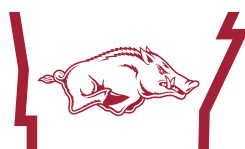

ON-COURT SUCCESS

A "players-first" coach whose biggest goal is helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, reached 900 career wins with an overtime in the 2025-26 regular-season finale, while guiding six teams to the Final Four and helping 62 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 34-year college coaching career with his pros amassing over \$5.8 billion in contracts.

Calipari took UMass to the Final Four in 1996, guided Memphis to the National Championship game in 2008 and led Kentucky to four Final Fours - including the 2012 National Championship and a runner-up finish in 2014 - to become **only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four**. He has racked up 24 NCAA Tournament appearances and numerous National Coach of the Year honors.

In his first two years at Arkansas, Calipari led the Razorbacks to a back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances and **became just the third coach in NCAA history to take four programs to the Sweet 16**. He win the 2026 SEC Tournament Championship for his 16th conference tourney title and become **the first coach to win SEC championships at two different schools**. Coach Cal helped Darius Acuff Jr. become the most decorated player in school history as he was a finalist for the 2026 National Player of the Year, the Bob Cousy Award winner, unanimous first team All-America and SEC Player of the Year.

At every collegiate stop, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his 10-year stretch at Kentucky (2009-19) was among the best decades in NCAA history, reaching four Final Fours (with a 2012 championship and 2014 national runner-up), seven Elite 8 berths and nine trips to the Sweet 16.

The 2015 campaign was highlighted by Coach Cal directing the first-ever college basketball team to own a 38-0 record (before falling in the Final Four) and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of that 2015 season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the **Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame**.

Coach Cal has **led three teams to an NCAA-record 38 wins on the court in a season** (once at Memphis and twice at Kentucky), led the NCAA in wins six times (at least once at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky) and tallied 30, 20-win seasons (including 11 30-win campaigns). With his sustained success, Coach Cal received the John R. Wooden Award Legends of Coaching honor in 2024.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass and returning Memphis and Kentucky to national contenders, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

PLAYER SUCCESS

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped **80 players realize their dreams by being drafted or playing in the NBA**. Calipari's NBA players have **amassed over \$5.8 billion in contracts**, which does not include endorsements nor players that have played overseas. He has had four No. 1 overall picks, tying for most overall, among his **65 players drafted and 44 first-round picks**, both ranking second-most all-time. In 2010, he had a record five first-round draft picks. Two years later, six of his players heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. Then in 2015, Cal would have six picks again, including a record-tying four lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 43 All-Star selections, including a record-breaking seven in 2024, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. **Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was voted NBA MVP in 2025 and 2026 to make Cal just the third person to coach two NBA MVPs in college** (with John Wooden and Dean Smith). Nine of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (a combined 21 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 18 players have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. **He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA's major honors: MVP (three times), Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player, Sixth Man of the Year (twice) and Clutch Player of the Year (twice).**

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 31 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

COMMUNITY SUCCESS

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the "Kentucky United" efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022. In his second month on the job at Arkansas, Cal helped with cleanup efforts after tornadoes hit the state. He has continued the Suits & Sneakers Gala in NW Arkansas and continued his tradition of helping families at Christmas with food, presents and paying for rent.

Calipari launched his **THE CALIPARI FOUNDATION** in 2012 and has worked with several key partners to donate more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional efforts include spearheading the creation of the **JOHN MCLENDON MINORITY LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE**, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders. **In 2026, the McLendon Foundation honored Coach Calipari with the 2026 Legacy of Impact Award.**

He was awarded the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good in 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. He earned the Race Amity Medal of Honor in 2023.

OTHER SUCCESS

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo. Also, he won gold as head coach of the 2012 Dominican Republic team at the Centrobasket Championship.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that **"it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."**

Razorbacks Ready for Year 3 of Calipari Era

- Naismith Hall of Fame coach John Calipari, who has led six teams to the Final Four, enters his 35th season as a collegiate head coach and third at Arkansas.
- He is just the fifth coach to amass over 900 career on-court Division I wins (905) and was the second-youngest and third-fastest coach to reach 900 wins.
 - ^ Cal has 31 20-win seasons (3rd-most in NCAA history)
 - ^ Cal has 21 25-win seasons (T-5th most in NCAA history)
 - ^ Cal has 11 30-win seasons (T-3rd-most in NCAA history).
- Of the 33 NCAA Tournaments held during his collegiate coaching career, he has led 25 teams to the NCAA Tournament, including 17 trips to the Sweet 16, 12 appearances to the Elite 8, six Final Four births, three national title games and a national championship. *(Note, in 2019-20, Kentucky was 25-6 and won the SEC with a 15-3 record but the NCAA canceled the tournament due to COVID-19.)*
- Calipari is the only coach to win SEC Tournament titles at two difference schools, one of two coaches in NCAA history to take three different programs to the Final Four and just is one of three coaches to lead four different schools to the Sweet 16.

First Look of the Hogs in The Bahamas

- Arkansas fans will get a preview of John Calipari's 2026-27 Razorbacks when they play four exhibition games against international competition as part of the 2026 Baha Mar Hoops Summer League.
 - ^ **The Bahamas National Team** will be made up of national team players from varying age groups.
 - ^ **Carleton University** is located in Ottawa, Ontario. The Ravens are the defending Canadian national collegiate champion. Carleton went 27-9 overall and 17-5 in league play to win the Ontario University Athletics (OUA) conference last season and earn a berth to the 2026 U Sports Men's Final 8 Basketball Tournament. The Ravens, seeded sixth, defeated Laval Rouge et Or (85-69) in the first round, TMU Bold (58-52) in the semifinal and Bishop's Gaiters (78-75) in the final to win the program's 18th Canadian Men's Basketball National Championship.
 - ^ **Toros del Valle** is a professional team from Cali, Colombia. They play in the Liga WPlay de Baloncesto, the premier professional basketball league in Colombia, and won the 2026 Apertura title (this past June), taking down two-time defending champions Los Paisas de Medellin, 3-1, in the best-of-five championship series. Toros del Valle went a league-best 12-2 during the regular season and out-scored its opponents by 280 points (1104 to 824).
 - ^ **The University of Calgary**, located in Calgary, Alberta, qualified for (and hosted) the 2026 U Sports Men's Final 8 Basketball Tournament, losing its first-round matchup versus Victoria (100-86) and falling in the consolation semifinal (88-77) to Acadia. The Dinos were U SPORTS runner-up in 2025. Calgary also played in the 2025 Baha Mar Summer League.

 - ^ His last outing at MSG came in his first season with the Razorbacks when Arkansas defeated then #14 Michigan, 89-87, as part of the Jimmy V Classic (Dec. 10, 2014).

Hall of Famers Face Off Part II; Part III in '27

- Arkansas, led by 2015 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee John Calipari, and Michigan State, led by 2016 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Tom Izzo, are set to square off in the CBS Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 26, in Detroit's Little Caesar's Arena.
 - The two teams played last season in East Lansing, a game the Spartans won, 69-66.
 - ^ **The teams will play the back-end of that home-and-home series in the 2027-28 season in Fayetteville.**
- The programs have only met on three occasions with Michigan State winning all three.

2026-27 ARKANSAS BASKETBALL PRESEASON NOTES

- The first meeting came in the 1991 Maui Classic championship game when the second-ranked Razorbacks fell to Michigan State, 86-71, on Nov. 27.
- The teams faced off again nearly four years to the date later (Nov. 28, 1995) as part of the Great Eight Tournament, played at The Palace in Auburn Hills. Michigan State edged the #25 Razorbacks, 75-72. That game came in Izzo's first year as the Spartans' head coach (his fourth game) and was his second career victory (first versus a Division I opponent as Michigan State beat Chamaine in the Maui Classic opener to start the season).

- This will be the second time Arkansas and Michigan State in "Detroit" as the Spartans edged the Razorbacks, 75-72, on Nov. 28, 1995, at The Palace o Auburn Hills, then home of the Detroit Pistons as part of ESPN's Great 8 Tournament.
 - ^ **2024:**
 - The Hogs fell to Illinois, 90-77, in Kansas City in what was the first ever college basketball game televised nationally on CBS on Thanksgiving Day.
 - 5.174 million people watched the Arkansas-Illinois game, which was the second-largest, regular-season college basketball television audience since 2008.
 - ^ **2025:**
 - The #22 Hogs fell to #4 Duke, 80-71, in Chicago.
 - 6.81 million people watched the Arkansas-Duke game. It was not only the most-watch, regular-season game of the year, it was the most-watched, regular-season college basketball game since the 1992-93 season. Viewership increased +32% vs. last year's CBS Thanksgiving Game between Arkansas and Illinois.

Hogs at North Carolina for SEC-ACC Challenge

- For the fourth consecutive year, Arkansas will participate in the ACC/SEC Challenge. The Razorbacks will travel to Chapel Hill to face North Carolina.
- The SEC leads in the ACC/SEC Challenge, 30-16, over the first three years. In 2023, the leagues split, 7-7. The SEC won 14 of the 16 match-ups in 2024 and won 9 of the 16 in 2025.

ARKANSAS IN THE SEC-ACC CHALLENGE

- Arkansas is 3-0 all-time in the Challenge.
 - ^ 2023: Arkansas defeated #7 Duke, 80-75, before a Bud Walton Arena record crowd of 20,334.
 - ^ 2024: Arkansas came from behind to beat Miami, 76-73, in Coral Gables. In the inaugural Challenge
 - ^ 2025: Arkansas hosted #6 Louisville and won 89-80.

ARKANSAS VERSUS NORTH CAROLINA

- Arkansas and North Carolina have played on 11 previous occasions, and this will be the first time the two programs have not met at a neutral site, with the Tar Heels owning an 8-3 advantage in the series.
- The last time the two teams met was on Nov. 24, 2023, in the Battle 4 Atlantis in the Bahamas. Then #14 North Carolina pulled out an 87-72 victory in the third-place game. Prior to that, #9 North Carolina handed the Hogs an 87-68 loss on Nov. 24, 2017, in the Phil Knight Invitational semifinals in Portland.
- From 1990 to 2017, the two programs met six times, all in the NCAA Tournament.
- One game in the series - **one of the best games in Razorback history - was played in the state of Arkansas when the Razorbacks upset #1 North Carolina**, led by Michael Jordan, 65-64, in Pine Bluff. Joe Kleine scored 20 points and had 10 rebounds in the win, but Charles Balentine was the hero, hitting the game-winning shot with four seconds left.
- The **first game of the series was a "made for TV" game** when #3 North Carolina defeated #10 Arkansas, 63-7-57, in a game played in Greensboro, N.C., on NBC. Two seasons later, #13 North Carolina defeated #20 Arkansas, 64-58, in the 1980 Great Alaska Shootout championship game.
- **CAL VERSUS CAROLINA**
 - Razorback head coach John Calipari has faced the Tar Heels on 13 previous occasions and leads 9-4. Highlights include:

- This will be the third-straight year Arkansas will face both LSU and Missouri twice as SEC-designated "permanent opponents." Alabama is the third team. In previous years, Texas (2025) and Auburn (2026) were the third team.
- Arkansas and LSU have met for a home-and-home series in all but three seasons since the Razorbacks joined the SEC for the 1991-92 season. The Razorbacks and Tigers only met once in 2013 (in Baton Rouge) and just once in 2015 (in Fayetteville). Arkansas leads the Tigers 42-32 since the Razorbacks joined the SEC. Arkansas leads the all-time series with Missouri, 38-28, and leads 19-10 since Mizou joined the SEC, including wins in 10 of the last 12.
- The last time Arkansas and Alabama met twice during the regular season was the 202-23 campaign. Alabama swept the series that season, winning 84-69 in Fayetteville and 86-83 in Tuscaloosa. Arkansas holds a one-game advantage over Alabama all-time, 36-35, but trails the Crimson Tide, 32-29, since the Hogs joined the SEC. Alabama has won six straight in the series. **In a scheduling quirk, since 2020, Arkansas have played nine times with six of those contests being played in Tuscaloosa.**
- Arkansas was 8-1 in SEC home games last season. If history is an indicator, the home schedule once again sets up well for Arkansas. The Razorbacks are a combined 166-69 (.706) all-time versus the SEC opponents they will play at home, including 20-8 versus Alabama, 24-6 versus Auburn, 10-8 versus Florida, 15-3 versus Georgia, 26-8 versus LSU, 18-12 versus Ole Miss, 24-9 versus Mississippi State, 21-10 versus Missouri and 8-5 versus Oklahoma.
