FIRST PITCH

LAST TIME OUT

The Raiders are coming off a 1-2 weekend at Kentucky. Wright State dropped the opener 8-3 but bounced with a 12-9 victory in game two. The Wildcats collected a 15-0 shutout on Sunday to clinch the series win.

Wright State batted .214 over the three games with five doubles, six homers, and 15 runs batted in. The Raider pitching staff was tagged for 31 earned runs, but three newcomers in Warren Hartzell, Ty Roder, and Ben Vore worked scoreless frames in relief.

"POWER FIVE" WIN

Wright State's 12-9 win over Kentucky was its 20th win over a "Power Five" conference opponent since 2014. WSU finished with a season-high 13 hits, including eight for extra bases. The duo of **Andrew Patrick** and **Jay Luikart** combined to go 7-for-8 at the plate with two doubles, four homers, eight runs batted in, and six runs scored. Luikart batted 4-for-4 with a double, two roundtrips, three RBI, and four runs in addition to a walk and a steal. Patrick blasted a pair of two-run homers to go along with an RBI double, all in the first five innings of play.

Starting pitcher **Sebastian Gongora** earned the winning decision after limiting Kentucky to two runs on one hit and four walks while striking out four batters in five innings of work. Luikart tossed the final two innings to secure his first save of the year.

STAY HOT, AP

Andrew Patrick has slashed .471/.550/.941 with two doubles, two home runs, five RBI, and five runs scored through six starts in 2023. The sophomore outfielder has added a team-leading three stolen bases and two hit by pitch. Patrick was at his best in WSU's 12-9 victory over Kentucky, going 3-of-4 at the plate with a double, two homers, and five RBI.

SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

Arkansas is 6-2 on the season, which includes a 4-1 record at Baum-Walker Stadium. The Razorbacks boast victories over Texas (3-2) and Oklahoma State (18-1) in addition to a series win over Eastern Illinois.

The Hogs are batting .300 as a team, led by Jared Wegner with team-leading marks in batting average (.433), hits (13), home runs (3), RBI (15), and runs scored (10). The pitching staff possesses a 6.56 ERA, but Friday starter Hagen Smith has yet to allow a run through 9.2 innings of work.

HISTORY VS. ARKANSAS

Wright State is 0-3 all-time against Arkansas. The Raiders opened their 2008 season against the Razorbacks, losing all three games by five or fewer runs.

STOCK RISING

Sebastian Gongora entered the 2023 season with high expectations after being named the preseason Horizon League Pitcher of the Year and the conference's top prospect for the 2023 Major League Draft by D1Baseball.com and Perfect Game USA. He was also listed as the 82nd-ranked prospect for the upcoming draft by D1Baseball.

This season, the 6-foot-5 lefty is 1-0 through two starts with a 1.80 ERA and a .90 WHIP. Gongora has given up just five hits in 10.0 innings of work, limiting opponents to a .147 batting average.

<u>DÉJÀ VU</u>

Julian Greenwell has blasted a two-run homer in his first at-bat of both series openers this season. The Columbus, Indiana native homered to center field at Hawaii (2/17), while his blast at Kentucky (2/24) went over the right field wall.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Friday starter **Jake Shirk** earned Horizon League Pitcher of the Week honors after firing six scoreless innings in Wright State's season-opening 8-3 victory at Hawaii (2/17). The junior right-hander allowed just two hits and one walk, while striking out six batters over 76 pitches en route to his first win of the 2023 season. Hawaii did not reach scoring position on Shirk in his last five innings of work.

HE GETS ON BASE

Justin Riemer ranks second in the Horizon League with a team-leading seven walks. The redshirt sophomore is tied for fourth on the team in hits and has struck out only once in 18 at-bats.

VETERAN GROUP

WSU returns 16 letterwinners and 11 starters from last year's team, including eight All-Horizon League recipients. **Gehrig Anglin** and **Julian Greenwell** collected All-League First Team honors, while **Jay Luikart**, **Jake Shirk**, and **Alex Theis** were named to the Second Team. **Sebastian Gongora**, **Andrew Patrick**, and **Justin Riemer** earned spots on the All-Freshman Team.

ALL-AMERICA RECOGNITION

Jay Luikart earned preseason All-America nods from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper after starring as WSU's starting outfielder and closer in 2022. The Ashland, Ohio native slugged .299/.409/.544 with 14 doubles, three triples, 10 homers, 31 RBI, and 49 runs scored over 54 starts. Luikart pitched to a 4-2 record with a team-low 2.53 ERA and seven saves in 21.1 innings.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

The Raiders were picked atop the 2023 Horizon League preseason poll. Wright State was also selected as the preseason conference favorite by D1Baseball.com and Perfect Game USA. Sammy Sass was listed as preseason Player of the Year by D1Baseball, while Gehrig Anglin earned preseason Player of the Year honors from Perfect Game. Both sites named Sebastian Gongora the preseason Pitcher of the Year and the conference's top prospect for the 2023 MLB Draft.

DRAFT TALENT

Wright State's Alec Sayre was selected in 17th round of the 2022 MLB Draft, becoming the 17th draftee since 2015 and the 41st in program history. The Raiders saw three total players selected in the top 10 rounds of the MLB's 2021 first-year player draft, along with another two signing free agent contracts.

SMITH REACHING MILESTONES

Former Wright State pitcher Joe Smith made 866 career appearances over 15 seasons as a reliever in the MLB. He ranks 36th in MLB history in games pitched and finished his career with 3.14 earned runs average, tallying 660 strikeouts, 55 wins, and 30 saves over 762.1 innings pitched. Smith is a member of the Wright State Hall of Fame, was the 2006 Horizon League Pitcher of the Year and is one of four Raider numbers retired on the Nischwitz Stadium left field wall.

MURPHY EARNS GOLD GROVE

Former Wright State catcher Sean Murphy has proven to be a top-tier catcher in Major League Baseball. Since his first full season in the majors in 2020, Murphy has compiled 10 Wins Above Replacement, according to FanGraphs, which ranks second among catchers behind the Phillies' J.T Realmuto (12.6 WAR). Last season, Murphy's 5.1 WAR led the American League and was the second-best mark for a catcher.

In 2022, Murphy hit .250 with a .759 OPS. He blasted 18 home runs and drove in 66 runs. He led all AL primary catchers in hits, doubles, RBIs and total bases, and finished second in homers and runs scored.

He was named the American League Gold Glove Award winner in 2021. Murphy, who won his first award in his first season as a finalist, had 10 defensive runs saved, which ranked second among AL backstops. According to Statcast, Murphy had eight runs saved from pitch framing, which led all AL catchers. The backstop led all MLB catchers in FanGraphs' defensive runs above average, with 19.6.

Murphy took home his first Gold Glove Award a year after finishing fourth in AL Rookie of the Year Award voting in 2020 and made Oakland history in the process, becoming the first A's catcher to win a Gold Glove. He signed a 6-year, \$73 million contract extension with the Atlanta Braves in December 2022, which includes a \$15 million club option for the 2029 season.

A third-round draft pick of the Athletics in 2016, Murphy came to Wright State as a walk-on from Centerville and proceeded to start 150 games over three seasons, earn Horizon League Freshman of the Year honors in 2014 and earn all-league accolades all three years as a Raider. He was called up and made his big-league debut on September 4, 2019, tallying his first MLB hit with a home run in the bottom of the fifth inning for the Athletics.

HOME RUN KING

Gehrig Anglin finished the 2022 season with 16 home runs, which tied the single-season school record held by Nick Shields ('01) and Bryan Vickers ('04). In addition to homers, the infielder led the Horizon League in slugging percentage (.598), OPS (1.022), and hit by pitch (14).

PRO RAIDERS

Sean Murphy, drafted by the Oakland Athletics in 2016, and Peyton Burdick, drafted by the Miami Marlins in 2019, are the Raiders' two current Major League players. Murphy debuted with the Athletics in September 2019 and earned the Gold Glove award following the 2021 season. He signed a 6-year, \$73 million contract extension with the Atlanta Braves in December 2022, which includes a \$15 million club option for the 2029 season. Burdick made his debut for the Marlins in August 2022 and finished the season with four homers and 11 RBI. Joe Smith spent 15 years (2007-2022) in the big leagues as a reliever with eight different clubs and currently sits Top 40 all-time with 866 career pitching appearances.

RAIDERS ON THE FARM

With the 2023 Minor League Baseball season coming soon, Wright State is represented at every professional level by 14 total players:

COACHING SUCCESS

Alex Sogard, the seventh-youngest active head coach in Division I baseball, is 114-69 at the helm of the Raiders. Among fifth-year D1 coaches entering the 2023 season, he possesses the third-most wins and fourth-best winning percentage (.631). Sogard had guided the Raiders to back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances and collected ABCA/ATEC East Coach of the Year honors in 2021. The Phoenix, Arizona, native led WSU to a 42-17 record in 2019, the most wins by a first-year head coach in program history. Wright State beat three ranked teams in 2019 and took down top-ranked Louisville in the COVID-shortened 2020 campaign before going 35-13 in 2021 on the way to the Horizon League regular season and tournament titles. In June 2021, Sogard was named to the 2021 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team coaching staff.

MORE TOP TALENT

D1Baseball listed several other Raiders as top MLB prospects in the Horizon League in addition to Gongora. Jake Shirk was named the number two prospect for the 2023 MLB Draft, followed by Justin Riemer in the third spot and Luke Arnold in the tenth spot. Patrick, Boston Smith, and Josh Laisure earned the first, fourth, and fifth spots for the 2024 MLB Draft, while Joey Valentine was the second-ranked prospect for the 2025 MLB Draft.

LOOKING BACK AT 2022

The Raiders are coming off a 30-27 campaign in 2022, winning the Horizon League regular season and tournament championships en route to their fifth trip to the NCAA Regionals in the last seven seasons. Wright State broke single-season school records in home runs (81) and strikeouts (461) while also possessing top-50 national marks in shutouts (10th, 6), walks (19th, 318), scoring (27th, 8.0), runs (41st, 455), triples (41st, 17), slugging percentage (42nd, .484), and on-base percentage (48th, .396).

STUDENT-athletes

WSU had a 3.35 team grade point average in the 2022 fall semester, including 29 individuals with a GPA above 3.00. Dating back to 2012, the Raiders have accumulated a team GPA of 3.00 or higher in 20 of their last 21 semesters.

PRESEASON PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

Sammy Sass was listed as preseason Horizon League Player of the Year by D1Baseball. The junior catcher has slashed .316/.412/.563 with 45 extra-base hits (21 home runs), 114 RBI, and 99 runs scored in his collegiate career and notably hit .350 (28-for-80) with runners in scoring position last season.

Gehrig Anglin earned preseason HL Player of the Year honors from Perfect Game USA. The sixth-year senior enjoyed a breakout 2022 campaign, leading the Horizon League in home runs (16), slugging percentage (.598), OPS (1.022), and hit by pitch (14) while adding 11 stolen bases on 13 attempts.

D1Baseball and Perfect Game USA named **Sebastian Gongora** as the preseason Pitcher of the Year and the conference's top prospect for the 2023 MLB Draft. In his debut season, the 6-foot-5 left-hander finished with a 5-1 record and 81 strikeouts in 82.2 innings of work. The redshirt sophomore tallied six quality starts and five appearances with seven-plus strikeouts.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

Wright State's **Gehrig Anglin** and **Jay Luikart** were among the 19 student-athletes who were named to the 2022 Baseball All-Academic Team by the League's faculty athletics representatives.

MLB DRAFT HISTORY

Wright State's Alec Sayre was selected in 17th round of the 2022 MLB Draft, becoming the 17th draftee since 2015 and the 41st in program history.

WSU had three players picked in the 2021 MLB Draft. The Milwaukee Brewers selected Tyler Black with the 33rd overall pick in the competitive balance round A of the draft. Black's Sunday selection at No. 33 overall was bettered only by Wright State Hall of Famer Brian Anderson as the highest drafted player in Raider history. Anderson, a left-handed pitcher, was selected third overall by the California Angels in 1993.

Outfielder and 2021 Horizon League Player of the Year Quincy Hamilton was selected in the fifth round by the Houston Astros with the 148th overall pick. In the ninth round, the Miami Marlins selected right-handed pitcher Jake Schrand with the 269th overall pick. After the draft, Damon Dues (San Francisco Giants) and Konner Piotto (Texas Rangers) signed free agent contracts.

Wright State has had three or more draftees in five of the last seven drafts, dating back to 2016, including a program-high five selections in the 2016 Draft. The Raiders saw four players taken in 2019 and three in both 2018 2021, and one last year.

Prior to the 2015 draft, Wright State had only had 24 total players drafted, dating back to the 1976 Draft, when Bob Grote was the first selection in program history. The Raiders had only had multiple players selected in the same draft five times in program history (two players four times, three players once) before the five selections in 2016 shattered that mark.

The 41 players drafted have been split pretty evenly down the middle, with 21 pitchers being taken and 20 positions players. slected through the 2022 Draft.



Alex Sogard was named the head baseball coach at Wright State on July 6, 2018 after two years as an assistant with the Raiders.

In 2022, Sogard led the Raiders a 30-27 overall record and a 20-9 mark against conference opponents. Wright State earned its third consecutive regular season championship, a second consecutive Horizon League Championship title, and a trip to the NCAA Blacksburg Regional. The regional berth was the fifth in the past seven seasons (excluding 2020 covid canceled season) for the Raiders.

WSU continued its yearly trend of reaching new heights under Sogard, as the team broke single-season records in strikeouts (490) and home runs (81). Gehrig Anglin also tied a single-season home run record with 16 on the season.

The 2022 campaign featured ten All-Horizon League honors for the Raiders, including three First Team selections (Alec Sayre, Gehrig Anglin, Julian Greenwell), four Second Team selections (Zane Harris, Jay Luikart, Jake Shirk, Alex Theis), and three All-Freshman Team selections (Sebastian Gongora, Justin Riemer, Andrew Patrick). Sayre and Zane Harris also earned a spot on the East-ABCA/Rawlings All-Region Team.

The 2021 Raiders won 35 regular season games on the way to the Horizon League regular season and tournament championships and appearance in the NCAA Knoxville Regional. Sogard earned his second Horizon League Coach of the Year honor, while Quincy Hamilton was named HL Player of the Year. In addition to the major awards, the Raiders placed five players on the All-League First Team, with Tyler Black, Austin Cline, Sammy Sass and Alec Sayre joining Hamilton. Three Raiders – Bradley Brehmer, Damon Dues and Zane Harris – earned Second Team honors, while Jake Shirk earned All-Freshman Team honors.

Sogard and the Raiders made the most of the COVID-shortened 2020 season, with a midweek win at then-No. 1 Louisville and a road series win at then-No. 11 Tennessee. The two wins over Tennessee turned out to be the Volunteers' lone losses in the shortened season.

In his first season as head coach in 2019, the Raiders finished 42-17, 22-8. The 42 wins were the most wins by a first-year head coach in program history and earned him the Horizon League Coach of the Year. The Raiders had a year for the record books. The offense broke the single season record for walks (368), stolen bases (169), runs (501), and home runs (67). They were also ranked second in the Nation in Walks & Stolen Bases, third in the Nation in Runs, fifth in the Nation in Fielding Percentage, ninth in the Nation in Batting Average and 27th in the Nation in Home Runs.

The Raiders had a number of big wins again in 2019, including #9 East Carolina, #10 Ole Miss, #18 Oklahoma State and Indiana.

Outfielder Peyton Burdick was selected by the Miami Marlins in the third round and 82nd overall of the 2019 MLB Draft, becoming the third-highest to ever be drafted for Wright State baseball behind Brian Anderson, who went third overall in the first round in 1993 to the California Angels and Keith Gordon, who went 47th overall in the second-round of 1990 draft by the Cincinnati Reds.

In all, the 2019 Raiders had nine All Horizon League Honors, including six First Team (Peyton Burdick, JD Orr, Zach Weatherford, Seth Gray, Tyler Black, and Bear Bellomy), two Second Team (Chase Slone, Bradley Brehmer), and two All-Freshman Team (Damon Dues and Bradley Brehmer). The six First Team selections tied the most all-time at Wright State.

Sogard, a left-hander, was drafted by the Houston Astros in 2010 in the 26th round of the MLB Draft and played seven seasons of professional baseball. In his first full season with the Astros organization, he led the Single A Lexington Legends in strikeouts. He advanced as high as AAA and was selected to play in the Arizona Fall League in 2012 (Mesa Solar Sox) and 2013 (Peoria Javelinas) with stints in the Arizona Diamondbacks and Baltimore Orioles organizations as recently as 2016. Sogard worked as the pitching instructor for several elite camps, including the Pro 5 Academy in Raleigh, NC.

Sogard started his collegiate playing career at Oregon State, where he won back-to-back National Championships in 2006 and 2007, before moving to North Carolina State for his final three collegiate seasons. In 2008, Sogard closed the regional championship game against South Carolina to win the Raleigh Regional. Sogard was drafted by the Diamondbacks in 2008 in the 26th round of the MLB Draft but chose to stay in school, ultimately being drafted by the Astros in 2010. His career also includes playing in the World Baseball Classic for Team Czech Republic in 2012 in Germany and 2016 in Mexico. His brother, Eric, was a 2nd round pick by the San Diego Padres in the MLB Draft out of Arizona State and spent 11 years as an infielder

in the big leagues, playing with the Oakland Athletics, Milwaukee Brewers, Toronto Blue Jays, Tampa Bay Rays and Chicago Cubs.

Sogard is a 2010 graduate of North Carolina State with a B.S. degree in Science Technology with a specialty in Nutrition and Exercise Science.
