WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss and Arkansas will be meeting on the field for the 66th time in a series that dates back to 1908.
- Ole Miss records show the Rebels trailing the series 27-35-1 (two wins taken away due to NCAA ruling), while Arkansas' records indicate a 36-26-1 advantage for the Razorbacks ... Arkansas claims a forfeit victory in a 1914 game that Ole Miss won 13-7.
- Arkansas holds a 16-9 edge since it joined the SEC in 1992.
- Ole Miss is 96-17-5 (.835 winning pct.) in home openers after vacations ... When playing their home opener in Oxford, the Rebels are 73-10-4 (.862 winning pct.) ... Ole Miss has won each of its last seven home openers on the field.
- Ole Miss is 96-33-3 (.739 winning pct.) in September home games (including home contests played in Memphis and Jackson), including a 71-20-2 (.774 winning percentage) mark in Sept. games played in Oxford after vacated wins.
- Ole Miss is 31-49-3 all-time in SEC openers after vacations... This is the first time since 2014 that the Rebels haven't opened up SEC play vs. Alabama.
- Transfer LB **Lakia Henry** tallied a game-high seven tackles vs. Memphis in his Rebel debut.
- 15 Rebels made their Ole Miss debut Saturday vs. Memphis, including five that earned starting spots.
- Ole Miss ranks third in the SEC in tackles for loss after posting eight TFLs in their season opener vs. Memphis.
- Matt Luke** is in his 12th season at Ole Miss and third season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater full time prior to the 2018 campaign as the 38th head coach in program history.

2019 marks the 125th season of Ole Miss football since the program started in 1893. The Rebels didn't field a team in 1897 (yellow fever) & 1943 (World War II).

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss will host its weekly fall press conferences every Monday at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Matt Luke at approximately 11:30 a.m. Defensive coordinator Mike MacIntyre and offensive coordinator Rich Rodriguez will follow Coach Luke at the podium. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may watch live on SEC Network+ (on the ESPN app) or on the Ole Miss Athletics Facebook page.

PLAYER/ASSISTANT INTERVIEWS: Coordinators will take part in the Monday press conference. Select players and assistant coaches will be available after practice on Tuesday. Coach Luke and select players will be available after practice on Wednesday. All media interviews will be held in the team meeting room. There is no availability on Thursday or Friday.

PRACTICES: All practices are closed to the public and open to media for select periods on Tuesdays. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. On available days, media will be alerted which periods are available for video. Live video is prohibited, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and not formations. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Communications office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of practice footage, interviews and game highlights for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter. Day passes are also available online at www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must agree to the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) daily newspapers; 2) network affiliate television stations; 3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. For those of you who are not credentialed for all of the games you requested, we hold onto your request and will contact you if space becomes available on a game-by-game basis.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the round about. Those with garage parking passes should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with Tad Smith Coliseum passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passed marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers must show a photo I.D. to receive sideline vest. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested at least seven days prior to gameday to ensure delivery.

RECRUITS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect -- from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit. In addition, media may not be present during any recruiting contact and may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST ARKANSAS

Oct. 13, 2018 • Little Rock, Ark. • Ole Miss 37, Arkansas 33: Ole Miss fell behind 17 points in the first half on a rainy night in Little Rock, but the Rebels never gave in, storming back to take the lead with 42 seconds remaining on a Scottie Phillips touchdown run. Jordan Ta'amu threw for 387 yards and connected on two second-half touchdown passes to fuel the comeback. The Rebel QB added 141 on the ground, giving him the second-most yards of total offense (528) in program history behind Archie Manning.

Oct. 28, 2017 • Oxford, Miss. • Arkansas 38, Ole Miss 37: Ole Miss jumped out to a 31-7 lead in the second quarter, but the Razorbacks roared back and swiped the victory on a 34-yard field goal by Connor Limpert with four seconds remaining on the clock to spoil Jordan Ta'amu's first start at quarterback for the Rebels.

Oct. 15, 2016 • Fayetteville, Ark. • #24 Arkansas 34, #12 Ole Miss 30: For the second straight season, the Ole Miss football team fell in a back-and-forth battle against Arkansas. A 6-yard run by Jared Cornelius with 2:20 remaining pushed the No. 22 Razorbacks (5-2, 1-2 SEC) to a 34-30 win over the No. 12 Rebels (3-3, 1-2 SEC) at Razorback Stadium. Senior quarterback Chad Kelly accounted for 334 total yards (253 passing, 89

rushing) and three touchdowns (one passing, two rushing) in the SEC setback.

Nov. 7, 2015 • Oxford, Miss. • Arkansas 53, #18 Ole Miss 52: Trailing seven points in the first overtime and facing a 4th-and-25 from the 40-yard line, Arkansas quarterback Brandon Allen completed a pass to Hunter Henry to the 26-yard line. Henry, while being tackled to the ground, flung the ball 20-some yards backwards to Alex Collins, who caught it on a hop and raced for a first down to the 11-yard line. It was a wild, back-and-forth game that featured five lead changes, eight-straight scoring drives and 1,195 yards of total offense.

Nov. 22, 2014 • Fayetteville, Ark. • Arkansas 30, #8 Ole Miss 0: A strong opening quarter by Arkansas and six turnovers were too much to overcome for No. 8 Ole Miss, and the Rebels lost 30-0 on a rainy Saturday afternoon at Razorback Stadium in Fayetteville, Arkansas. Paced by a strong rushing attack and favorable field position throughout much of the first half, the Razorbacks jumped out to a 17-0 lead by the end of the first quarter. Ole Miss was plagued by turnovers throughout the game, throwing four interceptions and also fumbling the ball twice.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke (Ole Miss, 2000) is in his 12th season at Ole Miss and third season at the helm, taking the reins of his alma mater as the 38th head coach in program history. He was born a Rebel as his family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. During his 25 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others. Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach before being promoted to interim head coach for the 2017 season. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), he served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

ARKANSAS HEAD COACH CHAD MORRIS

Chad Morris (Texas A&M, 1992) is in his second year as Arkansas' head coach and comes into Saturday's game with a 3-10 record early into his head coaching campaign in Fayetteville, Arkansas. Morris, who owns a 17-32 overall coaching record, was head coach at SMU from 2015-17 after a four-year stint as the offensive coordinator at Clemson. During his three seasons at SMU, Morris took the Mustangs from a 1-11 campaign in 2013 before he took over to the program's first bowl bid since 2012 with a 7-5 mark in 2017. Morris inherited an offense that ranked last (128th) in the FBS in scoring in 2014 (11.8) and turned it into the nation's eighth-highest scoring offense (40.1) in 2017. The 2017 SMU offense marked the fourth time and third different program that Morris has either been the head coach or offensive coordinator of that has finished in the top 10 in the FBS in scoring average at more than 40 points per game. During his four years at Clemson as offensive coordinator, Morris helped the Tigers post a 41-11 record and two BCS Orange Bowl appearances. He spent 16 years as a high school head coach in Texas, winning three state titles and earning coach of the year honors 11 times.

RAZORBACK SCOUTING REPORT

The Arkansas Razorbacks head into Oxford 1-0 after a 20-13 season-opening win over Portland State on Saturday. Touchdowns on the ground from Devwah Whaley and Rakeem Boyd, along with three Razorback interceptions, were enough to grab a win in the season opener. Arkansas racked up 395 total yards, with 204 coming on the ground. Boyd paced the Razorbacks on the ground with 114 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. SMU transfer Ben Hicks got the start at QB for Arkansas and was 14-of-29 for 143 yards. Fellow transfer Nick Starkel entered the game late for the Razorbacks and finished 4-for-5 for 48 yards and one interception. The Arkansas defense limited Portland State to 230 yards and tallied three interceptions for the first time since 2014. The Razorbacks also tallied six total sacks, including two apiece from McTelvin Agim and Kamren Curl. Connor Limpert, a 2018 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts.

- Ole Miss and Arkansas will be meeting on the field for the 66th time in a series that dates back to 1908.
- Ole Miss records show the Rebels trailing the series 27-35-1 (two wins taken away due to NCAA ruling), while Arkansas' records indicate a 36-26-1 advantage for the Razorbacks ... Arkansas claims a forfeit victory in a 1914 game that Ole Miss won 13-7.
- Arkansas holds a 16-9 edge since it joined the SEC in 1992 after vacated wins.
- The last four games between Ole Miss and Arkansas have been decided by four or less points.
- This is the first time that the Rebels and Razorbacks have played each other in an SEC opener for both teams.

HOME OPENERS

Ole Miss is 96-17-5 (.835 winning pct.) in home openers during its 125 seasons of fielding a football team after vacated wins. The Rebels did not have a home game during the 1900 season. When playing their home opener in Oxford, the Rebels are 73-10-4 (.862 winning pct.). Ole Miss has won each of its last seven home openers on the field. The Rebels' last season-opening loss came in 2011 when BYU beat Ole Miss 14-13 in Oxford.

OLE MISS IN SEPTEMBER

- Ole Miss is 152-89-7 (.627 winning pct.) all-time during the month of September after vacated wins.
- Ole Miss is 96-33-3 (.739 winning pct.) in September home games (including home contests played in Memphis and Jackson), including a 71-20-2 (.774 winning percentage) mark in September games played in Oxford.

- DL **Benito Jones** tallied his first career interception with a pick during the third quarter vs. the Tigers.
- DL **Josiah Coatney** posted a career-high seven solo tackles against Memphis.
- DB **Keidron Smith** had a career-high seven total tackles, six of which were solo stops.
- The Ole Miss defense recorded eight tackles for loss vs. Memphis, including two TFLs by **Luke Knox** and **Jaylon Jones**.
- DE **Ryder Anderson** had a career-high in solo stops (7) at Memphis.

SPECIAL TEAM NOTES

- P **Mac Brown** punted five times for an average of 46.8 yards per punt, including a long of 54 yards.
- Brown ranks third in the SEC and 15th nationally with an average of 46.8 yards per punt.
- K **Luke Logan** was 1-of-2 on field goals, including a 35-yard field goal in the third quarter.

MAC BROWN RAISES NEARLY 70K FOR ALS

When he was in seventh grade, Ole Miss punter **Mac Brown** had a modest goal of raising \$500 for a childhood friend's dad who had been diagnosed with ALS. Along with a group of neighborhood friends, Brown started a lemonade stand, *Awesome Lemonade Stand*, in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, to help his friend's family. Eight years later, that \$500 goal has ballooned to nearly \$70,000 raised by Brown and his friends for ALS research. The *Awsome Lemonade Stand* is held on a late day in June and this year's fundraiser raised more than \$17,000 alone.

125 SEASONS OF OLE MISS FOOTBALL

This year is the 125th season of football at Ole Miss and the third under head coach **Matt Luke**. The Rebels boast an all-time record of 638-525-35 (.547 winning percentage) after vacated wins. Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.

HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE

After the 2018 campaign, **Matt Luke** found himself in the market for both an offensive and defensive coordinator, and he delivered in a big way. **Mike MacIntyre**, a two-time national coach of the year and coaching veteran with nearly three decades of experience, will take over the reigns as the Rebels' defensive coordinator while **Rich Rodriguez**, considered one of the most innovative offensive minds in college football, will serve as Ole Miss' offensive coordinator. Ole Miss is one of only two teams in the nation, along with Alabama, to have three coaches with Power 5 head coaching experience.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

A large portion of Ole Miss' experience is on the defensive side of the ball as the Rebels brought back 33 letterwinners and eight starters from the 2018 Landshark defense. Nearly half of the returning defensive players, 19, have starting experience and provide quality depth for **Mike MacIntyre** as the Rebels transitioned to a 3-4 base defensive system. Seniors **Benito Jones** and **Josiah Coatney** help anchor the Rebel defensive line. Coatney finished third on the team in 2018 with 63 total tackles, while Jones was a load on the inside, recording nine tackles for loss and six quarterback hurries. Linebacker **MoMo Sanogo** returned for his junior campaign after leading Ole Miss in tackles last season with 112. The Rebels also returned some key starters and additional depth in the secondary. **Myles Hartsfield** and **Jalen Julius** are back for their senior seasons, while cornerback and return specialist **Jaylon Jones** also return from injury to help add experience in the Rebel defensive backfield.

LOOKING TO RELOAD

On the offensive side of the ball, **Rich Rodriguez** and the Rebels had some big shoes to fill with the loss of eight starters, including All-America performers **A.J. Brown** and **Greg Little**. After **Jordan Ta'amu** lit up the scoreboard in 2018, finishing fourth in the country in passing yards per game (326.5), the Rebels hope another first-year starter finds the same success. Redshirt freshman **Matt Corral** is back after appearing in four games last season. In a few spot appearances in 2018, Corral was 16-of-22 through the air for 239 yards and two TDs. With the loss of Brown, as well as the departure of **D.K. Metcalf** and **DaMarkus Lodge**, the Nasty Wideouts (nWo) look for some new faces to step in and take the belt. Sophomore **Elijah Moore** returned after appearing in all 12 games as a true freshman, hauling in 36 catches for 398 yards and two TDs. **Braylon Sanders** will be relied upon as the junior from Hogansville, Georgia, has the most experience of any Ole Miss wideout with 16 career games played. While the Rebels look to replace starters at most offensive positions, the Ole Miss running back group should be a strong point of attack in 2019. Prior to dealing with an injury in the latter part of 2018, **Scottie Phillips** ranked in the top 10 nationally in nearly every rushing category and was on pace to challenge for the Ole Miss single-season rushing record. Despite playing sparingly over the final three contests, Phillips finished 2018 with 928 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns on the ground. His 14 total TDs ranked fifth in the SEC. Preseason All-SEC tackle **Alex Givens** and guard **Ben Brown**, a 2018 Freshman All-SEC selection, both return to help anchor the Ole Miss offensive line.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DE **Austrian Robinson** became the 29th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late **Chucky Mullins**, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Robinson wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

RebTalk, the official weekly radio show of Ole Miss Athletics, is moving to a new day and location for this season. Beginning Aug. 27, RebTalk will be broadcast each Tuesday this fall at Bouré in downtown Oxford from 7-8 p.m. The show, which is hosted by the "Voice of the Rebels" **David Kellum** and includes special guests, will air live on the Ole Miss IMG Sports Network. Ole Miss Football head coach **Matt Luke** and select players will join the broadcast each Tuesday throughout the season.

HEAD COACH MATT LUKE

Matt Luke was born a Rebel. His family has ties to Ole Miss that span three generations. Now, he has achieved a lifelong dream by taking over the reins of his alma mater. Ole Miss made it official on Nov. 27, 2017, removing the interim tag and introducing Luke as the 38th head coach in program history.

Headed into his third year at the helm, Luke has bolstered his staff by adding more than 60 years of coaching experience with the addition of new coordinators and former Pac 12 Coach of the Year winners, Mike MacIntyre and Rich Rodriguez. The Gulfport native continued that momentum by assembling a top-25 recruiting class in February.

Luke's 2018 Rebels finished amongst the top 20 nationally in multiple statistical categories including total offense, passing yards per completion, passing efficiency, fumbles lost and defensive touchdowns.

Nine Rebels received invitations to the 2019 NFL Combine, the fourth-most invitees by any school in the country. Six were drafted, which is Ole Miss' most since 1971.

A.J. Brown, earned multiple All-America honors after a season that saw him become Ole Miss' all-time leading receiving in yards, as well as set single-season marks in both receiving yards and receptions. Senior quarterback Jordan Ta'amu led the SEC and ranked fourth nationally with 326.5 yards passing per game. Ta'amu's 3,918 passing yards were second-most on the Ole Miss single-season charts.

Sophomore MoMo Sanogo led the Rebel defense with 112 tackles and became just the second Ole Miss player in the last 12 years to tally 100-plus tackles in a single season.

In his first year at Ole Miss, Luke faced the daunting challenge of taking over the team just a week before 2017 fall camp and responded by helping the Rebels bounce back from a losing season to post a 6-6 record. Ole Miss won three of its final four games, including a 31-28 road victory at Mississippi State to return the Golden Egg to Oxford.

During his 25 years as a player and coach at the collegiate level, Luke has risen through the ranks while learning from a number of successful veteran coaches. He has worked alongside national champion Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer, Duke head coach David Cutcliffe and former Ole Miss head coach Tommy Tuberville, among others.

Luke, a four-year center for the Rebels (1995-98), just wrapped up his 11th season as a coach at Ole Miss. Prior to taking over as interim head coach, Luke spent five seasons as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. During his first stop in Oxford (2002-05), Luke served four seasons coaching the Ole Miss tight ends and offensive line under Cutcliffe.

A product of Gulfport High School, Luke lettered four seasons (1995-98) as a center at Ole Miss. A starter in 33 career games for the Rebels, he served as team captain in 1998 as Ole Miss posted a 7-5 ledger and defeated Texas Tech in the Independence Bowl. He was named the 1998 Ole Miss Most Valuable Senior by the Jackson (Miss.) Touchdown Club and twice earned Academic All-SEC honors.

Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1999, helping the Rebels to an 8-4 mark with regular-season wins against Auburn, South Carolina, LSU and Arkansas as well as a 27-25 triumph over Oklahoma in the Independence Bowl. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in business administration.

His father, Tommy, was a defensive back at Ole Miss in the 1960s while his brother, Tom, quarterbacked the Rebels from 1989-91. Tom is also on the Ole Miss football staff as assistant athletics director for player development.

Luke is married to the former Ashley Grantham of Oxford, Mississippi, and the couple has two sons, Harrison and Cooper.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Down 17 points late in the first half, the Ole Miss football team never quit, fighting back to take the lead with 42 seconds remaining on a Scottie Phillips touchdown run to secure a 37-33 victory over Arkansas.

Quarterback Jordan Ta'amu amassed 528 yards of total offense—387 through the air and 141 on the ground—the second-most in program history behind Archie Manning in the victory. He capped the tremendous day by leading the Rebels on a stunning 97-yard drive in the final minutes of the game.

The Ole Miss defense came through with a key stop late in the contest, forcing an Arkansas punt with just over two minutes to play and the score 33-31. The punt took a Razorback bounce all the way to the 3-yard line. With plenty of green in front of them, the Rebels chased space. Ta'amu hit A.J. Brown on a 20-yard gain early in the drive. Two plays later, Dawson Knox broke free for a 48-yard gain to put the Rebels to within field goal range.

The Rebels didn't stop there. Ta'amu capped his incredible day on the ground with a 15-yard rush down to the Arkansas 14. Phillips did the rest, notching a nine-yard rush before punching in the game-winning score from five yards out. The Landshark Defense signaled the end of the contest when Zedrick Woods intercepted a Cole Kelley pass on the first play of the ensuing drive.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Ole Miss football gave itself a chance late at the Liberty Bowl, but an outstanding fourth-quarter punt by Memphis' Andy Williams led to a safety and ultimately quelled a Rebel comeback attempt in the 15-10 defeat.

The Tigers mustered just those two points in the second half as the Landshark defense swarmed all day, holding the home team to just 364 total yards. Scottie Phillips notched the lone touchdown of the day for the Rebel offense early in the fourth quarter, but the comeback just wasn't meant to be as Ole Miss opened the season with a close loss.

The Rebels opened with the football and went three-and-out on their first two possessions. The Landshark defense turned in a three-and-out to start its day as well and was on its way to a stop on the Tigers' second possession, but a pair of costly penalties—a facemask and a roughing the passer call—both against junior outside linebacker Sam Williams, kept the drive alive and led to a Memphis touchdown. Quarterback Brady White drove a head on a QB sneak from one yard out for the game's first score.

The Rebel defense managed to force a punt, but after another Rebel three-and-out, a 21-yard punt return by John Williams gave the Tigers the field position they needed to score once more. Ole Miss nearly held at the goal line, but on 3rd-and-goal from the one, Patrick Taylor punched in the 1-yard score. Riley Patterson's extra point attempt clattered off the right upright, keeping it a 13-0 game just before the half.

Ole Miss broke through to put points on the board late in the third quarter. The Rebels used a heavy dose of Phillips, as well as a 36-yard connection between Corral and Moore to drive to the Memphis 18-yard line, where Logan hit a 35-yard field goal to make it 13-3.

The ground game then led the Rebels to their first touchdown of the season. Corral and Phillips combined to run 38 yards on the drive, while freshman receiver Jonathan Mingo drew a critical pass interference call in his collegiate debut to set up the score. After the flag, Corral scampered for a 15-yard gain down to the Memphis 2-yard line. It took two attempts, but Phillips was able to drive his way in to make it a three-point game, 13-10.

On the following drive, Memphis was able to chip its way across midfield thanks to a 4th-and-1 conversion, but the Landshark defense continued to swarm. On 3rd-and-6 following that conversion, Bivens and Ryder Anderson combined on a sack to force a punt.

Andy Williams' ensuing punt rolled all the way down to the 2-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Corral was sacked in the end zone for a safety, making it 15-10, Memphis. From there, the Tigers were able to drain the clock and hold off the Rebel comeback attempt.

GAME ONE MEMPHIS 15, OLE MISS 10

Aug. 31, 2019

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Ole Miss football gave itself a chance late at the Liberty Bowl, but an outstanding fourth-quarter punt by Memphis' Andy Williams led to a safety and ultimately quelled a Rebel comeback attempt in the 15-10 defeat.

The Tigers mustered just those two points in the second half as the Landshark defense swarmed all day, holding the home team to just 364 total yards. Scottie Phillips notched the lone touchdown of the day for the Rebel offense early in the fourth quarter, but the comeback just wasn't meant to be as Ole Miss opened the season with a close loss.

The Rebels opened with the football and went three-and-out on their first two possessions. The Landshark defense turned in a three-and-out to start its day as well and was on its way to a stop on the Tigers' second possession, but a pair of costly penalties—a facemask and a roughing the passer call—both against junior outside linebacker Sam Williams, kept the drive alive and led to a Memphis touchdown. Quarterback Brady White drove a head on a QB sneak from one yard out for the game's first score.

The Rebel defense managed to force a punt, but after another Rebel three-and-out, a 21-yard punt return by John Williams gave the Tigers the field position they needed to score once more. Ole Miss nearly held at the goal line, but on 3rd-and-goal from the one, Patrick Taylor punched in the 1-yard score. Riley Patterson's extra point attempt clattered off the right upright, keeping it a 13-0 game just before the half.

Ole Miss broke through to put points on the board late in the third quarter. The Rebels used a heavy dose of Phillips, as well as a 36-yard connection between Corral and Moore to drive to the Memphis 18-yard line, where Logan hit a 35-yard field goal to make it 13-3.

The ground game then led the Rebels to their first touchdown of the season. Corral and Phillips combined to run 38 yards on the drive, while freshman receiver Jonathan Mingo drew a critical pass interference call in his collegiate debut to set up the score. After the flag, Corral scampered for a 15-yard gain down to the Memphis 2-yard line. It took two attempts, but Phillips was able to drive his way in to make it a three-point game, 13-10.

On the following drive, Memphis was able to chip its way across midfield thanks to a 4th-and-1 conversion, but the Landshark defense continued to swarm. On 3rd-and-6 following that conversion, Bivens and Ryder Anderson combined on a sack to force a punt.

Andy Williams' ensuing punt rolled all the way down to the 2-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Corral was sacked in the end zone for a safety, making it 15-10, Memphis. From there, the Tigers were able to drain the clock and hold off the Rebel comeback attempt.
