Opening Up 2015

Arkansas Razorback women's cross country will open the 2015 season with a 3K race against Oklahoma State. The gun will start at 8 a.m. Tues., Sept. 1 at the OSU XC Course in Stillwater.

New Beginnings

Arkansas will feature a combination of talents this season returning two-time All-American Dominique Scott as well as fellow former contributors Kaitlin Flattmann, Valerie Reina, Kelsey Schrader and Regan Ward.

Scott Set to Lead Razorbacks

Redshirt senior Dominique Scott will play a very important role in the success of the Razorbacks as one of only two seniors represented on the 2015 roster. The two-time All-American will be at the helm of a young Arkansas team and will set the pace for the new group to follow en route to a potential third-consecutive SEC title and top-10 national finish.

Fresh Faces

Head coach Lance Harter has brought in their biggest group of freshman this season. Possible immediate impact-makers include: redshirt freshman Sydney Brown and true freshman Devin Clark and Claudia Verstraten. Additionally, Nikki Hiltz has transferred to Arkansas from Oregon.

Brown who redshirted last season earned All-State honors during her junior year at Marcus High School. She holds records at Marcus as a member of both the DMR and 4x800 meter relay team and has a personal best of 10:41 in the 3200-meter run and 4:57 at 1600 meters. Brown qualified for the 2015 USATF Junior Championships in the 1500-meter run.

Clark was the 2014 6A state champion in Texas and a 12-time state medalist across cross country and track field. She holds sub-17 PR in the 5K (16:40.57) and was ranked in the top 10 nationally at 1600 meters (4:42.70) and 3200 meters (10:18.37). Verstraten is one of top young middle-distance talents out of Australia and holds PRs of 4:27.64 at 1500 meters and 4:50.1 in the mile.

During her freshman season at Oregon Hiltz earned All-American honors for her efforts in the mile (4:37.90) and 1500-meter run (4:16.13). Hiltz gained a point towards Oregon's indoor team total with an eighth place finish in the mile at the NCAA Indoor Championships only to return during the outdoor season and place in the top 12 at 1500 meters at the outdoor national meet.

On Tap

The Razorbacks will open the schedule with the Oklahoma State Duals in Stillwater, Okla. on Sept. 1, travel to Riverside, Calif. for the UC Riverside Invitational Sept. 12, head to Joplin, Mo. for the MSSU Stampede Sept. 19, return home to run the Chile Pepper Festival in Fayetteville (Oct. 3) and venture to Madison, Wis. for the Wisconsin adidas Invitational Oct. 16.

The championship season begins with SECs in College Station, Texas Oct. 30, followed by the NCAA South Central Regional Championships in College Station, Texas Nov. 13. It all culminates with the NCAA Championships Nov. 21 in Louisville, Ky.



Last Time Out

For the second consecutive season Dominique Scott collected first-place finishes at both the SEC Championships and NCAA South Central Regional Championships. Scott led a talented group of upperclassman in Grace Heymsfield, Jessica Kamilos, Shannon Klenke and Diane Robison to a fifth place team finish at 2014 NCAA Championships.

Returning Razorbacks

Arkansas returns five student-athletes from the 2014 roster that each have made an appearance in the scoring five including SEC All-Freshman Kelsey Schrader.

When the Razorbacks travel to Ole Miss for the 2009 SEC Championships, Arkansas will be contending for its 14th conference cross country title and 20th SEC title overall (including indoor and outdoor track and field).

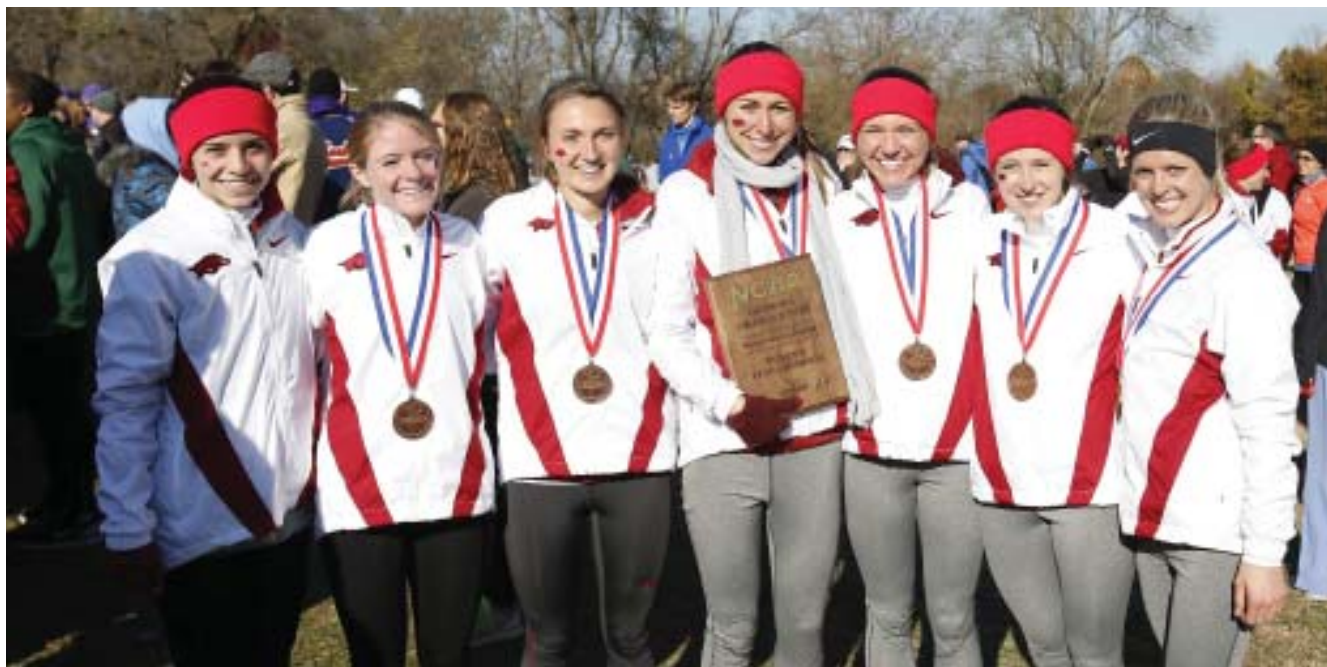

The most successful coach in University of Arkansas and Southeastern Conference women's cross country and track and field history, Lance Harter is in his 26th year at the helm of the Razorback program. Harter's individual honors include four-time National Coach of the Year and 24-time SEC Coach of the Year accolades. His Razorbacks have racked up 18 NCAA event titles, 149 SEC event titles and 395 All-America certificates through the 2015 outdoor season.

In recognition of his standout career and accomplishments, Harter was inducted into the USTFCCA Coaches Hall of Fame on December 15, 2014, at the organization's convention in Phoenix. He is also a member of the Arkansas Sports Hall of Honor, Mt. SAC Relays Hall of Fame and Cal Poly Hall of Fame.

During his tenure, Arkansas has collected 11 NCAA podium (top four) finishes including the 2015 NCAA Indoor Championships team title and four national runner-up performances in cross country. Harter has also guided his team to 25 SEC titles (15 cross country, five indoor track and five outdoor track) including six of the last eight conference championships dating back to the 2013 SEC indoor meet. His title haul at Arkansas also includes 19 NCAA Regional Championships in cross country.

In winning the 2015 NCAA indoor team crown, Harter and the Razorbacks secured the first-ever national title by any women's program at the University of Arkansas. With its 63 points, Arkansas scored the third-highest team total in meet history and scored in each of the 15 events it had entries. The 2015 indoor season marked another first for the Razorback women when the program received its first-ever No. 1 ranking when the USTFCCA released the Feb. 16 national poll.

Overall, Harter has guided Arkansas to 29 top-10 NCAA finishes (10 cross country, 12 indoor track and seven outdoor) in his tenure including 16 top-five performances. Through the 2015 outdoor season, the Razorbacks have finished third or better in 78 percent (56 of 72) of SEC Championship meets under his watch. Arkansas has never finished lower than third at an SEC cross country meet.

Former Razorback track All-American Megan (Jackson) Elliott re-joined the Arkansas cross country/track coaching staff as Director of Operations in August 2014 after a brief one-year stint as an assistant coach at IUPUI. The Middlebury, Ind., native will assist Head Coach Lance Harter in all facets of leading the program, including training, recruiting, fund raising and academic oversight.

Elliott earned her B.S.E. in Kinesiology in 2010, majoring in P-12 Teaching Physical Education from the University of Arkansas and also completed her Master's degree in Kinesiology/Exercise Science from the U of A in 2013 after serving as a graduate assistant. As a GA with the Hogs, Elliott was involved in practice structuring, individual workouts and on-campus recruiting. She was also heavily involved with the University of Arkansas Track Camps.

She earned All-American honors in the steeplechase in 2008 and was an Academic All-American throughout her college career. She also served on the Arkansas Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and was a two-time team captain for both the cross country and track programs.

She earned SEC All-Academic First Team accolades every year of her collegiate career as well as being named to the Athletic Director's Honor Roll all four years. She was also involved in the Fayetteville community, participating with the Arkansas Athletes Outreach (AAO) and Sweat Haws program. She also took part in the Lee Spencer Cup, given annually to the Arkansas team which demonstrates the strongest commitment to life skills initiatives, academic success and athletic excellence.
