WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This is the 72nd meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Arkansas dating back to 1908.
- The Razorbacks hold a 37-33-1 lead on the field, while Ole Miss leads 10-6 in Oxford ... The home team has won five of the last six contests, the lone exception being Ole Miss' record-breaking 63-31 win in Fayetteville last fall.
- Ole Miss has risen to No. 13 in the Coaches poll and No. 17 in the AP poll ... The Rebels have been ranked for 35 consecutive polls since the beginning of the 2023 season, the longest streak since 2014-16 (41).
- The Rebels are 306-116-8 (.721) all-time at Vaught-Hemingway before vacated wins (284-113-8 after).
- Ole Miss is 28-3 in its last 31 home games and 14-1 at home since the start of the 2023 season ... In that span, Ole Miss is averaging 43.3 points and 531.5 yards per game at home.
- The Rebels are 41-13 under **Lane Kiffin** since 2021 and rank third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- Since the start of 2020, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams lead all FBS schools at 506.4 yards per game.
- Ole Miss ranks second in the SEC and eighth nationally at 22.1 seconds per play.
- RB Kewan Lacy leads the SEC in both rushing yards (246) and rushing touchdowns (4) ... Lacy is among six Rebels in available records with at least four scores through two games and one of seven with at least 200 yards.
- WR Harrison Wallace III leads the SEC at 247 yards, sixth-most through two games at Ole Miss in available records.
- QB **Austin Simmons** leads the SEC and ranks second nationally at 17.5 yards per completion.
- At six career blocked kicks, DT **Zxavian Harris** stands one block shy of the all-time SEC record of seven.
- Preseason All-America LB **Suntarine Perkins** (14.0) is one sack away from cracking the all-time top-10 at Ole Miss.
- LB **Tyler Banks** was awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award and will wear the No. 38 jersey all season.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (12:10 p.m. CT). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE: Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at 12:10 p.m. CT, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystems.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes are digital and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of Ole Miss Athletics. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (cabell.philpott@imgworld.com), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW: The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on OleMissSports. com and airs on ESPNU.

COREY ADAMS: 2006-2025



This season, the Rebels will wear helmet decals in memory of freshman defensive end **Corey Adams**, who was tragically killed on July 19. Adams, a member of the 2024-25 Ole Miss signing class, enrolled at Ole Miss early and participated in spring drills while earning Dean's Honor Roll accolades in the classroom. Adams, a native of New Orleans, was a unanimous three-star prospect coming out of Edna Karr High School and was rated as high as the No. 16 overall recruit in Louisiana.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST ARKANSAS

Nov. 2, 2024 • Fayetteville, Ark. • #18 Ole Miss 63, Arkansas 31 Jaxson Dart set the single-game passing record with 515 yards and Jordan Watkins broke the single-game receiving yards (254) and touchdown records (5) in a dominating win over Arkansas in Fayetteville. Ole Miss entered the game just 2-13 all-time in Fayetteville but led Arkansas wire-to-wire and put the game away by halftime on Saturday for its first win at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium since 2008.

Oct. 7, 2023 • Oxford, Miss. • #15 Ole Miss 27, Arkansas 20 Ole Miss held Arkansas to 288 total yards of offense, the fewest for Ole

Miss against an SEC opponent since 2019 en route to a 27-20 win. The Rebels held Arkansas to just 36 yards on the ground, the fewest yielded by Ole Miss against an SEC opponent since 2014. Ole Miss' defense shined all around, finishing with a season-high five sacks and two interceptions.

Nov. 19, 2022 • Fayetteville, Ark. • Arkansas 42, #14 Ole Miss 27 Ole Miss tallied 703 total yards of offense, including 463 yards on the ground, but fell in an early hole and drop the SEC road contest 42-27 to Arkansas. Quinshon Judkins and Zach Evans became the first two Rebels to eclipse the 200-yard rushing mark in the same game. Ultimately, the Razorback ground game was just as effective as Arkansas held on for the win.

Oct. 9, 2021 • Oxford, Miss. • #17 Ole Miss 52, #13 Arkansas 51 In a back-and-forth shootout, Ole Miss and Arkansas combined for just shy of 700 rushing yards as the Rebels just edged the Razorbacks in a wild victory. Ole Miss claimed a 24-14 advantage out of halftime, but Arkansas fought back to tie the game four separate times in the second half. Ultimately, the Hogs attempted to break the tie with a two-point conversion on the game's final play, but the Rebel secured the victory.

Oct. 17, 2020 • Fayetteville, Ark. • Arkansas 33, Ole Miss 21
The Ole Miss offense had scored 35 or more points in each of their first three games in 2020, but the Arkansas defensive gameplan befuddled the Rebel air attack, resulting in six interceptions for the Razorbacks. Despite the heavy turnovers, the Rebels were right in the game, trailing by five with the ball late in the fourth quarter—but the sixth interception of the game from Matt Corral was returned by Grant Morgan for six Razorback points, sealing the Rebel defeat.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program. Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths, including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances. Kiffin has tallied three 10-win seasons in Oxford, including Ole Miss' first-ever 11-win season. In 13 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 107-52, including a 46-18 mark with the Rebels. Under his watch, the Rebels have broken into the national top-10 in each of the last four seasons, the first such streak at Ole Miss since 1961-64. Kiffin came to Ole Miss from Florida Atlantic, where he turned around an FAU program that won nine games over the previous three seasons with two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

ARKANSAS HEAD COACH SAM PITTMAN

Arkansas head coach Sam Pittman sits in his sixth season coaching the Razorbacks, helping to lead the squad to a record of 31-31 since taking over in 2020. Pittman has led the Razorbacks to seven or more wins in three of the last four seasons. Pittman is coming off his third straight bowl win, making him the only Arkansas coach in program history to win each of his first three bowl games. Pittman's sixth season at the helm matches the tenure of Ken Hatfield, as only five coaches have served longer as the Head Hog over the program's 131 seasons. Prior to taking the helm at Arkansas, Pittman served as head coach for Hutchinson Community College, where he helped lead the Blue Dragons to an 11-9-1 record over two seasons. Pittman also has experience in offensive line and assistant head coaching roles for various Power 5 programs including Georgia, Tennessee, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Kansas and Missouri.

RAZORBACK SCOUTING REPORT

Arkansas enters the week 2-0 overall, scoring 50-plus points in both of their games to start the 2025 season. The Razorbacks currently rank No. 4 in the country, averaging 591 yards per game, with 334 yards of that coming through the air. Taylen Green is completing 72 percent of his passes and has thrown for 561 yards and 10 TDs this season. Seven different Razorback receivers have hauled in a touchdown during the first two games, including O'Mega Blake who leads Arkansas with 12 catches for 185 yards this season. Green and New Mexico State transfer, Mike Washington Jr., are both averaging over 90 yards rushing per game and 10 yards per carry. Defensively, Arkansas is limiting its opponent to just 260 yards per game, only giving up three total touchdowns this year. Quincy Rhodes Jr. ranks No. 5 in the NCAA with three sacks so far this season. Punter Devin Bale, a preseason All-SEC selection, is averaging 48.8 yards per punt on five punts this season.

HOME SWEET HOME

Vaught-Hemingway Stadium has been a safe haven for the Rebels historically, owning a 306-116-8 (.721) record all-time in Oxford before vacated wins (284-113-8), and that's been no different in the **Lane Kiffin** era. Ole Miss is 28-3 in its last 31 home games, and since the beginning of Kiffin's tenure in 2020, the Rebels have gone 28-6 overall at Vaught-Hemingway -- which includes a 14-game home winning streak that spanned Nov. 14, 2020 to Oct. 15, 2022. That streak was among the longest home winning streaks nationally when it was snapped by No. 9 Alabama in 2022. Including a tie to LSU in 1960, the Rebels went unbeaten for 34 games over the course of 12 years (1952-64). Under Kiffin, the Rebels have recorded the first two seven-win home seasons in program history in 2021 and 2023.

HOT AT HOME

Ole Miss has only lost at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium three times since the beginning of the 2021 season and only six times total in the **Lane Kiffin** era. That includes only one loss since the start of the 2023 season. In that span, the Rebels have consistently put on a show for the Ole Miss faithful, welcoming in a grand total of 984,023 fans through its turnstiles -- good for a capacity crowd per game average of 65,601.

In the **Lane Kiffin** era, the Rebel offense ranks as the most prolific in the nation, leading the FBS in both yards per game since the beginning of the 2020 season (506.4), as well as total yards (32,408) despite playing six fewer games than Alabama (32,328) and Georgia (31,938). Ole Miss is also the lone school nationally to rank top-six since 2020 in both passing (3rd, 297.6 ypg) and rushing (6th, 208.7 ypg).

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Lane Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording four of the top-five and six of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history. Kiffin owns 28 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 19 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as eight of the top-10 performances all-time.

LACY TO THE ENDZONE

Sophomore **Kewan Lacy** is off to a terrific start as Ole Miss' top rusher, currently leading the SEC in rushing touchdowns (4; No. 2 FBS), rushing yards (246; No. 8 FBS) and rushing yards per game (123.0; No. 10 FBS). Lacy's proficiency in finding the endzone has him among elite company, as he stands as one of six Ole Miss rushers in available records (since at least 1970) to score four times across the first two games of the season. Lacy's three rushing scores in the season opener vs. Georgia State had him in rarefied air as well as one of three Rebels since 2000 with multiple rushing scores in a debut alongside Scottie Phillips (2018 vs. Texas Tech, two TD) and BenJarvus Green-Ellis (2006 vs. Memphis, two TD).

GROUND GAME

Kewan Lacy has powered Ole Miss to the SEC's No. 2 rushing attack this year, accounting for 123.0 of the Rebels' 257.5 ground yards per game. Lacy has broken 100 yards in each of his first two contests as a Rebel against Georgia State (108) and Kentucky (138), making him the first Ole Miss rusher to do so to start a season since Scottie Phillips in 2018 against Texas Tech (204) and Southern Illinois (107) -- which was also the start of Phillips' career as a Rebel. In available records since at least 1975, Lacy is one of six Rebel rushers to break 100 yards through two games -- with Lacy and Phillips standing as the lone Rebels to do so at the beginning of their Ole Miss careers.

TOP TARGET

Senior WR **Harrison Wallace III** has been the main engine for the Ole Miss passing attack so far this season, currently leading the SEC and ranking fourth nationally at his 247 receiving yards. Through two games, that ranks sixth among all Ole Miss receivers (in available records since at least 1976), and among newcomers in that same timespan, Wallace stands alone as the first Rebel to break 100 yards in each of their first two games to start a season.

SIMMONS' TIME TO SHINE

After two years of sitting behind Ole Miss' all-time leading passer, sophomore QB **Austin Simmons** is now leading the charge for the Rebels offensively, having earned his first two career starts against Georgia State and Kentucky. On the year, Simmons is 33-of-55 for 576 yards and three touchdowns, and he currently leads the SEC and ranks second nationally at his 17.5 yards per completion. A former consensus four-star recruit out of Miami and a former flamethrower for the Ole Miss baseball team, Simmons began 2025 with nine prior games of experience with 282 yards and two touchdowns passing. But no moment so far has been bigger than his first quarter march down the field against No. 2 Georgia in relief of an injured Jaxson Dart. Simmons went 5-of-6 for 64 yards to match the Bulldogs early, helping keep the Rebels afloat in what turned out to be Ole Miss' biggest top-five win since 1969. Simmons already owns a college degree after graduating with his bachelor's in multi-disciplinary studies this past May, another early completion after graduating high school early to reclassify and enroll at Ole Miss in the fall of 2023.

CALLING IN THE SOUTHPAW

Adding additional intrigue to **Austin Simmons** taking over the starting quarterback role for Ole Miss is his throwing arm, as he is the first Rebel lefty to start at quarterback since Brent Schaeffer, who started 12 games under center for the Rebels across the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Other notable lefties at Ole Miss in the last half-century include Paul Head (1993-96) and Bobby Garner (1976-78).

SEASONED VET

Senior WR **De'Zhaun Stribling** ranks among the most experienced receivers in the FBS, sitting within the top-20 of the NCAA's active career database in receptions (5th, 165), receiving yards per game (5th, 51.6), receiving yards (6th, 2,217), receiving touchdowns (6th, 17), receptions per game (10th, 3.84) and yards per catch (18th, 13.4). Stribling has been a top target at two prior stops at Washington State from 2021-22 and Oklahoma State from 2023-24, tallying up 1,073 yards and 10 scores with the Cougars while hauling in 1,080 yards and seven TDs while with the Cowboys.

KING OF SWAT

Senior DT **Zxavian Harris** has been a wrecking ball on special teams his entire career, and after another blocked kick against Georgia State in the opener, he stands on the edge of history as one of the best kick blockers in SEC history. Harris, who had a superb game with 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sack, two QB hurries and his first career interception, got a finger on the Panthers' field goal try during the first quarter -- his sixth career blocked kick across PATs and field goals. One more ties him with Kentucky's Lonnell Dewalt (2004) and Matt Roark (2008-11), who each set the SEC record at seven blocks apiece. On the year, Harris leads all Rebels with 2.5 TFL and 2.0 sacks, and ranks fourth on the team with 11 tackles.

PERKINS ON PACE

Junior LB **Suntarine Perkins** put together a superb sophomore campaign in 2024, ending near the top of the national leader boards with 14.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks -- with the latter ranked tied for the second-most in Ole Miss single-season history. For his efforts, Perkins has been rewarded by a number of preseason accolades, including watch lists for the Lombardi, Bednarik and Nagurski, as well as preseason All-America nods by Walter Camp (second-team), The Sporting News (second-team) and Phil Steele (fourth-team). Perkins currently stands on the edge of the all-time top-10 sacks list at Ole Miss, needing 1.0 to tie Dewayne Dotson for 10th at 15.0 career sacks.

TYLER BANKS WINS CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

Ole Miss senior LB **Tyler Banks** was named the winner of the 2025 Chucky Mullins Courage Award. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. A native of Blackstone, Virginia, Banks is Ole Miss' active career leader in games played with 41 total appearances and owns 32 career tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

CARNEIRO FROM DOWNTOWN

Lou Groza Award watch list member **Lucas Carneiro** has stood among the more talented place-kickers nationally across his career, thanks in large part to a near-sterling record on field goal attempts from far away. Across his time at both WKU and now at Ole Miss, Carneiro owns a career line of 32-of-37 (86.5 percent) and a perfect 95-of-95 mark on PATs. But it's from distance where Carneiro really shines, holding a career 9-of-10 mark from 40-49 yards and a 6-of-7 line from 50 yards out -- with his first career 50-yard miss coming last week at Kentucky on a strike that hit far up the left goal post.

YEAR SIX OF THE KIFFIN ERA

Ole Miss is in the sixth year of the **Lane Kiffin** era in 2025, who has put an indelible stamp on the program. He is the owner of the first 11-win season in school history (2023) in 2023, the first two 10-win regular seasons in program history (2021, '23), the first two seven-win home seasons (2021, '23), and the first consecutive 10-win seasons at Ole Miss (2023, '24) since John Vaught's history 1959 (10-1) and 1960 (10-0-1) did so -- with another such season in 2025 making him the first in program history with three in a row. He is the fastest Ole Miss head coach to 40 wins, and at 46-18 he barreling toward becoming the fastest to 50 as well. The Rebels are mainstays in the national polls, having broken into the top-10 in each of the last four seasons (the first four-year stretch since 1961-64), and he has turned Ole Miss into a powerhouse both on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal -- which has resulted in 23 NFL Draft picks already mentored since arriving in 2020.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program in 2025.

Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths (including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances), three 10-win seasons (including the first ever 11-win season and the first two 10-win regular seasons in program history), and several of the most statistically significant campaigns in the storied past of Ole Miss football.

Kiffin's Rebel teams have broken into the national top-10 in at least one poll in each of the last four seasons since 2021, the first streak at Ole Miss since John Vaught's hallowed teams from 1961-64. In that same stretch since 2021, Kiffin has won 41 games, which ranks third among all SEC schools behind Georgia and Alabama, and includes a superb 28-3 home record. Since 2023 alone, Kiffin's teams are 14-1 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Kiffin's well-renown prowess on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal has helped transform Ole Miss into perennial contenders and a hot commodity on the transfer market. The "Portal King" has welcomed in four straight top-six transfer classes according to 247Sports -- including the No. 1 ranked class in 2024 -- as well as five-straight top-25 high school classes per On3.

In 14 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 107-52 — including a 46-18 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin's 46 wins has him third in Ole Miss history, and in 2024 he became the fastest in program history to 40 wins — doing so in 57 games, three fewer than Vaught. Kiffin (.719) and Vaught (.745) rank as the lone Rebel coaches all-time to have a win percentage of at least .700 (in at least 30 games coached).

Kiffin led the Rebels to a 10-3 mark and a dominant 52-20 Gator Bowl victory over Duke in 2024, marking the first consecutive 10-win campaigns at Ole Miss since 1959-60. The Rebels shattered program records in total yards (6,845), yards per play (7.3), passing yards (4,561), passing yards per game (350.8), sacks (52) and tackles for loss (120), as Ole Miss possessed one of the most dynamic passing attacks in the nation in addition to one of the most powerful rush defenses and pass rush capabilities in the FBS.

The 2024 campaign was simultaneously highlighted by the end of the incredible career of eventual first-round NFL Draft pick quarterback Jaxson Dart, who led the nation in total offense while dismantling several all-time Rebel records, and the stifling Ole Miss defense, which led the nation in both sacks and TFL alongside the best Rebel rush defense since 1966. Defensive tackle Walter Nolen led that defense, ending up as the 14th consensus All-American in program history and the first Rebel selected in the 2025 NFL Draft -- one of a seven-round era record eight Ole Miss draftees taken.

Kiffin's marquee win of the 2024 season was a 28-10 victory over No. 2 Georgia, the highest ranked win for the Rebels since 2015 and the first top-five win and highest ranked win in Oxford since 2014. The 2024 Rebels were the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and it stands as the largest top-five win by an Ole Miss team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 victory over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11). The Rebels finished the year ranked No. 9 in both the AP and Coaches polls, only the second final top-10 ranking by an Ole Miss team since 1969.

The Rebels once again ranked among the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16).

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history that included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Wide receiver Elijah Moore and quarterback Matt Corral were two of the main cogs in the Rebels' high-powered offense.

Moore earned first-team consensus All-America accolades after a historic and shortened 2020 junior season. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native hauled in a school record 86 receptions for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns during his last season in a Rebel uniform. Moore, a Biletnikoff finalist, led the country in receiving yards per game (149.1) and receptions per game (10.8).

Corral became just the fourth SEC player ever to finish as the NCAA leader in total offense per game (384.9), joining Pat Sullivan (1970), Rex Grossman (2001) and Johnny Manziel (2012). The signal-caller also finished No. 5 in passing yards per game (333.7), No. 7 in passing TDs (29), No. 9 in passing efficiency (177.6) and No. 11 in passing yards per completion (14.5).

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set last season during the Tigers' run to a national title.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first seasons at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing guarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

GAME ONE #15 OLE MISS 63, GEORGIA STATE 7

Aug. 30, 2025 Attendance: 66,378 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.



OXFORD, Miss. — No. 15 Ole Miss football overcame a couple of early miscues to turn in a dominant 63-7 victory over Georgia State to open its 2025 season on Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Georgia State pass rush caused a pair of early interceptions to keep the game close in the opening half, but Ole Miss kept its foot on the gas to come away with a decisive win to start 1-0 for the fifth straight season. The Rebels became the first team in SEC history to score 60-plus points in three consecutive season-openers.

Lane Kiffin's squad outgained Georgia State 695-260, including a 400-69 advantage through the air. Ole Miss totaled 33 first downs in the victory, including an 8-for-13 mark on third downs, while the Rebel defense held Georgia State to 2-for-15 on third downs.

Austin Simmons finished 20-for-31 for 341 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions in his first career start. Harrison Wallace III led the receiving corps with 130 yards and a touchdown on five catches, while tight ends Dae'Quan Wright and Caleb Odom each scored, combining for eight catches and 135 yards. Kewan Lacy broke the century mark on the ground and found the end zone three times in his Rebel debut, going 108 yards on 16 carries.

TJ Dottery led the Rebel defense with nine tackles, including a shared tackle for loss, and broke up one pass. Zxavian Harris had a monster day, totaling five tackles, including a sack, with an interception and two pass breakups. Jaden Yates finished second behind Dottery with eight tackles in his Rebel debut.

LEXINGTON, **Ky**. — No. 14 Ole Miss football had a slow start in its SEC opener at Kentucky, but Lane Kiffin and the Rebels found their way and left Kroger Field with a 30-23 road win to open conference play.

It was the fourth win for the Rebels in the last five meetings vs. Kentucky.

A couple of early interceptions helped Kentucky jump out to a 10-0 lead, but Ole Miss responded with two of its three rushing touchdowns on the afternoon to go on top. The Rebels never trailed from there, fending off the Wildcats thanks to a late rushing score by Austin Simmons and three Lucas Carneiro field goals.

Ole Miss outgained Kentucky 455-354, including a 220-yard day on the ground for the visitors. The Rebels were a perfect 5-for-5 in red zone scoring and logged three sacks, while the Wildcats had zero.

Austin Simmons finished 13-for-24 through the air, with 279 total yards, one rushing touch-down and two interceptions. Kewan Lacy had a monster day, rushing for 138 yards and a score on 28 carries. Both Lacy and Harrison Wallace III had consecutive 100-yard performances to start their Rebel careers. Wallace hauled in four passes for a team-high 117 yards.

TJ Dottery, Jaden Yates and Zxavian Harris tied atop the Rebel tackle sheet with six apiece, with Harris notching a sack for the second straight game. Princewill Umanmielen had a team-high two tackles for loss, including a sack. Will Echoles logged a sack as part of his three total tackles. Ole Miss broke up six passes on the afternoon, including two by Wydett Williams Jr.
