Last Time Out: The Golden Eagles are coming off a 2-1 weekend in Texas, going 1-1 against Dallas Baptist (L, 5-6; W, 8-6) and defeating Air Force, 6-3.

Makani Tanaka led the team over the three games, batting .429 with six hits in 14 at-bats, including five extra-base hits with three doubles, a triple and a homer, while drawing both a walk and an intentional walk. Cooper Combs also recorded six hits at Horner Ballpark, batting .400 over the weekend with five RBI.

Starters Nathan Love and Conner Johnson each picked up a win in Dallas, while Weston Rouse was awarded the save in the second game against DBU. Rouse closed for the Golden Eagles, throwing 3.2 innings while allowing no runs on two hits and striking out four.

Inside the Series: In a series dating back to 1970, Tuesday's game will mark the 114th meeting between ORU and the Razorbacks. The 2026 season marks the third consecutive year the teams have met after a four-year break following their 2019 matchup.

Scouting the Opponent: Arkansas is currently 9-3 on the season and has been consistently ranked as a top-10 team this week, coming in at No. 6 by D1Baseball, No. 8 by the NCBWA and No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

This past weekend, Arkansas took a series against UT Arlington, falling 4-3 in the opener before defeating the Mavericks, 9-0 and 11-1 (7 inn.).

Junior infielder Camden Kozeal currently leads the Hogs and ranks 11th in the nation in home runs with six on the season. Not far behind him is Ryder Helfrick with five homers. Kozeal's 16 RBI are good for 11th in the SEC, while his .905 slugging percentage ranks seventh.

Kozeal slashed .375/.444/.813 last week, starting all four games for the Razorbacks. He scored four runs with six hits, including a double and two home runs, driving in seven RBI.

James DeCremer is set to start on the mound for Arkansas, making his third appearance and second start of the season. DeCremer, a transfer from Oregon State, made his debut with the Hogs in a 6-5 win against Texas Tech, throwing two relief innings while allowing no runs on one hit with a walk and one strikeout.

The right-handed redshirt sophomore made his first start last week against Arkansas State, throwing 3.2 innings while allowing no runs on one hit and striking out three.

Head coach Dave Van Horn has built a 1,313-643 career record, including a 952-475 mark in 24 seasons at Arkansas.

Leading Off with Tanaka:

As the Golden Eagles settle into the 2026 roster, senior outfielder Makani Tanaka has found himself at the top of the lineup for ORU, batting leadoff in the last five games after opening the season in the five-hole. Transferring from Saddleback College ahead of the 2025 season, Tanaka has cemented himself in the ORU batting order and leads the team with a .519 on-base percentage.

Last week, Tanaka led the team over four games, batting .412 with seven hits in 17 at-bats, including three multi-hit performances. Tanaka had five extra-base hits across the four games- three doubles, a triple and a 402-foot home run to left-center that gave the Golden Eagles the advantage over Air Force.

Player of the Week:

Senior outfielder Cooper Combs was named the first Kwik Star Summit League Peak Hitter of the Week on Tuesday, February 17.

Combs went 6-for-10 and hit safely in all three games of the season-opening series against Southern Illinois. The Fayetteville, Arkansas, native went 2-for-4 in the opener before finishing 1-for-3 with the game-tying run in game two.

1st Place = 1st Teamers:

ORU returns three Summit League First Team selections from 2025. Catcher Wailele Kane-Yates, right fielder Will Edmunson, and right-handed starter Easton Teel were each selected to the First Team for the first time in their careers.

Tulsa Tanks:

ORU relied on the long ball last season, leading the league with 70 home runs. Wailele Kane-Yates led the team and ranked second in the Summit League with 12 home runs, closely followed by Martell Davis with 10. Cooper Combs and Will Edmunson added nine each, while Owen Coil and Ethan Fielder finished with seven apiece.

Crown the King:

Head Coach Ryan Folmar surpassed legendary coach Larry Cochell for first on the ORU Baseball program's wins list with the Golden Eagles' walk-off win on against Northern Colorado on Sunday, May 11. The win marked number 429 for Folmar as the head man at ORU with a College World Series appearance in 2023, one of two appearances in program history. In addition, Coach Folmar was awarded the 2025 Summit League Coach of the Year award.

Journey Back to the Summit:

Oral Roberts has won three of the last four Summit League Tournaments, earning NCAA Tournament berths during that span, including a 2023 College World Series appearance.

ORU's longest championship streak includes 15 straight tournament titles from 1998 to 2012, spanning the Mid-Continent Conference and the Summit League.

League Award Winners:

RHP Easton Teel earned the 2025 Summit League Newcomer of the Year Award for his performance on the mound. His 2.95 ERA led the conference and ranked No. 36 nationally.

The freshman also led the league in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.60), wins (7), WHIP (1.09), and walks allowed per nine innings (1.64).

Non-Conference Slate: ORU opens the season at Chapman Park with a three-game series against Southern Illinois (Feb. 13-15), followed by a midweek matchup against Missouri State (Feb. 17).

Following the opening weekend, ORU travels to Abilene Christian for a weekend series (Feb. 20-22) before facing Missouri State on the road (Feb. 24). The Golden Eagles will then return to Texas to face Dallas Baptist (Feb. 26 & 28), with a neutral-site contest against Air Force in Dallas (Feb. 27).

ORU continues non-league road play with trips to Arkansas (Mar. 3), Central Arkansas (Mar. 10), and Arkansas Little Rock (Mar. 17-18), before taking on Air Force again in a neutral-site game in Enid, Oklahoma (Mar. 25).

The Golden Eagles return home to host Arkansas State for a three-game series (Mar. 6-8).

This season's home midweeks also feature Power Four opponents Oklahoma (Mar. 31), Cincinnati (May 5), and Oklahoma State (May 12).

ORU will also face Oklahoma State (Apr. 7) and Oklahoma (Apr. 21) on the road before closing out the non-conference slate with a neutral-site matchup against OSU at ONEOK Field on April 28.

Ryan Folmar enters his 14th season as head coach of the Golden Eagles. At ORU, he has posted a career record of 435-278-1 and is a seven-time Summit League Coach of the Year (2015, '16, '17, '18, '21, '23, '25). Prior to being tabbed head coach in 2013, Folmar served on the ORU coaching staff as an assistant for nine seasons.

During his tenure, Folmar has guided the Golden Eagles to seven Summit League regular season and tournament championships, seven NCAA Regional appearances, one NCAA Super Regional appearance and one NCAA College World Series appearance. As head coach, Folmar has overseen the development of five Summit League Players of the Year, seven Newcomers of the Year, eight Pitchers of the Year, nine All-Americans, 31 MLB Draft picks and more than 100 all-conference selections.

In his 13th season as head coach, Folmar led the Golden Eagles to a 37-22 overall record and a co-regular season title with a 21-9 mark in Summit League play. ORU had eight all-conference honorees, highlighted by Folmar's seventh Coach of the Year award and Newcomer of the Year Easton Teel.

Teel ended the 2025 season with a league-best seven wins and a 2.95 ERA while holding opponents to a .240 batting average. On the mound, the Golden Eagles led the league in ERA (4.91), hits allowed per nine innings (9.65), shutouts (3), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.13), WHIP (1.46) and walks allowed per nine innings (3.48).

At the plate, ORU led the Summit League with a .282 batting average and also topped the league in doubles (99), hits (575), home runs (70), runs (361) and slugging percentage (.437). Cooper Combs' 18 doubles were a league best, while Will Edmunson ranked second with eight triples.

In 2024, Folmar led the Golden Eagles to a 27-32-1 record, including a 13-15-1 mark in league play. ORU entered the Summit League Championship as the No. 4 seed and battled back to win the tournament title and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament, competing in the Normal Regional.

The Golden Eagles finished the season leading the league in numerous statistical categories, including walks (291), double plays (36), doubles (95), ERA (5.72), hits (554), runs (380), stolen bases (62), WHIP (1.47) and walks allowed per nine innings (4.17). Individually, Jakob Hall led the league and ranked in the top 25 nationally in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.24), strikeouts (110), wins (10), WHIP (1.13) and walks allowed per nine innings (1.77). Holden Breeze led the league in batting average (.345) and hits (79), while Elijah Rodriguez's 17 stolen bases were a Summit League best.

ORU had six All-Summit League selections in 2024, including Pitcher of the Year Jakob Hall. Two players- Hall and Brooks Fowler- were selected in the 2024 MLB Draft.

In his 11th season at the helm in 2023, Folmar led the Golden Eagles to a 52-14 record and their first College World Series appearance since 1978. The 52 victories set a new DI-era program record and marked the first 50-win season since 2004. Over their final 48 games, ORU went 42-6 and set a DI-era program record with 21 consecutive wins from April 23 to June 4. The Golden Eagles also went a perfect 6-0 against midweek foes Oklahoma State and Wichita State, marking the first time they

accomplished the feat since 2006.

Folmar, who was named the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Mike Martin National Coach of the Year, guided ORU to its 20th Summit League regular season title, 21st Summit League Tournament Championship, 30th NCAA Regional appearance and a No. 5 national ranking by Collegiate Baseball, matching the highest in program history. The ORU skipper coached a league-best 13 All-League members, including Player/Newcomer of the Year Jonah Cox, Pitcher of the Year Cade Denton and Defensive Player of the Year Mac McCroskey.

Under Folmar's tutelage, ORU had three players named All-Americans (Cox, Denton and Matt Hogan) for the first time since 1999. Denton, who was named the NCBWA Stopper of the Year, became only the third player in program history to earn All-America honors in back-to-back seasons. Cox and Denton also became the first Golden Eagles since Mark Serrano in 2009 to earn multiple All-America honors in a single season.

In the 2023 MLB Draft, ORU had four players selected: Cox, Denton, Jacob Widener and McCroskey. Three of the four were taken inside the top 10 rounds, the most since 1981.

ORU led the league in 23 statistical categories while ranking in the top 10 nationally in fielding percentage (1st), winning percentage (2nd), hits (2nd), batting average (7th), ERA (7th), WHIP (7th) and runs (9th). The Golden Eagles finished the season as the only team in the country ranked inside the top 10 in batting average, ERA and fielding percentage. Under Folmar's development, Cox- a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy- led the nation in hits and set both the program and Summit League single-season record with 114.

Against ranked opponents in 2023, Folmar guided ORU to a 7-3 record. The Golden Eagles entered the Top 25 (Collegiate Baseball) for the first time since 2011 on May 1 and finished the season ranked in the Top 10 for the first time since 1983.
