STORY LINES

BATTLE LINE TROPHY UP FOR GRABS SATURDAY

- ▼ Mizzou Football (4-3, 4-3 SEC) will have more hardware on the line as it welcomes SEC West cross-divisional rival Arkansas (3-5, 3-5 SEC) to Memorial Stadium for the Battle Line Rivalry, Presented by Shelter Insurance®. The winner will receive the massive Battle Line Trophy, which is made of silver and stands more than four feet tall and weighs more than 180 pounds. The trophy depicts the outline of the two states with the border of the two states being divided by interchangeable silver inserts with the words Battle Line in either gold or cardinal. The color of the Battle Line within the trophy will be reflective of the winner of the series' most recent game. It has been gold for the last four years, as Mizzou has won the last four meetings.
- ▼ Mizzou, winners of four of five and two straight, is coming off of a dominant 41-0 dismantling of Vanderbilt last Saturday at The Zou. It was Mizzou's first SEC shutout since blanking Arkansas, 38-0, to close the 2018 season. It was also Mizzou's largest margin of victory in an SEC game. Over its last three wins, it has been a complete team effort with the defense limiting opponents to just 20 total points in the last three wins.
- ▼ Arkansas dropped a 27-24 decision to defending national champion LSU two Saturdays ago in Fayetteville. LSU scored the game's go-ahead TD with 3:59 remaining and held on for the win. Arkansas had an open week last Saturday after COVID cases within its program forced it to cancel its originally-scheduled game at Mizzou.

SCHEDULE FLEXIBILITY KEY FOR DRINKWITZ, TIGERS

- ▼ Last week, Mizzou was originally scheduled to play Arkansas on Nov. 28 before COVID cases dropped the Razorbacks below the threshold required to play. The SEC then moved Mizzou's Vanderbilt game, scheduled for Dec. 12, to Nov. 28. Then last Friday, it was announced that Arkansas and Mizzou would play the make-up game this Saturday (Dec. 5), moving Mizzou's game at Mississippi State to a day TBD. That marked another in a long line of schedule changes that the Tigers have endured this season. It was the seventh time Mizzou has had a game altered in 11 weeks this season. Below is a look:
 - Oct. 10 vs. LSU - moved from Baton Rouge to Columbia due to Hurricane Delta.
 - Oct. 17 vs. Vanderbilt - Postponed until Dec. 12 due to COVID issues within Vanderbilt program.
 - Oct. 24/31 - Mizzou flip-flopped its scheduled games with Florida and Kentucky due to COVID issues within the Florida program. The Tigers played UK on Oct. 24 (originally scheduled for Oct. 31) and UF on Oct. 31 (originally scheduled for Oct. 24).
 - Nov. 14 - Georgia game postponed due to COVID issues in the Mizzou program.
 - Nov. 28 - Arkansas game postponed and Vanderbilt game moved from Dec. 12 to Nov. 28.
 - Dec. 5 - Arkansas game moved to Dec. 5 instead of originally-scheduled Mississippi State road contest.
- ▼ Of course, Mizzou's final two games against Georgia and Mississippi State are still TBD as well, so schedule flexibility is a must for this year's crew.

DRINKWITZ HAS DEEP ROOTS IN ARKANSAS

- ▼ Mizzou's first-year bench boss Eliah Drinkwitz is no stranger to the Natural State as his hometown is Alma, Ark., a four-stoplight community with a population of around 5,000, located 45 minutes south of Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.
- ▼ Drinkwitz began his coaching career as an assistant on the Alma High School staff in 2005 before moving to Springdale High School to be the offensive coordinator from 2006-09. He moved on to Auburn as a quality control analyst from 2010-11 before heading to Arkansas State as the team's running backs coach in 2012 and co-offensive coordinator in 2013.
- ▼ Drinkwitz is a 2004 graduate of Arkansas Tech, earning a BS in education.

FAMILIAR FACE ON THE ARKANSAS SIDELINE

- ▼ When Mizzou lines up against Arkansas this Saturday, it will do so against former head coach Barry Odom, who is in his first season as Arkansas' defensive coordinator. Odom spent four years as head coach at Mizzou (2016-19), compiling a 25-25 record, and spent 17 seasons working with the program in some capacity.

SERIES WITH ARKANSAS

- ▼ Mizzou leads the all-time series with Arkansas, 8-3, and has won the last four meetings. Since joining the SEC, Mizzou is 5-1 against the Razorbacks with the only loss coming in a rainy, cold Fayetteville during the 2015 season.
- ▼ In last year's meeting, Mizzou escaped Little Rock's War Memorial Stadium with a 24-14 win to finish the season 6-6 and 3-5 in the SEC. Arkansas took a 14-10 lead with 13:34 remaining in the third quarter, but Mizzou scored the game's final 14 points on a **Tyler Badie** 3-yard TD run and a 10-yard TD grab from former Arkansas wideout Jonathan Nance with 8:47 remaining. WR **Tauskie Dove** made arguably the play of that game, hauling in a 37-yard grab in the middle of two defenders on a third-and-10 that helped Mizzou extend the drive that culminated in Nance's

CREDENTIALS

- With COVID-19 forcing Mizzou Athletics to take physical distancing measures, the capacity in the Memorial Stadium Press Box will be greatly reduced during the 2020 season. The press box capacity has been capped at 50, with the majority of those seats accounted for already. Below is the breakdown:
 - Seats 1-4:** Mizzou Communications Staff
 - Seats 5-26:** Mizzou Local Beat Media
 - Seats 27-30:** Visiting Communications Staff
 - Seats 31-42:** Visiting Media

- * All media in the pressbox must wear face coverings at all times.**

MIZZOU LOCAL BEAT MEDIA

- Those on the Mizzou beat have already been selected for their seats, and Kate Lakin from the Mizzou Strategic Communications staff will be reaching out with how to obtain your credentials. This list includes all print media and radio personalities who cover Mizzou on a regular basis.
- Each local TV affiliate will also have one seat in the press box. Those three affiliates are KMIZ ABC-17, KOMU NBC-8, and KRCG CBS-13. We ask that these affiliates please share video that you shoot with affiliates (home and visiting team) that we are not able to credential due to the space/field restrictions this year.
- *If you do not receive a note, please e-mail both me (Shawn Davis at davisshaw@missouri.edu) and Kate Lakin (lakinke@missouri.edu) to be placed into consideration for one of the rotating floating spots.

VISITING MEDIA

- The seats for the visiting team's media will be selected by the visiting team's communication staff each week. If you are interested in traveling to a game to watch a team that you normally cover, please reach out to the communications staff for that particular team. They will then supply our staff with a list for each home game. Mizzou's communications staff will then assign seats, which will be displayed on the seating chart when media arrives at the press box.

FLOATING SEATS/LOTTERY

- Each week, Mizzou's communications staff has left four seats open as floaters for any national/local media wishing to attend games. This number could change week-to-week, depending upon the RSVPs of our local group and the size of the visiting team media pool. Those interested in applying for these four seats should e-mail both me (Shawn Davis at davisshaw@missouri.edu) and Kate Lakin (lakinke@missouri.edu) for consideration.
- Additionally, if extra seats become available, we will send a note to our local listserv on Tuesdays at 10 a.m. to see if we can accommodate extra media members through a lottery of sorts. We will give preference to those who have covered our team regularly in the past. Should you be approved for one of the extra floating seats, we will communicate that to you by the end of the day every Tuesday before a home game.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP

- All credentials will be distributed on a game-by-game basis this season. Credentials will be available for pickup starting the Wednesday before a home game from the south entrance of Mizzou Arena. Please contact Kate Lakin (lakinke@missouri.edu) if you need alternate pickup arrangements.

FIELD ACCESS (PHOTO/VIDEO)

- The physical distancing policies are not just confined to the press box, as field level will also be greatly impacted this season. In the best interest of the health and well-being of our student-athletes and coaches, Mizzou will be prohibiting field access to all but two wire photography services, and three local television stations (one per each major affiliate – ABC, CBS and NBC), in accordance with the SEC's photography rule. Below is a breakdown of the five external photo/video slots allowed on the sideline at each of Mizzou's five home games:

 - USA Today Photo
 - KMIZ TV ABC-17
 - KRCG TV CBS-13
 - KOMU TV NBC-8

IMPORTANT INFO FOR PERMITTED PHOTOGRAPHERS

- These photographers must participate in required COVID screening consistent with institutional personnel permitted on the field.
- Photographers will be assigned a designated spot.
- At no time may a non-institutional media photographer come within 6 feet of the bench area or move behind the bench area.
- Photographers will be required to wear disposable vests. Vests will be distributed when you pick up your credentials.
- Face coverings must be worn at all times while on the field.
- Check-in for photographers will be at the gate on the SW corner of Memorial Stadium, just to the south of the press elevator. That ramp has direct access to the photo work room.

FIELD ACCESS (PRINT/STAND-UPS)

- Field access to print media will be strictly prohibited. Pre- and post-game standups for all media outlets are strictly prohibited on the field. Mizzou asks that for those wishing to do standups to find a spot outside of the stadium.

POSTGAME INTERVIEW PROCEDURES

- All interviews with Mizzou head coach Eliah Drinkwitz and student-athletes will be conducted via Zoom postgame. There will be one Zoom link sent out for Mizzou's press conferences each week. Media will be required to stay in their seats for the press conference with their microphones muted, and earphones in to prevent any feedback on the Zoom call.
- Coach Drinkwitz will address the media first following a brief cooling-off period. The communications staff will give preference to those who are credentialed for the game when asking questions. Immediately following that Zoom call, the Mizzou Strategic Communications office will download and disseminate Coach Drinkwitz's video to all members of the media, regardless of attendance at the game.
- Players will then be available on the Zoom call following Coach Drinkwitz. We anticipate making a maximum of seven players available following the game, based upon the requests of those in attendance. These interviews will also be disseminated to the media regardless of attendance at the game.
- The visiting team will be responsible for their Zoom link, and sharing that with their media.

FOOD

- Mizzou Athletics will provide pre-packaged food and beverages this year, instead of the traditional buffet style meal. This is to help limit the amount of time waiting in food lines, and cross-contamination through food.

STATS

- Mizzou will no longer provide handouts of stat sheets, due to the potential distancing challenges of that process. Traditional stat books will be printed following the conclusion of the game, and they will be available for pickup at the media window for those interested. Of course, every Mizzou Football game will feature a live stats view at www.Mizzou.Statbroadcast.com.

STORY LINES

TD grab to ice the game. Mizzou RS freshman QB **Connor Bazelak** started that game, his first career start. Mizzou is now 5-1 in games started by Bazelak after Mizzou's win over Vanderbilt.

- ▼ In the 2018 meeting, Mizzou finished the regular season 8-4 (4-4 SEC) after earning a dominant, 38-0, victory over the Hogs. On Senior Day, a day when the program's 19 seniors were honored while playing their final home game, it was Mizzou's defense that was dominant from start to finish. The Tigers posted 8.0 tackles for loss, including a season-high 5.0 sacks, 4.0 of which came in the first half. Mizzou limited the Razorbacks to 187 total yards, including just 52 on the ground. It was Mizzou's first shutout over an FBS team since Nov. 28, 2010, against Iowa State.
- ▼ Mizzou senior QB Drew Lock, playing in his final home game, went 16-for-25 for 221 yards and two TDs while rushing for two more scores. He exited the game in the fourth quarter to a standing-ovation from the crowd. Lock set the SEC's passing TD record in the Tigers 2017 win at Arkansas before it was broken by Joe Burrow last year.
- ▼ One of the more memorable matchups between Mizzou and Arkansas came during the 2007 season in the 2008 Cotton Bowl. In that game, Mizzou earned a 38-7 win to finish with an 11-2 record and a No. 4 national ranking. Mizzou senior RB Tony Temple set a single-game Cotton Bowl Classic rushing record with 281 yards and four touchdowns in the victory.

LAST TIME OUT

- ▼ Mizzou Football defeated SEC East foe Vanderbilt, 41-0, last Saturday afternoon (Nov. 28) at Memorial Stadium, improving to 4-3 (4-3 SEC) in head coach **Elijah Drinkwitz's** first season at the helm of the program. The Tigers used a stout defensive effort, limiting Vanderbilt to 196 total yards, and a dominant rushing attack from **Larry Rountree III** and **Tyler Badie** who helped Mizzou rush for 223 yards on the ground in the win.
- ▼ The win marked Mizzou's first SEC shutout since the 2018 season-finale when Mizzou defeated Arkansas, 38-0. It was Mizzou's first shutout since a 50-0 win over SEMO, Sept. 14, 2019. The win marked Mizzou's largest margin of victory in an SEC game since joining the league.
- ▼ The Tigers have now won four of the last five games, with their only loss in that span coming at No. 10 Florida on Halloween night. Mizzou has allowed just 20 points over its last three wins.
- ▼ Junior **Nick Bolton** once again anchored a dominant defensive performance, posting nine tackles with 2.0 tackles for loss and one sack with a pass breakup. Rountree also rushed for a career-high three touchdowns and 160 yards on 21 carries to lead the offense. Thanks to the rushing attack, Mizzou never punted in the game.
- ▼ Junior RB **Tyler Badie** posted seven catches and 102 yards (both career-highs) while rushing for 18 yards on five carries with a score. He is the first Mizzou running back to post a 100-yard receiving game since Michael Jones (1987-90) had 118 yards receiving against Nebraska in 1990.

OTHER NOTABLES FROM LAST SATURDAY'S WIN

- ▼ Mizzou secured its first shutout victory since blanking Southeast Missouri a year ago (Sept. 14, 2019).
- ▼ The Tigers' dominant 41-point triumph Saturday marked their largest-ever margin of victory against an SEC opponent. Mizzou's previous standard was 38 points, as it shutout Arkansas two years ago in Columbia (Nov. 23, 2018).
- ▼ Mizzou's offense was clicking on all cylinders against Vanderbilt, accumulating 603 total yards (380 passing yards, 223 rushing yards). It's the most single-game total yards produced by the Tigers in two years, as they tallied a collective 637 total yards vs. Oklahoma State in the Liberty Bowl (Dec. 31, 2018). It was their fourth-most yards ever in an SEC game. Mizzou is now 22-3 all-time when hanging 600 yards of total offense on its opponent.
- ▼ Senior RB **Larry Rountree III** tallied a 7-yard rushing

touchdown on Mizzou's opening drive, marking his fourth consecutive game with a score on the ground. The four-straight contests with a rushing touchdown is tied for the longest of Rountree's career (final game of 2018, plus opening three games in 2019).

- ▼ Rountree's impressive four-game streak is the longest by a Tiger since Marcus Murphy, as he accomplished the feat over Mizzou's first four games in 2013. Additionally, Kendial Lawrence was the last Tiger to also produce four consecutive rushing scores in SEC play (2012).
- ▼ With a pair of 25-plus yard rushes Saturday, Rountree III now possesses 18-such career rushes. He now moves into solo possession of third place all-time of 25-plus yard rushing plays.
- ▼ In the second quarter, Rountree added another 7-yard rushing touchdown, clinching the seventh multi-rushing touchdown game of his career. The Raleigh, N.C., native tacked on a 25-yard rushing score early in the fourth quarter, tying his single-game career-best mark of three rushing touchdowns. Rountree III is now responsible for the last two Tigers individual performances of three-plus rushing touchdowns, joining his performance two years ago vs. Memphis (Oct. 20, 2018).
- ▼ Rountree III's fourth quarter score gave Mizzou four overall rushing touchdowns Saturday. It's the first time the Tigers tallied four rushing scores in a single-game in two years (Sept. 22, 2018 vs. Georgia).
- ▼ Junior RB **Tyler Badie** filled the stat sheet Saturday, totaling 18 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while totaling 102 yards on seven receptions in the passing game. The seven receptions matched his single-game career-high (seven at Wyoming - Aug. 31, 2019) and his 102 receiving yards easily established a new career-best, surpassing his previous standard of 82 (at Kentucky - Oct. 26, 2019).
- ▼ Badie's 102 receiving yards marked the Tigers' first 100-plus receiving yards performance by a running back in 30 years. Mike Jones last accomplished the feat with 118 receiving yards from the running back position against Nebraska (Oct. 13, 1990).
- ▼ Redshirt freshman QB **Connor Bazelak** was highly productive and efficient despite not throwing a touchdown Saturday, going 30-of-37 (81%) with 318 passing yards. It stood as his second game this season with a completion percentage greater than 81% and 300-plus passing yards. Since 2000, Bazelak and Chase Daniel are the only Tiger QB's with multiple contests of 81% or higher completion percentages.
- ▼ Behind an highly-productive first half (8 rec., 62 yards), redshirt sophomore WR **Tauskie Dove** surpassed his single-game career-high in receptions. It surpassed his previous high of six receptions earlier this season vs. LSU (Oct. 10).
- ▼ Freshman RB **Elijah Young** easily enjoyed his most productive outing yet as a Tiger, totaling a season-high 52 yards on four attempts. His rush of 35 yards in the fourth quarter was the longest by any player from either squad Saturday.
- ▼ Freshman QB **Brady Cook** made his Mizzou debut in the fourth quarter, leading the Tigers to a five play, 67-yard touchdown producing drive. He capped off the impressive drive with his first career touchdown throw, connecting with graduate WR **Damon Hazelton** on a 25-yard strike in the corner of the end zone. It also marked Hazelton's first career touchdown reception as a Tiger.
- ▼ For the second-straight game, Mizzou shut out its opposition in the first half. The Tigers limited the Commodores' offense to only 93 total yards (44 passing yards, 49 rushing yards) in the first 30 minutes of action Saturday. Additionally, Vanderbilt only managed six first downs in the opening half.
- ▼ The Tigers routinely pressured Vanderbilt's quarterback, leading to 3.0 total sacks. Redshirt sophomore DE **Trajan Jeffcoat** added onto his team-high sack total, now possessing 4.0 takedowns on the year.
- ▼ Mizzou recorded its first turnover of the afternoon in the third quarter, as sophomore MLB **Devin Nicholson** registered his first forced fumble of the season and junior CB **Jarvis Ware** earned his first fumble recovery this year. Following his game-clinching interception last week vs. South Carolina (Nov. 21),

- Freshman **K Harrison Mevis** capped off Mizzou's opening drive of the second half with a 21-yard field goal. He has produced at least one made field goal in all seven contests this season.
- Mevis added a 44-yard field goal on the Tigers' next drive of the third quarter, marking his third 40-plus yard field goal this season.

BOLTON IS THE NATION'S BEST LINEBACKER, DON'T @ US

- As national award season approaches, allow us to take this time to launch a campaign for **Nick Bolton** to be considered for basically every national defensive player of the year award. He is undoubtedly the best defensive player Mizzou has at any position, and has been a workhorse all season for Coach Drinkwitz and DC Ryan Walters, playing in all seven games. Here are the awards he is currently in consideration for with three games still to play:
 - o Nagurski Trophy
 - o Bednarik Award
 - o Butkus Award
 - o Lott IMPACT Trophy
 - o Jason Witten Man of the Year
- With a skillset and a track-record known nationally coming into the season, Bolton has not disappointed during his junior campaign when other players with similar credentials were opting out. A projected first-round draft pick, Bolton has done plenty to impress NFL scouts this season. He is coming off of another game where he was just flying all over the field while filling the stat sheet. He had nine tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and a pass breakup while sitting much of the second half as Mizzou had put the game away, keying Mizzou's first SEC shutout since 2018. All nine of his tackles last Saturday were solo tackles.
- He now ranks 16th nationally and seventh in Power 5 in tackles per game (10.86). That mark is third-best in the SEC as well.
- Bolton has 28 more tackles than the next-closest Mizzou defender with 76 on the year (53 solo), and leads the team in tackles for loss (7.0).
- He is fifth in the SEC in tackles for loss as well.
- Bolton was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week following Mizzou's win over Kentucky, posting seven tackles in the dominant defensive performance, while the seven tackles may not seem like many by Bolton's lofty standards, it's important to note that he tallied those seven solo tackles among just 28 team tackles against Kentucky as the Wildcats ran just 36 offensive plays.
- Since Oct. 12, 2019, after Mizzou senior captain LB Cale Garrett went down with a season-ending injury, Bolton has tallied 147 tackles over the last 14 games (10.5 per-game average).
- The last Tiger to average better than 10.5 tackles per game over a similar span was LB Kentrell Brothers during his All-American 2015 season when he led the nation with 152 tackles. Brothers averaged 12.7 tackles per game that year and 12.2 over the final 14 games of his career.
- Bolton's 17 tackles at Tennessee are tied for the second-most at Mizzou since the turn of the century and are the most since a 20-tackle performance by LB Sean Weatherspoon against Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2008.
- Bolton has entered the prestigious 21-MPH club at Mizzou as the strength staff tracks each players' top speed. At 6-0, 235 pounds, Bolton is by far the heaviest player on the team to run faster than 21 MPH, showing why he has NFL scouts turning their heads to watch him play.

BAZELAK IS THE GUY AT QB

- With Mizzou winning four of its last five games, one of the keys to the recovery from an 0-2 start was the emergence of RS freshman **Connor Bazelak** as the team's starting quarterback. In his young career, Bazelak is now 5-1 as a starting QB dating back to his first career start at Arkansas last season.
- In his six career starts, Mizzou's freshman QB is now 134-for-183 (73.2%) for 1,416 yards and five touchdowns against only one INT, most importantly winning five of those six games.
- He was highly productive and efficient despite not throwing a touchdown last Saturday vs. Vandy, going 30-of-37 (81%) with

318 passing yards. It stood as his second game this season with a completion percentage greater than 81% and 300-plus passing yards. Since 2000, Bazelak and Chase Daniel, a 2007 Heisman finalist, are the only Tiger QBs with multiple contests of an 81% or higher completion percentage.

- He was the first Mizzou QB to complete 30 passes in a game since Kelly Bryant did so in last year's season-opener at Wyoming.

RUNNING GAME REVIVED AS BOROM, DELGADO RETURN

- In Mizzou's dominant win over Kentucky on Oct. 24, the Tigers ran the ball for 220 yards (then a season-high) as it won its second straight game. Unfortunately in that game, Mizzou lost its starting left guard **Xavier Delgado** and starting RT **Larry Borom** to injury late in that game.
- With Borom and Delgado on the shelf with those injuries, Mizzou struggled to get the run game untracked against Florida and South Carolina. In fact, in those two games Mizzou rushed for just 138 yards on 57 attempts (2.4 avg.), and in turn it managed just 34 points in those two games.
- But, last Saturday against Vanderbilt both Borom and Delgado came back from their injuries and Mizzou seemingly got the run game going again, rushing for a season-high 223 yards and four scores on the ground. It was Mizzou's most rushing yards in a game since hanging 233 on Ole Miss in a 38-27 Homecoming win on Oct. 12, 2019, a span of 12 games.
- Borom is Mizzou's highest-graded O-Lineman this season according to Pro Football Focus, checking in an 82.4 over 364 snaps this season. He has allowed just one QB hurry and no QB hits this season.

ROUNTREE IS A WORK HORSE

- Mizzou senior RB **Larry Rountree III** is arguably one of the SEC's top running backs and the numbers prove it. He keyed a dominant ground game that hung 223 rushing yards on the Commodores in last Saturday's win over Vandy.
- Rountree ran for 160 yards on 21 carries (7.6 avg.) while matching a career-high three touchdowns. The game marked his fourth consecutive contest with a score, the longest such streak of his career and longest by a Tiger since 2013. It was the longest such streak for a Tiger in SEC play since 2012.
- With a pair of 25-plus yard rushes Saturday, Rountree III now possesses 18-such rushes in his career. He now moves into sole possession of third place all-time of 25-plus yard rushing plays. In the second quarter, Rountree added another 7-yard rushing touchdown, clinching the seventh multi-rushing touchdown game of his career.
- The Raleigh, N.C., native tacked on a 25-yard rushing score early in the fourth quarter, tying his single-game career-best mark of three rushing touchdowns.
- Rountree III is now responsible for the last two Tigers individual performances of three-plus rushing touchdowns, joining his performance two years ago vs. Memphis (Oct. 20, 2018).
- Rountree's fourth-quarter score gave Mizzou four overall rushing touchdowns last Saturday. It's the first time the Tigers tallied four rushing scores in a single-game in two years (Sept. 22, 2018 vs. Georgia). He is now fifth in the SEC in rushing yards per game and rushing touchdowns.
- After rushing 21 more times vs. Vandy, Rountree moved his career rushing total to 3,398 yards as he is seventh on the NCAA's list of active rushers.

ROUNTREE RANKS AMONG PROGRAM'S ALL-TIME GREATS

Mizzou senior RB **Larry Rountree III** passed Tiger legend Zack Abron to move into second place on Mizzou's all-time rushing list and the all-time leading rusher at the running back position. He now has 3,398 yards on 680 career carries (4.99 average). He likely won't catch transcendent QB Brad Smith, the school's all-time leading rusher with 4,289 yards. Rountree is 891 yards back of that mark. Below is a look:

The Vandy game marked Rountree's 12th career 100-yard rushing game and third of the season. He is one of six Tigers to record 10+ games of 100 or more rushing yards, joining Brad Smith (18), Zack Abron (11), Henry Josey (11), Joe Moore (11) and Devin West (11). Mizzou is 11-1 when Rountree rushes for 100 yards in his career. Rountree tallied his 32nd, 33rd and 34th career rushing touchdowns against Vandy. That ranks him fourth place all-time at Mizzou. Below is a look at where Rountree ranks on Mizzou's all-time rushing TD list (running backs unless otherwise denoted):

Rountree is averaging 0.76 touchdowns per game in his career. Should he average that mark for the final three games this season, he would finish with 36 career rushing TDs, which would be fourth-most in Mizzou history and second-most among Mizzou running backs. Additionally, Rountree now has 18 runs of 25+ yards in his career, third-most in school history. He also has 21 rushes of 20+ yards, fifth-most in Mizzou history. Below is a look:

BLEDSOE EMERGING AS ELITE PLAYMAKER

Mizzou may have the SEC's best trio of safeties (more on that later), and one of the keys to that trio is senior **Joshuah Bledsoe**. In Mizzou's first two wins, Bledsoe made the game-

winning defensive play. Big-time players make big-time plays, and Bledsoe has personified that moniker recently.

Against LSU, it was his fourth-down pass breakup as LSU QB Myles Brennan was looking for Terrace Marshall, Jr., in the end zone on an out-route from the 1-yard line. Bledsoe – nicknamed Jiggy by his teammates – jumped the route and knocked the ball down to seal the win. Against Kentucky, with Mizzou up 10 late, Kentucky completed a pass on first down and Bledsoe made the tackle. In the process, he ripped the ball from WR Josh Ali for a fumble. That gave the ball back to Mizzou and the Tigers milked the clock from there.

RAKESTRAW PUTTING TOGETHER A FINE FRESHMAN SEASON

Mizzou head coach **Elijah Drinkwitz** went viral back in February during national signing day when a video of him reacting to **Ennis Rakestraw, Jr.**, committing to Mizzou made its way around the internet. A three-star prospect, Rakestraw was a late-bloomer who began to garner interest from schools like Alabama and Texas late in the recruiting cycle, but he stayed solid to his commitment and chose the Tigers. Through the first half of his freshman season, the Tigers are fortunate he did. Rakestraw leads the Tigers with five passes defended and he's pitched in 15 solo tackles and two tackles for loss while starting every game, the only Mizzou cornerback to do so. He tallied his first career sack at South Carolina. Rakestraw started his first collegiate game, becoming the first Tiger defender to start his first game since Jordan Ulmer in 2017. Before that, the last defender to make a start in his first collegiate game at Mizzou was Justin Smith in 1998. Smith of course is on the NFL Hall of Fame ballot and is a former NFL Defensive Player of the Year.

JEFFCOAT MAKING AN IMPACT

In his third year with the program, RS sophomore buck DE **Trajan Jeffcoat** has shined this season. Through six appearances, he leads the team with 4.0 sacks and seven QB hurries while pitching in 144 tackles (10 solo).

TIGERS MAY HAVE THE SEC'S BEST TRIO OF SAFETIES

One of the strongest position groups for the Tigers on this year's defense is the safety position. Mizzou's two elder statesmen on the back end of the defense – FS **Joshuah Bledsoe** and boundary safety **Tyree Gillespie** – are long-known as being one of the nation's elite safety tandems. But, after the first half of the season, we also need to insert SS **Martez Manuel** into the conversation. Manuel – whose SS spot is a hybrid linebacker/safety position as part of Mizzou's five-DB scheme – is currently third on the team with 40 tackles and second on the team with 5.0 tackles for loss. The trio has combined for 104 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, nine pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Gillespie has 37 tackles and three pass breakups and is gaining attention around the league as a guy who could have a huge impact at the next level. Bledsoe, mentioned earlier for making big-time plays, has 27 tackles and leads the safety group with four pass breakups (second on the team behind only freshman CB **Ennis Rakestraw, Jr.**). Bledsoe also has the aforementioned forced fumble and recovery to clinch the win against Kentucky. Coached by defensive coordinator Ryan Walters, a rising young star in the coaching profession who landed at No. 8 on The Athletic's Assistant Coaches to Watch list over the summer, Mizzou's safeties are a proven commodity in the SEC. Gillespie was tabbed a 2020 second-team All-SEC pick during the preseason by the league's coaches after posting 50 tackles over 12 games last year, including 4.0 tackles for loss, one sack and seven pass breakups. Bledsoe, who made the jersey change from #18 to #1 this season, finished 2019 ranked third on the team with 49 tackles (35 solo) with 4.0 tackles for loss. He added a team-high 10 pass breakups with a fumble recovery and also forced fumble. His 49 tackles were a new single-season career-high and he became the first Mizzou safety in more than a decade to post 10+ pass break-ups in a single season and just the eighth Mizzou defender to do so since 2009.

BADIE A STAR IN THE PASSING GAME, TOO

- Dating back to last season, junior RB **Tyler Badie** has emerged as a threat in the passing game. In fact, he has caught five of Mizzou's last 10 TD receptions, and six of the last 12. Here is a look:
 - vs. Vanderbilt - Cook to Hazelton for 25
 - at South Carolina - Bazelak to Dove for 20

- On his last five scores, Badie has taken it to the house from all parts of the field, averaging 34.2 yards per score as he continued to be dynamic with the ball in his hands.
- Additionally, Badie caught seven passes for a game-high 102 receiving yards last Saturday vs. Vandy. Badie's 102 receiving yards marked the Tigers' first 100-plus receiving yards performance by a running back in 30 years. Mike Jones last accomplished the feat with 118 receiving yards from the running back position against Nebraska (Oct. 13, 1990).
- He now leads the team with 302 receiving yards this season, as do his two receiving TDs. His 20 catches rank second on the team as well.

TOUCHBACK MASTER

- Mizzou redshirt junior K **Sean Koetting** has mastered the art of the touchback since taking over kickoff duties this season.
- In his career, Koetting has posted 34 touchbacks in 36 attempts, including 33 of 35 through seven games this season. One of the two non-touchbacks was an onside kick attempt.
- He leads the nation with his 94.29 touchback percentage this season.

A HISTORIC PERFORMANCE FOR BAZELAK

- It's important to note that Mizzou's win over LSU featured a redshirt freshman quarterback making his second career start and first of the season guiding Mizzou's dominant offense. **Connor Bazelak**, who had shined in backup duty in Mizzou's first two games, got the start for Coach Drinkwitz and excelled against the defending national champions.
- In his second career start, Bazelak engineered an unbelievable day for the Mizzou offense. At 85.3 percent (29-of-34), Bazelak posted Mizzou's best-ever completion percentage against a ranked opponent or FBS opponent, a mark that is also a Mizzou freshman record. The only performance better than Bazelak's was Chase Daniel's 94.1 completion percentage against Southeast Missouri during his senior season in 2008.
- Bazelak's passer rating of 242.4 was the sixth-best mark in program history, with the other five coming against SEMO, Iowa State, Missouri State, Nevada and Idaho, as it was the best-ever rating against a ranked team for a Mizzou QB. The previous best rating by a Mizzou QB in an SEC game was Drew Lock's 210.3 at Florida in 2018.
- The redshirt freshman passed for 406 yards and four touchdowns – the first Mizzou freshman to pass for four touchdowns in a game since Maty Mauk against Kentucky in 2013 – and the 14th-most passing yards by a Mizzou QB ever.
- Only six Mizzou QBs have ever thrown for more yards than Bazelak did against LSU – keep in mind it was his second career start.
- He led the offense to 586 total yards, including 406 through the air, and at one point completed 15 consecutive passes, the longest such streak since Chase Daniel had 20 straight against Buffalo in 2008 -

Bazelak's streak ended on a ball he had to throw away after being flushed from the pocket.

- Bazelak is the only SEC QB since the turn of the century to have 400 yards, 4 TDs, 85% completion pct. and 0 INTs in a game. Only two other QBs have accomplished a similar stat line against a Power-5 opponent over the same time frame - Geno Smith and Philip Rivers.
- Keep in mind, he did all of this with Mizzou's top two WRs and three of the group's top five out of the lineup due to COVID-related issues.
- Bazelak won the following awards following Mizzou's win over LSU:

TIGERS HAVE A BUDDING YOUNG STAR AT KICKER

- We would be remiss if we didn't mention true freshman kicker **Harrison Mevis** as the Tigers get ready to take on Arkansas this weekend. A native of Warsaw, Ind., Mevis was the No. 2-ranked kicker nationally coming out of Warsaw Community High School by Kohl's Kicking. He has lived up to those expectations early in his young career, connecting on 11 of his 14 field goal attempts this season, with one of his misses coming from 56 yards.
- He is the first Mizzou kicker ever to connect on his first five field goals as a collegiate kicker, and he did so in incredible fashion, hitting a pair from 50+ yards. His 52-yard field goal vs. LSU marks the longest by a Mizzou freshman in program history.
- He is also the first Mizzou freshman to make a 50+ yard FG since Jeff Jacke in 1988.

COACH DRINK GETS FIRST WIN, DOES SO IN NOTABLE FASHION

- Of course, the win over LSU on Oct. 10 marked the first for **Eliah Drinkwitz** as Mizzou head coach. He became the first Mizzou coach to defeat a ranked opponent for his first career Mizzou win since Warren Powers defeated No. 5 Notre Dame, 3-0, on Sept. 9, 1978 in South Bend, Ind. The Irish, by the way, were also the defending national champions, just as LSU was.

#MIZZOU4CHANGE

- Mizzou has been heavily active in social justice reform over the offseason following the untimely deaths of numerous Black individuals.
- First, Mizzou Football student-athletes organized a march from Mizzou's columns to the Boone County Courthouse in June. Many notable Mizzou head coaches and Mizzou Athletics staffers joined the student-athletes during this event. Following the march to the courthouse, more than 60 student-athletes registered to vote.
- Next, Mizzou Football participated in a march from the columns to Memorial Stadium in September. The march was organized by the newly-formed Black Student-Athletes Association (BSAA), and kicked off the organization new movement, named #Mizzou4Change. The group's focus is to begin the conversation on social justice, and how to create a better world for everyone moving forward. Representatives from every Mizzou Athletics sport was in attendance for this march.

WHITESIDE NAMED TO THE WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Mizzou senior DT **Kobie Whiteside** was named to the watch list for The Wuerffel Trophy in July, which recognizes college football's top community servant. Whiteside is one of 114 players from college football's Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to be named to the

watch list. The number is a record for the award since it first began releasing a watch list in 2015.

- The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented each February in Fort Walton Beach. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback from the University of Florida, Danny Wuerffel, the Wuerffel Trophy exists to honor college football players who serve others, celebrate their positive impact on society, and inspire greater service in the world.

VANDERBILT GAME ONE FOR THE BOOKS

- The last time Missouri won a conference game by 41 points was a 58-0 win over Colorado on October 25, 2008.
- The last time Missouri had a 300 yard passer, 100 yard rusher and 100 yard receiver in a conference game was the Ole Miss game in 2019.
- The last time Missouri hit those marks and all three players had touchdowns was November 28, 2009 in a 41-39 win over Kansas when Blaine Gabbert threw for 303 yards and a TD, Derrick Washington ran for 111 and 2 TD and Danario Alexander had 236 yards receiving and a score.
- The last time Missouri had just one penalty was October 22, 2011 in a loss to Oklahoma State (the penalty was for 11 yards). The Mizzou media guide lists only three games in which the Tigers had zero penalty yards: a 20-13 loss to Oklahoma in 1943, a 34-14 win over Kansas in 1964 and the Texas Bowl loss to Navy in 2009. However, the box score from a 52-17 win over Iowa State the week prior to that Oklahoma State game in 2011 also lists Missouri with 0 penalties for 0 yards.

A DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

- Mizzou is expected to play three regular-season games during the calendar's 12th month for the first time since 1896 when it went 4-0 in such games. The Tigers are 9-6 in regular season games December games and 9-10 in the month of December if you count conference championship games.
- Mizzou's last regular season non-championship game in December came during the 2001 season.
- Mizzou's last regular season December win was a 15-13 decision over Kansas on Dec. 1, 1952.

ELIAH DRINKWITZ

A winner at every stage of his coaching career, Eliah Drinkwitz – considered one of college football's top offensive minds – has been named the 33rd head football coach at the University of Missouri in December of 2019. Drinkwitz takes over at Mizzou following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State, where he led the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a 12-1 record and a Sun Belt Conference championship.

Drinkwitz's offensive acumen has been a key element in his teams winning five conference championships while compiling a perfect 8-0 bowl game record in 10 seasons at the FBS level. The combined record of his teams from 2010-19 is 102-38 overall (72.9%), including a 61-26 conference mark (70.1%).

The 2019 season saw Drinkwitz turn in one of the most impressive FBS head coaching debut seasons ever. His Mountaineers set a Sun Belt record with their 12 wins, and also set the mark for the best regular season in conference history (11-1). They claimed the Sun Belt championship with a 45-38 win against Louisiana on Dec. 7.

The 2019 season saw App State become the first-ever Sun Belt program to earn a Top 20 ranking in the Associated Press poll, while also becoming the first team in league history to receive an in-season ranking in the College Football Playoff poll. Drinkwitz's team also made history in 2019 with a pair of Power 5 road wins (at bowl-eligible North Carolina, and later at South Carolina) – making them the first-ever Sun Belt team to register two Power 5 wins in a season. In all, the Mountaineers claimed an FBS-best six road wins this season en route to becoming the first-ever 12-win team among North Carolina's FBS members.

For his efforts, Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious award which goes annually to the nation's top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal in December.

App State proved to be one of the nation's most balanced teams in 2019, thanks in large part to an efficient offense that ranked ninth nationally in scoring (39.4 points per game), coupled with a stingy defense that ranked 22nd nationally in points allowed (20.2 ppg). The Mountaineers also excelled in the critical turnover category, ranking eighth nationally in 2019 with a plus-12 turnover margin. App State junior RB Darrynton Evans was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, after rushing for 1,323 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Prior to App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for record-setting North Carolina State teams (2016-18), after excelling in a similar role at Boise State for two years (2014-15), where the Broncos won the Mountain West title in 2014 and finished 12-2 and ranked 16th nationally. In 2015, Drinkwitz was promoted to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and he helped the Bronco offense rank in the top 15 nationally in points (39.1) and yards (501.3) per game.

In his five seasons as an offensive coordinator, Drinkwitz has produced five 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. Three of those years (2015, 2017, 2018) his offenses produced at least one in each category.

Before Boise, Drinkwitz was a key figure in back-to-back Sun Belt championships in 2012-13 as running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State. He got his first taste at the FBS level in the Southeastern Conference, as he served as a quality control assistant at Auburn for the 2010-11 seasons. The Tigers won the SEC in 2010, and went on to the BCS Championship that season with a perfect 14-0 record.

Following a 7-6 debut season in 2016 at N.C. State, Drinkwitz helped the Wolfpack to consecutive nine-win seasons (2017-18) for the first time since 1991-92. With an average of 35.6 points per game under his direction in 2018, N.C. State had a 1,000-yard rusher for the third-straight year, two 1,000-yard receivers and a quarterback with nearly 4,000 passing yards. The Wolfpack made a steady rise from 63rd nationally in total offense in his first season in 2016 to 25th in 2017 and 16th in 2018. He was a Broyles Award nominee as one of the nation's top assistant coaches in his final year with the Wolfpack.

The Wolfpack offense had six players selected in the 2018 and 2019 NFL Drafts combined, including record-setting QB Ryan Finley, who was a fourth round selection in 2019 by the Cincinnati Bengals.

Drinkwitz, 37, graduated magna cum laude and was the student body president at Arkansas Tech before beginning his coaching career at the prep level in his hometown of Alma, Ark., in 2005. He and his wife, Lindsey, have four daughters: Addison, Emerson, Ella and Parker Lynn.

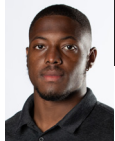

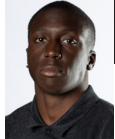
