LEADING OFF

ROAD HOGS HEAD TO ARLINGTON

- After an Opening Weekend series sweep at home, the fifth-ranked Razorbacks hit the road for the first time this season to make their way down to Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas, to compete in the Amegy Bank College Baseball Series presented by Kubota.
- Arkansas squares off against Kansas State, #22 TCU and Michigan during the three-day, three-game tournament.
- The action gets started Friday, Feb. 21, with first pitch between the Hogs and Wildcats set for 7 p.m. on FloCollege.

HOGS AT GLOBE LIFE FIELD

- This weekend will mark the Hogs' fourth appearance (2021, 2023-25) in the Arlington-based tournament.
- Arkansas is 7-2 all-time at Globe Life Field, including a perfect 3-0 record in 2021 and 2-1 records in 2023 and 2024.
- The Razorbacks went undefeated in the inaugural College Baseball Showdown in 2021, sweeping the state of Texas by beating Texas Tech, Texas and TCU.
- Arkansas went 2-1 in the College Baseball Showdown in 2023 with wins against Texas and Oklahoma State.
- The Hogs also went 2-1 in last year's Kubota College Baseball Series at Globe Life Field, downing Oregon State and Michigan along the way.

HISTORY LESSON

- Arkansas is 30-21 all-time against Kansas State, including a 2-1 record in games played at neutral sites.
- Under DVH, Arkansas is 4-3 overall and 1-0 at neutral sites against the Wildcats.

30 AND COUNTING

- Arkansas opened the 2025 season by sweeping Washington State to win its 30th consecutive non-conference home weekend series in a streak that dates back to the start of the 2015 campaign.
- The Hogs have not lost or tied a nonconference regular season weekend series at Baum-Walker Stadium since 2014, when Arkansas lost two-of-three games to South Alabama in its final non-conference home weekend series.

GET THE GACK

- Arkansas right-hander Gabe Gaeckle will get the start on the mound in the Amegy Bank College Baseball Series opener against Kansas State.
- The sophomore made his first collegiate start on the bump on Opening Day against Washington State (Feb. 15), firing five shutout innings with a career-high seven strikeouts.
- Last season at Globe Life Field, Gaeckle struck out six over 2.2 scoreless relief innings vs. Oklahoma State (2/24/24).



GÉT THE GACK


- Following a historic rookie campaign, RHP Gabe Gaeckle enters his sophomore campaign as one of college baseball's top pitchers.
- Prior to the 2025 season, the right-hander was named Baseball
 America's preseason SEC Pitcher of the Year, clinched consensus
 preseason All-America status from Baseball America, D1Baseball,
 NCBWA and Perfect Game and earned preseason first-team All-SEC
 recognition from the league's 16 head coaches.
- It is the second consecutive year that a Razorback has been named Baseball America's preseason SEC Pitcher of the Year. LHP Hagen Smith also earned the distinction prior to the 2024 campaign.
- The Aptos, Calif., native was a unanimous first-team Freshman All-American in 2024 after he made 22 relief appearances for Arkansas and posted a 3-3 record with a 2.32 ERA, 57 strikeouts and a teamleading seven saves in 42.2 innings of work.
- Gaeckle became the fifth Razorback freshman pitcher since 2003, head coach Dave Van Horn's first season at the helm of the program, to record five or more saves in a season.

- Gaeckle, who made his first career start in game one of the Opening Day doubleheader, is the sixth Arkansas sophomore to start on the mound on Opening Day and the fifth Arkansas sophomore to start the home opener on Opening Day in the Van Horn era (2003-pres.).
- The right-hander lived up to the preseason hype in his first start of the season, firing a career-long five shutout innings with career-high seven strikeouts in a win over Washington State (Feb. 14).

Infield **Wehiwa Aloy** and pitcher **Gabe Gaeckle** landed on the preseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award, presented annually to the best player in college baseball.

GOLDEN HOGS

- INF Wehiwa Aloy and RHP Gabe Gaeckle were named to the preseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award, presented annually to the best amateur baseball player in the nation.
- The list includes 55 players across high school and college baseball.
 Arkansas is one of 11 schools with multiple players on this year's list.
- Aloy, also named to last year's preseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award, started all 60 games at shortstop for the Razorbacks in 2024, his first season at Arkansas after transferring in from Sacramento State following his freshman campaign.
- The Wailuku, Hawai'i, native slashed .270/.355/.485 with a team-high 14 home runs and 56 RBI, finishing his sophomore campaign as the team leader in runs scored (45), multi-RBI games (11), stolen bases (7) and consecutive games reached base safely (31).
- Aloy is the fourth two-time preseason watch list candidate for the Golden Spikes Award in program history, joining OF Heston Kjerstad (2019-20), INF Casey Martin (2019-20) and INF Robert Moore (2021-22).
- Gaeckle, meanwhile, is the 16th Razorback player since 2008 to earn a spot on the Golden Spikes Award's preseason watch list.
- Two Hogs OF Andrew Benintendi (2015) and RHP Kevin Kopps (2021)

 have previously won the Golden Spikes Award, making Arkansas (2)
 one of only six schools, along with Florida State (4), Arizona State (3), Cal State Fullerton (3), LSU (2) and San Diego State (2), with multiple winners of college baseball's most prestigious award.

ALOHOGS

- INF Wehiwa Aloy, who earned All-SEC honors at shortstop last season, is one of three Hawai'i natives, along with INF Nolan Souza and INF/OF Kuhio Aloy, his younger brother, on this year's roster.
- He is one of four native-born Hawaiian student-athletes in Arkansas baseball history, also including INF Rick Nomura (2015-16).

ROOT PIG SOOIE

- LHP Zach Root, a transfer from ECU, is one of three prized pitchers that Arkansas landed from the portal during the offseason.
- Root went 6-2 with a 3.56 ERA and 76 strikeouts in 68.1 innings across 13 appearances, including 12 starts, on the mound during his stellar sophomore campaign at ECU in 2024, earning him a spot on the midseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award.
- The Fort Myers, Fla., native recorded four quality starts last season, punctuated by a career-best seven-inning, 10-strikeout performance against Cal State Fullerton (March 2, 2024).
- Root entered the 2025 campaign with three preseason All-America accolades to his name, collecting the national recognition from D1Baseball, NCBWA and Perfect Game this spring.
- The junior left-hander made his first start as a Razorback in game two of the Opening Day doubleheader against Washington State (Feb. 14), spinning five innings of one-run ball with eight strikeouts.

CHEESE

- LHP Landon Beidelschies, a transfer from Ohio State, is another prized pitcher that Arkansas landed from the portal this offseason.
- Beidelschies was the Buckeyes' Friday night starter as a sophomore in 2024, posting a 6-7 record with a 4.15 ERA and 91 strikeouts in 84.2 innings across 15 starts on the mound.
- The left-hander logged seven quality starts and recorded a careerhigh 12 strikeouts at West Virginia (March 15, 2024) last season.
- The Canfield, Ohio, native, entered the 2025 campaign as a Perfect Game preseason All-American as well as a preseason All-SEC honoree from the league's 16 head coaches.
- Beidelschies made his Arkansas debut against Washington State (Feb. 17), striking out seven over five innings of one-run ball.

THE FIREMAN

- RHP Christian Foutch is expected to take on a much larger role in the bullpen this season after a strong sophomore campaign in 2024.
- The hard-throwing junior right-hander made 20 appearances in relief for the Hogs last season, posting a 1-0 record with a 0.81 ERA, 20 strikeouts and one save in 22.1 innings.
- The Littleton, Colo., native allowed only two runs, finishing the season with the lowest ERA by a Razorback pitcher to appear in at least 20 percent of the team's games since RHP Kevin Kopps recorded a 0.90 ERA in 89.2 innings over 33 outings in 2021.
- Foutch entered 2025 with NCBWA preseason All-America honors and preseason All-SEC praise from the league's 16 head coaches. He was also named to the preseason watch list for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top reliever in college baseball.

AUSSIE, AUSSIE, AUSSIE

- INF Brent Iredale powered the Razorbacks to an Opening Weekend series win against Washington State, slashing a team-leading .467/.526/.933 with two home runs and nine RBI over four games.
- The Sydney, Australia, native, making his Arkansas debut after beginning his collegiate career at New Mexico JC, had at least one hit and RBI in all four games, logging two multi-hit games and three multi-RBI performances, including a four-RBI game.
- Iredale became the first Razorback with nine RBI in a seasonopening series since OF Heston Kjerstad accomplished the feat against Eastern Illinois on Opening Weekend in 2020. Kjerstad hit four home runs during Arkansas' season-opening sweep of Eastern Illinois, homering twice and recording six RBI in the series finale.
- Iredale, Kjerstad, INF Carson Shaddy (9 RBI vs. Bucknell, 2018) and OF Sam Bates (9 RBI vs. Villanova, 2012) are the only Hogs in the Dave Van Horn era (2003-pres.) with nine RBI in a season-opening series.

CAN YOU DIGGS IT

- Senior OF Kendall Diggs has returned to Arkansas for another season after an injury-plagued junior campaign.
- One of the Razorbacks' three team captains last year, Diggs came into 2024 as a preseason first-team All-SEC honoree after slashing .299/.436/.547 with 12 home runs, a team-leading 63 runs batted in and a team-high 46 walks over 58 games as a sophomore in 2023, earning him second-team All-SEC honors as designated hitter/utility.
- Diggs, however, battled through a torn labrum throughout 2024, slashing .229/.346/.395 with seven homers and 34 RBI in 55 games.
- For his career, Diggs has swatted 22 career home runs, seven of which have been three-run homers. He has also hit two grand slams.

GOT THAT WOOD

- RHP Gage Wood has worked in a variety of roles on the Razorback pitching staff throughout the first two years of his career.
- As a sophomore in 2024, the Batesville, Ark., native made 22 appearances, including three starts, and posted a 3-2 record with a 4.46 ERA, 56 strikeouts and two saves in 40.1 innings of work.
- As a true freshman in 2023, Wood was Arkansas' closer, going 2-0 with a 4.80 ERA, 42 strikeouts and a team-leading five saves in 30.0 innings of work to earn a spot on the Freshman All-SEC Team.
- All five of Wood's saves came in SEC play, and all five of his saves were of the multi-inning variety, including three three-inning saves.
- Now a junior, the right-hander made his first start of the season on the mound against Washington State (Feb. 15), striking out a careerhigh seven over five innings of two-run ball.

RETURN OF THE MAC (AGAIN)

- Veteran RHP Will McEntire can do it all for the Hogs.
- The redshirt senior has pitched in 65 career games with 20 starts, racking up 204 strikeouts over 197.2 innings of work. As a reliever, McEntire has seven career saves, including a career-high four saves in 2024, and at least one save in each of his last three seasons.
- One of McEntire's best outings of his career came in a start against Louisiana Tech (March 11, 2023), throwing a nine-inning complete game with six strikeouts on 97 pitches. He allowed just one unearned run on three hits and a walk in the dominant performance.
- His nine-inning complete game was the first by a Razorback pitcher since RHP Dominic Taccolini's 10-inning complete game shutout against SEC Eastern Division foe Kentucky in 2016.
- His three-hitter was the first by a Hog since RHP Ryne Stanek's nineinning complete game three-hitter at #6 South Carolina in 2013.

HOGS' TRANSFER PORTAL CLASS RANKED NO. 2 BY BASEBALL AMERICA

- Arkansas' transfer portal class coming into the 2025 season was ranked No. 2 in the country by Baseball America.
- The publication's top 100 transfer portal rankings feature eight Hog newcomers, including one in the top 10 and four among the top 50.
- The list includes LHP Landon Beidelschies (No. 9), LHP Zach Root (No. 13), INF Camden Kozeal (No. 26), OF Charles Davalan (No. 33), OF Logan Maxwell (No. 52), INF/OF Rocco Peppi (No. 65), OF Carson Boles (No. 93) and INF Michael Anderson (No. 98).
- In its summary of Arkansas' transfer class, Baseball America writes:

2. Arkansas

No. of top 100 transfers: 8

It was a disappointing end to the season for Arkansas, who—as the No. 4 national seed—saw its season end on its home turf following an upset loss in regional play to Southeast Missouri. The Razorbacks coaching staff entered the offseason with serious work to do as it pertained to both adding and replacing talent, and their transfer class is perhaps the best to come to Fayetteville in the portal era.

They lost their entire rotation—Hagen Smith, Brady Tygart and Mason Molina—to the draft, but they added two of the best lefthanders in the portal in Landon Beidelschies (6-7, 4.15 ERA) and Zach Root (6-2, 3.56 ERA). Both will assume a weekend role this spring, and Arkansas has a bevy of weapons who will battle it out for the third starter spot. For as impressive a duo as Beidelschies and Root are, this class really shines positionally.

Charles Davalan (.288/.413/.514) has no shortage of tools packed into his compact frame, and the Florida Gulf Coast product will likely be the team's everyday center fielder. Infielder Camden Kozeal (.284/.349/.439) will almost certainly start at second base, while a handful of other position players will be in the mix for starting roles. After a stunning end to 2024, Arkansas again has the look of a team that will be competing for a national championship.

POWERED BY THE PORTAL

 Head coach Dave Van Horn and the Razorbacks took full advantage of the transfer portal prior to the 2025 campaign, adding 10 Division I transfers to the roster during the offseason.

From D1Baseball: Portal Pitchers with Breakout Potential Zach Root, East Carolina to Arkansas - One of the top prospects in the 2025 draft class, Root started 12 games and appeared in 13 for ECU last season posting a 3.56 ERA in 68.1 innings of work. The 6-foot-1, 185-pounder also struck out 76 and walked 21. The left-hander potentially has one of the best arsenals in the nation, and what you see is what you get. It's an off-speed over fastball package, and he throws four of them average or better (change-up, curveball, cutter, slider). The best of the bunch is the curveball. It has two-plane shape at 79 mph with a total vertical depth of -55" which is comparable to current Major Leaguers Cole Ragans and DL Hall and would place him 20th of current qualified Major League left-handed starter pitchers. He also drew a 48% whiff rate with a .057 xw0BA against this breaker in 2024. His cutter (86-87 mph) and slider (83-85) profiles are very similar with about an inch of horizontal separation and four inches of vertical separation, and both drew strong whiff rates and ball-in-play results. There's a strong pronation bias with his two-seam 91-94 mph fastball that he throws 47% of the time and his low-80s changeup (22% usage) both carry significant arm-side profiles. There's little doubt in our minds that this arsenal, and the accompanying pitchability, translate to immediate success in the SEC, as well as professional baseball. - David Seifert/D1Baseball

JUCO BANDITS

- Arkansas also added a pair of big-name junior college products in INF Brent Iredale (New Mexico JC) and OF Justin Thomas Jr. (Florida SouthWestern State) to its roster during the offseason.

RAZORBACKS' NEWCOMER CLASS RANKED NO. 3 BY BASEBALL AMERICA

- Arkansas' newcomer class coming into the 2025 season was ranked
 No. 3 in the country by Baseball America.
- To get the most accurate read on which college programs have the best incoming talent on their roster heading into 2025, the publication combined each program's transfer haul and recruiting class to come up with an overall ranking of newcomers.
- Baseball America's top 100 transfer portal rankings feature eight Razorback newcomers, including one in the top 10 and four among the top 50, and its top 500 draft rankings include four freshman.
- In its summary of Arkansas' newcomers, Baseball America writes:

Arkansas has a lengthy track record of bringing impact talent to campus, and this year is no different. On top of a fantastic portal haul that includes eight of the top 100 transfers, the Razorbacks bring to campus a quartet of players who ranked on the final iteration of the BA 500.

Left-handers Landon Beidelschies (6-7, 4.15 ERA at Ohio State) and Zach Root (6-2, 3.56 ERA at East Carolina) are the strength of Arkansas' class of newcomers, but Oklahoma prep fireballer Carson Wiggins (No. 78), who is the younger brother of former Razorback and current Cubs prospect Jaxon, will be in contention to log a handful of innings as a freshman.

Former New Mexico JC standout third baseman Brent Iredale (.441/.576/1.000) ranked No. 464 on the BA 500 and is already off to a fast start this fall.

Following a disappointing end in 2024, Arkansas has reloaded and looks the part of a national championship contender.

DIBASEBALL TOP 25 IMPACT FRESHMAN CLASSES


- Arkansas' freshman class, headlined by RHP Carson Wiggins and LHP Cole Gibler, was ranked No. 16 in the country by D1Baseball.
- In its summary of Arkansas' freshman class, D1Baseball writes:

Of all the Razorback freshmen, Carson Wiggins came to campus with the highest accolades. The 94th overall prospect for the 2024 MLB Draft per Prep Baseball, the 6-foot-5 righthander touched 100.8 mph with his fastball while landing a mid-80s slider for strikes. It's a nasty combo that overwhelms opposing hitters, especially when also combined with solid control. He, like Gabe Gaeckle, is not just a wild-armed thrower. It took him just 10 pitches to set down Oklahoma State in order. Arms like Wiggins don't make it to college very often and he'll be a fun one to watch at least for two seasons in Fayetteville - Wiggins will be a draft-eligible sophomore in 2026.

Cole Gibler, a Missouri prep, was ranked the 131st overall prospect for the 2024 MLB Draft by Prep Baseball and he did everything to show deserving of that evaluation. His present pitchability is advanced for most any age, but super impressive for a freshman. With a quick arm he repeats a starter's-type delivery for above average control of three pitches. His fastball sat 92-95 and fired two breaking balls for strikes. Gibler sat down the side in order on 13 pitches, striking out a pair. Although it's a long way off, the 6-foot-2, 200-pound lefty has the look of a high round pick in 2027. – David Seifert/D1Baseball

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- Perfect Game featured RHP Carson Wiggins and LHP Cole Gibler in its rankings of the top 75 freshmen coming into the 2025 season.
- Wiggins is the younger brother of RHP Jaxon Wiggins, who pitched for Arkansas from 2021-22 and was selected by the Chicago Cubs in the second round (No. 68 overall) of the 2023 MLB Draft.

- Arkansas finished the 2024 season 12-0 in midweek games, posting an unbeaten midweek record for the first time since 2005.
- In 2024, the Razorbacks secured midweek wins against Grambling, UCA, Oral Roberts, Little Rock, Arkansas State and UAPB as well as three two-game midweek series sweeps over San Jose State, Texas Tech and Missouri State to finish with a perfect 12-0 midweek record.
- In 2005, Dave Van Horn's third season as head coach, Arkansas went 9-0 in midweek games, including two wins against Centenary, two wins against Missouri State, two wins against Northern Colorado, two wins against Oral Roberts and one win against Oklahoma State.



- The one-of-a-kind facility, which opened ahead of the 2022 campaign, sits in the right-field corner of Baum-Walker Stadium.
- It also includes a tunnel to connect the facility to the first-base dugout and postgame press conference room.



MLB DRAFT FACTS

- Arkansas has had at least one player selected in each of the past 50 MLB drafts dating back to 1975.
- The Razorbacks have had double-digit players selected in a single draft on three occasions: 1985 (10), 2013 (11) and 2018 (11).
- Since 2018, no school in the country has had more overall draft selections than Arkansas (53).



Arkansas pitching coach **Matt Hobbs** has developed nine All-Americans, nine All-SEC honorees and 23 MLB draft picks since joining the program prior to the 2019 season.

HOBBS NAMED DIBASEBALL ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

- Arkansas pitching coach Matt Hobbs was named the D1Baseball Assistant Coach of the Year following the 2024 season.
- Hobbs, who enters his seventh season as pitching coach in 2025, guided his staff to a historic and record-breaking campaign in 2024.
- Arkansas ranked fifth nationally with a 3.87 ERA and a 3.11 strikeoutto-walk ratio and led the country with 12.1 strikeouts per nine innings, powered by a school-record 706 strikeouts.
- Since joining Arkansas as the pitching coach prior to the 2019 campaign, Hobbs has helped develop:
 - » 9 All-Americans
 - » 9 All-SEC honorees, including two SEC pitchers of the year
 - » 23 MLB draft selections, including 16 top 10 rounders
- Under Hobbs's tutelage, RHP Kevin Kopps emerged as the best player in the country in 2021, winning both the Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy, and LHP Hagen Smith was the unanimous national pitcher of the year in 2024.
- With Hobbs' help, Smith solidified his status as one of the greatest pitchers in Razorback history, concluding his career as the program's all-time strikeout king and single-season strikeout leader, and departing as the highest-drafted pitcher in school history when he was selected fifth overall by the Chicago White Sox in the 2024.
- Since Hobbs joined the Razorback coaching staff, Arkansas has made two trips to the College World Series (2019, 2022), clinched a pair of overall SEC championships (2021, 2023) and captured four SEC Western Division titles (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024).
- Additionally, the Hogs won Collegiate Baseball's national recruiting championship for the first time in program history in 2023 as Arkansas' star-studded recruiting class was named the nation's best.

HOGS AT NO. 5 IN DIBASEBALL'S TOP 100 PROGRAMS RANKINGS

- Arkansas checked in at No. 5 in D1Baseball's biennial rankings of the top 100 programs in college baseball.
- D1Baseball's rankings place an emphasis on a tradition of consistent winning in the last decade, especially in the last five years, with the ultimate goal being to identify programs in the best shape currently with an eye towards the next five to 10 years.
- D1Baseball writers Aaron Fitt, Kendall Rogers, Mike Rooney, Joe Healy and Mark Etheridge made adjustments to the rankings based on evaluations of coaching staff quality and stability, facilities, scholarship/financial aid situation, conference dynamics, momentum, recruiting and player development proficiency.
- In its summary of the Arkansas program, D1Baseball writes: The Razorbacks are still chasing the program's first national title, but it's safe to say they've still had a plethora of success over the past few seasons under the direction of long-time and legendary head coach Dave Van Horn. The Hogs recently went 44-16 overall, 20-10 in the SEC, and earned the No. 5 national seed before getting upset in the Fayetteville Regional. Before this past season, the Hogs had gone 43-18 overall (tied for the SEC regular season crown with Florida) in '23 with a No. 3 national seed and yet another Regional host while also going 46-21 overall in '22 with a trip to the College World Series. And in '21, the Hogs went a miraculous 50-13 overall with a 22-8 record in the SEC. That year, the Hogs were the top overall national seed before getting upset in the Fayetteville Super Regional by NC State. Yes, not winning a national title - yet - is a knock on the Hogs, but literally everything else is checked. The Hogs are a perennial power, they're insanely consistent in the toughest conference in college baseball, and the resources are plentiful in Fayetteville. Baum Stadium is exceptional, the player development facilities are the nation's best, and the program is well-positioned in the NIL era. 



Dave Van Horn, the three-time SEC Coach of the Year, has elevated Arkansas into one of the nation's premier college baseball programs ever since returning to his alma mater to take over for legendary head baseball coach Norm DeBriyn.

In his 23rd season as head coach in 2025, Van Horn, the second-winningest coach in Arkansas baseball history, has led the Razorbacks to seven College World Series appearances, including a runner-up finish (2018) and four top five finishes (2009, 2012, 2018, 2022), 20 NCAA Tournament berths, three SEC overall titles, eight SEC Western Division championships, one SEC Tournament title and 887 overall wins, including 353 SEC victories.

Van Horn, whose 1,472 career wins are among the most by all active Division I head coaches, is one of only five head coaches in college baseball history with 300 or more SEC wins in their career. Year in and year out, Van Horn, the 23rd coach in NCAA history to win 1,200 games at the Division I level, has produced nationally competitive teams and developed elite-level student-athletes on and off the field, including two Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy winners in outfielder Andrew Benintendi (2015) and pitcher Kevin Kopps (2021), as well as countless All-Americans, all-SEC performers and professional baseball players.

Under Van Horn's guidance, the Razorbacks boast 35 All-America honorees, 52 All-SEC selections and 144 Major League Baseball draft picks - and counting.
