

- ANOTHER RANKED SHOWDOWN For the fourth straight weekend, Tennessee will take on a ranked opponent, including three straight against top-five clubs. The Vols are 5-4 in those previous three series, including a sweep over then No. 12 Texas A&M.
- MERRITT IS MASHING Graduate transfer Griffin Merritt is red hot entering this weekend with eight RBIs over his last three games, including a pair of homers and a career-high six RBIs in last Saturday's series finale vs. Florida.

#### CREDENTIALS

All credentials not picked up at the Tennessee Media Relations office will be left at the ticket will call window at the entrance of the stadium.

#### **INTERVIEW POLICY**

Tennessee Head Coach Tony Vitello and select student-athletes will be available to meet working members of the media inside the batting cages located down the right-field line following each game at Lindsey Nelson Stadium. Media members are not permitted in the locker room or clubhouse area at anytime.

Interviews with visiting team members may be done on the field, subject to the policy of the visiting team's media relations representative

#### **PHOTOGRAPHERS/TV**

Media credentials are required for all photographers and television media.

. Photo decks are located atop the stairwells behind the first- and third-base lines. There is also a field-level photo area between the third-base dugout and the bleachers. Both still and television photographers are welcome to shoot from these locations. Television crews are welcome to film from the mezzanine level underneath the press box.

Photographers will not be permitted in or between the dugouts.

#### PRESS BOX

The Lindsey Nelson Stadium press box is for working members of the media only. The press box includes space for working members of the press, team representatives, public address announcer and scoreboard operator. Also located on the press level are two radio booths and a television/VIP booth. Admission to the press box is by credential only.

Updated cumulative statistics, game notes and team rosters will be available in the press box at each home game. A final box score will be distributed at the completion of each game. Stat Broadcast live stats links for each game are available at UTStats.com.

An official scorer is assigned to all home games, and Sean Barows will keep media informed of all scoring decisions, notable facts and records.

High-speed wireless Internet is available throughout Lindsey Nelson Stadium. There also are a limited number of DSL connections available in the press box and phone lines for dial-up access are available as well inside each radio booth.

### NUMBERS TO KNOW



Under head coach **Tony Vitello** (2018-pres.), Tennessee has won **13** series against top-25 teams, including five in 2022 and one so far this season.



Senior third baseman **Zane Denton** has driven in **16** runs during SEC play, which is double the next closest players on the team (Christian Moore & Griffin Merritt).



Since pitching coach **Frank Anderson** has been with the program (2018-pres.), the Vols have posted **35** shutouts, including three years of six or more (2023, 2022, 2019).

### **ROUNDING THE BASES**

### VOLS SET TO BATTLE HOGS IN ANOTHER TOP 25 SHOWDOWN

- For the third consecutive weekend, Tennessee will square off against a top-five team as the Vols hit the road to battle No. 5 Arkansas this weekend following back-to-back series against No. 1 LSU and No. 2 Florida.
- The Big Orange are 5-4 against ranked teams so far this season after sweeping then No. 12 Texas A&M three weekends ago before dropping two of three games against No. 1 LSU and No. 2 Florida the past two weekends.
   Since Tony Vitello became UT's head coach in 2018, the Vols have posted 54 wins over ranked foes, including
- 23 victories over teams ranked in the top 10 and seven wins over top-ranked teams LSU in 2023, Ole Miss (x3) in 2022, Arkansas in 2021, Texas Tech in 2020 and Florida in 2018.
- Vitello's record against ranked teams at Tennessee is 54-47.
- Tennessee went 16-6 against ranked foes last year with series wins over No. 22 Georgia, No. 17 Auburn, No. 24 Alabama and sweeps at No. 3 Vanderbilt and No. 1 Ole Miss, plus three ranked wins in the SEC Tournament.
  UT has won 13 series over ranked teams since 2018, including five last season.
- BATTLE OF SEC POWERS
- This weekend's series will feature the SEC's top two teams in terms of overall record during conference play since the start of the 2021 season and will also pit the last two SEC Champions against one another.
- Tennessee is 50-22 in SEC regular-season play since 2021, the best record in the league. The next closest program is Arkansas, who is 48-24 in that span. Including postseason games, the Vols are 59-24 against SEC foes since 2021.
- The last meeting between the two programs came in the 2021 SEC Tournament Championship game, a 7-2 Arkansas victory.
- UT put together one of the most dominant seasons in SEC history in 2022, winning both the SEC Regular Season and SEC Tournament Championships for the first time since 1995.
- The Vols posted their best record in league play in program history, going 25-5 en route to winning the SEC regular season title by six games, and the eastern division crown by 10 games, both of which are the largest margins in conference history.
- UT secured the regular-season title with four games still remaining in conference play after clinching the Eastern Division title a week earlier.
- The Vols have won the last two SEC Eastern Division crowns, as well.
- Tennessee was the first team to start SEC play 12-0 in the history of the conference, surpassing the previous record of 11-0 held by LSU (1991), Ole Miss (1964) and Alabama (1940).

#### VOL WARS: BREAK OUT THE LIGHT SABER

- Tennessee has been putting its new home run celebration to good use this season, as the Vols rank fifth nationally and third in the SEC with 65 home runs entering this weekend. UT hitters have donned a Darth Vader mask with a light saber in the dugout following homers this year.
- So far this season, 17 different players have gone deep for the Big Orange. Eleven of those 15 players have hit multiple homers, led by Blake Burke (12), Griffin Merritt (10) and Zane Denton (8).
- UT has homered in 23 of its last 26 games and has gone deep multiple times in 20 games this season. The Big Orange posted their 11th contest with three or more homers in Tuesday's 14-2 win over Eastern Kentucky, going deep five times in the run-rule victory. Logan Chambers and Reese Chapman both hit their first-career home runs in the win.
- For the fourth time since 2019, the Big Orange tied the program's single-season home run record, blasting seven long balls in the series opener vs. Morehead State on March 10.
- Six separate players combined for the seven homers on the night while four different players hit their first home run of the year (Maui Ahuna -2, Kavares Tears, Dylan Dreiling, Christian Scott). Tears and Dreiling's blasts were the first of their careers.
- Tennessee's 158 home runs in 2022 shattered the previous program record of 107 while ranking fourth in NCAA Division I history, including the most by any team in the BBCOR bat era (since 2011).

#### ANDERSON'S ARM FACTORY

Under the guidance of Frank Anderson, one of the nation's top pitching coaches and developers of talent throughout his highly-successful career, Tennessee once again has one of the nation's premier pitching staffs.
The Vols' staff enters this week among the national and SEC leaders in numerous categories.

- In their series sweep of Morehead State (3/10-11), the Vols totaled 43 punchouts over the three games (15 in Game 1, 16 in Game 2 and 12 in Game 3). The 43 strikeouts were the most by UT in a single series since racking up 46 in three games vs. Indiana (Feb. 22-24, 2019).
- The Vols' bullpen has also been impressive this year with a 2.12 ERA and 178 strikeouts compared to just 39 walks in 135.2 innings pitched. AJ Russell (0.71), Bryce Jenkins (0.87), Aaron Combs (1.50), Camden Sewell (1.59), Jake Fitzgibbons (1.93), Jacob Bimbi (2.00), Andrew Lindsey (2.01), Seth Halvorsen (2.42) and Kirby Connell (2.70), all enter this week with ERA's under 3.00.

#### SEC SWEEPS

- In just the four-plus seasons under head coach **Tony Vitello** that have featured SEC games (no SEC games in 2020 due to COVID-19), Tennessee has recorded 11 series sweeps in league play.
- Prior to Vitello taking over as head coach in 2018, the Vols recorded just 12 series sweeps in conference play from 2003-2017, a span of 15 seasons.

#### DICKEY DOES IT ALL

- Redshirt sophomore **Jared Dickey** has consistently been one of Tennessee's top players this season and is doing a little bit of everything for the Big Orange this season.
- Dickey enters the weekend having reached base safely in 11 straight games and ranks second on the team with 10 multi-hit games.
- The Mount Juliet, Tennessee, native led the team with a .429 batting average and six hits against No. 1LSU two weeks ago, recording at least one hit in all three games. Dickey capped the series with a three-hit day to go along with a run scored and two RBIs in UT's 14-7 win in the series finale on Saturday.
- Dickey has also been extremely valuable for the Vols defensively with his ability to play all three outfield spots and catcher. He has started seven of the last 11 games behind the plate after not playing any catcher for the first 21 games of the season.
- Dickey has started at four different positions this season: left field (10), catcher (7), center field (6), right field (6) and designated hitter (3).

#### DENTON NEXT IN LINE AT 3BU

- Tennessee has become a factory when it comes to producing third basemen with the likes of Andre Lipcius (2019), Jake Rucker (2020-21) and Trey Lipscomb (2022) manning the hot corner in each of the past four years.
- Zane Denton is proving to be the next in line of ultra-productive players at third base for the Big Orange. The Alabama transfer enters the weekend leading the team in RBIs (34), triples (3) and sac flies (4) while also ranking second on the team in extra-base hits (15), walks (28), on-base percentage (.439) and total bases (63). He also ranks third on the team in home runs (8) and slugging percentage (.636).
- The Brentwood, Tennessee, native hit his team-leading six home run in SEC play with a two-run blast vs. No. 2 Florida last Friday night. Denton's six homers and 16 RBIs are double that of anyone else on the team in league play.
- Denton homered twice and led Tennessee with five RBIs in its series at No. 1 LSU (3/30-4/1).
- Denton was the Vols' most productive player in UT's series vs. Texas A&M (3/24-3/26), leading the team in batting average (.667), on-base percentage (.818), slugging percentage (1.667), homers (2), RBIs (6), total bases (10) and walks (5).
- The senior switch hitter put forth a massive performance in the series finale, going 3-for-3 with a walk, two
  runs scored and five RBIs. Denton went deep twice in the game, marking his first-career multi-homer outing.
- Denton became just the fifth player in program history to hit for the cycle, doing so in the series opener vs. Morehead State on March 10.

#### BURKE FINDING HIS GROOVE AGAIN

- After a slow start to SEC play, sophomore slugger **Blake Burke** is starting to find his form once again at the plate, batting .325 with three homers and six RBIs over the team's last 10 games.
- Burke went 2-for-3 with two RBIs and hit his team-leading 12th homer of the year in Tuesday's midweek win over Eastern Kentucky. He also went deep in last Thursday's series opener vs. No. 2 Florida.

#### IMPACT TRANSFERS

- Despite losing all eight position starters and five key arms from last season's team, Tennessee was able to bolster its core of returners with impact transfers from other four-year schools as well as the JUCO ranks.
- The Vols added veteran position players via the transfer portal with the likes of **Maui Ahuna**, **Zane Denton** and **Griffin Merritt**, who have combined for 453 games played at the Division I level.
- On the mound, UT added Charlotte transfer Andrew Lindsey as well JUCO arms in Zach Joyce, Bryce Jenkins, Jacob Bimbi and Aaron Combs, among others.
- More info on some of the Vols' top newcomers can be found below.

#### Maui Ahuna (SS - Kansas)

- Enters this weekend on a six-game hitting streak and has recorded at least one hit in 19 of his 23 games played this season.
- Was a first-team All-Big 12 selection as a sophomore in 2022 after slashing .396/.479/.634 with 42 runs scored, 16 doubles, eight home runs, 48 RBIs and 13 stolen bases for the Jayhawks.
- Starred for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team over the summer.
- Tabbed a preseason All-American by multiple outlets as well as a preseason All-SEC selection and is considered a potential first round draft pick in the upcoming 2023 MLB Draft.

#### Zane Denton (3B - Alabama)

- Leads the team with 34 RBIs and three triples while also ranking second on the team in extra-base hits (15), total bases (63), walks (28) and on-base percentage (.439).
- Leads the team with five home run and 13 RBIs over the last 10 games.
- Hit for the cycle on March 10 vs. Morehead State, finishing with a career-high six RBIs.
- A three-year starter for the Crimson Tide who was named to the 2021 SEC All-Newcomer Team and SEC All-Defensive Team.
- Led Alabama with 13 homers and 48 RBI last season after leading the team with a .308 batting average in 2021. Griffin Merritt (OF Cincinnati)
- Ranks second on the team with 10 home runs after hitting three bombs and driving in seven runs over the last
   two games
- Had three hits, scored three runs and had a career-high six RBIs in win over Florida last Saturday.
- One of the top players for the Bearcats over the past three seasons, boasting a .528 career slugging percentage with 29 home runs and 102 RBIs during his career at Cincinnati.
- Named the 2022 American Athletic Conference Player of the Year after leading the league with 19 homers. Was also tabbed a CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American.

#### Andrew Lindsey (RHP - Charlotte)

- Tops among UT relievers with 26 strikeouts in 22.1 innings of work.
- After issuing three walks in his Tennessee debut, has only walked five batters over his last 11 appearances (19.1 IP) while racking up 25 strikeouts in that span.
- Had a season-long outing of 4.2 innings at No. 1 LSU (3/31), holding the Tigers to one run while striking out three batters.
- Was one of the 49ers top pitchers as a sophomore in 2021, helping lead them to the NCAA Greenville Regional.
- Made 12 starts over 20 appearances, finishing 6-2 on the year to go along with a 4.89 ERA. Led the team with 81.0 innings pitched and finished second on the staff with 76 strikeouts.

#### Aaron Combs (RHP - College of Central Florida)

- Has emerged as a valuable weapon out of the bullpen and continues to see an increased role.
- Is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA in 12 relief appearances this season, totaling 22 strikeouts while allowing just two walks and five hits in 12.0 innings of work.
- Has not allowed a run or a hit in nine of his 12 appearances and has posted seven consecutive scoreless outings.
- Spent last season at the College of Central Florida where he was a 2022 All-Mid Florida Conference first team selection and helped the Patriots to a 47-17 record and a trip to the 2022 NJCAA Division I Junior College World Series after going 8-2 with a 3.45 ERA and 74 strikeouts in 60.0 innings pitched.

#### Bryce Jenkins (RHP - Cleveland State Community College)

- Has allowed just one run on four hits in his 10 relief appearances this season and has yet to issue a walk while totaling 13 strikeouts.
- Retired all six batters he faced with a career-high five strikeouts against No. 2/3 Florida last Friday night.
- Compiled a 11-9 record over 27 appearances (26 starts) during his time at Cleveland State Community College. • Went 4-3 with a 4.45 ERA and tied for the team lead with 13 starts in 2022 while racking up a team-high 93
- strikeouts over 60.2 innings pitched.

### Zach Joyce (RHP - Walters State Community College)

- Has been solid in 11 relief appearances this season, allowing just three runs on seven hits while racking up 15 strikeouts in nine innings of work.
- Has not allowed a base runner in six of his 11 appearances this season.
- Knoxville native who rejoined the Tennessee baseball program in the fall after deciding to step away from the game for the last two years.
- Twin brother of former Vol *Ben Joyce*, who was an All-American relief pitcher for UT in 2022 and was drafted in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels.
- Spent two seasons with his brother Ben at Walters State and helped lead the Senators to the NJCAA D1 JUCO World Series as a freshman in 2019, making 13 relief appearances with a 1.15 ERA, racking up 24 strikeouts while issuing just six walks in 15.2 innings pitched.

#### Jacob Bimbi (LHP - Wabash Valley College)

- Has made 10 relief appearances this season, allowing two runs on seven hits in nine innings with 14 strikeouts.
- Posted five straight scoreless outings: WCU (3/21), Lipscomb (3/14), Morehead State (3/10), UNCA (3/28) and EKU (4/11).
- Star pitcher for the Warriors in 2022, helping lead the program to a 59-9 record and a fourth-place finish at the NJCAA DI JUCO World Series while earning a spot on the World Series All-Tournament team.
- Tabbed a 2022 NJCAA Division I First-Team All-American starting pitcher after starting 18 games and posting an 11-1 record with a 1.49 ERA and 133 strikeouts in 84.2 innings pitched.


Beam posted a big performance last Saturday for the Vols, helping UT salvage the final game of the series with No. 2 Florida.

#### THE WEEKEND ROTATION

- Tennessee boasts one of the most talented weekend pitching rotations in the country with the trio of **Chase Dollander**, **Chase Burns** and **Drew Beam**.
- All three landed on the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List and were tabbed as first-team preseason All-Americans by at least one outlet with Dollander and Burns garnering unanimous first-team honors.
- The trio combined to post an 26-3 record last season with 273 strikeouts and just 59 walks allowed in 235.1 innings pitched.

#### Chase Dollander - RHP - Jr. (4-3, 4.19 ERA, 1.19 WHIP, 13.2 Ks per 9)

- Dollander is widely regarded as one of the top college pitching prospects this season and is projected as an early first-round pick in the 2023 MLB Draft after earning unanimous All-America honors and being named the SEC Pitcher of the Year in 2022.
- Was named to the Golden Spikes Midseason Watch List last Wednesday.
- Enters the weekend tied for 18th nationally and fourth in the SEC with 63 strikeouts.
- Finished with seven strikeouts despite pitching just four innings in last start vs. No. 2 Florida.

#### Chase Burns - RHP - So. (2-3, 6.10 ERA, 1.31 WHIP, 15.0 Ks per 9)

- Burns was one of the top freshmen in the country in 2022, earning freshman of the year or freshman pitcher of the year recognition from the NCBWA, D1Baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball News while garnering unanimous Freshman All-America honors. He was the first pitcher in program history to earn three national award honors in the same season.
- Tied for seventh in the nation with 69 strikeouts and ranks fifth nationally with 15.0 strikeouts per nine innings.
- · Was named to the Golden Spikes Midseason Watch List last Wednesday.
- Has posted 12-plus strikeouts three times this season.

#### Drew Beam - RHP - So. (4-1, 2.52 ERA, 1.19 WHIP, 9.4 Ks per 9)

- Beam was also one of the top freshman arms in 2022, earning unanimous Freshman All-America honors while being recognized as the SEC Freshman of the Year.
- Was dominant in a win over No. 2 Florida last Saturday, pitching six scoreless innings before allowing a tworun homer in the seventh. Allowed just four hits and tied a career high with 10 strikeouts in seven innings of work against the Gators.
- Enters the weekend with the lowest ERA among Tennessee's weekend starters and has not allowed more than three earned runs in any start this season.

#### DENTON HITS FOR THE CYCLE

- Senior third baseman Zane Denton became the fifth player in program history and the second in as many years to hit for the cycle after accomplishing the feat in the series opener vs. Morehead State on March 10.
- Denton led Tennessee's offensive explosion in the 23-4 victory, finishing with a career high four hits and six RBIs on the night.
- The Brentwood, Tennessee, native got UT on the board with an RBI double to open the scoring in the first inning before homering in his second at-bat with a solo blast in the bottom of the third. He drove in two more runs with a single in the fifth before completing the cycle with a two-run triple in the bottom of the sixth.

### NON-CON DOMINATION

- Tennessee has been extremely successful against non-conference opponents since the start of the 2019 season, posting a 112-20 record in that span.
- The Vols have not lost a regular-season non-conference weekend series since 2020 (Wright State) and have swept 11 of their 13 regular-season non-conference weekend series since 2020.
- In 2022 and 2021, the Vols posted a 53-10 record against out-of-conference opponents, going 28-4 a season ago after posting a 25-6 non-conference record in 2021.
- Under Vitello, Tennessee is an incredible 60-9 overall in midweek games, including a 13-1 record a season ago, outscoring their opponents 139-31 in those 14 contests.
- The Vols are 8-1 in midweek games this season while outscoring their opponents 89-13 in those contests.
- In 21 non-conference games this season, Tennessee is batting .311 as a team with 50 home runs and has a 1.87 team ERA while posting seven shutouts and holding opponents to a .173 batting average. The Vols have allowed more than three earned runs just twice in their 21 non-SEC contests.

#### ROCKY TOP TRULY IS HOME SWEET HOME

- Tennessee has been extremely tough to beat at home over the past three-plus years thanks in large part to
  having one of the best home field advantages in college baseball.
- The Vols are 102-19 when playing at Lindsey Nelson Stadium since the start of the 2020 season and continue to set attendance records along the way.
- UT sold out 29 of its 45 home games last season and set new program records for total (181,517) and average attendance (4,221). 47 of UT's 50 highest single-game attendance marks have come since the start of the 2021 season (all over 4,000).
- The Big Orange have sold out 13 of their 24 home games this season and have posted an attendance of over 4,000 in all 24 of those contests.
- In its win over Gonzaga on March 4, Tennessee recorded the second highest attendance for a game in program history (5,037), while the March 7 midweek contest against Boston College came in at No. 3 (4,749). Last Thursday's series opener vs. No. 2/3 Florida had an attendance of 4,727, the fourth highest in program history.

### 2022 MLB DRAFT PAINTED BIG ORANGE

- The 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft was one for the history books at Tennessee as a program-record 10 Volunteers heard their names called to fulfill lifelong dreams.
- Tennessee's 10 selections ranked as the second most of any school, just one behind Oklahoma's 11, and the most of any SEC program.
- Previously, the record for players drafted in a single season out of Tennessee was eight in 1992 when the draft had 50 rounds, compared to the modern draft which is only 20 rounds.
- Since 2019, 26 Vols have been selected in the MLB Draft, the third-highest total among SEC teams in that span.

#### VOLS REPRESENTED WELL IN THE WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC

• Two VFLs represented their countries in the 2023 World Baseball Classic. Liam Spence and Team Australia made it through the Group Stage before being eliminated by Cuba in the quarterfinals, while Julio Borbon served as the first base coach for the Dominican Republic.

#### **RECORD-SETTING 2022 SEASON**

- Tennessee continued its reemergence as an SEC and national power in 2022, setting a new program record with 57 victories en route to winning SEC regular season and SEC Tournament titles for the first time 1995. The Vols won the SEC regular season title by six games and the eastern division crown by 10 games, both of which are the largest margins in conference history.
- The Vols achieved the program's first No. 1 national ranking in any poll in week six before settling in as the unanimous top-ranked team in week seven. UT was ranked No. 1 in at least one poll during 12 weeks of the season and spent 10 weeks as the nation's unanimous top-ranked team.
- UT led the nation in numerous statistical categories while setting a handful of program records along the way, including new marks for home runs (158), runs scored (613), RBIs (574), slugging percentage (.604), ERA (2.51), WHIP (1.00), opponent batting average (.199), strikeouts (695), strikeouts/nine innings (10.5) and walks allowed/nine innings (2.48).
- Tennessee became the first NCAA Division I team since at least 1972 to lead the country in both home runs and ERA. The Vols' 158 long balls shattered the previous program record of 107 while ranking fourth in NCAA Division I history, including the most by any team in the BBCOR bat era (since 2011). UT also led the country in runs scored (613), slugging percentage (.604), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.24), WHIP (1.00), walks allowed/ nine innings (2.48) and win/loss percentage (.864).

Since taking over prior to the 2018 season, Vitello has coached 27 players at Tennessee that have gone on to be selected in the MLB Draft, including a program record 10 in 2022.

Vitello's teams have been consistent postseason contenders, advancing to 15 15 NCAA Regionals and five NCAA Super Regionals as well as two trips to the CWS (Tennessee - 2021 // Arkansas - 2015).

> During his 19-year collegiate coaching career, Vitello has helped assemble 12 top-15 signing classes, including two top-10 classes since coming to UT and the top-rated class in the nation in 2014.

### TENNESSEE HEAD BASEBALL COACH: TONY VITELLO

#### Full Bio on UTSports.com

Tony Vitello (pronounced: VIE-tell-oh) accepted the position of head coach for the Tennessee Volunteers baseball program on June 7, 2017.

Since taking over on Rocky Top, Vitello has led the Big Orange back to national prominence and has helped establish Tennessee baseball as an SEC and national power, leading the program to three NCAA regionals (2019, 2021, 2022), back-toback NCAA super regionals (2021 & 2022) and a College World Series (2021), its first since 2005.

A native of St. Louis, Missouri, Vitello arrived at UT following four seasons as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Arkansas. His rise to the head coaching ranks also included stops at Missouri (his alma mater) and TCU. He has earned a reputation as one of the elite recruiters on the college baseball landscape, having assembled 12 top-15 signing classes--including America's top-rated crop of talent in 2014. In November 2016, D1Baseball. com ranked Vitello No. 2, and tops in the SEC, on its list of the top 30 recruiting coordinators in America.

During a full-time, Division I coaching career spanning 19 years, Vitello has signed and developed nine first-round MLB Draft picks and a handful of players who gone on to play in Major League Baseball. That list includes VFL Garrett Crochet, Andrew Benintendi, Brandon Finnegan, Kyle Gibson, All-Star Aaron Crow, Gold Glove Award winner and four-time All-Star Ian Kinsler and five-time All-Star and three-time Cy Young Award winner Max Scherzer

Vitello, a two-time National Coach of the Year during his time at Tennessee, has recruited and developed three first-round picks during his tenure with the Vols, including Crochet, who was selected with the 11th overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft and became the first player to go from the draft to the big leagues without playing in the minors since Mike Leake did so with the Reds in 2010. Crochet made six appearances for the Chicago White Sox during the 2020 season, including one postseason outing.

Tennessee has had 27 players drafted since 2018 when Vitello took over as head coach, averaging just over five picks per year. Since 2019, the Vols' 26 selections rank third amongst SEC teams in that span.

Tennessee cemented its reemergence as an SEC and national power in 2022, setting a new program record with 57 victories en route to winning SEC Regular Season and SEC Tournament titles. With Vitello in charge, the Vols have increased their win total during every full season since his arrival (29 - 2018, 40 - 2019, 50 - 2021 57 - 2022)

The Volunteers achieved the program's first No. 1 national ranking in any poll in week six of the 2022 season before settling in as the unanimous top-ranked team in week seven. UT was ranked No. 1 in at least one poll during 12 weeks of the season and spent 10 weeks as the nation's unanimous top-ranked team.

The Vols led the nation in numerous statistical categories while setting a handful of program records along the way, including new marks for home runs (158), runs scored (613), RBIs (574), slugging percentage (.604), ERA (2.51), WHIP (1.00), opponent batting average (.199), strikeouts (695), strikeouts/ nine innings (10.5) and walks allowed/nine innings (2.48), among others

UT was one win away from making its second consecutive College World Series appearance but fell to Notre Dame in the Knoxville Super Regional. However, the Big Orange won both the SEC Regular Season and SEC Tournament championships for the first time since 1995. The Vols won the SEC Regular Season title by six games, and the eastern division crown by 10 games, both of which are the largest margins in conference history.

Tennessee became the first NCAA Division I team since at least 1972 to lead the country in both home runs and ERA. The Vols' 158 long balls shattered the previous program record of 107 while ranking fourth in NCAA Division I history, including the most by any team in the BBCOR bat era (since 2011). UT also led the country in runs scored (613), slugging percentage (.604), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.24), WHIP (1.00), walks allowed/nine innings (2.48) and winning percentage (.864). Vitello was named the Perfect Game National Coach of the

Year for the second season in a row and was also tabbed as the Southeast Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball

Coaches Association (ABCA). The Vols set a program record with nine players earning postseason All-America honors, including four first-team selections, which was also a school record. Tennessee had four players earn Freshmen All-America honors, as well.

Sophomore pitcher Chase Dollander racked up the postseason honors following a dominant year on the mound, becoming the first UT player to be named SEC Pitcher of the Year and earn consensus first-team All-America honors since Luke Hochevar in 2005. Freshman right hander Chase Burns also brought home some national awards after being named the D1Baseball.com National Freshman of the Year, the NCBWA Freshman National Pitcher of the Year and the Collegiate Baseball Co-Freshman National Player of the Year.

UT's 2022 record-breaking season was followed by an equally impressive showing in the 2022 MLB Draft, as a programrecord 10 Vols were selected, ranking second among all schools nationally and first in the SEC. Outfielders Drew Gilbert and Jordan Beck were both taken in the first round, giving Tennessee multiple first rounders for the first time since 2007 when three Tennessee players were selected in the opening round. The Vols became just the fourth SEC team to have 10 or more players chosen in the first 20 rounds of any MLB Draft, joining the likes of Mississippi State, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt.

Tennessee continued its ascension through the college baseball ranks during an historic 2021 season. Vitello's Vols won 50 games for just the third time in program history, finishing with a 50-18 record while advancing to the College World Series for the first time since 2005. UT also hosted an NCAA regional for the first time since 2005 and hosted its first-ever super regional, sweeping LSU to punch its ticket to Omaha for the fifth time in program history. Tennessee's 50 wins were tied for the most in the country in 2021.

Under Vitello's guidance, Tennessee won its first SEC Eastern division title since 1997 after posting a 20-10 record in league play and winning eight of its 10 conference series, including all five series on the road for the first time ever. The Vols also made their first appearance in the SEC Tournament Championship game since 1995 and advanced to back-to-back NCAA regionals for the first time since 2004 and 2005.

Vitello was named the 2021 National Coach of the Year by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Perfect Game, becoming just the second head coach in program history to earn that honor, joining legendary Vols' skipper Rod Delmonico, who was named National Coach of the Year by Baseball America in 1995. Delmonico led Tennessee to three of its previous four trips to the College World Series (1995, 2001, 2005) and is the program's career leader in wins with 699 during his time on Rocky Top. With an 11-6 win over Georgia on March 19, Vitello became the fastest head coach in program history to win 100 games with the Vols, overtaking Delmonico's mark of 163 games. Vitello needed just 153 contests to accomplish the feat. The St. Louis native has compiled a 191-77 record during his five seasons with the Big Orange despite having the majority of the 2020 season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tennessee was ranked for the entire 2021 season and checked in as high as No. 2 in the polls on multiple occasionsthe program's highest ranking ever at the time. The Vols set a program record with 16 road victories and hit 98 home runs-second most in school history at the time. Tennessee also had five players earn All-America honors in 2021, another program record until it was broken in the 2022 season.

For the third year in a row. Tennessee was also wellrepresented in the MLB Draft. UT's seven total picks were tied for the sixth most among Division I programs, and at the time, were tied for the second most in a single draft in program history and marked the most Vols ever selected through the first 20 rounds of any draft.

A three-year letterwinner at Missouri (2000-02), Vitello earned Academic All-Big 12 Conference honors as a senior and was named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll twice. Following his playing career and the completion of his management degree at MU, Vitello joined the Missouri coaching staff as a volunteer assistant in 2003 and completed his course work for his master's degree in business. In 2004, he was elevated to full-time assistant coach.




