

THIS REGIONAL

- » GCU returns to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year with its first at-large bid in program history. After transitioning from Division II, the Lopes have only been postseason eligible since the 2018 season.
- » The Lopes at-large resume includes wins over national seeds No. 2 Stanford and No. 3 Oregon State and 12 total wins against teams in the field.
- » GCU was a No. 4 seed in its inaugural regional appearance last year in the Tucson Regional.
- » Of the Stillwater Regional field, GCU has the best batting average (.309) while striking out the least (6.4 per game).

STORYLINES

- » GCU won the WAC regular-season title by going 25-5, four wins better than any other team. The Lopes have won four of the last five WAC regular-season crowns.
- » **Andy Stankiewicz** was named WAC Coach of the Year for the second straight year and fourth time overall.
- » **Daniel Avitia** was the WAC Pitcher and WAC Freshman of the Year. He holds GCU's freshman strikeout record.
- » **Jacob Wilson** is one of 31 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award. He is ranked as the nation's No. 5 shortstop by D1Baseball. He is the toughest batter to strike out in the nation, doing so only every 34.0 at bats.
- » Other Lopes ranked by D1Baseball: **Juan Colato** (#20 3B), **Daniel Avitia** (#44 SP), **Taylor Aguilar** (#94 OF).
- » GCU had a WAC-best six honorees on the first team: Jacob Wilson (SS), Juan Colato (3B), Tyler Wilson (AL), Daniel Avitia (SP), Vince Reilly (AL), Taylor Aguilar (OF).
- » The Lopes have shattered their all-time program record with 572 strikeouts (record was: 499 in 2018, 1986).
- » GCU has won a program-record 21 road games and holds the nation's fourth-best road win percentage (.778) behind Tennessee, Old Dominion and Texas State.
- » GCU sits at No. 50 in the NCAA RPI rankings.
- » GCU has the seventh-most hits (655) in the nation. The Lopes rank 13th in batting average (.309).
- » The Lopes are 33-5 when they hit at least one home run.
- » At 108-30 the last five conference seasons, GCU has the nation's best conference win percentage (.783).
- » GCU played the nation's No. 6 toughest nonconference schedule, per D1Baseball.com
- » Lopes pitching has controlled the strike zone, ranking 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.11).







Grand Canyon earned the first at-large bid by a WAC team since 2012 and was named one of the last four teams in by the NCAA selection committee on May 30.



"I'm excited for all of our guys in the program, for the families, fans, administration," Stankiewicz said. "I feel like they got it right. Sometimes, RPI becomes the end-all and I don't think it is. It's the overall body of work and our overall body of work put us in position. That's always been the design of our scheduling, to show people that if you schedule well, you schedule tough programs and you compete well, you've got a chance to get an at-large."

GCU set a Division I-era program record for wins this season and matched its best WAC winning percentage at 25-5, four games better than the next team. The Lopes went 2-2 against the tournament's No. 2 and No. 3 seeds (Stanford and Oregon State), 7-4 against elite Power 5 programs and 21-6 on the road.

» PRIMED FOR A BREAKTHROUGH

The theme of the program's rise continued when *Baseball America* released its list of the 10 mid-major schools primed for a breakthrough in the 2020s.

“

If you are betting on untapped potential, Grand Canyon is a solid bet to be among the next class of mid-majors that transforms into a perennial regional team. Everything is in place for the Antelopes to do so, and that's by design.

When GCU was preparing to move back up to Division I ahead of the 2014 season, the administration made an inspired hire in Andy Stankiewicz. Then, in 2018, GCU Ballpark opened, giving the Lopes a showcase facility to match the rest of the new construction on a growing campus.


All of that support has had the desired result. Grand Canyon has three Western Athletic Conference regular season titles already, including twice before it was even eligible to take part in the postseason. The team hasn't broken through to a regional yet, although they've only been eligible to do so for two years, but that will come sooner rather than later.

The publication's sentiment from 2020 has already partially come to fruition. The Lopes won their fourth WAC regular-season title (since returning to D-I) and advanced to their first regional in 2021.

» SCHEDULE TAKES ON CHALLENGES

A challenging schedule is typical of a Stankiewicz season. The Lopes will take on seven NCAA Tournament teams in 2022. Not only did these seven opponents simply qualify for the NCAA Tournament, they had significant success.

» LOPES RISE, TALENT RISES

A respected coaching staff, a top-tier ballpark, recent team success, a pro pipeline, baseball weather and a growing university are just a few contributing factors to the rise in notoriety of the Lopes' incoming talent.

The recruiting accolades have become more and more commonplace, headlined by a 2019 top-30 recruiting class ranking by *Collegiate Baseball*.

This year's group of newcomers has made its own mark. *Prep Baseball Report* listed GCU as one of its 10 best non-Power Five recruiting classes.

The publication highlights incoming Lopes Zach Yorke, Isaac Lyon and Nick Arias. GCU is joined on the list by Campbell, Coastal Carolina, Illinois State, Jacksonville, Old Dominion, South Florida, UC Santa Barbara, UNC Wilmington and Wichita State.



» PAC-12 PUNCH

GCU has had success against the Pac-12 beginning notably in the 2019 season, piling up nine victories against schools from the conference.

The Lopes went 4-3 against the Pac-12 in 2019 and split four games in 2020. GCU had an early 4-0 series loss to Oregon State early in 2021 before splitting regular-season series with Arizona State and Arizona.

GCU is already on the board in 2022, defeating three Pac-12 opponents with five more games on the schedule: two more vs. Arizona, one more vs. Arizona State and two vs. Stanford.

Unheralded out of the high school ranks, **Elijah Buries** quickly made a name for himself in college baseball.

With a resume worthy of Freshman All-American status, Buries led GCU in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage and stolen bases.

He checked in with one of the nation's top 60 batting averages.

Buries was part of an even more exclusive club of true freshmen to hit .370 or above. With the COVID waiver making many second-year players on the national leaderboards into de facto freshmen, Buries was one of the few true freshmen to hit at the level he did in 2021.

» WYNNE GOES PRO

The U.S. is not the only country that presents pro opportunities in baseball. **Coen Wynne**, a bullpen mainstay for four seasons from 2018-21, earned a pro contract in his native Australia over the summer.


Wynne joined the professional ranks by signing a multi-year deal with the Sydney Blue Sox of the Australian Baseball League.

» NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED BALLPARK

While the iconic gold bleachers and green brick of Brazell Stadium served the program well through 2017, it was time for a new facility to rise alongside the growing national brand of the Lopes program.



Following the 2017 season, a state-of-the-art ballpark was constructed that catapulted GCU's facilities to elite status in the west. With a capacity of 4,000 fans, the newly dubbed Brazell Field at GCU Ballpark offers covered chairback seating, restrooms, a concession stand, new sound system, right field entertainment platform, turf berm, larger dugouts, a spacious three-room press box and even classroom space.



Ballpark Digest took note, naming GCU's facility the Best Ballpark Improvement of 2018 across all levels of baseball – college and professional alike.

"On a college campus committed to top-notch facilities, it's no surprise that a renovated ballpark should shine," Kevin Reichard of Ballpark Digest wrote in November. "With a fan-friendly design that also recognizes the program's rich history, GCU Ballpark is our choice for the Best Ballpark Improvement."

The finishing touches were put on the stadium following the 2018 season when approximately 1,200 field-level seats were installed to complete construction.

» SIZEABLE STADIUM

Featuring a capacity of 4,000 fans, Brazell Field at GCU Ballpark is the fourth-largest on-campus baseball stadium west of Texas.

He is one of 52 active Division I coaches to have collected 300 or more wins while also winning at a clip of better than .570.


» BRAZELL'S LEGACY

Dr. Dave Brazell, the founder of GCU's baseball program, passed away on Oct. 17, 2018, at age 93 after a long battle with cancer.

Brazell served as a coach, teacher and administrator in Grand Canyon athletics and academics for 50 years (1951-2001), leaving an impression with his character, charisma and competition.

Brazell is most remembered for his 28 seasons at the helm of Lopes baseball, a program he founded in 1953. Grand Canyon baseball did not get bleachers, grass or a win until the following season, but he built a program that he guided to an NAIA national ranking by 1967 and an NAIA national championship in 1980.

Brazell went 728-385-8 as the head coach of a baseball program whose home is called Brazell Field at GCU Ballpark, the stadium that opened in February 2018 around the original field Brazell designed in 1962. Brazell joined students with picks and shovels to dig the first dugouts

for a field that remains where he chalked lines and manicured the grass.

"Nobody probably has contributed more to Grand Canyon University over the years than Dave and Mildred Brazell," GCU President Brian Mueller said of Brazell and his wife of 72 years. "They have made countless contributions to the University and impacted thousands of lives from an academic, athletic and spiritual life perspective."



"I'm proud," Brazell said in February 2018. "We worked hard and we got good players in there and that's the key thing. You do your coaching in the summertime when you contact players and get good ones in there."

» FIFTH-YEAR VETS

GCU will lean on the experience of a handful of ultra-veterans of college baseball. The NCAA's COVID waiver for a shortened 2020 season has granted extra eligibility, and four Lopes are playing in their fifth seasons.

Nick Hull has spent all of his career in a GCU uniform. A career reliever, Hull is expected to move to the Lopes' starting rotation in his fifth season.

Juan Colato has the second-most Lopes experience. He retains one year of eligibility should he opt to use it since his 2019 season was cut short with injury.

» BASEBALL IN THE STANKIEWICZ FAMILY

Baseball is in the air at the Stankiewicz household.

Of course it started with Andy, a former big leaguer. The undersized, scrappy infielder won over the hearts of fans throughout his seven-year MLB career.

The passion for the sport continued through Andy and Mari Ana's children.

The oldest, Drew, played baseball at Arizona State and was an 11th-round choice of the Philadelphia Phillies. Drew has five seasons of professional baseball under his belt, reaching as high as the Double-A level in 2018.

Marisa made the most of a softball career at Arizona State where she steadily improved her game each season before starring for the Sun Devils in their run to the Women's College World Series in 2018. Marisa served on the ASU staff as a volunteer assistant coach for a season and continues to coach softball.

Dane also showed off his baseball skill, playing at GCU as an infielder for five seasons from 2017-21. Dane was one of GCU's most vocal leaders and was known for doing the "little things", just as you'd expect from a coach's kid. He is pursuing a career in coaching.

Lastly, Mia was a junior-college All-American playing softball at South Mountain Community College before joining the CSUN program for 2022.

» WELCOME COACH SBRANTI

Shea Sbranti joined GCU's staff in August as its volunteer assistant coach. Most recently, he was the Penn State director of player personnel after a two-year playing career with the Nittany Lions.

"I'm very excited to start working for Coach (Andy) Stankiewicz, Coach (Gregg) Wallis and Coach (Jon) Wentz in the program they have built," Sbranti said. "I look forward to our success in the near future."

Sbranti spent two seasons as Penn State's director of player personnel, assisting with the daily operations of the program. Penn State was off to a 10-5 start in 2020 before the COVID-19 shutdown and played a conference-only schedule in 2021.

"Shea brings a wealth of knowledge to our program, especially in the area of catching defense," Stankiewicz said. "He had a wonderful playing career at San Joaquin Delta College and then onto Penn State for two years. He will bring high energy and a very detailed coaching regimen to our program. GCU baseball is pleased to announce Shea as a member of our coaching staff."

Sbranti will replace outgoing Lopes volunteer assistant Paul Panaccione, a GCU alumnus who served three years as volunteer assistant before taking a position as Prep Baseball Report's Arizona Scouting Director.

» COLATO BRINGS SALVADORAN FLAG TO GCU

If not for El Salvador's 12-year civil war, Fernandomania in California, hitting wads of paper with a broomstick, an uncle living in Phoenix and a chance Christmastime meeting, **Juan Colato** might not be walking the GCU campus with two bright futures—in baseball and engineering.

Pursuing a college degree on a baseball scholarship was the goal that his parents, Marcos and Katia, set for their oldest child when they hatched a plan as he started school in San Salvador.

Juan backed the plan with passion and purpose in the years since then. He is now believed to be the first player born and raised in El Salvador to play Division I colatobaseball on an athletic scholarship.

"It's like a movie script for him because he's been battling a lot of players, obstacles, the language and coaches who didn't believe in him," Marcos said. "It's a very nice story that he made for himself."

Juan is a success in numbers, whether it be his team-leading .367 batting average in 2020, his 3.5 GPA in engineering or being the one Salvadoran among 6.5 million to blaze this trail for his country.

"It means a lot to me," Juan said. "I try not to forget it. I try to always remember where I came from. I try to always think about my friends who weren't as lucky as I was, to have my uncle here and all the other stuff. I work hard for it."

» BURIES RISES, LIFTS MOM'S SPIRIT

If **Elijah Buries** was not an undeterred overcomer, he would not have made two-hour round trips daily in high school so that he could face the best competition.

Buries would have given up when he was a fourth-year starter with no Division I offers. He would have been overwhelmed at a GCU camp of committed players in 2020, shook by his mother's cancer diagnosis on the day he moved into GCU, discouraged at his chances as an unheralded freshman on a 48-man Lopes roster and dismayed when he did not play in the first three games of 2021.

Buries' ability to adapt and overcome made him the 2021 GCU season's surprise sensation as the team's leading hitter. Buries showed the power of a conventional clean-up batter with the unconventional traits of hitting to all fields for his team-best .374 average and running for a team-high 13 stolen bases.

During Elijah's first semester away from home, his mother, Jude, underwent chemotherapy for months to combat multiple myeloma, a rare cancer of plasma cells that impedes the body from fighting infection.

Jude attended Elijah's first college series and saw his first AB, a pinch-hit RBI double on Feb. 21, 2021, against Missouri, before going to City of Hope for three weeks to receive a stem cell transplant. After extended isolation helped by streaming GCU games, Jude returned home in May 2021 with an optimistic prognosis.

"It's been really rough," Elijah said. "I struggled with it ... and talked to Stank (GCU head coach Andy Stankiewicz). He's just amazing. More than anything, he's such a supporting coach. As good as he is at coaching baseball, he's even better at life and making sure everyone's feeling good. The way he cares about us is special."

"When GCU came knocking, every other school was insignificant," his father, Jeff said. "There is not a better human being than Coach Stank to be my son's coach. It is literally the perfect fit."

Elijah went from pondering pursuits of junior college baseball or firefighter academy to committing to GCU two weeks later. It's worked out quite well for both sides since.

A former big leaguer, professional scout and minor league manager, **Andy Stankiewicz** is in his 11th season at the helm of Grand Canyon's baseball program for the 2022 season after becoming the fourth head coach in the history of the program prior to the 2012 campaign.

Stankiewicz has guided GCU to four WAC regular-season titles (2015, 2017, 2018, 2021), one WAC tournament title (2021) and the program's first NCAA tournament appearance at the D-I level (2021). Along the way, Stankiewicz has been awarded the WAC Coach of the Year award three times (2017, 2018, 2021).

GCU achieved a major milestone in 2021 by reaching its first NCAA tournament at the D-I level. The Lopes claimed the WAC's top seed entering the tournament and took care of business by going 3-0 with wins over New Mexico State, Sacramento State and UT Rio Grande Valley. GCU advanced to a regional in Tucson, falling to a pair of top-25 teams in No. 5 Arizona and No. 23 Oklahoma State. Stankiewicz led the Lopes to a D-I program record of 39 wins while recording a personal milestone by winning his 300th game on May 29 in the WAC tournament championship game. The Lopes made noise in the state of Arizona in 2021 by splitting regular-season series with Arizona and Arizona State, while also picking up impressive series wins over Tulane and Missouri.

After a pair of successful seasons at the Division II level in 2012 and 2013, Stankiewicz successfully guided the GCU baseball program through a transition to the Division I level. The transition saw unprecedented success, as the Lopes claimed the WAC regular-season championships in 2015 and 2017. Amid the transition, GCU posted an impressive 71-33 (.683) mark in conference play despite being the WAC's only transitioning school. Amid the transition, Stankiewicz's program recorded marquee wins over the likes of Texas Tech, Oklahoma State, Arizona, Tennessee, UC Irvine and Kansas.

GCU's success under Stankiewicz continued after the Division I transition when the Lopes claimed the 2018 WAC regular-season title. The skipper was named the WAC Coach of the Year for the second straight season, and the program once again featured the WAC Player of the Year (Quin Cotton). For the second straight season, GCU won all eight of its conference series -- running an impressive streak of consecutive conference series wins to a nation-leading 17 series. Stankiewicz also guided GCU to its first top-10 win, toppling No. 4/7 TCU 9-8 in 12 innings on Feb. 18.

Stankiewicz is one of the more respected coaches on the collegiate baseball landscape, evidenced by multiple selections to lead USA Baseball national teams into international competition. Most recently, Stankiewicz guided the U18 national team to an undefeated gold-medal run at the World Baseball Cup in Thunder Bay, Ontario, Canada in September 2017. He helped lead the team to a 9-0 mark and a 61-5 margin of victory.

The MLB Draft is increasingly shining a national spotlight on the impressive player development within the program under Stankiewicz's guidance. GCU had nine players drafted between the 2018 and 2019 drafts, with the five selections in 2019 matching a program best. In 2018, right-handed pitcher Jake Wong became GCU's highest draft pick since Tim Salmon (1989), going in the third round (80th overall) to the San Francisco Giants. Another right-hander, Mick Vorhof, went in the ninth round, the first time the program has featured two players in the first 10 rounds since 1988. Zach Malis (24th) and Ian Evans (26th) made it four total selections in the draft, the most since 1996. The Lopes topped that mark the following year with Quin Cotton (8th), Kona Quiggle (16th), Preston Pavlica (24th), Tyler Wyatt (31st) and Kade Mechals (40th), combining to tie a program record for total selections.

In his time as GCU's head coach, the Lopes have had 21 selections in the MLB Draft with five selections coming in the first 10 rounds. Fifty-one Lopes have been named first- or second-team all-conference in Stankiewicz's tenure with 30 being first-team selections.

Prior to joining GCU, Stankiewicz held the position of minor league field coordinator for the Seattle Mariners. Before his stint with the Mariners, he was a member of the Arizona State baseball coaching staff from 2007 to 2009. He helped guide the Sun Devils to three Pac-10 championships and two appearances in the College World Series.

Stankiewicz also brings to GCU a professional coaching background, having served as manager for the New York Yankees NY-Penn League team in Staten Island. He guided Staten Island to the NY-Penn League championship in 2005.

Stankiewicz was drafted by the New York Yankees in the 12th round of the 1986 First-Year Player Draft. He made his Major League debut with the Yankees on April 11, 1992. Stankiewicz played in parts of seven MLB seasons, with the Yankees (1992-93), Houston Astros (1994-95), Montreal Expos (1996-97) and the inaugural season of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 1998.

A standout infielder at Pepperdine, Stankiewicz ranks in the school's top 10 in runs scored (172), triples (9), at-bats (755), stolen bases (101) and games played (220).

Andy and his wife, Mari Ana, reside in Gilbert and have four children: Drew, Marisa, Dane and Mia. Drew played collegiately at Arizona State and was an 11th-round selection of the Philadelphia Phillies in 2014 and has reached as high as Double-A. Marisa graduated from ASU, where she helped lead the Sun Devils softball team to a Women's College World Series appearance in 2018. Dane had a five-year playing career at GCU and now coaches college baseball. Mia was an All-American softball player at South Mountain Community College and now plays for CSUN.





The 2018 season marked the opening of the most expansive facelift in the 57-year history of the Grand Canyon baseball facility.

The field, which has gained a reputation as one of the top playing surfaces nationally, remains in place from Dr. Dave Brazell's initial designs in 1962. On January 22, 2018, the university officially announced that the field will retain the name of the founder and developer of GCU Baseball as Brazell Field.

The immaculate playing surface now has a shiny, new stadium surrounding it. Named GCU Ballpark, the facility brings with it many firsts for the wildly successful program. Ballpark Digest named GCU Ballpark the top ballpark improvement across all levels of baseball in 2018.


Following the venue's debut season in 2018, construction crews went back to work to put the finishing touches on the facility for a 2019 launch. The ballpark got even more fan friendly with chairback field-level seating, covered dugouts and camera wells to complete the new facility, replacing temporary seating sections.

Brazell Field at GCU Ballpark debuted to a program record crowd of 3,749 fans on Feb. 16, 2018 to watch the Lopes narrowly miss an upset of No. 4 TCU, falling 2-1.

New amenities that arrived with the facility included chairback seating, a turf berm, a multi-room press box, an on-site team shop, a ticket office, a state-of-the-art sound system, an entertainment deck, wireless internet access and classroom space.

Alongside the ballpark is an artificial turf practice field and batting cages. The Tim Salmon Clubhouse remains in place just steps outside of the ballpark.

Over time, the stadium has evolved from simple wooden bleachers and chainlink fence to one of the West's top collegiate baseball venues.


