POSTGAME NOTES: MISSOURI 24, ARKANSAS 14

PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, cardinal jerseys and white pants, a uniform from Nike that dates back to the 2006-07 seasons. Arkansas has worn it every home game this year.
- Arkansas won the coin toss and elected to receive. Missouri defended the north end zone.
- Arkansas' captains were seniors McTelvin Agim, Austin Capps, De'Jon Harris and T.J. Smith. Agim, Harris & Smith were named permanent captains by head coach Chad Morris and donned a "C" on their left shoulder.
- Weather 49, cloudy, winds east 6 mph

GENERAL NOTES

- Saturday marked the 11th meeting between the Razorbacks and Tigers. Arkansas trails in the all-time series, 7-4.
- It was the second time Arkansas and Missouri have played each other in Little Rock.
- Arkansas is 168-69-5 in Little Rock.
- The Razorbacks are now 151-62-14 all-time at War Memorial Stadium, dating back to 1948.
- The annoucned attendance for the game: 33,961
- Today's starters: Offense Jack Lindsey (OB), Myron Cunningham (LT), Austin Capps (LG), Ty Clary (C), Ricky Stromberg (RG), Dalton Wagner (RT), Rakeem Boyd (RB), Michael Woods (WR), Treylon Burks (WR), Trey Knox (WR), Grayson Gunter (TE). Defense Mataio Soli (DE), McTelvin Agim (DT), T.J. Smith (DT), Jamario Bell (DE), De'Jon Harris (MIKE), Bumper Pool (WILL), Greq Brooks Jr. (NICK), Montaric Brown (CB), Myles Mason (SS), Joe Foucha (FS), Jarques McClellion (CB).
- De'Jon Harris made his 36th consecutive start, the most on the either side of the ball.
- McTelvin Agim started in his 39th game of his collegiate career, the most by a current Razorback.
- Five freshmen, all true, started today's game for the Razorbacks. A total of 16 freshmen/redshirt played against Missouri.
- Jack made his first career start at quarterback. Arkansas is the only school in the FBS to have started five quarterbacks in 2019.
- It was also the first career starts for Myles Mason and Jamario Bell.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Arkansas ended the first quarter with a lead for the first time since Oct. 12 at Kentucky (7-0).
- The Razorbacks scored on a 19-yard pass from Jack Lindsey to Trey Knox with 6:49 left in the first quarter.
- It was Lindsey's second TD pass in as many games and Knox's first since San Jose State on Sept. 21.
- The TD reception was Knox's first catch since Mississippi State on Nov. 2.
- Arkansas had 122 yards of total offense in the first half, 103 on the ground, led by Rakeem Boyd's 70 yards on 14 carries.
- Only pass was completed in the first half, the 19-yd touchdown pass to Trey Knox.
- Lindsey's second completed pass was also a touchdown, a 10-yd throw to Grayson Gunter.
- The TD reception was Gunter's first of the season.
- Gunter is the seventh Razorback with a touchdown catch this season.
- It was the first second-half opening drive TD since Texas A&M on Sept. 28.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Isaiah Nichols and Jonathan Marshall combined for Arkansas' first sack in five games. The Razorbacks ended the game with 3.0 sacks.
- De'Jon Harris tallied his first sack of the season in the first quarter.
- Harris forced a fumble on that play, his second of the season and first since Arkansas faced Auburn on Oct. 19.
- Greg Brooks Jr. intercepted Missouri's first play of the second half, his first career INT and the first by a Razorback since Texas A&M on Sept. 28.
- It was the sixth interception of the season for Arkansas, the most since 2017 (8).
- Three players (Foucha, Harris, Pool) finished with double-digit tackle performances against Missouri. It marked the second time this season three players have finished with 10 or more stops, the same three.
- Bumper Pool led the team in total tackles with 13 tackles.
- Harris posted 11 tackles, pushing over the 100-tackle threshold for the third-straight season.
- Harris is one of four Razorbacks to ever record three consecutive 100+ tackle seasons.
- Harris finishes his time at Arkansas with 371 total tackles, good for fifth all-time in school history.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Connor Limpert was 0-for-1 on field goals, missing a 54-yarder in the 4th quarter.
- He finishes his Arkansas career in seventh in career field goals made with 41.
- His career percentage of 78.8 finishes as the school record.

PLAYER NOTES

QB Jack Lindsey

- Made his first career start at quarterback.
- Was 10-for-26 through the air for 75 yards and one touchdown. It was his second touchdown pass in as many weeks.
- Connected on a 19-yard pass to Trey Knox midway through the first quarter to give Arkansas the early 6-0 lead. It was his only completion of the first half.
- The completion and yardage total were both career highs.

• Rushed four times for 50 yards, setting a career high in rushing yards.

WR Trey Knox

- Caught one pass in the game for 19 yards and scoring Arkansas' first touchdown of the game.
- It was his first reception in the last three games.
- The touchdown catch was his third of the year, which ties for second on the team.
- It was his first touchdown catch since Week 4 against San Jose State (9/21).

RB Rakeem Boyd

- Finished the game with a season high 21 carries for 95 yards.
- Rushed 14 times in the first half, his most in a half since rushing it 19 times in the first half against Tulsa (10/20/18) last year.
- · Also had two yards receiving to finish with 97 all-purpose yards. It was the ninth time this year he totaled 95 or more all-purpose yards in a game.
- Completes his junior season as the team's leading rusher with 1,133 yards on 184 carries and eight touchdowns.
- It's the most yards in a season by a Razorback running back since Rawleigh Williams III totaled 1,360 in the 2016 season.

TE Grayson Gunter

- Tied for the team lead with two catches for 16 yards and had one touchdown.
- · Hauled in his second receiving touchdown of his career, first of the season, early in the third quarter; a 10-yard pass from Jack Lindsey.
- Is the seventh different player on the team to catch a touchdown pass this year.
- Finished his junior season with six catches for 55 yards and one touchdown.

DB Greg Brooks, Jr.

• Hauled in his first career interception on the first play of the second half. He's fifth different Razorback to bring in an interception this year.

LB Bumper Pool

- Led the team with 13 tackles in the game, including seven solo and 1.0 tackle for loss.
- It's his third double-digit tackle game of the season and first since recording 13 against Mississippi State (11/2) in Week 10 to tie a career high in stops.
- Had at least five or more tackles in each of his last seven games.
- Completes his sophomore season with 94 tackles (38 solo), surpassing his total from a year ago. Also had 6.5 tackles for loss, tying for second on the team.
- Has ranked first or second on the team in tackles in each of the last five games.

DB Joe Foucha

- Finished the game with 12 tackles, four solo.
- It's his most tackles in a game since a career-high 13 stops against No. 1 Alabama (Oct. 26) in Week 9.
- It was his third game this year with double-digit tackles. All three have come in SEC play.

DE Jamario Bell

- Had three tackles in the game, two being solo stops and one sack.
- It's his first sack since Week 5 against Texas A&M (9/28) and he now has 4.5 sacks for the season.

LB De'Jon Harris

- Finished the game with 11 tackles, eight solo. It's his most tackles in a game since pulling in 12 stops against Mississippi State (11/2).
- Also forced his second fumble of the season and first since Week 8 against Auburn (10/19). It's the 12th fumble forced by the Arkansas defense this year.
- Tied a career high with 2.0 tackles for loss, his most since tallying 2.0 against Texas A&M (9/29/18) last year.
- Also recorded his first sack of the season and 7.5 of his career. It's his first sack since Oct. 13, 2018 against Ole Miss.
- Completed his senior season with 101 tackles, marking the third-straight year he has had 100+ tackles.
- Friday's performance was his fifth double-digit tackle game this year and 20th of his career.
- Finishes his Razorback career with 371 tackles, ranking fifth all-time. He's one tackle shy of Sam Olajubutu (2003-06) and passed Caleb Miller (200-03) and Cliff Powell (1967-69).
- He's the fourth Razorback all-time to record three-straight seasons with 100+ tackles, joining Caleb Miller (2001-03), Tony Bua (2001-03), Ken Hamlin (2000-02).
