San José State record: 1-1, 0-0 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost a non-conference contest to Tulsa, 34-16, on September 7.

Arkansas record: 2-1, 0-1 SEC. The Razorbacks defeated Colorado State, 55-34, on September 14.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his third season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 4-23, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. He is 0-0 as a head coach against Arkansas.

Arkansas head coach Chad Morris: In his second season as the Razorbacks head coach. Has a record of 4-11 at Arkansas. Overall, Morris is in his fifth season as a major college head coach and has a record of 18-33. Morris is 0-0 as a head coach against San Jose State.

Series history: This is the first meeting between these teams.

Aiming for a road victory: San Jose State plays its first road game of the season at Arkansas. The Spartans are seeking their first road win in 14 games since leaving Fresno State with a 16-14 triumph on November 26, 2016.

The last time San Jose State won a road game in the Central Time Zone was a 52-24 victory over UTSA in the Alamodome on October 20, 2012. Since then the Spartans are 0-6 in games played in the Central Time Zone with losses to Auburn and Minnesota, twice, each, and Tulsa and Iowa State, once, each.

Another chance for 2-1: San Jose State has its next opportunity to have a 2-1 win-loss record after three games when it plays Arkansas.

The last time the Spartans had a 2-1 record after three games was in 2012 when San Jose State topped Colorado State, 40-20, in its third game of the season en route to an 11-2 overall record and a #21-ranking in the final Associated Press poll.

Since then, the Spartans had chances in 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2017.

Returning to the state of Arkansas: San Jose State has the opportunity to play in its third different football venue when it plays Arkansas on September 21.

Previously, the Spartans won their 2002 season opener against Arkansas State at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, 33-18, on August 31.

San Jose State's first trip to Arkansas resulted in a 21-7 loss to Arkansas State at Indian Stadium, now known as Centennial Bank Stadium in Jonesboro.

The San Jose State-Arkansas broadcast with Justin Allegri and Tim Crawley calling the action also will be carried on www.siriusxm.com Channel 986.

San Jose State & Arkansas' Super Bowl head coaching history: San Jose State and Arkansas are two of the six colleges and universities claiming two alums as Super Bowl winning head coaches.

For San Jose State, **Bill Walsh** coached the San Francisco 49ers to victory in Super Bowls XVI (1982), XIX (1985) and XXIII (1989) and **Dick Vermeil** led the St. Louis Rams in Super Bowl XXXIV (2000).

For Arkansas, Jimmy Johnson coached the Dallas Cowboys to Super Bowl XXVII (1993) and XXVIII (1994) wins. Barry Switzer took over for Johnson and coached Dallas to a Super Bowl XXX (1996) title.

The other four schools with two alums coaching teams to Super Bowl victories are Dayton (Chuck Noll and Jon Gruden), Miami (Ohio) (Weeb Ewbank and John Harbaugh), Eastern Illinois (Mike Shanahan and Sean Payton) and the University of the Pacific, 70 miles east of San Jose State and an institution that no longer has football (Tom Flores and Pete Carroll).

Some Arkansas ties: Current Arkansas assistant coach **Barry Lunney, Jr.**, was San Jose State University's quarterbacks coach during the 2003 and 2004 seasons and co-offensive coordinator in 2004. The Spartans' starting quarterback in 2003 was Scott Rislov, who went on to play three seasons of ARENA and one season of ARENA2 football.

Lunney coached three different starting quarterbacks in 2004, all of whom played in the October 2 NCAA record-setting contest for most points scored by two teams in a regulation four-quarter game won by San Jose State, 70-63, over Rice. The Spartans trailed, 34-7, and took their first lead of the game with their final touchdown in the fourth quarter. The Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) two-team scoring record for a regulation game lasted until Pitt defeated Syracuse, 76-61, on November 26, 2016.

Former Razorbacks assistant coach **Fitz Hill** (1992-00) was San Jose State's head coach for four seasons (2001-04). He compiled a win-loss head coaching record of 14-33. The Spartans' best season was in 2002 with a 6-7 record playing 13 games, nine of them on the road, in 13 weeks.

Arkansas graduate **Keith Burns** was an assistant coach at San Jose State during the 2004 through 2009 seasons primarily as the defensive coordinator.

Former Arkansas defensive coordinator **Willy Robinson** (2010-11) was a San Jose State graduate assistant in 1979 coaching linebackers.

Aguayo has another week as the national leader: For the second consecutive week, San Jose State University linebacker **Ethan Aguayo** is the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) national leader in tackles per game at 17.0.

Aguayo opened the season matching a single-game career best 20 tackles in the Northern Colorado victory on August 29. He added a game-high 14 stops in the September 7 game vs. Tulsa.

Spartans break onside trend: For the first time since the November 1, 2014 Colorado State game, San Jose State recovered an onside kick when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in the Tulsa game (9/7).

The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

Camping buddies: San Jose State's **Josh Love** and Arkansas' Nick Starkel attended the same summer 2019 **Steve Clarkson** Dreammakers quarterbacks camp. Clarkson was a member of the Spartans during the 1979 through 1982 seasons and the San Jose State starter his sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

Two games, no pass interceptions thrown: After two games, San Jose State has not given up the football via a pass interception. In comparison to the 2018 season, Spartan passers three interceptions.

The last time San Jose State did not have a pass intercepted after the first two games was in the 2004 season. The Spartans played their first three games without an interception in 67 pass attempts and were intercepted on their third pass attempt of the fourth game of the season in the 70-63 comeback win over Rice.

The loss of former head coach John Ralston: One-time San Jose State football head coach **John Ralston** (1927-2109) died peacefully in nearby Sunnyvale, Calif., on September 14 at age 92.

Ralston was the Spartans' head coach from 1993 through 1996. He also was a college head coach at Utah State (1959 through 1962) and at Stanford (1963 through 1971). He was the head coach of the Denver Broncos (1972-76) and the Oakland Invaders of the United States Football League (USFL).

His career head coaching record was 140-126-7. He is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame, the Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame, the City of San Jose Sports Hall of Fame; and the Halls of Fame for the three schools he served as head coach.

Emphasis on a positive turnover margin: A point of emphasis for this year's San Jose State team is finishing in the top-25 in turnover margin.

The Spartans enter the week of September 21 tied for 58th nationally in turnover margin with a 0.00 ratio.

A year ago, San Jose State finished at +1, a significant improvement from the 2017 season when the team had a minus-26 turnover margin figure.

Opening a season with two home games: Since 1946, it has been the rare occasion for San Jose State to begin a season with at least two home games. In 1947, the Spartans played their first three games at home and would finish with a 9-3 win-loss record.

First-time starters: Seven Spartans now can claim starting in a major college football contest. Offensive guard **Tyler Stevens**, running back **DeJon Packer**, wide receiver **Isaiah Hamilton**, tight end **Brett Foley**, defensive lineman **Viliami Fehoko**, linebacker **Rico Tolefree**, and cornerback **Brandon Ezell** made their first major college starts in the Northern Colorado game.

The Spartans also began the 2019 season with newcomers on special teams. Against Northern Colorado, freshman **Andrew Gonnevillie** was the long snapper. Redshirt freshman **Matt Mercurio** was the placekicker. Sophomore **Chris Wood** took care of kickoffs. Punter and kick-scoring holder **Alex Galland** is a graduate transfer from Yale University.

Pressuring the passer: San Jose State's 4.0 quarterback sacks in the Northern Colorado win was its first time with 4.0 sacks in a game since the 2017 loss to Utah State. Linebackers **Ethan Aguayo**, **Tysyn Parker**, and **Jessie Osuna**, and defensive lineman **Demanuel Talauati** were credited with a quarterback sack against Northern Colorado.

Sharing the wealth: Ten Spartans caught at least one pass in the Northern Colorado victory. Former Charter Oak High School teammates **Isaiah Hamilton** and **Jermaine Braddock**, tight end **Derrick Deese, Jr.**, wide receiver **Andre Crump, Jr.**, and running back **Kairee Robinson** caught a pass for the first time in a major college game.

Hamilton led the Spartans with five receptions for 91 yards. Braddock and Deese, Jr., each caught a pass from Josh Love for a touchdown.

The Northern Colorado game marked the second time in five games dating back to 2018, three tight ends caught a pass in a game for the Spartans. Deese, Jr., **Brett Foley** and **Billy Humphreys** each had a pass reception.

Ground game moves ahead in opener: San Jose State's 158 rushing yards against Northern Colorado were its most rushing yards since gaining 173 yards at Nevada on November 17, 2017. Quarterback **Nick Nash** led the Spartans with 67 yards on five carries. His 49-yard run was the Northern Colorado game's longest play from scrimmage.

Nash on a dash: San Jose State freshman **Nick Nash** is the first Spartan quarterback to rush for as many as 50 yards since Kenny Potter gained 52 yards and scored three touchdowns on 22 carries in a 41-38 loss to Air Force on November 19, 2016 in CEFCU Stadium.

Nash's 67 rushing yards are the most by a San Jose State quarterback since Potter gained 69 yards and scored a touchdown on 15 carries in the 2015 Cure Bowl victory over Georgia State. Nash's 49-yard run against Northern Colorado was the first time a San Jose State quarterback ran for more than 40 yards in one play since Potter ran for 42 yards against Georgia State.

He is the team's leading rusher after two games with 115 yards on 13 carries.

2019 opponents: San Jose State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school with games in five different time zones this season. The Spartans will exceed 16,000 travel miles in 2019 with short trips to Nevada and UNLV in the Pacific Time Zone, Air Force in the Mountain Time Zone, Arkansas in the Central Time Zone, Army West Point in the Eastern Time Zone and Hawai'i in the Hawaiian Time Zone.

The only other year San Jose State played in five time zones was in 2015 with road games at Oregon State, Nevada and UNLV (PT), Air Force (MT), Auburn (CT), Hawaii (HT), and Georgia State in the inaugural Orlando, Fla., Cure Bowl (ET).

The 2019 season also marks the first time San Jose State plays two of the three service academies (Air Force, Army West Point and Navy) in the same season and the Spartans' first trip to state of New York.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons, San Jose State has the same offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator in consecutive seasons with **Kevin McGiven** in the offensive coordinator role, **Derrick Odum** as defensive coordinator and **Fred Guidici** as special teams coordinator.

In 2008 and 2009, the Spartans' offensive coordinator was **Steve Morton**. **Keith Burns**, the current defensive secondary coach at UTEP, was the defensive coordinator, and current San Jose State head coach **Brent Brennan** was coordinated special teams while coaching the wide receivers.

National Football Foundation honors five Spartans with bachelor's degrees: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Deano Motes** and **Quinn Oseland** were five San Jose State football players among more than 1,400 honored by the National Football Foundation on August 27 as college graduates playing a final season for their respective schools at the NCAA Divisions I, II and III levels and in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics).

Foley and Motes are enrolled in a San Jose State M.B.A. program; Galland and Oseland, in a master's in public administration curriculum; and Hawkins, in educational counseling.

New CEFCU Stadium look: During the summer, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, begins after the 2019 season is over. The Spartan Athletics Center will be under construction from 2020 to 2022. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe**, defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** and **Deano Motes**, and defensive back **Zamore Zigler** are four San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Zigler was a running back his first two seasons before moving to a cornerback role in 2018.

Motes was a defensive lineman in his first two seasons before moving to the offensive side last season and started eight games.

Hoppe, last year's starting center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a wide range of internal family ties.

- Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** is the son of former SJSU offensive line coach Gary Bernardi.
- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.
- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller**.
- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers.
- Running back **Brendan Manigo** is the second Manigo brother to play football for SJSU. His brother, Alex Manigo, was a linebacker on the 2015 and 2016 San Jose State teams.
- Linebacker **Isaiah Ossai** is the third Ossai brother to play linebacker for the Spartans. Older brother Onyeka Ossai was a Spartan during the 2000 through 2002 seasons. William Ossai played on the 2014 through 2017 San Jose State teams.
- Linebacker **Lionell Wiggins** is the younger brother of former San Jose State defensive lineman Larnell Ransom, a letterwinner during the 2002 through 2004 seasons.

A master's degree in their future: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Quinn Oseland** and **Deano Motes** are five San José State players playing as graduate students.

Foley, Hawkins and Motes are San Jose State University graduates. Foley and Motes are in their first semester as M.B.A. candidates. Hawkins is pursuing his master's degree in educational counseling.

Galland, a mechanical engineering major at Yale University, and Oseland, a business marketing major at the University of Minnesota, are enrolled in San Jose State's public administration master's program.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, the Spartans logged more than 5,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2019 season is the Spartans' third with adidas.
