- Following a bye week after playing eight straight games to open the season, Arkansas returns to Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium on Saturday, Nov. 5, for a 2:37 p.m. CT showdown against No. 10 Florida on CBS.
- The University of Arkansas will host SEC Nation, the SEC Network's traveling college football pregame show. It marks the third straight year SEC Nation has made its way to Fayetteville. Hosted by Maria Taylor, who is joined by analysts Tim Tebow, Marcus Spears and Paul Finebaum along with reporter Laura Rutledge, SEC Nation will be live from 9-11 a.m. CT on the lawn at Old Main.
- Florida will make its fourth trip in program history to Fayetteville and first since 2008. The Gators have been ranked in eight of the 10 previous all-time meetings against Arkansas.
- Saturday's contest will be the first meeting between the two schools since 2013. Florida owns a 9-1 advantage in the all-time series. Arkansas won the inaugural meeting 28-24 in 1982.



Behind seven multi-passing touchdown games, QB AUSTIN ALLEN is tied for the SEC lead with 18 passing touchdowns.

► FIVE KEY STORYLINES

- With 11 wins over its last 15 games dating back to last season, Arkansas will look to open the month of November with a win over a ranked team for the second consecutive season. The Razorbacks' 11 wins over their last 15 contests are the second-most in the SEC during that span. Arkansas is also 6-2 in the month of November over the past two seasons.
- Coming off a loss at No. 21 Auburn, Arkansas looks to return to its winning ways when it hosts Florida. The Razorbacks defeated No. 12 Ole Miss 34-30 in their last game at home. Arkansas has won eight consecutive games following an SEC loss dating back to the 2014 season.
- Arkansas will face its sixth ranked opponent this season, including its fourth straight. Florida will be the Razorbacks' ninth ranked SEC opponent since the start of the 2015 season. Saturday's contest will also mark the 24th time **HEAD COACH BRET BIELEMA** has faced a ranked opponent in 47 career games at Arkansas.
- The Razorbacks' three losses this season have come to No. 10 Texas A&M, No. 1 Alabama and No. 21 Auburn. Each of those three teams are currently ranked in the top 11 of the Associated Press Top 25 and have combined to post a 21-3 record. Their opponents' three losses have come against current No. 1 Alabama, No. 7 Texas A&M and No. 3 Clemson.
- · QB AUSTIN ALLEN and RB RAWLEIGH WILLIAMS III have been one of the nation's top QB-RB tandems this season. Allen is averaging 256.0 yards per game through the air, while Williams is averaging 100.9 on the ground. Allen and Williams are one of just four QB-RB duos in the Power 5 conferences averaging at least 250 yards passing and 100 yards rushing per game this season.

► PLAYER QUICK NOTES

QUARTERBACKS

- AUSTIN ALLEN is tied for the SEC lead in TD passes (18), thanks to seven multi-passing touchdown games.
- Leads the SEC and is T-5th in the FBS in red-zone TD passes (14).
- Has thrown for 200+ yards six times, including 371 vs. then-No. 10 Texas A&M and a career-high 400 vs. No. 1 Alabama.

RUNNING BACKS

- RAWLEIGH WILLIAMS III is the 48th Arkansas player since 1956 to amass 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Ranks 3rd in the SEC in runs for a first down or TD (38).
- T-2nd in the SEC in 100-yard rushing games (4) and T-3rd in 10-yard runs (22).
- DEVWAH WHALEY rushed for 135 yards and a TD in Arkansas' win over Alcorn State.
- Owns a 5.6 yards-per-carry average and 317 yards rushing on the season.
- Broke a 75-yard TD run against Alcorn State.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- DREW MORGAN leads the team and ranks 5th in the SEC in receptions (41).
- 5th Arkansas player since 1997 to record 40+ catches through the first eight games of a season.
- Has a reception in 22 straight games dating back to 2014.
- KEON HATCHER extended his streak to 26 consecutive games with a reception for a first down dating back to 2013.
- Had a streak of four straight games with a receiving TD and is tied for sixth in the SEC (5).
- Had two first-down receptions, including one on 4th down, during Arkansas' game-winning 4th quarter drive vs. Ole Miss.
- JARED CORNELIUS 16 of last 17 touches on offense have either resulted in a first down or a TD.
- Prior to Ole Miss, he became just the third player in program history with 100 yards receiving in three straight games.
- Ranks 3rd in the SEC in yards per catch (19.4), 9th in yards (465) and T-3rd in 25-yard catches (7).
- DOMINIQUE REED scored his first TD of the season against No. 12 Ole Miss on a 51-yard pass play.
- Scored a TD in six straight games in 2015, including all four SEC road games.
- Three of his eight receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards.

TIGHT ENDS

- JEREMY SPRINKLE has eight TD catches in his last 11 games dating back to 2015.
- Ranks 2nd in the SEC and T-6th nationally among tight ends with four TD grabs this season.
- Surpassed D.J. Williams for the program record for career receiving TDs by a tight end (11).

OFFENSIVE LINE

- DAN SKIPPER made his 42nd consecutive start on the offensive line at No. 21 Auburn.
- Blocked his seventh career kick, second of the season, against Alcorn State.
- Helped pave the way for the Razorbacks to rush for 200 yards against No. 12 Ole Miss.
- FRANK RAGNOW made his 21st consecutive start on the offensive line against No. 21 Auburn.
- Moved back to center against No. 10 Texas A&M after starting at right guard in the Texas State game.
- Gave Austin Allen a key push at the goal line on his 5-yard game-winning TD run in the second overtime at No. 15 TCU.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- DEATRICH WISE JR. has 10.0 sacks in his last 13 games.
- Cracked Arkansas' top 10 career list in sacks (16.0) and ranks 6th among SEC active career sack leaders.
- Leads the Razorbacks in tackles for loss this season (4.5).
- JEREMIAH LEDBETTER has logged at least a half-sack in six of his last 12 games, including four this season.
- Ranks 6th on the team in tackles (31).
- His 3.5 sacks this season lead the team and are tied for 18th in the SEC.
- TAIWAN JOHNSON has started 34 straight games.
- Has made at least 0.5 tackles for loss in six of his last 10 games, totaling 4.5 during that stretch.
- Has 16.0 career tackles for loss, good for 3rd among active Arkansas players.

- Arkansas' active career leader in interceptions.
- Eclipsed the 100-career tackle mark with four against No. 12 Ole Miss.

SPECIALISTS

- TOBY BAKER ranks 7th nationally and second in the SEC with a 45.6 average.
- Has 16 punts of 50+ yards and has placed 11 inside the 20-yard line.
- Matched career-highs in punts (10) and yards (415) at No. 21 Auburn.
- ADAM MCFAIN booted through a career-high 54-yard FG at No. 21 Auburn.
- 1st 50-yard FG by an Arkansas kicker since Zach Hocker (54 yards) in 2013 and tied for the 8th-longest in school history.
- Also tied for the 4th-longest this season in the FBS and 2nd-longest in the SEC.

► A RAZORBACK WIN WOULD

- Make Arkansas bowl eligible for the third straight season.
- Give Arkansas its 12th win in its last 16 games dating back to 2015.
- Improve Coach Bielema's record to 24-23 at Arkansas and 92-47 all-time as a head coach.
- Give Arkansas its fifth win over a ranked team in the last eight opportunities, including three of six this season.
- Be Arkansas' second ever victory over Florida and its first in Fayetteville.

► WHAT TO WATCH FOR

THE RAZORBACKS

- Have scored 40 or more points in eight of their last 15 games.
- Have produced 400 or more yards of total offense in six of eight games this season.

QB AUSTIN ALLEN

- Has thrown for multiple touchdown passes in seven of eight games this season.
- Looks to become one of four Arkansas QBs to record multiple 400-yard passing games in his career.
- Looks to become one of three QBs in school history to have multiple 400-yard games in the same season.

LB BROOKS ELLIS

- Is one double-digit tackle game away from recording eight in his career (Last: Martrell Spaight, 2013-14).
- Is 36 tackles shy of 300 for his career, which would rank 16th all-time in school history.
- Looks to extend his streak of four-plus tackles to nine straight games and make it 17 of the last 18.

WR KEON HATCHER

- Is 11 yards shy of tying Hunter Henry for 16th all-time in school history in receiving yards.
- Is tied with teammate Drew Morgan for 15th all-time in school history with 114 career receptions.

- A win would give **HEAD COACH BRET BIELEMA** his 12th victory in the last 16 games. The Razorbacks won 12 of Bielema's first 31 games at Arkansas.
- Seven of Arkansas' last nine SEC games have been against ranked opponents, including all five this season. Florida marks the 23rd ranked SEC opponent Arkansas has faced in the last four seasons out of a possible 29. Out of those 23 ranked SEC opponents, 10 have been in the top 10.
- It is the third time in four seasons under Bielema that Arkansas has played four straight ranked opponents.

► ELLIS A FINALIST FOR "ACADEMIC HEISMAN"

• Senior LB BROOKS ELLIS was named a NFF National Scholar-Athlete and one of 12 finalists for the 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy. Considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman," the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. Ellis and the 11 other finalists will each receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship. Selected from a nationwide pool of 156 exceptional semifinalists among all NCAA divisions and the NAIA, Ellis is the only student-athlete in the SEC to be selected as an NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

► AGAINST THE BEST

• Saturday's game marks Arkansas' seventh of nine contests against opponents who played in a bowl game last season. The Razorbacks currently have the seventh-toughest remaining schedule in college football per ESPN.com's College Football Power Index.

► TIME OF POSSESSION

- Arkansas leads the SEC and ranks third nationally in time of possession per game (35:18.63). The Razorbacks have led the SEC in time of possession each of the last two seasons. **HEAD COACH BRET BIELEMA** is 69-27 all-time when his team wins the time of possession battle. Arkansas has possessed the ball longer than its opponent in 17 of its last 22 contests. The Razorbacks are averaging an 11-minute, 15-second advantage in possession time against its opponents this season.

- His 2.6:1 TD-INT ratio ranks second among SEC QBs with double-digit TD passes.
- His 319.3 passing yards per game against current AP Top 25 opponents ranks second in the SEC and seventh in the FBS.
- His 296.8 yards per game against SEC opponents ranks second in the SEC.
- Has thrown for 958 yards and five TDs against current AP Top 25 opponents to rank third and tied for ninth in the FBS.
- Ranks second in the SEC and tied for 21st in the FBS with 89 completions of 10+ yards.
- Ranks second in the SEC and tied for 17th in the FBS with 55 completions of 15+ yards.
- Ranks second in the SEC and tied for 28th in the FBS with 93 completions for a first down.
- Tied for third in the SEC in TD passes against conference opponents (8).

► MULTIPLE TD PASSES

- Is one of seven Power 5 QBs with seven or more multi-TD pass games this season.

► AMONG THE ARKANSAS GREATS

- Is the fourth QB in school history to pass for 400 yards in a single game.
- Became the first QB in school history to throw 18 TD passes in the first seven games of a season.
- Is one of three QBs in school history to throw 18 TD passes in the first eight games of a season.
- Became the first QB to throw three TD passes in three straight games (Weeks 5-7) since Ryan Mallett in 2010.
- His 2,048 passing yards are the fifth-most in school history through the first eight games of a season.
- Became one of just four QBs in Arkansas history to throw at least one TD pass in each of the first seven games of a season.
- Threw 146 straight passes without an interception, surpassing Ryan Mallett for second in school history.

▶ IN THE RED ZONE

- Has completed 55.0 percent of his passes (22 of 40) for 202 yards and 14 TD inside the red zone.
- Leads the SEC and is tied for fifth in the FBS with 14 red-zone TD passes.
- Ranks second in the FBS in percentage of red zone pass attempts for a TD at 35 percent (min. 40 red zone passing attempts).

► MORE NOTABLES

- Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award candidate.
- Has helped the team surpass 400 yards of total offense in six games.
- Is one of 13 Power 5 QBs to throw three or more TD passes in a game at least four times this season.
- Is one of five QBs since 2007 to throw for 400+ yards against Alabama.
- Other QBs were Chad Kelly (UM, 2016), Deshaun Watson (CU, 2016), Nick Marshall (AU, 2014), Johnny Manziel (TAMU, 2013).
- Led the Razorbacks to a 34-30 win over No. 12 Ole Miss.
- Went 19-of-32 passing for 229 yards and three TDs against a Rebel defense that had allowed only two passing TDs.
- · His 400 passing yards against No. 1 Alabama are the most by an Arkansas QB in school history against the Crimson Tide.
- Ranks third in the SEC with a 137.5 fourth-quarter passer rating among QBs with 30 or more fourth-quarter attempts.
- Has orchestrated three fourth-quarter TD drives to either tie or take the lead this season.
- Went 13-of-15 passing for 144 yards with two TDs on those fourth-quarter drives.
- His 96 second-half QBR at No. 15 TCU was the best second-half against the Horned Frogs in 10 years.

▶ THE ENOS EFFECT

• In 2015, **DAN ENOS'** first season at the helm of the offense, Arkansas threw for 3,000 yards and rushed for 2,000 yards for the first time in the same season. The Razorbacks totaled 467 points last season, which were the most in a single season since 2011 (478), while 305 first downs were a school record. Additionally, Arkansas led the SEC with 34.4 points per conference game. Arkansas averaged 46.3 points over the last seven games of the season, nearly 10 points more than any other SEC program over its final seven contests. The Razorbacks also scored 50+ points four times over the final six regular season games, breaking the previous program single-season record of three set in 1910, 1916 and 2007.

► RACKING UP POINTS

• Since 2015, Arkansas has scored 30 or more points 12 times (10-2 in those games), ranking third in the SEC during that span, and has scored 40 or more points nine times (8-1 in those games), tying for the SEC lead with Ole Miss during that span.

► PASS HOGS PASS

• With **DAN ENOS** at the helm of the offense, Arkansas has scored a passing TD in 18 games, which is tied with Alabama for fourth in the SEC. The Razorbacks have also thrown for 200 or more yards 15 times since Enos' arrival, going 10-5 in those contests.

▶ OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION IN 2016

• Through eight games in 2016, Arkansas has put together 3,334 yards of total offense, including 400 or more yards in six games, produced 247 total points, and topped the 30-point plateau five times.

▶ POUND HOGS POUND

- Arkansas is 105-60 since 2000 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game.
 The Razorbacks have also rushed for a TD in 119 games during that span, going 82-37 in those contests.
- Arkansas has scored a rushing touchdown in 39 of 46 games under Bielema (2013-pres.) which ranks third in the SEC during that span. The Razorbacks have also logged 100 or more yards in 39 games since 2013, ranking fourth in the SEC. Of those 39 games, 22 of them have been at home, resulting in a 15-7 record. Under Bielema, Arkansas is 22-17 when a Razorback hits the century mark.
- Arkansas has rushed for 200 or more yards in 22 games since 2013, ranking sixth in the conference and posting a 15-7 record in those games.

MOVING THE CHAINS

• Arkansas ranks fifth in the SEC with 185 first downs this season and have converted more first downs than its opponent in six of its eight games. One of the keys to Arkansas' success on offense is its ability to produce plays that result in 10 or more yards from the line of scrimmage. The Razorbacks have manufactured 131 plays that gained at least 10 yards this season, which also ranks fifth in the league. Last season the Razorbacks were able to rip off 209 plays of 10 or more yards, which ranked fourth in the SEC.

▶ GOING FOR TWO

• Since the hiring of **OC DAN ENOS**, Arkansas has been successful on five of its six two-point conversion attempts over the last two years.

▶ J-RED LEADING THE WAY

• Junior **WR JARED CORNELIUS** has been a menace to opposing defenses this season. Cornelius has totaled a team-best 465 yards receiving on 24 receptions, despite missing the Texas State game with a sore back. The 465 yards rank ninth in the SEC, while his 19.4 yards-per-reception average ranks third in the conference and ranks 19th nationally.

► ZERO TO 100

- Prior to 2016, **JARED CORNELIUS** had never totaled 100 or more yards receiving in a single game. After logging 100+ yards through the air in Weeks 4, 5 and 6, Cornelius matched a 20-year old school record of three straight 100-yard receiving games. The Razorbacks' top wide receiver totaled a career-high 146 yards on five receptions against No. 1 Alabama in Week 6 to join former Razorbacks Anthony Lucas (1996) and Mike Reppond (1971) as the only three players in school history to accomplish that feat. He followed up that performance with three catches for 40 yards and lifted the Razorbacks to a 34-30 victory over No. 12 Ole Miss with a 6-yard TD run late in the fourth quarter.
- His three games over the century mark through the air are tied for the SEC lead, and he is one of four SEC receivers with two 100-yard receiving efforts in conference play.

► MR. OCTOBER

• With 14 catches for 309 yards and two TDs in Weeks 5-8, no SEC receiver was more productive in the month of October than Cornelius as his 309 yards receiving were tops in the conference during that span.

► A BIG-PLAY PASS-CATCHER

- **JARED CORNELIUS** has a reception in 23 of 29 career games played, including multiple receptions in 20 games. An impressive 20 of his 24 receptions this season have produced a first down or TD. Even more impressive, he has moved the chains on each 14 of his last 15 grabs.
- Cornelius is tied for third in the SEC in catches of 15+ yards (14), ranks second in 20+ yard receptions (11), tied for third in 25+ yard grabs (7) and is tied for fifth in 30+ yard catches (5). His 20+ yard grab against No. 12 Ole Miss pushed his career total to 19, including 17 over the past two seasons.

FINDING THE END ZONE

• Not only has **JARED CORNELIUS** been able to rack up yards, but he's found the end zone four times through the air, as well as once on the ground during the process in 2016. Two of his scoring grabs this season came in Week 5 against Alcorn State. It was the second multi-TD performance of his career. Dating back to 2015, Cornelius has scored a TD in eight of his last 12 contests with six through the air and three on the ground.

► MORGAN A RELIABLE TARGET

• WR DREW MORGAN has paced the Razorbacks in receptions five times this season, continuing to show why he has been one of the Razorbacks' most reliable targets over the last two years. Morgan hauled in four passes for 42 yards in Week 8, improving his season totals to a team-best 41 receptions for 420 yards. Only five Arkansas players since 1997 have recorded 40 or more receptions through the first eight games of a season.

• Morgan's 41 receptions rank fifth in the SEC, while his 25 catches for a first down rank third. He joins Texas A&M's Christian Kirk and Mississippi State's Fred Ross as the only three receivers in the SEC to record three or more receptions in eight games this season.



► HATCHER SHINING IN SENIOR CAMPAIGN

- With 28 receptions for 435 yards and five TDs through seven games played this season, **WR KEON HATCHER** is off to one of the best starts of his career, despite missing the Alcorn State game with a sore hamstring.
- 19 of Hatcher's 28 catches have resulted in a first down, while 13 have produced 15+ yards, which ties for sixth in the SEC. Hatcher's 435 yards receiving rank 14th in the SEC, while his five TDs are tied for sixth. He also has 16 catches for 311 yards and three TDs in the first half of games this season. The 311 first-half yards rank fifth in the SEC. Hatcher eclipsed 1,500 career receiving yards (1,558) in Week 8 when he hauled in seven passes for 81 yards.

► SPRINKLE SETS TIGHT END TD RECORD

- A John Mackey Award candidate, **TE JEREMY SPRINKLE** made three receptions for 37 yards and a TD against No. 1 Alabama, surpassing 2010 John Mackey Award winner D.J. Williams to become Arkansas' all-time leader in TD receptions by a tight end with 11.
- A preseason All-SEC choice by the league's media and coaches, Sprinkle has caught 20 passes for 215 yards and four TDs this season. Among tight ends, his four TD catches rank second in the SEC and tie for sixth in the FBS. He has reeled in a TD pass in four of Arkansas' eight games this season and has totaled eight through his last 11 games dating back to 2015.
- For his career, Sprinkle has caught 58 passes for 756 yards and 11 TDs. Of Sprinkles 58 receptions, 39 have resulted in either a first down or a TD for a conversion rate of 67.2 percent. His 11 career receiving TDs are the second-most among active SEC tight ends.

► RUN RAWLEIGH RUN

• RAWLEIGH WILLIAMS III ranks fourth in the SEC with 807 yards rushing this season. He is tied for second in the conference with four games of 100 or more yards on the ground, helping Arkansas to a 4-0 record in those contests. His careerhigh 180 yards rushing against No. 12 Ole Miss were the most by a Razorback in an SEC game since Knile Davis in 2010.

► APPROACHING 1,000

- With 807 rushing yards through eight games and with four games ahead of him, **RAWLEIGH WILLIAMS III** is on pace to become the 13th player in Arkansas history to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a season.

► MULTIPLE 100-YARD RUSHERS

- For the 39th time in school history, the Razorbacks produced multiple 100-yard rushers in the same game as freshman **RB DEVWAH WHALEY** (135) and sophomore **RB RAWLEIGH WILLIAMS III** (126) both topped the century mark on the ground against Alcorn State in Week 5. It marked Whaley's first 100-yard effort of his career and the fourth ever for Williams.
- Arkansas totaled 353 yards on the ground en route to a convincing 52-10 win over Alcorn State for the program's 150th victory at War Memorial Stadium. It was Arkansas' highest rushing total in two years (438 at Texas Tech on Sept. 13, 2014). The Razorbacks averaged 9.3 yards/rush, the eight-best average in a game in program history.

► TRIPLE-DIGIT TRIO

• Not only did Whaley and Williams eclipse the 100-yard mark, but **WR JARED CORNELIUS** hauled in four passes for 106 yards and two TDs in Week 5. It marked the eighth time in school history that Arkansas has produced multiple 100-yard rushers and one 100-yard receiver in the same game, and it was the first time since the Razorbacks win at Tennessee on Oct. 3, 2015. Prior to last season, the last time Arkansas had multiple players top the 100-yard rushing barrier and one player reel in 100-yards through the air in the same game was on Sept. 18, 2004 - Rushing: DeCori Birmingham (127), DeArrius Howard (109); Receiving: Steven Harris (133).

► WHALEY BREAKS FREE

• RB DEVWAH WHALEY broke through to the end zone on a 75-yard run against Alcorn State in Week 5. The 75-yard TD run was the longest scoring rush by a freshman running back in school history since Felix Jones scored from 80-yards out against Missouri State on Sept. 3, 2005. It is Arkansas' longest play of the season and its longest run from scrimmage since Alex Collins' 80-yard touchdown run at No. 9 LSU on Nov. 14, 2015. The 135 yards were the most by an Arkansas freshman since Collins' 172 in 2013 against Samford.

MCFAIN SHOWS RANGE

- K ADAM MCFAIN converted a 54-yard field goal attempt at No. 21 Auburn. The 54-yard field goal is tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since Zach Hocker's 54-yard field goal at Mississippi State on Nov. 23, 2013.
- The field goal is also tied for the fourth-longest this season in the FBS and secondlongest in the SEC. Since taking over place-kicking duties for the Razorbacks against No. 1 Alabama, McFain is 4-for-4 on field goal attempts and 7-for-7 on extra point attempts.

► SKIPPER'S BLOCK PARTY

- **OL DAN SKIPPER** added another blocked kick to his resume when he got his hand on a 41-yard attempt in the fourth quarter against Alcorn State in Week 5 and is now two blocked kicks away from tying the FBS record for career blocked kicks.
- Earlier this season, Skipper used his 6-10, 319-pound frame to block No. 15 TCU's 28-yard field goal try with 10 seconds remaining, sending the game into OT on Sept. 10. It was the first by an FBS team in the fourth quarter of a tie game against a ranked opponent since Georgia Tech in 2015 against Florida State.

► AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE BEST

- A Texas native, **DEATRICH WISE JR.** has recorded 11 of his 16.0 career sacks against SEC opponents. including at least a half-sack in six of the last 13 conference games he's played in.
- Wise tallied 31 tackles including 10.5 for loss and eight sacks in 13 games played last season. All eight of his sacks came during SEC play, which led the league in that category.

► LEDBETTER MAKING PRESENCE KNOWN

- DL JEREMIAH LEDBETTER has recorded 31 total tackles, including 4.0 for loss, 3.5 sacks, two pass breakups, and one forced fumble through eight games in 2016.
- Ledbetter's 31 tackles rank sixth on the team, while his 3.5 sacks are a team high and tied for 18th in the SEC. He registered a career-high 1.5 sacks against Texas State in Week 3 and has recorded at least a half-sack in six of the last 12 games dating back to last season, including four of eight in 2016.

► NO FLY ZONE

- DB RYAN PULLEY has looked the part of one of the nation's top DBs this season. Through eight games, the sophomore from Fort Myers, Florida, is tied for 11th in the FBS in passes defended (11) and tied for seventh in pass breakups (10). The 10 pass breakups lead the SEC, while the 11 passes defended rank second. He is one of 11 players in the FBS with 10 pass breakups and at least one interception this season.
- Pulley's 10 pass breakups are just three shy of **DB JARED COLLINS'** SEC-tying best 13 in 2014.
- His second career interception came in the second quarter against Texas State when he jumped a route in the flats, then picked off the pass and returned it 25 yards to the end zone.

► ELLIS CHASING 300

- A Campbell Trophy finalist, Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist, **LB BROOKS ELLIS** is 36 tackles away from becoming the 16th Razorback in history to total 300 in a career. Ellis currently has a team-best 57 total tackles this season.
- For the seventh time in his career, Ellis tallied double-digit tackles as he registered a team-best 13, a career-best 3.0 tackles for loss and an interception returned for a TD at No. 15 TCU in Week 2. The 13 tackles were the most by Ellis since registering 15 against Mississippi State on Nov. 21, 2015. Ellis' 3.0 tackles for loss against TCU were the most by a Razorback since **DB JARED COLLINS** had 3.0 against UAB on Oct. 25, 2014. It was his fourth career interception and was the first interception return for a TD by a Razorback since former **DB ROHAN GAINES** (100 yards) against Ole Miss on Nov. 22, 2014.

► ELLIS-GREENLAW TACKLING DUO

- Prior to **DREW GREENLAW** missing the last two games due to a foot injury, the linebacker duo of **BROOKS ELLIS** and Greenlaw had combined for 276 tackles (130 solo), 17.0 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, eight QB hurries, three interceptions, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries through the last 19 games dating back to 2015.
- Ellis or Greenlaw has paced the Razorbacks in tackles in 15 of the last 18 contests, dating back to last season (Ellis: 8, Greenlaw: 7). Ellis has paced the team in tackles four times this season.

► 28-POINT MARK UNDER ROBB SMITH

 Arkansas has held its opponent to 28 points or less in 22 of 34 games played under defensive coordinator ROBB SMITH. The Razorbacks are 16-6 when allowing 28 points or less since Smith joined the program prior to the 2014 season.

▶ PICKING 'EM OFF

- Arkansas has picked off seven passes through the first eight games this season, which is currently tied for the eighth-most in the SEC and tied for 58th in the nation. However, the Hogs have done more than just make the interception as three of those picks have been returned for TDs.
- The three interception returns for a touchdown is currently tied for the fourth-most in the FBS and trails only Ohio State, Central Michigan, and Alabama.
- Arkansas tied the school season record for interception returns for a touchdown (3) when **HENRE' TOLIVER** took one back 70 yards against Alcorn State. **RYAN PULLEY** and **BROOKS ELLIS** each have an interception return for a TD also.

▶ GETTING BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE

- Nine different Razorbacks have recorded at least 2.0 tackles for loss this season, led by **DEATRICH WISE**, who has 4.5. Of those nine, seven have 2.5 or more, which ties for eighth-most in the SEC.
- Against Alcorn State in Week 5, the Hogs racked up 10.0 tackles for a loss, its highest total in a game this season and highest since totaling 11.0 against UTEP last season.
- Nine players had at least 0.5 tackles for loss against the Braves, which is the most since 2015 against UTEP (12 players).

▶ BRINGING 'EM DOWN

- As a team, Arkansas has totaled 511 tackles this season by 41 different players, the third largest number of players with at least one tackle this year in the SEC. Arkansas trails only Kentucky (42) and Ole Miss, which leads all SEC teams with 46 different players with at least one tackle.
- **BROOKS ELLIS** leads all Arkansas defensive players with 57 tackles, tied for 7th in the SEC. 26 of those stops have been solo as he is averaging 7.13 tackles per game.



The University of Arkansas captivated the college football world by naming Bret Bielema the 32nd head coach in Razorback history on December 2012. Since arriving in Fayetteville, Bielema, who enters his fourth season on The Hill, has in turn captivated the passionate Razorback fan base and the state with the culture he is creating and the standards he is holding the program to.

Throughout his head coaching career, Bielema has won three conference championships and coached 13 first-team All-Americans, numerous award winners, 39 NFL Draft picks and NFL superstars. Among the NFL players coached by Bielema are three-time Defensive Player of the Year J.J. Watt, Super Bowl winning quarterback Russell Wilson and No. 1 overall draft pick and eight-time Pro Bowler Joe Thomas.

Backed by his "Five Edges" to success, Bielema represented the qualities Arkansas was looking for: a leader of young men who holds student-athletes responsible both on and off the field and a coach who has a proven record of winning championships.

Bielema's recruitment philosophy of building a program on "uncommon" men have yielded record-setting results in the classroom. Arkansas posted a 2.94 team GPA in the spring of 2015, the highest recorded mark on record. Helping build the record-setting team GPA were 40 student-athletes on the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Fall Academic Honor Roll, good for the most in the conference. During Bielema's three seasons, Arkansas leads the SEC with 100 student-athletes on the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll, while the 40 honorees in 2015 is the most by one school since he joined the league.

In 2015, Arkansas' off the field success was accompanied by on the field results to the tune of winning six of its last seven games and finishing in a tie for third place in the SEC West with a 5-3 mark. The Razorbacks displayed the resolve of their head coach by bouncing back from a tough start to pick up three SEC road wins and two overtime victories in conference action. Arkansas' wins at Tennessee, Ole Miss and LSU marked the first time in program history that the Razorbacks won three road games against teams that finished in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll.

Arkansas' surge in late October through November set up a Liberty Bowl matchup with Kansas State and one of Bielema's mentors head coach Bill Snyder. For the second-straight year the Razorbacks capped the season with a win in front of a large contingent of Arkansas fans, defeating Kansas State 45-23. With the win, Bielema became the first coach in program history to win back-to-back bowl games while Arkansas is the only SEC West team to win a bowl game each of the last two years.

A key ingredient in Arkansas' success in 2015 was its balance and efficiency on offense. The Razorbacks led the SEC in scoring in conference games (34.4) while reaching 50+ points four times during the final six regular season games, breaking the previous program single-season record of three set in 1910, 1916 and 2007. Arkansas was the only school in the SEC and one of eight nationally to have both a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher during the regular season. Brandon Allen's 30 touchdowns through the air and Alex Collins' program record 20 scores on the ground made them the only duo in the nation to hit those statistical peaks.

Individual records and postseason accolades stacked up during and after the 2015 season, highlighted by junior tight end Hunter Henry winning the John Mackey Award. A consensus first-team All-American, Henry led all FBS tight ends with 739 yards receiving, as Arkansas became the first program to have two players win the John Mackey Award. Collins became just the third player in SEC history to start his career with three straight seasons of 1,000-yards rushing en route to earning All-America third team honors from Athlon. Paving the way for Collins was senior offensive lineman Sebastian Tretola, who was the co-recipient of the Jacobs Blocking trophy as the SEC's top blocker. Tretola was named a first-team All-American by Sports Illustrated and a second-team All-American by three other outlets.

Bielema is building Arkansas into a pro-style football program that prepares players for the NFL. He has had 39 draft picks in 10 seasons, good for the second-most among current head coaches with 10 years or less experience.

Since Bielema's arrival, a total of 14 Razorbacks have been selected in the NFL Draft which ranks as the fourth-most among SEC programs during that span. After having four defensive players chosen in the 2015 NFL Draft - the school's most since 1989 - Arkansas saw five offensive players find NFL homes during the 2016 draft. The five offensive players taken were the second-most from one school in the 2016 NFL Draft.

Henry was not only the first Razorback taken in the 2016 NFL Draft but also the first tight end selected when he went in the second round to the San Diego Chargers. Jonathan Williams (Buffalo Bills) and Collins (Seattle Seahawks) became just the second running back duo since Arkansas greats Darren McFadden and Felix Jones in 2008 to be picked in the top five rounds of the same NFL Draft when they both went in the fifth round. Less than 30 picks after Collins, both Tretola (Tennessee Titans) and Allen (Jacksonville Jaguars) came off the board in the sixth round to round out the program's most offensive players taken in the same draft since 2008.

Arkansas closed 2014 and its second season under Bielema by winning three of its final four games against traditional powers LSU, Ole Miss and Texas. The victories marked the first time in school history the Hogs have defeated those three teams in the same season. The Razorbacks finished 7-6 with a 31-7 victory over Texas in the AdvoCare V100 Texas Bowl, marking Arkansas' first winning season since 2011.

Bielema has always prided himself on a balanced offensive attack and that is exactly what the Razorbacks accomplished in 2014. Running backs Williams and Collins were the only FBS teammates to rush for more than 1,000 yards each and both players finished in the top five of the SEC in rushing totals.

Arkansas was the SEC's most improved defense in 2014, allowing just 19.2 points per game. With an 11.9 points per game improvement from the previous season, the Razorbacks had the seventh-most improved defense in the nation. Arkansas became the first unranked team in college football history to post back-to-back shutouts over ranked opponents after blanking No. 20 LSU and No. 8 Ole Miss. Senior linebacker and consensus first-team All-SEC selection Martrell Spaight was the first Razorback to ever lead the SEC with 128 total tackles.

In his first season at Arkansas (2013), the Razorbacks had five student-athletes named Freshmen All-Americans: Collins, offensive linemen Denver Kirkland and Dan Skipper, Henry and defensive tackle Darius Philon. Collins was named the SEC Freshman of the Year.

Bielema lettered from 1989-92 at lowa after joining the program as a walk-on. He earned a scholarship after his first year and was a member of lowa's 1990 Big Ten championship team. A starter as a junior in 1991, he was a team co-captain as a senior. Bielema signed a free agent contract with the Seattle Seahawks and later completed his playing career with the Milwaukee Mustangs of the Arena Football League.

A 1992 graduate of Iowa with a degree in marketing, Bielema married his wife, Jen, on March 10, 2012.
