





Former Razorback and LPGA Player of the Year Stacy Lewis was asked by Golf Channel to be on the Feherty Show. She was told she could select any location for the shoot and Lewis decided to bring the world to Northwest Arkansas shooting the episode at Blessings.

SMITH TRAINING FACILITY



The Razorbacks took a giant leap forward in the spring of 2004 with the dedication of the Fred W. and Mary B. Smith Razorback Golf Training Facility at Blessings in Johnson, Ark.

Located on the practice tee of Blessings, the facility is home to six indoor-outdoor practice bays, an indoor video swing analysis station, office space and men's and women's locker room facilities for the Arkansas golf teams.

The long-time CEO of the Donrey Media Group, Fred Smith, is the chairman of the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation.

"We are excited to be a part of this facility that will help the Razorback golf programs continue to compete at the highest national level," Smith said. "Many members of our family play golf, so we have an appreciation for the commitment and many hours of practice that are required to succeed. We have a great love for the University of Arkansas and have always been proud to support the Razorbacks."

Arkansas head coach Shauna Estes-Taylor echoed those thoughts.

"I believe we have one of the best golf facilities in the country," said Estes-Taylor. "I can't thank Mr. Tyson enough for allowing us to call the Blessings our home. There is not a golf shot that we can not practice at our facility and it helps prepare us for championship golf. The Fred and Mary Smith Golf Center is another amazing facility that houses our offices, locker rooms, video bays, putting studio, and a lounge for our teams to call home. Many thanks as well to Fred and Mary Smith for their generous support for our golf center. I feel so lucky to have such a great place to show off to recruits. There is this "wow" factor that exists when people see our place for the first time. We are very lucky!"

Although the facility and golf course are just a couple years old, a recent expansion was added. The SAM PuttLab is the most comprehensive putt training tool ever developed. The software and computer system is customized to exactly fit the needs of each individual player. It is used by the top players on the PGA and LPGA tours.

The training system gives you feedback on all of the following parts of your putting stroke: face angle, swing path, impact position, dynamic loft and rise angle, club face rotation, movement dynamics, rhythm and timing.

STACY LEWIS GIVES BACK



Former University of Arkansas and current Ladies Professional Golf Association star Stacy Lewis became the first female member of the Razorback Foundation's Century Circle, with her recent gift to the golf program.

Lewis, a The Woodlands, Texas, native, is the first former female student-athlete to donate \$100,000 or more to the program. Her gift is earmarked for expansion of the Razorback golf training facilities at Blessings.

"We are grateful to Stacy Lewis for her generous gift which will directly benefit current and future Razorback student-athletes," Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Jeff Long said. "Despite her demanding schedule, Stacy continues to support the Razorbacks in a variety of ways including remaining active with our women's golf program. Stacy's personal story of overcoming adversity to achieve success continues to serve as an inspiration to others. We are extremely proud of Stacy and what she is doing on the LPGA Tour and in our community. She is a tremendous ambassador for the University of Arkansas and for the Razorback program."

Lewis is a three-time winner on the LPGA Tour including two victories this season and a major championship at the Kraft Nabisco last year. Lewis is currently ranked No. 2 in the world and is the highest ranked American player.

"I was fortunate enough to get to know Stacy at a time when golf took a back seat to her getting healthy after surgery," said Arkansas head coach Shauna Estes-Taylor. "It was during this time I really began to understand her commitment to her dream of becoming a professional athlete. As I worked with her that first year when she was so limited physically, I saw that Stacy was invested in not only her own success but the success and

growth of our program. She had a great student-athlete experience at Arkansas and now her gift will enhance the experience of others who have the dream of being Razorbacks."

"We are so proud of all that Stacy has accomplished," said G. David Gearhart, the university's chancellor. "This generous gift reflects her own pride in her alma mater and her commitment to helping other U of A students pursue their dreams and goals. We are most appreciative of her gift."

Lewis was a member of the Razorback women's golf team from 2005-08. She redshirted her first season on campus after having surgery to address her scoliosis. Lewis recovered quickly earning four All-Southeastern Conference and National Golf Coaches Association All-America honors. Lewis was a two-time SEC Champion-ship medalist and won the 2007 NCAA Individual title shooting a course record 66 in the final round at LPGA International.

While at Arkansas, Lewis helped the Razorbacks to four NCAA Regional selections and three NCAA Championship team appearances. Arkansas won three tournaments and Lewis picked up a school record 13 individual titles during her collegiate career.

Lewis graduated in 2008 with a degree in finance from Arkansas. She won Qualifying School in the fall of 2008 earning her LPGA Tour Card in her first year as a pro.

BLESSINGS EXPANSION






The proposed expansion of the Razorbacks Training facility, the Fred and Mary Smith Center, is scheduled to include an indoor putting facility with surface that allows the Razorbacks to hone our short game skills in all areas. The space will also include expanded locker rooms, pictured at the right, as well as a second floor with a weight room that will allow each team to do golf specific training on site at the golf course.







Blessings Golf Club is an exciting 18 hole championship course located in Fayetteville, Ark.. From the back tees it plays 7,527 yards with a par of 72. The course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr., ASGCA and opened in 2004. The course contact is Tom Jones, General Manager/Director of Golf, and Stan Wright, Head Professional.

The Razorback Golf team moved into their home course at Blessings during the summer of 2004. The course is both challenging to players and was a challenge to create. Robert Trent Jones II and owner John Tyson (Chairman of Tyson Foods) had a number of goals in mind when designing Blessings.

A very hands-on client, Tyson wanted a flexible golf course where every shot required careful thought and precise execution. He also wanted a course sufficiently demanding to host major collegiate tournaments. To meet the dual goals of toughness and flexibility, RTJ II created a unique golf course with three adjustable holes-eight, nine and sixteen-which can be configured to play to different pars, depending on course setup.

Another challenge in designing Blessings was to route the golf course so that the clubhouse could be located outside of the floodplain of Clear Creek, the major topographical and strategic feature of the site. After considering a number of possibilities, a continuous eighteen-hole routing was recommended rather than a pair of returning nines. A third challenge arose as the architect designed the short, par-three tenth hole, which plays to a green located on an exposed platform at the edge of a vertical rock quarry. The green site was shaded by a grove of hardwoods that designers wished to save, but needed to thin out to provide sunlight to the green. To solve this dilemma, they generated computer models that showed sunlight angles to the green at various times of day and season, and figured out how to save the greatest number of trees while allowing for enough light to grow grass on the green. This is a good example of how RTJ II delivers environmentally sensitive solutions to golf course design challenges-something we've been doing for more than 30 years.

Blessings stretches to nearly 7,500 yards from the back tees and plays through two distinct landforms-the Clear Creek floodplain and a plateau that rises to 65 feet above the floodplain where it's bisected by a series of ravines. Both the outward and inward nines climb up and down between the two topographies, creating drama and variety on

a course where golfers will surely feel both tested and blessed by the glory of their surroundings. Practice Facilities




CLUBHOUSE


The Blessings Clubhouse, is a luxury clubhouse designed by architect Marlon Blackwell. A stand-alone structure set at the base of the hill, with its footprint minimally contacting the land, the Blessings Clubhouse acts as a type of covered bridge. This bridging creates an entry portal that operates as a breezeway framing the eighteenth green, acts as a threshold to the golf course beyond, and is an event space for golf tournaments. Conceived as an animate form, the building receives the visitor beneath its cool and shaded underbelly, not unlike the clefts and caves found in the nearby hills. The Blessings Golf Clubhouse attempts to demonstrate that a conventional commercial building system can be transfigured into a contemporary design solution that recalls a traditional lineage, that of the traditions of the game of golf. PARADISE VALLEY GOLF CLUB



Established in 1967, Paradise Valley Golf and Athletic Club has challenged golfers for almost four decades. Once located "out in the country," the Club is now in the middle of one of Fayetteville's busiest shopping, dining and business areas. Paradise Valley has much to offer its members and guests. The Clubhouse features a pro shop, grill area and locker rooms. A swimming pool and sundeck area and two hard-surface tennis courts add to members' outdoor recreational options.

The golf course features a meandering creek that comes into play on at least five holes on the back nine. Gently sloping greens that can trick even the seasoned player are just part of the challenge. Significant elevation changes dramatically affect shot-making decisions on several holes. Numerous mature pine and oak trees line fairways throughout the course to catch errant tee shots.

Golfers that are on their game are rewarded with low scores, but even those not playing their best, will enjoy their day at Paradise Valley.

SPRINGDALE COUNTRY CLUB



Springdale Country Club was established in 1927 by several charter members as a premium 9-hole golf course. It expanded its course from nine to 18 holes in the summer of 1996, presenting golfers with completely different courses on both the front and back sides. Additional updates to both the course and clubhouse are followed. The front was built in 1927 and redesigned in 1972 while the back features a modern design with many physical challenges to overcome.

STONEBRIDGE MEADOWS GOLF CLUB



Opened in November of 1997, Stonebridge Meadows Golf Club is described as an upscale daily-fee public course. Stonebridge Meadows measures 7,130 yards from the back tees and has 50 strategically placed bunkers, large challenging greens and a practice area. The 13-acre practice facility includes a club house and amenities. Stonebridge Meadows quickly became recognized as one of the best golf facilities in Arkansas, ranking as "Best Place to Play" by Golf Digest with a 4½ star rating.

The par-72 golf course at Stonebridge Meadows Golf Club measures over 7100 yards from the back tees. The course rating is 75.1 and it has a slope rating of 133. It was designed by Randy Heckenkemper and opened for play in 1997. Ranked as Northwest Arkansas' "Best Place to Play" & rated "4 1/2 Stars" by Golf Digest, our course features five sets of tees, bermuda fairways, and bent grass greens. Stonebridge Meadows is also one of thirteen courses on The Natural State Golf Trail.

PINNACLE COUNTRY CLUB



Women's professional golf is a fixture in the state of Arkansas, joining the Razorbacks at one of their home courses - Pinnacle Country Club in Rogers. Located in the northwest portion of The Natural State, Pinnacle Country Club hosts an international field of LPGA Tour professionals at

the Walmart Northwest Arkansas Championship presented by P&G at Pinnacle Country Club. The week-long championship included a variety of community events, Pro-Am play and three days of LPGA competition.

The Razorbacks are currently the only Southeastern Conference team whose course is hosting an LPGA event this year and are one of just a handful of major college programs with an event on their home course.

In addition, the Razorbacks compete all season to qualify for two of the Monday play-in spots for the championship.

Founded in 1990, Pinnacle Country Club is one of Northwest Arkansas' premier golf and tennis facilities. The course, designed by Don Sechrest in association with Bruce Lietzke, stretches 6,695 yards from the back tees with a course rating

of 72.8 and a slope of 131. The Razorbacks compete from Pinnacle's white tees with a length of 6,102 yards.

Located 20 minutes north of Fayetteville in Rogers, Ark., Pinnacle is known both for its course difficulty and homesite elegance.

Pinnacle is graced with generous landing areas, but its large, undulated greens require both precision and accuracy. Its par 3s are extremely challenging including, Pinnacle's signature hole, No. 15. This hole requires a golfer's most accurate mid-iron as the 160-yard downhill shot must carry to an island green.

While young in its existence, Pinnacle has a history as host of prestigious events including the Greg Norman Challenge in 1990 and the Philips Classic in 1992, an event that included several senior PGA players.

The grand clubhouse provides a comfortable setting for casual entertaining as well as formal events. The elegant design and location of the clubhouse evoke the Southern hospitality that welcomes all members "home."

Northwest Arkansas returned to the Ladies Professional Golf Association's schedule in 2007 hosting the Walmart Northwest Arkansas LPGA Championship at Pinnacle Country Club.

Arkansas has been home several events beginning with the Hardscrabble Women's Invitational Oct. 17-21, 1950, in Fort Smith, Ark. The event was won by Patty Berg.

The Hardscrabble Open returned to Fort Smith in 1952 and was followed by the Arkansas Open at the Country Club of Hot Springs, in Hot Springs, Ark., in 1956.

The LPGA added the Walmart Northwest Arkansas Championship in 2007. The

commitment allows the Arkansas women's golf team and the Northwest Arkansas community to enjoy the sport at its best.

The inaugural event in 2007 was spectacular for Arkansas fans. Then junior Stacy Lewis earned a sponsor's exemption to play in the event and she blistered the course shooting a 65 in the first round.

Eight inches of rain, however, washed away Lewis' "win" as the tournament was declared a "non-event". Lewis was awarded the trophy and invited back for the 2008 event.

2013 WALMART CHAMPIONSHIP



University of Arkansas sophomore Gabriela Lopez fired a second round 74 at the Walmart Northwest Arkansas LPGA Championship at Pinnacle Country Club in Rogers, Ark.

Although Lopez did not make the cut, her experience is one she can learn from.

"I really enjoyed this experience," Lopez said. "I played better today and really have a lot of things that I learned from this experience. I feel very blessed and very glad to be here, It was a lifetime opportunity to play in an LPGA tournament and I just want to say thank you for the opportunity."

Lopez opened play with a 79 in the first round for 153 (79-74).

"I'm so proud of Gaby," said Arkansas golf coach Shauna Estes-Taylor. "This is where she wants to be and to have the opportunity to tee it up with these players gives her the opportunity to move forward to help her move and improve as a player."

She was able to get her putter going today with three birdies in the round. Lopez birdied the 12th, 16th and 17th holes, her only birdies of the tournament.

PREVIOUS YEARS

The second year of the event saw the tournament move from the early fall to the July 4th weekend. Hot temperatures and stormy weather again effected play but athletes were able to complete three rounds.

Lewis was again in the hunt early finishing 49th after three rounds. University of Arkansas women's golfers Lucy Nunn and Kristin Ingram were given a pair of qualifying spots and Nunn made the most of her opportunity finishing as the low qualifier with a two-under 70 on Monday before the event. Nunn battled nerves and tough conditions in the first round but rallied with a second round 74. She did not make Sunday's cut.



The 2009 season saw Nunn receive an exemption for the event while Kelli Shean and Kristin Ingram had the chance to play their way in. Shean made the cut and was invited to play in the Friday-Sunday event. Former Razorback Lewis tied for 21st overall with a 211 (73-67-71).

Corinna Rees and Victoria Vela both earned invitations to the 2010 tournament. Rees counted a 78 while Vela scored 82 as neither

made the cut. Teammate incoming senior Kelli Shean earned a sponsor's exemption and played Friday and Saturday with rounds of 74-73.

In 2011, sophomore Emily Tubert was granted the exemption to take part. Teammates Victoria Vela and Emma Lavy hoped to join her by advancing through the qualifier.

This year, Tubert again was granted an exemption and Lavy took part in the Monday qualifier.

The Solheim Cup is a biennial golf tournament for professional women golfers contested by teams representing Europe and the United States. It is named for the Norwegian-American golf club manufacturer Karsten Solheim, who was a driving force behind its creation.

The inaugural Cup was held in 1990, and the event was staged in even number years until 2002, alternating years with the Ryder Cup (the equivalent men's event between the USA and Europe). As part of the general reshuffling of team golf events consequent to the one-year postponement of the 2001 Ryder Cup due to 9/11, the Solheim Cup switched to odd numbered years from 2003.

The US team is selected by a points system, with American players on the LPGA Tour receiving points for each top-twenty finish on tour.[1] For the European team, up to 2005, only seven players were selected on a points system based on results on the Ladies European Tour (LET). This allows top European players who compete mainly on the LPGA Tour to be selected to ensure that the European team is competitive. From 2007, only the top five players from the LET will qualify and another four will be selected on the basis of the Women's World Golf Rankings. This reflects the increasing dominance of the LPGA Tour, where almost all top European players spend most of their time.[2] In addition, each team has a number of "captain's picks", players chosen at the discretion of the team captains, regardless of their point standings, though in practice the captain's picks are often the next ranking players.

The Curtis Cup is the best known team trophy for women amateur golfers, awarded in the biennial Curtis Cup Match (not "Matches"). It is co-organized by the United States Golf Association and the Ladies Golf Union and is contested by teams representing the United States and "Great Britain and Ireland". The same two teams originally contested the Ryder Cup, but unlike that competition, the Curtis Cup has not widened the Great Britain and Ireland team to include all Europeans (nor has the analogous event for amateur men, the Walker Cup). Many women who have gone on to become stars of women's professional golf have played in the Curtis Cup.




The United States Women's Open Golf Championship, one of thirteen national championships conducted by the United States Golf Association (USGA), is one of the LP-GA's major championships along with the LPGA Championship, the Women's British Open, and the Kraft Nabisco Championship. It is the only event to have been recognized as a major by the LPGA since its founding in 1950; the other current majors were established later. The U.S.

Women's Open is open to any professional or amateur female golfer. Amateurs must have an up-to-date USGA Handicap Index not exceeding 4.4. Players may obtain a place by being exempt or by competing successfully in qualifying. In 2002, a two stage method of qualification was introduced - 18 holes for local qualifying and 36 holes for sectional qualifying. In 2010, the qualification process reverted to a single sectional stage of 36 holes played on a single day. The criteria for exemption from qualifying has changed through the years. In 2010, there were eleven exemption categories, including winners of the U.S. Women's Open for the last ten years, winners of the other three majors for the last five years, the top 50 from the previous year's LPGA Tour money list, the top five from the previous year's Japan LPGA Tour, Korea LPGA Tour, and Ladies European Tour money lists, and official winners of LPGA co-sponsored events for the 52 week period prior to the U.S. Women's Open.

Stacy Lewis took home another trophy in 2013. Lewis, the No. 2 golfer in the world in the Rolex rankings, won the ESPY award as the top female golfer. Lewis won through a fan vote that ran on ESPN's web site. In 2012, Lewis won four events and had 16 top-ten tournament finishes, and has seven career wins and 47 top-ten finishes.

Stacy Lewis won her third tournament of 2013 and, in the process, stopped Inbee Park's bid to win 4 majors in a row - the Grand Slam. After



But, by winning the Ricoh British Open,

Stacy stopped another streak, by becoming the 1st non-Asian player to win a major since she won the Kraft Nabisco in 2011.

The win also narrowed the gap between the top two players in the world and may be the beginning of another run to the #1 ranking.

Going into the Ricoh Women's British Open, Stacy was feeling pretty good about her chances. After all, she played her last amateur event at St. Andrews at the Curtis Cup, where she made history by achieving a 5-0 won/loss record and leading the US team to a commanding victory. She loved the course then and the Old Course loved her back on this major occasion. And her timing could not be more perfect as she will now lead the US team against the Europeans, this time at the biennial Solheim Cup, to be played in Colorado in two weeks in an effort to win back the Solheim Cup.

Whether it is winning a major for herself, or representing her country against the best golfers in the world, Stacy Lewis is proving time and again that she is the American face of golf and an inspiration for millions around the world.

Shauna Estes-Taylor always knew she wanted to be a women's golf coach. From her playing days as a prepster working with Mike Adams who would go on to become her assistant at Arkansas, through her experiences as one of the best collegiate golfers in the country at the University of Georgia, Estes-Taylor has been preparing for her time in the first chair.

"Arkansas is a special place and I'm excited to lead this program to even greater heights," Estes-Taylor said when hired after five seasons as a Razorback assistant. "This team, community and University are very dear to my heart and I feel fortunate to be a part of this program."

The fourth head coach in program history, Estes-Taylor wasted no time picking up the reigns from mentor, friend and former Bulldog Kelley Hester who returned to her alma mater after five seasons at Arkansas.

As a head coach for the Razorbacks, Estes-Taylor has coached three players to six All-American honors, 11 All-Southeastern Conference selections including the 2008 SEC Golfer of the Year (Stacy Lewis) and the 2011 SEC Co-Freshman of the Year (Emily Tubert) and guided the team to five tournament titles and 12 individual medalist honors.

A BULLDOG TO START

The former Shauna Estes was more than a standout student-athlete at Georgia. She was part of the winning tradition of some of the best collegiate golfers and teams during her four-year career. A four-time All-American and All-SEC player, 50 Estes-Taylor's honors include 1997 SEC Women's Golf Freshman of the Year and the 1997 and 2000 SEC Women's Golf Player of the Year honors. She is still tied

for the most individual wins for the Bulldogs with seven including the 1997 and 1999 SEC title. Estes-Taylor finished a personal-best third at the 1999 NCAA Championship and paced the Bulldogs to four top 10 team appearances on the biggest stage for college golf. Her name remains sprinkled throughout the record books at her alma mater.

A BRIGHT FUTURE

Estes-Taylor left college golf to try her hand on the professional circuit. She spent three seasons playing in the DURAMED Futures Tour, playing in 10 events in 2000, 19 in 2001 and 10 in 2002. She made 22 cuts and had three top 10 finishes.

WOO PIG SOOIE

As her professional playing career came to a close, Estes-Taylor returned to the collegiate ranks in January 2003, becoming Hester's assistant at Arkansas. That season, Arkansas returned to the NCAA Regional Championship making the program's second-ever appearance in the postseason. It would start a run of 10 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances for the Razorbacks.

Another important development in the life of Estes-Taylor and the history of the Razorbacks happened around the same time. The Razorback coaching staff recruited a player from The Woodlands, Texas, named Stacy Lewis.

Lewis had a good junior season but recurring problems with scoliosis (a curvature of the spine) forced the budding star to have back surgery. Despite the seeming career-ending circumstances, the Razorbacks offered and honored their offer to Lewis to come to Arkansas.

Lewis accepted the offer and redshirted her first season with the Razorbacks. It was during this rehab year that Lewis hit the putting green with Estes-Taylor and the duo fine-tuned the short game of the player who would go on to be one of the best to play the game at Arkansas.

Estes-Taylor and Lewis formed a bond that remains to this day. Estes-Taylor was the assistant coach when Lewis won the 2005 SEC Individual title, earned Freshman of the Year honors and for the 2007 NCAA National Title. It was that season that Estes-Taylor earned National Golf Coaches Association Assistant Golf Coach of the Year honors.

"It's an honor to be recognized by other coaches for doing a good job," said Estes-Taylor said at the time. "I really feel prepared to lead a golf team. My goal from the beginning was to gain the experience necessary to become a head coach. Kelley (Hester) has given me this great opportunity to grow as a person and to develop into a coach. I feel this award is another great stepping stone towards my ultimate goal of becoming a head coach."

TAKING OVER

Little did Estes-Taylor know the foreshadowing of her comments. Just two weeks later, she became the head coach of the Razorbacks.

Firmly seated in the first chair, Estes-Taylor reached out to one of her former coaches, Mike Adams, convincing him to leave Hilton Head, S.C., to join her in Fayetteville. It has proven to be a winning combination with the pair guiding Arkansas to six consecutive NCAA Regional appearances including a program-best fourth-place finish in 2011.

Estes-Taylor and Adams have also paced the Razorbacks to four NCAA Championship appearances and again recorded the program's best showing with a tie for fifth place in 2011.

Finally, the tandem has teamed to lead Arkansas to five consecutive top five finishes at the Southeastern Conference Championship (2008-2012) including a program-best second-place finish in 2008 and 2012 and a tie for second in 2009.

PERSONAL

Estes-Taylor was inducted into the NGCA Players Hall of Fame in 2009 capping off a successful season at Arkansas. Born in Orangeburg, S.C., Estes was a 2000 graduate of Georgia with a degree in turf grass management. Estes is married to Adam Taylor of Harrisburg, Ill. Taylor is a sports performance director at the Shoulder Center of Arkansas, and the couple resides in Fayetteville with their bulldogs, Layla and Moe.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT

There really is no limit to what Estes-Taylor expects to accomplish at Arkansas. She has put the Razorbacks on the college golf map and has made Arkansas a destination for the country's elite players. As the 2013-14 season begins, Estes-Taylor welcomes players from four states and two countries to the roster. She has the Razorbacks poised to move up in the rankings, keep the NCAA Regional appearance streak alive and return to the NCAA Championship. Stay tuned and see what's

ASSISTANT COACH MIKE ADAMS



Mike Adams joined the University of Arkansas as the assistant women's golf coach in August 2007.

Since joining the Razorback program, Adams has assisted Arkansas to the top four finishes at the SEC Championship, seven consecutive NCAA Regional appearances and four NCAA Championship appearances including three in a row. He became the second Razorback women's golf assistant to earn NGCA Assistant Coach of the Year when he was honored in 2013. Current head coach Shauna Estes-Taylor who earned the award in her final season as a Razorback assistant in 2007.

Adams began his association with Estes-Taylor as her coach throughout her junior years, her collegiate career and while she was on tour as a professional player.

Prior to joining the Razorbacks, Adams worked five years at the International Junior Golf Academy on Hilton Head Island, S.C., where he was a senior instructor. While there, Adams worked with some of the best instructors in the country. In addition, he helped train some of the best junior golfers from all over the world and several of Adams' former students are currently playing college golf and professional tours.

Before working at the golf academy Adams spent 19 years at the Woodlands Country Club in Columbia, S.C. He served the Woodlands as head golf professional, director of golf and for the final three and a half years as general manager. While at the Woodlands, Adams worked with several members of the University of South Carolina women's golf team who used the Woodlands as their home course.

Adams is a member of the Professional Golfers Association of America, an organization he has been associated with for more than 30 years, and he is a member of the PGA's Quarter Century Club. While in the Carolinas, Adams served on the Carolinas PGA Section Board of Directors and also served on the section's rules and tournament committee.

Adams graduated from Thomas Heyward Academy in Ridgeland South Carolina, and received a bachelor's of science degree in Business Administration from Newberry College in Newberry South Carolina in 1977.

Adams has one son, Michael Adams Junior.

W. STANLEY BEECHAM, PSY.D. SPORTS PSYCHOLOGIST





ics, we will also continue to train mentally to make sure our mental games match our technique. A winning mind set is often times what separates good from great—and we want to be great!



EMMA LAVY

AMATEUR CAREER

Emma Lavy took part in a full schedule of amateur events in the summer before her senior season. Some of the highlights for Lavy included shooting 71 in a qualifier and moving on to the U.S. Women's Amateur. Lavy also reached the round of 16 in the North-South Amateur, recording her best finish at the event.

Lavy reached the round of 32 at the Women's Western Amateur Championship and she made the cut at the North-South Amateur in Pinehurst, N.C. in mid-July, 2012. She also took part in the Monday qualifier at the Walmart NW Arkansas LPGA Championship.

Lavy's 2011 summer was busy filled with three big tournaments on the amateur circuit. Lavy opened the summer at Pinehurst Country Club where she advanced to the second round of the 109th North and South Women's Amateur Championship.

She followed up with a runner-up finish at the 111th Women's Western National Amateur Championship at Sawgrass Country Club in Florida, falling in the 36-hole final. Lavy had a great week on her road to the finals. She qualified 10th with a two-day total of 145 and won her first match against Sarah Ababa, Davao City, The Philippines, 1 up. She defeated Ellen Ceresko, Jefferson Township, Pa., 3 and 1, in the first round of the second day, and her afternoon match was suspended due to weather and completed on Friday morning. Lavy defeated Erica Popson, a University of Tennessee Volunteer from Davenport, Fla., 5 and 4. Later that day she defeated Vanderbilt University senior, Marina Alex, of Wayne, N.J., 2 up; and then defeated Jackie Chang, a University of North Carolina student from Paradise Valley, Ariz., 4 and 3. Lavy finishing tied for eighth overall in the Hooters Women's Collegiate Team Championship wrapping up her summer play.

Lavy had a good summer after redshirting her first year with the Razorbacks. She played in a U.S. Women's Open qualifier and was leading after the first round. Lavy just missed the cut in the qualifier. She reached the quarterfinals of both the Women's North and South Championship and the Women's Trans Invitational.

Lavy had a busy summer after signing with Arkansas. She finished fifth at the American Junior Golf Association event at Traditions with a 77-78-70. She picked up a second-place finish at the AJGA Junior at Blessings with rounds of 76-76-78) and was 28th at the Rolex Junior Girls Championship with 72-77-80. The summer of 2009-10 saw Lavy compete in a couple of events including the 110th Western National Amateur Championship in Rochester, Minn., reaching the Championship Flight of match play.

AS A JUNIOR (2012-13

Lavy continues to grow and improve with each season on the golf course for the Razorbacks. The Fayetteville, Ark., native posted her careerbest single season stroke average with a 74.53 mark this year and had three top 10 finishes for Arkansas. Lavy also shot her career-best with a round of 67 on the first day of the NCAA Regional Championship en route to her best Regional finish, a tie for 11th.

Lavy carded a career-best two-under 214 twice as a junior, first in the season opener at Ole Waverly with rounds of 70-71-73, and again at the Regional Championship where she shot 67-75-72. Lavy had three top 10 finishes with a season-best fifth-place showing at Ole Waverly. She was tied for sixth at the Westbrook Invitational and tied for ninth at the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate. Lavy was a member of the Razorback Athletic Department's Athletic Director's List with a GPA from 3.50-3.99 for the fall 2012 and spring 2013 semesters.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2011-12)

Lavy was one of the most steady members of the lineup for the Razorbacks in 2011-12. She improved her season stroke average from her freshman season and qualified

for all 11 tournaments as a sophomore. Lavy post-

ed a season-best 71 in the

second round of the Lady Puerto Rico Classic and shot a 222 at the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Classic - her second lowest career score. Lavy's scores counted 29 times (in 33 rounds) toward the Razorback team total and her NCAA Regional and NCAA Championship scores counted in each round. Lavy was a member of the Razorback Athletic Department's Athletic Director's List with a GPA from 3.50-3.99 for the spring 2011 semester and a member of the Honor Roll (3.00-3.49) in the fall of 2011.

RAZORBACKS TIE FOR 13TH

University of Arkansas senior Victoria Vela wrapped up her Razorback women's golf career pacing her fifthranked team to a tie for 13th-place finish at the 2013 NCAA Championship in Athens, Ga. Challenging conditions met the Razorbacks out of the gates in the final round with swirling winds that gusted to 20-plus miles per hour. The temperatures crept up and the greens got faster as the round wore on. Arkansas finished the day with a 309 and had rounds of 296-293-302-309 for 1200 overall. Vela was plus-four in the final round leading the team and paced Arkansas for the event, shooting 298 with rounds of 74-71-77-76. Vela finished the tournament tied for 37th overall. Emily Tubert shot 301carding rounds of 75-73-74-79 and freshman Gabriela Lopez shot 74-76-75-77 for 302. Junior Emma Lavy posted 73-78-76-80 for 307 while freshman Regina Plasencia also shot 307 with rounds of 77-73-80-77. Tubert tied for 50th overall and Lopez tied for 58th. Lavy and Plasencia tied for 85th overall.

RAZORBACKS ADVANCE OUT OF EAST REGIONAL

The fifth-ranked University of Arkansas women's golf team tied for third place at the 2013 NCAA East Regional Championship qualifying for the NCAA Championship in Athens, Ga., May 21-24. Arkansas finished with a final round 287 to tie for third place with an 864. The tie for third is the program's best NCAA Regional finish bettering the fourth-place finish two seasons ago. That finish propelled the Razorbacks to the program's sixth NCAA

The Fayetteville, Ark., native shot 214 with rounds of 67-75-72. Junior Emily Tubert and senior Victoria Vela tied for 18th overall shooting 216. Tubert shaved three strokes off her previous rounds shooting a two-under 70 in the second round to go with her 73-73 from the first two days. Vela post-

ed her best-ever NCAA Regional finish and shot 71-73-72 for her 216. Freshman Gabriela Lopez tied for 26th overall with a 218. Lopez carded 72-73-73 in her first-ever collegiate postseason appearance. Freshman Regina Plasencia tied for 60th overall shooting a 225 with 73-75-77 for the Razorbacks.

RAZORBACKS HAVE NINE TOP 5; SIX TOP THREE FINISHES

The Razorback women's golf team posted nine top five finishes, six top three finishes and won one tournament in the 2012-13 season. The fall season saw the Razorbacks finish third twice and tie for fifth in the three-event season.

The Razorbacks opened the spring with back-to-back second place showings at the Puerto Rico Golf Classic and the Westbrook Invitational. In addition, Arkansas had the medalists in both those events with junior Emily Tubert winning in Puerto Rico and freshman Gabriela Lopez picking up the individual title at the Westbrook.

The Razorbacks picked up the team title at the LSU Golf Classic in Baton Rouge, La., March 24. The Razorbacks were 10-stroke winners and led the event wire-to-wire.

THREE RAZORBACKS EARN ALL-SEC HONORS

Emily Tubert, Gabriela Lopez and Regina Plasencia earned All-Southeastern Conference honors for the 2012-13 season.

Tubert, a junior from Burbank, Calif., earned her third consecutive first-team honor. Lopez, a freshman from Mexico City, Mexico, is an All-SEC Second-Team selection. Lopez and freshman Regina Plasencia were also selected to the SEC's All-Freshman team. Tubert had two wins under her belt running her career total to five victories with the Razorbacks. She had five top 10 finishes in 10 events and posted a season-low round 70 three times. Tubert is a two-time National Golf Coaches Association All-Scholar Team selection and has twice earned selection to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Lopez had four top five finishes as a true freshman for the Razorbacks. She picked up her first collegiate win at the Westbrook Invitational shooting a career-best 209 with rounds of 72-70-66. Her final round 66 ties the Arkansas school record for lowest single day score. Lopez and Plasencia were both selected to the SEC All-Freshman team. It is the first time in Razorback program history that Arkansas has had multiple selections.

Plasencia, a Guadalajara, Mexico, native, took part in 11 events as a true freshman. She had a career-best score of 219 twice. Plasencia posted a career-low round of 68 on day two of the Ole Waverley Bulldog Invitational.

ADAMS NAMED NATIONAL ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike Adams earned National Golf Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year the coaches association announced at an awards banquet following the National Championship. Adams joined the University of Arkansas as the assistant women's golf coach in August 2007, but his association with current Arkansas head coach Shauna Estes-Taylor began when he was her coach throughout her junior years, her collegiate career and while she was on tour as a professional player. Since joining the Razorback program, Adams has assisted Arkansas to the top four finishes at the SEC Championship, seven consecutive NCAA Regional appearances and four NCAA Championship appearances including three in a row. He is the second Razorback women's golf assistant to earn NGCA Assistant Coach of the Year, Estes-Taylor who earned the award in her final season as a Razorback assistant in 2007.

VELA NAMED TO SEC COMMUNITY SERVICE TEAM

Victoria Vela was selected to the Southeastern Conference's Community Service Team in 2012-13. Vela was one of 14 student-athletes selected and is the 10th Razorback women's golfer selected since the award began in 2003-04. Some of Vela's community service activities this year include volunteering with the Book Hogs Read To Win Program, the Sweat Hawgs Physical Fitness Program, Special Olympics and the Richardson Center Helping the Homeless. Vela participated in Feeding My Starving Children, the SEC Together We CAN Food Drive, the Jingle Bell 5K Run for Rheumatoid Arthritis and Lift Up America. The Mansfield, Texas, native is a three-time selection to the National Golf Coaches Association All-Scholar Team and a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll as well as a member of the Arkansas honor roll every semester of her collegiate career. This season, she paced the No. 5 Razorbacks to a tie for 13th at the NCAA Championship. Vela tied for 37th overall shooting a 298 with a 71 in the second round. She finished the year with a personal best 74.81 stroke average and played in 41 tournaments over her four-year career. Vela graduated in May with a degree in business.

ARKANSAS FINISHES STRONG AT SECS

Junior Emily Tubert tied for third place leading the No. 6 Razorbacks to a tie for seventh place at the 2013 SEC in Birmingham, Ala. The Razorbacks shot a 302 – their best score of the weekend to finish with a 923 (313-308-302).

Tubert opened play hitting her tee shot off of one within eight inches of the pin. She sank the birdie putt and seemed to be in good shape. The Burbank, Calif., native had to drop on the second hole when her approach rolled off the fast and steep green near the edge of the water. She was unable to hit her ball as it was lying up against a thicket of flowers. She dropped, chipped up near the pin and saved the hole with a par.

Her luck ran out on the third hole where she ran into water and doubled the hole as the Greystone course again proved difficult. But Tubert settled in playing even par golf for the final 13 holes including a birdie on the 18th hole. Tubert finished with a final round 76.

Senior Victoria Vela made the turn at one-over for the Razorbacks. She opened with eight consecutive pars before a plus-one on the par four ninth hole. Her tee shot was to the middle of the fairway but her second shot was short of the green giving her a tough up-and-down.

The Mansfield, Texas, native rallied on the 10th hole with a birdie returning back to even for her round. She would pick up bogeys on the 13th and 18th holes. The final hole continued to be tricky all weekend as her approach rolled off the side on the fast green.

Despite the scores, Arkansas rallied late in Sunday's round playing the final five holes one-under to wrap up play. Freshman Gabriela Lopez had a solid start to the day. She shot even on the first four holes and the last four holes before the turn. The lone blemish was a bogey on the long par five fifth hole. Lopez finished her round four over with four bogeys in the first six holes on the back side. She rallied with a birdie on the 18th shooting 76 for the round.



Freshman Regina Plasencia turned at two-over for Arkansas. She birdied her first hole but struggled with three consecutive bogeys on five, six and seven. She got one back on the par four eighth hole with a three before the turn. Three quick bogeys on the back nine gave way to four pars and a birdie on the 18th as she also finished with a four-over 76.

Junior Emma Lavy bogeyed the second and sixth holes but got one back on the eighth and was in good shape heading into the turn before the ninth hole saw her count a high number and she moved to four-over for the day. She also played the final nine holes even for a 76 in the final round.



The fifth-ranked University of Arkansas women's golf team tied for third place at the 2013 NCAA East Regional Championship qualifying for the NCAA Championship in Athens, Ga., May 21-24.

Arkansas finished with a final round 287 to tie for third place with an 864. The tie for third is the program's best NCAA Regional finish bettering the fourth-place finish two seasons ago. This will be the sixth NCAA Championship team appearance in program history and the third consecutive for the Razorbacks.

"Obviously we are excited to advance," Arkansas head coach Shauna Estes-Taylor said. "It was a tough round of golf in what I consider one of the most tense rounds of golf all year. This group had a calm



about them all week that I felt so at peace about. It is really just taking one step at a time on the journey to get to Athens. They just really performed at a high level. We did a fantastic job coming down the stretch. We started strong and finished strong."

Also qualifying out of the NCAA East Regional is No. 2 Alabama with an 844, No. 20 Tulane with 852, Arkansas and No. 17 Oklahoma State with an 864, No. 23 Texas with 871, No. 29 Northwestern with 874, No. 8 UCLA with 875 and No. 42 Auburn with 877.

Emma Lavy paced Arkansas and finished tied for 11th overall. The Fayetteville, Ark., native


HISTORIC SENIOR WALK

As you make your way around campus, you're sure to notice something unique about many of the sidewalks. Historic Senior Walk showcases the names of more than 150,000 University of Arkansas graduates, grouped by year of graduation. Senior Walk is the university's longest tradition in both length and years. It's concrete proof of

the university's commitment to students.

Senior Walk is also a perfect example of how the University of Arkansas celebrates its history and traditions while focusing on innovations for the future. When the costs involved in handetching names into concrete forced numerous other universities to give up, the U of A turned to its physical plant and engineering school grads

to create a one-of-a-kind computerized sandblasting machine: the SandHog. Each summer, the SandHog roars across campus etching the names of new graduates into sidewalks.



BEYOND CAMPUS

OLD MAIN

One of the original buildings on Arkansas' campus, Old Main symbolizes the strong connection to the past and the focus upon the future which come together in the present at the University of Arkansas. Completed in 1875, Old Main stood the test of time until the mid-1980s when age and modern building codes threatened to send it to the wrecking ball as had happened to its sister building at the University of Illinois. A major fund-raising campaign by alumni totally renovated Old Main. Reopening in 1992, the building maintains the feel of a Victorian-era building with high ceilings and elaborate wooden trim. Just below the surface of the period hardwood floors, Old Main is hard-wired to the internet and built to last well into its second century.

Even with renovation, Old Main remained unfinished until 2005. One of the gifts during the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century specified the installation of a clock, originally planned for the blank faces of the south tower.

As mentioned, Old Main was built from shared plans with its counterpart on the Illinois campus, with one important difference. The north tower of Arkansas' Old Main is taller than the south tower. Legend says this was symbolic of the Civil War as the lead engineer was a northern veteran.







CHANCELLOR



Chancellor Dr. G. David Gearhart

Dr. G. David Gearhart became the chancellor of the University of Arkansas on July 1, 2008. Before that he served for 10 years as vice chancellor for university advancement. In that position he oversaw the most successful capital campaign in Arkansas history, the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century, which raised more than \$1 billion. The Campaign transformed the U of A in many ways including substantial increases in faculty fellowships and student scholarships, as well as major capital improvements, and the creation of the Honors College.

As Chancellor, Dr. Gearhart implemented a \$243 million campus building renovation and refurbishment plan, as well as a campus-wide energy savings plan. Dr. Gearhart also developed a major cost savings program that has already resulted in \$62 million in cost reduction and savings for the flagship campus since 2009. Campus enrollment has also grown by nearly 6,000 students in the past five years and the fall 2013 enrollment is expected to exceed 25,000 students for the first time in school history. At the same time, diversity in the student body has increased significantly.

A Fayetteville native, Dr. Gearhart received his bachelor of arts degree from Westminster College in Missouri. He earned his law degree and his doctor of education degree at the University of Arkansas.

Before joining the U of A administration he served as senior vice president of Penn State University, during which time he was named a Fulbright Scholar, studying at Oxford University in Oxford, England. He and his wife Jane have been married for 38 years and have two children and three grandchildren.

DR. SHARON HUNT

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

Chancellor G. David Gearhart appointed Dr. Sharon Hunt to be the faculty athletics representative (FAR) for the University of Arkansas in August 2010.

Dr. Hunt is the first woman and non-lawyer to hold the post. Dr. Hunt has been on the University of Arkansas faculty since 1990, and she served as the department head of the recently renamed Department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation from July 1,1990 until June 30, 2011 except for the 2000-01 academic year, when she served as the interim dean of the College of Education and Health Professions On June 30, 2011 Dr. Hunt stepped down as department head and returned to the faculty at the rank of Professor giving her more time to devote to the FAR position.

A high school athlete, Hunt's involvement with collegiate athletics dates back to her own college days at the University of Arkansas when she played extramural sports with the women's basketball and tennis teams prior to the enactment of Title IX. After receiving her bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education from the university, she went on to earn a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Georgia, where she taught a variety of undergraduate courses as a graduate assistant. Upon the completion of her doctoral degree, she joined the faculty of the University of Kentucky for 13 years, where she taught both undergraduate and graduate courses and served as the graduate coordinator for the Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation. In 1990, she and her family returned to Fayetteville.

The FAR's responsibilities lie in three broad areas: academic integrity within the athletics program, student-athlete well-being, and institutional control of the athletics program. Dr. Hunt is involved in the student-athlete advisory council on campus and chairs the Academic Credential Review Committee and Athletic's Academic Integrity Committee, and serves as an ex-officio member of the Faculty Athletics Committee. In addition, she travels to represent the University of Arkansas at various SEC and NCAA meetings.

Dr. Hunt was instrumental in establishing the graduate athletic training education program in the College of Education and Health Professions, and she has worked closely with athletics on that program. The athletics department provides support to students in the athletic training education program in the form of a stipend, books and travel to the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association annual meeting. Two endowed scholarships for athletic training students in honor of longtime Razorback trainers Dean Weber and the late Bill Ferrell were established through the athletics department. Dr. 152 Hunt has been married to David Hunt since 1973, and they have an adult son and daughter as well as one grandson and granddaughter.

VICE CHANCELLOR AND DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Entering his sixth full year as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics, Jeff Long has helped transform the University of Arkansas' Department of Intercollegiate Athletics into one of the most successful and nationally respected programs in the country. Along the way, Long has gained national attention and earned numerous awards for his progressive leadership of a program encompassing 19 sports and more than 460 student-athletes.

Long leads a comprehensive athletics program committed to the development of student-athletes academically, athletically and socially. A member of Chancellor G. David Gearhart's Executive Committee, Long is helping to chart the course for the future of higher education at the University of Arkansas while integrating Razorback Athletics into the campus community.

Long's leadership and unwavering commitment to the student-athletes and maintaining integrity within intercollegiate athletics has not gone unnoticed. In 2013, Long was named as an Under Armour Athletics Director of the Year for the Football Bowl Subdivision. In 2012, Long was named a finalist for the *SportsBusiness Journal* and *SportsBusiness Daily* Athletic Director of the Year. In the spring of 2012, the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation and longtime chairman Fred W. Smith made a combined gift of more than \$1.25 million to the program in recognition of Long's leadership of Razorback Athletics.

In each of the past four years, Razorback Athletics has transferred funds totaling more than \$1 million to support the university's academic mission. The department's total support of university and student programs and initiatives includes \$1.9 million in direct funding of academic programs. In 2012, Razorback Athletics committed an additional \$1.2 million annually to help fund a new classroom and laboratory building to serve the entire University of Arkansas student population.

In Long's tenure, Arkansas has captured 15 conference championships and advanced to 81 post-season competitions, including the school's first Bowl Championship Series appearance in football and a national title at the 2013 NCAA Men's Indoor Track and Field Championships. In 2012-13, Arkansas finished No. 23 in the Learfield Sports Directors Cup, a year-long competition ranking the nation's most successful intercollegiate athletic programs, marking the fifth time in the past six years the Razorbacks have finished in the top 25.

In the classroom, the Razorbacks continue to set new standards including posting a school record student-athlete grade point average of 3.09 in 2012-13. It marked the fifth consecutive year Razorback student-athletes posted a GPA exceeding 3.0. In 2013, for the first time in history, Arkansas exceeded the national APR multi-year rate in all 19 sports and had a record ive teams earn NCAA Public Recognition awards. Graduation success rates continue to rise with a total of 94 current or former Razorback student-athletes graduating in 2012-13.

Student-athlete development has also been a priority including the establishment of the Razorback Leadership Academy, the first of its kind in the Southeastern Conference. In the community, Razorback student-athletes are more active than ever volunteering more than 6,500 hours of time for more various agencies, organizations and schools around the state.

One of the nation's most active athletic directors on Twitter, Long embraces the opportunity to interact with members of the Razorback Nation whether in person or through social media.

Long was selected to replace legendary athletic director and former Razorback football coach Frank Broyles and even before he officially took the reins on Jan. 1, 2008, Arkansas announced that it would combine its previously independent men's and women's athletic programs into one combined athletic program. Long adeptly blended the men's and women's athletic departments into one unified department and established a new administrative structure.

Long has also worked tirelessly to maintain long-time relationships and to forge new relationships for the benefit of the Razorback program including extending Arkansas' relationship with War Memorial Stadium and partnering with former Razorback Jerry

Jones to develop the Southwest Classic, a football series with Texas A&M played at the spectacular Cowboys Stadium.

Under Long's leadership, the program has fortified its financial standing ensuring more support for the development of student-athletes. According to USA Today, Arkansas is one of only 23 financially self-sustaining Division I-A athletic programs in the nation.

As economic indicators were beginning to point toward challenging economic times, Long signed Arkansas to a deal with IMG College to form Razorback Sports Properties that guarantees the Razorback program \$73 million during the course of the decade-long agreement.

Long also negotiated an extensive all sports apparel and footwear agreement with NIKE, Inc. that will outfit all 19 Razorback sports programs through the 2014-15 season. In December 2012, Forbes Magazine estimated the value of the Razorback Football program at \$83

million, ranking the University of Arkansas in the top 10 nationally for the second consecutive year.

In 2010, Long moved to help meet the growing financial needs of fielding a nationally competitive all sports program. The athletic department launched the "Answer the Call" campaign through the Razorback Foundation which resulted in more than 2,600 new members and helped generate more than \$6.5 million in additional support for Razorback student-athletes. In 2012, Long guided the program to a record breaking fundraising year further bolstering Arkansas' financial strength.

With an eye towards the future, Long commissioned a comprehensive plan to assess the future facility needs of the program. Unveiled in October 2011, the Razorback Athletic Facilities Master Plan provided a vision and the road map for \$320 million of facility renovations and additions that will help all 19 Razorback sports remain competitive in the Southeastern Conference and nationally over the next 30 years. The first major project from the master plan, the \$40 million Fred W. Smith Football Center, opened in the summer of 2013. Three other facilities, a Student-Athlete Success Center, a basketball indoor practice facility and a baseball and track indoor training facility have all been approved and are moving forward to construction. As part of the next step in the plan, a market and cost analysis study is being conducted on a potential north end zone expansion to Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

According to a recent economic impact study, Razorback Athletics will have an estimated economic impact of more than \$1 billion in the next five years. The study estimated that Razorback Athletics generates \$153.6 million annually to the region's economy including the benefits of drawing more than a million fans annually to campus to cheer on the Razorbacks. Planned athletic construction during the course of the next five years will generate another \$239.7 million.

A veteran administrator with a track record of the highest commitment to the concept of "student-athlete," Long has had more than two decades of experience in athletic administration at the Division

I level including at the University of Pittsburgh, University of Oklahoma, University of Michigan, Virginia Tech University, Eastern Kentucky University and Rice University. Long also understands the coach's perspective from time spent in coaching staff positions at Duke University, University of Michigan and North Carolina State University.

His experience as an athletic director and administrator in five of the six Bowl Championship Series conferences – the Big 12, Big Ten, Big East, Atlantic Coast and SEC - gives Long a uniquely informed perspective on intercollegiate athletics.





On the forefront of NCAA governance, Long has served on the NCAA Management Council, the NCAA's Sports Wagering Task Force and as a member of the Executive Committee of the Division I-A Athletic Directors' Association. Long currently serves on the NCAA Championships/Sports Management Cabinet.

Prior to assuming his current roles at Arkansas, Long served for four years as the athletic director at the University of Pittsburgh. Long redefined Pitt athletics, most notably through the "Quest for Excellence" campaign that raised nearly \$34 million to enhance the student-athlete experience. During his tenure the Panthers' were selected as the No. 17 overall program in the nation in the December 2006 Sports Illustrated on Campus' All-Sport Rankings.

Before arriving at Pitt, Long was senior associate athletic director at Oklahoma for two and a half years overseeing external affairs for the Sooners. In addition, Long was the primary administrator for the Sooners' highly successful football and men's basketball programs, along with sport supervision of baseball, wrestling and both golf teams.

Long's first appointment as a director of athletics was at Eastern Kentucky where he served for two and a half years. Prior to Eastern, Long had a brief stay with Virginia Tech as an associate athletics director.

He began his career in college athletic administration at Michigan, hired by legendary coach and athletics director, the late Bo Schembechler. During his seasons with the Wolverines, Long was promoted through a series of posts to the position of associate athletics director.

A former two-sport athlete at Ohio Wesleyan, Long earned seven varsity letters for the Bishops in football and baseball before completing his degree in economics in 1982. He started his post-graduate career in athletics working on head coach Tom Reed's staff as a graduate assistant football coach at the cradle of coaches, Miami University of Ohio. Long earned his master's in education at Miami in 1983, moving on to football staff positions at Rice, Duke and N.C. State prior to joining Michigan.

An Ohio native from Kettering, Long is married to the former Fanny Gellrich of Ann Arbor, Mich. The Longs have two daughters, Stephanie and Christina.

BEV LEWIS

Associate Vice Chancellor & Executive Associate Athletic Director

Bev Lewis has served the University of Arkansas and its Razorback athletic programs for more than three decades.

The former women's athletic director prior to the department merger in 2007-08, Lewis now serves as the associate vice chancellor and executive associate athletic director.

Lewis is the coordinator of a five-member sport administrator group that provides day-today administrative support for each of Arkansas' sports. Lewis is the sport administrator for men's and women's cross country, men's and women's track and field, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, softball and volleyball. In addition, Lewis oversees and coordinates the Razorback Performance Team, including the strength and conditioning, nutrition, psychology, athletic training and sports medicine programs. She also serves as a liaison to the faculty senate and the faculty athletic committee, and coordinates the department's Title IX compliance and strategic planning as well as assists with fundraising.

The largest portion of her service to the university was her 19-year tenure as the Director of Women's Athletics. As a result of her strong emphasis on the classroom, Razorback female student-athletes received numerous academic honors including national academic All-American of the year, team academic national titles and the university's first two SEC/H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year. To increase athletic participation for women at Arkansas, she also oversaw the addition of four sports at the university turning her tenure-volleyball, golf, gymnastics and softball and each team went on to become nationally competitive.

Her leadership was also a part of the success of the university's Campaign for the Twenty-First Century. Lewis directed Women's Athletics to over \$11.5 million in direct support for women's teams. During the campaign, Lewis received one of her greatest personal honors as Bob and Marilyn Bogle requested that Arkansas' new facility be named the Bev Lewis Center for Women's Áthletics. In 1998, she was voted into the University Of Arkansas Hall Of Honor.

Lewis served collegiate athletics at the highest level as an administrator, as a member of the NCAA Management Council, the NCAA Championship Cabinet and the Southeastern Conference Executive Committee. Prior to assuming the duties of AD, Lewis was women's cross country and track coach. Her Arkansas coaching milestones included the first women's team to achieve a national ranking, first team ranked in the top 10 and the first women's team

to win a conference championship.

Lewis earned her bachelor's degree from Central Michigan in 1979 and followed it with her master's from Purdue prior to her arrival at Arkansas in 1981. The former Bev Rouse is married to Harley Lewis.



JON FAGG

Senior Associate Athletic Director Administration and Governance

Jon Fagg joined the University of Arkansas in June of 2008. He is a member of the senior management group and assists the Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics in the daily administration of the department. Fagg serves as the sport administrator for football and men's basketball. He also has oversight of the university's compliance program and Office of Student-Athlete Success, which encompasses academic support, student-athlete development and career development services for Razorback student-athletes.

Fagg came to Arkansas after spending seven years at North Carolina State. Hired in March 2001, he served four and half years as an assistant athletics director for compliance before being promoted to associate athletics director for compliance in the fall of 2005. While with the Wolfpack, Fagg's responsibilities included coordinating all aspects of the NCAA compliance program, including rules education for intercollegiate staff and related university personnel, and advisement, education and interpretations regarding NCAA rules and regulations. He also served as sport administrator for the wrestling and women's soccer programs.

Prior to his tenure at North Carolina State, Fagg spent three years as the assistant athletics director for compliance at Fresno State. He also served one year as director of compliance for the Big South Conference. His first athletics administrative experience came at Mars Hill College where he handled compliance duties as well as serving as an assistant coach for the football team for three seasons. His coaching experience also includes a stint as an assistant coach at Davidson from February 1992 to June 1993 and as a GA coach at his alma mater, the University of Arizona, from January 1991 to February 1992.

Fagg and his wife Amanda have three children: Jon Madison and twins, Reed and Ellie.



MATT TRANTHAM

Senior Associate Athletic Director for **Internal Operations**

Matt Trantham joined the University of Arkansas in 2008 as the senior associate athletic director for internal operations. He oversees all Razorback facilities and events.

With this role, Trantham has overseen the Razorback Athletics Facilities Master Plan recently unveiled in October 2011. Additionally he serves as administrative supervisor for the new Fred W. Smith Football Center completed during the Summer of 2013. Additional projects forthcoming as part of the Master Plan will be a Student-Athlete Success Center, a basketball practice facility and a baseball and track indoor training facility with design/constructions teams recently approved by the Board of Trustees in Sept. 2012.

He is also facilitating the current Market and Cost Analysis on a future expansion of the North End Zone in Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium. Other projects supervised have been the \$2.5 million renovation of Bud Walton Arena in 2008, the \$1.3 million installation of synthetic playing surface and \$1.2 million installation of ribbon boards at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback stadium in 2009, expansion of Razorback soccer team facilities

in 2011 and \$4.6 million installation of new video displays at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback stadium prior to the 2012 season. Prior to joining Arkansas, Trantham began his career with the University of Oklahoma in July 1999 as the promotions director for the athletic department where he worked with all 20 of OU's teams. He was named assistant athletic director for event management in 2004 and was promoted to associate athletic director in 2006.

He is also a past recipient of the College Athletic Business Manager of the Year Award, and was recognized within the State of Arkansas in 2011 as one of Northwest Arkansas' Top Forty Under 40. Hamilton also serves on the Board of Directors for the Walton Arts Center Foundation.

Entering her 29th year with the University of Arkansas, Tracey Mays Stehlik serves as the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance for Razorback Athletics. In addition, she is a member of the sport administrator's group, overseeing women's basketball, men's and women's tennis and swimming and diving.

Stehlik began her career as an assistant women's basketball coach with the Razorbacks and was a part of the staff that won the only women's hoops conference championships at Arkansas. As an assistant coach, she recruited some of the greatest players in UA history, including former All-American Delmonica DeHorney, and helped lead Arkansas to backto-back Southwest Conference titles.

She left the court and moved into athletic administration in 1995 and was promoted to associate athletic director for compliance in 1997. Stehlik's duties included the oversight of compliance, eligibility, academics and event management for the then-separate women's athletics department. Among her numerous areas of responsibility, Stehlik has served as the meet director for several SEC and NCAA events, including the NCAA Indoor Championships from 2003 to 2008, and the 2009 NCAA Gymnastics Regional meet. Stehlik moved into her current role when the Razorback Athletic Departments unified in 2008. As the associate athletic director for compliance, Stehlik is responsible for the oversight of all areas of compliance including eligibility, financial aid and the studentathlete opportunity fund. ZACK HIGBEEAssistant AD for Media Relations

Zack Higbee is in his fifth year at the University of Arkansas. Higbee joined the Razorback staff in January of 2009 as Associate Director of Media Relations. In August of 2010, he was promoted to Director of Football Media Relations and he was elevated again to his current position in February of 2013.

Previously, he worked at Florida, UConn and Oklahoma.

Higbee's role includes media relations office oversight and he oversees media relations

operations for the Razorback football program as well as serving as the primary media contact for the athletic department. In his media relations career, Higbee successfully promoted the first underclassman ever to win the Heisman Trophy as well as winners of the Maxwell Award (2007 and 2008), Sullivan Award (2007), Davey O'Brien Award (2007), ESPY for Best Male College Athlete (2007 and 2008), Manning Award (2008), Disney Spirit Award (2008 and 2010), Mackey Award (2010) and the inaugural Johnny Rodgers Award (2011). He has also been one of the primary contacts for football teams that have appeared

in three BCS games including the 2007 and 2009 BCS National Championship Games and the 2011 Sugar Bowl.

Higbee joined the Razorbacks after working the previous six and a half years as one of the primary football contacts at the University of Florida. While at Florida, Higbee coordinated the football game-day operations for the media relations office. His duties included press box set up, supervising gameday staff, production of notes packages and post-game press conference management.

Prior to working with the Gators, Higbee served as the assistant director of athletic communications at Connecticut. While with the Huskies, he was the second media contact for the 2002 Big East regular season and tournament champion men's basketball team as well as for football.

Assistant AD for Facilities

Justin Maland joined the Razorbacks in 1999, moving into the assistant athletic director position in 2006. His areas of responsibility include oversight of all Razorback athletic facilities, including budgeting, game day operations, scheduling, upkeep, maintenance, long-range planning, daily facility operations, contracting services with outside vendors and coordination of special events.

Maland supervises a staff whose responsibilities include custodial and housekeeping, buildings, grounds and other service areas and oversees external events and facility operations on campus.

As Arkansas Athletics continues its growth and development, so to do Maland's duties. He is currently working on the construction oversight of the Fred W. Smith Football Center scheduled for completion in the late summer 2013. In addition, Maland is overseeing the planning and design phase of several other construction projects outlined in the Razorback Athletics Department's Master Plan including an academic and dining center, track plaza expansion, basketball practice facility and the addition of seating in the football stadium.

Maland recently completed several renovations and upgrades to the video and ribbon boards for football and baseball as well as updates to the men's and women's basketball locker rooms.

The Harrison, Ark., native and former college student-athlete provides management services in all athletic facility renovation projects and construction management of all new projects including the state-of-the-art Fred W. Smith Football Center, part of the Athletic Department's Master Plan. One of Maland's recent projects is the installation of the new videoboard for Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Maland is a 1999 graduate of Hendrix College and earned his master's degree in sports management at Arkansas in 2001.

MARK SCOBEY
Assistant AD for Ticket Operations

Charged with the supervision of ticket operations for all University of Arkansas Athletic department-related sporting events, Mark Scobey is in his 36th season with the Razorbacks. He was promoted to Assistant AD for Ticket Operations in August 2012.

During his tenure at the University of Arkansas, Scobey has assisted with ticket sales for a wide assortment of events on the Fayetteville campus, including SEC and NCAA championship events in baseball, softball, gymnastics, tennis and track. He has also been affiliated with 20 postseason football bowl games, the 1995, 2002 and 2006 SEC football championship games, and 23 postseason basketball tournament teams, including the 1978, 1990, 1994 and 1995 Final Four clubs.

In December 2011, Scobey began the transition with Paciolan Systems, Inc., to help implement Razorback E-Tickets, a new digital ticketing system for athletic events. The user friendly system allows fans to print their tickets at home and transfer their tickets to a friend when they cannot attend an event. The system is being used again this year for baseball at Baum Stadium, football at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium and basketball at Bud Walton Arena. The addition of on-line ticket sales is now 65% of ticket volume.

Scobey joined the UA athletic staff in 1977 as an assistant athletic ticket manager and became ticket manager in 1983. A native of Warren, Ark., Scobey lives in historic Eureka Springs.

TRADITIONS



A MASCOT LIKE NO OTHER

The wild hogs known as razorbacks native to the Arkansas wilderness bear no resemblance to the typical barnyard pig of today. The untamed razorback hog was a lean, feral animal that was ill-tempered. It fought and defeated anything that crossed its path, man or beast. Turn of the 20th century outdoor magazines lauded the razorback as "the most intelligent of all the hogs and is likewise the most courageous. . . . He has a clear, farseeing eye."

Except for the rare sighting in the Australian Outback, the Razorback only exists today in the form of Arkansas' players and fans. A Russian boar, which closely resembles the wild hog of Hugo Bezdek's day, currently serves as the official live mascot.

Tusk III is cared for by the Stokes family of Dardanelle, Ark., and travels to home games and special events for the Razorbacks. Tusk III is supported by the legacy program known as the Tusk Fund, and fans can participate by sending their support care of the Razorback Foundation, Inc. Tusk III made his debut in 2010 after the unexpected passing of his brother, Tusk II, following Arkansas' AutoZone Liberty Bowl win over ECU in January.

While yearbook references as early as 1914 of a hog on the sideline at football games, a formal live mascot prior to the Tusk line dates back to the 1960s with a series of hogs that represented Arkansas. In addition to appearances at games, they have gained a reputation for fierce behavior.

Big Red III escaped from an exhibit near Eureka Springs in the summer of 1977 and ravaged the countryside before being gunned down by an irate farmer. Another live mascot, Ragnar, was a wild hog captured in south Arkansas by Leola farmer Bill Robinson. Before Ragnar's spree was done, the mighty animal had killed a coyote, a 450-pound domestic pig and seven rattlesnakes. Ragnar died in 1978 of unknown causes.

THE HOG HAT

It is true; no Razorback fan's closet is complete without an official Hog Hat. The original style was a hard plastic hat with a long snout, rough razorback ridges across the top and wickedly sharp, pointed curly-cue tail. The modern versions are often sculpted from softer material. Regardless, the Hog Hat is undoubt-

edly the most recognized piece of fan apparel in college athletics. Just ask ESPN GameDay's Kirk Herbstreit as he dons the traditional Hog Hat.

WHY RAZORBACKS?

Arkansas' athletic teams have not always been called the Razorbacks. During the early years of its athletic history, the Cardinal served as the University nickname.

A lot of things changed in 1909, however, when Arkansas football coach Hugo Bezdek called his players "a wild band of Razorback hogs," after guiding his team to a 16-0 victory over Louisiana State on October 30, 1909.

Alluding to the Razorback, characterized by a ridge back and tenacious, wild fighting ability, Bezdek never forgot this idea and often called his team "a fighting band of Razorbacks."

This new nickname became increasingly popular and the student body voted to change the official University mascot from the Cardinal to the Razorbacks in 1910.

In the 1920s, "Wooo, Pig, Sooie" was added as the school yell, referred to more commonly as the "Hog Call."

There are dozens of Lions, Tigers and Bears, but in all of college a t h l e t i c s there is only one Razorback. The distinctive logo of the Arkansas teams is officially known as the Profile Hog, but is known to many fans as the Helmet Hog -- a fixture of the football team's helmet for almost half a century.

A PROPER HOG CALL

A chant of "Woo Pig Sooie" is known worldwide as a Hog Call. Just like any good tradition, there are lots of versions of the Hog Call (even spellings).

A properly executed Hog Call is composed of three "calls," slowly raising one's arms from the knees to above the head during the "Woo." Traditionalists prescribe an eight second "Woo." The fingers should be wiggled and the "Woo" should build in volume and pitch as the arms rise.

Upon completion of the "Woo," both arms are brought straight down with fists clinched as if executing a chin-up while yelling, "Pig". The right arm is extended up and out with the "Sooie."

A full Hog Call -- the kind one will always

hear victorious Razorback teams execute after contests -- requires two more Hog Calls, followed immediately by a "Razor-Backs" yell, coordinated with a pumping motion of the right arm after the third "Sooie." So, in order, the full Hog Call is:

Wooooooo. Pig. Sooie! Woooooooo. Pig. Sooie! Wooooooo. Pig. Sooie! Razorbacks!

ARKANSAS FIGHT

One of the first tasks of a new Razorback is learning to sing the University of Arkansas fight song. Arkansas Fight was written in the late 1920s. It is a unique tune, fitting of the only college in America with a Razorback mascot. Several other colleges have adapted the tune, but the lyrics remain unique to Arkansas.

Hit that line! Hit that line!
Keep on going!
Take that ball right
down the field!
Give a cheer. Rah! Rah!
Never fear. Rah! Rah!
Arkansas will never yield!
On your toes, Razorbacks,
to the finish,
Carry on with all your might!
For it's A-A-A-R-K-A-N-S-A-S
for Arkansas!
Fight! Fight! Fi-i-i-ight!

RAZORBACK SPIRIT SQUADS

Along with being a Razorback, serving as a Razorback cheerleader has a long tradition at the University of Arkansas. Currently, the Razorbacks have two squads, a Red and White, that inspire the crowds at all home sporting events.

Arkansas also has a dance team, the Razorback Pom Squad, which performs at halftime of many events. Members of the Pom Squad also serve at baseball games as RBI Girls. Arkansas has a team of uniformed mascots, led by the original Big Red, the Fighting Razorback. Sue E. joined the family along with kid-sized Pork Chop in the late 1990s. Boss Hog is a 9-foot-tall inflatable mascot that rounds out the team.

Jean Nail serves as the coordinator for cheerleaders and mascots.

THE UA ALMA MATER

Brodie Payne and Henry Tovey wrote the University of Arkansas Alma Mater in the early 1900s. They were inspired by the Ozark Mountain sunrise as it illuminated Old Main.

Pure as the dawn on the brow of thy beauty, Watches thy Soul

from the mountains of God.

Over the fates of thy children departed,
Far from the land

where their footsteps have trod.
Beacon of hope in the ways dreary lighted,
Pride of our hearts that are loyal and true.
From those who adore unto one who
adores us.

Mother of Mothers, we sing unto you.
