SETTING THE SCENE

- The Tigers have scored 20 or more points in 43-consecutive games - the longest active streak in the nation - dating back to a 33-28 win over Tulane on Nov. 27, 2021.
- Dating back to 2023's win at UAB, Memphis has forced at least one turnover in 19 of its last 23 games. Over that stretch, the Tigers have created 40 takeaways (22 INT, 18 FR).
- The Tigers had six named to preseason award watch lists: **Brendon Lewis** (Johnny Unitasw Golden Arm Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award), **Chris Adams** (Panini Senior Bowl Top 300), **William Whitlow Jr.** (Bednarik Award), **Greg Desrosiers Jr.** (Doak Walker, Paul Hornung), **Sutton Smith** (Doak Walker) and **Donovan Mathena** (Wuerffel Trophy).
- Memphis welcomes in over 70 new faces this season that includes 22 true freshmen.
- Memphis, Illinois and Ohio State are all tied with the longest active FBS win streak at seven.
- Memphis moved to 3-0 on the season after a 28-7 win at Troy - the win marks 13-straight victories against Sun Belt opponents.
- The Tiger defense has held their opponents to just seven second half points this season, holding both Georgia State and Troy scoreless in the second halves of its respective games. The only score came against Chattanooga in the season-opener.
- The Tigers racked up 430 yards of total offense in the win, their third 400-yard performance this season and sixth consecutive game of eclipsing 400 yards, dating back to the 2024 season.
- Memphis had a 200-plus yard passer and 100-plus yard rusher for the first time this season as **Brendon Lewis** had 213 through the air and **Sutton Smith** had 113 on the ground.
- The Memphis defense held Troy to just 40 yards of offense in the first half, the least allowed by the Tigers in a single half since 2023 when Memphis held Bethune-Cookman to 34 yards in the first half (Sept. 2, 2023).
- Memphis limited Troy to just 112 yards of offense - 72 of those yards coming on the Trojan's final possession of the game.
 - It is the fewest yards allowed by a Tiger defense since holding North Alabama to 124 total yards on Nov. 19, 2022.
 - The Tigers held Troy to just 49 total yards through the first 11 possessions.
- Memphis' defense forced six three-and-outs and did not allow Troy to cross midfield until its 12th and final possession of the game.
- Saturday's win was the first time since Bethune Cookman (2023) that Memphis forced an opponent to punt 10+ times (Troy punted 11x for 530 yards).
- The Tigers held the Trojan offense scoreless in the full game, with Troy's only points coming from its defense.
- Wide receiver **Brady Kluse** made SportsCenter's Top-10 Best Plays after he snagged a one-handed 18-yard touchdown catch in the back corner of the endzone.
 - The touchdown was Kluse's first career score.
- On the first play of Memphis' seventh drive of the first half, Smith cut right through the Trojan defense for a 50-yard rushing touchdown, his second of the game.
 - It was the longest rush of Smith's career, surpassing a 35-yard run against Chattanooga earlier this season.
- Memphis sealed the game with a redzone stand highlighted by an interception from defensive lineman **Jalen Bell** - the first of his career.

INSIDE THE SERIES

- Saturday's game between Memphis and Arkansas will be the sixth all-time meeting between the programs and the first in nearly three decades.
- In the team's last meeting in 1998, the Hogs took a 23-9 victory over the Tigers inside then-named Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.
- The Tigers last win over Arkansas in Memphis came in 1994 with a 16-15 victory.

Ryan Silverfield became the 25th head coach in Memphis football history in December 2019 and began his tenure by leading the Tigers into their first major bowl game appearance: the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Dallas. In naming Silverfield, the Tigers hired from within. Silverfield served as deputy head coach and offensive line coach during the 2019 season as the Tigers won their first outright conference title in 50 years. Memphis won the 2019 American Athletic Conference championship with a 29-24 win over Cincinnati at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.



Silverfield also was part of Memphis staffs that led the program to three-straight American Athletic Conference West Division crowns from 2017-19 and four-straight bowl appearances from 2016-19. Behind Silverfield's contributions, Memphis won 38 games during those four seasons, including going 10-3 in 2017 and 12-1 in 2019. He is the only member of the staff to be part of both 10-plus win seasons.

The 2024 season was a historic one with Memphis recording the first back-to-back 10-win season after finishing 11-2 overall with a 42-37 win over West Virginia in the Scooter's Coffee Firsco Bowl. The bowl game win was the fifth consecutive postseason victory for the Tigers (2023 - AutoZone Liberty Bowl, 2022 - SERVPRO First Responder Bowl, 2021 - EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl, 2022 - Montgomery Bowl). Memphis finished the season ranked in both the AP and Coaches Poll as well as the College Football Playoffs final poll.

In 2023, Silverfield guided the Tigers to a 10-3 season, including a win in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, 36-26, over Iowa State. The 10-win season is just the fifth in program history and his four bowl titles are the most in school history. His 31 victories are the second-most in program history for a head coach in his first four seasons, while those wins rank in a tie for fourth nationally among head coaches hired in 2020.

Silverfield also became the first head coach in Tiger history to earn Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Coach of the Year honors twice. He also earned the accolade in 2020.

The Tigers had nine student-athletes earn All-AAC honors in 2023, the most for the team since 2019. Running back Blake Watson and linebacker Chandler Martin earned first-team accolades, while wide receiver Roc Taylor, offensive lineman Xavier Hill, quarterback Seth Henigan and defensive lineman Jaylon Allen were named to the second team. Offensive lineman Jacob Likes and defensive back Simeon Blair earned spots on the third team, while linebacker Geoffrey Cantin-Arku earned honorable-mention.

Under Silverfield's leadership in 2022, Memphis defeated Utah State, 38-10, in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl, becoming the first head coach in program history to earn back-to-back bowl titles.

Individually, six Tigers earned All-AAC accolades in 2022, led by first-team honorees defensive back Quindell Johnson and kicker Chris Howard. Tight end Caden Prieskorn and linebacker Xavier "Zay" Cullens earned second-team All-AAC

accolades, while defensive lineman Jaylon Allen and defensive back Davion Ross were named Honorable-Mention All-AAC.

In 2021, Silverfield led the Tigers to the program's eighth-straight bowl game, extending the longest bowl streak of any non-Power 5 team in the country. Memphis was named EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl Champions after Hawai'i was unable to participate.

Individually, true freshman quarterback Seth Henigan had a record-breaking season, earning FWAA Freshman All-America honors. The Denton, Texas native completed 235-of-393 passes for 3,322 yards, 25 touchdowns and eight interceptions. His 3,322 passing yards shattered the school's freshman record previously held by Paxton Lynch in 2013 (2056) and rank sixth overall on the program's single-season list. His 25 touchdowns are tied for the seventh-most in school history.

Wide receiver Calvin Austin III was unanimously chosen by the AAC coaches to the first team, one of just three players to be unanimously selected. Joining Austin III on the All-AAC First Team were tight end Sean Dykes, offensive lineman Dylan Parham and linebacker JJ Russell. The four first-team honorees were the most for Memphis since the program had six in 2017. Earning second-team all-conference accolades for the Tigers were defensive lineman John Tate IV and defensive back Quindell Johnson.

In his first full season at the helm of the program in 2020, Silverfield led the Tigers to the team's first bowl victory since 2014, a 25-10 win over Florida Atlantic in the Montgomery Bowl, becoming the first head coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first year.

Silverfield guided Memphis to an 8-3 record on the season, setting the program record for winning percentage (.727) by a first-year head coach, while also matching the school mark for most wins in a debut year (Mike Norvell, 2016). For his efforts, he was named the 2020 TSWA Coach of the Year.

On the field, Memphis ranked 22nd in the nation in total offense (453.1) and finished 17th in the country in both passing offense (307.9) and first down offense (260). Defensively, the Tigers were 13th in turnovers gained (20), 17th in passes intercepted (12) and 19th in red zone defense (.744).

Quarterback Brady White capped his incredible career at Memphis by winning the 31st William V. Campbell Trophy, which is presented to the college football player with the best combination of academics, community service and on-field performance. White was also a First-Team Senior CLASS Award All-American, one of nine semifinalists for the Wuerfel Trophy and a top-15 candidate for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.

Five players earned honors from the American Athletic Conference following the season, with wide receiver Calvin Austin III and defensive lineman O'Bryan Goodson being named to the first team. Defensive back Quindell Johnson was named to the second team, while both tight end Sean Dykes and defensive lineman Morris Joseph earned All-AAC Honorable-Mention accolades.

During the 2019 season, Silverfield developed a young offensive line that returned only two starters from 2018. One of starters -- Dustin Woodard -- moved to center as a regular for the first time in his collegiate career. Silverfield molded a line that blocked for the fourth-best offense in program history (6,249 yards) and the program's third-best scoring offense (527 points).

Two of Silverfield's linemen received all-conference accolades in 2019. Woodard was named to the All-American

Athletic Conference second team and Dylan Parham earned all-league honorable mention recognition. Silverfield's line blocked for Kenneth Gainwell, The American's Rookie of the Year and the program's fifth 1,000-yard rusher all-time (1,425 yards), and for all-league second team performers in quarterback Brady White, wide receivers Damonte Coxie and Antonio Gibson, and tight end Joey Magnifico. White had more than 3,000 yards passing and Coxie posted more than 1,000 yards receiving, both for a second-straight campaign. After the season, Woodard was a seventh round draft selection in the 2020 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots.

Silverfield served as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2018, overseeing the team's most consistent unit with all five starters playing every game. One year after blocking for an offense that featured consensus All-American wide receiver Anthony Miller and set a school record for passing touchdowns, the offensive line spent the 2018 season in the trenches blocking for the program's first unanimous All-American in running back Darrell Henderson. During the 2018 season, Memphis set school records for total yards, points scored and rushing touchdowns. In 2017, they set the standard for passing touchdowns.

Collectively, Silverfield's 2018 unit was one of 10 semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award, given to the best offensive line in college football. For his role leading the offensive line, Silverfield was named one of six finalists for the offensive line coach of the year award sponsored by FootballScoop. Silverfield also was recognized as one of the top recruiters in his time at Memphis. In 2017, he was ranked the fourth-best recruiter in The American by 247sports.com.

A 2018 Frank Broyles Award candidate, Silverfield first came to Memphis in 2016 with more than 18 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and NFL levels. He remains the only coach to have worked with an NCAA single-season rushing leader and an NFL single-season rushing leader. At UCF, Silverfield helped tutor Kevin Smith when the junior back led college football with 2,567 yards in 2007. Five seasons later in 2012, Silverfield was at Minnesota, where the Vikings' offensive line paved the way for Adrian Peterson's 2,097-yard season.

Just prior to coming to Memphis, Silverfield spent the last half of the 2015 football campaign with the NFL's Detroit Lions. In a mid-season staff shake-up, the Lions brought in Silverfield as an assistant offensive line coach, and the hire paid immediate dividends. His tenure with the Lions was Silverfield's second stint in the NFL.

Before Silverfield's arrival, the Lions had a 2-7 record in the three games before he came on board, Detroit's offensive line allowed 15 sacks for 105 yards. In the season's final stretch, Silverfield helped mold an offensive line that propelled the Lions to a 5-2 record. The Lions' offensive line allowed just more than three sacks per game in the last seven contests, and quarterback Matthew Stafford thrived behind Silverfield's new-look offensive line. In the seven games with Silverfield on staff, Stafford threw 17 touchdowns and only one interception. Before that, Stafford had 15 touchdowns and 12 interceptions.

Preceding his 2015 mid-season jump to the NFL, Silverfield was a senior offensive analyst on head coach Todd Graham's Arizona State staff. In his short time in Tempe, Ariz., the Sun Devils posted a 5-5 record on their way to a final 6-6 regular-season mark and a Motel 6 Cactus Bowl berth.

Silverfield served as an offensive consultant at Toledo in 2014 and helped the Rockets to a 9-4 overall record and a 7-1

Mid-American Conference (MAC) mark. Toledo tied for the MAC West crown and earned a GoDaddy.com Bowl berth. The Rockets' nine wins were the most since 2001, and Toledo's 63-44 bowl victory over Arkansas State was its first postseason win since 2011.

The Rockets' offensive line helped put one of the most prolific offensive seasons in Toledo football record book. The 2014 offense set school records for total offense, total rushing yardage and first downs per game and also ranked among the program's top-five in points per game (2nd), touchdowns scored (3rd) and rushing touchdowns (3rd).

Leading the charge on Silverfield's offensive line was Greg Mancz, the 2014 Vern Smith Award/MAC Player of the Year award recipient. Mancz, also an All-America second team selection, became the first offensive lineman in MAC history to be honored as the league's Player of the Year. Fellow linemen Josh Hendershot and Jeff Myers joined Mancz in earning All-MAC recognition.

Toledo's offensive line proved fruitful for the 2014 Rockets' attack. Toledo led the MAC in scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense and first downs. Rockets running back Kareem Hunt led the MAC in rushing (1,631 yards) and was tops in the nation in yards per carry (8.0). Hunt was an All-MAC first team pick and also earned GoDaddy.com Bowl MVP honors (271 yards/5 touchdowns).

Before jumping back to the collegiate ranks, Silverfield spent six seasons on the Minnesota Vikings staff. In his time in Minnesota, Silverfield helped the Vikings to two NFC North Division crowns and three NFL playoffs appearances, including a trip to the 2009 NFC championship game. Silverfield began his Vikings' stint as an offensive quality control staffer, before moving to a defensive line staff assistant in 2009 and 2010. He moved to the offensive side from 2011-13, assisting Jeff Davidson with the offensive line.

It was in the midst of his three years working with the Minnesota offensive line that Peterson had one of the most-prolific, single-season rushing performances in NFL history. In 2012, Peterson ran for

a league-best 2,097 yards, falling just eight yards shy of Eric Dickerson's NFL record of 2,105. Peterson was named the 2012 NFL MVP.

Prior to his time in the NFL, Silverfield spent the 2006 and 2007 seasons at UCF. In his two campaigns in Orlando, Fla., he served as an offensive graduate assistant his first season and moved to a defensive graduate assistant spot in 2007. Silverfield was a member of the 2007 Knights staff that led the squad to a 10-4 record, a 7-1 Conference USA mark and the C-USA East Division crown. UCF defeated Tulsa in the C-USA championship game and earned the league's AutoZone Liberty Bowl berth.

As an offensive graduate assistant, Silverfield worked with Smith in 2006. That season – Smith's sophomore campaign – he rushed for 934 yards in only nine games, setting up his explosive junior season. As a junior, Smith was the NCAA rushing champion.

In Silverfield's season working with the Knights defense, UCF ranked among the top four in C-USA in scoring defense, rushing defense, passing defense and turnovers forced. The Knights held half of their opponents to 20 or fewer points in the 2007 campaign.

In 2005, Silverfield served as the quarterbacks coach at Jacksonville University. In 2004, at the age of 23, Silverfield served as head coach at Memorial Day High School in Savannah, Ga.

A 2003 Hampden-Sydney College (Va.) graduate, Silverfield coached four seasons at his alma mater, starting as an offensive assistant in 2000. Then, at age 20, he was tapped as the Tigers defensive line coach and spent two seasons at that post (2001-02). In 2003, Silverfield moved back to offense and coached the tight ends and H-backs. That season, the Tigers went 9-1 and had the nation's No. 1 scoring offense in the country (47.0 ppg). Hampden-Sydney scored 45 or more points in seven of its 10 games in 2003. Silverfield graduated from HSC in 2003, cum laude with an Economics degree.

Silverfield started coaching in 1999 at his alma mater, The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla. He played for the Bulldogs and was a member of two Florida state championship teams (1995 and 1998). During his playing career, Silverfield helped Bolles to a No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Super 25 national high school football poll. Immediately after his playing career, Silverfield jumped to the coaching ranks as a Bolles School assistant.

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas is coming off a 41-35 loss at #17 Ole Miss where quarterback Taylen Green led the team with 115 yards on the ground (1 TD) and 305 yards in the air (1 TD, 22-35). Green became the first player in the Hogs program to throw for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards in the same game.
- Nine different receivers caught a pass against Ole Miss with O’Mega Blake leading the pack this season with 18 catches and three scores.
- Green ranks first in FBS with 11 touchdown passes this season while leading the team with 307 rushing yards.

CONTROLLING THE TEMPO

- The Tigers rolled the Trojans to remain undefeated this season and extend their active win streak to seven - tied for the longest in the country with Illinois and Ohio State.
- Sutton Smith racked up 130 all-purpose yards with two scores on the ground while Brendon Lewis threw for 213 yards and one touchdown - a play-action throw to the back of the endzone to Brady Kluse for a SportsCenter Top 10 one-handed catch.
- Memphis held Troy to just 112 yards of total offense - 73 of those yards coming on the Trojan’s final possession of the game. The Tigers also held Troy’s offense to a shutout - the only points coming on a scoop-and-score by the team’s defense.

DEFENSE WINS GAMES

- The Tiger defense has been an iron wall in their first three games, allowing just seven points in the second half by opponents.
- After Chattanooga scored in the third quarter of the season-opening, Memphis held both Georgia State and Troy scoreless in the second halves of both games.

SECOND HALF SURGE

- Memphis’ second half surge over Georgia State kept them undefeated as they scored 24 unanswered points to claim the 38-16 win.
- A tempo shift that started at the end of the first half from placekicker Gianni Spetic after he nailed a 55-yard field goal, a career best for him and the third longest field goal made in program history.
- For the second straight game, DeMarco Ward recorded a pick six. Ward picked off TJ Finley with seconds left in the game to ice it for Memphis.
- On the defensive side, the Tigers recorded 10 TFL for the second consecutive game - the first time the team has done this since the 2018 season.

HOMETOWN KIDS

- Making their way back to Atlanta, three Georgia-native Tigers showed out in their home state against Georgia State.
- Running backs Sutton Smith and Makari Bodiford made a statement to the Peach State. Smith recorded 74 yards on the ground, 43 in the air and 54 on punt returns while Bodiford netted 42 yards on the ground and his first multi-touchdown game after scoring in the second and third quarters.
- DeMarco Ward recorded his second pick-six of the season with 11 seconds left in the game to ice it for Memphis.

LOCK DOWN DEFENSE

- The Tiger defense locked down the run game against Georgia State - after giving up 62 yards on the ground in the opening quarter, Memphis held the Panthers to -13 yards over the remaining three quarters of play.

WEEK WON WIN

- Memphis opened up the 2025 season at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium with a dominating 45-10 win over Chattanooga.
- With the win, Memphis extended its home-opening win streak to 12-straight games and is 12-0 against FCS opponents since 2013.
- Memphis has scored at least 15 points in 81-consecutive home games - the second-longest active streak in the FBS and the fourth-longest streak overall since 1978.
- Four different Tigers rushed for a touchdown (Desrosiers Jr., Smith, Lewis, Peasant), the most in a game since Aug. 30, 2014, when five players scored on the ground in a 63-0 win over Austin Peay.
- Dating back to a win over UAB during the 2023 season, Memphis has forced at least one turnover in 17 of its last 21 games. Over that stretch, the Tigers have created 38 takeaways (20 INT, 18 FR).
- Along with the offensive feats, the Tiger defense shined with an interception from Chanuncey Logan Jr., a pick six from DeMarco Ward and a blocked field goal from William Whitlow Jr.

DUAL THREAT

- Quarterback Brendon Lewis led the team with 81 rushing yards in the season-opener against Chattanooga.
- The last Memphis QB to rush for 80 yards in a game was Tyler Bass on Sept. 19, 2009, vs. Tennessee-Martin (80).
- With Lewis hitting 81 against the Mocs, it was the most by a Memphis QB since Danny Wimprine on Oct. 13, 2001, vs. Houston.

WELCOME BACK, SUTTON

- Redshirt junior running back Sutton Smith got back onto the field for the first time in a year. After a season-ending injury in the team’s season-opener last year, Smith’s first attempt ended up being a 35-yard run to the house.
- The touchdown was Smith’s first score since the AutoZone Liberty Bowl on December 29, 2023.

BEST AGAINST THE BEST

- Since 2015, Memphis has posted a record of 9-11 (.450) against top-25 ranked opponents.
- The nine victories are the most over that stretch for any non-Power 4 team in the country.
- Memphis’ nine ranked wins since 2015 have come over No. 13/12 Ole Miss (2015), No. 18/21/20 Houston (2016), No. 25/RV UCLA (2017), No. 25/24 Navy (2017), No. 15/14 SMU (2019), No. 18/17/19 Cincinnati (2019), No. 21/21/20 Cincinnati (2019), No. 23/24 SMU (2021) and No. 17/18/18 Tulane (2024).

RIDING THE MOMENTUM

- The 2024 season was a historic one for the Tigers as they became just the sixth team in program history to win 10 games (2023, 2019, 2017, 2014, 1938) and secured back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in 109 years of football.
- Last year’s team also became just the 11th in program history to win nine or more games in a season.
- The Tigers reached eight wins for the ninth time in the past 11 seasons.

AMONG THE ELITE

GAME NOTES

- Memphis has posted 101 victories since 2014, tied for 12th-most in the nation during that stretch.
- The 101 wins are the most among American Athletic Conference schools during that span.
- The Tigers also rank 13th in the country in winning percentage dating back to 2014 with their 102-43 (.703) mark.
- Memphis (64) has the fourth-most home wins in the country since 2014, trailing only Alabama (72), Clemson (70) and Ohio State (69). The Tigers’ .840 winning percentage is No. 9 in the country over that stretch.
- Memphis’ streak of 11-straight seasons with a record of .500 or better is the third-longest streak among Group of 5 and independent schools and is the longest such streak in the AAC.

MEMPHIS LEADS NATION IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH 20 OR MORE POINTS

- The Tigers have scored 20 or more points in 41-consecutive games - the longest active streak in the nation - dating back to a 33-28 win over Tulane on Nov. 27, 2021.
- Memphis has scored 1,513 points over that stretch for an average of 36.9 points per game.
- The next longest active streaks belong to Miami (17).
- Only eight other schools have had a streak of 40+ games in the last 40 years.
- The FBS record is 77-consecutive games held by Ohio State, spanning from Sept. 17, 2017 to Sept. 23, 2023.
- The Tigers have scored at least 21 points in 40 straight home games. The only other school with an active streak of 21+ points in 30+ straight home games is Louisville (34).

BOWL STREAK

- Following the win over North Texas last season, Memphis was bowl eligible for the 11th-consecutive season, the longest stretch of any non-Power 4 team in the country.
- It took the Tigers only seven games to reach bowl eligibility in 2024, matching the fastest marks set in 2017 & 2019 to do so in the last decade.
- Memphis is one of seven teams in FBS with 11 or more consecutive bowl-game appearances along with Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Iowa.
- In 2024, the Tigers defeated West Virginia, 42-37, in the Scooter’s Coffee FirSCO Bowl, improving the program’s record to 9-8 in bowl games.

THE JORDON HANKINS EFFECT

- Since taking over as the defensive play caller for the Tigers before the 2023 AutoZone Liberty Bowl win over Iowa State, the Memphis defense has been much improved.
- In his debut, Hankins and the Tigers held the Cyclones to zero rushing yards on 20 attempts in the victory.
- The zero rushing yards allowed by Memphis were the fewest since the Tigers held Ole Miss to -4 rushing yards in 1993.
- Memphis’ 12 tackles for loss in the win over Florida State were the most for the Tigers in a game since 2018 vs. SMU.
- As a unit, the Tiger defense lead the country in 2024 with 15 fumble recoveries, was tied for second nationally in turnover margin (+19), No. 10 in turnovers gained (26), No. 15 in ruhsing defense (111.8), No. 16 in first-down defense (225), No. 56 with 74.0 tackles for loss and No. 66 in total defense (369.3).

OUR FOOTBALL FUTURE: TRANSFORMATIONAL RENOVATIONS TO SIMMONS BANK LIBERTY STADIUM

- Memphis Athletics, alongside the University’s Auxiliary Services Foundation, is committing to a \$220 million investment in the stadium project.
- All demolition at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium has been completed for phase two from the top of the structure to the ground level.
- Phase 2 priority elements include creating a unique interior “party plaza” area for all fans and beginning initial perimeter and halo upgrades to create a hospitality space around the stadium.
- Stadium capacity during the 2024 and 2025 Memphis Football seasons is anticipated to be in the low-30,000s, and capacity after renovations are complete is estimated to be approximately 50,000.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Memphis (64) has the fourth-most home wins in the country since 2014, trailing only Alabama (71), Clemson (70) and Ohio State (69). The Tigers’ .840 winning percentage is No. 9 in the country over that stretch.
- Memphis has had a great home field advantage at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium, posting a record of 43-9 (.827) since head coach Ryan Silverfield joined the staff in 2016 - tied for fourth most in the country over that stretch.
- As head coach, Silverfield is 29-6 (.828) at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium. The 29 home wins are tied for fifth most in FBS over that span.

NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS IN MEMPHIS

- Memphis is 31-1 in the team’s last 31 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Among the games during that stretch for the Tigers include victories over Mississippi State (2021), Ole Miss (2019, 2015), UCLA (2017) and Kansas (2016).
- The lone loss during that stretch came against UTSA (now a member of The American), 31-28, on Sept. 25, 2021.

TIGERS IN THE NCAA RANKINGS

- As a unit, the Tiger defense lead the country in 2024 with 15 fumble recoveries, was tied for second nationally in turnover margin (+19), No. 10 in turnovers gained (26), No. 15 in ruhsing defense (111.8), No. 16 in first-down defense (225), No. 56 with 74.0 tackles for loss and No. 66 in total defense (369.3)
- On the offensive side, the Tigers ranked second in fewest fumbles lost (2) and fewest turnovers lost (8), fourth in time of possession (33:14), sixth in fewest interceptions thrown (6), 12th in scoring offense (35.7), 16th in total offense (444.5), 20th in passing offense (270.5), 26th in first-down offense (300) and 36th in fewest sacks allowed (19).

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Memphis was well represented on preseason national award watch lists by numerous student-athletes.
- Redshirt senior quarterback Brendon Lewis was named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm preseason award watch lists.
- Returning left tackle Chris Adams was tabbed to the Panini Senior Bowl’s Top 300 List.
- Running backs Greg Desrosiers Jr. and Sutton Smith were both named as preseason candidates for the 2025 Doak Walker Award while Desrosiers Jr. was tabbed to the Paul Hornung Award watch list.
- Defensive end William Whitlow Jr. found himself on the Bednarik Award preseason watch list.
- Linebacker Donovan Mathena was named to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list and was an AFA Allstate Good Works Team honoree.

GAME NOTES

- Memphis opened the season at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium for the 14th time in the last 15 years on August 30 against Chattanooga.
- The 2025 season got off to a bang with a 45-10 win over the Mocs.
- The Tigers opened the 2024 season against North Alabama and rolled to a dominant 40-0 shutout win.
- 2022's season-opening game on the road at Mississippi State snapped an 11-season streak of opening the season in Memphis.
- The Tigers are 46-61-3 all-time in season-opening contests.
- Memphis has won 12-straight home openers and have posted a record of 54-49-5 all-time in home opening games.

MEMPHIS IN OVERTIME GAMES

- Memphis has been involved in 11 overtime games (3-8). The Tigers have played a total of five multi-overtime affairs and have a 2-3 record in those games.
- The most recent overtime game for the Tigers was last season at Charlotte when Memphis won 44-38.
- The Tigers came up just short in the 2017 American Athletic Conference Championship game in double-OT at UCF, 62-55. The Tigers and Knights combined to score 117 points, the highest total in a conference title game in FBS history.
- Memphis ended the 2014 season with the first overtime game in five seasons, defeating BYU 55-48 in double-OT at the Miami Beach Bowl.

SILVERFIELD STATS

- Head coach Ryan Silverfield's 42 wins through his first five seasons as head coach are the most in program history.
- Silverfield is the only head coach in Memphis history with five bowl titles.
- Silverfield was named the Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Coach of the Year in 2023, becoming the first Memphis head coach to earn the honor twice (2020).
- Among 24 head coaches hired in 2020, Silverfield is the only one with five bowl championships and his 42 wins are third most among that group.

RYAN SILVERFIELD

- Coming off the fifth 10-win season in program history capped by an AutoZone Liberty Bowl victory over Iowa State, head coach Ryan Silverfield received a new five-year contract through the 2028 season in April that will pay him an average of \$2.45 million annually.

SILVERFIELD SECURES ANOTHER TOP RECRUITING CLASS

- Memphis clocked in as the number one recruiting class for The American and at No. 60 in Rivals rankings for the 2025 season. The 20 student-athletes, ranked as the best class among Group of Five programs.
- The 2023 class, which included 23 student-athletes, was ranked No. T-60 by Rivals, making it the fifth-best class in program history. It ranked as the second-best class among Group of Five programs.
- The 2022 class was the best class in program history (No. 47), while the 2021 class is the second-best in school history (No. 49).
- Both classes were ranked No. 2 in the AAC those seasons behind only Cincinnati.
- Prior to Silverfield, Memphis had never had a top-50 recruiting class in Rivals rankings.

STAFF ADDITIONS

- Jay Simpson starts his first season with the Tigers as the cornerbacks coach after a three-year stint at Arkansas State as the defensive backs and defensive pass game coordinator role.
- Simpson helped the Red Wolves to an 8-5 record and a Ventures Bowl Championship - the best season for the program since 2019.
- Three staff members were promoted from analysts to assistant coaches during the offseason: David Diehl (offensive line), Joe Cauthen (defensive line) and Mitch Stewart (quarterbacks).

STERLING START

- Head coach Ryan Silverfield had a tremendous first season at the helm of the Tiger Football program in 2020, leading the team to an 8-3 record and a win in the Montgomery Bowl, the first for the Tigers since 2014.
- With that victory over Florida Atlantic in the Montgomery Bowl, Silverfield became the first head coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first year.
- Silverfield set the program record for winning percentage (.727) by a first-year head coach, while also matching the school mark for most wins in a debut year (Mike Norvell, 2016).
- For his efforts, he was named the 2020 Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Coach of the Year.
- Prior to being named head coach in 2019 before the team's appearance in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Dallas, Silverfield served as deputy head coach and offensive line coach during the 2019 season as the Tigers won their first outright conference title in 50 years.
- Silverfield also was part of Memphis staffs that led the program to three-straight American Athletic Conference West Division crowns from 2017-19 and four-straight bowl appearances from 2016-19.
- Behind Silverfield's contributions, Memphis won 38 games during those four seasons, including going 10-3 in 2017 and 12-1 in 2019. He is the only member of the staff to be part of both 10-plus win seasons.

MADE IN MEMPHIS

- Since 2015, 14 Memphis players have been drafted by the National Football League.
- Defensive back Kobee Minor was selected as "Mr. Irrelevant" in the 2025 NFL Draft, going in the seventh round as the last 257th pick to the New England Patriots.
- OL Dylan Parham was selected in the third round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Las Vegas Raiders, while WR Calvin Austin III was taken by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the fourth round.
- With the selections, Memphis has had at least one player selected in nine of the last 11 NFL Drafts, with 15 players being taken over that span.
- On current NFL rosters, five former Tigers are listed at running back (Antonio Gibson, Tony Pollard, Kenneth Gainwell, Patrick Taylor Jr. and Blake Watson).
- Currently, 13 Tigers are on NFL rosters – DB Arthur Maulet (Baltimore), WR Anthony Miller (Baltimore), RB Blake Watson (Denver), DE Genard Avery (Indianapolis), OL Dylan Parham (Las Vegas), DL Bryce Huff (Philadelphia), PK Jake Elliott (Philadelphia), RB Kenneth Gainwell (Philadelphia), WR Calvin Austin III (Pittsburgh), RB Patrick Taylor Jr. (San Francisco), LB JJ Russell (Tampa Bay), RB Tony Pollard (Tennessee) and RB Antonio Gibson (New England).
