» QUICK HITTERS

- This weekend marks Auburn's third of nine straight series against ranked opponents.
- The week marks the team's second of the season against nothing but top-15 foes.
- The Tigers are 4-6 against ranked opponents this season, including 2-2 at home.
- Only four of the last 35 games of the season dating back to the first matchup vs. Georgia Tech on Mar. 17 are against unranked opponents.
- Auburn is 13-4 at home this season and has won 12 of the last 13 regular season home series dating back to the final series of the 2024 season.
- Andreas Alvarez will make his first weekend start Thursday. He leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the NCAA with a 0.85 ERA in 31.2 innings.
- In weekend series, Auburn starting pitchers are 9-3 with a 2.45 ERA and .196 average against. They have struck out 148 and walked 23 in 114.0 innings pitched.
- The Tigers trail the all-time series with Arkansas, 50-56, but are 26-22 against the Razorbacks at Plainsman Park. The team is looking for its first series win matchup since 2017.

Butch Thompson enters his 11th season at the helm of the program in 2025, posting a record of 324-233-1 in his first 10 seasons. He has led the program to two College World Series appearances and four regional championships.

Butch Thompson was named Auburn's head baseball coach on October 22, 2015 and enters his 11th season at the helm of the program in 2026.

Recently hitting his 10-year mark with the program, Thompson is not only the third longest-tenured coach in program history, but also the third winningest with 324 wins.

After guiding the Tigers to a record-setting season in 2025 that saw multiple single-game and series attendance records as well as the fourth straight single-season attendance record and culminated with the first home Super Regional in program history, Thompson signed a contract extension that will keep him with the program through at least 2031.

A native of Amory, Miss., Thompson has coached 34 Division I All-Americans and 54 all-conference performers. He has seen 25 of his former pitchers called up to Major League Baseball, including 19 since 2014. Thompson has also turned 47 pitchers who went undrafted out of high school into MLB draft picks.

Along with his pitching pedigree, Thompson is also considered one of the top recruiters in the country. Since 2003, he has secured 18 recruiting classes that were ranked in the top 10 by either Baseball America or Perfect Game, including three straight top-10 classes from 2024-26 and four classes ranked in the top five on National Signing Day.

In 33 years of coaching at the collegiate level, including 24 in the Southeastern Conference, Thompson has coached nine College World Series participants, including leading the Tigers to the program's first trip to the College World Series in 22 years in 2019 and taking the team back for the second time in three postseasons in 2022. Thompson has also coached one national champion and a national runner-up, won nine conference championships and made 20 postseason appearances.

Following the previously mentioned 2025 season, Thompson was named the American Baseball Coaches Association Southeast Region Coach of the Year, joining Hal Baird (1994) as the only other coach in program history to earn the distinction. He has also been named the 2006 Fellowship of Christian Athletes SEC Coach of the Year while at Auburn and the 2014 Baseball America and ABCA National Assistant Coach of the Year while at Mississippi State.

Highlighting Thompson's 10 seasons at Auburn, he has led the Tigers to six NCAA Tournament appearances in the last eight postseasons, including the pair of College World Series appearances, and has taken the program to four of the five Super Regionals in program history (2018, 2019, 2022, 2025). His four regional championships are the most by a head coach in program history. Along with all of the postseason success, Thompson's teams have finished seven of the last nine seasons ranked in the top 25, including top-10 marks on four occasions.

After going 12-3 in league play at Plainsman Park in 2025 and finishing the regular season as one of four SEC teams to win seven or more conference series, the Tigers matched a program record by earning the No. 4 national seed for the NCAA Tournament, marking the third time in the last four seasons the program had been selected as a regional host. Auburn is one of seven programs in the country, including three from the SEC, to host at least three times in the last four years.

Including the team's 17-13 SEC record a year ago, which matched the 2023 team for the most SEC wins since 2010 (20), Thompson has guided Auburn to 15 or more league wins in five of the last eight seasons, including three of the last four.

Along with all of the on-field success, Thompson also played a pivotal role in the



planning, approval and completion of the newly-renovated Plainsman Park, a \$30 million project that was completed prior to the 2025 season. In its first season in the renovated and expanded ballpark that now features three premium club options and a standing room area on top of the War Eagle Wall in left field, Auburn welcomed more than 200,000 fans through the gates, ranking top 10 in the country both total attendance (201,703) and average attendance (5,603).

Thompson, who spent three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Auburn from 2006-08, returned to the Plains after seven seasons at Mississippi State as both associate head coach and pitching coach. In seven seasons at MSU, Thompson made four regionals, two super regionals, won the SEC Tournament and advanced to the College World Series, finishing as NCAA runner-up in 2013. In addition to his experience at Auburn and Mississippi State, Thompson also spent five seasons at Georgia from 2002-05, including a trip to the College World Series in 2004.

Thompson launched his coaching career as pitching coach and top assistant at Huntingdon College (Ala.) in 1993, before returning to his alma mater in Birmingham, where he helped lead the Panthers to back-to-back Southern States Conference championships and in 1995 coached BSC to its first NAIA World Series berth.

Thompson left BSC briefly to serve as head coach at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham in 1997, where he was honored as the Regional Tournament Coach of the Year, the ABCA Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year and the Southeast Region Coach of the Year after guiding JSCC to a 39-21 mark, the AJCAA Region 22 State Championship and a third-place finish in the NJCAA Division II World Series.

He returned to Birmingham-Southern as top assistant the following season, beginning a four-year run during the most successful span in BSC baseball history, making three straight appearances in the NAIA World Series while winning the NAIA National Championship in 2001.

Thompson prepped at Amory (Miss.) High School and later starred as a pitcher at Itawamba (Miss.) Community College from 1989-90. On Oct. 25, 2014, Thompson was inducted into the ICC Athletic Hall of Fame. He was later inducted into the Mississippi Association of Community Colleges Conference (MACCC) Hall of Fame as a member of the class of 2021.

Thompson earned a bachelor's degree in history at BSC in 1992 and completed a master's degree in sports administration at UAB in 1996. He is married to the former Robin Ashe of Birmingham, Ala., and they are the parents of three daughters - Anna, Olivia and Madelyn Gail - and grandparents of Mary Gail and Hayes Grady Moreman.

SAMFORD STADIUM-HITCHCOCK FIELD AT PLAINMAN PARK

Auburn baseball's home for the past 76 seasons, an expanded and renovated Samford Stadium-Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park shattered the single-season attendance record (201,703) in its debut season in 2025 and is back for an encore in 2026.

After undergoing a \$30+ million project, the ballpark now features premium club areas including the Broadway Club at Plainsman Park located at the top of the stadium behind home plate and the 984 Club located down the first base line to go along with the pre-existing Hall of Fame Club located at field level behind home plate, which opened prior to the 2024 season.

Along with the premium club areas, Plainsman Park now features multiple expanded general admission areas. The YETI Yard now includes three tiers of paved terrace space with the bottom tier featuring nine boxes equipped with soft seating and drink rail viewing areas, Traeger pellet grills, refrigerators and more. Additional general admission areas include the two-tiered standing room space atop the War Eagle Wall in left field and the expanded Plainsman Patio at concourse level down the first base line.

The new and improved ballpark, which continues to feature the timeless elements inspired by Camden Yards, Wrigley Field and Fenway Park that were included in the initial renovation spearheaded by former head coach Hal Baird nearly 30 years ago, has a capacity of 7,189. The design continues to combine the look of old-time ballparks with academic buildings on the Auburn campus to create a facade of brick and painted steel.

Kickstarted by the completion of the Josh Donaldson Hitting Facility prior to the 2021 season, Auburn baseball's player development areas also continue to take a step forward. Along with the hitting facility, the program has a new state-of-the-art locker room, bullpen and pitching lab, weight room and nutrition center, and coaches offices and team meeting space located on the second floor of the old Plainsman Park Rehab Center adjacent to the ballpark.

Plainsman Park, which has hosted seven NCAA Regionals (1978, 1999, 2003, 2010, 2022, 2023, 2025), including three in the last four seasons, and also had the privilege of hosting President George W. Bush on Oct. 24, 2002, has twice been named one of the best facilities in college baseball. Baseball America initially voted it the best facility in the country prior to the 2003 season, and D1 Baseball named it one of the top venues in the nation in 2016.

SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas enters the weekend with a 19-11 overall record and 4-5 mark in SEC play after getting swept by Florida last weekend and losing 15-14 in 10 innings at Missouri State on Tuesday.
- Offensively, the Razorbacks are hitting .281 as a team with 219 runs on 284 hits, including 60 doubles, three triples, and 46 home runs. Junior infielder Camden Kozeal leads the team with a .336 average, 38 hits, and 37 RBI. Junior catcher Ryder Helfrick leads the team with nine homers while also stealing five bases.
- On the mound, Arkansas has turned in a 4.02 staff ERA with 318 strikeouts and 98 walks in 260.0 innings. Left hander Hunter Dietz leads the team with 58 strikeouts in 34.1 innings pitched and carries a 4.19 ERA into the weekend.

WWWWWWWWWWIN STREAK

- Auburn went on a 12-game win streak from Feb. 28-Mar. 20, outscoring the opponents 102-22 during the span.
- The 12-game win streak marked the program's longest since winning 15 straight from Feb. 24-Mar. 22, 2019.
- During the streak, the team turned in a 1.40 ERA and didn't allow more than four runs in a game during the streak, including holding the opponent to two runs or less in eight of the 12 games.
- In the last 11 games of the streak, Auburn's starting pitchers didn't allow more than one earned run in any start.

GET READY FOR A WILD RIDE

- After finishing last season with the No. 1 SOS in the country, Auburn currently boasts the No. 1 SOS and No. 4 RPI in the country this season.
- Starting with the weekend vs. No. 2 Texas, the team's final nine SEC series are against teams currently ranked.
- Four of the remaining series are against team currently ranked in the top eleven of a poll.
- In addition to the weekend series, Auburn had its second of two midweeks vs. No. 3 Georgia Tech on Tuesday and takes on Jacksonville State, who appeared at No. 23 in Perfect Game's poll, twice, leaving just three games left on the schedule against teams not currently ranked.

RACKING UP Ks AT A RECORD RATE

- Auburn's pitching staff struck out 43 batters in three games vs. Youngstown State to begin the season, marking the most strikeouts in a three-game series since at least 1992 and tied for the most in any three-game span since 1997.
- Through 28 games, the Tigers have registered 301 strikeouts while walking just 73.
- The 301 strikeouts through 28 games are the most in the stat crew era (1993-present), one more than the total through 28 games in 1997, and the 73 walks allowed are tied for the fewest since 2002 (62) and tied for the second fewest in the stat crew era.

STRONG STARTS

- Through 28 games, Auburn starting pitchers are 13-5 with a 2.38 ERA and 195 strikeouts compared to 35 walks in 147.1 innings.
- The weekend rotation remained the same through seven weeks, marking the first time that has occurred since 2018, but will get a shakeup this weekend with Andreas Alvarez set to start Thursday's game.
- Starting pitchers have turned in at least 5.0 innings in 22 of 28 games this season, with one of the occasions it didn't coming because of the rain delay in game three vs. Winthrop.
- SEC opening weekend at Missouri marked the first time the weekend rotation each turned in 7.0+ innings since 2014 at Arkansas.

'DRE HAS BEEN DEALING

- Dating back to his last four appearances of 2025, Andreas Alvarez is 6-1 with a 0.57 ERA (three earned runs) with 56 strikeouts and 15 walks in 47.2 innings pitched.
- He turned in a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings with one walk and eight strikeouts en route to his fourth straight win last Tuesday vs. South Alabama.
- Facing the best offense in the country in Georgia Tech on Mar. 17, Alvarez struck out a career-high 10 batters and allowed just one unearned run on two hits and three walks.
- Alvarez hasn't allowed an earned run in four-plus outings and 24.1 innings dating back to the come-from-behind win vs. West Georgia.

MARCIANO HAS BEEN MASTERFUL

- Jake Marciano has started the opener the first seven weekends and is 3-1 with a 1.30 ERA and 56 strikeouts with six walks in 41.2 innings.
- In his first career SEC start at Missouri, he turned in 7.0 scoreless innings en route to being named the SEC Pitcher of the Week.
- In his first three SEC starts, he has turned in a 1.37 ERA, allowing three earned runs on 10 hits with 21 strikeouts and five walks in 19.2 innings pitched.
- Marciano ranks top three in the SEC in ERA (1.30), WHIP (0.67), strikeouts (56), innings (41.2) K-BB ratio (9.33), and walks allowed per 9.0 innings (1.30).
- His 12 strikeouts opening weekend were the most by an Auburn pitcher since Tanner Burns matched the single-game record with 15 Ks vs. Cincinnati on Mar. 1, 2019.

SANDERS IS SHOVING

- Jackson Sanders was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week after turning a career-best outing of 7.0 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts in the series-clinching win vs. Winthrop (Mar. 7).
- Sanders retired nine straight batters with seven strikeouts the third through the fifth innings, facing just one over the minimum.
- He turned in his second straight 7.0-inning start in his first career SEC start at Missouri, striking out eight while walking one.
- He responded from a tough start vs. Texas by allowing one earned run in 5.0 IP at Alabama.

PETRO'S POURING IT IN THERE

- Alex Petrovic earned a win in each of his first three starts of the season, doing so in 5.0 innings of work each time out.
- He became the first Auburn pitcher since Casey Mize in 2018 to start a season 3-0 with three starts of 5.0 or more innings.
- His fourth start vs. Winthrop was cut short due to a rain delay, and he turned in a career-long 7.2 innings en route to the win in his first career SEC start at Missouri.
- Petrovic's 7.2 innings were the most by an Auburn starting pitcher since Tommy Vail turned in 8.0 innings at Ole Miss in 2023.

THREE HEADED MONSTER

- Marciano (51), Alvarez (45) and Sanders (45) became the first trio of Auburn pitchers with 45 or more strikeouts through 24 games since 1999 - Brent Schoening (64), Chris Bootcheck (49) and Hayden Gilemmo (48).

RETURNING RUN PRODUCERS

- Auburn's quartet of Chris Rembert (46), Lucas Steele (45), Chase Fralick (41) and Bub Terrell (41) was the only returning SEC quartet to have each driven in 40 or more runs in 2025.

- After representing the USA Baseball CNT last summer, Chris Rembert earned a plethora of preseason accolades ahead of 2026.

REMBERT STAYS RAKING

- Last Tuesday vs. South Alabama, Rembert went 3-for-4 with a home run and season-high four RBI, capping off a five-game span in which he went 9-for-21 with five runs, three homers and eight RBI.
- With Thursday marking his 80th game in an Auburn uniform, Rembert is just two hits shy of reaching 100 in his career.
- He was recently ranked the No. 2 second baseman in the country by D1 Baseball.

REACHING AT A HIGH RATE

- Last year, Rembert became just the third Auburn freshman since 2001 to draw more walks than strikeouts.

FRALICK CAN FLAT OUT HIT

- As a freshman last year, Chase Fralick ended up starting 48 games behind the plate, including 27 of 30 SEC games.
- All 17 of Auburn's SEC wins came with Fralick behind the plate, and the freshman backstop raised his average to .343 in SEC play.
- At the halfway point of 2026, Fralick was named to the Buster Posey Award Midseason Watch List and is considered by D1 Baseball as the No. 4 player at the position.
- He leads the team with a .352 average, 37 hits, 10 doubles and 24 RBI and is tied for the team lead with a career-high five home runs through 28 games.
- Fralick has a hit in 24 of 28 games this season and has reached base in all but one contest.

BRANDON IS BALLING

- Brandon McCraine has made 26 straight starts at shortstop (16), second base (7) and third base (3) and ranks second on the team in OBP (.477) and third in average (.345) in his first 27 career games played.
- McCraine went on a 12-game hitting streak (19-for-41) from Feb. 20-Mar. 10 and reached in his first 19 games played to start his career, including multiple times in 17 contests.
- Since 1993, he became the fifth true or redshirt freshman to reach base in each of the first 19 games of their Auburn career.

- Younger brother Mason McCraine was named the SEC Freshman of the Week On Mar. 2 after collecting six hits, including his first career home run, and driving in eight runs in four games.
- Mason went 4-for-5 with six RBI in the middle game against Nebraska, driving in four runs on a pair of two-RBI singles in his first two at-bats before ending the game early with his two-run home run in the seventh inning.
- His six RBI were tied for the most by an Auburn freshman since Steven Williams drove in seven runs vs. Longwood on Feb. 17, 2018.
- He drove in five runs in the finale vs. Winthrop and is tied for third on the team in the category (20) in 20 games played.

BRISTOL'S BEEN A DIFFERENCE MAKER

- Bristol Carter was named the Amegy Bank College Baseball Series Most Outstanding Player after going 6-for-11 with seven runs, a homer, two RBI, three walks and three stolen bases in three games at Globe Life Field.
- He hit the walk-off single that led the three runs in the series opener vs. Texas and matched a career high with three RBI to go along with two hits vs. South Alabama.
- He leads the team in OBP (.480), runs (29) and stolen bases (20) while ranking second in average (.351).

BING BOMBS

- Ethin Bingaman hit a pair of home runs in the win vs. Louisville on Feb. 22, becoming the first Auburn freshman since Brian Fletcher in 2008 with a multi-homer game.
- He finished the tournament in Arlington with a team-best .625 average (5-for-8) and reached at a .700 clip en route to being named the SEC Freshman of the Week.
- Bingaman went 2-for-5 with a three-run HR in the series finale at Missouri, leading the team with six hits during the opening week of SEC play.
- He collected his sixth multi-hit game of the season at Georgia Tech Tuesday.

MADRIGAL MAKING HIS RETURN

- After undergoing ACL surgery last October, senior Eddie Madrigal made his Auburn debut in the series finale vs. Texas and hit a pinch-hit double off the base of the right field wall in the ninth inning.
- Madrigal made his first start as the DH last Tuesday vs. South Alabama and went 1-for-4 with a run scored.
- He collected a hit in four of his first five games back from injury, less than six months after undergoing surgery.

THANK YOU, HETZ

- Ryan Hetzler's eight saves last year were tied for fourth in the league and tied for the third most in a season since 2013, trailing only Blake Burkhalter (16, 2022) and Cody Greenhill (12, 2019) in the category.
- Along with recording four saves at Cal Baptist in 2024, Hetzler's 13 career saves are tied with teammate Ethan Harden for the most among active SEC pitchers.
- He has factored into the decision in five of his first eight appearances this season, going 3-1 with a save after most recently pitching a season-high 3.0 innings in a tough-luck loss at Alabama (Mar. 28).
- Hetzler leads the team with a 1.23 ERA in SEC play (one earned run in 7.1 IP) and leads Auburn relievers in innings in league play.

CORMIER IS COMING ON STRONG

- Freshman LJ Cormier ranks tied for third on the team with nine appearances and is second among Auburn relievers with 13.1 IP.
- LJ turned in 2.0 scoreless inning in the finale at Alabama and has allowed one run on three hits in his last four appearances on 7.2 innings dating back to Mar. 10.
- LJ's dad, Lance, was an All-American pitcher at Alabama (1999-2002) and went on to pitch in the big leagues for part of eight seasons.

AUBURN IN ARLINGTON

- Auburn wrapped up its third trip to Arlington in the last five seasons - 2022, 2025, 2026 - with three wins against Kansas State, No. 9 Florida State and No. 15 Louisville.
- The Tigers are a combined 8-1 in the event and have won eight straight games since losing the 2022 season opener to Oklahoma.

- Auburn’s 17 SEC wins last year were tied for the most in a conference season since 2010 (20), marking the fourth time in nine SEC seasons under head coach Butch Thompson the Tigers have turned in a winning league record.
- Auburn also turned in a 15-15 SEC record and went to game three of a super regional in 2018 and went 14-16 in league play while on its way to Omaha in 2019.
- Prior to Thompson’s arrival, Auburn turned in a winning record in SEC play twice from 2001-15.

REGIONAL HOST REGULARS

- Auburn is one of seven programs nationally that has hosted a regional in at least three of the last four seasons, joined by Arkansas, Clemson, North Carolina, Oklahoma State, Oregon State and Tennessee on the short list.

THOMPSON’S TENURE

- The 2026 season marks head coach Butch Thompson’s 11th season on the Plains, making him the third longest-tenured coach in program history and the fourth longest-tenured coach in the league.
- He surpassed the 300-win milestone with the team’s 13-9 win against Alabama State on Mar. 18, 2025, joining Paul Nix (1963-84) and Hal Baird (1985-2000) as the only coaches in program history to reach the milestone.
- Under Thompson, Auburn has hosted back-to-back regionals for the first time in program history (2022-23), three regionals in four years for the first time in program history (2022-23, 25) and has made a NCAA regional in six of the last eight postseasons, including four Super Regional appearances (2018-19, ‘22, ‘25) and two College World Series appearances (2019, ‘22).

- Auburn is one of two SEC programs with three coaches entering their ninth season together (Ole Miss).

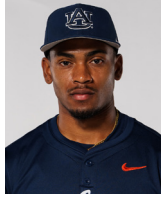
