STORY LINES

- Mizzou Men's Basketball (12-4, 2-1) hits the road for Southeastern Conference action, tipping off at Arkansas (11-5, 1-3) on Saturday, January 13, at 5 p.m. CT on ESPN2. Live coverage from the Tigers' trip can also be found on the Tiger Radio Network.
- Head coach **Cuonzo Martin** has sculpted Mizzou into a squad capable of knocking down shots, as well as defending against teams with the same mindset. The Tigers rank in the nation's Top 20 in both effective field goal percentage (57.6, 11th) and effective field goal percentage defense (45.2, 18th).
- With the game at Arkansas, the Tigers have the opportunity to win three-straight road games for the first time since the 2011-12 season. That season, Mizzou claimed away victories at Texas (Jan. 30, 67-66), at Oklahoma (Feb. 6, 71-68) and at Texas A&M (Feb. 18, 71-62).
- The Tigers climbed back into the SEC win column with a stellar second-half performance at home vs. Georgia (Jan. 10), scoring 48 points after the break to run away with a 68-56 victory.
- Freshman forward **Jontay Porter** stood out for Mizzou in the win vs. Georgia, recording the second double-double of his career (15 points, 10 rebounds). Porter had three blocks in the win, as well.
- Senior forward **Jordan Barnett** is averaging 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game over the Tigers' last 11 games. In that stretch, Barnett has scored in double-figures in 10-of-11 games and is converting 52.0 percent of his field goal attempts (65-125 FG) and 49.3 percent of his three-pointers (36-73 3PT).
- Graduate senior guard **Kassius Robertson** and Porter rank as the league's most accurate foul shooters in conference action thus far. Both Tigers have sank 13-of-14 (.929) free throws.
- Robertson scored 15 points vs. Georgia (Jan. 10) for his sixth-straight game scoring in double-figures. The former Canisius standout has averaged 17.7 points per game over Mizzou's last six games.
- Mizzou's 153 three-pointers rank as the most in program history through 15 games, ahead of the 1999-2000 season's 144 through 16 games. Mizzou sank 133 triples in 15 games in 2009-10.

62-39 (.614) at California. He has registered six, 20-win seasons as a head coach, including a 21-13 mark in his final season at Cal, which earned the Golden Bears an NIT bid.

Martin's Golden Bears went 23-11 in 2015-16 and tied for third in the Pac-12 en route to the program's highest NCAA Tournament seed in school history (No. 4). A consensus top 10 recruiting class, which included top-five overall prospects Ivan Rabb and Jaylen Brown, helped the Bears fashion the best single-season record in school history at Haas Pavilion (18-0) and end the year with a 19-game homecourt win streak. All-told, the Golden Bears won a school-record 27-straight home games which spanned the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons.

Before moving to the West Coast, Martin spent three highly-successful seasons at Tennessee, where he guided the Volunteers to a 63-41 (.606) record and into the postseason each year (one NCAA, two NIT). His teams also finished among the top-five in the SEC standings every season, including a second-place tie in his first campaign after the Volunteers were ticketed for an 11th-place finish in the preseason poll.

After back-to-back NIT appearances in his first two years as the Volunteers head coach, Martin led Tennessee to a 24-13 record, the Sweet 16 and a No. 23 national ranking in the season-ending 2013-14 USA Today coaches poll. In the process, Tennessee matched the fourth-best win total in school history and recorded its most postseason victories since the 2009-10 campaign. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, Massachusetts and Mercer to equal the most wins in one NCAA Tournament in program history.

Martin is no stranger to the Show-Me State, having launched his head coaching career at Missouri State. After an 11-20 debut season at the Springfield school, Martin led the Bears to a 24-12 record and the 2009-10 CollegeInsider.com Championship in year two.

His third season saw Missouri State record a 26-9 record en route to the program's first-ever regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championship and an NIT bid. Martin was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year and was the 2011 recipient of the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, presented annually to the nation's top minority head coach in Division I men's basketball.

The 46-year-old Martin has served the game of basketball for more than two decades, beginning with a standout four-year playing career at Purdue. He has played and coached alongside some of the game's most highly-regarded mentors, including Hall of Fame Coach Gene Keady. Martin is a member of a distinguished group of successful college basketball coaches to serve under Keady, along with Matt Painter (Purdue), Bruce Weber (Illinois and Kansas State), Steve Lavin (UCLA and St. John's) and Kevin Stallings (Vanderbilt and Pitt).

As a student-athlete, Martin was a 1995 first-team All-Big Ten selection at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 three-pointers. He graduated as one of the program's all-time leaders in three-pointers (179) and among the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 four-year record. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

Following his collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the NBA's Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy.

Martin returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000, and served one season as an assistant on the staff at West Lafayette High School. After earning his degree, Martin joined Keady's Purdue staff for the 2000-01 season as an assistant coach, his college coach, and remained with the Boilermaker program when Painter took over as head coach upon Keady's retirement. He served as the Boilermakers' associate coach during the 2007-08 season before taking the Missouri State post the following season. In his eight-year tenure at Purdue, mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American and current Minnesota Timberwolves forward Robbie Hummel.

He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.

SCOUTING ARKANSAS

- Led by seventh-year head coach **Mike Anderson**, Arkansas has started 1-3 in Southeastern Conference play within an overall record of 11-5. The Razorbacks have solid nonconference wins to their credit, including Oklahoma (Nov. 23, 92-83) and Minnesota (Dec. 9, 95-79).
- Arkansas has averaged 86.3 points per game through 16 games and have allowed an average of 75.7 points to their opponents.
- While Mizzou ranks fourth in the league with a solid 47.8 field goal percentage, Arkansas ranks second with its 49.6 overall shooting success rate. The Razorbacks rank second-worst in the conference in field goal percentage defense (.434), while the Tigers rank fourth-best (.395).
- Senior guards **Jaylen Barford** and **Daryl Macon** have led UA in SEC play, averaging 19.3 and 19.0 points per game, respectively.

NOTES FROM GEORGIA GAME

- Mizzou's win against Georgia was its first over the Bulldogs since Jan. 10, 2013, a 79-62 home win. Georgia had won the previous six meetings. Mizzou cut UGA's lead in the all-time series to 6-5.
- The 12-point win was Mizzou's largest in SEC play since a 15-point triumph over Auburn on Jan. 9, 2016, nearly two years to the day and a span of 41 games.
- Mizzou won for the first time this season when trailing at the half. Mizzou dropped its previous three contests when trailing following the initial 20 minutes.
- With 15 points and 10 rebounds, freshman forward **Jontay Porter** scored in double-figures for the second time in three SEC games and secured the second double-double of his career.
- Freshman forward **Jeremiah Tilmon** scored all 10 of his points in the final 20 minutes of action, as was the same with junior forward **Kevin Puryear's** nine points.

MIZZOU MISLED MATEN

- Mizzou's bigs were tasked with a difficult objective heading into the Tigers matchup with Georgia (Jan. 10): stop preseason All-SEC First-Team selection **Yante Maten**.
- The 6-foot-8 Bulldog entered the matchup averaging 19.9 points and 10.0 rebounds per game, and had scored 10-or-more points in all 14 games this season, including seven 20-point games.
- Maten's double figures streak came to a halt, as Mizzou held him to nine points and two rebounds, both season-lows. Maten had recorded no fewer than 13 points and four rebounds in every game this season.
- Both of Mizzou's freshmen bigs, **Jontay Porter** (15) and **Jeremiah Tilmon** (10), posted double-figure scoring nights.

MORE STORY LINES

- Martin's Mizzou squad has added 12 wins to his career total thus far, bringing that mark up to **198 victories as a head coach.**
- Senior forward **Jordan Barnett** ranks 12th nationally in free throw percentage, hitting on 48-of-52 from the charity stripe (92.3).
- Barnett also leads the SEC in minutes played per conference game (38.3). Barnett has played the entire second half of Mizzou's three SEC games, not subbing out to the bench at any moment.
- Freshman forward **Jontay Porter** is one of just six players nationally to have compiled at least 30 assists (34) and 30 blocks (37).
- Mizzou is shooting well and keeping its opponents from doing the same, ranking 56th nationally in field goal percentage (47.8) and 28th nationally in field goal percentage defense (39.5).
- The Tigers are one of the nation's hottest perimeter shooting teams, ranking 45th nationally in three-pointers made in overall games (9.9) and No. 2 in the SEC. Mizzou also ranks 24th nationally in three-point field goal percentage (40.3, 148-367).
- Barnett's three double-doubles thus far in 2017-18 rank tied for fifth-most in the Southeastern Conference. Georgia's Yante Maten (7) and Vanderbilt's Jeff Roberson (6) hold the No. 1 and No. 2 positions in the SEC.
- Junior forward **Kevin Puryear** ranks in the SEC's Top 10 for active career points (884, 8th) and rebounds (411, 10th).
- Junior guard **Terrence Phillips** ranks in the SEC's Top 10 for active career assists (278, 3rd) and steals (88, 6th).
- Mizzou has outrebounded its opponents in 14-of-16 games. The Tigers rank second in the SEC in rebounding margin (+7.7) in overall games.
- Junior guard **Jordan Geist** has hit 42.5 percent (17-of-40) of his three-pointers this season, an increase from his 28.6 percent success rate from the entire 2016-17 campaign.
- Ball movement is on the up-tick for the Tigers this season, as Mizzou has averaged 15.0 assists per game -- an improvement over the 12.1 dimes averaged last season.
- The Tigers have improved immensely as a blocking team (5.1 BPG), more than doubling last season's blocks per game average (2.1).

BLOCKED BY JONTAY

- Freshman forward **Jontay Porter** earned his first career start in Mizzou's 68-56 win vs. Georgia (Jan. 10) and did well with the nod from head coach **Cuonzo Martin** by recording the second double-double of his career (15 points, 10 rebounds).
- Porter's 37 blocks rank tied as the most by a freshman Tiger through 16 games of a season. Mizzou's freshman single-season record holder, **Arthur Johnson**, totaled 65 blocks in the 2000-01 season. Johnson also had 37 through 16 contests.
- Porter dropped a season-best 19 points in the win at South Carolina (Jan. 3), shooting 5-of-7 from three-point range and 4-of-4 from the charity stripe.

BARNETT HAS SOME BOUNCE

- Senior forward **Jordan Barnett** has been on his game for the Tigers for more than a month, averaging 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over Mizzou's last 11 games.
- Barnett has recorded three of his four career double-doubles during that stretch.
- Barnett's 55.0-percent shooting clip from three-point land in SEC games ranks fifth-best in the league. In overall games, his 42.1-percent mark ranks seventh in the SEC.
- Barnett had a career day with his fantastic shooting performance vs. Florida (Jan. 6), scoring a career-high 28 points thanks in part to his career-best six three-pointers (8-13 FG, 6-9 3PT, 6-7 FT).

KASH MONEY

- Graduate senior guard **Kassius Robertson** is averaging a stout 15.4 points per game, a total that ranks No. 1 among graduate transfers playing at a "Power-5 Conference" school, according to ESPN's Sean Farnham. That total stands at fifth-best overall across the entire NCAA Division I level.
- Robertson extended his streak of scoring in double-figures to six games with his 15 points vs. Georgia (Jan. 10). Over Mizzou's last six contests, Robertson is averaging 17.7 points per game.
- Robertson has connected on multiple three-pointers in six-straight games, and recorded his 76th career game with multiple three-pointers with three against the Bulldogs.
- Robertson is shooting 42.7 percent (47-of-110) from deep, which would be the highest mark by a Tiger since Kim English shot 45.9 percent in 2011-12.
- Robertson became the first Tiger to score 20 points or more in three consecutive games since the 2013-14 season with his 23 points at South Carolina (Jan. 3), which matched his season-best. Robertson scored 22 vs. Illinois (Dec. 23) and 23 vs. Stephen F. Austin (Dec. 19).

DIALED IN FROM DEEP

- Mizzou has hit 153 three-pointers thus far in the 2017-18 season for an average of 9.6 per game that ranks tied for second-best in the Southeastern Conference.
- The Tigers' 153 triples are the most ever by a Mizzou team through 16 games, according to MU historian Tom Orf. Mizzou sank 144 in the same time frame during the 1999-2000 season. The Tigers' 2009-10 squad sank 133 triples in 16 games for the third-best total.
- Martin's squad has already compiled 11 games of 10-or-more three-pointers through 16 contests this season. Last season's Mizzou group recorded exactly five games of 10-or-more three-pointers for the entire 2016-17 campaign (32 games).
- For an entire season, Mizzou's 11 games with 10-or-more triples already ranks tied for fourth-most in program history.

MIZZOU ARENA



The beautiful home to Mizzou Basketball, Mizzou Arena opened for the 2004-05 season, housing Norm Stewart Court along with locker rooms, practice and training facilities, coaches offices, team video room, medical training areas and a player lounge with attached kitchen.

Mizzou Arena received a multi-million dollar upgrade prior to the 2014-15 season, which saw a state-of-the-art video board installed above center court. Additionally, the Tigers' player lounge and locker room area received a tremendous upgrade. Ahead of the 2017-18 season, new \$600,000 ribbon boards were placed in the arena, along with new LED courtside tables and NBA-style shot clocks.



Constructing Mizzou Arena was an impressive feat in itself - more than 104,000 clay bricks were used on the building, as well as more than 2,000 tons of steel. The facility, from arena floor to roof, stands 117-feet, nine-inches tall.

The seating capacity of Mizzou Arena is 15,061, with 26 suites separating lower and upper decks of Black & Gold fans.

Mizzou's rowdy student section encompasses the entire west bleacher section of Mizzou Arena, totaling approximately 4,000 seats.

The north entrance to Mizzou Arena features the Hall of Fame Lobby, which showcases the University of Missouri's many all-time great student-athletes and traditions.

The southern portion of Mizzou Arena houses many of the Tigers' administrative departments, ensuring that Mizzou's support staff are never far away from attending to the Black & Gold basketball program.

EVEN MORE STORY LINES

- Mizzou's 78-69 win at South Carolina (Jan. 3) was the first road conference win for the program since Jan. 28, 2014, when the Tigers defeated Arkansas in Fayetteville, 75-71.
- The Black & Gold completed its most successful nonconference schedule since the 2013-14 season (12-1), winning 10 games against three losses.
- Mizzou grabbed 52 rebounds against North Florida (Dec. 16) -- its first game with 50-or-more boards since last season vs. Auburn (51, Jan. 10, 2017).
- Mizzou put up 100 points for the first time since the 2012-13 season in its 100-77 victory over Green Bay (Dec. 9). The Tigers defeated South Carolina State by a score of 102-51 on Dec. 17, 2012.
- Iron Man! Graduate senior guard **Kassius Robertson** has played at least 20 minutes in 92-straight games dating back to midway through his freshman season (2014-15) at Canisius.

STATEMENTS ON #MPJR

- Mizzou Men's Basketball announced the following on Nov. 21: **Michael Porter, Jr.** will undergo surgery on Nov. 21, in Dallas, Texas. The procedure, a microdiscectomy of the L3-L4 spinal discs, has a projected recovery time of three-four months and will likely cause him to miss the remainder of the season. Michael is expected to make a complete recovery, and the Mizzou Men's Basketball program wishes Michael the best during this process. No further information is available at this time.
- **Statement from head coach Cuonzo Martin:** "Our top priority as a program is the well-being of our student-athletes, so Michael beginning this process to be 100 percent healthy is important to all of us. Our focus has been on Michael's well-being, just like every other player in our locker room. We will continue to work every day to build Mizzou Basketball into a program to be proud of. We're preparing now for a trip that is a tremendous opportunity. I'm excited to get after it in Orlando."
- **Statement from Michael Porter, Jr.:** "I really appreciate the support of my family and the Mizzou Men's Basketball program as I begin this process. I'm thankful for all the kind words and messages I've received from fans. Those mean a lot to me. I cannot wait to be completely healthy and playing the game I love, once again."

STATEMENT ON HARRIS

- Mizzou Men's Basketball head coach **Cuonzo Martin** announced the following on Jan. 5: "Blake Harris has decided to transfer from the Mizzou Men's Basketball program. We will support and assist him in any way possible."

STATEMENT ON ROBERTS

- Mizzou Men's Basketball head coach **Cuonzo Martin** announced the following on Dec. 7: "C.J. Roberts will transfer from the Mizzou Men's Basketball program. We wish him nothing but the best, and we will assist him in any way possible."

NORM

- Mizzou's legendary head coach, **Norm Stewart**, was honored with the dedication of a statue outside Mizzou Arena on the Walsworth Family All-American Plaza on Nov. 10, ahead of Mizzou's exciting season-opening win vs. Iowa State.
- Funded by private donations, the statue honors Stewart's 39-year association with his alma mater as a student-athlete, assistant coach, and head coach of Mizzou Basketball from 1967-1999.
- Stewart won more than 630 games in his Hall of Fame career, guiding Mizzou to 16 of its 26 all-time NCAA Tournament appearances and 19 Big 8 Conference championships.

ROBUST RECRUITING

- Head coach **Cuonzo Martin** signed three future Tigers to Mizzou's 2018 recruiting class on Nov. 9. The trio is set to join Mizzou's 2018-19 roster.
- Guard **Javon Pickett** (Belleville, Ill.), currently in a postgrad year of prep school at Sunrise Christian Academy in Wichita, Kansas, was an exceptional scorer for Belleville East High School as a senior in 2016-17. Pickett scored 25.3 points per game to earn *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* All-Metro recognition.
- Originally a 2017 recruit, the 6-5 195-pound Pickett signed with Illinois before opting out of his NLI and reclassifying for a year of prep school.
- With three years of eligibility remaining, **K.J. Santos** (Geneva, Ill.) comes to Columbia by way of Tallahassee Community College after a freshman season at Illinois-Chicago in 2016-17 that saw him average 7.1 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. A 6-8, 220-pound forward, Santos made 30 starts within 35 total game appearances as a freshman and scored a career-best 19 points with five three-pointers in an OT win at Milwaukee (Feb. 4, 2017).
- From The Whitfield School, the Tigers gained 6-5, 220-pound guard **Torrence Watson** (St. Louis, Mo.). The four-star standout was rated as a Top 150 recruit by both ESPN and Rivals after a junior campaign that saw Watson propel The Whitfield School to a Missouri Class 3 team runners-up finish. Watson averaged 28.0 points per game as a junior.

HURRICANE RELIEF

- Mizzou and Kansas met at Kansas City's Sprint Center (Oct. 22), for a newly NCAA-approved charity exhibition - an opportunity to raise money for hurricane relief. In total, the game's tickets, live pay-per-view stream and additional donations amounted to \$2.011 million.
- On the court, the Tigers pushed the preseason No. 3-ranked Jayhawks, but ultimately fell by a score of 93-87. Freshman forward **Michael Porter, Jr.** (Columbia, Mo.) led the Tigers with 21 points (6-of-20 FG, 2-of-9 3PT, 7-of-8 FT), also grabbing eight rebounds and dishing two assists.
- Senior forward **Jordan Barnett** (St. Louis, Mo.) scored 19 points (7-of-10 FG, 5-of-7 3PT) in the exhibition, the second-most for Mizzou.
- Graduate transfer guard **Kassius Robertson** (Toronto, Ontario) was efficient, scoring 13 points (5-of-9, 3-of-5 3PT) while guarding Kansas' ball handler for a majority of the contest.

SEC TOURNAMENT IN ST. LOUIS

- For the first time ever, the Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament will be played west of the Mississippi River. St. Louis, Missouri, plays host to the 2018 edition of the event, at the Scottrade Center from March 7-11, 2018.
- The Scottrade Center is a contemporary, 12-story glass and concrete structure located in the heart of downtown St. Louis. The home of the NHL's St. Louis Blues, the Scottrade Center also features a full range of arena programming, including concerts, ice shows, family shows and other sporting events. The Scottrade Center plays host to approximately 175 events per year, bringing nearly two million guests to downtown St. Louis annually and ranking it among the top arenas in the country.
- The SEC Tournament will be broadcast on the SEC Network and ESPN, with the quarterfinals, semifinals and championship game on the main network.
- The tournament, routinely in Nashville, Tennessee, deviates again to Tampa, Florida, in 2022.

SOLD OUT ARENA

- Mizzou Arena is officially sold out of season tickets for the 2017-18 season, with the public season ticket sales total (9,572) standing as an arena record.
- Mizzou Arena holds 15,061 fans, and Mizzou Athletics has sold 15,600 season tickets to date, including 6,028 student combo tickets which are good for both men's basketball and football games.
- An increase of nearly 4,000 tickets took place in the offseason, as last season's final total of Mizzou public season ticket holders was 5,802.
- Mizzou's student season ticket total of 6,028 is double last year's total of 3,008 and marks the most sold since the 2013-14 campaign when 6,816 student tickets were purchased. Prior to this season, Mizzou Arena's last sold-out men's basketball game was for the Tigers' 93-63 victory over Arkansas, March 5, 2013.

UP NEXT

- Mizzou returns home to take on Tennessee on Wednesday, Jan. 17, with live coverage starting at 8 p.m. CT on the SEC Network and the Tiger Radio Network.
- The all-time series between the Tigers and Volunteers is tied, 5-5. The two programs have each added a win to their totals over the past two seasons. Mizzou won at home during the 2015-16 season, 75-64, on Feb. 13, 2016.
