LEADING OFF

THE MATCHUP – Longtime conference foes, Texas and Arkansas face off in its first series in league play since 1991. The two sides first met in 1902, but squared off 17 straight seasons as members of the Southwest Conference, beginning in 1974. This weekend marks the Longhorns' first trip to Baum-Walker Stadium since 2018. Across 115 contests, Texas boasts a 76-39 advantage in the all-time series.

SCORCHING START – In its inaugural campaign under head coach Jim Schlossnagle, Texas is off to its best 43-game start in 21 years. The Longhorns' 38-5 ledger is also the best start to a season nationally since Oregon State (39-4) in 2017. After an extra-inning defeat on Opening Day, the Longhorns rattled off 17 straight victories from Feb. 15 - March 16. The 17-game winning streak marked the longest since the program won 21 in a row in 2010. Overall, Texas' five losses have come by a combined 11 runs, dropping three one-run contests.

THE EYES OF TEXAS ARE UPON YOU – For the third straight week, Texas checked in as the consensus No. 1 team in the country. The Longhorns are slotted as the top team nationally in back-to-back-to-back weeks for the first time in three years. Texas climbed the rankings for nine consecutive weeks, as the Longhorns began the year at No. 19, according to D1Baseball.

IT JUST MEANS MORE – Texas is one of three programs to start 19-2 or better since 1996 when the 30-game SEC schedule began, joining 2013 Vanderbilt (19-2) and 2022 Tennessee (19-2). The Longhorns' 19-2 record in SEC action marks their best start to conference play in 15 years. With a sweep over Mississippi State at Dudy Noble Field, Texas became the first SEC team to notch a sweep in the school's first-ever conference road series since 1992. The Longhorns' win over LSU was their first series victory over a top-2 team since March 1-3, 2019. Meanwhile, with a 4-3 walk-off win over Georgia, Texas completed its first sweep against a top-3 opponent since that same weekend with LSU in 2019. The Longhorns are the lone program to have won all seven of their series in SEC play.

NEW ERA, SAME STANDARD – A 24-year head coaching veteran who was twice tabbed National Coach of the Year and led his team to the College World Series seven times, Jim Schlossnagle was named only the sixth Longhorns head baseball coach since 1911. Schlossnagle's six CWS appearances in the last 10 seasons are tied for the most of any coach, while his 50 NCAA Tournament wins during that stretch are the best of any skipper. As of April 30, the ABCA Hall of Famer ranks 10th among winningest active Division I coaches, amassing a 984-460 (.681) record.

Jim Schlossnagle, one of the nation's premier baseball coaches who took programs at Texas A&M and TCU to historic heights over the last 21 years, has been named head coach at The University of Texas, UT Vice President and Lois and Richard Folger Athletics Director Chris Del Conte announced. A 23-year head coaching veteran who was twice named National Coach of the Year and led his team to the College World Series seven times, he becomes just the sixth Longhorn head baseball coach since 1911 (with the exception of the war years of 1943-45 when assistant football coach Blair Cherry was at the helm). He is the 14th head coach in 123 years of Texas Baseball.

During his combined 21-year tenure as head coach at TCU (2004-21) and Texas A&M (2022-24), Schlossnagle has led his teams to the CWS in six of the last 10 seasons. That includes trips to Omaha in two of the last three seasons with the Aggies, including earning A&M's first-ever spot in the championship series this year. His six CWS appearances in the last 10 seasons are tied for the most of any coach (Kevin O'Sullivan, Florida), while his 50 (50-22/.694) NCAA Tournament wins during that stretch are the best of any coach. The programs he has built make it even more impressive as his six wins in two CWS appearances at Texas A&M tripled the Aggies' all-time total of two CWS victories in the history of the program. Meanwhile at TCU, five of the Horned Frogs' six CWS appearances came under Schlossnagle, and he led them to the final four at the CWS four times (2010, 2015, 2016 and 2017), the furthest that program has ever advanced. All totaled, his squads have been to the CWS seven times (all in the last 14 years), at least the final four on five occasions, and in 23 years as a head coach, his teams have earned NCAA Tournament bids 20 times. The resurgences of his programs all began in his first head coaching job at UNLV, where he led a struggling Rebels program to a Mountain West Conference Championship (regular season & tourney) and back to the NCAA Tournament in just his second year in 2003.

"Everywhere Coach Schlossnagle has been he's built winners at the highest level, had a first-class program in every way and is an absolutely perfect fit to lead our baseball program," said Kevin Eltife, Chairman of the UT System Board of Regents. "He had a historic run at TCU, took Texas A&M to heights they'd never seen, and the way he develops his players and works with his coaches and team is really something special. I couldn't be more excited to watch him work his magic on the Forty Acres."

Schlossnagle's Texas A&M program reached historic levels in short order, leading the Aggies to the CWS his first year (2022) and again in 2024. What he did on the biggest stage for Texas A&M was significant, posting a 6-4 record in the two CWS appearances for a program that had just two CWS wins in its history. Before he arrived, the Aggies had six CWS appearances in program history with the most recent coming in 2017. The Aggies' 53 wins in 2024 were tied for the second-most in school history. He took the Aggies to their best-ever NCAA runner-up finish with his patented squad built around outstanding pitching (fourth-best nationally in ERA at 3.86/nation-leading 12 shutouts/school-record 715 strikeouts), great fielding, reliable big bats (fourth-best nationally in home runs with 136) and clutch hitting. And they overcame a rash of injuries, adversity and challenges while still managing to advance to the CWS championship series. The Aggies outscored their CWS opponents 14-3 in the first three games to earn their spot in the championship series before dropping a closely contested series to No. 1-seed Tennessee, 2-1, including a 6-5 deciding final game. A&M had an all-time program-best five players earn All-America honors on the year, catcher Jackson Appel; outfielders Braden Montgomery and Jace LaViolette; reliever Evan Aschenbeck and starter Ryan Prager.

"What a home run hire," said Jay Hartzell, UT President. "Coach Schlossnagle is the best in the business, his long list of accomplishments is incredible, and his track record of building great programs is well documented. We are the premier baseball program in the country with legendary coaches, our six national championships and record 38 College World Series appearances, so it's certainly fitting that we hired a coach of his caliber to lead us. We're looking forward to great days ahead with Coach Schloss leading our Longhorns."

In Schlossnagle's three seasons in College Station, the Aggies' rise to dom-

inance was marked by winning nearly 70 percent (135-62) of their games under his leadership. And the success was immediate as Texas A&M went 44-20 and advanced to the CWS in his first year at the helm in 2022. The Aggies were one of the final four teams remaining that year and won their first games in Omaha in 20 years (since 1993) that season. That was the first A&M squad to reach the final four in Omaha, and he matched the total number of CWS wins in program history in just year one. Texas A&M also won the SEC Western Division title with a 19-11 mark with Jacob Palisch and Dylan Rock earning All-America recognition, and Micah Dallas, Joseph Meneffee and Rock getting selected in the MLB Draft.

Schlossnagle's Aggies followed a trip to Omaha in his first season by pushing to the title games of both the SEC Tournament and the Stanford Regional in year two, finishing with a 38-27 mark.

Before his move to College Station, Schlossnagle built one of college baseball's elite programs during his 18 years at TCU. He guided the Horned Frogs to the CWS five times, making their Omaha debut in 2010 and adding four consecutive CWS trips from 2014-17. TCU was one of just three schools to earn five trips to Omaha in a 10-year stretch (2010-19). The Horned Frogs posted an 11-10 CWS mark, including being one of the last four teams standing in 2010, 2016 and 2017. He left Fort Worth as TCU's all-time winningest coach with a 734-346 (.680) record. It was a dramatic turnaround for the Frogs, as prior to his arrival, TCU had made just two NCAA Tournament appearances. He responded by guiding the team to 15 tournaments, including nine consecutive NCAA postseasons from 2004-12. The success included all seven of TCU's NCAA regional titles, which began in 2009.

Schlossnagle navigated TCU to success in three different conferences, claiming 19 total conference titles between the Big 12, Mountain West and Conference USA with 10 in the regular season (7 MWC/3 Big 12) and nine in tournaments (2 C-USA/4 MWC/3 Big 12). The Horned Frogs claimed tournament titles in their last two seasons in Conference USA, entering the 2004 tournament as the number four seed before surging to the crown, then repeating as the postseason champs in 2005. They proceeded to win both the regular season and postseason championships in each of their first three years in the Mountain West. They left the Mountain West after the 2012 season with 11 league titles (7 regular season/4 tournament). Schlossnagle wasted little time in the move to the Big 12, finishing second in the regular season, winning the postseason tourney and advancing to the CWS in year two. He topped his time in Fort Worth by sweeping the Big 12 regular season and tournament championships in his final year in 2021. All totaled, TCU won six Big 12 Championships under his leadership, the 2015, '17 and '21 regular-season crowns and the 2014, '16 and '21 tournament titles. That nearly tripled the all-time conference title total TCU won prior to his arrival of seven, all of which came in the Southwest Conference (1933, 1956, 1963, 1966, 1967, 1972, 1994), before he took over and led them to their first league title in 11 years in just year one (2004).

Additionally, Schlossnagle taking over at Texas reunites him with Del Conte, who was TCU's athletics director for eight seasons (2010-17) of his tenure as the Horned Frogs' baseball coach. During their time teaming up together, TCU advanced to the CWS five times and won four Big 12 Championships (2 regular season/2 tourneys). That memorable run was one for the record books as TCU had earned an NCAA Tournament berth just twice (1956, 1994) and won just one NCAA Tournament game before Schlossnagle arrived.

"What a great day it is to be a Longhorn," said Del Conte. "We are absolutely thrilled to have Coach Schlossnagle joining our Longhorn Family, and like everything we do, we couldn't have made this happen without the incredible leadership in our chairman of the board of regents and our president. Chairman Eltife and President Hartzell are a critical piece in every decision we make, they are such great friends and counsel, and together help us make great days like today happen for Longhorn Nation. I can't thank them enough."

"I've known Coach Schlossnagle for a long time, and there's no better coach, program builder, and leader in the game, and the best part is he's an even better person," Del Conte added. "When we were looking for our next baseball coach, we knew Schloss would be the perfect choice, and we are beyond thrilled that he's joining our Longhorn family. He's a guy who obviously knows our state so well, is very familiar with our program's rich and proud history and everything Texas Baseball is all about, and absolutely checks all the boxes for this critical position. He really understands every level of building a team, develops and gets the best out of his players and coaches, recruits with the best of them and is totally dialed into the holistic growth of the student-athletes in his program. Our players, our staff, the UT community and Longhorn Nation will absolutely love him. I can't wait to get him started and for everyone to have a chance to meet him. The future of our program is in great hands, and I'm so excited to have Coach Schloss joining our elite group of coaches as we prepare to head into the Southeastern Conference."

Schlossnagle's ability to turn programs' fortunes around, and in quick fashion, was evident from his first head coaching job at UNLV. He took over a Rebels program in 2002 that had six losing campaigns in the nine years prior to his arrival, never won a MWC Championship, and had not been to an NCAA

Tournament in six seasons (since 1996). In his first season, he guided them to the semifinals of the conference tournament as a 5 seed, and by the end of his second and final season, he led a high-scoring UNLV squad that posted a 47-17 record, won the MWC regular season and tournament championships, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

The Hagerstown, Maryland native has enjoyed tremendous success during his 23-year career as a head coach at Texas A&M, TCU and UNLV, amassing an 946-455 (.675) mark. Schlossnagle is just the fourth coach to win multiple CWS games at different programs, joining Longhorn Legend Augie Garrido, Larry Cochell, and Andy Lopez. He is also one of just 11 coaches to win a game in the CWS as skipper of multiple programs.

A leader in his sport on the collegiate level, Schlossnagle served as president of the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) in 2023. He has been an ABCA member for 33 years and has consistently been involved in advancing the profession. Elected to the ABCA board in 2017, he is integral in shaping the association's legislative efforts and crafting the agenda for each year's convention. He served as the ABCA's Division I chairman in 2018, and in 2019, he began a string of four one-year stints as vice president, capped off by serving as president in 2023.

The Schlossnagle coaching tree has been extremely fruitful, as well. Eight NCAA Division I baseball coaches during the 2024 season sharpened their craft under his tutelage, including Derek Matlock (UTRGV), Randy Mazey (West Virginia), Bill Mosiello (Ohio State), Kirk Saarloos (TCU), Ryan Shotzberger (UIW), Steven Trout (Texas State), Tony Vitello (Tennessee) and Todd Whitting (Houston).

Schlossnagle earned national recognition for his efforts, being named National Coach of the Year by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association in 2010 and Baseball America in 2016. He also served a stint as the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team head coach in 2013 and as a Team USA assistant coach in 2016.

He has been recognized as a conference coach of the year on eight occasions as well, earning Mountain West honors in 2003 and 2006-11, and Big 12 recognition in 2015.

TCU players enjoyed MLB success during his 21 years there, including a school-record nine players drafted in 2019, highlighted by Nick Lodolo picked by the Cincinnati Reds with the No. 7 overall pick, the highest in school history. Sixteen players mentored by Schlossnagle have appeared in the Major Leagues since 2008, including 2015 NL Cy Young Award winner Jake Arrieta and three-time MLB All-Star Matt Carpenter.

Before life as a head coach, he spent eight years as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Tulane. He was an integral part of the Green Wave's success, helping Tulane to six NCAA Regional appearances during his tenure. He served as the Green Wave's recruiting coordinator for his last five years and garnered three nationally-ranked recruiting classes, which helped produce two 48-win seasons and a No. 1 NCAA Regional seed.

In 1993, he served as the pitching coach at Clemson. The Tigers finished that campaign with a 45-20 record, an Atlantic Coast Conference Championship and a third-place finish in the NCAA Midwest Regional. Seven members of that pitching staff were drafted.

After graduation, his coaching career began with three seasons as an assistant at Elon College (N.C.) where he helped lead his alma mater to a 99-41 mark, picking up two South Atlantic Conference Championships, one District 26 title and one regional appearance.

As a player, he was a pitcher on the 1989 Elon squad that finished 39-7 and appeared in the NAIA World Series. He graduated magna cum laude from Elon with a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1992 and earned a Master of Education degree in human performance and health promotion from the University of New Orleans in 1995. He has a son, Jackson Lambert, and a daughter, Kathleen Grace.

LONGHORNS NOTES

OOH, BARRACUDA – After splitting time behind the plate a year ago, Rylan Galvan has solidified himself as Texas' everyday catcher in 2025. Among SEC hitters, Galvan ranks fourth in OPS (1.180), sixth in slugging (.695) and on-base percentage (.485), while checking in seventh in walks (36). The junior tallied 12 home runs in his first 114 at-bats, matching his total from his first two seasons combined. Galvan is averaging a homer once every 10.7 at-bats. The 6-foot, 215-pound backstop posted a 32-game on-base streak from Feb. 25 to April 25, notching a team-high .366 average and 12 blasts across that stretch. In the Longhorns' sweep of No. 3 Georgia, Galvan punctuated the series with a walk-off solo shot to lift the Longhorns to a 4-3 victory. His game-winning swing marked Texas' first walk-off homer since Garret Guillemette on March 26, 2023.

HUM YOU, DV – Left-hander Dylan Volantis has made a name for himself in his freshman campaign. The 6-foot-6, 212-pound hurler's 0.98 ERA leads all SEC hurlers (min. 35 inn.). Volantis has yielded only four earned runs in 36 2/3 innings. The Thousand Oaks, Calif., native has notched a 3-0 ledger with 11 saves, which sits fourth nationally. Over his last 16 outings, Volantis has allowed just two earned runs across 34 2/3 innings. In league play, the rookie has allowed one tally over 21 2/3 frames. Volantis has posted a 1-0 mark with 10 saves, while issuing only three walks and 36 strikeouts across his first 13 SEC appearances. He has been named SEC Freshman of the Week twice since March 24.

WELCOME HOME, DOZA – A lifelong Longhorn fan, second baseman Ethan Mendoza transferred to The Forty Acres after one season at Arizona State. In his first campaign in burnt orange, Mendoza has totaled a .353/.452/.521 slash line. Heading into the series, Mendoza paces Texas in average, runs (44), hits (59), triples (3) and multi-hit performances (21). The 5-foot-10, 185-pound second baseman homered four times in his first 34 at-bats, after hammering only three blasts in 203 at-bats a year ago. Prior to the Longhorns' series against then-No. 2 LSU, Mendoza strung together a 14-game hitting streak, mounting nine multi-hit efforts along the way. During that run, the sophomore hit a team-high .456 with four homers and 15 RBI.

SUPER MAX – One year after emerging as the Longhorns' ace, right-handed pitcher Max Grubbs has shifted into a key bullpen arm for Texas. In 2024, Grubbs made 18 appearances, earning 12 starts in an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention worthy campaign. Across his first 15 outings this season, Grubbs has allowed only six earned runs over 38 2/3 innings. The junior's 1.40 ERA is third among all SEC hurlers (min. 35 inn.), trailing only teammate Dylan Volantis (0.98) and LSU's Zac Cowan (1.13). Grubbs has limited opposing hitters to a .213 average, recording a 6-0 ledger and five saves.

ALL GAS, NO BRAKES – Sophomore Will Gasparino has blossomed into a force to be reckoned with for the Longhorns. Through 43 contests, the 6-foot-6, 225-pound slugger is batting .268 with a co-team-best 12 homers and 45 RBI. During Texas' 4-0 week against Sam Houston and Missouri, the center fielder registered a .533/.588/1.600 slash line, leaving the yard in three of the four wins. In the series opener at Missouri on March 28, Gasparino socked a pair of three-run blasts and drove in eight runs, becoming just the fourth Longhorn with eight RBI in a game since 2008, matching Brandon Belt (2008), Porter Brown (2023) and Eric Kennedy (2023). Following his historic week, Gasparino was named SEC Player of the Week on March 31 and the Dick Howser Trophy National Co-Hitter of the Week on April 1. He registered a 34-game on-base streak from February 28 to April 26. Over that stretch, Gasparino hit nine homers.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE – Right-hander Ruger Riojas' glove says it perfectly: 'SAY WHEN.' Riojas – who joined the program after two years at UTSA – has done a little bit of everything for the Longhorns on the mound. Overall, the 6-foot, 192-pound hurler is 8-1 with a 2.98 ERA over 14 appearances, including six starts. As of April 30, Riojas is tied for sixth nationally in wins. In his six starting nods, the Wimberley, Texas, native has notched a 2.38 ERA across 34 innings. At Missouri, Riojas pitched a career-long seven shutout frames. He faced one batter over the minimum, retiring 16 of the first 17 Tigers. On March 31, he was tabbed SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week.

MUSTACHE YOU A QUESTION – After only making two starts across his first three years at Texas, red-shirt junior Luke Harrison has become a stalwart for the Longhorns in the rotation. As a freshman in 2022, Harrison made a team-high 32 appearances, registering a 3.06 ERA and two saves. Over the next two seasons, the left-hander would only pitch in 13 games, missing the 2023 campaign due to injury. This year, Harrison has posted a 4-0 ledger and a 2.81 ERA. As of April 30, the 6-foot-2, 215-pound hurler sits fourth in the SEC in ERA (min. 1.0 IP/G). In 2025, Texas is 10-1 when Harrison draws the start, with its lone loss coming in a 15-inning affair at Kentucky on April 12.

SCHUESS IS LOOSE – Despite growing up an Aggie fan and spending his first year at Texas A&M, graduate student Kimble Schuessler bleeds burnt orange. After playing just three games for the rivals from College Station, Schuessler has become a constant presence in the Longhorns' lineup since 2022. The 6-foot-2, 215-pound slugger has totaled at least a .323 average in all three of his seasons at Texas. As a full-time starter last year, Schuessler mounted a .343/.420/.601 slash line, posting the second-best average on the club. Following a slow start to his final go-around in college baseball, Schuessler has become one of the hottest hitters for the Longhorns as of late. This year, all six of his home runs have come since March 28, highlighted by SEC Co-Player of the Week honors on April 21. Against UTRGV and No. 8 Auburn, Schuessler reached safely in 13 of his 17 plate appearances. As part of his career-week, the first baseman notched a two-homer, eight-RBI performance in Texas' 14-2 run-rule win over the Tigers. Schuessler became just the fifth Longhorn with eight RBI in a game since 2008. Heading into the weekend, the Llano, Texas, native is tied for the fourth-most doubles (15) among all SEC hitters. Over Texas' 10-game winning streak, Schuessler is batting .500 with three home runs and 15 RBI.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK – Third baseman Adrian Rodriguez has burst onto the college baseball scene. Rodriguez left the yard in two of his first three career games, highlighted by a go-ahead solo shot against Louisville in the 10th inning on Opening Day. The 6-foot-2, 210-pound switch hitter began his freshman campaign with an 11-game on-base streak, posting a .404 average over that stretch. At the Las Vegas Classic, Rodriguez was the lone rookie tabbed to the All-Tournament Team.

GOING WITH THE FLO – A consensus All-American a year ago, Jalin Flores cemented himself as one of the best shortstops nationally. Flores paced the Longhorns in doubles (22), RBI (56) and hit by pitches (10), while also tying for the club lead in homers (18), total bases (158), multi-hit games (26). In 2025, Flores ranks second in the SEC in doubles (18), trailing only Florida's Colby Shelton (19). The 6-foot-2, 210-pound slugger is tied for the seventh-most career home runs (32) in program history, matching Danny Peoples (1994-96). Throughout his time at Texas, Flores has had a flair for the dramatic, tallying five grand slams, including the go-ahead shot in the ninth inning at Texas State on April 22.

LONGHORNS NOTES

LONG HAIR, DON'T CARE – Jared Spencer was selected in the 14th round of the 2024 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies, but elected to transfer to Texas instead. Despite making 59 appearances in three years at Indiana State, Spencer arrived on The Forty Acres with only 11 collegiate starts under his belt. As the Longhorns' ace, the 6-foot-3, 210-pound lefty has staked his claim as one of the top arms in the SEC. Against then-No. 3 Georgia, he struck out a career-high 11 batters in the longest outing during his time as a collegian, tossing 7 2/3 innings. Spencer limited the Bulldogs to a season-low one run on two hits in a 111-pitch effort, becoming the first Longhorn to pitch into the eighth this year.

MAX POWER – Junior Max Belyeu entered 2025 as one of the most prolific hitters in the country. Belyeu brings his big bat back to the heart of Texas' lineup after pacing the club in slugging (.667), OPS (1.090) and multi-RBI performances (15), while matching the team lead in home runs (18). The outfielder totaled a .329 average and drove in 53 RBI, earning Big 12 Player of the Year honors last season. This year, Belyeu has reached safely in 23 of his 24 games played, slashing .358/.465/.642 with six homers and 22 RBI. The 2024 Second Team All-American has been sidelined with a thumb injury since March 29.

PATIENCE IS A VIRTUE – Throughout his time as a head coach, Jim Schlossnagle's teams have been touted as some of the best offensive units nationally. At the forefront of their approach, Schlossnagle's clubs have been known for working lengthy at-bats. Over the last four full seasons, Schlossnagle's squad has led the country in pitches per plate appearance. As of April 30, Texas (4.7) paces the nation in that category, checking in ahead of Notre Dame (4.07), and Jacksonville State (4.06).

DOMINATE THE ZONE – Under first-year pitching coach Max Weiner, the Longhorns have adopted the identity of 'Dominate the Zone.' Weiner puts an emphasis on overall strike percentage, winning the 0-0 and 1-1 counts, and maximizing strikeout-to-walk ratio. Across its first 43 games, Texas has thrown 64 percent of its pitches for strikes, while totaling a 59 percent clip in 0-0 counts and a 63 percent mark in 1-1 counts. The Longhorns also boast a 2.7 strikeout-to-walk ratio. As a result, Texas has lowered its ERA by nearly two runs. The Longhorns rank second in the country in ERA (3.07) and WHIP (1.16).

TEXAS FIGHT – Heading into the weekend, Texas has notched 18 come-from-behind wins, which marks its most in a season in three years. The Longhorns have tallied five victories trailing after six innings, which is more than double their win total in those situations from 2024. On April 22, Texas overcame a five-run deficit at Texas State, scoring 10 runs over the final three innings. In one-run games, the Longhorns have posted a 7-3 record.

SCORING IN BUNCHES – Texas has shown its ability to put crooked numbers on the scoreboard. The Longhorns scored at least seven runs in an inning on six different occasions over their first 11 contests, highlighted by a season-high nine-spot against Illinois on March 2. Through its first 43 games, has mounted at least five runs in a frame on 13 different instances. Overall, the Longhorns have notched double-digit runs 13 times, tallying six run-rule victories over Ole Miss (Feb. 15), Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (March 4), Sam Houston (March 25), Missouri (March 28), Houston Christian (April 10) and Auburn (April 19).

OWN THE DISCH – Since UFCU Disch-Falk Field opened in 1975, Texas has gone 1,653-423-3 (.796) at home thanks in large part to Longhorn Nation. In 2025, Texas has drawn 192,329 fans at home, including a season-best 7,942 fans against Texas A&M on April 25. Across the weekend with the Aggies, the Longhorns set a new three-game series attendance record at UFCU Disch-Falk Field, with 23,680 fans watching Texas' sweep over its rival. With the exception of the 2021 campaign because of limited capacity due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Longhorns led the Big 12 in attendance for 16 consecutive seasons. Last year, Texas posted the fifth-highest average attendance (7,476) in the country.

THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT OMAHA – The winningest NCAA Division I college baseball program of all time has become very familiar with the restaurants in Omaha, Neb. Texas holds the record for most appearances in the College World Series (38), most individual CWS games won (88), most overall NCAA Tournament games won (258) and most NCAA Tournament appearances (63). The Longhorns have won six national championships, trailing only USC (12) and LSU (7).
