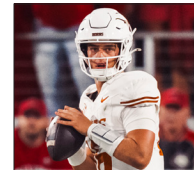

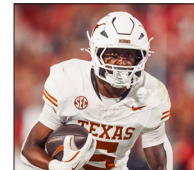

USE OF AUDIO/VIDEO COVERAGE

Any accredited media entity using "video or audio materials" (film, traditional video or audio, digital video or audio, photos, etc.) from University of Texas Athletics events (games, practices, post-practice/postgame interviews and press conferences) may use that material only for traditional television newscasts, web-based or print coverage (see note below regarding policy on game video on web), or other electronic transmission as approved by The University in writing, with a limitation of up to three (3) minutes in length from any single event. That three (3)-minute package may contain no more than two (2) minutes of game highlights. Its usage must be only as supporting edited video/audio for a reported video/audio story and not simply as a raw video post/rebroadcast/ streamed highlights or interview sessions. Accredited media entities may not offer any live video, audio or other coverage of the event (or tape delay rebroadcast coverage in its entirety) without the advance written permission of The University of Texas athletics department. Video is for news usage only and may not be sponsored or sold. This policy includes all games, matches, practices and events involving any of Texas' athletics programs. It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews.

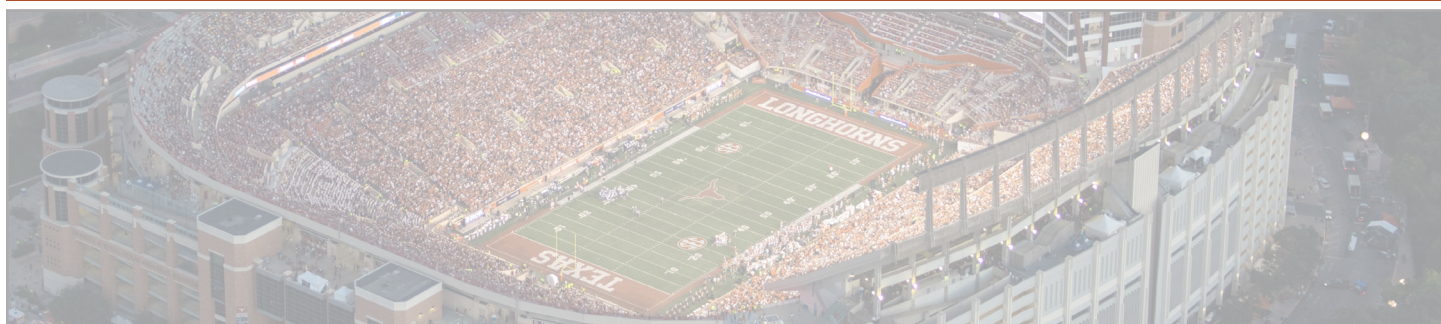
NOTE REGARDING USE OF GAME VIDEO: Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.

EXCEPTION: With advance written permission from the UT Athletics department, media entities will be permitted to rebroadcast the Steve Sarkisian weekly Monday press conferences in its entirety. Video from that 20-minute press conference can be used for either over the air rebroadcast or web postings. Live distribution of the weekly Monday press conference is not permitted. If posted on a website, it must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of the press conference.

THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Texas returns home to DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium for its final two regular season matchups at 2:30 p.m. CT Saturday, Nov. 22, against the Arkansas Razorbacks. The game will broadcast on ABC with Joe Tessitore (play-by-play), Jesse Palmer (analyst) and Katie George (reporter) on the call.
- The Longhorns have won seven-consecutive home games at DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium, dating back to the 2024 season. That streak ties for the fifth-longest streak by a P4 team.
- UT is coming off a 35-10 loss on the road to No. 5/5/5 Georgia on Nov. 15.
- Texas has won four of its last five SEC games this season.

- Texas currently boasts 968 all-time wins, the fifth-most all-time victories in FBS history. The Razorbacks have 749 all-time wins - the 25th-most in the FBS.
- Texas has won 19-straight home games against unranked opponents - the team's longest such streak since an 18-game stretch that spanned between the 1999 and 2003 seasons.
- The Longhorns concluded the 2024 season with a 13-3 overall record, including an SEC-best 7-1 mark during conference play, and their second-consecutive trip to the College Football Playoff Semifinal. Texas' 13-3 record matched the school record in wins. UT finished the season with its second-straight top-five ranking (No. 3 Coaches/No. 4 Associated Press).
- Texas is 32-8 over the last three seasons and is the only program to appear in each of the last two College Football Playoffs.
- Steve Sarkisian holds a 45-20 record at Texas and an 92-55 mark in 12 seasons as a head coach.

HORNS VS. HOGS

- For the 81st time in history, Texas and Arkansas will meet on the gridiron in a historic rivalry that dates back to 1894. Longtime former Southwest Conference foes, Texas and Arkansas will meet for the second time as Southeastern Conference members.
- Earlier this season, the SEC announced Texas and Arkansas will be annual opponents for the next four seasons.
- The Longhorns lead the all-time series, 57-23, including a 29-11 mark in Austin.
- Texas won last year's meeting, 20-10, in Fayetteville.
- The Horns have won 20 of the last 30 meetings, dating back to 1969.
- Texas and Arkansas will be playing each other in Austin for the first time since the 2008 season. Texas won that game, 52-10.
- Texas and Arkansas played each other for 60-straight years from 1932-1991 before the Hogs departed for the SEC following the 1991 season.
- The first-ever meeting between the Horns and the Hogs took place in 1894 in Austin and resulted in a 54-0 Texas win.
- Texas and Arkansas played one of the most storied games in the history of college football, dubbed "The Game of the Century" with President Richard Nixon at the game. Under head coach Darrell Royal, No. 1 Texas pulled out a 15-14 win over No. 2 Arkansas in Fayetteville to determine the 1969 National Championship.
- The Longhorns won the series' first 14 contests (1894-1932) before Arkansas claimed its first win (20-6) in Austin in 1932.
- Texas and Arkansas have played 34 games that have been decided by 10 points or fewer, with the Longhorns holding a 22-12 advantage in those games.

A TEXAS WIN WOULD ...

- Move Texas' 2025 overall record to 8-3 and its conference record to 5-2.
- Clinch Texas' 20th-consecutive win at home vs. an unranked opponent.
- Be Texas' 969th all-time victory.
- Secure Steve Sarkisian his 93rd victory as a head coach and 46th at Texas in his 148th career game as a head coach.
- Move Texas' series edge to 58-20.
- Secure back-to-back victories over the Razorbacks.

YEAR FIVE OF THE SARKISIAN ERA

- Texas Football Head Coach Steve Sarkisian is in his fifth season at the helm of the Longhorns and his 12th season as a head coach overall.
- Texas made its third-consecutive postseason appearance under Sarkisian in 2024, including its second-straight CFP semifinal appearance.
- Sarkisian was named to the preseason watch list for the Dodd Trophy on July 7.
- Sarkisian was tabbed a finalist for the George Munger Award on Dec. 24, 2024.
- In UT's inaugural season in the SEC in 2024, Sarkisian led Texas to the best regular season record in the conference (7-1) and an SEC Championship Game berth, and the Longhorns became the only program to earn a spot in the CFP semifinals in each of the last two seasons. Texas' 13-3 record in 2024 matched the school-record for wins and included a second-straight final top-five ranking (No. 3 Coaches Poll/No. 4 AP), marking the first consecutive top-five finishes for the Longhorns since 2008-09.
- Sarkisian and the Horns turned in a historic season in 2023 with a 12-2 record, a Big 12 Championship, No. 3 final ranking and College Football Playoff semifinal appearance. He has also compiled top-five recruiting classes over the past four years.
- The 2024 Longhorns were just the third team in program history to amass 13 or more victories in a single season.
- RB Quintrevion Wisner rushed for 1,064 yards on the ground in 2024, the 13th consecutive year a Sarkisian offense has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

TAKING THE LONG WAY HOME

- The Longhorns are back home after enduring a 63-day stretch where they played just one home game vs. Vanderbilt on Nov. 1. Texas played one home game in Austin over the span of 63 days by the time the Horns face Arkansas on Saturday, Nov. 22.
- The Longhorns' stretch of 42 days without a true home game this season (Sept. 20 - Nov. 1) is the longest such stretch for an FBS team since Texas A&M went 42 days without a home game in the 2022 season (Sept 17 - Oct 29).
- On Nov. 1, Texas returned home after an extraordinarily long stretch between games at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium. The extended road swing started after the Sam Houston game on Sept. 20, and including a bye week (Sep. 27), and covered 42 days before the Longhorns returned home to face Vanderbilt (Nov. 1). Following the road tussle at Florida on Oct. 4, Texas was

the home team for this year's Allstate Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma (Oct. 11), traveled to Lexington to face Kentucky (Oct. 18) and concluded the road swing at Mississippi State (Oct. 25). That lengthy home game draught matched the Longhorns' longest stretch away from home since 2013 when Texas went 42 days between home games against Kansas State (Sep. 21) to its next game at DKR-TMS vs. Kansas (Nov. 2).

ALL EYES ON TEXAS

• According to Nielsen, Texas is the fourth-most watched college football team in the nation. The Longhorns average 6.48 million viewers per game this season.

SARK'S STAMPEDE

- Under head coach Steve Sarkisian, the Longhorns are 33-9 in their last 42 games. Eight of their nine losses are against AP top-15 programs.
- In Sarkisian's first 22 games as head coach at Texas, UT went 11-11.
- Sarkisian is one of two coaches in program history with a 13-win season (Mack Brown) after Texas finished the 2024 season 13-3 overall.
- Since the start of the 2023 season, UT is 31-8 with seven of eight losses against AP top-15 ranked foes.
- Texas is 21-3 at home over the last three seasons with its only three losses to top-five ranked foes (No. 5/4 Georgia on Oct. 19, No. 1/1 Alabama in 2022 and No. 4/4 TCU in 2022).
- Texas has won 16 of its last 19 conference matchups.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Texas, Georgia and Indiana are the only teams in the nation with two wins over opponents ranked in the AP Top 10 at the time of the game.
- Texas, Alabama and Texas Tech are the only teams in the nation with two wins over opponents currently ranked in the AP Top 15.
- Texas is one of just six teams to have played at least four current AP Top 16 opponents. The Longhorns are 2-2 in those games; the other five teams are winless at 0-21.

HORNS STREAKS

- With the win over No. 9/11 Vanderbilt on Nov. 1, Texas improved to 18-1 in its last 19 games at DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium.
- The Horns have secured multiple victories over AP Top 10 opponents during the regular season for the first time since 2016.
- Texas is 17-1 at home since the start of the 2023 season with 15 wins coming by 14 or more points. That is the second-most such wins in the FBS over that span (Ohio State - 17).
- The Longhorns have not allowed 100 yards rushing in five-straight home games, tied for the longest active streak in the FBS. It's the longest run by the Longhorns since a six-game stretch between 2009-10.
- Texas has won 19-consecutive games at home against unranked opponents - the team's longest stretch since an 18-game stretch between the 1999 and 2003 seasons.
- Texas is 23-2 when it scores first since the beginning of the 2023 season.
- Over the last 25 seasons, Texas is 62-0 at home when leading by 14+ points at halftime.
- UT has registered an interception in 12 of the last 15 games.
- Texas has not allowed a score on their opponent's opening drive in their last 15 regular season home games

dating back to September 2023.

- The Longhorns have opened 4-0 at home for the third straight season — their first time doing so since the stretch from 2000 to 2002.
- Texas has forced a turnover in 21-straight home games, the longest active streak in the FBS (Memphis is second with 16-consecutive home games). During this stretch, the Longhorns have converted those takeaways (39 total) into 158 points. It's also the longest streak by Texas since recording 24-consecutive from 1999-2003.
- UT has held five of its eight opponents to under 300 yards of total offense this season: OSU 203, San Jose 273, UTEP 259, Sam Houston 113 and Oklahoma 258.
- Texas won 12-plus games in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008-09. The Horns had nine-consecutive 10-win seasons from 2001-09.
- 2024 marked the second-straight season in which UT played in a conference championship game.
- The Texas defense gave up just four passing touchdowns through 12 games during the regular season in 2024 – the fewest in program history since giving up four in 1972 (10 games). It also tied for the fewest by an FBS team during the regular season (tied with Ohio State).
- Texas held its opponent to under 350 yards in its first 13 games of the season, becoming the first FBS team to do so in 13-consecutive games in a single season since Alabama in 2011. The last team to do so in 14-straight games in a single season was another Alabama squad (2009).
- Texas led Texas A&M 17-0 at halftime on Nov. 30, 2024, and posted first-half shutouts in three of its last four conference matchups to close out the regular season.

TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- The time of possession battle could be a huge factor Saturday. Texas has won 19-straight games when possessing the ball more than its opponents.
- The Longhorns' 32-2 record since 2020 when winning the time of possession battle ranks second in the FBS behind Georgia's 50-2 record (min. 10 games).

RED RIVER ROMPING

- Texas recorded a 23-6 win vs. No. 6/6 Oklahoma in the Allstate Red River Rivalry on Oct. 11 at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas. The victory secured UT's first ranked win of the season.
- UT has won three of the last four matchups vs. OU. Texas has not given up a touchdown to the Sooners in three of the last four games as well.
- Texas now leads the all-time series, 65-51-5, against the Sooners.
- QB Arch Manning completed a then career-high 21 passes on 27 attempts for 166 yards and a touchdown. On third down, Manning finished 11-for-12 with 117 yards and a score, converting eight times through the air.
- RB Quintrevion Wisner tallied a season-best 94 rushing yards, highlighted by a season-long 37-yard run. Wisner also added five catches for 35 yards.
- WR DeAndre Moore Jr. hauled in three receptions for 50 yards and one touchdown - his first touchdown reception of the season.

- In Texas' home opener vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6, the 100,841 fans in attendance were the most in a home opener at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium since 102,315 spectators watched the Horns play Notre Dame in 2016.

NOT SO FAST MY FRIEND

- During Texas' season opener at No. 3/2 Ohio State on Aug. 30, it marked the 11th time in the last five seasons that Texas appeared on ESPN's College GameDay as the pregame show aired live from Ohio State University in Columbus on Aug. 30.
- Including eight visits to the Red River Rivalry and four neutral site appearances, Aug. 30 was the 28th time the GameDay set and its show was a prominent fixture at a Texas game.
- It was the fourth time overall and second-consecutive season a Texas vs. Ohio State matchup drew College GameDay after the show aired live from the CFP Semifinal at the 89th Goodyear Cotton Bowl at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, on Jan. 10, 2025.
- The show came to the University of Texas during the 2006 season when the Horns hosted the Buckeyes. College GameDay was in Columbus for the 2005 matchup between UT and Ohio State when the Longhorns prevailed 25-22.
- Last season, GameDay was at five games the Longhorns were playing in. The five College GameDay appearances were the most in a single season for the Horns. GameDay was in Ann Arbor for Texas' road win at No. 10/9 Michigan on Sept. 7 before the show returned to the Forty Acres for Texas' home contest with No. 5/4 Georgia on Oct. 19. Last week, GameDay traveled to College Station, Texas, for the Lone Star Showdown vs. Texas A&M on Nov. 30, the SEC Championship Game vs. Georgia on Dec. 12 and the CFP Semifinal at the 89th Goodyear Cotton Bowl vs. Ohio State on Jan. 10.
- 2024 was the third-straight year that GameDay broadcast at least twice in a season live from a game UT was playing in. The only other times that has occurred for the Horns was 2005, 2008 and 2009 when Texas made three GameDay appearances those years.

- Texas opened the 2025 season ranked No. 1 in both the AP Poll and Coaches Poll for the first time in history.
- Texas has 50 overall appearances at No. 1 in the AP poll, including spending three weeks ranked No. 1 during the 2024 season.
- The No. 1 preseason ranking was the first time the Horns have posted back-to-back preseason top-10 rankings since 2009-10.

- The Longhorns opened the 2025 season ranked No. 1 in both the AP Poll and Coaches Poll for the first time in history. Texas was ranked inside the AP Top-25 for the first six weeks of this season before dropping out on Oct. 5. Texas returned to the AP Poll at No. 21 on Oct. 12.
- Texas was unanimous No. 1 in both the AP Poll and AFCA Coaches Poll for two weeks (Oct. 5-Oct. 20, 2024) and held the top spot in at least one of the two major polls for five-straight weeks. That was the Horns longest streak at No. 1 since 1977 when they topped both polls for six-consecutive weeks.
- Texas was ranked among the Top 25 of the Coaches Poll for a school-best 208-straight weeks from 1998-2010.
- The Top 5 streak of 11 weeks in a row that snapped on Oct. 20, 2024, was the longest streak since the Horns were ranked in the Top 5 of one of the polls for 32 weeks in-a-row from 2007-10 (30-straight in the AP Top 5).

He is also the fourth UT quarterback to reach both marks in three games in a season since 1999, joining Major Applewhite (1999), Colt McCoy (2009), and Casey Thompson (2021). Overall, Manning completed 25-of-33 attempts for 328 yards and three touchdowns in guiding the Longhorns to their second top-10 win of the season and their fourth-straight victory overall. It was also the first time in 30 years Texas had eight different receivers with multiple catches and at least 15 yards receiving each. Manning opened the game with a 75-yard touchdown connection to Ryan Wingo on the first play of the game, his third 75-yard touchdown pass in the last two seasons, the third-most among FBS quarterbacks in that time. Manning later registered six-yard touchdown passes to both CJ Baxter and Emmett Mosley V as the Longhorns built a 34-10 lead through the first three quarters.
- Manning was named a Manning Award "Star of the Week" on Oct. 27 after his effort in Texas' 45-38 overtime road win at Mississippi State on Oct. 25. completed a career-high 29 passes on 46 attempts (63.0%) for a career-high 346 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing for a touchdown in Texas' 45-38 overtime win on the road at Mississippi State. Manning led the Longhorns' rally from twice being down by 17 points, including with 26 seconds left in the third quarter and 12:29 to go in the fourth quarter, tying for the seventh-largest comeback win in program history. In both instances, Manning and the Longhorns answered with touchdown drives to get back within 10 points. Manning connected with wide receiver Ryan Wingo for three passes of 45-plus yards, including a 60-yarder on the opening offensive play of the game, and later a 47-yarder and a 62-yarder.
- Manning was stellar in Texas' 26-3 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 11, completing a then-career-high 21 passes (21-for-27) and a score. He also ran four times for 36 yards (8.5 ypc).
- In Texas' SEC opener at Florida on Oct. 4, Manning completed 16-of-29 passes for 263 yards and two

touchdowns while throwing a pair of interceptions. Manning was also Texas' leading rusher, accounting for 300 of UT's 341 yards of total offense.

- Manning is one of 10 SEC players this century to run and pass for at least five TDs in the first four games of the season. The only ones of that group to have more than Manning's nine TD passes were Tim Tebow, Johnny Manziel, Matt Corral and Jalen Milroe (10 each).
- Manning had a strong performance vs. Sam Houston on Sept. 20 to close out non-conference play, completing 18-of-21 passes for a season high 309 passing yards and three touchdowns. Manning also added a pair of scores on his legs to account for five total touchdowns and 320 yards of total offense.
- With his performance vs. Sam Houston on Sept. 20, Manning is the third Texas QB since 2000 to have multiple games of 300+ pass yards and 80% completion rate, joining Colt McCoy (4) and David Ash (3). Manning is the fourth Texas QB this century with two passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns in a game, joining Sam Ehlinger, Colt McCoy and Vince Young.
- Manning is the first SEC QB to record 300+ passing yards, 3+ passing TDs and 2+ rushing TDs in a single game since Joe Milton III (Tennessee) on 11/25/2023.

- Against UTEP on Sept. 13, Manning tallied 165 total yards and three touchdowns, becoming the first signal caller to rush for a pair of scores in the first half of a game since Sam Ehlinger accomplished that feat vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 10, 2020.
- Manning is the third Texas QB this century (since 2000) to record multiple rushing touchdowns in back-to-back games, joining Sam Ehlinger and Colt McCoy. He is also the third QB since 2010 to record a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown in three-consecutive games (Sam Ehlinger and Quinn Ewers).
- In the home opener vs. San Jose State (Sept. 30), Manning completed 63 percent of his passes for 295 yards (19-of-30), while mounting five total touchdowns. Manning became the fifth Texas quarterback to throw at least four touchdown passes in the first half of a game in the last 30 years, joining Vince Young (Nov. 12, 2005), Sam Ehlinger (Sept. 12, 2020), Casey Thompson (Oct. 9, 2021) and Quinn Ewers (Dec. 2, 2023 & Nov. 9, 2024). Manning's career-long 83-yard strike to Parker Livingstone in the first quarter was the longest passing touchdown by a Texas player since Jerrod Heard hit John Burt for an 84-yard score on Nov. 7, 2015.
- Over the past 15 years, just three SEC players have had multiple games with 4+ pass TDs and 1+ rush TDs as an underclassmen: Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (3 in 2012-13), Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa (2 in 2018) and now Texas' Arch Manning (2 - vs. San Jose State in 2025, vs. UTSA in 2024).
- In his first career start on the road at No. 3/2 Ohio State in the 2025 season opener on Aug. 30, Manning finished 17-of-30 for 170 passing yards with one touchdown and an interception. Manning also added 38 yards on the ground, accounting for 208 yards of total offense for the Horns.
- The New Orleans native was on preseason watch lists for Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Walter Camp National Player of the Year Award and Maxwell Award. He earned a preseason Third-Team All-SEC selection in a vote by the media in July.
- As a redshirt freshman in 2024, Manning saw action in 10 games with the two starts, completing 61-of-91

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passes (68 percent) for 939 yards and nine touchdowns. He was named the SEC's Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 16, 2024, was placed on the Davey O'Brien's Great 8 list on Sept. 16, and named the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose National Player of the Week on Sept. 17. He added 25 carries for 108 yards and four touchdowns.

- Taking over for an injured Quinn Ewers vs. UTSA on Sept. 14, redshirt freshman QB Arch Manning led Texas to two wins in two starts on the Forty Acres.
- In the 35-13 victory against Mississippi State to open conference play on Sept. 28, Manning established new career highs in completions (26), 83.9 completion percentage and passing yards (325). Manning tossed two touchdowns and accounted for three total after recording a one-yard rushing touchdown.

- Manning was the first Texas freshman with 300+ pass yards, 2+ pass TD and no interceptions since Colt McCoy in the 2006 Alamo Bowl against Iowa (308 yards, 2 TD, 0 INT).

- Manning was the first Texas QB to have 300+ pass yards and no interceptions in the team's first conference game of a season since Major Applewhite in 1999 at Baylor (333).

- After recording a 67-yard touchdown run vs. UTSA on Sept. 14, 2024, Arch Manning is the fifth SEC freshman QB in the last 15 years to have a 65+ yard touchdown run, joining South Carolina's LaNorris Sellers (did so on Saturday) Florida's Anthony Richardson (2021) Auburn's Malik Willis (2017) and Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (2012).

- Arch Manning's 75-yard TD pass (tied for seventh-longest by a UT freshman) to Ryan Wingo and 67-yard TD run (longest ever by a UT freshman) against UTSA marked the first time in UT history that a player recorded a 65-yard-plus pass and run in the same game. Colt McCoy (2009) and Vince Young (2003 and 2005) are the only other players in UT history to post a passing and rushing play of play of 65 or more yards in the same season.

- McCoy had three 65-plus TD passes (68t vs. Kansas, 78t vs. ULM, 88t UCF) and a 65-yard TD run at Texas A&M in 2009. Young recorded a 75-yard TD pass vs. Texas Tech and posted an 80-yard TD run at Oklahoma State in 2005. He also recorded a 67-yard TD pass at Oklahoma State and 65-yard TD run vs. Nebraska in 2003.

- In the last 25 years, only one FBS or NFL QB has had a 75+ yard TD pass, a 65+ yard TD run & another 50+ yard TD pass all in the same game. That one QB was Arch Manning. He did it in a span of 15:10 of game time in a game he didn't even start (via OptaStats).

- Manning's 67-yard rushing touchdown was the longest by a UT quarterback since Vince Young was credited with an 80-yard scoring run in the third quarter against Oklahoma State on Oct. 29, 2005.

- The redshirt-freshman's 67-yard rushing touchdown was the longest scoring run by a Longhorn football student-athlete since Jaydon Blue reached the end zone on the ground from 69 yards out during the second quarter of Texas' 57-7 win over Texas Tech on Nov. 24, 2023. Blue has since run for a 77-yarder against Clemson.

- Manning set a single-game high in passing touchdowns with four after throwing one to DeAndre Moore, Jr., during the second quarter and then connecting with Isaiah Bond to open the third quarter.

- Manning's 12-yard touchdown pass to Cook II early in the fourth quarter marked the first time a UT quarterback has accounted for 5-or-more touchdowns in a game since Casey Thompson had six in the Longhorns' 70-35 win against Texas Tech on Sept. 25, 2021.

- Manning's five (four passing, one rushing) touchdowns on the night are the most touchdowns accounted for by a UT freshman quarterback since Colt McCoy had six (six passing) against Baylor on Oct. 14, 2006.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Texas' defense ranks third in team sacks (3.60), third in opponent yards per rush (2.5), sixth in rushing defense (83.2), seventh in opponent red zone chances per game (2.2), seventh in opponent rushing first downs per game (5.5), eighth in opponent red zone scores per game (1.8), 10th in 4th down conversion percentage (0.467), 11th in opponent points per play (0.261), 12th in opponent yards per play (4.5), 13th in tackles for loss (7.0) and 15th in scoring defense (18.3).

- Texas' defense has held eight of its last 11 opponents to under 100 rushing yards, dating back to the 2024 season.

- In 2024, the Longhorn defense ranked third in the FBS in scoring defense (15.3 ppg) and total defense with an SEC-best 283.4 yards allowed per game.

- The 50 yards Texas allowed in the first half vs. Sam Houston on Sept. 20 were the fewest allowed in the first half of a game since holding Oklahoma to 29 yards in the first half on Oct. 11, 2014. Against the Bearkats, the Horns held an opponent without a first down in the first quarter of a game for the first time since vs. Oklahoma in 2014.

- In 2024, UT also forced an SEC leading 31 turnovers (2nd FBS) including an FBS-best 22 interceptions, and nearly three sacks (2.88/15th FBS) per game.

- Texas, along with Ohio State, limited opponents to just four passing touchdowns during the 2024 regular season - the lowest in the FBS.

- Four defensive players garnered All-America honors in 2024 (DB Jahdae Barron, DT Alfred Collins, LB Anthony Hill Jr. and DB Michael Taaffe).

- Following the 2024 season, five Longhorn defenders were selected in the 2025 NFL Draft. Jahdae Barron was taken in the first round with the 20th overall pick by the Denver Broncos, while Alfred Collins was drafted in the second round by the San Francisco 49ers, Andrew Mukuba was selected in the second round by the Philadelphia Eagles, Vernon Broughton was drafted in the third round by the New Orleans Saints and Barryn Sorrell was picked in the fourth round by the Green Bay Broncos.

- Barron won the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back, along with being UT's first-ever defensive back to be a Nagurski Award finalist, and EDGE Colin Simmons claimed the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award and was tabbed a Freshman All-American.

- The Texas defense posted a season-high four forced fumbles against Georgia on Dec. 7 - two more than the previous single-season high (2) in which the Horns accomplished six different times during the season. The four forced fumbles were the most credited by a Texas team since forcing three against Oklahoma on Oct. 10, 2020.



DBs Jelani McDonald, Malik Muhammad, Anthony Hill Jr. and Graceson Littleton lead Texas in interceptions with two apiece through 10 games.

TALKIN' TURNOVERS

- Through 10 games in 2025, the Longhorns have gained 16 turnovers, which ranks fourth in the SEC and 32nd in the FBS.
- UT has registered 10 interceptions this season, which ranks fifth in the SEC and 32nd in the FBS.
- Texas led the SEC and ranked second in the FBS in turnovers gained with 31 in 2024.
- The Longhorns have now forced a turnover in 21-straight home games, the longest active streak in the FBS. EDGE Colin Simmons kept the streak alive after his strip-sack fumble vs. No. 9/11 Vanderbilt in the first quarter on Nov. 1.
- UT's three interceptions against Oklahoma on Oct. 11 were its most in the Red River Rivalry game since 2002.
- Texas had four takeaways in its home opener vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6, including three forced fumbles and an interception.
- The Horns' four first-half takeaways vs. the Spartans are tied for the most in any half of a game since accomplishing the feat against Kansas on Nov. 11, 2017.
- The Longhorns gained 31 turnovers (22 interceptions, 9 fumbles recovered) last season - the second-most in the FBS.
- Texas has forced a turnover in 33 of its last 34 games.
- UT forced a turnover in all 16 games last year and 24 games in a row overall before its streak was snapped at Ohio State on Aug. 30.
- In 16 games in 2024, Texas intercepted 22 passes - the most in the FBS. 13 different UT defenders registered an interception.

WEAPONS AT WIDEOUT

- In the wide receiver room, Texas returns junior DeAndre Moore Jr., sophomores Ryan Wingo and Ryan Niblett and redshirt freshmen Parker Livingstone and Aaron Butler.
- Via transfer portal, the Longhorns add sophomore Emmett Mosley V, who transferred to Texas from Stanford during spring 2025.
- The Longhorn wide receiver corps also added true freshmen Jaime French Jr., Kaliq Lockett, Michael Terry III and Daylan McCutcheon prior to the 2025 campaign.
- Wingo is Texas' leading returning receiver after hauling in 29 receptions for 472 yards and a pair of touchdowns in 2024. He also added five carries for 100 yards with a season-long 55 yard run vs. Michigan on Sept. 7, 2024.
- As a sophomore in 2025, Wingo leads Texas with 40 receptions for 655 yards (16.38 ypc) and six touchdowns. Wingo has posted one 100-yard receiving game this season after reeling in five catches for 184 yards at Mississippi State on Oct. 25.
- Moore is a third-year wide receiver who has played in 34 games with 14 starts. The Anaheim, Calif., product finished the 2024 season with 39 receptions for 456 yards and seven scores, averaging 11.7 yards per catch. As a sophomore, he totaled two 100-yard receiving games. In UT's SEC opener against Mississippi State on Sept. 28, 2024, he snared four receptions for 104 yards and a career-high two touchdowns. He put together his second 100-yard receiving effort after grabbing a career-high nine receptions for a career-high 114 yards and a score in the SEC Championship vs. Georgia on Dec. 7, 2024. He came close to another 100-yard performance in Texas' road victory at Vanderbilt (10/26/2024), gathering six catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns.
- As a junior in 2025, Moore ranks second on the team in receiving yards with 454 on 34 receptions (13.35 ypc) and a touchdown.
- During his freshman season in 2024, Livingstone saw action in four games to preserve his redshirt.
- Livingstone has emerged as a weapon on UT's offense this season. After seeing action in four games last season to preserve his redshirt, Livingstone has broken onto the scene during the 2025 season and has played in all 10 games for UT with six starts. Livingstone has totaled 23 receptions for 368 yards (16.7 ypc) and five touchdowns -

the second-most touchdown receptions on the team.

- In the overtime win at Mississippi State on Oct. 25, Livingstone snared four receptions for 22 yards and two scores.
- In Texas' home opener vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6, Livingstone hauled in four receptions for a career-high 128 yards and two touchdowns, notching his first career 100-yard receiving effort and multi-touchdown performance.
- Since 2000, four Texas freshmen have recorded at least 125 receiving yards and two receiving touchdowns in a game -- Roy Williams (2000), Malcolm Williams (2008), Xavier Worthy (twice in 2021) and Parker Livingstone.
- His 128 receiving yards vs. San Jose State rank 11th on the UT freshman single-game list.
- With both of his touchdown receptions coming in the first quarter vs. San Jose State, Livingstone became the third Longhorn to have multiple receiving touchdowns in the first quarter of a game in the last 30 years, joining Jaxon Shipley (Sept. 29, 2012) and Joshua Moore (Oct. 9, 2021). QB Arch Manning and Livingstone connected on an 83-yard touchdown, which marks the longest passing play since a 90-yard competition against Oklahoma State on Oct. 21, 2017 and the 13th-longest in program history. The 83-yard reception was the fourth-longest by a freshman in UT history and the longest since 2015 when John Burt had an 84-yarder against Kansas.
- Livingstone is the third Texas player in the last 30 years to have at least 100 receiving yards and two touchdown catches in the Longhorns' home opener, joining Limas Sweed (2006) and Roy Williams (2003).
- Mosley joins Texas after a breakout freshman season at Stanford in 2024. After missing the first half of the season due to an injury, Mosley has played in the last six games, grabbing 18 catches for 267 yards (16 ypc) and three touchdowns. Against No. 9/11 Vanderbilt, Mosley caught a team-high seven receptions for 69 yards and a score. Against Mississippi State on Oct. 25, Mosley reeled in four catches for 53 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winning TD grab in overtime.
- As a freshman at Stanford in 2024, Mosley ranked second on the squad and leading ACC freshmen with 48 receptions for 525 receiving yards (10.9), while leading the Cardinal with six touchdown receptions. Playing in nine games with eight starts, Mosley set Stanford records for most receptions and receiving yards by a true freshman while logging two 100-yard receiving games. His 525 receiving yards were the most by a Stanford true freshman since Richard Sherman in 2006 (581). The Chicago native garnered a pair of ACC honors, receiving ACC Receiver of the Week and ACC Rookie of the Week during Week 12 of the season. In his collegiate debut, Mosley caught seven passes for 48 yards (6.9 ypc) with a touchdown at No. 17 Clemson on Sept. 28. He posted his first career 100-yard receiving effort after setting season highs in receptions (13), receiving yards (168) and touchdowns (three) in Stanford's victory against No. 22 Louisville. Following the win vs. Louisville, he finished with six receptions for 63 yards (10.5 ypc) and a score against rival Cal. Mosley concluded his freshman season with his second 100-yard receiving game, hauling in seven catches for 101 yards (14.4 ypc) and a touchdown vs. San Jose State on Nov. 29.

THE RUNNING BACK ROOM

- Texas returns RBs Quintrevion Wisner and CJ Baxter for the 2025 season. In addition, redshirt freshman Christian Clark returns to the fold after missing the 2024 season due to a season-ending injury.
- UT has recorded 100 rushing yards in six games this season, including a season-high 264 yard performance vs. Sam Houston on Sept. 20.
- The Longhorns netted 100 yards on the ground vs. No. 9/11 Vanderbilt, led by Wisner's 75 yards on 18 carries (4.2 ypc) and a touchdown.
- In the victory over Oklahoma on Oct. 11, the Longhorns

combined for 136 yards on the ground (3.9 ypc).

- In the win over UTEP, four Texas players rushed for 30 yards in the same game for the first time since 11/24/2023 vs. Texas Tech: J.Blue (121), S.Red (72), Q.Wisner (60), C.Baxter (45).
- CJ Baxter ran for 65 yards on 13 attempts (4.9 ypc) vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6.
- In the Sept. 13 win over UTEP, true freshman James Simon led Texas with 67 rushing yards on 17 carries (3.9 ypc), followed by Jerrick Gibson's 64 yards on 18 attempts and Arch Manning's 51 rushing yards.
- In the 2025 season opener at Ohio State on Aug. 30, the Longhorns combined for 166 yards on the ground, averaging 4.5 yards per rush against a strong Ohio State defense. Wisner led UT with 80 yards on 16 attempts (5 ypc), followed by Baxter who had 10 rushes for 40 yards (4 ypc) and QB Arch Manning, who compiled 38 yards on 10 attempts for a 3.8 average.
- Prior to the Oct. 4 loss to Florida, Wisner had recorded at least 50 scrimmage yards in 13-straight games, which was the second-longest active streak in the FBS (Penn State's Nicholas Singleton -- 22). The last Texas player to have a longer such streak was Jamaal Charles between 2006 and 2007 (14).
- Wisner and Baxter were both placed on the Doak Walker Award preseason watch list on Aug. 5.
- Baxter earned a spot on the Doak Walker Award watch list for the second-consecutive season. A sophomore running back from Orlando, Fla., Baxter has played in 19 games with eight starts. He missed the entire 2024 season after sustaining a season-ending injury during fall camp. As a true freshman in 2023, Baxter earned a second-team All-America nod by The Athletic, Freshman All-American Honorable mention by College Football Network, and honorable mention All-Big 12 honors, in addition to being honorable mention Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. Baxter also received preseason second-team All-SEC accolades on offense in July. In his first season on the 40 Acres, Baxter ran the ball 138 times for 659 yards (4.8 ypc) and five touchdowns while also catching 24 passes for 156 yards. His 659 rushing yards are the 12th-most for a Longhorn freshman in program history. Making the start at running back in Texas' season-opening victory against Rice on Sept. 2, 2023, he became the first true freshman running back to start for the Longhorns since Ricky Williams in 1995. In a win versus Kansas State, he had 10 carries for 90 yards and one touchdown, including a 54-yard run. In the road victory at Iowa State, he established career highs in carries (20), rushing yards (117) and receptions (5), recording the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career. In the College Football Playoff semifinal against No. 2 Washington in the Sugar Bowl, he rushed nine times for 64 yards (7.1 ypc) and one touchdown, while hauling in two passes for 39 yards, including a career-long 31-yard reception.
- Wisner played an integral role in UT's offense in 2024. Wisner is a third-year player who has competed in 36 career games with 19 starts, garnering 2024 Third-Team All-SEC praise, 2025 preseason First-Team All-SEC recognition while claiming a spot on the preseason watch list for the 2025 Maxwell Award.
- Wisner had a monster outing vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 11, where he produced 94 yards on the ground on 22 carries (4.3 ypc), including a season-long 37-yard run. Wisner also added five receptions for 35 yards and accounted for 129 yards of total offense.
- As a sophomore in 2024, Wisner played in 15 games with 12 starts and rushed for a team-leading 1,064 yards and five touchdowns on 226 carries (4.7 ypc). The Glenn Heights, Texas, product had the third-most receptions on the team, hauling in 44 catches for 411 yards (7.1 ypc) and a score. The 44 receptions were the second-most in a single-season by a UT running back, while the 411 receiving yards were the third-most. Altogether, he accumulated 1,375 all-purpose yards and accounted for

six touchdowns during his sophomore season. He pieced together four 100-yard rushing performances with all four coming against SEC or CFP opponents. Additionally, he's the only returning 1,000-yard rusher in the SEC going into 2025 season. His 91.67 all-purpose yards per game ranked seventh in the SEC last season.

- Christian Clark is a redshirt freshman who was named to the Comeback Player of the Year award on Aug. 18. A two-time all-region honoree at Mountain Pointe High School, he was rated as the No. 3 overall running back recruit in Arizona per ESPN. During his three-year varsity career, he compiled 1,890 rushing yards and 24 rushing touchdowns. As a senior in 2023, he rushed for 801 yards and six touchdowns while adding 144 yards on 12 receptions. He was an integral part of an offense that averaged 150.5 rushing yards per game. He registered three 100-yard rushing performances, including a 190-yard game versus Corona del Sol. As a junior, he was named the Arizona Varsity 6A Central Regional Player of the Year in 2022 after finishing the season with 1,105 all-purpose yards and 16 total touchdowns.
- True freshmen Rickey Stewart Jr. and James Simon along with senior Colin Page and sophomore Carson Berger round out Texas' loaded running back room.

DYNAMIC DUO ON OFFENSE

- WR Parker Livingstone and TE Jack Endries are the third Texas WR/TE duo in the last 30 years to have multiple receiving touchdowns in the same game after doing so vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6. They join Xavier Worthy and Ja'Tavion Sanders (Oct. 1, 2022) and Brandon Healy and Artie Ellis (September 9, 2000).

COACHING CONTINUITY

- Texas is the only Power Four program with the same head coach, offensive, special teams and defensive coordinators over the last five seasons.
- In the decade prior to Sarkisian's arrival on the Forty Acres, UT had three head coaches, seven offensive coordinators and six offensive line coaches.
- 2025 marks the fifth year with the same offensive play caller (Sarkisian)/OC (Kyle Flood) and OL coach in Sarkisian's tenure.
- It also marks the first time since Greg Davis and Mac McWhorter's 10-yard run together (2001-10) that Texas had had the same play caller/OC and OL coach for more than two years in a row.

KING OF THE HILL

- Junior All-American LB **Anthony Hill Jr.** is back for the 2025 season after solidifying himself as one of the nation's top defensive players in 2024. Hill was dominant in 2024, leading Texas in tackles (113), tackles for loss (16.5), and forced fumbles (4), while sitting third on the squad in sacks (8). He composed three double-digit tackling performances and was credited with 0.5-or-more tackles for loss in 11 different games.

- Hill was recently named a semifinalist for the Butkus Award on Nov. 4 and the Bednarik Award on Nov. 11.
- The third-year player has played in 40 career games with 32 starts. Through 10 games, Hill leads UT in tackles (69), interceptions (2) and forced fumbles (3) to go along with 7.0 TFL, 4.0 sacks, five quarterback hurries, one pass break-up and one fumble recovery. In the win over No. 9/11 Vanderbilt on Nov. 1, Hill registered four tackles (three solo), 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.
- At No. 5 Georgia on Nov. 15, Hill posted six stops (three solo), a 0.5 tackle for loss and an interception.
- Hill was named the Chuck Bednarik Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Mississippi State. Hill led the Longhorns with career highs of 2.5 sacks and four pressures, and his second-highest total of 3.5 tackles for loss, to go along with a forced fumble and a double-digit tackle total of 10.
- At Kentucky on Oct. 18, Hill led UT in tackles with 12 (eight solo) along with an interception and a quarterback hurry.
- Hill accumulated seven tackles (four solo) vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 11.
- Hill was Texas' leading tackler vs. Florida, notching a career-high 14 tackles with a 21-yard fumble return.
- Against Sam Houston on Sept. 20, Hill notched two solo stops, including one tackle for a loss of two yards.
- Hill racked up three total stops (two solo) vs. UTEP on Sept. 13.
- Against San Jose State on Sept. 6, Hill registered six tackles (five solo) and a career-high two forced fumbles.
- In the 2025 season opener vs. Ohio State, Hill logged six tackles (one solo) against the Buckeyes.
- Hill was placed on preseason watch lists for the Lombardi Award, Chuck Bednarik Award, Walter Camp National Player of the Year Award, Butkus Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Lott IMPACT Trophy.
- Hill was tabbed to the All-America Second Team by the AFCA, Associated Press, The Sporting News and Walter Camp.
- He carded eight tackles (one solo) at the CFP Quarterfinal at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl vs. Arizona State on Jan. 1.
- Hill led Texas in tackles with nine (seven solo) in the CFP First Round win vs. Clemson on Dec. 21, 2024.
- In the SEC Championship game vs. Georgia on Dec. 7, 2024, Hill registered six solo stops, including a tackle for loss, and had a fumble recovery he returned for 25 yards.
- Against Texas A&M on Nov. 30, 2024, Hill collected five total stops (three solo) vs. the Aggies.
- Hill earned SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the win vs. Kentucky on Nov. 23, 2024. Hill set career single-game highs of two sacks and four tackles for loss as part of 11 total tackles in addition to forcing a fumble as he led Texas to a 31-14 win over Kentucky.
- Hill posted a sack on Kentucky's second offensive play, pushing them to a 2nd-and-17, which led to a punt three plays later.
- Hill's forced fumble came early in the second quarter as he also made a tackle for loss to force a 4th-and-2 from the Texas 4-yard line.
- His second sack came in the third quarter with the Wildcats having a 3rd-and-goal from the Longhorns' 3-yard line while trailing 24-7. The sack was for a 12-yard loss, forcing a field goal attempt that Kentucky then missed.
- Hill led a UT defense that limited the Wildcats to 232 total yards, including just 21 rushing yards. The 21 yards are the third fewest allowed in a game in the Sarkisian era at UT and mark the fifth time in the last two years Texas has allowed fewer than 35.
- He compiled eight tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss of three yards and a forced fumble in the 49-17 win vs. Florida on Nov. 9. Hill had back-to-back games with a forced fumble.

GAME NOTES

- In the 27-24 win at No. 25/25 Vanderbilt on Oct. 26, 2024, Hill posted eight tackles (five solo), two quarterback hurries and a pass break-up.
- Against No. 5/4 Georgia on Oct. 19, 2024, Hill had eight tackles (four solo), 1.5 tackles for a loss of four yards, including a sack for a loss of two yards.
- Hill carded his second career double-digit tackling effort in the win over OU on Oct. 12, 2024, after tying his career high in total tackles with 11 (seven solo) and notching a career high 3.5 tackles for loss, tying his career high in sacks with 2.0 and having one forced fumble.
- Hill finished with three tackles (one solo stop), one sack for a loss of five yards and an interception he returned for 32 yards vs. ULM on Sept. 21, 2024.
- He had a career day in the win over UTSA on Sept. 14, registering a career-high 11 stops (five solo), including a tackle for a loss of two yards, and a quarterback hurry. It also doubled as his first career double-digit tackle performance.
- He opened the 2024 season with five-tackle effort, including logging one tackle for a loss of three yards, vs. Colorado State.
- Hill Jr. had six tackles (two solo) and a 0.5 tackle for loss against No. 10/9 Michigan on Sept. 7.
- Hill Jr. is the team's leading returning tackler after logging 67, including five sacks and eight tackles for loss, in 2023.
- Hill Jr. was named to preseason watch lists for the Dick Butkus Award and Bronko Nagurski Trophy to go along with preseason second-team All-SEC praise by the media and a preseason third-team All-SEC nod by the league's coaches.
- Hill Jr. earned a spot on the FWAA's Freshman All-America team to go along with co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors. The Denton, Texas, product was also named honorable mention All-Big 12, a Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award semifinalist and a Freshman All-America selection by ESPN, The Athletic and the College Football Network.
- Hill Jr. played in all 14 games with six starts and recorded 66 tackles (40 solo), 8.0 tackles for loss, five sacks, one forced fumble, four quarterback hurries and two pass breakups as a true freshman.
- He etched his name into the Longhorn record book after producing five sacks, which ties for the fourth-most by a Longhorn freshman and the third-most by a Texas true freshman.
- The eight tackles for loss by Hill Jr. equaled the eighth-most for a UT freshman and sixth-most for a true freshman.
- His 67 total tackles were the ninth-most by a Power 5 conference freshman and seventh-most by a Power 5 conference true freshman in 2023. He led all Big 12 true freshmen in total tackles and only three other SEC true freshmen compiled more tackles (Alabama's Caleb Downs with 107, South Carolina's Jalon Kilgore with 76 and Texas A&M's Taurean York with 74).
- He had a breakout performance in the win at No. 3 Alabama, logging six tackles (four solo stops) with two tackles for loss and two sacks, including one in the Crimson Tide's final offensive play of the game. Following the win at Alabama, Hill Jr. earned Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Week and 247Sports True Freshman of the Week honors.

PICKIN' 'EM OFF, ONE-BY-ONE

- Last season, Texas led the nation in interceptions after totaling 22 through 16 games.
- Through 10 games in 2025, Texas has picked off 10 passes which ranks fifth in the SEC and 32nd in the FBS.
- Texas posted its second multi-interception game in the win over Oklahoma on Oct. 11, grabbing three interceptions, led by Malik Muhammad's two picks.
- The Texas defense recorded its first multi-interception game vs. UTEP after Jelani McDonald and Graceson Littleton snagged one apiece.
- Six Longhorns have snared an interception, led by Malik Muhammad, Graceson Littleton, Anthony Hill Jr. and Jelani McDonald who have two apiece.
- Senior DB Jaylon Guilbeau recorded Texas' first interception of the 2025 season after picking off San Jose State in the first quarter on Sept. 6. It was his first career interception.
- Texas had seven games with multiple interceptions in 2024, its most games in a single season since 2009 (seven). Since the start of the 2023 season, Texas tallied 41 total interceptions.
- For the seventh time in 2024, the Texas Longhorn defense was credited with multiple interceptions in the same game after picking off Kentucky twice on Nov. 23: Colorado State (2), at Michigan (2), ULM (2), Georgia (3), at Vanderbilt (2), Florida (2) and Kentucky (2). It total, UT recorded at least one interception in 12 different games last year.
- 13 different Longhorn defenders recorded an interception last year, led by DB Jahdae Barron and Andrew Mukuba, who registered five apiece.
- Texas' three interceptions vs. Georgia on Oct. 19, 2024, were its most against a team ranked in the top five of the AP Poll since having four against No. 2 Oklahoma on Oct. 12, 2002.

DKR-TEXAS MEMORIAL STADIUM ATTENDANCE RECORD

- With an announced attendance of 105,215 vs. No. 5/4 Georgia on Oct. 19, 2024, Texas set a new attendance record for a football game inside Darrell K. Royal - Texas Memorial Stadium. The previous record was 105,213 set when the Alabama Crimson Tide visited the Forty Acres on Saturday, Sept. 10, 2022.
- It was the second time during the 2024 season Texas had been involved in an attendance-breaking football game after the Longhorns played in front of a program-record 111,170 fans against then-No. 10/9 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich., on Sept. 7, 2024.

HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN

- Following its second-consecutive appearance in the College Football Playoff Semifinals, excitement for Texas Football is at an all-time high. Season tickets and individual game tickets for all home games at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium are officially sold out through Texas Athletics.
- This marks the fourth-consecutive season that Texas Football has set an all-time season ticket record. While tickets for the general public are sold out, returning and incoming UT students can still purchase the Big Ticket

- In addition, Texas' allotment for the annual Allstate Red River Rivalry game against Oklahoma was sold out. The game will be played at historic Cotton Bowl Stadium on October 11 at 2:30 p.m.

DRAWING A CROWD

- Texas played in front of capacity crowds in each of the last 38 games, dating back to Week 2 of the 2023 season when the Longhorns hit the road to face the Alabama Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.
- In the 2025 season opener vs. Ohio State, the Longhorns played in front of a crowd of 107,000.
- The Longhorns played in front of a crowd of 109,028 at Kyle Field against Texas A&M on Nov. 30, 2024, - the third-largest crowd in Kyle Field history. The game was also the 14th-highest attended game across college football last season.

TREY MOORE NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

- Senior LB Trey Moore was tabbed one of 16 finalists for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy, the NFF announced on Sept. 24. Celebrating its 36th year, the Campbell Trophy is a scholar-athlete award that annually recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- Moore is the 14th Longhorn selected as a finalist for the Campbell Trophy. Texas has had two previous winners of the Campbell Trophy in center Dallas Griffin (2007) and defensive end Sam Acho (2010).
- "Trey checks all the boxes of a tremendous student and athlete and is an absolute joy to coach," Texas head coach Steve Sarkisian said. "He has a huge impact on the field, is an outstanding leader on and off the field and with the example he sets in his commitment to his schoolwork. One of the big mantras in our program is who you are some of the time is who you are all the time and that extends to every facet of our players' lives. Trey is consistently driven to be great in everything he does, and he absolutely epitomizes that mantra every day. We're so fortunate to have him in our program, and he is an outstanding representative of The University of Texas."
- Moore will graduate from Texas in December 2025 with a Physical Culture and Sports degree and holds a 3.64 cumulative GPA. The San Antonio native was named the team's Spring 2025 Academic MVP in addition to earning 2024 SEC Academic Honor Roll and 2024 CSC Academic All-District Team recognition.
- Excelling in the community, Moore has volunteered with the San Antonio Food Bank and Hungry Souls Austin by helping package food for the hungry. He has spent time visiting and providing encouragement to patients at the Dell Children's Hospital in Austin. Another community service project he is involved with is through the Down Syndrome Association of Austin, helping children with down syndrome through activities. He has also volunteered with the Hope Food Pantry by packaging and providing food to those in the Austin area with food insecurity.
- Moore is a second-year linebacker who transferred to Texas from UTSA in spring 2024. He has played in 55 career games between Texas and UTSA, including 25 career games at Texas. Through 10 games in 2025, Moore has tallied 28 tackles (19 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, three pass break-ups, four quarterback hurries and a fumble recovery.
- As a junior at Texas in 2024, Moore recorded 36 tackles (23 solo), 10.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and six pressures. He was one of four Longhorns with 10.5-or-more (10.5) tackles for loss and one of three Texas players with both 10.5-or-more tackles for loss and 6.5-or-more sacks. Additionally, he was the only Longhorn defender with multiple fumble recoveries and multiple forced fumbles last season.

HORNS LAND 10 ON PRESEASON COACHES' ALL-SEC TEAM

- First-team honorees Quintrevion Wisner (RB), DJ Campbell (OL), Anthony Hill Jr. (LB), Colin Simmons (EDGE) and Michael Taaffe (DB) headlined 10 Texas Football standouts who earned 2025 Preseason Coaches' All-SEC distinction.
- DB Malik Muhammad and punter Jack Bouwmeester were selected to the second team, while OL Trevor Goosby, LB Trey Moore and KOS Will Stone landed on the third team.

LONGHORNS ON THE SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

- Six Longhorns were named to the Senior Bowl watch list on Aug. 21. The Senior Bowl, which takes place in Mobile, Ala., is where elite draft prospects from around the country are selected to showcase their talent and connect with coaches and decision-makers from all 32 NFL teams.
- Longhorns on the Senior Bowl watch list: OL DJ Campbell, EDGE Ethan Burke, LB Trey Moore, LB Anthony Hill Jr., DB Jaylon Guilbeau and DB Michael Taaffe.

SHUT 'EM OUT

- Courtesy of its defensive effort, Texas recorded its first shutout of the 2025 season with a 55-0 routing of Sam Houston on Sept. 20. Texas has shut out an opponent four times overall and once in four of Sarkisian's five seasons as head coach.
- Texas' 55-0 win over Sam Houston on Sept. 20 was its largest margin of victory since defeating Rice 58-0 on Sept. 18, 2021.
- With Texas' 52-0 win over Colorado State in the 2024 season opener, it marked the first time the Longhorns have shutout an opponent to begin the season since Sept. 4, 2004, when UT beat North Texas, 65-0.
- The 52-point margin of victory marked the highest by the Longhorns since beating Rice, 58-0, on Sept. 18, 2021.
- On Oct. 8, 2022, the Longhorns knocked off Oklahoma with a 49-0 victory in Dallas.

TEXAS RANKED NO. 12 IN ESPN'S FPI

- Texas is currently ranked No. 12 in this week's FPI (18.2).

REIGNING NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Second-year EDGE Colin Simmons became the program's first winner of the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award when he took home the honor following the 2024 season.
- The sophomore has played in 26 career games with 10 starts and was named to the preseason watch lists for the Lombardi Award, Chuck Bednarik Award, Walter Camp National Player of the Year Award and Bronko Nagurski Trophy.
- This season, Simmons leads Texas with nine sacks, 11 tackles for loss and eight pressures to go along with 33 total tackles (17 solo), two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one pass break-up. His 0.90 sacks per game rank second in the SEC and ninth in the FBS. In his last five games, Simmons has accounted for 7.5 sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss.
- Simmons collected his third SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honor over a four-week span on Nov. 3 after his outing vs. No. 9/11 Vanderbilt on Nov. 1. Simmons produced a strip-sack and also made the recovery on the first Vanderbilt possession of the game to go along with five tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two pressures in Texas' 34-31 win over the No. 9 Commodores. The recovery set up the UT offense at the Vanderbilt 29-yard line, which it converted for field goal and a 10-0 lead on the way to the win. On the Commodore's next possession, Simmons pressured the quarterback into an incomplete pass on third-and-11 at midfield to force a punt. The Texas offense then drove 83 yards on that possession for a 17-0 lead. On the following Vanderbilt possession, Simmons registered a tackle for no gain and a half tackle for a four-yard loss, helping limit the Commodores to

a field goal on the possession. Overall, Simmons' efforts helped the Texas defense post six sacks, twice as many as quarterback Diego Pavia has ever suffered in a game in his career.

- Against Mississippi State on Oct. 25, Simmons finished with six tackles and a quarterback hurry.
- Simmons was named the SEC Co-Defensive Lineman of the Week for the second-consecutive week on Oct. 20. He had four solo tackles, including 3.0 sacks for a loss of 10 yards and a forced fumble.
- He collected 2.5 sacks as part of five tackles to help the Texas defense keep rival No. 6 Oklahoma out the end zone in a 23-6 victory in the Allstate Red River Rivalry in Dallas. Simmons' first sack came early in the second quarter with Oklahoma having reached the UT 24-yard line. It was for five yards and set the tone of the series that eventually ended in a stop by the Longhorns to hold the Sooners to just a field goal and a 6-0 lead. His next sack came in with 6:23 left in the fourth quarter and Texas leading 20-6. Oklahoma was at the UT 35-yard line with a 3rd-and-20 and it forced a fourth down that Oklahoma went for but failed to convert to give the ball back to Texas. His final half sack came on the Sooners' final drive for a loss of 12 yards resulting in a 3rd-and-22. Oklahoma would be limited to only 258 total yards in the game, including just 88 in the second half after entering the game averaging 415.2 yards per and 33.8 points per game.
- The sophomore had a monster game vs. Florida on Oct. 4, registering four tackles, one tackle for a loss of three yards, one pass break-up and two quarterback hurries.
- Simmons made one sack for a loss of two yards vs. Sam Houston on Sept. 20.
- Against San Jose State on Sept. 6, Simmons posted five tackles (two solo), two quarterback hurries and a 0.5 tackle for three yards.
- Simmons opened the 2025 campaign at Ohio State on Aug. 30, earning his first career start. He finished with two tackles (one solo) and a quarterback hurry vs. the Buckeyes.
- The Dallas native had a breakout year in his first season on the Forty Acres, emerging as a standout on an elite Texas defense. Simmons appeared in all 16 games last season, leading the team with 9.0 sacks for a loss of 64 yards and ranking second on the squad in tackles for loss (14.0-73), quarterback hurries (nine) and forced fumbles (three).
- Simmons compiled 48 total tackles (31 solo), an interception and two pass break-ups as a true freshman in 2024. Simmons led all FBS freshmen in total sacks, while his nine sacks are the third-most by a freshman in program single-season history. During the postseason, Simmons carded 15 quarterback pressures, the third-most among all FBS defenders.
- With Simmons' help in 2024, the UT defense ranked No. 1 in the FBS in passes intercepted with 22. Texas also ranked second nationally in turnovers gained (30) and team passing efficiency defense (104.56), third in total defense (283.4 ypg) and red zone defense (0.692), fourth in scoring defense (15.3 ppg), seventh in passing yards allowed (173.8 ypg), ninth in third-down conversion percentage defense (0.314), 13th in rushing defense (109.6 ypg), 15th in team sacks (2.88) and 22nd in team tackles for loss (7.0). UT shut out opponents in the first half in three of the last four games to cap the regular season - all conference opponents. The Horns finished the regular season giving up just four passing touchdowns - which tied with Ohio State for the fewest in the FBS.

FROM WALK-ON TO ALL-AMERICAN

- Senior DB Michael Taaffe joined the Longhorns as a walk-on and earned a scholarship on Dec. 17, 2022.
- Taaffe, an Austin native, grew up a fifth-generation Longhorn and dreamed of playing for Texas one day. Taaffe is a fifth-year defensive back who has played in 51 games with 34 starts.
- Taaffe was recently announced a semifinalist for the 2025 Jim Thorpe Award and Burlsworth Trophy.
- Taaffe, who has missed the two games due to thumb injury, has registered 58 tackles (31 solo), 1.0 sack and an interception.
- In 2024, he garnered Second-Team All-America honors from the Associated Press.
- A preseason First-Team All-SEC honoree, Taaffe has already been placed on preseason watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy. He was also selected to Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list, which recognizes college football players from across the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) who exemplify community service, academic excellence and athletic achievement. Widely regarded as college football's premier award for community service, the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy celebrates student-athletes who use their platforms to serve others and create positive change.
- Taaffe has been exceptional in his work in the community, most notably establishing Taaffe's Tackles for Fentanyl Awareness that will raise funds for Texas Against Fentanyl, an organization that raises awareness and provides resources and advocacy for prevention and education about fentanyl. In addition, he has partnered with Crime Stoppers of Houston's Million for Million Campaign that raises awareness about the dangers of fentanyl. Taaffe has also recorded and promoted a PSA for SoberRides.org from the Texas Department of Transportation, along with participating in numerous other service activities and youth speaking events.
- In the 2025 season opener vs. Ohio State, Taaffe, along with LB Liona Lefau, led Texas with nine tackles (two

solo).

- Taaffe finished with seven tackles and an interception vs. Florida on Oct. 4.
- Taaffe was Texas' leading tackler vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 11, totaling nine stops, including a sack for a loss of 10 yards.
- Taaffe finished with 10 tackles (five solo) in the overtime win at Kentucky on Oct. 18.
- In his return back to action after missing two games due to injury, Taaffe notched seven tackles (three solo).
- He returns to the UT defense after garnering second-team All-America recognition from the Associated Press in 2024. An Austin, Texas native and former walk-on, Taaffe started all 16 games last season, ranking second on the team in total tackles (78), interceptions (2) and pass break-ups (10).
- He was the only Longhorn to record an interception and a forced fumble in the same game last season after doing so in Texas' win at No. 25/25 Vanderbilt on Oct. 26, earning the Burlsworth's Trophy National Player of the Week and the SEC's Co-Defensive Player of the Week. Taaffe forced two turnovers to go along with six tackles and a pass break-up against the Commodores. In the CFP Quarterfinal at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl vs. Arizona State, Taaffe logged a career-high 10 tackles (six solo) and two pass break-ups to help send Texas to its second-consecutive CFP semifinal.

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

- With the departures of Alfred Collins, Vernon Broughton, Barryn Sorrell and Bill Norton to the NFL, the Longhorns turn to other standout defensive lineman to lead the defense in 2025.
- Texas added six defensive linemen via transfer portal in the spring, bringing in Cole Brevard, Hero Kanu, Lavon Johnson, Travis Shaw, Brad Spence and Maraad Watson.
- Senior EDGE **Ethan Burke**, a fourth-year standout from Austin, has played in 50 career games with 18 starts. In 2025, Burke has started in eight of 10 games and has recorded 25 tackles (12 solo), 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, one quarterback hurry, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal attempt. His 6.5 tackles for loss rank third on the team.
- Against No. 9/11 Vanderbilt on Nov. 1, Burke had a career-high three tackles for a loss of 23 yards, including two sacks for a loss of 20 yards.
- Burke earned his first career SEC weekly honor after earning SEC Co-Defensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 27 after his big outing vs. Mississippi State on Oct. 25. He tied his career high with 2.0 tackles for loss as part of seven total tackles, registered his second career blocked field goal and second career forced fumble and created a walk-off sack-fumble for a loss of 31 yards on the final play of the game.
- Burke was credited with two solo tackles, including a tackle for a loss of one yard, at Kentucky on Oct. 18.
- The senior posted a solo tackle vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 11.
- Burke had one stop vs. Florida on Oct. 4.
- Against UTEP, Burke had five tackles (one solo), including a 0.5 tackle for a loss of a yard.
- Against San Jose State on Sept. 6, Burke was credited with two solo tackles and a quarterback hurry.
- Burke opened the 2025 season at Ohio State on Aug. 30 with four total tackles. During the 2024 season, Burke carded 27 total tackles, nine tackles for loss, two sacks, an interception and a blocked kick. In the win over UTSA, Burke was credited for three tackles (one solo), including a tackle for a loss of two yards, and an interception that he returned 30 yards for a touchdown in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter. An honorable mention All-Big 12 honoree in 2023, Burke recorded 41 tackles (21 solo), nine tackles for loss, a team-leading 5.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one rumble recovery. He had a career day at No. 3 Alabama with four tackles (all solo), two tackles for loss and one sack. Burke then made a career-high six tackles (three solo) with half a tackle for loss in the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma. In the CFP semifinal vs. No. 2 Washington, he equaled his career high with six tackles (four solo), including half a tackle for loss.
- **Maraad Watson**, a first-year transfer from Syracuse, has started in seven games this season and has totaled 19 tackles (three solo), 1.5 sacks, and two quarterback hurries. Watson tallied a career-high 1.5 sacks vs. San Jose State on Sept. 6.

Watson has played in 22 career games with 16 starts. As a true freshman in 2024, Watson was tabbed a 247Sports Freshman All-American after collecting 31 stops, 1.5 tackles for loss, one sack, a pass break-up and a quarterback hurry.

- **Colin Simmons**, the reigning Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year, has played in 26 career games with 10 starts.
- **Hero Kanu**, the first-year transfer from Ohio State, has played in all 10 games this season with nine starts. Kanu has logged 28 tackles (nine solo), 4.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, four pressures, one forced fumble and a pass break-up.
- **Cole Brevard**, a first-year player who transferred from Purdue, has played in 46 career games with 24 starts. Brevard has played in 10 games this season while accumulating 14 tackles (six solo), 1.0 tackle for loss, one pass break-up and two quarterback hurries. Last season, Brevard was named Honorable Mention All-Big Ten by the media after notching 19 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- **Travis Shaw** is a first-year player who transferred to Texas from North Carolina and brings in a wealth of experience. He has played in 47 career games. Shaw has played in all 10 games in 2025 with 10 tackles (three solo) and a tackle for loss.

- The Longhorns held seven teams to less than 100 rushing yards across 16 games in 2024 and hasn't skipped a beat heading into 2025 - Texas has held seven of 10 opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in 2025 and ranks sixth in the FBS and second in the SEC in rushing defense.
- Texas has not allowed 100 yards on the ground in six-straight home games, tied for the longest active streak in the FBS with Texas Tech. It's tied for the longest run by the Longhorns since a six-game stretch between 2009-10.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- Texas has made scoring non-offensive touchdowns a habit, registering at least one in each of the last nine seasons and in 16 of the last 17 seasons overall.
- WR Ryan Niblett's 75-yard punt return touchdown against Oklahoma on Oct. 11 extended the streak to nine-consecutive seasons.
- EDGE Ethan Burke kept the streak alive after recording UT's first non-offensive touchdown of the 2024 season in the victory against UTSA. Burke had a pick-six he returned for 30 yards in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter vs. the Road Runners, increasing the Longhorns' streak to eight-straight seasons with a non-offensive touchdown and tallying at least one in 15 of the last 16 seasons overall.
- The Horns scored five non-offensive touchdowns in 2023, the third time in the last 15 seasons that Texas has tallied at least five in a year and the most since 2017.
- UT picked up two in the win over Texas Tech, earning the first on a 95-yard kickoff return by Keilan Robinson to open the second half of play, then adding a second near the end of the third quarter when Jett Bush hauled in an interception after it bounced off the foot of a Red Raider and taking it 43 yards for the score.
- Xavier Worthy returned a BYU punt 74 yards for a touchdown for the first score of the game in Texas' victory over the Cougars.
- **Malik Muhammad** opened the scoring for Texas in the Red River Rivalry after recovered a Kitan Crawford blocked punt in the first quarter against Oklahoma.

• Jerrin Thompson clinched the Longhorns' week three victory over Wyoming with a 27-yard interception return.

- The Horns wasted no time in 2022 when Keilan Robinson scored on a D'Shawn Jamison blocked punt to close out the first drive of the season opener by ULM.
- Jamison secured a defensive score with a third-quarter, 69-yard interception return against ULM, giving UT multiple non-offensive touchdowns in a season for the fourth time in six years.
- UT added a third for the 2022 campaign when Jahdae Barron intercepted a pass against UTSA at the Roadrunner 44-yard line and took it to the house for the first interception return of his career. He followed that with a scoop-and-score fumble recovery against TCU.
- Josh Thompson tallied a 27-yard interception return against Texas Tech in 2021 that marked the fifth-straight season in which the Longhorns had a non-offensive touchdown.
- D'Shawn Jamison's 100-yard kickoff return against Oklahoma State in 2020 was the second of his career and fueled the Longhorns comeback from an 11-point deficit at the sixth-ranked Cowboys.
- UT finished 2017 with eight non-offensive touchdowns, tied for the most in the country. It was their most since registering 11 in 2009.

TEXAS IN THE SPOTLIGHT

- The 23-6 Red River Rivalry win over Oklahoma on Oct.11 recorded 8.73 million viewers - the most of any Red River Rivalry matchup. It surpassed the previous record of 8.71 viewers in 2009.
- The Texas vs. Ohio State BIG NOON SATURDAY matchup on Aug. 30 was the most watched Week 1 game in history (any network) with 16.6 million viewers.
- The Texas-Georgia game on Oct. 19, 2024, averaged 12.9 million viewers and peaked at 14.1 million viewers. It was the most watched regular season game since 2016 and the second-largest regular season audience in 10 years.
- The Texas-Michigan BIG NOON SATURDAY matchup on FOX scored 9.35 million viewers.
- The Texas-Alabama broadcast on Sept. 9, 2023, was the most-viewed regular-season game for ESPN since 2015.
- The broadcast averaged 8.8 million viewers on ESPN and ESPN2, peaking at over 10.7 million viewers.
- UT-UA had the best Saturday viewership for an ESPN game since 2014.
- "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee Show" on ESPN2 had 799,000 viewers – the most-watched McAfee Alternate Telecast and most-viewed College Football Alternate Telecast since the 2018 CFP National Championship.
- Texas-Oklahoma had 8.1 million viewers on ABC - the second-highest mark ever for the Red River Rivalry (2009).
- Viewership peaked at 11.1 million viewers, while "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee Show" on ESPN2 had 559,000

viewers.

RYAN ON THE RUN

- Texas WR Ryan Niblett has served as UT's primary punt and kickoff returner this season.
- For the season, Niblett leads the FBS in punt return average (24.7) and ranks second in punt return TDs with two. He also ranks third in the FBS and leads the SEC in combined kick return yards with 576.
- Niblett had a clutch, 79-yard punt return touchdown with 1:47 remaining in regulation against Mississippi State on Oct. 25, tying the game up at 38-38 and forcing overtime.
- Against Kentucky on Oct. 18, Niblett recorded a 43-yard and a 45-yard punt return in the win. Niblett has five returns of at least 40 yards in the last five games.
- It was Texas-OU history for Niblett as he became just the third Longhorn ever to return a punt for a touchdown in 121 all-time Red River Rivalry games. Niblett recorded a 75-yard punt return touchdown vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 11. It was the first punt return touchdown for a Longhorn against OU since an 85-yard return by Daje Johnson on Oct. 12, 2013.

SPECIAL TEAMS SPOTLIGHT

- Texas has one letterwinner returning on special teams in longsnapper **Lance St. Louis**.
- Texas added punter **Jack Bouwmeester** and kicker **Mason Shipley** via transfer portal in the spring.
- A Utah transfer, Bouwmeester is a first-year punter for the Longhorns. The Bendigo, Australia, native played in all 39 games for Utah from 2022-24 and was a two-time all-conference selection (2023 AP Pac-12 First Team and 2024 Big 12 Second Team). He has been tabbed to the Ray Guy Award preseason watch list in back-to-back years and was semifinalist for the award in 2023.
- Through 10 games, Bouwmeester is averaging 44.58 yards per punt on 45 punts for 2,006 yards. He has booted 11 of those punts for 50+ yards and has pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line 17 times.
- Bouwmeester ranks fourth in the SEC and 30th in the FBS in punting average (44.6).
- Against Mississippi State on Oct. 25, Bouwmeester boomed eight punts for 358 yards (44.8 avg) and pinned the Bulldogs inside the 20-yard line twice.
- Against Kentucky on Oct. 18, Bouwmeester punted eight times for 336 yards, averaging 42 yards per punt. He pinned the Wildcats inside their 20-yard line six times and booted three punts for 50+ yards.
- Against Sam Houston (Sept. 20), Bouwmeester had two punts for 106 yards (53 ypp), tying his season-long with a 58-yard punt.
- In the win vs. UTEP (Sept. 13), Bouwmeester averaged 47.8 yards per punt on four punts with a long of 58 yards, pinning the Miners inside the 20-yard line once. Bouwmeester's 58-yard punt was the longest by a Longhorns punter since Ryan Sanborn had a 64-yard punt vs. BYU on 10/28/2023.
- Against San Jose State on Sept. 6, Bouwmeester punted six times for 262 yards (43.7 avg) with a long of 50 yards. He pinned SJSU inside the 20-yard line once.
- Bouwmeester opened the 2025 season at Ohio State on Aug. 30 with a strong performance. He boomed four punts for 185 yards (46.2 avg), including two punts for 50+ yards, and pinned the Buckeyes inside the 20-yard line three times.
- In 2024, he punted in all 12 games for the Utes and served as the primary holder on field goal and PAT attempts. He boomed 60 punts, leading the Big 12 in the regular season (14th among Power Four teams) with an average of 44.7 yards per punt with 13 of his punts going for 50+ yards. He booted three punts for 60+ yards,

including a season-long 62-yarder vs. UCF. He pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line nine times, including five times against BYU. As a sophomore in 2023, he punted 55 times for 2,503 yards with an average of 45.5 yards per punt, placing opponents inside the 20-yard line 20 times and smacking a career-high 19 punts for 50+ yards. He ranks sixth in Utah program history with a career average distance of 43.6 yards per punt, and his career average ranked fourth among active Big 12 punters at the end of the 2024 regular season.

- Through 10 games in 2025, Shipley is 15-for-19 on field goal attempts.
- Shipley brings veteran experience to Texas' special teams and has played in 48 career games between Texas State and Texas. The Liberty Hill, Texas product has connected on 46-of-54 career field goals (85.2 percent), which is the 16th-highest career field goal percentage amongst active FBS players.
- Shipley nailed a 33-yard field goal at No. 5 Georgia on Nov. 15.
- Against No. 9/11 Vanderbilt on Nov. 1, Shipley went 2-for-3 on field goal attempts, connecting from 39 and 37 yards out. His lone miss was from 51 yards out.
- Against Kentucky on Oct. 11, Shipley connected on a 45-yard field goal in OT to seal the victory for the Horns. It was Texas' first-ever walk-off field goal in overtime and the ninth all-time walk-off field goal.
- Earning his first SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honor on Oct. 20 following the Kentucky game, Shipley connected on all three of his field goal attempts, all of which came in the second half of Texas' 16-13 road win at Kentucky and included a season long 53-yarder with two minutes left in the third quarter, a go-ahead 39-yarder with 57 seconds left in regulation, and the game-winning 45-yarder in overtime. Shipley also kicked a PAT to account of 10 of the team's 16 points, in addition to handling primary kickoff duties for the first time this season. Shipley kicked off four times for an average of 63.2 yards with a touchback. Shipley's first field goal that came from 53 yards out provided an immediate answer to Kentucky's first points of the game and provided the Longhorns a 10-3 lead. The second field goal came with 57 seconds left and broke a 10-10 tie to regain the lead for Texas. Although Kentucky would tie it again to force overtime, the Longhorns' defense stopped the Wildcats at the goal line on the opening possession, providing Texas the chance to win with a score. Shipley delivered that from 45 yards out even after a penalty had pushed the team back.
- Landing on the 2024 Lou Groza Award watch list, Shipley went 15-of-19 (78.9 percent) on field goals with a long of 60 as a redshirt junior. He appeared in all 13 games in 2024 and hit a 60-yard field goal vs. Sam Houston, setting a program and Sun Belt Conference record. He was tabbed a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2023 after making 15-of-15 field goals, becoming one of two kickers in the country with a 100 percent field goal mark. He established a TSU record with his 15 made field goals and scored the second-most points in program history (103). He converted on all four field goal attempts from 40-49 yards out, as well. He has also had significant kickoff duty experience after kicking off 72 times for 3,916 yards and 18 touchbacks in two seasons.

- Sarkisian's squad set a UT record for NFL Draft Picks (in a seven-round draft) in 2024 with 11 (second-most of any program) and eclipsed that mark with 12 (third-most of any program) in 2025, including a school-record-tying three first-round selections.
- Texas currently has 48 former players on either active NFL rosters or practice squads (active, PUP, IR, practice squad).
- The 12 picks in 2025 are tied for seventh-most of any program in the history of the seven-round NFL Draft, while 11 in 2024 is tied for 10th.

HEAD COACH

One of the nation's premier coaches who has steadfastly returned Texas Football back to prominence, Steve Sarkisian is in his 25th year of coaching and 12th as a head coach. In his fifth season at Texas, his Longhorn rebuild has been patient, deliberate and highly successful. Sarkisian's process and efforts include a steady growth of on-field results through player development and recruiting, combined with a strong team culture, both of which have positioned the program for continued long-term success. The Longhorns finished 5-7 in 2021 and improved to 8-5 with an Alamo Bowl bid in 2022 before turning in a historic season in 2023 with a 12-2 record, Big 12 Championship, No. 3 final ranking and College Football Playoff semifinal appearance. In year four there has been more history. In year one in the SEC, Sarkisian led Texas to the best regular season record in the conference (7-1) and a berth in the SEC Championship Game, and the Longhorns became the only program to earn a spot in the CFP in each of the last two seasons. Texas' 13-3 record in 2024 matched the school-record for wins and included a second-straight final top-five ranking (No. 3 Coaches Poll/No. 4 AP), marking the first consecutive top-5 finishes for the Longhorns since 2008-09. Sarkisian has also produced top-five recruiting classes the past four years, while having 11 players drafted by the NFL in 2024 — the most ever for UT in a seven-round draft and second-most of any program that year. Sark's squad had a school record 11 players invited to the NFL Combine in 2024 and shattered that mark with 14 in 2024. He enters the 2025 season with a 38-17 record in four seasons at Texas and 84-52 mark in 11 seasons as a head coach.

A former All-American quarterback at BYU whose coaching career includes six years as an offensive coordinator at both the NFL and collegiate levels, Sarkisian was the 2020 Broyles Award winner (best assistant coach in college football) as offensive coordinator at Alabama. The former head coach at USC and Washington, he was named the 31st Head Football Coach at The University of Texas on January 2, 2021.

In 2024, Texas posted school-record-tying 13 wins and earned a spot in the College Football Playoff semifinals for a second-straight year. It was just the third time in school history the Longhorns won 13 games and Sarkisian was again named a Bear Bryant, George Munger Coach of the Year finalist. Texas' 25 wins in 2023 and 2024 were the most for the Longhorns since matching that total in 2008-09 and Sarkisian led his squad to a No. 1 ranking in one of the major polls for four-straight weeks, marking the programs first No. 1 ranking at any point in a season since 2008. Texas ranked third in the FBS in scoring defense (15.3 ppg) and total defense with an SEC-best 283.4 yards allowed per game. The Longhorn defense forced an SEC leading 31 turnovers (2nd FBS) including an FBS-best 22 interceptions, and nearly three sacks (2.88/15th FBS) per game. Offensively, the balanced Longhorn attack averaged 278.8 passing yards (14th FBS), 158.8 rushing yards and 33 points (29th FBS) per game. Sarkisian's explosive offense produced 21 plays of 40 or more yards (10 of 50+) and saw running backs Jaydon Blue and Quintrevion Wisner each have a rush and reception

of 40-plus yards. Wisner rushed for 1,064 yards, extending Sarkisian's streak to 13-straight seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher during his tenure as a head coach or offensive coordinator. Five players earned All-America honors (OT Kelvin Banks Jr., DB Jahdae Barron, DT Alfred Collins, LB Anthony Hill Jr., DB Michael Taaffe). Banks became the Longhorns' second-straight Outland Trophy winner and the first Texas player ever to sweep the Lombardi Award and Outland. Barron won the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back (and was UT's first-ever defensive back to be a Nagurski Award finalist), EDGE Colin Simmons claimed the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award and was tabbed a Freshman All-American, while center Jake Majors was a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete/Campbell Award finalist. Seven Longhorns earned All-SEC honors with QB Quinn Ewers, TE Gunnar Helm, RB Quintrevion Wisner and DB Andrew Mukuba joining Banks, Barron, and Hill. Banks earned the SEC's Jacob Blocking Trophy, which is given annual to the league's most outstanding blocker. Four different UT offensive linemen earned SEC Lineman of the Week honors. The Longhorns had school record 14 players invited to the NFL Combine in February 2025.

The 2023 season had Texas Football attain heights not seen on the Forty Acres in over a decade. Sarkisian was named a finalist for the Bear Bryant, George Munger and Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year awards after leading the Longhorns to their first Big 12 Championship since 2009, winning 12 games for the first time since that season and reaching the College Football Playoff for the first time in program history. At that time, the 12 wins marked just the fourth time in school history that the Longhorns had 12 or more victories in a season. He was also tabbed the Big 12 Coach of the Year by The Associated Press. Texas earned a No. 3 final ranking in The Associated Press Poll, its highest finish in 15 years since earning the No. 2 spot in 2009. The Longhorns were one of only five Power-5 programs that ranked among the top 15 in scoring offense (35.8 ppg) and scoring defense (18.9 ppg), finishing 15th nationally in both. Sarkisian's versatile and balanced squad ranked ninth nationally in total offense (477.5 ypg), led the Big 12 in total defense (336.7 ypg/34th FBS) and was bolstered by one of the nation's top special team's units. Led by Outland Trophy winner and unanimous first-team All-American defensive tackle T'Vondre Sweat, Texas ranked third nationally in rushing defense (82.4 ypg). The Longhorns' ground game, which was led by Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award finalist Jonathon Brooks' 1,139 yards in 11 games, and three total backs with 100-yard rushing games, ranked 24th in the FBS (188.4 ypg). Texas averaged 289.1 yards per game passing (17th/FBS). Seven Longhorns earned first-team All-Big 12 honors with Sweat voted the league's defensive player of the year, defensive tackle Byron Murphy II selected defensive lineman of the year, wide receiver Adonai Mitchell chosen offensive newcomer of the year, and linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. tabbed defensive freshman of the year. The Longhorns had 11 players invited to the NFL Combine in February 2024, which at the time was the most ever in program history.

In 2022, Sarkisian guided Texas to an 8-5 record with all five defeats coming by seven points or

fewer, and it is just the second time in the last nine years the Longhorns reached eight wins in the regular season. Meanwhile, this past season's trip to the Valero Alamo Bowl marks the sixth bowl game Sarkisian has led his teams to in nine completed seasons as a head coach. The 2022 Longhorns featured a balanced attack that averaged 34.5 points per game (25th FBS) and allowed just 21.6 points per game (28th FBS). Running back Bijan Robinson won the Doak Walker Award and earned first-team All-America honors after leading the nation in tandem yards during the regular season with 1,894 (1,580 rushing, 314 receiving) and ranking second in total touchdowns (20), while averaging a Big 12-best 131.7 rushing yards and 157.83 all-purpose yards per game. Robinson was also a first-team All-Big 12 selection and was joined in that honor by tight end Ja'Tavion Sanders and linebackers Jaylan Ford and DeMarvion Overshown. A three-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honoree in 2022, Ford was second in the Big 12 in tackles (119; 9.2 tpg). His four interceptions were tied for the UT linebacker record and were the most among FBS linebackers this year. He was also the only Power 5 player with four interceptions and three forced fumbles, and the only FBS player with four interceptions, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Additionally, wide receiver Xavier Worthy, true freshman offensive lineman Kelvin Banks Jr. and defensive lineman Keondre Coburn earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades, as a total of 20 Longhorns received all-conference recognition. After having no players selected in the 2022 NFL Draft, five of Sarkisian's Longhorns were selected after his second season with the program.

Year one had its ups and downs as the Longhorns dealt with inconsistency, injuries and adversity in a 5-7 campaign. Texas opened and closed the 2021 season with big victories as the Sarkisian era began with a 38-18 victory over No. 23 Louisiana and ended with a 22-17 win over Kansas State. In between, five of the Horns' seven losses came down to the end with Texas falling by eight points or fewer in each of those. The Longhorns' offense averaged nearly 200 yards rushing and 425 total yards while ranking 18th nationally in scoring at 35.2 points per game on the season. Worthy had a record-setting season on his way to Freshman All-America and Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year honors. Despite missing the final two games with an injury, Robinson compiled 1,127 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns to go with 26 receptions for 295 yards and four more touchdowns. Kicker Cameron Dicker and offensive lineman Derek Kerstetter joined Worthy and Robinson as four Longhorns

who earned first-team All-Big 12 honors. All totaled, 14 Longhorns earned All-Big 12 recognition. Prior to arriving on the Forty Acres, Sarkisian served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Alabama where he was the architect of 24 straight games in which the Crimson Tide's offense scored 35 or more points, the longest streak in major college football history. Despite coming up just short of that in a 31-14 win over Notre Dame in the College Football Playoff semifinals, the victory propelled Alabama to the 2020 National Championship Game where they defeated No. 3 Ohio State, 52-24.

Sarkisian not only boasts play-calling experience at the highest levels of football, but seven years as an FBS head coach ahead of his time in Austin. He guided the Southern California program in 2014-15, and the Washington Huskies from 2009-13. He posted a head coaching record of 46-35 over those seven seasons while leading his teams to five bowl appearances.

Prior to his start in coaching as quarterbacks coach at El Camino College in 2000, Sarkisian starred at the quarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. He spent time with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99) following his collegiate career at BYU.

While with the Cougars from 1995-96, he completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating was third on the all-time NCAA list when he finished playing. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, the fourth-best mark in NCAA history at the time), leading the Cougars to the WAC championship and a win in the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996 and earned second-team All-America honors. A participant in the East-West Shrine Bowl in 1997, he was inducted into the East-West Shrine Bowl Hall of Fame in 2024.

Sarkisian earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after getting his associate's degree in general studies from El Camino College in 1994.

He is married to the former Loreal Smith, who competed and coached in track and field. Sarkisian has two daughters, Ashley and Taylor, and a son, Brady. He and Loreal had a son, Amayas, in April 2025.
