
## 1992 ARKANSAS RECAP

The 1992 baseball season was one of both beginnings and endings as the Hogs competed for the first time in the Southeastern Conference and also said goodbye to a pair of outstanding seniors.

Arkansas finished at 31-26 overall, 10-13 in the SEC Western Division and qualified for the league tournament after a third-place finish in the division. The Hogs were in second place at the midpoint of the conference season and then clinched third place on the regular season's final day.

Among the highlights were victories over Georgia (1-0) in Arkansas' first SEC game ever and over then-number oneranked Wichita State, (5-4) a win that broke the Shockers' 41-game home winning streak. Junior righthander Brian Cook, who pitched the shutout over Georgia, set a team mark by throwing 27 and one-thirds consecutive scoreless innings in March. Norm DeBrivn became the 18th head coach in the nation to win 800 career games when Arkansas defeated Tennessee 1-0 on March 14th.

Seniors Scott Epps and Tim Thomas concluded their careers as Razorbacks and provided a young team with leadership.

Epps, Arkansas' starting catcher, led the Hogs in a number of categories. He was tops in batting average (.335), hits (73), home runs (10), total bases (122) while gunning down 23 of 52 would-be base stealers. He capped his season with a selection to the SEC All-Tournament team after going seven-for-12.

Thomas provided outstanding play on the defensive side as he led conference second baseman with a .981 fielding mark and was in on 51 double plays in the pivot. Thomas, along with shortstop Jeff Houck and first baseman Brian Walker were leaders at their individual positions as the Hogs compiled the highest fielding mark (.971) in the SEC.

Sophomore third sacker Allen Williams was a second-team allconference selection in his first season as a starter, while eleven other Razorbacks lettered in their

Arkansas opened its 69th baseball season with a 12-1 win over Missouri Southern as Brent Birch picked up the win. The Razorbacks would go 11-3 in a season opening 14-game homestand, including a seven-game win streak heading into the first road trip of the year.

first seasons in Fayetteville.

That road trip saw the Hogs participate in a domed stadium for the first time in school history in the Seal College Baseball Classic in Seattle's Kingdome. The Hogs split four games. Highlighting the tourney was junior Brian Cook's 1-0 shutout over



Tennessee and Ty Bilderback's first collegiate home run.

Following the tournament was a three-game losing streak as the Hogs headed to Athens, Ga., for their first conference series. Once again it was Cook throwing a 1-0 shutout as he set the tone for the Hogs in sweeping Georgia to open SEC play.

The Hogs would climb to 7-4 in league play after four weeks as they took two of three at home from South Carolina and Auburn and lost two of three at Kentucky. The Hogs reached their highest national ranking of 24th in Collegiate Baseball's Top 25 and were 23-15 overall.


Arkansas knew that playing on the road in the SEC would be difficult and it was never more evident than a two-week road swing as the Hogs were swept at both LSU and Mississippi State. Arkansas was outscored 44-18 in the six games and dropped to fourth place in the SEC Western Division.

The Razorbacks came home to battle Alabama, but the guests handed Arkansas its eight and ninth straight league losses in sweeping a Saturday doubleheader. Allen Williams led off Sunday's single game with a home run as the Hogs rebounded with a 7-3 win over the Crimson Tide.

Entering the final weekend of the season, the Hogs needed two wins to assure themselves a postseason berth in the conference tournament. Ole Miss downed the Hogs 8-4, before Arkansas won the final two games 15-3 and 10-

0 behind the pitching of Scott Brocail and Birch's first collegiate shutout.

The Hogs then went to New Orleans for their first-ever SEC Tournament and won the first game in dramatic fashion. Pinch-hitter Carl Stall's two-run, twoout double in the top of the ninth gave the Hogs an 8-6 win over South Carolina. Two days later, South Carolina ended the Hogs season with a 9-5 victory.
