Playing To Our Standard

*Georgia's 2026 Senior Class owns a record of 38-6 with back-to-back SEC titles. The 2025 Senior Class went 51-6 with a national title (2022) and three SEC crowns in their career. They were the third straight class to register 50 wins, joining the 2023 group (50-4) and the record-setting 2024 class (53-5).

*Georgia owns the nation's longest active bowl streak at 29 seasons but has dropped its last two CFP quarterfinal matchups at the Sugar Bowl. Prior to these losses to Notre Dame and Ole Miss, Georgia had won seven straight CFP/bowl games. Overall, the Bulldogs have made 64 appearances in a bowl/CFP game with a 38-23-3 mark. The appearances and wins rank second in FBS.

*Georgia has a current winning streak over every SEC team except Ole Miss that equals 77 games. The streaks range from one game up to 16 straight.

Simply The Best (Since 2021)

*Georgia owns the best record in the FBS since 2021 at 67-7. This run includes back-to-back CFP national titles (2021-22) and three SEC titles (2022, 2024-25). The next best is Ohio State at 60-11.

*Georgia and Ohio State are the only FBS schools to win 11+ games every season since 2021.

Storylines On The 2026 Bulldogs

***Look Who Is Back:** Georgia (2-0, 0-0 SEC) remains at No. 2 in the AP and Coaches poll this week. The Bulldogs feature seven returning starters on offense including fifth-year All-SEC quarterback **Gunner Stockton** and All-SEC junior tailbacks **Nate Frazier** and **Chauncey Bowens**. Eight starters return on defense including All-American juniors **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** and veteran starters in seniors **Raylen Wilson**, **Jordan Hall** and **Gabe Harris Jr.**, plus junior **Quintavius Johnson**. Also, the special teams unit is headlined by senior All-SEC placekicker **Peyton Woodring**. In 2025, the Bulldogs were one of the youngest teams in the country with 54 percent of the roster consisting of players in their first or second season in Athens. In 2026, the Bulldogs brought in only nine scholarship transfers, the fewest in the SEC.

***The SEC Gauntlet Begins:** The two-time defending SEC champion Bulldogs open league play at Arkansas this Saturday, Sept. 19. Arkansas (1-1) lost 43-10 at No. 17 Utah last week. Georgia's SEC home opener will be Sept. 26 with the first-ever visit by No. 24 Oklahoma (1-1).

***The Bulldogs are 10-0 in their first SEC road game each year of the Kirby Smart era**, winning at Tennessee (twice), South Carolina (twice), Vanderbilt (twice), Arkansas, Auburn, Kentucky and Missouri. In the 2025 SEC opener in Knoxville, No. 6 Georgia outlasted No. 15 Tennessee 44-41 in overtime.

***Georgia has three other true SEC roadtrips**, traveling to Alabama, Ole Miss and South Carolina while the Florida game will be held in Atlanta on Oct. 31 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. Georgia is the home team against the Gators. This marks the first time since 1995 that the Bulldogs and Gators square off somewhere other than Jacksonville, Fla. Everbank Stadium is being renovated for the next two seasons. The 2027 Georgia-Florida game will be in Tampa, Fla.

***Georgia is 40-3 in its last 43 SEC regular season games with losses to Alabama (@ UA in '24, in Athens in '25) and one at Ole Miss in '24.**

***Series History With Arkansas:** Georgia leads 12-4 and has won the last three meetings.

Last Time Out: #2 Georgia defeated #8 UA 37-0 in '21 in Athens

Last Visit To Fayetteville: #4 Georgia posted a 37-10 win in '20.

Did You Know? The first four clashes in the UGA-UA series came in bowl games starting with the 1969 Sugar Bowl, a 16-2 Arkansas win in New Orleans. The Razorbacks won the 1976 Cotton Bowl 31-10 over the Bulldogs in Dallas. Georgia claimed the 1987 Liberty Bowl Trophy in Memphis after a 20-17 win and then beat the Razorbacks 24-15 in the 1991 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. Also, the teams met for the 2002 SEC Championship in Atlanta. The Bulldogs posted a 30-3 victory over the Razorbacks for their first league title since 1982.

***Easing Into 2026:** Georgia opened the season with a 63-3 home victory over Tennessee State, tallying 660 yards of total offense on 60 plays while the FCS opponent managed just 99 yards on 58 plays. It marked the most points in an opener by Georgia since 1941 (81-0 over Mercer in Macon). In week two in Athens against Western Kentucky, the Bulldogs raced out to a 49-6 lead by halftime and went on to post a 70-20 victory. It was the most points by the Bulldogs since 1994 when it defeated Northeast Louisiana 70-6 in Sanford Stadium. For the first time since 1915, Georgia has had back-to-back games with at least 60 points. Back then, Georgia opened the campaign with a 79-0 win over Newberry and then blanked Dahlgonega 64-0.

***Fast Starts and Fluffy Stats:** Georgia is outscoring its opponents 49-0 in the first quarter and 84-9 in the first half. For the season, the Bulldogs have outscored their two opponents (Tennessee State and Western Kentucky) 133-23. Against TSU, Georgia scored a touchdown on its first five possessions before a botched hold on a field goal attempt forced a turnover on downs. In the rout of WKU, the Bulldogs registered a touchdown on their first seven possessions before losing a fumble at their own 15 which led to the Hilltoppers first score. Opponents are 4-for-4 in the Red Zone this season with three touchdowns and a field goal. Georgia is 12-for-13 with 12 TDs.

***Selflessness:** In the offseason, the Bulldogs studied the 2025 NBA Champion OKC Thunder and noted how they led the league in eight major defensive and team statistical categories and most importantly, "selflessness," according to Smart. He aims for the 2026 Bulldogs to showcase that trait.

- *5-2 against ranked teams in 2025 including a 83.7 Completion Percentage in the 4th quarter of those games (36-for-43, 383 yards, 7 TDs, 0 INT)
- *Accounted for 5 TDs in 35-10 win over No. 10 Texas, tying his career-high with four passing and one rushing, finishing 24-for-29 for 228 passing yards
- *Directed three 4th quarter comebacks in 2025 including over #5 Ole Miss, #15 Tennessee in Knoxville and versus Florida in Jacksonville.
- *Led Georgia to scoring drives on each of its first 8 drives in win over #5 Ole Miss, the first team to do that against an AP Top-10 team since 2016.
- *Successful home debut in the 2025 opening win over Marshall as the team's leading rusher (73 yards on 10 attempts with 2 scores) plus threw for 190 yards and 2 TDs...First Georgia player to have two passing TDs and two rushing scores in a season opener in the past 80 years per ESPN Stats.

*Behind Stockton, Georgia's QB room with game experience includes a trio of Bulldogs. Junior **Ryan Puglisi** (nine career games) has the been the first off the bench in 2026 followed by sophomores **Ryan Montgomery** (three games), and **Hezekiah Millender** (two games). Puglisi showed off some sp-

speed in the win over WKU, racing 70 yards for a TD. It was the longest TD-run by a Bulldog since 2022 when wideout Ladd McConkey went 70 yards for a score against Miss. State. Montgomery made his debut against Charlotte in 2025 and went 1-for-1 for 12 yards, and then in the 2026 opener against TSU, he connected with **Jeremy Bell** for a team-long 54-yard TD. He finished 2-for-2 for 60 yards. Millender made his debut in 2026 against TSU, going 1-for-1 for 17 yards plus two rushes for 22 yards.

*Puglisi posted a career-high 7-of-13 for 109 yards and 1 TD (16-yarder to freshman TE **Kaiden Prothro**) in the 63-3 win over TSU in 2026

*Made his collegiate debut in a 45-7 win over Marshall in 2025, directing four possessions in the second half with one TD drive covering 80 yards in eight plays and finished the game 5-for-8 for 59 yards and one TD, a 23-yard strike to then freshman TE **Elyiss Williams**.

*Georgia added one more QB this season in 6-2, 200-pound freshman **Bryson Beaver**, a native of Murrieta, Calif. He originally signed with Oregon but entered the portal after Ducks starting QB Dante Moore opted to return.

Frazier & Bowens Headline Ground Attack

Through two games, Georgia is averaging 253.0 rushing yards a contest including 8.2 yards a rush. Fifteen Bulldogs have had at least one carry. The Bulldogs have seven rushing TDs on the year.

*Junior **Nate Frazier** leads the team with four rushing TDs in only 10 attempts. In 2025, Georgia averaged 182.1 rushing yards/game with 31 TDs.

*Frazier started against TSU and tied his career high with three TDs in only four carries! His first touch resulted in a 48-yard TD, his second was a 14-yard TD and his final carry was a three-yarder for a score. His final line of the day was 72 yards on four carries (18.0 avg) and three TDs. Last year, he led the team with 947 yards and six TDs in 10 games.

*Junior **Chauncey Bowens** had four carries for 24 yards against TSU and added two catches for 32 yards. He only had one carry for four yards against WKU and flashed as a receiver with two catches for 45 yards including a 21-yarder for a TD when he hurdled the final defender near the goal line.

*Georgia also welcomes back **Dwight Phillips Jr.**, **Bo Walker** and freshman **Jae Lamar** and **Nick Peal**. UK senior transfer **Dante Dowdell** is out due to an injury. Against TSU, Walker had a team-high five carries for 35 yards. Lamar scored the game's final TD, an 11-yarder as he finished with 15 yards.

Spreading It Around

Georgia is averaging 323.5 passing yards a game and spreading the wealth in the first two blowouts. Four quarterbacks saw action in the rout of TSU to open the 2026 season, and they combined to complete 25 passes to 15 different Bulldogs for 388 yards and five TDs. Then, three QBs played in the win over WKU as 12 different Bulldogs caught a pass with five TDs.

*The featured receivers in the early going include junior **Sacovie White-Helton** (4-for-104 yards overall including a 70-yard TD against WKU), sopho-

more **Talyn Taylor** (5-for-59 yards, 2 TD plus a 31-yard rush) and freshman **Craig Dandridge Jr.** (4-for-92 yards). White-Helton and Dandridge have contributed on special teams too.

*In 2025, the Bulldogs averaged 220.2 receiving yards/game with 25 TDs. The Bulldogs will have to lean on a new cast with six of the top seven pass catchers off to the NFL or have graduated. The departed group includes junior **Zachariah Branch** (81-for-811 yards, 6 TDs), now with the Atlanta Falcons. He led the SEC in receptions with a Bulldog record 81 catches last year.

*Senior **London Humphreys** (18-for-276 yards, 3 TDs in 2025) is the top returning receiver. He had *THE* catch of the 2025 season. Down 38-30 with 2:38 remaining in the game at No. 15 Tennessee, it was 4th-and-6 when he hauled in a 28-yard touchdown strike from **Gunner Stockton**. This year, he has two catches for 11 yards and a score.

*Bulldog junior transfer **Isiah Canion** has three catches for 28 yards.

*The following Bulldogs will be looking for an increased role: **Jeremy Bell, CJ Wiley, Thomas Blackshear, Landon Roldan** and **Tyler J. Williams**. Bell caught a 54-yard TD strike from **Ryan Montgomery** against TSU while Williams made a nifty 27-yard catch in traffic.

Paving The Way

Georgia's offensive line has featured the same starting five through the first two games of 2026, and that's a welcome sight after last year. The Bulldog front had an eventful season in 2025 due to injuries. Georgia used a different starting OL unit in its first six games, then had the same unit for the next four contests before resting a pair (All-America **C-Drew Bobo**, RT-**Earnest Greene III**) in the win over Charlotte. Bobo left the game versus No. 23 Ga. Tech with a leg injury. **C Malachi Toliver** started three of the final four games for him. Micah Morris (LG) was the only lineman to start every game in his final year. The Bulldogs employed three different starting RGs, two different LTs, two different Cs and four different RTs. Junior LT Monroe Freeling, a 2nd Team Coaches All-SEC selection, had the longest starting streak at 10 games. He was a first round draft pick of the Carolina Panthers.

*In 2026, Bobo, a 2nd Team Coaches All-SEC pick, and Greene III are the veteran leaders of the unit. They are joined by sophomores **Dontrell Glover** (LG) and **Juan Gaston Jr.** (RT) plus freshman **Zykie Helton** (RG) to round out the starters.

*Greene III now has a team-best 34 career starts. Last year, Gaston Jr. started at RG and RT while Glover, who earned FWAAs Freshman All-America honors, started the last 10 games at RG.

*Helton became just the third true freshman offensive lineman to start an opener in the Kirby Smart era. The others were Andrew Thomas (2017-RT) and Gaston (2025-RG). Overall, 14 true freshmen have started an opener under Smart.

*Georgia returns **Jahzare Jackson**, Toliver and **Michael Uini** who made spot starts last year. Along with Helton, a freshman to watch is **Ekene Ogboko**. Ekene is the younger brother of Bulldog DL **Nnamdi Ogboko**.

Tight Ends Always In The Game Plan

Tight ends have been a staple of the Bulldog offense and the player development is notable. Five former Bulldogs are in the NFL in 2026, most notably two-time John Mackey Award winner Brock Bowers (Las Vegas). The Bulldogs aim to continue that trend with a stocked room in 2026 as only Oscar Delp graduated from the group. He is now with the New Orleans Saints.

*In 2025, **Lawson Luckie** and Delp led the room. **Jaden Reddell** appeared in every game while **Elyiss Williams** played in 13 games as a rookie and **Colton Heinrich** saw action in four games. Last year, **Ethan Barbour** went down with a leg injury in game two (Austin Peay) and eventually returned for the CFP.

*Georgia's 2026 additions to this room include freshmen **Kaiden Prothro, Brayden Fogle** and **Lincoln Keyes**.

*In the win over TSU, Georgia's tight ends combined for 100 receiving yards on six catches including three touchdowns. Reddell (2-38, 1 TD plus a 29-yard rush), Williams (2-26, 1 TD), Prothro (1-16, 1 TD) and Barbour (1-10). It was the first career TDs for Reddell and Prothro.

*In the win over WKU, the tight ends had three catches for 25 yards and one TD. Williams made his first career start while Barbour notched his first TD.

The '26 Defense And A Final Look At 2025

Georgia has had 55 players drafted over the past five seasons, including 30 on defense and 11 of those defenders have gone in the first round.

*Through two games, Georgia is allowing 11.5 points a game including none in the first and third quarters.

*In 2026, Georgia opened with a 63-3 rout of FCS-member Tennessee State. The Tigers field goal came in the second quarter. WKU managed 20 points including 14 in the 4th quarter with Georgia up 63-6. Two of the Hilltopper scoring drives covered just 15 and 23 yards following Bulldog turnovers.

*The 2025 Bulldogs allowed 10 points or fewer in each of their final four games before the CFP, the longest streak in a season since an eight-game stretch during the 1971 season, according to ESPN Research. However, No. 6 Ole Miss scored 20 points in the 4th quarter to win the CFP quarterfinal at the Sugar Bowl 39-34. Overall, opponents scored 246 points in 2025 (17.6 ppg/10th nationally).

Stopping The Run Starts Up Front

In 2026, Georgia's opponents are averaging 60.0 rushing yards per game. In the season opener against TSU, the Tigers managed 10 yards on 32 attempts as the Bulldogs collected three sacks. Then, WKU tallied 110 yards on 37 attempts (3.0 average) as Georgia notched two sacks. In 2025, Georgia ranked fourth nationally by allowing only 81.5 rushing yards a game.

*Senior **Jordan Hall** and senior **Gabe Harris Jr.**, and sophomore **Elijah Griffin** have been the starters up front this season. For Griffin, a FWAAs Freshman All-American last year, these have been the first two starts of his career.

*Returnees on the line include **Joseph Jonah-Ajonye, Justin Greene, Nnamdi Ogboko, Josh Horton, JJ Hanne, Isaiah Gibson, Nasir Johnson** and **London Seymour**.

*Newcomers to watch here include freshmen **Preston Carey, Carter Luckie** (younger brother of Bulldog senior **Lawson Luckie**), **Valdin Sone, Anthony Lonon Jr.** Junior transfer **Amaris Williams** (Auburn) is out with a knee injury.

*Harris Jr. and Lonon Jr. each had a sack against WKU.

Linebackers Making An Impact

With the lopsided scores in the first two games this season, the Bulldogs have been able to get a look at their depth on both sides of the football. For the linebackers, the good news is two-thirds of the 2025 starting trio return in **Raylen Wilson** and **Quintavius Johnson** while All-American and tackle leader CJ Allen is off to the NFL as a member of the Buffalo Bills.

*Wilson finished third on the team with 74 tackles plus had 6.5 TFL and 2.5 Sacks. Johnson tallied 35 tackles on the year. The next wave who flashed in 2025 and look to make a bigger impact includes **Chris Cole, Justin Williams** and **Zayden Walker**. Cole has drawn the starting assignment this season.

*Wilson, Cole, Williams and Walker were among the seven Bulldogs who tied for the team-high in tackles (three) against TSU. Cole had a 0.5 sacks too.

*Also, Georgia's depth here includes **Terrell Foster, Isaiah Gibson, Darren Ikinagbon, Anthony Kruah** and **Chase Linton** plus freshmen **PJ Dean, Nick Abrams II, Khamari Brooks, Elijah Littlejohn** and **Terrence Penick**. Linton has missed the first two games of 2026 due to injury.

*In the season opener against TSU, Dean made an immediate impact with a team-high 1.5 sacks for a loss of 20 yards plus two tackles.

*Littlejohn made three solo stops and his first career sack against TSU while Brooks ranked among the tackle leaders too with three stops.

*Against WKU, Kruah led the team with five tackles and had a forced fumble while Brooks picked up his first sack

A Passing Grade In The Secondary

Through two games, Georgia's opponents are averaging 107 yards through the air while the secondary has a pair of interceptions.

*In the season opener, TSU finished 15-for-26 for 99 yards and no TDs while WKU tallied 115 passing yards, going 18-for-37 with 2 INTs.

*The starting unit featured preseason All-Americans **KJ Bolden** and **Ellis Robinson IV** plus **Demello Jones, Kyron Jones** and local product and Clemson transfer **Khalil Barnes**.

***Kyron Jones** started the first six games of 2025 before missing the rest of the season due to a foot injury while Demello Jones (no relation) appeared in 12 games last year before making his first start against TSU in the 2026 opener.

Demello Jones had a 41-yard INT return against WKU plus a fumble recovery. *The Bulldogs made four portal additions in the secondary: Along with Barnes, Georgia's depth in the secondary includes fifth-year **Gentry Williams** (Oklahoma), junior **Ja'Marley Riddle** (ECU) and junior **Braylon Conley** (USC). The Bulldogs return **Jontae Gilbert**, **Jaylan Morgan** and **Todd Robinson**. From the high school ranks, Georgia added **Justice Fitzpatrick**, **Zech Fort**, **Tyriq Green**, **Caden Harris**, **Jordan Smith** and **Blake Stewart**. *Green is getting a look as a kickoff returner too as he had one for 25 yards against TSU and then raced 91 yards for a TD against WKU. Also, he scored on a fumble recovery in the endzone after an INT by Stewart versus WKU.

We're Going For It!

In the **Kirby Smart** era, the Bulldogs have a 64% success rate on 4th Down Conversion attempts (96-for-150) with 17 TDs. *In 2026, Georgia is 0-for-1 on 4th Down, however it came on a botched hold during a field goal attempt in the season opener and led to an incomplete pass. *In 2025, Georgia ranked second nationally in 4th Down Conversions at 75% (15-for-20) with 3 TDs. Some of the more memorable ones from last year included a 4th-and-3 at the Auburn 40 with 5:14 left in the contest. It was part of the clinching go-ahead TD drive that lasted a school record-tying eight minutes and 45 seconds. Down 38-30 with 2:38 remaining in the game at No. 15 Tennessee, Georgia converted a 4th-and-6 at the UT 28 for a TD (Stockton pass-to-Humphreys). ***Did You Know?** Prior to the UT game last year, the only other fourth quarter 4th down conversion featuring a TD pass when Georgia was behind under Smart came in 2016 at Missouri. The Bulldogs trailed 27-21 with 1:31 left in the game and faced a 4th-and-10. Jacob Eason hit Isaiah McKenzie for a 20-yard TD in a 28-27 win.

Geaux Dawgs

Senior All-SEC specialist **Peyton Woodring**, a native of Lafayette, La., is a three-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist. *Woodring's Career FG% of 88.06% (59-of-67) is on track for a school record as the current mark belongs to Rodrigo Blankenship who posted an 82.47% from 2016-19, making 80-of-97 attempts. Blankenship holds the Georgia and SEC record for Career PATs, going 200-for-200. *Woodring is 190-for-190 in Career PATs including tying a school record with 10 PATs in the 70-20 rout of Western Kentucky this season. He became the third Bulldog to make 10 PATs in a game, joining Kanon Parkman (1994 vs. Northeast Louisiana) and George Jernigan (1946 vs. Furman). *Also, Georgia has freshman PK **Harran Zureikat**. He took care of the final two PATs and last two kickoffs in the 63-3 season-opening win over Tennessee State. He handled the final two kickoffs against Western Kentucky. *Kickoff returns under Woodring have been rare but look for **Kyron Jones**, **Raylen Wilson**, **Justin Williams**, **Chris Cole** and **Will Taylor** to be among those with special teams tackles. *In 2026, Woodring has 17 kickoffs with 13 touchbacks. Zureikat has four kickoffs with three touchbacks. Georgia allowed one KOR for 18 yards against WKU.

***Did You Know?** After missing three of his first seven field goal attempts as a freshman in 2023, Woodring has been good on 55 of his past 60 FG (4 of those misses were from 50+ yards while one was from 45 yards).

Jack Podlesny hit a 53 yarder with three seconds left for a 22-21 lead. The Bulldogs would register a safety on the last play for a 24-21 final.

It's Miller Time

With elite distance, hang time, placement and a strong coverage unit, All-America punter Brett Thorson captured the 2025 Ray Guy Award to cap

his Bulldog career. The Bulldogs ranked fourth nationally in Net Punting at 43.5. Thorson missed the 2025 opener while still recovering from offseason knee surgery and **Drew Miller** served as the punter.

*A native of Mediapolis, Iowa, Miller, now a junior, handles the punting duties in 2026. For the year, Miller is averaging 49.8 yards on five punts with three covering 50+ yards.

*Against TSU in the season opener, he had just one, and it covered a career-long 65 yards with a touchback for a net of 45 yards. He punted four times in the second half against WKU and posted a 46.7 average.

*Miller actually got his first taste of action in the 2025 CFP Quarterfinal at the Sugar Bowl after Thorson was injured in the 2024 SEC Championship Game.

*Senior **Will Snellings** serves as the snapper.

*The returning gunners include **KJ Bolden**, **London Humphreys**, **Jeremy Bell** and **Talyn Taylor**.

Back Deep For The Bulldogs In The Return Game

Junior **Sacovie White-Helton** is averaging 13.7 yards per punt return, tallying six for 82 yards. He had four PR for 59 yards including a 35-yarder in the season opener against TSU. Also, he had one KOR for 18 yards.

*Freshman **Tyriq Green** has a team-best 35.8 average on four KOR. He had one KOR against TSU for 25 yards while freshman **Craig Dandridge Jr.**, had one PR for nine yards. Green ignited the crowd against WKU with a 91-yard KOR for a TD. It marked the first KOR for a TD by a Bulldog since 2016 (Terry Godwin, 43-yarder at South Carolina).

*Sophomore **Landon Roldan** is another option as a PR plus he is on the kickoff coverage team and has served as a holder on PATs. He muffed a punt return against WKU but also recovered a fumble on the opening kickoff. Both plays led to eventual TDs.

“Hard To Kill” In 2025

In 2025, Georgia went 7-1 in the SEC gauntlet, trailing early and/or late in seven of those contests. The Bulldogs rallied to beat No. 15 Tennessee and Auburn on the road for their ninth straight victory in those series. They outlasted No. 5 Ole Miss 43-35 in Athens and never had to punt. Georgia won its fifth straight over Florida in Jacksonville. Georgia erased an early 7-0 deficit at MSU with 38 unanswered points and eventually recorded a 41-21 decision for the program’s 900th all-time win. Georgia used a 21-point fourth quarter to defeat No. 10 Texas 35-10 to close out the SEC regular season.

*The only league contest in the regular season where Georgia led wire-to-wire was a 35-14 home win over UK while the only comeback that fell short came to then No. 17 UA 24-21 in Athens.

*The Bulldogs dominated No. 9 UA in the SEC Championship Game becoming the first team to shut out their opponent for the first three quarters of the title game.

*During Georgia's school record 33-game home winning streak from 2019-2025, the Bulldogs beat 10 ranked teams including No. 1 Tennessee in 2022, No. 7 Tennessee in 2024, No. 7 Auburn in 2020, No. 8 Kentucky in 2021 and No. 9 Ole Miss in 2023.

Academic & Community Service In The Smart Era

* The University of Georgia ranked No. 19 in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2026 ranking of the best public universities in the nation, marking the 10th consecutive year that UGA has placed in the top 20.

*The 2026 Bulldogs feature 11 players who have the "SEC Graduate" patch on their uniform: Khalil Barnes (Clemson), Henry Bates, Micah Bell, Drew Bobo, Danny Curran, Terrell Foster, Earnest Greene III, Jordan Hall, Gunner Stockton, Gentry Williams and Raylen Wilson.

* A total of 354 players have made the SEC Academic Honor Roll including a high of 64 in 2025.

* Under Smart, Bulldogs have been named National Football Foundation (NFF) Hampshire Society Members 22 times. The society is comprised of football players from all divisions who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or better in their career, were starters or significant contributors and have completed their final year of eligibility. The most recent members were Oscar Delp, Beau Gardner and Gunner Stockton.

* Ladd McConkey, a 2nd round pick of the L.A. Chargers in 2024, became the 15th Bulldog since 1966 to be named a Campbell Trophy finalist and NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award winner. He received an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship. Georgia leads the SEC and is tied for sixth nationally with its 15 honorees. Oscar Delp was a 2025 Campbell Trophy semifinalist.

* Members of the football team play in the annual Bulldogs Battling Breast Cancer charity golf tournament in the summer. It has raised more than \$2 million since the event began in 2004.

* In 2024, Malaki Starks became the 24th Bulldog since 1992 to earn a spot on the AFCA Good Works Team, which honors 22 men annually for their community service. Georgia's 24 recipients leads the nation.

The team participates in the annual Chick-fil-A Dawg Bowl on night in October. It is led by former Bulldog coach Mark Richt and has raised close to \$3 million for Parkinson's and Crohn's disease.

* In September of 2020, it was announced that Kirby and Mary Beth Smart contributed \$1 million to UGA and the Athletic Association's new social justice program, scholarships for senior athletes whose seasons were affected by the pandemic and the expansion of the football program.

Dooley Field At Sanford Stadium Quick Facts

*Named for the late Dr. S. V. Sanford, former president of the University and Chancellor of the University system.

*An overflow crowd of 30,000 saw the stadium's first game on October 12, 1929, when Yale University made its only trip South. Georgia won the now famous game when a young sophomore end from Macon, Vernon "Catfish" Smith, scored all 15 of the Bulldogs' points. Final score, Georgia 15, Yale 0.

*Over the years, the stadium has experienced various projects including adding lights at field level, double-decking the stands, closing in the West End, building SkySuites on both sides, work to Reed Plaza and renovating the West End Zone.

*Sanford Stadium played host to the medal round of the 1996 Olympic men's and women's soccer, watched by over 3 billion people around the world on television.

*Prior to Georgia's 2019 home opener, the playing field at Sanford Stadium was formally renamed in honor of Vince Dooley, the Bulldogs' all-time winningest head coach. Dooley served as head football coach of the Bulldogs from 1964 through 1988 and director of athletics from 1979 to 2004.

*The latest development was completed in 2024 that featured a new press box, additional premium seating, restrooms, concessions and expanded concourse on the 100-level south side. It raised capacity to 93,033.

Mascot Facts And More About Uga XI, a.k.a "Boom"

*Georgia's Uga has established himself as the nation's most well-known mascot. The line of pure white English bulldogs, which epitomizes everything Georgia, has been owned by the Frank W. "Sonny" Seiler family of Savannah, Ga., since Uga I first graced the campus in 1956. **Uga XI**, aka "Boom" owns a record of 38-6 as he is in his fourth season.

*Boom is the 11th solid white English Bulldog to serve as Georgia's mascot since the line began in 1956 courtesy of the Seiler family of Savannah. In the offseason, Boom resides with his family in Savannah.

*Through the years, Uga has been defined by his spiked collar, a symbol of the position which he holds. He was given his name, an abbreviation for the university, by William Young of Columbus, a law school classmate of Seiler. Each of the Uga mascots is awarded a varsity letter in the form of a plaque, identical to those presented to all Bulldog athletes who letter in their respective sports.

*As determined and published by the *Pitt Press*, the University of Georgia is the only major college that actually buries its mascots within the confines of the stadium. Ugas I-IX are buried in marble vaults near the main gate in the embankment of the South stands. Epitaphs to the dogs are inscribed in bronze, and before each home game, flowers are placed on their graves.

NO. 3 GEORGIA 63, TENNESSEE STATE 3

Sept. 5, 2026 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — The No. 3-ranked Georgia football team kicked off its season Saturday afternoon with a runaway 63-3 win over Tennessee State at Sanford Stadium. The sellout crowd of 93,033, along with a national television audience on SEC Network+, saw the Bulldogs get off to a fast start thanks to a 48-yard touchdown run by Nate Frazier on the third play of the game — the first of three scores for the junior running back.

At the end of the opening quarter, the Bulldogs had a 28-0 lead while the Tigers had zero yards of offense. It was 35-3 at halftime, by which point Georgia quarterback Gunner Stockton and several other starters were already done for the day. Georgia finished with 660 yards of offense, to just 109 for Tennessee State, and seven different Bulldogs scored touchdowns.

Stockton led the offense for five drives before hitting the bench, and Georgia scored TDs on all five. He finished 15 of 16 passing for 202 yards and three touchdowns, with completions to nine different receivers. Frazier scored touchdowns on his first two carries and finished a light day with 72 yards and three scores on just four rushes.

Frazier took a handoff on the right side and sprinted 48 yards for a 7-0 lead. After the Georgia defense got a quick three-and-out, with linebacker Raylen Wilson getting an 8-yard tackle for loss on second down, the Bulldogs were quickly back on the attack. A 25-yard catch and run by Chauncey Bowns moved the ball inside the Tiger 20-yard line, and Frazier later scored on a 14-yard rush to make it 14-0.

Later in the first, Stockton found tight end Elyiss Williams open on the right side for a 17-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. The Bulldogs made it 28-0 with 2:08 left in the opening quarter when Stockton and Talyn Taylor connected on a screen pass at the Tiger 11.

On Tennessee State's next drive, linebackers Chris Cole and PJ Dean sacked quarterback Daylin Lee for a loss of 13 yards on third down. It was the final play of an opening quarter in which the Bulldogs out-gained the Tigers 228-0.

On his final drive, Stockton hit Williams for a 19-yard gain; he later hit Craig Dandridge Jr. for 20, and on second down at the Tiger 14, he found tight end Jaden Reddell open down the middle for a touchdown and a 35-0 lead with 10:33 to play in the half. Tennessee State got on the scoreboard late in the first half on Preston Hurless' 37-yard field goal.

Frazier scored on a 3-yard run to make it 42-3 with 10:56 left in the third quarter. Backup QB Ryan Puglisi threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to tight end Kaiden Prothro with 5:01 left in the third, pushing the lead to 49-3. Later, Ryan Montgomery fired a strike to wide receiver Jeremy Bell for a 54-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter, making it 56-3.

Freshman running back Jae Lamar scored his first career touchdown with 8:57 left in the game, sprinting into the end zone for an 11-yard score to make it 63-3. Georgia's defense finished the game with seven tackles for loss and three sacks.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"Our guys played really hard. ... We'll certainly get challenged more on the perimeter with the run game, once we play better teams. I was proud of the guys. They were into it and were cheering for each other. When you play those kind of games, you have to take the good with the bad and have to pull for your teammates and celebrate their success, and we had that."

Worth Noting...

- Quarterback Gunner Stockton was close to perfect, completing 15 of 16 passes for 202 yards and three touchdowns. The senior was on the field for five drives, and the Bulldogs scored touchdowns on all five. He connected with nine different receivers on his 15 completions.
- When backup QB Ryan Montgomery hit Jeremy Bell for a 54-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter, it was a first for both. It was Montgomery's first career TD pass and Bell's first touchdown catch. Tight end Jaden Redell and running back Jae Lamar also scored the first touchdowns of their careers, with Redell's coming on a 29-yard run.
- Georgia outgained Tennessee State 228-0 in the first quarter, and the Bulldogs' 35 first-quarter points were their most in a quarter since scoring 35 in the second quarter of the 2023 Orange Bowl against Florida State.
- Seven Bulldog defenders had three tackles each to lead the team. Freshman linebacker PJ Dean had 1.5 sacks in his first game, and freshman linebacker Elijah Littlejohn also got a sack. Georgia finished with seven tackles for loss and three sacks while holding TSU to 109 yards of offense.
- Georgia's captains for the game were kicker Peyton Woodring, center Drew Bobo, defensive lineman Jordan Hall and linebacker Chris Cole. Tennessee State won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.

NO. 2 GEORGIA 70, WESTERN KENTUCKY 20

Sept. 12, 2026 • Dooley Field at Sanford Stadium • Athens

ATHENS, Ga. — The No. 2-ranked Georgia football team looked different Saturday afternoon at Sanford Stadium, dressed in all white for the first time ever, but the result was like so many games that have preceded it. A sellout crowd of 93,033, along with a national television audience on SEC Network, saw the Bulldogs blow out Western Kentucky, 70-20.

Gunner Stockton completed 13 of 16 attempts for 234 yards and tied a program record with five passing touchdowns. As a team, Georgia had 493 yards of offense while holding Western Kentucky to 225. Georgia also scored touchdowns on a kickoff return and a fumble recovery.

Anthony Kruah forced a fumble on the opening kickoff, and Demello Jones recovered the loose ball at the WKU 18-yard line. Two plays later, Stockton hit Ethan Barbour for a 7-yard touchdown. On WKU's first possession, both linebacker Chris Cole and safety KJ Bolden had a tackle for loss. After a Hilltopper punt, Georgia went up 14-0 on a Nate Frazier 7-yard run.

Georgia's third touchdown came on a 21-yard screen pass from Stockton to running back Chauncey Bowens, who scampered up the right side after the catch and hurdled a would-be tackler at the goal line.

A 9-yard sack by Gabe Harris Jr. helped force a punt after the Hilltoppers drove down to the Georgia 31. On the ensuing drive, Stockton hit London Humphreys for a 3-yard touchdown. Georgia needed just three plays to score on its next drive. On third-and-3 at the UGA 30, Stockton hit a crossing Sacovie White-Helton near midfield, and the speedy wideout outran everyone for a 70-yard TD.

Jones, who recovered the fumble on the opening kickoff, picked off a Rodney Tisdale Jr. pass on the next WKU drive, setting the Bulldogs up for another score. That came on Stockton's 5-yard pass to Talyn Taylor.

Georgia linebacker Khamari Brooks recovered a Tisdale fumble on WKU's next drive, giving the Bulldogs the ball back at the Hilltopper 16. A couple of plays later, wideout Landon Roldan ran the ball in from the 9.

Backup quarterback Ryan Pughli fumbled on a run later in the half, and the Hilltoppers recovered at the Georgia 15 with 1:18 remaining. On the next play, WKU quarterback Brock Glenn ran the ball in for the first touchdown scored against the Bulldogs this season. On the opening drive of the third quarter, Pughli made up for his fumble, running 70 yards for a touchdown and a 56-6 lead.

Later in the third, safety Blake Stewart intercepted a Glenn pass that bounced off linebacker Terrell Foster's hands and started running the other way. He was stripped of the ball around the 15, and the ball kept rolling toward the end zone. Just before the ball passed through the back of the end zone for a touchback, safety Tyriq Green dove on the ball for a touchdown, pushing the lead to 63-6 with 4:17 to go in the quarter.

After a second WKU score, Green scored his second touchdown of the game, returning the kick 91 yards into the end zone.

Coach Kirby Smart said...

"They work really hard during the week in practice. I thought Nate (Frazier) ran really hard. I think Gunner (Stockton) did a nice job with the passing game that he was afforded. Balls were a little slick and wet, and I think both teams struggled with that."



Gunner Stockton tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

- Georgia scored 10 touchdowns against the Hilltoppers, with two of the coming on 70-yard offensive plays, one on a kickoff return and another on a fumble recovery in the end zone. Quarterback Gunner Stockton tied a school record with five TD passes, including a 21-yarder to Courtney Bowns and a 70-yarder to Sacovie White-Helton.
- Stockton was out of the game by halftime, having completed 13 of 16 passes for 234 yards and thrown TD passes to five different players. Through two games, while playing less than four total quarters, the QB has completed 28 of 32 passes for 436 yards and eight TDs.
- Safety Tyriq Green had a game to remember. Late in the third quarter, he recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. He followed that with a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the fourth.
