## LEADING OFF

- For the second straight season, the Northeastern Huskies are Champions of the CAA after a historic 4-1 run through the tournament, walking off the final if-necessary game on Sunday against #1 seed Campbell. It was just the fourth time in conference history that a team won the tournament after losing its first time, and the first time since #2 seed William & Mary did it in 2016.

- Redshirt senior outfielder and newly minted three-time All-CAA First Teamer Harrison Feinberg headlines the 2026 roster as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, a D1Baseball Preseason Second Team All-American, an NCBA Preseason All-America Second Teamer, and a Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List selection. He was also named the #6 outfielder in the country by D1Baseball and earned a spot on D1Baseball's 2026 All-Loyalty Team as one of just three mid-major returners with 4+ WAR last season. Feinberg is joined on the Preseason All-CAA Team by shortstop Carmelo Musacchia (.302, 6 HR, 35 RBI in 2025), while First Team All-CAA outfielder Ryan Gerety (.294, 5 HR, 25 RBI) earned Preseason All-CAA Honorable Mention. Northeastern received all four possible first-place votes in the CAA North Division preseason poll. Through 53 games, Feinberg is hitting .340/.450/.617 with 15 home runs, 61 RBI, and 42 stolen bases - having already set new program records for career home runs (46, breaking a mark that stood since 2009) and single-season stolen bases (surpassing his own record of 37 set in 2025). Meanwhile, Musacchia has rewritten the career stolen base record book, sitting at 93 career steals after surpassing Cam Maldonado's longstanding mark of 89. Feinberg is not far behind at 85.

- 12th-year skipper and five-time CAA Coach of the Year Mike Glavine enters the weekend with a 391-241-1 career record, all with Northeastern, the second-most wins in program history behind only predecessor Neil McPhee (723). Glavine is also a four-time ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year (2018, 2023, 2024, 2025) and three-time ECAC Coach of the Year (2018, 2023, 2025). His Huskies have earned the program's only two at-large NCAA bids (2018, 2023), and four of the program's 11 trips to the tournament.

- Northeastern went 3-1 at Alex Box Stadium in Baton Rouge over the Feb. 27-Mar. 2 weekend, picking up its first three wins of the 2026 season against Grambling State and #2 LSU. The Huskies opened the weekend with a 4-1 win over Grambling State on Friday behind a strong start from Robbie O'Connor (5.0 IP, 1 H, 1 ER) and 10 stolen bases as a team. Saturday's game against #2 LSU saw Northeastern fall 3-1, as LSU's Cooper Moore held the Huskies to three hits over 7.2 innings with 10 strikeouts - AJ Aschettino's solo homer in the fifth provided the lone run. The Huskies bounced back with a dominant 10-0 shutout of Grambling State on Sunday, highlighted by back-to-back solo home runs from Feinberg and Gerety, a Cooper Tarantino two-run homer, and three perfect innings from Andrew Basel out of the bullpen. Northeastern then capped the weekend with the highest-ranked win in program history, a 13-10 victory over #2 LSU on Monday night - the first triumph over a top-two team in program history. The Huskies jumped out to a 10-0 lead behind a Chris Walsh three-run homer and Feinberg's three-RBI night, and held off a late LSU rally. Ryan Griffin earned the win with a career-high 5.1 innings in his first career start, and Andrew Rogovic recorded his first career save. The Huskies tallied 15 hits, with every player in the lineup recording at least one.

- The Huskies face Kansas for just the second time in program history and the first time since 2015, setting up a first-time meeting in round two vs. Arkansas or Missouri State.

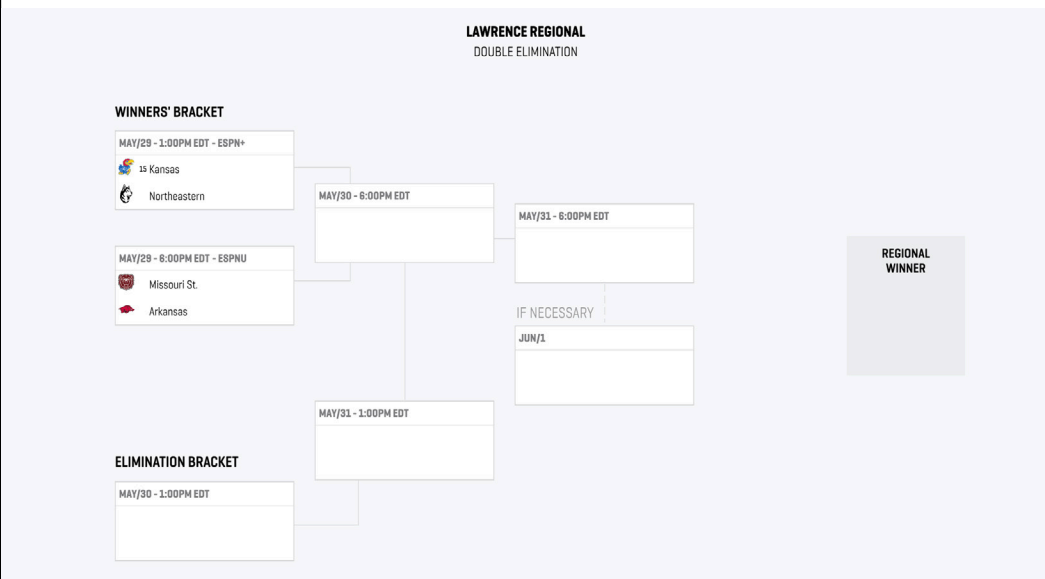

## A Run To Remember

Northeastern's path to the NCAA Tournament was anything but smooth. After earning the conference's #2 seed and a first-round bye in the CAA Tournament, the Huskies were shut out 6-0 by Hofstra in their tournament opener, needing to win four straight elimination games to claim the title. Northeastern responded with a 7-3 win over UNCW, with **Andrew Rogovic** earning the win in relief after **Luc Rising** struck out a career-high 11 Seahawks in an electric performance. **Harrison Feinberg** turned the tide of the tournament in the game against UNCW, trailing by a run in the eighth inning. His leadoff solo shot in the inning tied the game and sparked the Huskies to a five-run frame, pulling away from their southern rivals in similar fashion to last year's championship game. From there on, the Huskies fed off that eighth-inning magic for the rest of the weekend.

The Huskies then exacted revenge on Hofstra with a 5-4 win – **Ryan Griffin** picked up the victory in his first start in 20 days, and **Andrew Wertz** notched his fifth save of the year, entering with one out remaining in the bottom of the ninth with the tying run on second, and beating the batter to first on an unassisted putout to send Northeastern back to the championship round. The offense came early in the game capped off by a monstrous two-run shot from rookie **AJ Aschettino** to give the Huskies a 5-0 lead before Hofstra made the Huskies sweat late in the contest.

The heroics continued later that night in the championship game – freshman hurler **Cooper Maher** took the ball for his first collegiate start, and delivered a stellar performance. He worked 5.2 innings allowing just two runs on two hits, holding the tournament's top seed Campbell at bay. Catcher **Will Fosberg** broke the stalemate in the fifth inning with a two-run blast to right-center, spurring the Huskies to a 7-0 lead before Campbell got on the scoreboard late, but the bullpen combo of **Joseph Hauser** to **David McSweeney** to Wertz slammed the door for the Huskies, earning Wertz his second save of the day.

In the winner-take-all finale, game one starter **Robbie O'Connor** asked for the ball on short rest to try and finish the run. O'Connor's 5.0 innings of 2-run ball were instrumental to the Huskies' defensive success, not allowing Campbell to get too far ahead while their pitching staff held Northeastern at bay. After a 2-0 Campbell lead, Feinberg scratched across a run in the fifth with an RBI ground out, and **Tyler Harmony** tied the game with an RBI single to left field. The game remained tied through the last three innings, with Wertz coming on for his fourth appearance of the tournament, stranding the bases loaded in the eighth with a strikeout, and working a 1-2-3 ninth.

It couldn't have been scripted better. The Huskies had their top of the order due up after their closer had just retired Campbell's 2-3 hitters. From there, it was three straight base hits. **Tyler Harmony** led off with a double. **Harrison Feinberg** labored with a lower body injury, legged out an infield single, and **Ryan Gerety** laced a line drive into right field to score Harmony from second, finishing the improbable run through the loser's bracket.

The comeback made Northeastern just the fourth team in CAA Tournament history to win the championship after dropping its opening game, and the first to accomplish the feat in ten years (William & Mary, 2016).

## About The Regional

Northeastern is making back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since the 1970s and has claimed back-to-back CAA Tournament titles for the first time in program history. Last season's squad won its first NCAA Regional game since 1973, defeating Bethune-Cookman to advance through the loser's bracket. It'll be the Huskies' 12th all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and the fifth under **Mike Glavine**. This year's roster is anchored by redshirt senior **Harrison Feinberg**, a three-time All-CAA First Teamer and the 2026 CAA Preseason Player of the Year, who is hitting .330/.443/.599 on the season with 16 home runs, 63 RBI, and 42 stolen bases – having set new program records this season for career home runs (46) and single-season stolen bases, surpassing his own mark of 37 set in 2025. Outfielder **Ryan Gerety** (.323/.457/.489, 5 HR, 37 RBI) and designated hitter **Matt Brinker** (.310/.426/.533, 8 HR, 59 RBI) provide a potent middle of the order, while **Carmelo Musacchia** (.285, 44 SB) has rewritten the program's career stolen base record, sitting at 97 career steals. On the mound, **Robbie O'Connor** (9-2, 4.31 ERA, 77.1 IP) leads the rotation alongside **Luc Rising** (5-4, 3.24 ERA) and **Ryan Griffin** (7-2, 3.90 ERA), with **Andrew Wertz** (2-2, 2.84 ERA, 6 SV) anchoring the back end of the bullpen.

The Lawrence Regional marks Northeastern's first time as a four seed in the Glavine era, and the first time the Huskies will take on the regional host in a regional opener. #13-ranked and #15 national seed Kansas (42-16, 22-8 Big 12) comes in as the hottest team in the field, capping its season with a dominant Big 12 Tournament run, culminating in a 9-0 rout of West Virginia in the championship game. The Jayhawks are 1-0 all-time against Northeastern, meeting in Port Charlotte Florida back in 2015. #2 seed and #14-ranked Arkansas (39-20, 17-13 SEC) enters after falling to Georgia in the SEC Tournament, looking to rebound on the regional stage. The Razorbacks and Huskies have never met, despite Northeastern traveling to the Fayetteville Regional in 2021, where the Huskies avoided the top-seeded Hogs in that bracket. #3 seed Missouri State (34-19, 21-3 Conference USA) was dominant in conference play but saw its season hit a speed bump with a loss to Liberty in the Conference USA Tournament. The Bears have also never faced Northeastern.

## Kings Of The North

Northeastern entered the CAA Tournament as the No. 2 seed for the first time in program history after winning the CAA's North Division in the conference's first year with a North/South divisional split since the 2021 season. Among the potential first-round opponents, the tournament history varies wildly: the Huskies own a dominant 7-0 all-time CAA Tournament record against Charleston, while Monmouth is making its first appearance in the tournament field. Hofstra, on the other hand, has had Northeastern's number in postseason play, holding a 3-0 edge in prior tournament meetings, including the 2022 championship game. In the 2026 regular season, the Huskies went 3-3 against Hofstra, 4-2 against Monmouth, and have yet to face Charleston this year. Northeastern arrives in Wilmington looking to defend its 2025 CAA Tournament Championship, where the top-seeded Huskies rolled through the bracket with a perfect 3-0 record, outscoring opponents 26-7 with wins over Charleston (6-0), UNCW (11-1), and UNCW again (9-6) in the championship game.

The Huskies also reached 20 conference wins for just the fourth time in program history, all under head coach **Mike Glavine**. The Huskies set a program and conference record last season with a 25-1 record. The Campbell Camels unseated the Huskies' conference record win total this season with a 26-4 record.

## The Brookline Nine

Northeastern placed nine players across the All-CAA teams, headlined by four First Team selections. Redshirt senior outfielder **Harrison Feinberg** earned First Team honors for the third time in his career after hitting .340/.450/.617 with 15 home runs, 61 RBIs, and 42 stolen bases while breaking the program's all-time career home run record. Junior outfielder **Ryan Gerety** (.330/.471/.512, 5 HR, 36 RBI, 20 SB) and senior designated hitter **Matt Brinker** (.322, 8 HR, 58 RBI, .561 SLG) each earned their first career First Team nods, while graduate transfer reliever **Andrew Wertz** (3.12 ERA, 4 SV, 33 K in 34.2 IP) rounded out the First Team contingent. Freshman infielder **Tyler Harmony** (.386/.489/.495), Friday starter **Robbie O'Connor** (9-1, .207 opp. AVG), and Saturday starter **Luc Rising** (3.18 ERA, 68 K in 70.2 IP) all earned Second Team recognition, while freshman reliever **Cooper Maher** (3.58 ERA, 2 SV, 25 K) was named honorable mention. Harmony, Maher, and redshirt freshman infielder **AJ Aschettino** (.270, 10 HR, 30 RBI) were also named to the All-Rookie Team.

## Highway Robbery

Northeastern's base running has gone from aggressive to historic. The Huskies have officially taken sole possession of the national lead in stolen bases, surpassing VMI to sit atop all of Division I with 203 steals on the season. That total leads the CAA by a wide margin and continues a multi-year trend of elite base running under head coach **Mike Glavine** – the Huskies have ranked among the top five nationally in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons, and

have now set a new program record, surpassing 200 steals for the first time in program history. **Carmelo Musacchia** and **Harrison Feinberg** have been the engines of the running game all year, combining for 170+ career stolen bases between them – with Musacchia breaking Cam Maldonado's career record set last season (89) with 93. **Charlie Criscola**, **AJ Aschettino**, and **Ryan Gerety** have all been active on the bases as well, giving the Huskies one of the deepest base running lineups in the country. Northeastern swiped 11 bags in a single game at Brown back in March and has consistently pressured opponents on the base paths all season long. With the national lead in hand and two players chasing the career record, the Huskies figure to keep the pressure on this weekend.

**Re-Writing The Record Books**  
**Harrison Feinberg** continues to etch his name into the Northeastern record books – and he's not done yet. The redshirt senior outfielder broke the program's all-time career home run record earlier this season with his 43rd career blast, a solo shot off Boston College's Nathan O'Donnell that eclipsed a mark that had stood since 2009. He's since pushed the record to 45 career home runs, including 14 this season – highlighted by a three-homer, six-RBI eruption in the series finale against Maine on April 12th, his first career three-homer game. On the base paths, Feinberg has been equally historic: he's set a new single-season program record with 38 stolen bases, surpassing his own mark of 37 set a year ago. He's now closing in on another piece of program history – Cam Maldonado's career stolen base record of 89 – and he's not the only one. Carmelo Musacchia leads the chase with 85 career stolen bases, just four away from the record, while Feinberg sits right behind him at 81, setting up a race between two of the most dynamic players in program history down the stretch. On the year, Feinberg is slashing .331/.440/.624 with 14 home runs and 54 RBI, and enters the weekend as the CAA Preseason Player of the Year, a D1Baseball Second-Team Preseason All-American, and a Golden Spikes Award Watch List selection.

**Send My Love Down to Baton Rouge**  
 Northeastern's signature moment of the early season came on March 2nd at Alex Box Stadium, when the Huskies knocked off #2 LSU 13-10 in front of 10,292 fans – the largest crowd to ever watch a Northeastern baseball game. It was just the third all-time meeting between the programs and the first Husky win over the Tigers, whose previous two victories came in the 2003 NCAA Baton Rouge Regional (11-8) and the Saturday prior (3-1). Trailing early, Northeastern erupted for 15 hits – the team's season high – led by Harrison Feinberg (3-for-6, 3 RBI), Matt Brinker (3-for-6, 1 RBI), and a Chris Walsh three-run homer in the third inning that blew the game open. Ryan Griffin (W, 1-0) earned the win with 5.1 innings of relief, and Andrew Rogovic picked up his first save. The win at college baseball's most iconic venue was part of a 3-1 weekend in Baton Rouge that also included a pair of wins over Grambling State (4-1, 10-0) and snapped a five-game losing streak to open the season. D1Baseball's podcast covered the win in a segment titled "Oh My Gosh, We're Going to Win," and the performance signaled that despite the roster turnover, the 2026 Huskies could still compete with the nation's best.

**Huskies In The Fort**  
 The Huskies made their annual trip to JetBlue Park at Fenway South in Fort Myers, Florida on February 20 for their exhibition game against the Boston Red Sox. Northeastern jumped out to a 2-1 lead after two innings – Harrison Feinberg singled to lead off the game, stole second, and scored on Ryan Gerety's single through the right side in the first, and Anthony Ruggiero singled, stole second and third, and came home on a throwing error in the second. Starter Robbie O'Connor turned in the pitching highlight of the afternoon, retiring the Sox in order in the second inning, capping the frame with a strikeout. The Red Sox answered with three runs in the third and four in the fourth before an explosive nine-run sixth put the game out of reach at 18-2. Cooper Tarantino singled in the seventh and came around to score on a Will Fosberg single to set the final at 18-3. The result ran Boston's record to 22-0 against Northeastern in the all-time series, which includes a one-off 10-2 Red Sox win at Fenway Park in 1977 and has continued as an annual Spring Training tradition at JetBlue Park since 2004. The Huskies posted seven hits and five stolen bases in the contest – all seven hits were singles, tallied by Feinberg, Gerety, Ruggiero, Tarantino, Fosberg, Carmelo Musacchia, and Matt Brinker. The seven hits were the most by a Husky team against the Red Sox since 2017.

**Defending the Diamond**  
 Northeastern's 2025 season was a program-defining run: 49 wins, 25 conference victories, a 21-game winning streak (the longest in the nation and in program history), the CAA regular season and tournament double, a #19 national ranking, and the program's first regional win since the 1970s – a 4-3 victory over Bethune-Cookman in the Tallahassee Regional. The Huskies led the country in win percentage (.817), ERA, and WHIP at season's end. What comes next? With significant roster turnover but a proven development system and elite returning talent, the 2026 Huskies aim to prove that 2025 wasn't a fluke, but the standard of what can be achieved when talent and culture align.

## The Glavine Era, Chapter 12

**Mike Glavine** enters his 12th season at the helm of Northeastern baseball, and 20th overall with the program. His 357 career wins are the second-most in program history, and he continues to close the gap on a legacy that has transformed Northeastern into a nationally recognized mid-major power. Under Glavine, the Huskies have reached 30 wins in six of the last seven full seasons (2018, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025), including five straight. They've made four NCAA Tournament appearances, earned two at-large bids, won two CAA Tournament titles (2021, 2025), four regular season titles (2017, 2018, 2021, 2025), and three Baseball Beanpot championships. Glavine is a five-time CAA Coach of the Year, four-time ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, and three-time ECAC Coach of the Year.

### Six Straight 30s?

Northeastern has reached 30 wins in five consecutive seasons (2021-2025), the longest such streak in program history. Only seven of the program's 100+ year seasons have reached the 30-win mark at all – and all seven have come under Glavine.

### On the Rise

Northeastern has established itself as one of the premier mid-major programs in college baseball. The Huskies climbed from #83 to #67 in D1Baseball's Top 100 Programs poll between 2022 and 2024, the third-highest CAA team behind UNCW (49) and Campbell (57), and the 25th-highest mid-major program in that poll. The Huskies earned their first D1Baseball Top 25 appearance in 2023 at #25, were ranked #23 in the 2024 preseason, and peaked at #19 in the final 2025 rankings – the highest D1Baseball ranking in program history. Baseball America named Northeastern the projected CAA favorite heading into 2026, noting the program "has become the CAA's measuring stick in recent years." Thanks to three NCAA Tournament appearances in five seasons (2018, 2023, 2025), including two at-large bids, the Huskies are annually in the mix for conference championships and NCAA Tournament conversations.

### Road Dawgs

Every season the Huskies begin the campaign with a long stretch of road and neutral-site games, facing top non-conference talent before returning home. The road schedule provides a challenging non-conference slate, increasing the strength of schedule and at-large hopes in previous years (2023, 2018). The Huskies have held a winning record entering their first home game in five of the last six seasons, and posted a 22-8 road/neutral record in 2025.

### Protect the Fortress

Northeastern went a program-best 23-1 at Friedman Diamond in 2025, shattering the previous best home record under Glavine (21-2, .913 in 2021). In the Glavine era, the Huskies are 157-51 with one tie (.753) at home. The Huskies open the 2026 home slate on March 13th against Towson, who handed the Huskies their lone home defeat last season.

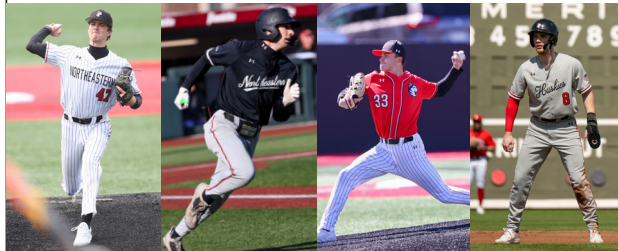

## THE GLAVINE FILE

**Mike Glavine** – the five-time CAA Coach of the Year (2017, 2018, 2021, 2023, 2025), 2018 NEIBA (New England) Coach of the Year, three-time ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year (2018, 2023, 2024), and three-time ECAC Coach of the Year (2018, 2023, 2025) – wrapped up his 11th season as head coach of the Northeastern baseball team and 19th season overall with the program, having previously served as the Huskies' full-time assistant and recruiting coordinator. He was named Neil McPhee's successor as head coach during September 2013 and took the reigns of the program upon McPhee's retirement at the conclusion of the 2014 season, following McPhee's 29th year at Northeastern.

Under Glavine, the Huskies have a 357-222-1 overall record while going 164-84 in CAA play, and four NCAA appearances, including the program's only two at large bids in the regional era (1999-present).

In 2025, Glavine's Huskies once again set a new standard for the program with a program-record 49 wins to just 11 losses, in a season that claimed the CAA Regular Season title, a three-game sweep of the 2025 CAA Tournament, and the program's first regional win since the 70's with a 4-3 win over Bethune-Cookman in the Tallahassee Regional. Northeastern's 25 CAA wins (25-2 record) tied the most in conference history, while their 48th overall win broke the conference's previous record of 47. Among the staggering numbers included the program's highest D1Baseball.com ranking, entering the 2025 NCAA Tournament as the #19 team in the country. The Huskies led the country in win percentage (.817), ERA (3.08), and WHIP (1.07) at season's end. Northeastern claimed the CAA Co-Player of the Year title for the second season in a row, with Harrison Feinberg garnering the honors - his three-RBI double in the CAA Championship game spurred a comeback against UNCW, tying the game at 6-6 before the Huskies went on to win 9-6, earning Feinberg the tournament's Most Outstanding Player award. Glavine's Huskies also set a new program record in steals, grabbing 196 steals, good for second in the country. NU's 17 shutouts on the year were also a program record, and were the fifth-most all-time in NCAA history. The Huskies entered the NCAA Tournament on a 27-game winning streak, the longest in the NCAA since 2021.

The 2024 Huskies reached 35+ wins for the fourth time in the Glavine era, going 38-17 overall, which moved Glavine past 300 career wins, giving him the second-most wins in program history behind only his former coach and predecessor, Neil McPhee (723 wins). The Huskies shattered several offensive records on the year, including a 32-year old record for stolen bases in a season, surpassing the 1992 mark of 145 stolen bags with 163 in the 2024 season. First baseman Tyler MacGregor was named the program's third-ever CAA Player of the Year, winning Co-POTY honors with the highest single-season batting average in program history (.402), while also leading the conference in slugging percentage, OPS, runs scored, hits, RBIs, and doubles, several of which were new program records.

In one of the most record-setting seasons in Northeastern Baseball history, Glavine's Huskies went 44-16 in 2023 with an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Huskies had their winningest season in program history, earning the program's first ever Top-25 ranking from D1Baseball.com, and breaking several team and individual offensive records, including wins, home runs (106), runs scored (459), hits (614), batting average (tied, .295), slugging % (.510), on-base % (.395), and walks (226). Center fielder Mike Sirota set a new record in runs scored with 73 on the season, and third baseman Danny Crossen put up a program-best 84 hits, with a 60-game on-base streak dating back to 2022. He was named CAA Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career, finishing with a conference record of 20-10 and a tournament runner-up appearance, and ECAC Coach of the Year.

The Huskies claimed another winning record in 2022, the sixth in Glavine's head coaching career, going 31-29-1 and reaching the CAA Championship game for the second straight season. Glavine's Huskies recorded four wins over top-20 opponents including a weekend sweep of #8 NC State, and handing #18 Clemson their first loss of the season.

Glavine guided the Huskies to a 20-3 CAA record in 2021, their first CAA Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament including a program best 20-game win streak overall and CAA record 19-game win streak to open conference play, earning him Coach of the Year honors for 2021. Glavine led the Huskies to a final RPI ranking of No 34.

Glavine led the Huskies to a final RPI ranking of No. 11 in 2020, before the season was canceled due to the global pandemic Coronavirus. Baseball America did a vote by coaches around the country in April 2020 and Coach Glavine earned the fourth-most votes as the 'most underrated College Baseball Coach' (story here). He earned his 150th win at Northeastern in a 10-0 victory over South Florida (2/22/20) as the Huskies picked up series wins against USF and Florida Atlantic before the season was halted.

Glavine guided Northeastern to consecutive CAA regular-season titles during 2017 and '18 – the Huskies' first within any conference since 2005 (America East). He has also led the Huskies back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2003, earning an at-large bid during 2018 after winning a program record, 36 games, including the program's first three victories against the SEC, and attaining a top-40 RPI.

Glavine steered Northeastern to the best fielding percentage in the CAA (.975), one that led the conference in double plays turned (58) and housed the 2017 CAA Defensive Player of the Year, shortstop Max Burt en route to capturing the CAA regular-season crown. Coupled with a pitching staff that combined to post a 3.88 ERA during league games, the Huskies went 16-7 during the conference calendar, winning the pennant by a half game ahead of UNCW. Glavine's success merited him CAA Coach of the Year honors.

Since becoming head coach, Glavine has coached nine Northeastern players to MLB Draft selections and a program-best three selections in 2019 with pitchers Sean Mellen (14th Rd./Dodgers) and Andrew Misiaszek (32nd Rd./Indians) and first baseman Jake Farrell (39th Rd./Yankees). During the 2016 MLB Draft, Glavine became the first head coach in Northeastern history to witness two players (Civale and Hunt) be selected during the draft's opening 10 rounds with Civale's selection at 92nd overall standing as the third highest NU draft pick all-time.

Under Glavine, the Huskies have produced a pitching draft pick or signee to Major League Baseball organizations in four of six seasons. During that time, the Huskies have been consistently one of the top pitching staffs in the CAA.

At the helm of the Huskies for his second season during 2016, Glavine led Northeastern to its fifth 30-win campaign (31) in program history. Opening the year on the road against No. 30 Oklahoma, he navigated NU to consecutive upset wins versus the ranked Sooners, delivering the program its first-ever victories against a Big 12 opponent. Returning to the CAA tournament for the fourth straight season and second in a row under Glavine, the fifth-seeded Huskies outperformed two higher-seeded teams (No. 3 Elon, No. 4 James Madison), finishing as one of the conference's final four teams left standing. Under Glavine's guidance, Northeastern observed two student-athletes go on to claim CAA postseason awards during 2016: right-hander Aaron Civale (Pitcher of the Year) and catcher Josh Treff (Defensive Player of the Year). That season, the CAA handed out 11 conference awards to eight of Glavine's players, including six All-CAA selections. Civale also became the first Northeastern player since 2012 to garner status as a Louisville Slugger All-American, having been selected to the Third Team.

Glavine made a smooth transition into his first head-coaching role during the 2015 campaign, leading NU to 14 CAA victories, the most the program had witnessed since its inaugural run through the conference during 2006 (19). Under his first-year mentorship, Northeastern achieved its first top-three, regular-season finish in the CAA in nine years and downed No. 15 College of Charleston, earning the program its first victory against an NCBWA ranked opponent since 2008. He also coached six student-athletes to CAA postseason awards, most notably placing starting pitcher Dustin Hunt on the All-CAA Second Team.

A native of Billerica, Massachusetts, Glavine spent four years at Northeastern and left as one of the most prolific hitters in the Huskies' history. He made a big splash during his freshman season, batting .307 and pounding 19 extra-base hits, including a school record, nine triples. Glavine graduated having hit 28 career home runs and accumulated 110 career RBIs, ranking him third and ninth at the time, respectively, in the school's record book. The left-handed slugger also walked 120 times during his four seasons at NU, ranking him second all-time upon completing his final collegiate campaign.

After graduating from Northeastern, Glavine spent 10 seasons in professional baseball after being drafted by the Cleveland Indians during 1995, alternating between the Double A and Triple A levels. During September 2003, the New York Mets called Glavine up to the major leagues, where he played with his older brother, Tom. He notched his one and only major league hit during his final game with the Mets on Sept. 28, 2003, recording a single off Florida Marlins closer Braden Looper. Glavine became the third Northeastern alumni to ever play in the major leagues, joining George Yankowski (1942, 1949) and Carlos Pena (2001-14).

Retiring from the pro ranks in 2004, Glavine now resides in Lexington, Massachusetts, with his wife, Carissa, their two daughters, Ava and Sophia, and their son, Luke.
