career start, including 15th straight.
- Set a career-high with 20 tackles, which is tied for the 10th most in a single game in school history. Jerry Franklin was the last Hog to have 20 in a game (Nov. 20, 2010 vs. Mississippi State). He is the sixth Razorback to have 20 or more total tackles since 2000.
- Registered his third straight game with double-digit tackles, which dates back to the 2019 season-finale against Missouri. Fourth career game with double-digit tackles.
- Set a career-high with two passes broken up.

S Myles Slusher

- The true freshman recorded his first career tackle and finished the game with three stops.
- Made his first career start.

P George Caratan

• Punted seven times for an average of 42.9 yards per punt with a long of 48 yards and three punts downed inside the 20.

K A.J. Reed

• Made his 65th consecutive PAT - has not missed since he was a freshman at Duke in 2016.
