



LSU TIGERS vs ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2018

POSTGAME NOTES: No. 7 LSU 24 , ARKANSAS 17

PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, cardinal jerseys and cardinal pants against LSU. It was the first time this season Arkansas has worn the combo.
- LSU won the coin toss and deferred to the second half. Arkansas received the ball to begin the game. LSU defended the northwest end zone. It was the fourth time this season & third-straight game an opponent has won the coin toss in Fayetteville & deferred.
- Arkansas' captains were seniors Hjalte Froholdt, Dre Greenlaw & Santos Ramirez and junior De'Jon Harris. The Razorbacks elected the quartet as team captains during Week 5 for the remainder of the season.
- Saturday was senior night. The Razorbacks honored 15 seniors during a pregame ceremony. The 15 seniors are: TE Austin Cantrell, WR Jared Cornelius (graduate), WR Gary Cross, OL Hjalte Froholdt, OL Johnny Gibson Jr., LB Dre Greenlaw, FB Kendrick Jackson, DB Ryder Lucas (graduate), TE Jeremy Patton, DB Santos Ramirez (graduate), DL Randy Ramsey, DB Kevin Richardson II (graduate), DL Michael Taylor II, OL Brian Wallace (graduate) and DL Armon Watts (graduate).
- Weather - 37 degrees, clear, SSW 5 mph

GENERAL NOTES

- Saturday marked the 64th meeting between the Razorbacks and the Tigers. LSU leads the all-time series, 40-22-2, with the first matchup coming in 1901.
- The game was the 27th-straight season Arkansas has played LSU, dating back to the Razorbacks' first season in the SEC in 1992.
- Arkansas is now 2-3 against the Tigers in games played in Fayetteville.
- The series is 15-8 in favor of LSU since the introduction of the Golden Boot, which was first awarded in 1996. Arkansas last won the trophy in 2015.
- The attendance for the game: 64,135 tickets distributed - 48,950 tickets scanned
- Today's starters: **Offense** - Ty Storey (QB), Colton Jackson (LT), Hjalte Froholdt (LG), Ty Clary (C), Johnny Gibson (RG), Brian Wallace (RT), Rakeem Boyd (RB), Deon Stewart (WR), Michael Woods (WR), Austin Cantrell (TE), Jared Cornelius (WR). **Defense** - McTelvin Agim (DE), Armon Watts (DT), T.J. Smith (DT), Randy Ramsey (DE), De'Jon Harris (MIKE), Dre Greenlaw (WILL), Kevin Richardson (NICK), Ryan Pulley (CB), Kamren Curl (SS), Santos Ramirez (FS), Jarques McClellion (CB).
- Hjalte Froholdt made his 35th consecutive start, the longest streak among current Razorbacks.
- Santos Ramirez, De'Jon Harris and T.J. Smith made their 22nd consecutive starts, tied for the most on the defensive side of the ball.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Cheyenne O'Grady recorded an 11-yard touchdown reception from Ty Storey with 12:37 remaining in the fourth quarter to move the score to 24-10.
- He would follow it up with a 32-yard TD catch from Storey with 5:27 left in the final frame to pull the game to 24-17.
- The two scores increased Arkansas' total to 17 touchdown receptions this season.
- Fourth game this season with 200 or more passing yards.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Third time this season the Razorbacks have held their opponent off the scoreboard on the opening drive of the game.
- Sixth game this year & fourth consecutive holding an opponent to seven or fewer points in the first quarter.
- Third-straight contest with no points allowed on the first drive of the second half.
- Arkansas recorded three sacks, tied for the eighth-most in a game under Morris.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Fifth time this season a field goal has been the first score of the game - 24-yarder by Connor Limpert as time expired in first half.

PLAYER NOTES

LB Dre Greenlaw

- Finished with 12 tackles that tied for a team lead - five solo.
- Recorded his 300th career tackle in the first quarter of Saturday's game.
- Returned a forced fumble 24-yards to set Arkansas' first points of the day.
- Recorded double-digit tackles in SEC play for the seventh time in his career.
- Posted his 14th-career double-digit tackle game of his career.

LB De'Jon Harris

- Finished tied for a team-lead with 12 tackles including two for a loss, and four solo.
- Recorded double-digit tackles for the 15th time in his career
- Recorded his 100th tackle of the season during Saturday's game.
- Back-to-back seasons with 100+ tackles.

DE McTelvin Agim

- Third consecutive game with at least 0.5 sacks.
- Forced a fumble in the second quarter, his third of the season and the 14th of the year for Arkansas.
- Finished with six tackles, one sack, 1.5 tackles for loss, and one forced fumble.

QB Ty Storey

- 19-of-38, 200 yards, 2 touchdowns, 1 interception
- Completed his 10th & 11th touchdown passes of the season.
- Fourth game thi season with 200 or more passing yards.

K Connor Limpert

- 1-for-1 FG - 24 yds
- FG at the end of the first half gave him 17 on the season - tied for seventh-most in a single season by a Razorback - Alex Tejada (2007), Todd Latourette (1998) & Todd Wright (1992).
- Has at least one made FG in each of the last 11 games.

TE Cheyenne O'Grady

- Team-high fifth & sixth touchdown receptions of the season - 11-yard catch with 12:37 remaining in the fourth quarter; 32-yard catch with 5:27 remainnig in the fourth quarter.
- Finished with six receptions for 75-yards and two touchdowns.
- Sixth-straight game with a reception.

SS Kamren Curl

- Entered the weekend ranked 34th in the SEC in total tackles (39).
- Recorded seven total tackles, five solo, and one pass breakup.

LG Hjalte Froholdt

- Made his 35th consecutive start, the longest streak among current Razorbacks.

WR Jordan Jones

- Third-straight game with a reception.

CB Jarques McClellion

- Finished with three solo tackles.

WR La'Michael Pettway

- Sixth-straight game with a reception.

CB Ryan Pulley

- Recorded a pass breakup in the first quarter, his sixth of the season and 21st of his career.
- Recorded four solo tackles, six total.

DL Michael Taylor II

- Recorded his first career sack, finished with two tackles - one solo.

DT Armon Watts

- Third-straight game with at least 0.5 sacks & seventh time this season.
- Needs one more sack to crack the top 10 for sacks in a season by a Razorback - (8) - Deatrich Wise Jr. (2015) & Henry Ford (1991).
