THIS IS SEC FOOTBALL

- Sixteen times in the last 20 seasons, a team from the SEC has advanced to the national championship game. The SEC has won 13 of those contests, with two of the losses coming in the game's final seconds. The winner of the SEC Championship Game has advanced to the National Championship Game all but four times since 2006.
- With Florida in January 2009, five different teams from the SEC (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, LSU, Georgia) have played for and won the national championship in the last 16 seasons. All five have multiple appearances and at least one victory since in the national championship game since 2007.
- The SEC won four consecutive CFP National Championships, by three different programs (LSU, Alabama, Georgia), from 2019-2022.
- Not counting games versus each other, the SEC is 17-10 all-time in College Football Playoff games, playing in eight of the 12 CFP Championship Games (winning six of those eight). The SEC is 10-4 in CFP Semifinals, including a streak of 10 consecutive semifinal wins from 2015-2022.
- Since 2006, the SEC has posted a 38-23 (.623) record in BCS/CFP games - more wins, appearances, and winning percentage than any other A4 conference.
- The Southeastern Conference led the nation yet again in 2025 with 451 former players on opening weekend 53-man active rosters, including injured reserve.
- A total of 31 former players from current Southeastern Conference institutions are on the active rosters of the New England Patriots and the Seattle Seahawks, the two National Football League teams who squared off in Super Bowl LX on February 8.
- The SEC is 126-88 (.589) in bowl games since 2006, over 30 wins more than the next closest conference.
- The SEC has now won 77 games in the last 10 postseasons and has sent no less than eight teams to post-season bowls in each of the last 19 seasons.
- In the 12 seasons of the College Football Playoff era, only 10 programs nationally have been ranked No. 1 in the weekly CFP Top-25 Poll (which begins in late October each year) – five of those 10 programs (Alabama, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, Tennessee) are from the SEC. Prior to 2023, no team outside the SEC had been ranked No. 1 in the weekly CFP Poll since 2019, while four schools from the SEC were ranked No. 1 during that time.
- With Georgia and Alabama both earning victories in the CFP Semifinals in both 2021 and 2017, the national championship game has featured two SEC teams twice in the last nine years and three times since the 2011 season.
- The SEC Championship has been the most watched conference championship nationally for 16 of the past 18 seasons, including 12 in a row from 2008-2019.
- The 2025 SEC Championship game between Georgia and Alabama drew an average of 16.9 million viewers, making it the third-most watched SEC title game ever and a top-10 most-watched game of the 2025 season. This figure represented a 2% increase from the previous year's championship. The 2024 SEC Championship Game averaged 16.6 million viewers across ABC and ESPN, the fourth-largest audience on record for the game.
- The SEC finished the 2025 season as the most-watched conference in college football based on minutes watched for a fourth-straight year. The SEC was also #1 in average audience for the 15th consecutive year. The SEC on ABC accounted for more than two-thirds of the 50 most-watched games in the 2025 regular season. The SEC averaged 5.2 million viewers per game (62 games) and accounted for 36% of time spent watching college football on Nielsen-rated networks across all networks.
- In 2025 SEC student-athletes won both the Campbell and Wuerffel Trophies for the first time since 2005.

A pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition, the Southeastern Conference is a leader on the national landscape for intercollegiate athletics in the 21st century. Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has achieved stature and stability by designating governing/voting power to the presidents of the member institutions. These university leaders determine the policies of the conference and through the years this involvement has been the principal source of strength in the evolution of the SEC. Throughout its 82-year history, the SEC has provided leadership on the vital issues facing intercollegiate competition. Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi, Mississippi State, Tennessee and Vanderbilt have been in the SEC since its formation in 1933. The league has expanded three times, adding Arkansas and South Carolina in 1991, then Missouri and Texas A&M in 2012, then Oklahoma and Texas in 2024.

SEC HIGHLIGHTS IN 2025-26

- A team from the SEC won the national championship in 13 of the 22 sports the league sponsors, which is an all-time high.
- The SEC had more former players on MLB Opening Day rosters than any other schools.
- The SEC has seven NCAA Women's Final Four appearances in the last four seasons, more than any other conference.
- A total of 20 basketball teams from the SEC (10 men's teams and 10 women's teams) earned NCAA Tournament bids. The SEC had the most combined teams in the Sweet 16.
- The SEC led all conferences with five teams in the College Football Playoff. Since the CFP expanded to 12 teams starting with the 2024 season, the SEC has had more teams (8) in the CFP than any other conference.
- Five SEC gymnastics teams advanced to the finals of the NCAA Gymnastics Championships.
- There was an SEC vs. SEC national championship match in volleyball for the first time (Texas A&M vs. Kentucky). The NCAA Women's Tennis Championship featured an All-SEC matchup in the final (Texas A&M vs. Auburn), as did the NCEA Equestrian Championship (South Carolina vs. Texas A&M)
- Nine SEC soccer teams received NCAA Tournament bids, tied for the most in the nation.
- The SEC led all conferences with 10 teams in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament.
- Two SEC teams advanced to the NCAA Final Four in women's basketball.
- The SEC swept the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field Championships.
- Texas won the SEC's second consecutive national championship in softball.
- Oklahoma won the NCAA baseball championship, giving the SEC its seventh straight national title won by six different programs.
- The SEC finished the 2025 season as the most-watched conference in college football based on minutes watched for a fourth-straight year. The SEC was also No. 1 in average audience for the 15th consecutive year.

TOP DRAFT PICKS

The SEC provided high draft choices in professional sports drafts in football, basketball and baseball.

- NBA 2026: The SEC had 11 players selected in the 2026 NBA Draft. Those 11 players represented six different schools.
- MLB 2026: The SEC led all conferences with 104 players selected in the 2026 MLB Draft. Each SEC school had at least two players selected, and 29 Major League clubs drafted at least one SEC player.
- WNBA 2026: A record 15 SEC players were selected in the 2026 WNBA Draft, including nine of the top-30.
- NFL 2026: The SEC led the nation's conferences in NFL Draft picks for the 20th consecutive year in 2026 with 87 selections.

SEC CONTRIBUTION TO PROFESSIONAL SPORTS

The SEC continues to be a training ground for professional sports

- NFL - A total of 451 players from SEC schools, which led all conferences, were listed on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend of the 2025 season.
- NBA - 103 players from SEC schools were on 2025 NBA opening day rosters, the most of any conference
- WNBA – A total of 36 former SEC players were on WNBA opening day rosters in 2026. Thirteen WNBA teams had at last one former SEC player on its roster.
- MLB - A nation-leading 86 players formerly from the SEC's 16 schools were named to Major League Baseball opening day rosters.

LEADERS IN ATTENDANCE

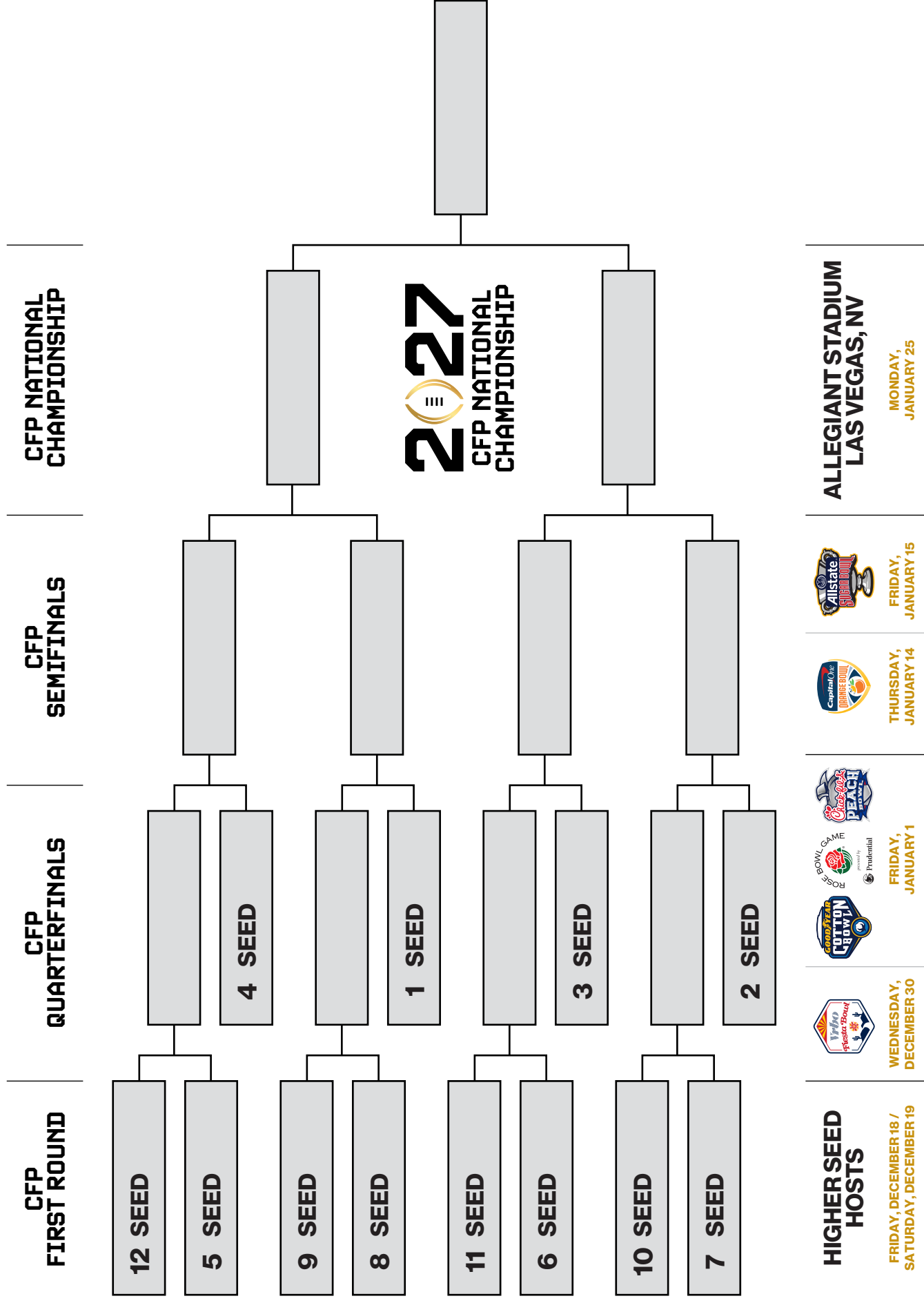
- The SEC for the 28th consecutive season in 2025 led the nation in attendance once again with an average of 80,362 per game, followed by the Big Ten at 64,662. The SEC's average of over 80,000 is an all-time high in college football.
- In men's basketball, the top three attendance leaders in 2025 were from the SEC. Kentucky led the nation with a total attendance of 366,007 (20,334 average), Arkansas ranked second with 341,935 fans (18,996 average) and Tennessee was third with 340,436 fans (20,026 average).
- Total attendance at baseball games on SEC campuses exceeded 3.45 million this season. Mississippi State led the nation in total attendance (420,696) and average attendance (a record 11,686).
