Openers and Storylines

♦ The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-0, 0-0 SEC) travel to Fayetteville, Ark. to take on the No. 19/23 Arkansas Razorbacks on Saturday, Sept. 10, in the 2022 SEC opener for both squads. Game time from Reynolds Razorback Stadium (76,000) is set for 11 am CT (noon ET).

♦ This week's game is being televised nationally on ESPN. Bob Wischusen will handle the play-by-play with Dan Orlovsky providing the color commentary. Kris Budden will work the sidelines for the network. ESPN Radio also has a national broadcast with Mike Couzens on the call with Max Starks as the analyst and Mike Peasley on the sidelines.

♦ Both teams come into the contest off season-opening victories. The Gamecocks used two touch-down returns of blocked punts in the second half to pull away from a feisty Georgia State squad, 35-14, while the Razorbacks took a 14-0 lead into intermission and held on for a 31-24 victory over Cincinnati.

♦ South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC together in 1992 and were assigned as "permanent" cross-division rivals. That held as the teams played every year until Texas A&M and Missouri joined the conference in 2013. The Aggies became the Gamecocks "permanent" cross-division rival at that time, while the Tigers and Razorbacks were paired up in a similar fashion. After facing each other on the gridiron for 22-consecutive seasons between 1992-2013, South Carolina and Arkansas have only met once since that time (2017).

♦ For the second-straight week, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer will be facing a former colleague. Coach Beamer and Sam Pittman were on the Georgia staffs together under head coach Kirby Smart for the 2016 and 2017 seasons. The 2016 squad went 8-5 and defeated TCU in the Liberty Bowl. The 2017 Bulldogs defeated Oklahoma in the Rose Bowl, then lost to Alabama in the CFP Championship game by a 26-23 score to finish 13-2. Last week, Coach Beamer faced Georgia State head coach Shawn Elliott. Both were on the 2010 South Carolina staff under head coach Steve Spurrier.

CAROLINA VS. ARKANSAS: This is the 24th meeting between two former "permanent" cross-divisional rivals in a series that dates back to 1992 when both schools joined the Southeastern Conference. The teams met every year from 1992-2013, but this is the first gridiron meeting between the two schools since the 2017 season and just the second since 2013. Arkansas holds a 13-10 advantage in the all-time series. The Razorbacks have won eight of 11 games when the contest has been played in their home state (5-2 in Fayetteville and 3-1 in Little Rock), while South Carolina has won seven of the 12 tilts in Columbia.

ON A ROLL: The Gamecocks have won each of the last three meetings over Arkansas, their longest winning streak in the series. All have come in convincing fashion, posting a 38-20 victory in Columbia in 2012, then routing the Hogs by a 52-7 count in Fayetteville in 2013 before winning by a 48-22 count in Columbia in 2017 in the most recent meeting. In the last three games, Carolina has outscored the Hogs by a 138-49 margin.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: The Gamecocks, under head coach Will Muschamp, scored three touchdowns on defense - returning two interceptions and a fumble - in a 48-22 win over Arkansas and head coach Brett Bielema on Oct. 7, 2017 in Columbia. Jake Bentley went 16-of-31 for 199 yards and three touchdowns, including a critical 18-yard pass to Bryan Edwards in the corner of the end zone with four seconds in the first half. The Gamecocks gained 358 yards, scoring on five of eight possessions in the final three quarters. Defensive scores came from Skai Moore (34-yard interception return), T.J. Brunson (73-yard fumble return) and Keisean Nixon (45-yard interception return).

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: The No. 14/12 Gamecocks, under the guidance of head coach Steve Spurrier, rolled up an easy 52-7 win over Arkansas and its first-year head coach Brett Bielema in Fayetteville on October 12, 2013. The Hogs scored first, but Carolina dominated the rest of the way to run its record to 5-1 en route to an 11-2 campaign and a final ranking of No. 4 in the nation, the best in school history. The Gamecock offense held the ball for 43:25 of the contest, rolling up 537 yards on 89 plays, compared to the Razorbacks' 248 yards on 37 plays. Connor Shaw threw for three touchdowns and 219 yards and added a rushing TD. Mike Davis ran for 128 yards and a score, while Bruce Ellington caught six passes for 96 yards and two TDs. The seven points scored by the Razorbacks were the fewest they had tallied in the series since scoring seven points in the 2000 contest.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: The winning team in this series has tallied at least 33 points in each of the last eight contests between the two schools. The Gamecocks put up a combined total of 138 points in their last three games against Arkansas, all resulting in wins.

STEPPI'S BROTHERS: South Carolina wide receivers coach **Justin Stepp** returns to his old stomping grounds this week. He served as Arkansas's wide receivers coach from 2018-20 before joining Coach Beamer's staff in Columbia.

HELLO OLD FRIEND: Arkansas defensive line coach **Deke Adams** held a similar position for the Gamecocks from 2013-15 under head coach Steve Spurrier.

Adams' front also featured defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles, who earned first-team All-SEC and All-America honors. Quarles and Clowney became the first Carolina duo since 1984 to earn All-America status in the same season.

A South Carolina win over Arkansas would...

- ◆ Be the Gamecocks first SEC-opening game win since they defeated Missouri in the 2017 SEC opener by a 31-13 score in the Show-Me State. The Gamecocks have dropped each of their last four SEC lidlifters to Georgia (2018), Alabama (2019), Tennessee (2020) and Georgia (2021).
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' fourth-straight win over the Razorbacks, extending their longest winning streak in the series. South Carolina has not lost to the Hogs since the 2011 season.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' a three-game winning streak dating to back to last season, their longest winning streak since they won three-straight in 2017 (Arkansas, Tennessee, Vanderbilt).

ABOUT LAST WEEK: The South Carolina Gamecocks opened the second year of the Shane Beamer Era in Columbia with a 35-14 win over Georgia State on Saturday, Sept. 3. A sold-out crowd of 78,297 was on hand to see **Spencer Rattler** in his Gamecock debut, but it was **Pete Lembo** and his special teams units that stole the show, it what arguably was the best single-game special teams performance in school history.

BEAMER BALL 2.0: The Gamecocks held a 20-14 lead over Georgia State midway through the third quarter when **Rashad Amos** broke through the line and blocked a punt that **DQ Smith** picked up and returned 26 yards for a touchdown. Early in the fourth quarter **Traveon Kenion** blocked another punt that **Ahmarean Brown** scooped and scored from 10-yards out to seal the win. They were the first punt returns for a touchdown by the Gamecocks since the 2000 season when Carlos Spikes and Derek Watson both returned blocked punts for first quarter TDs in a 41-21 loss at Florida.

PARKER WHO?: **Mitch Jeter** won the placekicking duties in fall camp replacing five-year starter and the school's all-time scoring leader in Parker White. Jeter, who came into the contest with just two career points on 2-of-2 PATs, connected on both of his field goal attempts against Georgia State, the first two of his career, from 53- and 51-yards out. His first attempt, the 53-yarder, tied for the seventh-longest made field goal in school history. There have been just 22 field goals of 50 yards or more in South Carolina history, and Jeter is the first two connect for two in the same game. He also made his only extra point attempt for seven total points. In addition, he kicked off six times with four touchbacks and no return yards.

COBRA KAI: Junior **Kai Kroeger** missed most of preseason camp with a foot injury and was listed as questionable heading into the Georgia State game, but responded with an impressive performance. Kroeger punted seven times for 344 yards, a 49.1-yard average with four inside the 20 and three of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 79-yarder, the longest for a Gamecock since Marty Simpson's 79-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992. It was the third 70-plus yard punt for Kroeger in his last eight games and the longest in the country so far this season. The school record of 90 yards is held by Bill Jeffords vs. North Carolina in 1924. Here are the 70-plus yard punts since 1979:

HUNTER GATHERER: Hunter Rogers, a redshirt sophomore who handles the long snapping duties on punts, was inserted into the game as a holder, as the Gamecocks' lined up in field goal formation early in the second quarter. Rogers took the snap and darted for five yards for a first down on the fake, setting up the first score of the season.

RATTLER'S BABY: The much-anticipated Carolina debut of transfer quarterback **Spencer Rattler** was deemed solid. The junior signal-caller completed 23-of-37 passes for 227 yards with one touchdown and a pair of interceptions. He displayed his athleticism, as he was able to scramble and avoid big losses in several situations while showing excellent arm strength and accuracy, especially on the move.

OPENING DAY BESTS: **Spencer Rattler** threw for 227 yards in the season opener against Georgia State, the 11th-highest yards thrown by a Carolina quarterback in a season opener. Here are the 200-yard passing games in South Carolina season openers:

HIS DEBUT WENT WELL: Wide receiver **Antwane Wells Jr.** showed why the Gamecock coaching staff was excited to have him aboard. The junior transfer from James Madison known as "Juice" was targeted seven times on Saturday against Georgia State and caught all seven for 55 yards.

BROOKS WAS HERE: Senior wide receiver **Jalen Brooks** returned to the lineup on Saturday against Georgia State after missing the final half of the 2021 season. He was targeted four times and responded with four catches for 88 yards, including a pair of highlight reel receptions.

NICK AT NIGHT: True freshman **Nick Emmanwori** made his presence felt in the opener against Georgia State. The local product from Irmo was inserted into the safety position in the first series of the game following an injury to veteran R.J. Roderick, and played virtually the remainder of the contest. He was credited with three solo tackles and a pass break up, including a stop on a fourth-and-one situation from the Carolina 8-yard line in the game's first series, which set the tone.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Six players made their first collegiate start for the Gamecocks on Saturday versus Georgia State, but only two, **MarShawn Lloyd** and **Alex Huntley**, were making their first collegiate start overall. **Spencer Rattler**, **Devonni Reed**, **Austin Stogner** and **Jordan Strachan** made their first starts for Carolina, but had made starts at their previous stops.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2022 marks the 129th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 116th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 622-601-44, a .508 winning percentage.

FOR OPENERS: The Gamecocks improved their all-time record in season openers to 86-39-4, a winning percentage of .682, through 129 years of intercollegiate football. In the 97 seasons in which the Gamecocks have opened at home, the record is a very impressive 73-20-4. That translates into a .773 winning mark.

SEC OPENERS: This is the first time that South Carolina and Arkansas have met in an SEC season opener. The Gamecocks are 12-18 in their 30 previous SEC openers and have dropped their last four, with their last win coming at Missouri in 2017. They are an even 9-9 when opening the SEC season on the road, but just 3-9 in SEC openers at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia. A majority of the contests have come against Georgia. South Carolina is 7-13 when opening the SEC slate against the Bulldogs from Athens. They are 3-1 against Vanderbilt, 1-0 against Mississippi State and Missouri, and 0-1 against Texas A&M, Kentucky, Alabama and Tennessee. Carolina has won two of its last three and four of its last six SEC openers when playing on the road.

ONE MORE AND THEY CALL IT A STREAK: The Gamecocks are looking to win their third-consecutive game dating back to last season's Duke's Mayo Bowl win over North Carolina and last week's victory over Georgia State. A win this week would match their longest winning streak since they won three-straight midway through the 2017 season when they defeated Arkansas, Tennessee, and Vanderbilt in successive games.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features nine scholarship transfers, six of whom enrolled at Carolina in January. The spring enrollees included RB **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), RB **Lovasea Carroll** (Georgia), EDGE **Terrell Dawkins** (NC State), QB **Spencer Rattler** (Oklahoma), DB **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan), and WR **Antwane Wells Jr.** (James Madison). TE **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), WR **Corey Rucker** (Arkansas State) and TE **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) were added to the roster in the summer. Rattler, Reed and Stogner were in the opening day lineup.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list 10 players (not including transfers) whose eligibility would have expired at South Carolina had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super seniors" are WR **Jalen Brooks**, OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Sherrod Greene**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, EDGE **Jordan Strachan**, WR **Chad Terrell**, WR **Josh Vann**, DL **M.J. Webb** and OL **Dylan Wonnum**.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA rule allowing for an extra year, five Gamecocks - OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, WR **Josh Vann** and OL **Dylan Wonnum** - can become five-year letterwinners.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 21 players on the active roster who will have their college degrees in hand prior to the start of the 2022 football season. Twelve players who wore the SEC Graduate patch in the Duke's Mayo Bowl return for the 2022 season. That list includes **Wyatt Campbell**, **Eric Douglas**, **Sherrod Greene**, **Brad Johnson**, **Tyreek Johnson**, **Dakereon Joyner**, **Hank Manos**, **Darius Rush**, **Jordan Strachan**, **Chad Terrell**, **M.J. Webb** and **Dylan Wonnum**. Two players, **Jovaughn Gwyn** and **Jaylen Nichols**, graduated in May. **Traevon Kenion** and **R.J. Roderick** graduated in August. In addition, **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), **Dante Miller**, (Columbia) **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan) and **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) have degrees from other institutions.

YOU'RE MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE: Wide receiver **Payton Mangrum** was awarded the Jake Panus scholarship prior to the start of the fall semester. Mangrum has been a regular on special teams and has also been on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. **Matthew Bailey** was the 2021 recipient.

NO BUENO: Sixth-year tight end **Chad Terrell** suffered an ACL injury during the Gamecocks' first scrimmage of preseason camp and will miss the entire 2022 season. It was the third ACL Terrell has suffered during his Gamecock career.

IN THE POLLS: The Gamecocks received two votes in the Associated Press preseason poll and five votes in the AFCA Coaches preseason poll. It's the first time since the 2019 season in which Carolina received votes for the top-25. The last time was after the upset win at Georgia in 2019 which improved their record to 3-3. The last time they received votes in the preseason poll was also in 2019 when they collected 15 votes in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls.

2021 IN REVIEW: South Carolina concluded its 128th season of intercollegiate football in 2021 with a record of 7-6, including a 3-5 mark in the SEC. In Shane Beamer's first year at the helm, the Gamecocks posted wins over traditional SEC powers Florida and Auburn in the regular season, and capped the season with a convincing 38-21 win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Coming off a two-win campaign in 2020 and with just six wins total over the previous two seasons, the Gamecocks went into the 2021 season predicted by the "experts" to win just 3.5 games on the season, but doubled that total with seven wins. The Gamecocks started and won with four different quarterbacks during the season.

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks return home to host the defending national champion Georgia Bulldogs at Williams-Brice Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 17. Game time is set for noon ET and the contest will be televised nationally on ESPN. Georgia leads the all-time series 53-19-2, including a 22-10-2 advantage when the game has been played in Columbia. Georgia has won the last two and six of the last seven meetings, with Carolina's lone win in that stretch coming in Athens in 2019 by a 20-17 count in double overtime.

Offense

SATT ATTACK: The Gamecock offense is in its second year under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. In his first season, Satt was able to cobble seven wins together with four different starting quarterbacks winning games. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first knew each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

QB BOWL WINS: South Carolina is one of only two schools in the country, along with Utah State, that has two players on its 2022 roster that have won a bowl game as a starting quarterback. South Carolina features **Spencer Rattler** (2020 Cotton Bowl) and **Dakereon Joyner** (2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl).

QB1: Oklahoma transfer **Spencer Rattler** is the Gamecocks' top signal-caller in 2022. Rattler, who joined the team in the spring and was the Joe Morrison Player of the Spring for the offense, was 23-for-37 for 227 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions in his Gamecock debut against Georgia State. He has appeared in 24 games during his career, posting a 16-2 record as a starter. He has completed 69.6 percent of his passes (384-for-552) for 4,822 yards with 41 touchdowns.

DOTY IN THE BULLPEN: Junior **Luke Doty** was the projected starter at quarterback during preseason camp a year ago, but foot injuries derailed his season. The Myrtle Beach, S.C. product is fully healthy and has improved his game since that time. He is without question the No. 2 QB entering the season. Doty has completed over 60 percent of his passes in 13 career games. He is 2-4 as a starting quarterback.

THAT'LL DO 'ER, LLOYD: **MarShawn Lloyd** has ascended to the top of the depth chart at running back. A highly-touted recruit, Lloyd has finally regained the trust in his surgically-repaired knee that cost him the 2020 season. In the opener against Georgia State, he rushed a team-high 11 times for 30 yards and a touchdown and also caught two passes for 31 yards and a score. It was the first multi-touchdown game of his career.

BACKFIELD IN MOTION: Running backs coach **Montario Hardesty** lost two running backs off last year's squad who were in NFL camps - Kevin Harris with New England and ZaQuandre White with Miami - but has others he can turn to in addition to Lloyd.

◆ **Juju McDowell** was a Freshman All-SEC performer a year ago as an all-purpose back and return specialist and, despite his diminutive size, is tough as nails and elusive in space. He rushed seven times for 14 yards and caught three passes for 18 more in the opener against Georgia State.

◆ **Christian Beal-Smith** joined the unit as a grad transfer from Wake Forest. He has rushed for 1,871 yards over the last four seasons, but was hobbled in preseason camp and did not dress for the opener against Georgia State.

◆ **Dante Miller** is speedy graduate transfer from the Ivy League's Columbia University who has earned the nickname "Lil Turbo." He saw late action against Georgia State in the opener.

◆ **Lavasea Carroll** joined the backfield room after transferring from Georgia, where he played defensive back on the national championship squad.

◆ **Rashad Amos** has been in the program for a few years now and is a capable backup and came up with a huge punt block on special teams against Georgia State.

DOWN BY THE RIVER: **Josh Vann** is the Gamecocks' top returning receiver. He had a breakout season a year ago when he caught 43 passes and now ranks tied for 24th in school history with 91 career receptions.

THE WELLS RUN DEEP: **Antwane Wells Jr.** quickly made his presence felt in the season opener against Georgia State. The transfer from James Madison was targeted seven times and caught seven passes for 55 yards in his first contest at the FBS level.

LONG BENCH: Wide receivers coach Justin Stepp has plenty of other candidates who are capable of making plays for the Gamecocks.

◆ **Jalen Brooks** returns after missing the last half of the 2021 season for personal reasons. He caught four passes on four targets for 88 yards in the opener.

◆ **Dakereon Joyner** is back at wide receiver after earning MVP honors in the Duke's Mayo Bowl win over North Carolina as a quarterback. He was held out of the opener with a nagging calf injury.

◆ **Ahmarean Brown** had his best game as a Gamecock in the Duke's Mayo Bowl win, and looks to be the deep threat that he was at Georgia Tech, where he began his career.

◆ **Xavier Legette** continues to impress the coaches and is looking for a breakout season. He also handles the kick returns.

◆ **Corey Rucker** is in his first season after transferring from Arkansas State. He has been sidelined for much of preseason camp with a foot injury and did not play in the season opener.

GET THE BALL TO THE TIGHT END: Offensive coordinator **Marcus Satterfield** will no doubt make it a priority to get the tight ends involved in the offense this year. Despite the loss of Chad Terrell, who suffered his third ACL injury in the preseason, **Jody Wright's** room is deep and talented. **Jaheim Bell** and **Austin Stogner** are both on the preseason Mackey Award Watch List.

IT TOLLS FOR THEE: **Jaheim Bell** is a do-it-all player who exploded in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Bell owns the top-two receiving games by a tight end in school history, a 136-yard effort against Vanderbilt and a 159-yard performance against North Carolina in the aforementioned bowl game. He can line up anywhere on the field, as demonstrated by his four catches for 18 yards and seven rushes for 39 yards in the season opener against Georgia State.

NO LIMITS FOR AUSTIN: Graduate transfer **Austin Stogner** joined the squad this summer after graduating from Oklahoma, where he caught 47 passes over the past three seasons, most of them from Spencer Rattler. He was limited to just one catch in the opener, but figures to have a big season.

SON OF A COACH: **Nate Adkins**, the son of offensive line coach Greg Adkins, joined the team after graduating from East Tennessee State. Regarded as a tough, hard-nosed blocker, Adkins has also shown good hands and has a great understanding of the game. Adkins is a candidate to play fullback when the Gamecocks' line up in a two-back set.

THE O-LINE IS O-KAY: Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country and has a group that will play with a chip on its shoulder. The group has combined for 134 career starts.

◆ **LT Jaylen Nichols** started seven games a year ago and has 12 career starts under his belt. He was the co-Most Improved Player of the Spring on the offensive side of the ball.

◆ **LG Vershon Lee** is expected to make the next step this year. He has started 11 games in his career, including nine last season.

◆ **OC Eric Douglas** makes the calls for the O-line. Douglas, a sixth-year player, has made 25 starts, including the last 24 in a row.

◆ **RG Jovaughn Gwyn** is the most experienced player on the squad with 35-consecutive starts. A player who leads by example, Gwyn was named a permanent team captain in 2021.

◆ **RT Dylan Wonnum** was not officially considered a returning starter as a back injury sidelined him for the final seven games of the 2021 season, but he returns healthy and has 31 career starts under his belt. His brother, D.J., was a standout defensive end for Carolina and now plays for the Minnesota Vikings.

◆ **OT Jakai Moore** (11 starts), **OG/OT Tyshawn Wannamaker** (7) and **OC Hank Manos** (2) all have gained valuable experience and are capable backups pushing for playing time. Wannamaker was listed as a returning starter at right tackle after making seven starts at that position in 2021.

Defense

CLAYTON'S CREW: Defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia and the results were impressive in his first season. A four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White's first foray in the SEC had Carolina allowing 24.0 points per game, down from 36.0 in 2020. The Gamecocks were especially strong in the secondary, ranking seventh in the country in pass defense while forcing 24 turnovers overall, including 15 picks.

STOP THE RUN: The Gamecocks are looking to improve their run defense this year. While the final stats against Georgia State weren't great, as the Panthers rushed 40 times for 200 yards, 85 of those yards came on two runs. The other 38 carries netted 115 yards, 3.0 yards per carry.

AIR ATTACK GROUNDED: South Carolina picked up right where they left off a season ago when they led the SEC and ranked seventh in the country in pass defense. Georgia State completed just 7-of-29 passes for 111 yards with an interception in the season opener. The seven completions allowed was the fewest by a Carolina defense since Wofford, a triple-option team, completed 5-of-9 pass attempts late in the 2017 season. The 24.1 completion rate was the lowest against the Gamecocks since Kentucky completed just 15.4 percent on 4-of-26 passing in a 54-3 Carolina win in 2011.

WHAT'S MY LINE: It all starts up front.

◆ The interior of the defensive line is led by All-SEC candidate **Zacch Pickens**. Pickens was the 2022 Rex Enright co-Player of the Spring for the defense. The senior has appeared in all 36 games over the past four seasons, making 21 starts. He was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2019.

◆ Another player who earned SEC All-Freshman honors is **Alex Huntley**, who was named to the 2021 unit by the league's coaches. Huntley is known by the nickname "Boogie." He made his first career start in the opener.

◆ **Tonka Hemingway** is in his third season with the program. Hemingway has great bloodlines, as his brother, Junior, played at Michigan and professionally for the Kansas City Chiefs.

◆ The veteran of the group is sixth-year player **M.J. Webb**. Webb, who garnered the Gamecocks' Toughness Award in the spring, has seen his game and his playing time increase each year.

JORDAN TIMES TWO: The Gamecocks feature a pair of EDGE rushers in **Jordan Burch** and **Jordan Strachan**. Burch, who was a high school teammate of Gamecock defensive tackle Alex Huntley, was the second-highest rated player to sign with Gamecocks, behind only Jadeveon Clowney. Strachan, a sixth-year player who began his career as a walk-on at Georgia State and led the country in sacks in 2020 before transferring to South Carolina prior to the 2021 campaign. The duo combined for nine stops in the opener against Georgia State.

SACK ATTACK: The two Jordans, **Jordan Burch** and **Jordan Strachan**, figure to be the Gamecocks' top pass rushers. The Gamecocks did not record a sack in the opener vs. Georgia State, but were credited with six hurries, as the GSU QB completed just 24 percent of his attempts. Last season, Carolina recorded 26 sacks, an average of 2.0 per game. Here are the sack number for the 2022 Gamecocks:

GILBER GETS IT: **Gilber Edmond** saw the most playing time of his career in the opener against Georgia State and took advantage of it. He was in on four tackles, including two of the team's six tackles for loss, and two of Carolina's six quarterback hurries recorded in the contest.

GREENE IS GOOD: Senior **Sherrod Greene** returns to bolster the Carolina linebacking corps. Greene started 22 games for the Gamecocks in 2018 and 2019, and was the starter entering the 2020 season, but suffered a fracture in his hip in the opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season. He was the starter again in 2021, but suffered a right ankle injury in game three at Georgia and missed the remainder of the season. He has logged 138 career tackles including 10.5 tackles for loss and owns 28 career starts, but has just eight tackles in four games over the past two seasons combined. He was held out of the opener.

BRAD'S BACK: **Brad Johnson** returns for his sixth year and his second at linebacker after transitioning from defensive end. Johnson was named a permanent team captain after the 2020 season. He has appeared in 48 contests with 17 starts. He was the Gamecocks' defensive player of the game against Georgia State after recording five solo tackles and a quarterback hurry.

SEEING MO KABA: **Mohamed Kaba** will get more action at linebacker this season. Kaba was named the 2022 Most Improved Player of the Spring for the defense. He was a member of the 2020 SEC Coaches' All-Freshman team.

ON SECOND THOUGHT: The defensive backfield lost a good one in All-American safety Jaylan Foster, but secondary coach **Torrian Gray** likes the first five he can put on the field. Depth is a concern, as the depth chart lists five true freshmen (**Nick Emmanuelwori**, **Emory Floyd**, **Kennan Nelson Jr.**, **DQ Smith** and **Kajuan Banks**) on it, and all five reside in the secondary.

ALL-EVERYTHING: Redshirt junior **Cam Smith** has seen his name appear on nearly every All-America and All-SEC preseason team and several watch lists. Smith is penciled in at the nickel position to start the year, but can also play corner. He has five career interceptions and broke up 11 passes a year ago while allowing multiple catches in just two of 11 games.

RUSH TO JUDGMENT: It's taken a little time, but **Darius Rush** has become the cornerback the coaches hoped he would be when he transitioned from wide receiver earlier in his career. At 6-2 and 200 pounds, Rush possesses the size and length that make him an intriguing prospect.

HE'S NUMBER ONE: Fifth-year Super Senior, four-year letterwinner and three-year starter **R.J. Roderick** returns at safety. Roderick has appeared in 44 games, making 34 starts.

EVERYBODY LEMBO: Special teams coordinator **Pete Lembo** slept well after the season opening win, as his units produced two blocked punts for touchdowns, was successful on a pair of field goals beyond 50 yards, had seven punts that averaged over 49 yards with a long of 79 and no return yardage, a successful fake field goal that led to a touchdown, no kickoff return yardage allowed and 98 punt return yards gained.

RESPECT FOR JETER: **Mitch Jeter** came into the season following in the huge footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer and five-year starter. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two career at-

tempts. He became the first player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game.

PRACTICE IS OVERRATED: Junior **Kai Kroeger** missed most of preseason camp with a foot injury and was listed as questionable heading into the season-opening contest against Georgia State, but responded with an impressive performance. He punted seven times for 344 yards, a 49.1-yard average with four inside the 20 and three of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 79-yarder, the longest for a Gamecock since Marty Simpson's 79-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992. The effort earned him a spot on "Ray's Eight" as selected by the Ray Guy Award committee.

KAI KROEGER CAN KICK: Junior **Kai Kroeger** returns to handle the punting chores for the Gamecocks this season. The third-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. He is averaging 43.5 yards per punt with a long of 79 yards in his career. Of his 105 career punts, 24 have traveled 50 or more yards with 35 inside the 20 and just five touchbacks. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements. Kroeger ranks second on the school's all-time punting average list, trailing only Joseph Charlton.

They both handled those respective duties a year ago as well.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — An unprecedented night by South Carolina's defense may have rescued the Gamecocks season and sent Arkansas back down a familiar, discouraging path.

The Gamecocks (4-2, 2-2 South-eastern) scored three touchdowns on defense - returning two interceptions and a fumble - in a 48-22 win over Arkansas (2-3, 0-2) on Saturday.

After a 75-yard touchdown drive by the Razorbacks tied it at 10 early in the second quarter, Arkansas gained just 48 yards in their next 18 plays. Those plays included an Austin Allen interception Skai Moore returned 34 yards for a TD and an Allen fumble that T.J. Brunson returned 74 yards for a score.

By the time the Razorbacks started moving the ball again, the Gamecocks led 41-10 in the fourth quarter.

"Everything disintegrated right in front of us," said Arkansas coach Brett Bielema, who will need three wins over five SEC teams he is a combined 8-15 against with the Razorbacks

South Carolina has no record of ever scoring three defensive touchdowns in the 125 years it has played football. Gamecocks coach Will Muschamp, known for his defensive mind, couldn't remember three touchdowns from his favorite unit in his career. And Brunson - he had never been in the end zone in all his football life, either.

"That was fun. I hope to get to do it again," Brunson said.

And all that defense helped build the confidence of an offense that had seen several shaky games but come through with two more wins than the halfway point in 2016. Jake Bentley went 16 of 31 for 199 yards and three touchdowns, including a critical 18-yard pass to Bryan Edwards in the corner of the end zone with four seconds in the first half.

Bentley spread the ball around to nine receivers as South Carolina beat a team from the SEC West for the first time since 2013.

The Gamecocks gained 358 yards, scoring on five of eight possessions in the final three quarters. Bentley was sacked just once, a week after the offense line allowed seven sacks in a loss to Texas A&M.

"It takes the pressure off of us," Bentley said of the defense. "Their confidence is through the roof."

GAME CHANGER

With the game tied at 10 in the final minute of the first half, Jake Bentley hit Bryan Edwards with an 18-yard touchdown pass, giving the Gamecocks a 17-10 lead with four seconds remaining. South Carolina took a lead it would never relinquish heading into the halftime locker room.

KEY STAT

3 -- The South Carolina defense recorded three touchdowns for the first time in modern history. Skai Moore and Keisean Nixon each returned an interception for a score while T.J. Brunson had a 73-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.

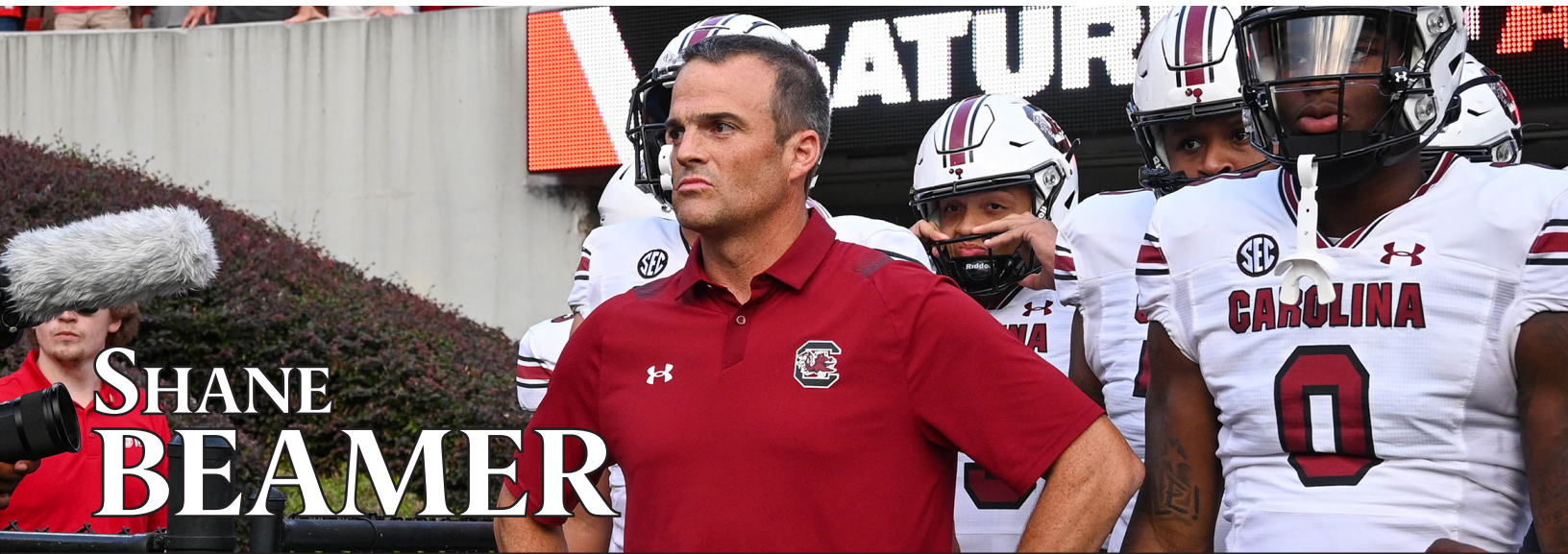

Shane Beamer, one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, begins his second season as the University of South Carolina's head coach in 2022. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2005.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to South Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in Gamecock Football history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

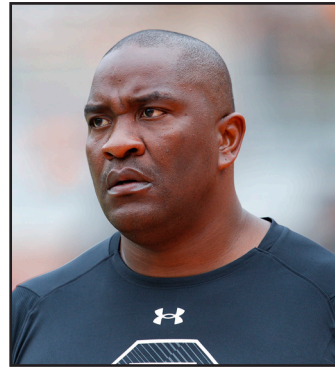

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's special teams led the way toward a season-opening 35-14 victory over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Special teams have always been an emphasis for Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer, who watched his father, Frank, win game after game with "Beamer Ball," and its big special teams play.

The approach worked as the Gamecocks pulled away from Georgia State with 23 unanswered points in the second half.

The Gamecocks returned two blocked punts for touchdowns, new placekicker Mitch Jeter debuted by knocking two field goals of 50-plus yards and long snapper Hunter Rogers carried a fake field goal 5 yards for a first down that led to the Gamecocks' only first-half touchdown.

New quarterback Spencer Rattler took in a key two-point conversion in the third quarter to restore South Carolina's lead and it was just enough to squeak past a determined Panthers' squad that held a brief third-quarter advantage, 14-12.

The back-breaker also came in the third, when Rashad Amos blocked a Georgia State punt and DQ Smith retrieved the carom and ran it in for a touchdown.

Rattler showed off his dynamic playmaking ability. He finished 23 of 37 passing for 226 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

Following a scoreless first quarter, South Carolina sent out Jeter to attempt a 25-yard field goal. But special teams coordinator Pete Lembo's gang took over.

Long snapper Rogers took the snap and ran for just enough room for the first down. The Gamecocks lined up versatile tight end Jaheim Bell as a fullback at the goal line, then pitched to MarShawn Lloyd on the end-around for a touchdown.

A Rattler interception on the second play of the third quarter set up the Panthers' second score, a Grainger 4-yard rush to take a 14-12 lead. The Gamecocks immediately responded as Rattler hit Marshawn Lloyd for a 16-yard scoring pass to take the lead for good, 20-14.

Just over two minutes later, Rashad Amos blocked the punt and DQ Smith ran it back 26 yards for a 28-14 lead.

Later, Gamecocks' Traevon Kenion blocked a fourth-quarter punt and Ahmarean Brown took it 10 yards for the final score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia State: The Panthers will cause a lot of trouble in the Sun Belt with their rushing attack. The Gamecocks' defense mostly held them in check, but GSU won't be playing the SEC anymore.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense had some creative play-calls and greatly benefited from having a talent like Rattler behind center. He escaped trouble with his legs to keep numerous plays alive. Yet its offensive line struggled to protect Rattler and the Gamecocks' runners finished with 79 yards.

THE RETURN

Lloyd was the Gamecocks' most hyped running back recruit in a decade but tore an ACL in the first week of preseason camp two years ago and missed the season. He played in 2021 but was still very much not back to full strength.

On Saturday, he rushed for 30 yards, caught two passes for 31 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CLOWNEY COMES HOME

South Carolina held a halftime ceremony to honor former All-American and No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowney. Clowney's jersey No. 7 was added alongside the Gamecocks' four retired numbers, although his number will continue to be worn as per a 2007 university policy.
