STORYLINES

- Mississippi State is coming off its highest-ranked win in a true road game in program history after defeating the defending National Champion and then-No. 6 LSU, 44-34, in the season opener. **Mike Leach** is the first MSU head coach to defeat a ranked team in his Bulldog debut.
- K.J. Costello** threw for an SEC-record 623 passing yards, while also breaking MSU records for completions (36) and attempts (60). Costello's passing yards were 11th in FBS single-game history and the most by any quarterback in his first start under head coach **Mike Leach**. No other starter had thrown for 500 yards in their first game in the Air Raid.
- The Bulldogs check in at No. 16 in the Associated Press poll this week, their highest ranking in the poll since Sept. 16, 2018 when they were No. 14. The jump from receiving votes a week ago marks the largest single-week rise in the polls for MSU since State went from receiving votes in Week 3 of the 2014 season to No. 14 in Week 4, gaining 651 points. MSU gained 584 points this week.
- MSU set school records for total offense (640 yards) and rushing yards (460) in an SEC game the last time they met Arkansas. The total offense mark ranks fourth in school history overall. State has set series records for scoring in each of the last two meetings (52 points in 2018; 54 points in 2019).
- Kylin Hill** posted 158 receiving yards in the win at LSU on opening weekend. That's the highest total for a Bulldog running back in program history. Of Hill's yards, 155 came after the catch, highlighted by a 75-yard catch-and-run touchdown that gave MSU the lead in the third quarter. MSU never trailed again in the game.
- Osirus Mitchell** (183), **Kylin Hill** (158) and **JaVonta Payton** (122) became just the second trio in school history to go over 100 yards receiving in the same game. The last time MSU had a trio of receivers crack the century mark came in the 2014 Orange Bowl against Georgia Tech. (Joe Morrow, 117; De'Runnya Wilson, 105; Fred Ross, 102).
- Saturday's matchup features the two teams that will play the toughest schedules in the nation according to ESPN's Football Power Index (FPI) preseason ranking. Arkansas has the toughest slate, and MSU will play the second-hardest schedule in the nation in 2020. SEC teams boast 14 of the 15 strongest schedules according to FPI.
- MSU has need an average of 2:42 to reach the end zone on its eight scoring drives this year, and six of those drives required less than two minutes to reach the endzone. Meanwhile, no scoring drive was shorter than 50 yards, and four were over 70 yards.
- State finished with 15 pass plays of 20 or more yards at LSU last week. The Bulldogs had eight such plays in the first half alone, which surpassed their game total (passing and rushing) from all but one game in 2019 (Arkansas - 9, 6 pass, 3 rush).
- A two-time national coach of the year, **Mike Leach** was hired as the 34th head coach in program history on Jan. 6, 2020. He has won 139 games in 18 seasons as a head coach highlighted by two 11-win seasons, five 9-win seasons, and five 8-win seasons. He's the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008.
- Since 2005, **Mike Leach's** offenses have passed for 500+ yards in 27 games, which is No. 1 in the nation among active FBS head coaches and 16 more than the next head coach during that time frame. His offense has totaled 600+ offensive yards in 26 different games, which ranks third among active FBS head coaches during that span.

34TH HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE 2018 & 2008 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike Leach, a two-time national coach of the year, three-time conference coach of the year and the mastermind behind the NCAA record-setting "Air Raid" offense, was tabbed Mississippi State's 34th head football coach on January 9, 2020.

The accomplishments for Leach in his 18 years as a head coach are long and distinguished. He has compiled a 139-90 (.607) record, guided his squads to 16 bowl games, produced seven seasons of at least nine victories, captured two division titles, become the winningest coach in Texas Tech history and set school records for bowl appearances at both Texas Tech (10) and Washington State (6). During 10 of those 18 seasons, Leach's passing attack led the FBS – six at Texas Tech and four at Washington State.

Of the 50 most productive passing yardage seasons in FBS history, 11 came from quarterbacks coached by Leach since his hiring as head coach at Texas Tech in 2000. That includes three seasons by Graham Harrell (2006-08), two by Luke Falk (2015-16), one by Gardner Mishew II (2018) and one by Anthony Gordon (2019).

Leach, 58, arrives in Starkville after eight seasons at the helm at Washington State where he compiled a 55-47 (.539) record and was named the 2018 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year and two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2015, 2018). Leach spearheaded WSU to a school-record six bowl appearances and became the first coach in school history to lead the Cougars to five consecutive bowl games. They also led the nation in passing offense in four out of his last six seasons in charge.

The 2018 campaign saw Leach produce one of the finest coaching performances as WSU posted its first 11-win season in school history and a share of the Pac-12 North Division. The Cougars were ranked in the top 13 of each College Football Playoff rankings, including four consecutive weeks at No. 8. WSU capped the season with a win over Iowa State in the Alamo Bowl and finished No. 10 in the Associated Press and Coaches polls. Senior quarterback and Mississippi native Minshew captivated the nation, leading the FBS in passing yards per game (367.6).

Leach previously spent 10 seasons as head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09) where his squads produced bowl appearances all 10 years. He compiled a school-record 84 victories, a school-record five bowl wins

and eight consecutive seasons of at least eight victories.

The architect of the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 - the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year and George Munger Award. Leach's offense captured six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous All-American for the second-straight season.

A total of 18 players were drafted at Texas Tech under Leach's watch and 21 others signed free agent contracts. In the spring of 2009, four players were selected among the first four rounds of the NFL Draft, marking the most successful draft for Texas Tech in the Leach era. The program made strides academically as well under Leach. During his 10 years, Texas Tech was recognized as one of the nation's top institutions for consistently being above a 70 percent graduation rate, according to the AFCA.

Prior to coming on board at Texas Tech, Leach, in just one season at Oklahoma, directed a Sooner offense that went from 11th in the Big 12 in 1998 to first in 1999 and 101st in the nation to 11th.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University. Under Mumme and Leach, the Kentucky offense set six NCAA records, 41 Southeastern Conference records and 116 school records in 22 games.

Leach and Mumme first teamed up at Iowa Wesleyan College in 1989 where he served as offensive coordinator and line coach until 1991. He has also made stops in Pori, Finland, where he served as a head coach in the European Football League (1989), as well as one-year stints at College of the Desert (1988) and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (1987).

IN THE BOOTH

Associate Head Coach/Nickelbacks | 9th season (second stint)

Veteran coach and heralded recruiter with three decades of experience in his home state of Mississippi ... Spent seven seasons (2009-15) as recruiting coordinator and safeties coach at Mississippi State prior to becoming the head coach at Jackson State University ... Boasting a reputation as being one of the top recruiters in college football, Hughes played a pivotal role in helping State land 22 signees for the 2020 class, including 11 top-30 prospects from Mississippi ... A teacher and mentor to his student-athletes, Hughes has excelled at identifying players in the state of Mississippi that leave MSU as NFL prospects, including Super Bowl Champions Fletcher Cox and Chris Jones, three-time Pro Bowl defensive back Darius Slay, 2012 Jim Thorpe Award winner Johnthan Banks and first-team All-American Benardrick McKinney.



ZACH ARNETT

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers | 1st season

Rising star in college football's coaching ranks ... Learned under one of the game's great defensive minds in former New Mexico and San Diego State head coach Rocky Long ... Member of the prestigious AFCA 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute in 2020 ... Spent the first nine years of his coaching career at San Diego State, beginning as a defensive graduate assistant in 2011 before being elevated to linebackers coach in 2014 and eventually promoted to defensive coordinator in 2018 ... Led an SDSU defense that ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing defense (No. 2), scoring defense (No. 3), interceptions (No. 4), first downs allowed (No. 4), total defense (No. 6), passing efficiency defense (No. 6) and takeaways (No. 8) in 2019 ... Logged 200 career tackles as a linebacker at New Mexico from 2005-08 and helped the Lobos to consecutive bowl appearances in 2006 and 2007.



MATT BROCK

Special Team Coordinator/Outside Linebackers | 1st season

Selected to the AFCA's prestigious 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute for 2020 ... In 2019 at Washington State, coached kicker Blake Mazza who led the Pac-12 in scoring (115 points) on his way to first-team All-Pac-12 honors ... Mazza was a Lou Groza Award finalist and midseason All-America second team selection by The Athletic and made a program-record 18 straight field goals to start the season ... Tutored eight all-conference performers and a pair of All-Americans during his coaching career, with six specialists and two linebackers earning the honor ... Played and began his coaching career at Baker University in Baldwin City, Kansas ... A two-time all-conference pick and two-time NAIA Academic All-American who tallied 277 career tackles and seven interceptions.



DARCEL McBATH

Cornerbacks | 1st season

Spent three seasons at Washington State (2017-19), including part of the 2019 season as interim co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach ... Led a defense in 2019 as co-interim defensive coordinator that finished the year No. 5 in the Pac-12 in takeaways (19) and tied for second in fumbles gained (9) ... Cornerbacks unit combined for five takeaways in 2018, highlighted by four interceptions while breaking up 18 passes on the year and adding 3.0 sacks ... Earned his degree in four years while playing for Mike Leach at Texas Tech from 2004-08 and spent five seasons in the NFL after being selected in the second round of the 2009 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos ... Played five seasons in the NFL with two seasons in Denver, one in Jacksonville and two in San Francisco ... Appeared in Super Bowl XLVII as a member of the 49ers and made one tackle.



ERIC MELE

IN THE BOOTH

Running Backs | 1st season

Spent eight seasons at Washington State, coaching the running backs during his final two seasons (2018-19) ... Spent three seasons coaching special teams (2015-17) after three seasons as an offensive quality control (2012-14) ... Tutored three All-Pac-12 honorees at WSU, including running back Max Borghi who was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honorable mention in 2018 ... Kicker Erik Powell earned All-Pac-12 second team honors in 2017 and finished No. 3 on WSU's all-time points kicking list with a school-record 164 career extra points ... Powell ranked third in school history in field goals made (51) and career field goal percentage (72.8) ... Helped WSU's special teams reach multiple milestones in 2016, as the Cougars recorded a kick return TD and punt return for a score for the first time in the same season since 1968, and the punt return unit finished No. 9 nationally (13.48 yd/rtn).



MASON MILLER

Offensive Line | 1st season

No stranger to the Air Raid system, after working with both Mike Leach and Hal Mumme, two of the Air Raid's architects ... Has coached at all three levels of the NCAA and been a key part in establishing lethal offenses at each stop ... In two seasons at Washington State, three student-athletes earned All-Pac-12 honors and the offensive line allowed the fewest sacks in the Pac-12 during that span while protecting college football's top passing attack in consecutive seasons, generating 437.2 passing yards per game during the 2019 campaign ... Helped Andre Dillard become the top pass-blocking tackle in the country per Pro Football Focus and earn first-team All-Pac-12 and second-team All-America honors in 2019 before becoming the highest drafted Cougar offensive lineman in program history when the Philadelphia Eagles selected him in the first round of the 2019 NFL Draft.



DAVE NICHOL

Inside Receivers | 1st season

Has spent nine of his 20 years as a collegiate coach under Mike Leach, including five at Texas Tech and four at Washington State ... Owns 12 career bowl game appearances ... In four seasons at WSU, helped Gabe Marks become the Pac-12 all-time receptions leader (316) and finish No. 2 all-time in receiving touchdowns (37), while earning first-team All-Pac-12 honors in 2016 ... Helped Brandon Arconado finish with a Cougars single-season-record seven 100-yard receiving games on his way to leading the conference in receiving yards per game (100.8) in 2019 ... SERIES NOTABLES

MSU and Arkansas are meeting for the 31st time ... The first meeting in the series was in 1916, a 20-7 Bulldog victory ... The two schools met only twice prior to 1992 when the Razorbacks joined the SEC ... This is the 29th straight year the two teams are playing each other ... State has claimed seven out of the last eight meetings ... The Bulldogs have set series records for scoring in each of the last two meetings (52 points in 2018; 54 points in 2019) ... In their last meeting, MSU set school records for total offense (640 yards) and rushing yards (460) in an SEC game ... In Fayetteville in 2015, Beniquez Brown blocked a potential game-winning 29-yard field goal with 0:39 remaining, while Dak Prescott became the first quarterback in SEC history to record over 550 yards of total offense and seven touchdowns in a game ... In 2014, Will Redmond intercepted Brandon Allen with 0:16 to play preserving a 17-10 win for the No. 1 Bulldogs ... In 2013 in Fayetteville, Damian Williams scored on 25-yard touchdown run in overtime and Taveze Calhoun recorded an interception on the Razorbacks' overtime possession ... State's 52-6 win over the Hogs in 2018 in Starkville was its largest margin of victory in the series ... State's fourth- and sixth-highest all-time marks for total offense have come against Arkansas (640, 2019; 631, 2015) ... 502 miles separate the two campuses.

Offense Explodes in Historic Performance at Arkansas, 54-24

Mississippi State pounded out 640 yards of total offense and 460 yards rushing – both school records for an SEC game – as the Bulldogs snapped a four-game losing streak with a dominating 54-24 victory over Arkansas in Razorback Stadium. **Kylin Hill** rushed for a career-high 234 yards – just 24 shy of the school record – and three touchdowns. **Tommy Stevens** made the start at quarterback as **Garrett Shrader** was limited by health issues during the week. Stevens guided State to points on its first drive of the game, going six plays for 82 yards that was set up by a 62-yard Hill run to the Arkansas 3-yard line. The grad transfer QB then ignited an 11-play, 80-yard drive that ate up 5:21 before culminating with a fade route, 33-yard touchdown to **Osirus Mitchell** with 5:31 to go in the first quarter. Hill had 198 yards and three touchdowns in the first half. The Bulldogs put the game out of reach right before the half ended when **Marcus Murphy**, making his first career start, stepped in front of a pass and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown to make it 38-10 at the break. Murphy finished with a team-high eight tackles. State continued the onslaught with more consecutive scoring drives to start the second half. **Farrod Green** caught his first touchdown of the season, and **Jace Christmann** capped a dominating drive that lasted 7:23 with a 46-yard field goal. **Erroll Thompson** added eight tackles, while **Willie Gay Jr.** finished with five tackles, 0.5 for loss and one fumble recovery. The Bulldogs scored on eight of their 11 drives on the day.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

According to ESPN's Football Power Index (FPI) preseason ranking, MSU will play the second-hardest schedule in the nation in 2020. Only Arkansas has a higher strength of schedule rating. SEC teams boast 14 of the 15 strongest schedules according to FPI. Five of State's 10 opponents were ranked in the AP Preseason Top 25, and all five were among the Top 15.

2010s: THE MOST SUCCESSFUL DECADE IN MSU HISTORY

From 2010-19, State posted a 79-61 (.564) record on the field, appeared in a bowl every season, finished in the final polls four times (2010, 2014, 2017, 2018) and produced 15 All-American honors and 37 first or second-team All-SEC selections. In 2014, the Bulldogs went from unranked to No. 1 faster than any team in college football history and spent five consecutive weeks at the top spot. Prior to the 2010s, the Bulldogs' best decade was the 1990s with 64 total victories.

FROM STATE TO SUNDAYS

Bulldogs continue to dominate NFL rosters in 2020 with over 33 players on active rosters or practice squads. Six current active Bulldogs have been selected to the Pro Bowl during their careers, including Dallas Cowboys starting quarterback Dak Prescott, Philadelphia Eagles defensive tackle Fletcher Cox, Houston Texans linebacker Benardrick McKinney, Philadelphia Eagles cornerback Darius Slay, Seattle Seahawks linebacker K.J. Wright and Kansas City Chiefs defensive tackle Chris Jones, who won his first Super Bowl ring in February.

UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP

Mike Leach was hired as the 34th head coach in program history on Jan. 9, 2020. He previously spent eight seasons at Washington State where he was twice named Pac-12 Coach of the Year. In 2018, he was tabbed the AFCA National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. Prior to his stint with the Cougars, Leach took Texas Tech to a bowl game in 10 consecutive seasons, setting a program record with 84 victories in his tenure. He's the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008.

ARNETT TO DIRECT DEFENSE

Leach tabbed **Zach Arnett**, a rising star in college football's coaching ranks, to serve as his defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. Arnett, who was selected as a member of the prestigious AFCA 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute in 2020, led a 2019 San Diego State defense that ranked in the top 10 nationally in seven categories.

RECORDS AGAINST THE RAZORBACKS

The Bulldogs set school records for total offense (640 yards) and rushing yards (460) in an SEC game the last time they met Arkansas.

- RB **Kylin Hill**'s 234 rushing yards were the fifth most in a single game in school history
- At the time of the game, that was the most rushing yards by an SEC player in a conference game since LSU's Derrius Guice had 276 vs. Ole Miss on Oct. 21, 2017
- 198 of his 234 yards during the first half which marked the most rushing yards by a MSU player in a half in school history

50 BURGER

Mississippi State has scored 50+ points in at least one game in nine consecutive seasons, entering the 2020 campaign. The last time MSU did so came in a 54-24 victory at Arkansas on Nov. 2, 2019. The 54 points were MSU's most in an SEC game since the Bulldogs' 55-20 win at Ole Miss on Nov. 26, 2016. State has put up 50+ points four times since 2018, tied for the fourth most in the SEC during that span. The Bulldogs are one of just four SEC teams to log multiple 50+ point games against SEC opponents during that stretch. MSU has scored 50+ points 17 times over the last 15 seasons and is 17-0 in those games.

DOWNING THE DEFENDING CHAMPS

Mississippi State became the biggest story in college football last week. The Bulldogs defeated reigning National Champion and then-No. 6 LSU, 44-34, in Baton Rouge to open the season.

- The win marked the first time a defending national champion lost its season opener since 1998 when No. 5 Michigan lost at No. 22 Notre Dame, 36-20
- It was the first time a defending national champion lost its opener at home since 1978 when No. 5 Notre Dame lost to unranked Missouri, 3-0
- MSU's victory snapped the longest active win streak in the country (16 games)
- The game was MSU's highest-ranked victory in a true road game in school history
- **Mike Leach** is the first MSU coach to defeat a ranked team in his Bulldog debut
- It was MSU's first win in Baton Rouge since 2014 and just its second since the 1992 season

THIRD DOWN'S THE CHARM

The Bulldogs put together one of the best third-down performances in recent memory in their win at LSU last week. QB **K.J. Costello** was 7-of-11 on third downs for 194 yards and three touchdowns. Each completion led to a first down, with six going for 15 or more yards and four of those longer than 25 yards.

State was even more impressive on third and long. When needing 10 yards or more, Costello was 5-of-7 while tossing two touchdowns.

QUICK STRIKES

MSU moved down the field quickly, chewing up yardage on its way to the end zone. The Bulldogs put together eight scoring drives, with an average drive time of 2:42. Six of those eight drives required less than two minutes to reach the endzone.

- Average scoring drive was 6.75 plays, covered 67.1 yards and consumed 2:42
- No scoring drive was shorter than 50 yards and four were over 70 yards
- MSU's shortest drive required one play as RB **Kylin Hill** caught a 75-yard touchdown pass, taking just 15 seconds off the clock

TWO-DOWN OFFENSE

One of the many reasons **Mike Leach**'s offenses are so efficient is they avoid third down. Over the last four seasons, Leach's teams have recorded the fourth-lowest percentage of overall plays that are third down plays at 15.4 percent (among coaches with multiple years of experience).

- Just 23 percent of Leach's first downs came on third down plays since 2017.
- Leach's offenses have gone three and out on just 14.53 percent of possessions over the last 17 seasons, which ranks No. 1 among active FBS head coaches with 5+ years of experience.

EYEING THE RECORD BOOK

Mike Leach's Air Raid offense has broken records at every school he's coached at over a 30-plus-year career. In just 22 games as the offensive coordinator at Kentucky, his offense broke 116 school records. Under his guidance, Washington State set or tied 42 school, Pac-12 or NCAA records in 2014 alone.

At Iowa Wesleyan, his offense broke 26 national records. In 1993 at Valdosta State, the Blazer offense smashed 66 school records, 22 conference records and seven national records. The following year, they again shattered 80 school records, 35 conference records and seven more national marks.

The first Mississippi State school record has already fallen as the Bulldogs passed for 623 yards against LSU in Leach's first game on Sept. 26. Many more are in jeopardy, as Leach's WSU offense has surpassed them on more than one occasion during his tenure.

THE QUARTERBACK WHISPERER

Mike Leach has coached a 3,000+ yard passer in 17 of his 18 seasons as a head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09) and Washington State (2012-19). His first 3,000+ yard passer as a head coach was Kliff Kingsbury in 2000, Tech's first in program history. The Bulldogs have not had a 3,000-yard passer since Dak Prescott threw for a school-record 3,793 yards in 2015.

MSU's last 1,000-yard receiver was Fred Ross (1,007 yards) on his way to setting the single-season Bulldog record with 88 catches in 2015.

THE CENTURY CLUB

For just the second time in school history, MSU saw three players eclipse 100 receiving yards in a game in the win at LSU last week. WR **Osirus Mitchell** (183), RB **Kylin Hill** (158) and WR **JaVonta Payton** (122) all went over 100 yards.

- The only other time MSU had a trio of receivers crack the century mark came in the Orange Bowl vs. Georgia Tech on Dec. 31, 2014 (Joe Morrow, 117; De'Runnya Wilson, 105; Fred Ross, 102)
- First time MSU had multiple 100-yard receivers since Donald Gray (207) and Fred Ross (107) did so against Samford on Oct. 29, 2016
- Mitchell and Hill were the first SEC duo to record 150 receiving yards in the same game since 2012
- The Bulldogs had a combined two 100-yard receivers over their previous 39 games
- MSU had not had a single receiver record 100 yards against LSU since 2014
- LSU had not allowed more than 420 passing yards in a game over the last six seasons

GRADING THE AIR RAID

Mike Leach is one of the original architects of the Air Raid offense and few have proven its effectiveness more than he has. While at Washington State, Leach's Cougars ranked in the top 20 in passing grade according to Pro Football Focus in four of the last six years. His teams also led the NCAA in passing yardage four times while at WSU.

AIRING IT OUT

QBs **Will Rogers** and **K.J. Costello** are no strangers to the Air Raid offense. Rogers ran a similar scheme at Brandon High School. He was recruited by head coach **Mike Leach** while he was still at Washington State before committing to MSU prior to Leach's hiring. Brandon was also home to Jacksonville Jaguars QB Gardner Minshew II, who led the nation in passing under Leach at Washington State in 2018.

Costello went head-to-head against Leach and Minshew while he was at Stanford. He would watch the defense's scout team film on the Cougars because he was intrigued by the Air Raid concepts. This summer, Costello and Rogers teamed up to teach their teammates the new offense before fall camp began.

PASSERS IN THEIR FIRST START UNDER LEACH

K.J. Costello became the 16th quarterback to start a game under **Mike Leach** since 2000, and shattered MSU's single-game records for completions and attempts on his way to an SEC record 623 passing yards at LSU on Sept. 26. Below is a look at each quarterback's first start under Leach.

- Nine completed at least 30 passes in their debut under the "Quarterback Whisperer"
- Six passers threw for 400 or more yards
- Seven passed for four or more touchdowns in their first start in Leach's system
- Five made their first start in his system against a conference opponent
- Anthony Gordon, turned in a 230.8 passer rating on the back of 420 yards and five touchdowns on Aug. 31, 2019 against New Mexico State
- Steven Sheffield posted the highest passer rating (232.30), most passing yards (490) and most touchdowns (7) in his first Leach start (vs. Kansas State on Oct. 10, 2009)
- Cody Hodges also posted a passer rating above 200.0 against FIU on Sept. 10, 2005 (217.1).

STATE HAS A TAKEAWAY IN 27 OF ITS LAST 30 GAMES

The Bulldogs have collected at least one takeaway in 27 of their last 30 games dating back to the 2017 season at Arkansas on Nov. 18. State has compiled 53 takeaways over the 30-game stretch. MSU had a takeaway streak of 22 straight games before it was unable to force a takeaway vs. No. 2 LSU on Oct. 19, 2019.

TAKEAWAYS, TURNOVER MARGIN IN 2019 (MULTIPLE TAKEAWAYS/INT)

After ranking sixth in the SEC in total takeaways with 20 in 2018, State racked up 24 takeaways in 13 games in 2019 (2nd in SEC, T-15th in FBS).

- Gained 14 fumbles in 2019 (T-1st in SEC, T-4th in FBS)
- Recorded multiple takeaways in eight games
- Gained at least one fumble in seven games
- Gained three fumbles three times (at Louisiana, vs. Kansas State, at Auburn)
- Picked off at least one pass in seven contests
- Logged multiple INTs three times (vs. Southern Miss, at Tennessee, vs. Abilene Christian)

MSU HAS AN INTERCEPTION IN 20 OF ITS LAST 27 GAMES

State has collected an interception in 20 of its last 27 games and has 25 total interceptions during that stretch. MSU carried a streak of nine straight games with a pickoff into the Kansas State game on Sept. 14, 2019, before it was ended. The 25 pickoffs have been credited to 14 different players, including seven on the 2020 roster.

BRINGING THE PRESSURE

- The Dawg defense picked up 7.0 sacks to open the season at LSU, surpassing their single-game high from all of 2019 (4.0)
- The last time MSU had 7.0 sacks was against Ole Miss on Nov. 28, 2015
- State leads the nation in sacks per game (7.00)
- State has at least 4.0 sacks in each of its last four games dating back to Nov. 23, 2019 against Abilene Christian
- Last year, State finished with 28.0 sacks for the season

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 200 YARDS RUSHING

Since the start of the 2018 season, MSU has held 24 of its 27 opponents below the 200-yard rushing mark, which is tied for the third most in the SEC during that stretch.

- Only three times has a team rushed for 200+ yards on the Bulldogs since 2018 - Kentucky in 2018 (229 yards), Auburn in 2019 (217) and Texas A&M in 2019 (207)
- 14 of those 24 games holding teams below 200 yards have been SEC games (T-3rd in the SEC)
- Against LSU in the season opener, State held the Tigers 80 rushing yards and allowed just one of LSU's 31 rushing attempts to go for more than 12 yards

COSTELLO'S RECORD DAY

QB **K.J. Costello** was more than impressive in his Bulldog debut at LSU on Sept. 26. The graduate transfer became the SEC's single-game passing king while breaking multiple MSU single-game records.

- 623 passing yards (Previous: Dak Prescott, 508 - vs. Arkansas on Nov. 21, 2015)
- Also an SEC record (Previous: Eric Zeier, Georgia, 544 - vs. Southern Miss in 1993)

COSTELLO BRINGS VETERAN PRESENCE UNDER CENTER

QB **K.J. Costello** is a graduate transfer from Stanford where he started 25 games under center. He missed time with injury in 2019. As a sophomore in 2018, he was named a team captain and started every game while going on to lead the Pac-12 in yards per attempt (8.57) and passing efficiency (155.0).

- Owns nine 300-yard passing games in his career (7 in 2018, 1 in 2019, 1 in 2020)
- Thrown four-or-more touchdown passes on six occasions (1 in 2017, 4 in 2018, 1 in 2020)
- 57 career touchdowns (54 pass, 3 rush)
- Ninth QB in Stanford history to throw for 6,000 yards in a career
- Ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in passing grade (81.6) in 2018 according to PFF

BREAKAWAY BACK

RB **Kylin Hill** is one of two active SEC players, and the only running back, to boast multiple receiving touchdowns of 75 yards or more. Only Alabama's Jaylen Waddle has also scored from more than 75 yards out on more than one occasion.

HILL'S QUICK HITS

- 158 receiving yards against LSU in the season opener are the most by a Bulldog running back in a single game in school history
- Scored at least one TD from scrimmage in 11 of his last 17 games dating back to 2018
- Led SEC in total rushing yards in the 2019 regular season (1,347).

HILL LED SEC IN REGULAR-SEASON RUSHING

One of the most electric running backs in college football, **Kylin Hill** led the SEC in rushing yards during the 2019 regular season, before finishing with 1,350 total yards. He broke the 1,000-yard mark after rushing for a career-high 234 yards at Arkansas on Nov. 2 to become the 13th different player in MSU history to rush for 1,000+ yards in a single season. It marked the fourth straight year that an MSU player reached the mark.

PREVIEWING HILL IN THE PASSING GAME

RB **Kylin Hill** racked up yards against Abilene Christian in the second to last game of the 2019 regular season, totaling 237 (153 rush + 84 receiving). He scored on a career long 88-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.

- Third-longest passing play and seventh-longest play from scrimmage in MSU history
- Longest catch by an SEC player in 2019 and tied for longest by an FBS RB
- One of just three SEC players in 2019 with an 80+ yard reception
- Caught 3 of 4 targets for 84 yards (77 earned after contact)

NOTING HILL'S CAREER DAY AT ARKANSAS IN 2019

RB **Kylin Hill** had a career performance at Arkansas on Nov. 2, and he earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts for the second time in his career.

- Rushed for a career-high 234 yards and three touchdowns on 21 carries (11.1 yards per carry)
- The 234 rushing yards are the fifth most in a single game in school history
- Most rushing yards by an SEC player in a conference game since LSU's Derrius Guice had 276 vs. Ole Miss on Oct. 21, 2017 (at the time of the game).
- Became the first player in MSU history with 230+ yards rushing and three TDs in a game
- Topped the 200-yard rushing mark for the second time in his career
- Marked MSU's 10th individual 200-yard rushing game in school history.
- Became the third player in school history to rush for 200+ yards in multiple games in a career
- Racked up 198 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns on 13 carries in the first half
- 198 rushing yards in the first half were the most in a half by an MSU player in school history
- Went over 100 yards rushing for the sixth time this season and ninth time in his career
- Finished the game with three 30+ yard runs – 62, 58, 37
- On his first 10 carries, rushed for 134 yards and two TD and averaged 13.4 yards per rush
- Took a career-long 62 yard run on MSU's first drive to the Arkansas 3-yard line and then found the end zone on his next carry two plays later
- Had a 37-yard run before his second rushing TD of the game four plays later from 2-yards out
- Became the 16th player in school history to rush for 2,000+ yards in a career

NOSE FOR THE END ZONE

RB **Kylin Hill** had 10 rushing touchdowns and one receiving score in the 2019 season. Hill scored at least one touchdown in seven games. For his career, he boasts 22 career touchdowns (16 rushing, six receiving) in 38 games.

- Three career three-touchdown games (vs. Kentucky, 2019; at Arkansas, 2019; at Kansas State, 2018)
- The only SEC player with multiple games with three rushing TDs in 2019 (vs. Kentucky, at Arkansas)
- Second MSU player since 2000 with multiple games of three rushing scores in a season
- First Bulldog since 2010 (Vick Ballard) with multiple games of three rushing TDs in a season

DON'T BLINK

Highlighted by 40 rushes of 10+ yards last season, RB **Kylin Hill** has a career total of 74. Hill had one against LSU last week, 19 such carries in 11 games as a sophomore and 14 in 12 games in 2017. Out of his 74 career 10+ yard runs, 18 have gone for 20+ yards.

- Six 20+ yard runs in 2019 came in SEC play
- Has three career 50+ yard runs

MOVIN' THE CHAINS

RB **Kylin Hill** added a rushing first down in the season opener to his impressive 63 first down carries in 2019. He has 123 such carries in his career. Hill averaged 4.8 rushing first downs per game in 2019.

A CLOSER LOOK AT STATE'S O-LINE

The Bulldogs are replacing a combined 2,009 snaps from the starting offensive line a year ago. Left tackle Tyre Phillips (821 snaps) and center Darryl Williams (755 snaps) departed for the NFL and Tommy Champion (510 snaps) graduated. Last fall, State entered the season with a combined 71 career starts on the line, which was the fifth-most in the SEC. This year, the Bulldogs' starting five had a combined 36 starts to begin the year.

LT Charles Cross

- Made first career start and played every offensive snap at left tackle in the opener at LSU
- Played 22 snaps at left and right tackle last year

LG Greg Eiland

- Started 26 games in his career (17 starts at left tackle, eight at right tackle and one at left guard)
- Played the fifth-most snaps in 2019 among MSU's offensive linemen (455)
- 12 snaps were at left tackle with the remainder at right tackle in 2019

C Cole Smith

- Transfer from LSU
- Appeared in two games for LSU, playing 12 snaps at center, in 2018
- Four-star recruit per ESPN and a three-star prospect by Rivals and 247Sports
- Top-20 recruit in Mississippi according to ESPN (No. 2), Rivals (No. 18) and 247 Sports (No. 19)
- No. 2-rated center in the nation by ESPN out of high school
- Did not allow a sack in his junior and senior seasons of high school

RG Dareuan Parker

- Started at left guard in 11 games in 2019 and saw action in every game in 2018
- Missed the second and third games of 2019 (injury)
- One of 13 returning SEC offensive linemen to play at least 600 snaps and allow fewer than 12 total pressures in 2019 according to PFF
- Just 11 pressures allowed in 2019 (2 sacks, 3 hits, 6 hurries) and none this season
- Had top overall grade in the season debut at LSU among MSU offensive linemen from PFF (74.2) and an impressive run-block grade (81.3)

RT Kwatrivious Johnson

- Played every offensive snap in the opener at LSU
- Played 15 total snaps at left tackle a year ago
- Did not allow a single pressure in 2019
- Invited to the Under Armour All-America Game and was the No. 10 overall recruit in Mississippi according to 247 Sports

MORE ON THE BULLDOGS' OFFENSIVE LINE

Behind the starting five, JUCO transfer **LaQuinston Sharp** played 410 snaps, mostly at right guard, last fall. He had to take one snap at center in the season opener. At Arkansas, he earned his first career start at right guard, seeing action in 67 snaps and allowing just a pair of pressures (both hurries). He followed up with a solid effort against Alabama, not allowing a single pressure in 35 total snaps. Sharp start at right guard in each of State's final games in 2019.

NOTING OSIRUS MITCHELL'S CAREER DAY AT LSU

WR **Osirus Mitchell** had a career day in the season opener at LSU, finishing with career highs in receptions (7), receiving yards (183) and touchdowns (2) against the Tigers

- 183 receiving yards were tied for the ninth-most in a single game in MSU history
- Most receiving yards by a Bulldog since 2016 and the most by an MSU player in an SEC game since 2007
- One of three receivers that eclipsed 100 yards receiving on the day, marking only the second time in program history a trio of Bulldogs achieved that feat
- Became the ninth player in school history to record 100 or more receiving yards against the Tigers, setting a school record for yards against LSU
- Six of his catches were for first downs
- Went for 15+ yards on six of his receptions and 25+ yards on four
- On third downs, he caught all three of his targets for first downs, including two touchdowns

MITCHELL LED BULLDOG RECEIVERS IN 2019

WR **Osirus Mitchell** returns for his senior year after leading the Bulldogs in receiving yards (430) and touchdowns (6) in 2019. The six scoring grabs were a career high for Mitchell in a single season, topping his previous best of four in 2018.

- Most TD catches by a Bulldog in a single season since 2016
- Six TD catches of 20+ yards were the most by a Bulldog since at least 2000
- Six TD catches of 20+ yards were tied for second in the SEC and tied for sixth in the FBS
- Hands/drop grade from PFF (80.0) in 2019 ranks seventh among returning SEC wide receivers

NOTING JAVONTA PAYTON'S CAREER DAY AT LSU

- Became the 10th player in school history to record 100 or more receiving yards against the Tigers (122)
- Caught a career-high six passes for a career-high in yardage
- Matched his career-long reception (34)

SHRADER SHIFTS TO THE SLOT

Sophomore **Garrett Shrader** made the change from quarterback to wide receiver during preseason camp, and head coach **Mike Leach** has a history of successful position changes within his programs.

Red Raider legend Michael Crabtree was a quarterback in high school, but started running routes in his first season on campus. In two years in Lubbock, he set eight NCAA records. The two-time Biletnikoff winner and 2007 ESPN All-America Player of the Year still holds single-season records for receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns at Texas Tech. He is second all-time in receiving yards and holds the career record for receiving touchdowns. He was the No. 10 overall pick in the 2009 NFL Draft.

Wide receiver Wes Welker was originally signed as a running back at Texas Tech, but made the transition prior to the 2001 season. Welker went on to post 3,069 career receiving yards. He went undrafted, but has the distinction of racking up the second-most all-purpose yards in NFL history by any player in his first three seasons. Welker also holds the NFL record for most receptions by an undrafted wide out.

Mickey Peters was also a quarterback during his freshman season at Tech in 2000. He went on to catch 196 passes in his career for 2,318 yards and 22 touchdowns after switching to receiver and later tight end for his senior season. Peters is seventh on the Red Raiders' all-time receiving touchdowns leaderboard.

SHRADER'S FRESHMAN SEASON

Garrett Shrader, an electric athlete, was one of nine Power 5 players, including three freshmen, to throw for 1,000+ yards and rush for 500+ yards in 2019. For the 2020 season, he has moved to wide receiver. Below is a look at Shrader's noteworthy numbers under center.

- 58.7 rushing yards per game in 2019 (2nd in SEC among QBs)
- Responsible for 14 touchdowns (8 passing, 6 rushing)
- Led MSU in rushing in four games (all vs. SEC)

- 30 runs for 10+ yards (Led SEC among QBs)
- Completed 51 passes for a first down and 54 for 10+ yards
- Completed 60+ percent of passes in five different games

MR. RELIABLE

WR **Austin Williams** has earned his reputation as "Mr. Reliable." Of Williams' 28 career receptions, 64.3 percent have led to a touchdown or first down.

Furthermore, Williams had the tenth-highest hands/drop grade among returning SEC players a year ago according to PFF (81.5) and the No. 5 grade among wide outs.

E40 IS THE LEADER OF THE DEFENSE

LB **Erroll Thompson** led the Bulldogs in 2019 with 84 tackles, which ranks 11th in the conference among returning players. He is the SEC's active career leader with 227 tackles and was the only SEC defender to enter the 2020 season with 200 or more career tackles.

Thompson recorded seven or more tackles eight times last season, including three games with double-digit stops. He has posted seven or more tackles in 19 of his 40 career games, including 10 or more six times. He finished the 2019 season ranked second in the SEC in QB hits among linebackers (6), and he logged 38 total "stops" per PFF, which are tackles that constitute a "failure" for the offense.

Thompson was named to the 2020 preseason watch list for the Dick Butkus Award, which honors the nation's top linebacker at the high school, collegiate and professional levels as well as the SEC Coaches' Preseason All-SEC second team.

THE MAYOR MAKING A MAJOR IMPACT

DE **Kobe Jones**, who is called "The Mayor" for his service efforts in the Starkville community, made a major impact for the Bulldogs down the stretch in 2019. Jones entered his senior season with 70 total tackles, 18.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. He collected 4.0 sacks a year ago, which ranked second on the team.

Jones was named to the preseason watchlist for the Wuerffel Trophy for the second straight year this summer. Known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," the award exists to honor college football players who serve others, celebrate their positive impact on society, and inspire greater service in the world.

Jones actively volunteers time to the Starkville Cowboys little league football and Starkville High School football programs. He currently represent MSU on the SEC Football Leadership Council and attended the Black Student Athlete Summit in Austin, Texas, last year.

LB Willie Gay Jr. and CB Cameron Dantzler were selected by the Kansas City Chiefs and Minnesota Vikings, respectively, in the NFL Draft. DE Chauncey Rivers has made the Baltimore Ravens practice squad and DE Fletcher Adams departed after graduation.

CB **Korey Charles** was the top-graded returner (76.7). S **Marcus Murphy** boasted the No. 6 coverage grade (85.6) among returning SEC players, and ranked second among safeties. S **Fred Peters** played corner last fall and posted the No. 5 pass rush grade (85.7) among returning corners in the conference.

DE **Marquiss Spencer** is one of 10 returning players in the league to have forced multiple fumbles in 2019. He also ranked fifth among returning players with eight QB hits last fall.

THE NEW KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

A total of 16 newcomers made their MSU debuts last week against LSU, including six true freshmen.

- K **Brandon Ruiz** was perfect going 5-for-5 on extra point attempts and hitting field goals from 24, 35 and 43 yards out
- The graduate transfer from Arizona State also put eight of his nine kickoffs in the endzone for touchbacks
- WR **Tyrell Shavers** caught the second pass of his career, and first at MSU, for a 31-yard touchdown before adding a second reception.
- LB **Jordan Davis** had a key hit on the quarterback that led to an interception while totalling six tackles
- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** intercepted the final pass of the game. Tyrus Wheat picked up his first career sack and finished with four tackles
- RB **Jo'quavious Marks'** first career carry went for 11 yards and a first down

State Shocks No. 6/Defending National Champ LSU

The Mike Leach era of Mississippi State football was ushered in on Saturday afternoon as a record-setting day for **K.J. Costello** propelled the Bulldogs over the defending National Champions, No. 6 LSU, 44-34, at Tiger Stadium. The win marked the first time a defending national champion lost its season opener since 1998 and snapped the longest active win streak in the country. It was also MSU's highest-ranked road win in program history. The Bulldogs, came away with just their second win in Baton Rouge since 1992. State grabbed their first lead of the game near the end of the first quarter, when a 12-play 66-yard drive culminated in a **Brandon Ruiz** 35-yard field goal. The lead would change four times in the second quarter, with the Bulldogs landing on top heading into the locker room. With 5:20 on the clock, **Kylin Hill** scampered 12 yards to the MSU 37-yard line before Costello found **Osirus Mitchell** from 43 yards out, giving the Bulldogs a 17-14 advantage. The Tigers' largest lead came in the third quarter, when Myles Brennan connected with Terrace Marshall on a 37-yard pass for a 24-20 lead. A 75-yard strike from Costello to Hill on the ensuing drive was all it took for the Maroon and White to regain the lead. With the score even at 34-34 in the fourth, a Ruiz 43-yard field goal and Mitchell's 24-yard touchdown reception gave the Bulldogs the lead for good. On LSU's (0-1) final drive of the game, **Emmanuel Forbes** intercepted Myles Brennan's pass in the endzone to secure the victory for State. **Shawn Preston Jr.** led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles, ignited by six solo stops. **Aaron Brule** and **Erroll Thompson** followed with 10 tackles and one sack a piece. Mississippi State racked up seven sacks, including two contributed by **Marquiss Spencer** for a loss of 10 yards..
