LEADING OFF

OPENING DAY RUN-RULE DUB

- Powered by Ryder Helfrick's two-homer game and Maika Niu's walk-off, Arkansas swatted four home runs and blasted its way past Oklahoma State in a 12-2 Opening Day run-rule win in front of an announced crowd of 18,387 fans Friday night at Globe Life Field in the Shriners Children's College Showdown.
- First pitch in Saturday's clash between the seventh-ranked Razorbacks and 10th-ranked Horned Frogs is 7 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 14, on FloCollege with Ben Wilson (play-by-play) and Pat Combs (analyst) on the call.

HOGBALL RETURNS

- Arkansas enters the year on the heels of a successful 2025 campaign in which the team went 50-15 overall and 20-10 in SEC play to clinch its sixth 20-win SEC season and punch its ticket to the College World Series for the 12th time in program history.
- Led by 24th-year head coach Dave Van Horn, the Hogs are the winningest team in the nation since 2017 with 384 total victories, and are the only SEC team as well as one of only two teams in the country to win 40-plus games in each of the last eight full seasons: 2017 (45), 2018 (48), 2019 (46), 2021 (50), 2022 (46), 2023 (43), 2024 (44) and 2025 (50).

HISTORY LESSON

- Arkansas is 49-22 overall against TCU, including 3-1 in games at neutral sites.
- Under head coach Dave Van Horn, the Hogs are 5-3 overall and 3-1 at neutral sites against the Frogs, including a 2-1 record at Globe Life Field.
- Arkansas defeated TCU in Arlington in 2021 (W, 4-1) and 2025 (W, 2-1).

IN THE POLLS

- Arkansas entered 2026 as a consensus preseason top 10 team. The Hogs are listed in all five major polls: No. 4 by Perfect Game, No. 5 by the NCBWA and USA Today Coaches, No. 7 by D1Baseball and No. 10 by Baseball America.
- Dating back to 2017, Arkansas has been ranked in 126 consecutive USA Today Coaches Polls, marking the longest active streak in college baseball.
- The Razorbacks have been ranked in the top 10 for 77 of the past 80 polls.

BAUM SOUTH

- Arkansas, now 10-3 all-time in games played at the Globe Life Field, is making its fifth appearance in the Arlington-based tournament this weekend.
- The Razorbacks also competed in tournaments at Globe Life Field in 2021 (3-0 record), 2023 (2-1 record), 2024 (2-1 record) and 2025 (2-1 record).



MACHINE OF CONSISTENCY

- Since the start of the 2017 season, Arkansas is the winningest college baseball program in the country (as of Feb. 14, 2026).

- Under Dave Van Horn, in his 24rd year as head coach, Arkansas has recorded eight 45-win seasons as well as two 50-win seasons.

- Excluding the shortened 2020 season, the Razorbacks are the only SEC team, and one of only two teams in the country (also Southern Miss), to record 40-plus wins in each of the last eight full seasons.

IT JUST MEANS MORE WINS

- Arkansas, winners of a program-record 12 consecutive SEC games in 2025, has won 18 or more SEC games for eight straight seasons.
- LSU is the only other team in SEC history to record at least eight consecutive seasons of 18-plus SEC victories (10 from 1996-2005).
- By going 11-1 thru its first 12 SEC games in 2025, Arkansas went 8-4 or better in SEC play for the eighth consecutive seasons (2017-present).
- It represents the best stretch of starting 8-4 or better in SEC play by a team since LSU did so in eight consecutive seasons from 1991-98.

THE BIG TWO-0

- Arkansas has finished with 20 or more SEC victories in a season six times in program history, including five times under Dave Van Horn.

- Arkansas hit the 20-win mark in SEC play for the third straight seasons in 2025, becoming the first SEC team in to win 20 or more league games in five of six seasons as well as one of two teams along with LSU (1996-98) with three consecutive 20-win SEC seasons.

GONE STREAKING

- Arkansas has recorded 11 winning streaks of 10 or more games since head coach Dave Van Horn took over at the helm of the program.

- The Razorbacks' 15-game winning streaks in 2023 and 2024 were their longest in-season winning streak of the Van Horn era.
- They were also the longest in-season winning streaks in program history since the Hogs won the first 18 games of the 1996 season.

MIDWEEK MAGIC

- The Hogs, who finished 11-1 in midweek games in 2025, had won 18 consecutive midweek matchups before their streak was snapped in a 14-13 extra-inning loss against Missouri State on March 25, 2025.
- Arkansas completed the 2024 season 12-0 in midweek games, posting an unbeaten midweek record for the first time since 2005.
- In 2024, the Razorbacks secured midweek wins against Grambling, UCA, Oral Roberts, Little Rock, Arkansas State and UAPB as well as three two-game midweek series sweeps over San Jose State, Texas Tech and Missouri State to finish with a perfect 12-0 midweek record.
- In 2005, Dave Van Horn's third season, Arkansas went 9-0 in midweek games, including wins against Centenary (2), Missouri State (2), Northern Colorado (2), Oral Roberts (2) and Oklahoma State (1).



HISTORY MADE AT HOME

- The 2025 campaign marked the 30th season in the history of Baum-Walker Stadium, which opened in 1996. Arkansas maintains an all-time record of 733-247 (.748) in the stadium's 30-year history.
- With a win against Creighton (June 1) in the NCAA Fayetteville Regional, the Razorbacks won their 35th game of the year inside the friendly confines of Baum-Walker Stadium, breaking their single-season program record of 34 home wins set in 2018 and 2024.
- Arkansas finished 2025 with 37 wins at Baum-Walker Stadium, which stands as the most home wins in a season in program history.
- Excluding 2020, Arkansas has won 28 or more home games in eight straight seasons, including a program-best 35 wins in 2025.

J.B. & JOHNELLE HUNT FAMILY BASEBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

- The J.B. & Johnelle Hunt Family Baseball Development Center is a \$27-million, 49,000-square foot baseball performance facility, providing players with an expanded locker room, team meeting room, strength & conditioning center, training room, nutrition center, pitching development center and an in-venue batting tunnel.
- The one-of-a-kind facility, which opened ahead of the 2022 campaign, sits in the right-field corner of Baum-Walker Stadium.
- It also includes a tunnel to connect the facility to the first-base dugout and postgame press conference room.



MLB DRAFT FACTS

- Arkansas has had a player selected in each of the past 51 MLB drafts dating back to 1975. The Hogs have had double-digit players selected in a draft on four occasions: 1985 (10), 2013 (11), 2018 (11) and 2025 (11).
- In 2025, a program-record four Razorbacks heard their names called in the first round of the MLB draft - RHP Gage Wood (No. 26 overall, Philadelphia Phillies), INF Wehiwa Aloy (No. 31 overall, Baltimore Orioles), LHP Zach Root (No. 40 overall, Los Angeles Dodgers) and OF Charles Davalan (No. 41 overall, Los Angeles Dodgers).
- Since Nate Thompson's first season as the Razorbacks' recruiting coordinator in 2018, no school in the country has had more overall draft selections than Arkansas (64).
- Under Matt Hobbs, Arkansas has had 30 pitchers selected in the MLB draft, including 22 pitchers taken in the first 10 rounds, since 2019.





Arkansas pitching coach **Matt Hobbs** has developed 10 All-Americans, 10 All-SEC honorees and 30 MLB draft picks since joining the program prior to the 2019 season.

MATT HOBBS: 2024 DIBASEBALL ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

- Arkansas assistant coach Matt Hobbs is nationally regarded as one of the best pitching minds in all of college baseball.
- Hobbs, now in his eighth season as pitching coach in 2026, was named the 2024 DIBaseball Assistant Coach of the Year after guiding his staff to a historic and record-breaking campaign in 2024.
- Since joining Arkansas as the pitching coach prior to the 2019 campaign, Hobbs has helped develop:

- 1 Golden Spikes Award winner
- 1 Dick Howser Trophy winner
- 10 All-Americans
- 10 All-SEC honorees, including 2 SEC pitchers of the year
- 30 MLB draft selections, including 22 top 10 rounders

- RHP Kevin Kopps emerged as the best player in the country in 2021, winning both the Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy. LHP Hagen Smith was the unanimous national pitcher of the year in 2024.
- With Hobbs' help, Smith solidified his status as one of the greatest pitchers in Razorback history, concluding his career as the program's all-time strikeout king and single-season strikeout leader, and departing as the highest-drafted pitcher in school history when he was selected fifth overall by the Chicago White Sox in the 2024.
- Since Hobbs joined the Razorback coaching staff, Arkansas has made three trips to the College World Series (2019, 2022, 2025), clinched a pair of overall SEC championships (2021, 2023) and captured four SEC Western Division titles (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024).
- Additionally, the Hogs won Collegiate Baseball's national recruiting championship for the first time in program history in 2023 as Arkansas' star-studded recruiting class was named the nation's best.



Arkansas is one of only four schools in college baseball history as well as the only SEC program to claim three or more Golden Spikes Award winners.

GOLDEN HOGS

- In 2025, INF Wehiwa Aloy was named the 47th winner of the Golden Spikes Award, which recognizes the top amateur baseball player in the United States based on their athletic ability, sportsmanship, character and overall contribution to the sport.
- Aloy, the first Hawaiian-born player to win the Golden Spikes Award and the first player born outside the U.S. mainland to accomplish the feat, became Arkansas' third award winner in program history, joining OF Andrew Benintendi (2015) and RHP Kevin Kopps (2021).
- Arkansas is one of four schools in college baseball history and the only SEC team with three-plus Golden Spikes Award winners: Florida State (4), Arizona State (3), **Arkansas (3)**, Cal State Fullerton (3).
- Since 2015, Arkansas is the only school in the country with multiple Golden Spikes Award winners (3).
- Aloy started all 65 games at shortstop last season and turned in one of the best offensive campaigns in Razorback history, leading the team in nearly every major category: slugging (.673), on-base plus slugging (1.107), hits (93), runs (81), doubles (19), triples (2), home runs (21), extra-base hits (42), multi-hit games (30), total bases (179).
- Aloy, playing alongside his younger brother Kuhio, finished second on the Razorbacks in batting average (.350), RBI (68), multi-RBI games (18), hit-by-pitches (10) and stolen bases (9). His numbers in total bases (No. 3), home runs (No. 4), runs scored (No. 4), extra-base hits (No. 5) and hits (No. 6) all finished ranked among the top 10 in the program's single season record book. Defensively, Aloy dazzled with just five errors in 229 total chances (.978 fielding percentage) while helping turn 31 double plays during the 2025 campaign.
- Aloy's historic season was capped off by a semifinal run with the 50-win Razorbacks in the College World Series, their 12th trip in program history and first since 2022.





Dave Van Horn, the three-time SEC Coach of the Year, has elevated Arkansas into one of the nation's premier college baseball programs ever since returning to his alma mater to take over for legendary head baseball coach Norm DeBriyn.

In his 24th season as head coach in 2026, Van Horn, the second-winningest coach in Arkansas baseball history, has led the Razorbacks to eight College World Series appearances, including a runner-up finish (2018) and five top-five finishes (2009, 2012, 2018, 2022, 2025), 21 NCAA Tournament berths, three SEC overall titles (2004, 2021, 2023), eight SEC Western Division championships, one SEC Tournament title (2021) and 934 overall wins, including 373 SEC victories.

Van Horn, whose 1,519 career wins are second most among all active Division I head coaches, is one of only five head coaches in college baseball history with 300 or more SEC wins in their career. He is also just the fourth coach in college baseball history, and only the third active coach, to win 900 games at an SEC program, along with Mississippi State Ron Polk, Vanderbilt's Tim Corbin and Ole Miss' Mike Bianco.

Year in and year out, Van Horn has produced nationally competitive teams and developed elite-level student-athletes on and off the field, including three Golden Spikes Award winners in outfielder Andrew Benintendi (2015), pitcher Kevin Kopps (2021) and infielder Wehiwa Aloy (2025), two and Dick Howser Trophy winners in Benintendi (2015) and Kopps (2021) as well as countless All-Americans, All-SEC performers and professional baseball players.

Under Van Horn's guidance, the Razorbacks boast 39 All-America honorees, 56 All-SEC selections and 155 Major League Baseball draft picks – and counting.


