



// Who Is There?

The Redhawks, who won the 2024 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Championship, enter the Fayetteville regional as the No. 4 seed in the group. They will join #1 Arkansas of the Southeastern Conference (SEC), #2 Lousisana Tech of Conference-USA (CUSA), and #3 Kansas State of the Big 12 Conference. #2 LA Tech and #3 Kansas State will face each other at 7 p.m. following the Redhawks matchup with Arkansas.

The 2024 Southeast Missouri Baseball program captured its sixth Ohio Valley Conference Championship title on Saturday, May 25, with a 9-6 victory over #3 Morehead State to clinch the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Redhawks rolled through MSU in the first game of the tournament for the Redhawks, crushing the Eagles by a final score of 9-4. Caleb Corbin, Shea McGahan, and Ian Riley all finished with mult-RBI days in the first contest. The following day was a matchup with the #4-seeded Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles. The Redhawks cruised to an 11-5 victory, pounding out 13 hits led by Coloma who finished 3-for-5 at the plate, including four RBIs and his second home run in two days. All-OVC selection Brooks Kettering provided the Redhawks with four more RBIs on his 2-for-3 day at the plate, including a pair of home runs and three runs scored. Four different Redhawks recorded multi-hit days, pushing SEMO into the championship round without a loss. The Redhawks would face off once again with Morehead State on championship Saturday, but the Redhawks faced some adverstiy. A seven run ninth inning by MSU forced the OVC Championship into a title-deciding finale as the Eagles took the first game on Saturday by a final score of 13-6. In the

winner-takes-all-game, the Redhawks got a big start from RHP Sam Heyman, making his first appearance in the tournament. The sophomore tossed 6.0 innings allowing just four runs on five hits and stifled a powerful MSU offense. He struck out five Eagles and left the game with the Redhawks leading, 9-2. Senior short stop Ben Palmer had a massive Championship performance, going 2-for-5 at the plate with three RBIs, including a first inning home run that sparked a big night for the program. RHP Payton Lawrence came in for Haden Dow (who relieved Heyman) and shut the door on the Eagles. The Dixon, Ill.-native pitched the final 3.0 innings of the championship, allowed no runs on just one hit and struck out four. He picked up his first save of the season and clinched the sixth OVC Championship title in SEMO history.

// Three of the Last Four

With the championship, the title marks the third in the last four seasons for Head Coach Andy Sawyers. Coach Sawyers OVC tournament record improved to 11-8 all-time and was the first title captured at Mtn. Dew Park in Marion, Ill.

// Even Years

SEMO has won six OVC Tournament titles and all but one have come in an even year on the calendar. The only title to come in an odd year was the 2021 tournament title, under head coach Andy Sawyers. The Redhawks have now won the title in 1998, 2002, 2016, 2021, 2022, and 2024.

// Last Regional

SEMO last competed in the NCAA Tournament in Louisville, Ky. in 2022. The Redhawks met the #7 National Seed, Louisville, in their first game of that regional. The Cardinals knocked off SEMO, 7-2, in the first game. The Redhawks turned around and lost the next day to Oregon (18-6

// SEMO in the Regional

The Fayetteville regional will mark the third regional appearnce for the Redhawks in the Sawyers era, dating back to 2021. SEMO has competed in Oxford, Mississippi, Louisville, Ky., and now Fayetteville, Ark. This will mark the second Southeastern Conference location as Arkansas is a member of the SEC.

// All-Tournament Team

Seven Redhawks were named to the 2024 All-Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Team from this past weekend. Seniors Ian Riley, Josh Cameron, Collin Wilma, and Payton Lawrence were all selected. Freshman Brooks Kettering and junior Keoni Coloma rounded out the team for the Redhawks. Coloma was selected as the tournament's MVP as he hit nearly .500 with two home runs and six RBIs.

// #1 Arkansas

The Razorbacks come into their own regional as the fifth national seed in the 2024 NCAA Tournament. Arkansas is led by 22nd year Head Coach Dave Van Horn and finished the season with a 43-14 overall record and a 20-10 record in SEC play. At the plate, Arkansas is led by Peyton Stovall who has a .349 batting average on the season. He has nine home runs, 38 RBIs, 12 doubles, and has a slugging-percentage of .559. The Hogs home run leader is short stop Aloy Wehiwa who has started and played all 57 games for Van Horn. Wehiwa has 13 home runs on the season. On the mound, Arkansas' LHP Hagen Smith is the top arm for the Razorbacks. Smith has a 1.48 ERA with a 9-1 record overall. He has struck out 154 batters over 79.0 innings pitched.

// #2 Louisiana Tech

The Bulldogs of Conference USA are led by eight year head coach Lane Burroughs and enter the regional as the #2 seed in Fayetteville. The Bulldogs finished the season 45-17 overall with a 18-6 mark in CUSA play. Cole McConnell leads the Bulldogs' offense with a .380 batting average and a .682 slugging-percentage. He is first on the team in hits (92), home runs (18), and total bases (165). Ethan Bates is the RBI leader with 74 on the season. He is also the team leader in doubles (21) and triples (2). The Bulldogs top arm is Luke Nichols. Nichols has a 3.74 ERA (Team-Best), with a 7-3 record overall on the season. He has a team-high 81 strikeouts over 77.0 innings pitched.

// #3 Kansas State

Kansas State comes to Fayetteville as the number three seed in the regional is led by sixth year head coach, Pete Hughes. The Wildcats finished the season with a 32-24 record overall and a 15-15 mark in Big 12 play. Brady Day leads KSU at the plate with a .332 batting average. He is tied for the most hits on the team (71), first in RBIs (53), second in doubles (15), and second in total bases (114). Kaelen Culpepper provides the power for the Wildcats' lineup leading the team in home runs (9), tied with day for hits (71), first in triples (5), and is first in slugging-percentage (.533). On the mound, Jackson Wentworth is KSU's top arm with a 4.18 ERA. He has a 4-5 overall record with six saves out of the bullpen. Opponents are hitting just .215 against him on the season.

// Top Defense

The Redhawks conclude the regular season with the OVC's top defense. SEMO finished one point above Morehead State (.971) with a .972 team-fielding percentage. First baseman Bryce Cannon finished conference play with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage to lead the squad. Nine Redhawks, who finished above the minimum number of games, recorded a fielding percentage of .970 or higher.

// Batting Champion

Outfielder Ty Stauss finished the season as the Redhawks top hitter with a .324 batting average. Stauss finished with 61 hits and led the team in doubles (16) and on-base percentage (.434).

// Hits

Center fielder Michael Mugan, who played in 54-of-55 games for the Redhawks, finished the season with a team-best 73 hits. The junior was second on the team with a .322 batting average and third on the team in RBIs (47).

// Unusual

Short stop Ben Palmer finished the season as the team leader in two contradictory categories. The senior from Fridley, Minn. led the Redhawks in both home runs (16) and sacrifice bunts (14). He also was the team leader in walks (37) and hit-by-pitches (11).

// The Staff

The Redhawks pitching staff finished the 2024 campaign strong, especially the final month of the season. As a group, SEMO finished with a 5.65 ERA over 477.2 innings. LP Haden Dow led the staff with 57 total strikeouts with a 4-1 record. Dow finished with a 4.54 ERA over 73.1 innings pitched. Opponents hit just .261 against the lefty in 2024. LHP Logan Katen and RHP Kyle Miller played a huge role in the back half of games. Katen finished with a 3.60 ERA over 30.0 innings, striking out 32 hitters. For Miller, he recorded 29 strikeouts over 24.0 innings, missing an entire month of the season, as opponents hit just .195 against him.

// 2024 Squad

The 2024 Baseball team will feature a lot of new faces around the dugout and on the diamond for the Redhawks. The squad features 31 players, including 11 newcomers making their first appearance(s) in a SEMO uniform. Outfielder Josh Cameron & LHP Haden Dow return to the squad as the lone-Redhawks featured on the All-OVC Preseason Team. Cameron led the team last season with 16 home runs, while Dow recorded 51 strikeouts over 63.1 innings pitched. Returning on the infield will be seniors Peyton Leeper, Ben Palmer, Chance Resetich, Ty Stauss, Nolan Ackerman, Gunnar Doyle, and sophomore Cole Warehime. New to the infield will feature Iowa Central Community College transfer, Caleb Corbin, freshman Brooks Kettering, and Johnson County CC transfer Shea McGahan behindthe-plate.Newcomers Gavin Baldwin and Keoni Coloma are listed as 'Utility' players. SEMO will have very little returning in the outfield as Josh Cameron is the only returner from a season ago. Junior College transfers Michael Mugan and Bryce Cannon will help patrol the outfield, along with Dallas Baptist-transfer, Ian Riley, will be in the outfield in 2024. The Redhawks will return several arms from a season ago, headlined by Haden Dow and RHP Payton Lawrence. RHP Esteban Hernandez, one of the hardest throwers on the pitching staff, will return for his senior campaign as well. Collin Wilma will return to the mound for

the Redhawks in 2024 after doing most of his work out of the bullpen last season, along with Tommy Windt who will be making his return to the mound after missing all of 2023 with an injury. Right-handed pitcher (and newcomer) Brian Strange will look to make an impact for the Redhawks pitching staff after transferring in from Mineral Area College. Fellow newcomers, Alex Hayes, and Sam Heyman will make their SEMO debuts in 2024. The left-hander and right-hander transferred in from Madison & Chabot College, respectively. Working out of the bullpen, and returning from a season ago, will be LHP Logan Katen, LHP Ethan Osborne, RHP Fischer Rausch, and RHP Anthony Klein, all who saw action in 2023. The sophomore duo of RHPs Gavin Johnston and Eddie White will help anchor a strong backend of the bullpen, and will be headlined by SEMO's all-time saves leader, Kyle Miller. Miller, who finished 2023 with six saves, became the all-time leader in saves with 17 a season ago.

// The Schedule

A 55-game schedule with 28 games at Capaha Field is in store for Southeast Missouri this upcoming 2024 season. SEMO opens the year with a three-game series at reigning Conference USA Champion Dallas Baptist (Feb. 16-18), one of two 2023 NCAA Tournament teams on the docket. DBU went 47-16 overall and 25-5 in C-USA play en route to making the Stillwater, Oklahoma NCAA Regional a year ago. The Redhawks host former Ohio Valley Conference member Murray State (Feb. 20) in their home-opener on the front end of a home-and-home series. SEMO will return the trip to Murray, Kentucky on Apr. 16. SEMO's other matchups prior to the start of conference action include a pair of four-game home series with St. Thomas (Feb. 23-25) and Toledo (Mar. 1-3), a three-game set against Western Kentucky (Mar. 16-17), a road series at Marshall (Mar. 8-10) and midweek bouts at Missouri (Feb. 27), vs. Middle Tennessee (Mar. 5), at Evansville (Mar. 13) and at Austin Peay (Mar. 19). The Redhawks begin their 27-game OVC schedule at Eastern Illinois (Mar. 22-24), which won three-straight elimination games to claim last year's OVC Tournament crown. EIU advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the

first time since 2008. SEMO's other conference road opponents include Little Rock (Apr. 5-7), Tennessee Tech (Apr. 19-21), Lindenwood (May 3-5) and first-year OVC member Western Illinois (May 10-12).

SIU Edwardsville (Mar. 28-30) comes to Cape Girardeau for the Redhawks first home OVC series, while Southern Indiana (Apr. 12-14), Morehead State (Apr. 26-28) and UT Martin (May 16-18) are SEMO's other home league foes.

The rest of the 2024 schedule features homeand-home midweek series against Missouri State (Mar. 26, Apr. 2) and longtime rival Southern Illinois (Apr. 9, Apr. 23), and another midweek game vs. Evansville (Apr. 30).

// Preseason All-OVC

Outfielder Josh Cameron and LHP Haden Dow landed on the 2024 All-OVC Preseason Team after their performances from a season ago. Cameron, a senior from Pflugerville, Texas, finished the season with a .304 batting average, 66 hits, 52 runs, 16 home runs, and 51 RBIs. The outfielder was also ranked 39th in the nation by D1baseball.com amongst all division-one outfielders. LHP Haden Dow was selected to the team after serving as the Redhawks' Sunday starter for the majority of the 2023 season. A native of St. John, New Brunswick, Canada, Dow finished the year with an overall record of 4-3 with a 4.55 earned-run-average. Dow registered 63.1 innings pitched, recording 51 strikeouts.

// Welcome Tommy Gleason

Assistant coach Tommy Gleason will join Coach Sawyers' staff in 2024 for the first season of his SEMO career. A native of Hopkins, Minn., Gleason played four seasons at Luther College from 2016-2019 where he graduated with a degree in Management. Prior to joining the Redhawks in 2024, Gleason spent 2023 at Southeastern Community College as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator under Justin Schulte. There he worked with the outfielders and the hitters. During the 2023 season, Southeastern CC went to the NJCAA World Series for just the 2nd time in program history and were national runners-up in the final game. Gleason was a part of a Region 11 championship, a Great Plains District Championship, and

the most wins in Southeastern CC program history with 49. Southeastern CC was second in the nation in runs scored, third in the nation in doubles, third in the nation in hits, 21st in batting average, 10th in On-Base percentage, and first in hit-by-pitches. They led the nation in fielding percentage, had two National Gold Glove winners, the National Defensive Player of the Year, and 10 players from the team moved on to Division-I programs.

// Kyle Miller, All-Time Saves Leader

Right-hander Kyle Miller became the all-time Saves leader in SEMO Baseball history. Miller, a senior from Eureka, Mo., picked up six saves a season ago and now has 17 total saves for his career. In 2023, Miller was tied for the most appearances from the pitching staff with 21, finishing with a 6.96 ERA. He struck out 30 batters over 32.1 innings pitched.

// Season 66

The 2024 campaign marks Southeast Missouri's 66th of college baseball. The Redhawks are in their 33rdd season as an NCAA Division I program. SEMO is 1,459-1,199 all-time and 925-811-1 at the NCAA Division I level since the inception of its baseball program. The Redhawks have a 456-311-1 record in Ohio Valley Conference play. SEMO won five OVC regular-season titles (2002, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021), five OVC Tournament crowns (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021, 2022) and made five NCAA Tournament appearances (1998, 2002, 2016, 2021, 2022) in program history.

// Redhawks Picked Third in OVC

Southeast Missouri Baseball was picked third in the 2024 Ohio Valley Conference Baseball Predicted Order of Finish voted on by the league's head coaches and communicators. The Redhawks were selected third with 127 points, trailing Morehead State (148) and Little Rock (155) in the 2024 poll. MSU received eight first place votes while Little Rock received 12 first place votes. UT Martin (106), Eastern Illinois (100), Tennessee Tech (93), SIUE (67), Southern Indiana (52), Lindenwood (31), and Western Illinois (20) rounded out the rest of the preseason team rankings. Morehead State's Ryley Preece (OF) and Jackson Wells (RHP) of Little Rock were voted as the OVC Preseason Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively.

// Fill the Hill Games

A Southeast Missouri baseball tradition continues in 2024 with "Fill the Hill" games. The Redhawks have partnered with Kohlfeld Distributing to bring tailgate days to Capaha Field during selected games this season. Kohlfeld Distributing will provide complimentary adult beverages to fans who provide proof of legal consuming age for the following dates:

// Lots of Home Games

The Redhawks are at home for 10-of-thefirst-14 games in 2024. Following the roadtrip to Dallas, the Redhawks will open their home slate on Wednesday, Feb. 21, when they host Murray State. SEMO will then host St. Thomas for a weekend series that will include four games against the Tommies. A midweek roadtrip to Missouri will break the home stretch before five-straight home games beginning with a four-game weekend series with Toledo (Mar. 1-3). The Redhawks will conclude the first 14 games with a midweek against Middle Tennessee (Mar. 5).


// Head Coach

he 2024 season marks Andy Sawyers' eighth as Southeast Missouri's head coach. In the last three years alone, Sawyers led SEMO to one Ohio Valley Conference regularseason title, back-to-back OVC Tournament crowns and two NCAA Tournament appearances. For the first time in program history, the Redhawks claimed the league's OVC Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in consecutive seasons during the 2021 and 2022 campaigns.

In 2023, the Redhawks finished fourth in the OVC with an overall record of 26-30 and 14-10 in league play. It was SEMO's third-straight winning record in OVC play. The Redhawks won a combined 47 conference games for an average of 15 per season over the previous three years.

The year before that, SEMO compiled a 37-22 overall record and finished second in the OVC with a 16-8 mark. The Redhawks, after dropping their first game of the conference tournament, won three-straight elimination games to secure their second-straight OVC Tournament championship. SEMO outlasted top-seeded Belmont, 5-4, in 10 innings to get the title.

The Redhawks later represented the OVC at the NCAA Regional in Louisville, Kentucky. That trip came a year after SEMO advanced to the NCAA Regional in Oxford, Mississippi.

SEMO was nearly unbeatable at home in 2022, where it led the nation with a 23-2 record. The Redhawks won their first 14 games at Capaha Field en route to their best home record in program history. In addition, the Redhawks finished the year with 24 comefrom-behind victories.

The Redhawks hit a program record 97 home runs with five players getting 10 or more. SEMO also had seven All-OVC selections, two American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA)/Rawlings All-South Region picks and one draft pick (Andrew Keck, 10th round, Atlanta Braves) in 2022.

Academically, SEMO's baseball team recently recorded a 3.45 grade point average for its best fall term GPA in program history. During the 2021-22 academic year, the Redhawks had two OVC Medal of Honor recipients and 20 Commissioner's Honor Roll selections. In terms of winning percentage, Sawyers' baseball program is the second-winningest in SEMO's Department of Athletics with a .546 percentage over the last seven seasons. The Redhawks accumulated a total of 194 wins and won at a .592 rate in OVC play (103-71). SEMO won 30 or more games each of the last two years and Sawyers is in position to become the third head coach in program history to post three-consecutive 30-win seasons.

Sawyers was named OVC Coach of the Year after leading SEMO to a sweep of league's regularseason and tournament titles in 2021. The Redhawks finished that championship season with an overall 30-22 record and 17-10 in the OVC. SEMO recorded 30 wins in a season for the first time with Sawyers at the helm and posted series wins in eight of its nine series against league foes in 2021.

Sawyers coached his first OVC Specialty Award-Winner when lefthander Dylan Dodd was tabbed the league's Pitcher of the Year.

Dodd later became the highest draft pick in program history when he was selected in the third round by the Atlanta Braves in the 2021 Major League Draft. Additionally, Dodd wrapped up his final college season as a Second-Team Collegiate Baseball All-American.

Statistically, SEMO led the OVC with 14 saves and a .967 fielding percentage after committing just 49 errors in 52 contests. The Redhawks were also second in the conference in wins as their 30 victories marked the most in a season in five years.

In 2020, SEMO had an overall record of 9-8 and a 2-1 mark in OVC play when its season abruptly ended due to a global COVID-19 pandemic. The Redhawks heated up to win seven of nine contests prior to the end of competition.

The Redhawks led the OVC in batting average (.314), hits (188), triples (9), plate appearances (707), at-bats (598), hit by pitch (26), stolen bases (36), fewest walks allowed (54) and fielding percentage (.976), and rated second in slugging percentage (.503), onbase percentage (.404), runs (129), RBI (121) and home runs (21) at the time their 2020 campaign came to a close. SEMO also ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation in hits (6th) and triples (8th).

Individually, Justin Dirden led the conference in slugging percentage (.900), RBI (26), home runs (9), hits (29), total bases (63) and stolen bases (9) before signing as an undrafted free agent with the Houston Astros.

Shortstop Tyler Wilber topped the OVC in runs (26) and center fielder Danny Wright tied a leaguehigh with 29 hits when play was suspended.

Pitching wise, left-handers Dylan Dodd (2-1, 36 Ks) and Noah Niznik (3-0, 15 Ks) were a combined 5-1 with 51 strikeouts and two complete game shutouts through four starts in 2020.

Before they took the field in 2019, the Redhawks ushered in a stateof-the-art hitting facility adjacent to Capaha Field. The 4,000-square foot facility can fit up to four batting cages and is equipped with portable pitching mounds. It also had HitTrax Rapsodo technology which is used to enhance overall player performance through real-tiem stats and performance metrics.

SEMO went 23-32 during an injury-riddled 2019 campaign. The Redhawks played without five of their position starters for much of the season.

Despite the misfortune with injuries, SEMO had a pair of All-OVC performers in Wilber and Niznik.

A First-Team selection, Wilber led the OVC with a .383 batting average and was the Redhawks leader in hits (80) doubles (19), triples (3), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.531) and on-base percentage (.480). Niznik, who landed a spot on the All-Newcomer Team, started 13 games as a freshman. He led the team with a 3.63 ERA, ranked second in innings (62) and third in both strikeouts (49) and wins (3).

The year before that, Sawyers guided the 2018 squad to the program's 13th consecutive OVC Tournament berth as the Redhawks finished 27-30 overall and second in the conference with a 20-10 record.

That team produced three First-Team All-OVC performers, including Carlos Vega, Trevor Ezell and Dirden.

Sawyers was hired as the sixth head coach in program history on July 29, 2016.

In his first year as an NCAA Division I head coach in 2017, Sawyers led the Redhawks to a winning season (29-26 overall, 16-14 OVC). He also picked up his first career OVC Tournament win along the way.

First-Team pick Dan Holst, Second-Team selections Brian Lees, Chris Osborne, Justin Murphy and Clay Chandler, and All-Newcomer Team member Danny Wright formed a group of six All-OVC players in Sawyers' debut season as a Division I head coach.

In all, Sawyers has over two decades worth of collegiate coaching experience.

Prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, he worked two seasons as the Associate Head Coach/ Offensive Coordinator at Big 12 Conference member Kansas State. There, Sawyers oversaw the hitters and catchers, while helping coordinate recruiting efforts.

Sawyers has coached in two College World Series, two NCAA Super Regionals and nine NCAA Tournaments during his coaching tenure. He has mentored 41 Major League Baseball draft picks, including two first-round selections and ten top-10 round picks.

The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big 12 offensively with a .284 team batting average in 2016. K-State's offense registered a .400 slugging percentage and .372 onbase percentage, scored 335 runs, had 550 hits, belted 100 doubles, notched 17 triples, and finished with 30 home runs and 300 RBI.

Sawyers coached freshman Josh Rolette who garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American honors in 2016. He also helped mentor Jake Scudder who was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year. The Wildcats had three studentathletes on the All-Big 12 Teams that season.

The 2015 and 2016 campaigns were Sawyers' second stint at K-State.

He previously served as an assistant coach for the Wildcats in 2009 and 2010. Sawyers helped lead K-State to an 80-30-1 record and the first two NCAA Regional appearances in school history over that span.

The 2009 season was a year of power for the Wildcats under Sawyers. The team hit 22 triples and 58 home runs, most in both categories since 1997. The offense shined when it came to stolen bases as the 149 steals were secondmost in the nation and just two shy of breaking the Big 12 record. Overall, the team finished among Big 12 leaders in on-base percentage (2nd, .399), runs scored (2nd, 458), hits (2nd, 675), RBI (2nd, 420), doubles (3rd, 123), and fewest strikeouts (4th, 393).

Six Wildcats claimed All-Big 12 honors in 2009, including outfielder Nick Martini, who also garnered Louisville Slugger Freshman All- America honors, and Justin Bloxom and Carter Jurica, who finished fourth and eighth, respectively, in the Big 12 in batting average.

The 2010 squad matched the success of 2009 by also reaching the NCAA postseason, and the offense topped the previous season totals in batting average (.323 in 2010; .317 in 2009), runs per game (7.6 vs. 7.4) and OBP (.426 vs. .399). Before K-State, Sawyers

spent four seasons as Associate Head Coach at Texas A&M (2011-14). Those four seasons at Texas A&M represented the end of Sawyers' five-year stint with the Aggies after he spent 2008 as a volunteer assistant coach.

In each of those five seasons, Sawyers helped Texas A&M reach an NCAA Regional while also winning a pair of Big 12 championships. In addition, he coached standouts Tyler Naquin - 2011 Big 12 Player of the Year, All-American and a first round pick by the Cleveland Indians in 2012 - and Krey Bratson, a 2011 Freshman All-American. Before his appointment at Texas A&M in 2008,

Sawyers worked with current Aggie head coach Rob Childress as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska from 2003-07.

While in Lincoln, he helped the Huskers earn four trips to the NCAA Tournament, including an appearance at the 2005 College World Series. Sawyers, who lettered two years at Nebraska, worked with 12 Huskers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Alex Collegiate Baseball.

After working as the volunteer assistant at Nebraska in 2000, Sawyers worked the 2001 and 2002 seasons as head coach at Hutchinson Community College, compiling an 87-30 record and two postseason berths. In 2001, the Dragons went 40-16 and won the Jayhawk West Sub-Regional, while the 2002 squad set a school record with 47 wins and was ranked as high as seventh by the NJCAA.

Sawyers' coaching career began at Northwestern (La.) State in 1999 as a volunteer assistant coach, helping the Demons finish second in the Southland Conference.

He first played collegiately at Point Loma (Calif.) Nazarene College in 1994. Following a year off, he played at Mendocino (Calif.) Junior College in 1996 before finishing up his playing career at Nebraska.

A native of Willits, California, Sawyers received his bachelor (1998) and master's (2000) degrees from Nebraska. He is married to the former Dena Lindeblad and the couple have two sons, Andrew James (A.J.) and Alex.
