#### OPENING TIP...SEC COUNTRY UP NEXT

- Austin Peay will face its lone SEC foe Saturday when the Gobs travel to Bud Walton Arena to square off against Arkansas.
- The Gobs are still seeking their first true road win in 2016-17; the Gobs dropped the season-opener at Dayton and their lone loss at the Tarkett Sports Classic came against host Miami.
- Robinson's usage makes him the only player in the OVC among the league's top-five in scoring (23.3 ppg, 1st), assists (4.6 apg, 4th), steals (1.7 spg, t-5th) and three-point field goals (3.3/g, 3rd).
- This is the third year in a row and fourth time in five seasons the Gobs have traveled to face an SEC foe. Austin Peay's last victory against and SEC opponent came Dec. 10, 2011 against Tennessee.
- The Governors highly-efficient offense has Austin Peay atop the OVC in shooting, hitting 49.4 percent from the floor through seven games, and scoring (82.7 ppg).
- Kenny Jones, averaging 15.1 ppg and 8.3 rpg, is one of only two players in the OVC top-10 in both categories, joining conference preseason Player of the Year Evan Bradds of Belmont.
- The Gobs have an average turnover margin of plus-9.8 in wins and minus-3.7 in losses.
- Arkansas' Moses Kingsley, voted preseason SEC Player of the Year by the media, is averaging 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game, while Dusty Hannahs leads the Razorbacks in scoring (16.7 ppg).
- Arkansas has suffered one non-conference home loss to an unranked opponent in the Mike Anderson era, to Akron (Nov. 18, 2015); the Razorbacks are now 51-1 in those games after beating Stephen F. Austin, Thursday.
- The Razorbacks are off to a 5-1 start after dispatching Stephen F. Austin Thursday evening. Arkansas received votes in the latest ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

#### INSIDE THE SERIES

**The Series:** This is the third meeting between the two teams, with Arkansas owning a 2-0 lead.

**Series Streak:** Arkansas has won two straight.

## NOTING THE GAME

### What You Should Know...

Mike Anderson's "Fastest 40 minutes in college basketball" means the Razorbacks are going to get out and run, owning a commanding 98-27 advantage in transition points this season. The Governors were outscored 18-2 in transition points against Fort Wayne, Wednesday. Arkansas has been dominant at home during Anderson's tenure, with 85 home wins (third-most in the country) during that time.

### Deeper Meanings...

**WHAT A WIN WOULD MEAN:** Be Austin Peay's fifth win against an SEC foe and first since 2011 (at Tennessee)... it would be the first win by an Ohio Valley Conference school against an SEC member since Nov. 15, 2012 (Murray State beat Auburn, 79-59)... it would make Dave Loos 1-2 all-time against Arkansas... it would be Loos' 497th career victory and 415th at APSU.

**WHAT A LOSS WOULD MEAN:** The Gobs would fall to 0-3 all-time against the Razorbacks... Loos would drop to 496-449 overall and 414-396 as Gobs head coach.

### Last Time Against Arkansas...

The Gobs have not journeyed to Fayetteville since the 2008 Jim Thorpe Classic, where they fell 89-80 to the Razorbacks despite 24 points from Drake Reed and 17 from Wesley Channels. The Gobs were within a bucket late but Arkansas held off the final push.

## ABOUT THE GOVS

- Lithuanian junior guard **Domas Budryas** spent his final prep year in Nebraska, playing AAU and club ball after being ruled ineligible by the state.
- Forward **Dre'Kalo Clayton** spent two seasons at USF, which he signed with in 2012 over offers from Florida, Georgia and Auburn, among others.
- Senior forward **Assane Diop** was born in Senegal, played high school ball in Japan, went to the same junior college (Cloud County CC) as former Gov Ed Dyson and speaks four languages.
- Freshman **Jartavious Dobbs** helped Columbus (Miss.) HS to its first-ever state title during his senior campaign.
- Freshman guard **Zach Glotta** played for his father Charles at Fort Zumwalt North High School. He played three seasons alongside older brother Chaz, who is now at Northern Colorado.
- Sophomore guard/forward **Steve Harris**, who prepped at Webster Groves (Mo.), was an AAU teammate of fellow Gov Zach Glotta for Gateway Basketball Club.
- Junior guard **Tre' Ivory** is following in his father's footsteps - his dad Willie played for the Govs from 1996-98.
- Forward **Kenny Jones** was a teammate of fellow senior John Murry at Owens CC. As a sophomore Jones nearly doubled his scoring (5.8 ppg to 11.6) and rebounding (3.9 rpg to 7.5).
- Guard **John Murry**, a third-team juco All-American at Owens CC, left as the program's all-time career leader in free throws made (274) and free throws attempted (371) in two seasons.
- Redshirt sophomore forward **Chris Porter-Bunton** led Warren Central HS to a 103-30 record during his prep career. He also was a highly-coveted wide receiver on the football field.
- Junior guard **Josh Robinson** led the St. Louis area in scoring as a prep senior, averaging more than 35 points per game for St. Mary's High School.
- **Jared Savage** was Chris Porter-Bunton's teammate at Warren County Central HS and is the son of Jermaine Savage, an APSU Hall of Fame player who starred in the mid-1990s.
- A 1,000-point scorer during his three years at Poplar Bluff (Mo.) HS, **Chris Stocks** spent last season at the prestigious New Hampton School in New Hampshire.

## OVCDN ENTERS FOURTH SEASON

The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2015-16 marks the ninth year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks to new streaming technology.

## REVIEWING FORT WAYNE

### ■ What Went Right

- Austin Peay posted an incredible 62 points in the second half—the Gavs second 60-point half of the season—behind 26 points from Josh Robinson and 21 from John Murry.
- Robinson had his fifth career 30-point performance, going for 33 on 10-for-17 shooting and hitting five three-pointers.
- Murry scored a career-high 25 points on 9-for-13 shooting and equaled his career-best with three assists. He scored 14 points in the final 4:50 of regulation.
- The Gavs hit a season-high 13 three-pointers.
- Kenny Jones posted his fourth double-double in the last five games (15 points, 10 rebounds).

### ■ What Went Wrong

- Although the Gavs put up 99 points, they allowed 103—the first time Austin Peay has scored as many points in a regulation loss since 1987 (Dec. 29 vs. Providence).
- Fort Wayne's running game overpowered the Gavs early; 16 of the Mastodons first 64 points came in transition and they outscored the Gavs 18-2 in fast break points.
- All five Mastodon starters scored in double figures.
- Austin Peay's bench was outscored 19-6, and is averaging 6.0 ppg in Governor losses in 2016-17.
- The Gavs forced a season-low tying nine turnovers, while Fort Wayne's ball movement saw the Mastodons pile up 24 assists, most allowed by the Gavs since Indiana racked up 25, Nov. 16, 2015.

## GOVERNORS DECREE

■ **GLOTTA'S "GOOD WORKS":** Sophomore guard Zach Glotta was one of a record 278 nominees for the 2017 Allstate NABC/WBCA Good Works Teams, announced Wednesday. The O'Fallon, Mo., native has been involved in every possible community service initiative the Governors have participated in: packaging meals at Manna Café, weekly reading at Liberty Elementary School, mentoring at the APSU Child Learning Center, APSU's Feed the Hungry event at the Foy Center and more. He's also a SAAC representative and on the FCA Leadership team at Austin Peay and served at an FCA camp at Lee University last summer.

■ **DOUBLE TROUBLE:** When Austin Peay stormed back from 17 down to nearly equalize against Fort Wayne, they did so on the strength of strong second-half performances from Josh Robinson and John Murry. Robinson scored 26 of his game-high 33 points in the second half, while 21 of Murry's career-high 25 came during the final period. Further research was unable to find the last instance when two Austin Peay teammates scored 20 or more points in a half in the same game.

■ **STAT SHEET STUFFER:** One player in the Ohio Valley Conference ranks in the top-five in scoring, assists, steals and three-point field goals, and that player is Josh Robinson with 23.3 ppg (1st), 4.6 apg, (4th), 1.7 spg (t-5th) and 3.3 3-point field goals per game (3rd).

## OVC ODDS AND ENDS

### OVC in fifth year of divisional play

For the fifth time this year the OVC will use divisional play for men's basketball. The addition of Belmont, July 1, 2012, gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. Some of the factors in determining the divisions included geography and balance while also being mindful of matchups and rivalries (both current and future).

### OVC tourney begins seventh season of current format

After debuting a new format and home for the OVC Tournament in 2011, the tournament will once again return to Municipal Auditorium in Nashville this year. Once again the top eight men's and women's teams will qualify for the tournament and advance to play in Nashville (as opposed to playing first round games in campus sites) under a merit-based format. On the men's side the No. 1 and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. Now that divisional play is used, the winner of each division is guaranteed one of the top two seeds while seeds 3-8 will be based on overall conference record regardless of division. Starting last season (2014-15) the OVC women's teams switched back to using the traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. bracket. 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. Now that divisional play is used, the winner of each division is guaranteed one of the top two seeds while seeds 3-8 will be based on overall conference record regardless of division.

### Replay systems for OVC basketball venues enter seventh season

On December 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

▪ **STRANGE BUT TRUE:** In Austin Peay's four wins in 2016-17, the Govs are shooting 60.9 percent from the free-throw line; in their three losses, Austin Peay is now at 75.0 percent from the charity stripe.

▪ **ROBINSON'S GRAND:** Josh Robinson's three-pointer with 18:23 remaining in the second half against Delaware was his 1,000th career point, making him the 32nd Governor to reach that milestone. He's the 13th guard to hit that plateau and the 11th APSU player since 2006 to reach 1,000 points.

▪ **JONES DOUBLING DOWN:** Kenny Jones posted a double-double in all three contests in Ohio to earn All-Tournament honors; he averaged 18.3 points and 11.3 boards and more than doubled his career double-double total; he had two entering the weekend. He added another double-double against Fort Wayne (15-10) and is averaging 17.4 points and 10.6 boards on 67.9 percent shooting over the last five contests.

▪ **STRANGE BUT TRUE II:** Austin Peay entered the Tarkett Sports Classic having not won a game when losing the rebounding battle by 10 or more boards since 2013; the Govs proceeded to do so twice in Oxford against Northern Kentucky (44-33) and Delaware (49-32).

▪ **THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN:** Seven Governors found their way into double figures against Oakland City, including Zach Glotta (15 points), John Murry (15), Assane Diop (12) and Dre'Kalo Clayton (10), each of whom set their career high. Two more Governors (Chris Porter-Bunton and Steve Harris) finished with nine apiece. It was the first time seven Govs scored in double digits since Dec. 30, 2015 against Westminster (Mo.).

▪ **DEFENSIVE MASTERPIECE:** The Govs hassled Oakland City into 27 turnovers-most forced by APSU since Jan. 29, 2008 at Southeast Missouri-including a Dunn Center-record 17 steals. Robinson (career-high six steals) became the first Gov since Zavion Williams (Nov. 28, 2014 vs. Brown) with five or more steals in a single game.

▪ **20-SPOT:** Robinson's 26-point performance in the opener was his fourth-straight 20-point outing, dating back to last season. It's the first streak of four or more 20-point performances by a Gov since Travis Betran scored 20 in four straight from Jan. 3-12, 2013.

## GOVERNORS GAME NOTES

- **ROBINSON PRESEASON ALL-OVC:** Robinson earned his first career pre-season All-OVC honor after averaging 16.9 ppg on 40.2 percent shooting last season. The Govs have now had a pre-season all-conference choice in four consecutive seasons.
- **54TH OVC SEASON:** Austin Peay began playing OVC basketball in the 1963-64 season, meaning 2016-17 is APSU's 54th as a member. Austin Peay ended the 2015-16 season with a 7-9 OVC record. The Governors entered the season at 416-392 (.515) during their five-plus decades as an OVC competitor. Before APSU head coach Dave Loos took over in 1990-91, APSU owned a 165-207 OVC mark.
- **ANOTHER COACHING MILESTONE:** Dave Loos (409 victories) ranks first all-time in the OVC for most victories. He passed former Murray State and UT Martin coach Cal Luther (319) in 2009-10. In 2008-09, Loos became only the second coach in OVC history to record 300 or more wins during his OVC stay. Loos needs four victories for 500 in his collegiate career, including four seasons at Christian Brothers.
- **FAMILY AFFAIR:** Freshman guard/forward Jared Savage is the son of former Gov Jermaine Savage, a member of the 1995-96 OVC title team who also is an APSU's Athletics Hall of Fame member. He joined this season sophomore guard Tre' Ivory, the son of former Govs' forward Willie Ivory.
- **DYNAMIC DUO:** Chris Horton (18.8 ppg, first) and Josh Robinson (16.9 ppg, sixth) became the first pair of Governors to finish top-six in conference scoring in the same

season since Wes Channels (16.9 ppg, second) and Anthony Campbell (15.5 ppg, fourth) in 2009-10; strangely, it marked the second straight year two teams had a pair of teammates in the top-six in scoring, a feat the previously had not occurred since the 2009-10 campaign.

- **ST. LOUIS FLAVOR:** The signing of Richard Henderson Jr. from Maryland Heights, Missouri—a St. Louis suburb—means another migration from the Gateway City to the Queen City. Henderson will join Glotta (Fort Zumwalt North HS) and Steve Harris (Webster Groves HS) when he arrives next fall at St. Louis transplants; the 6-5 post averaged 16.2 points and 8.6 boards as a junior for Pattonville High School.
- **TIBIAL NAIL SURGERY:** Redshirt sophomore Chris Porter-Bunton underwent tibial nail surgery in February 2015. It was the same surgery that gained nationwide attention back in the 1996-97 season when former Gov Bubba Wells underwent the then-radical procedure. Both surgeries were performed by APSU team orthopedist Dr. Cooper Beazley.
- **WARREN COMMISSION:** Jared Savage and Chris Porter-Bunton developed a rapport long before they ever ran a pick-and-roll for Dave Loos. The pair prepped together at Warren Central in Bowling Green, Ky. Another Bowling Green native, Terry Taylor, will join APSU from Bowling Green High School next fall after signing his NLI; Taylor averaged 15.3 points and 11.9 rebounds for the KHSAA quarterfinalists last season.
- **NEW FACES:** Three Govs are first-timers on the APSU roster in 2016-17. Dre'Kalo Clayton, late of Northwest Mississippi Community Col-

lege, transferred in and will have two years of eligibility remaining; he averaged 10.3 points and 6.5 rebounds, hitting 39 percent from three, last season. Jartavious Dobbs and Chris Stocks join the Govs straight from high school; Stocks will be a redshirt candidate while Dobbs provides depth along the front line. A fourth newcomer, Sam McCracken, recently left the program.

# DAVE LOOS

The most successful coach in Austin Peay and Ohio Valley Conference history, Dave Loos capped his 26th season at Austin Peay and 30th as a head coach with his fourth Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship.

'The Dean of OVC Coaches' has set the standard for excellence in the OVC and reached new heights in 2015-16. With the Governors win against SIU Edwardsville, Jan. 21, Loos became the only coach in conference history with 400 victories and with his fourth conference tournament title, he tied E.A. Diddle (Western Kentucky, 1922-64) for most tournament victories in OVC history and is the only coach in history to be named OVC Coach of the Year five times

For more than 16 years, Loos helped APSU thrive as both its head basketball coach and the Athletics Director. His double duties aptly pointed out the respect Loos garnered both on and off campus. He applied the same common-sense approach to his athletics director's duties that have been representative of his APSU basketball tenure.

What is even more remarkable is that Loos, who is in his 24th season as Gobs head coach, owns the mark for APSU's longest basketball coaching tenure—only 13 other Division I coaches have longer tenures at their respective schools—and is the program's all-time wins leader, surpassing Dave Aaron in 2006-07. To honor such achievement, then-outgoing president, Dr. Sherry Hoppe, at the behest of several longtime basketball supporters, named the basketball floor Dave Loos Court. In addition, Loos was inducted into the Austin Peay Athletics Hall of Fame in Feb. 2008.

On Dec. 12, 2009, Loos became the league's all-time wins leader, passing Cal Luther (319) for most victories while coaching in the OVC. His achievement was honored with the establishment of the Dave Loos Scholarship, a graduate scholarship to be awarded to an aspiring coach. Loos entered the season ranked 34th among active coaches for most victories.

Such success didn't happen by accident. Loos not only has elevated APSU's program to the pinnacle of OVC prominence, but has done it as well with the dignity and class so reflective of the reputation he built as an athlete and as a high school/college coach.

He is only the second APSU coach to lead the Gobs to an OVC regular-season and NCAA Division I tournament berth. His APSU teams have advanced at least to the OVC tourney semifinals in 13 of the last 18 years.

More impressively the Governors sported nearly a 60 percent winning percentage during those 13 seasons, including six 20-win seasons and four OVC regular-season titles. In fact, the Gobs own 10 double-digit OVC wins seasons in the new millennium.

That has resulted in Austin Peay winning the OVC tournament and gaining an NCAA tourney berth in 1996; APSU capturing a 1997 league co-championship—the first since 1977; shocking the league by winning both a regular-season co-championship and tourney title in 2003; posting an unprecedented 16-0 OVC campaign in 2004; winning the 2006-07 OVC regular-season title by a convincing three games and repeating it in 2007-08 while advancing to the NCAA tournament. Loos is the only APSU coach to earn multiple OVC Coach of the Year honors, in 1990-91, 1996-97, 2002-03, 2003-04 and 2006-07.

As a result, Loos has achieved one of his program's goals when he took over in 1990-91—the Governors reclaiming their spot among the OVC elite and annually competing for the title.

Loos became Austin Peay's 11th head men's basketball coach on July 14, 1990. In his initial season, not only did his Gobs produce a winning (15-14) season after a previous 10-19 campaign, they displayed an exciting style as well. He became only the third Austin Peay coach to earn OVC Coach of the Year, the first to be recognized in his first Gobs' season.

He then began building his own program with young men who reflected their coach both on and off the court and represented the University with great class.

The Gobs struggled record-wise (11-17 and 7-20) the next two seasons as Loos reinvented the soul of the program. The young 1993-94 team began 0-7 but finished strongly at 11-16. Picked to finish eighth in preseason polls, the Gobs battled for the title much of the season, finally settling for third.

Since then APSU has developed a rich tradition of excellence.

In 1994-95, the Gobs finished the regular-season at 12-15 but pulled two upsets in the OVC tournament before falling to Murray State when star forward Bubba Wells suffered a leg injury that later turned out to be a surgery-necessitating right leg stress fracture.

In 1995-96, the Governors again peaked late. In February, the Gobs fashioned an 8-2 record, including six straight victories. APSU entered the NCAA tourney with a four-game win streak before losing to Georgia Tech.

A year later, the Governors finished 17-14 overall—with Wells missing the season's first 12 games—but won six of their final eight games, including a four-game winning streak that helped clinch a regular-season OVC co-championship.

In 1997-98, the Gobs, despite a rebuilding season, ended the season with a surprising 17-11 record and a fourth-place OVC finish.

In 1998-99, the young Gobs finished in a third-place OVC tie, although the 11-16 mark ended the string of winning seasons at three. A year later, the Gobs ended 18-11. The 18 wins, at the time, represented the most regular-season wins by the Gobs since 1976-77. APSU topped that mark in 1999-00 with a 22-10 record—the Gobs' first 20-win mark since 1986-87.

It was a 14-18 mark in 2001-02 as the Governors possessed only one senior. That returning group completely turned around those losing fortunes in 2002-03. In going 23-8, the Gobs won 15 of their last 16 regular-season games to win a share of the OVC title, with the 23 wins representing the third most in school history.

But the 2003-04 season saw the Gobs make a remarkable run through the OVC, becoming only the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in conference play. The Gobs were just one of three teams in the country to finish league play without a loss.

Despite losing four senior starters, the Gobs were in the 2005 OVC regular-season race until the final weekend and stunned Samford and top-seed Tennessee Tech in the OVC tourney before narrowly losing to Eastern Kentucky in the title tilt. The Gobs finished 9-7 in the OVC. APSU owned an 11-9 league mark in 2006 with a 17-14 overall mark with a young team.

In 2006-07, the Governors, despite having no seniors on the roster, overcame a slow start to finish at 21-12 overall, the third 20-win season during Loos's tenure. More importantly, the Gobs ran away with the OVC crown, going 16-4.

The 2007-08 season was even more remarkable. The odds-on choice to repeat as league champions, the Governors battle a much-improved league, yet finished with an identical 16-4 record and won the regular season by the same three-game margin. It was only the second time in OVC history that a team posted back-to-back 16-win seasons.

The Gobs' 24-11 overall record also tied the APSU mark for single-season wins, both overall and as a Division I program.

Beginning in 2008, the Governors went 19-14 (2008-09), 17-15 (2009-10), 20-14 (2010-11), 12-20 (2011-12) and 8-23 (2012-13). In addition to participating in the CBI three years ago, the Govs appears in the 2009 CollegeInsider.com post-season tourney. .

Loos came to APSU after four seasons as Memphis' top assistant. He joined Larry Finch in 1986 and helped direct his alma mater to an 85-43 record, including two NCAA tourney appearances and a Metro Conference tourney title during his tenure.

Prior to joining Memphis State, Loos enjoyed four successful head-coaching seasons at Christian Brothers College in Memphis. He took over that program in 1982-83, and after an initial 16-14 season, recorded three straight 20-win campaigns. In 1985, CBC captured its first Volunteer State Athletic Conference crown, the VSAC tourney title and second place in the National Catholic Tournament.

For his efforts, he earned VSAC, NAIA District 24 and NAIA Area V Coach of the Year honors. He also was named the National Catholic Tournament Outstanding Coach.

Loos' move to CBC came after spending eight seasons as head coach at his prep alma mater, Mehlville High School in St. Louis. Taking over a program that previously had endured 11 straight losing seasons, Loos led his team to five winning campaigns, including a state tourney berth. He left the school as its winningest coach.

The Missouri native played both basketball and baseball during his college days at Memphis State, where he was inducted into its athletic Hall of Fame in September 2002. Loos was the starting point guard for the 1968-69 Tigers, leading the team in minutes played. He also was an all-conference shortstop for the Tigers baseball team.

Upon completing his eligibility, he remained at Memphis as an assistant in 1970. Following his graduation (1970), he officially began his coaching career as an assistant basketball and head baseball coach at CBC.

He and his wife, Phyllis, have four children, David, who broadcasts Governor sports; Todd, who is in the music business; Brad, a former Gov who is assistant coach at Missouri, and Nicole Peterson, a former dance team member who now is the APSU alumni director.
