LEADING OFF --

• Arkansas will face West Coast Conference-member Gonzaga starting on Tuesday for a two-game midweek series. Gonzaga is 5-6 on the year and is coming off a 2-1 series loss to TCU last weekend.

• The Razorbacks are coming off a 2-2 week with two wins over Eastern Illinois to earn its second-straight home series victory. The Hogs were set back slightly during its midweek tilt with Louisiana Tech as they lost their first game of the season, 3-2 to the Bulldogs.

• Before Wednesday's loss, the Razorbacks were off to an 8-0 start in 2016, their third-best start under current head coach Dave Van Horn and fourth-best start in school history. It's the best start since 2006, when the Hogs started 9-0 under Van Horn.

• Junior Jake Arledge had himself a weekend against Eastern Illinois. Arledge hit .429 with a triple and two home runs. Both of his long balls came in game two against Eastern Illinois as Arledge went 3-for-6 in the game with four runs scored and three RBI. The two home runs is a new personal single-game high as a Razorback. Arledge is the third Razorback to have a multi-home run game this season. Both Carson Shaddy and Michael Bernal have turned in multi-homer games.

• Before last Saturday, the Razorbacks hadn't committed an error in six-straight games, the longest such streak under Dave Van Horn.

• Sophomore pitcher Keaton McKinney turned in his best start of the season Sunday against Eastern Illinois as he went seven strong innings, scattering just four hits and only allowing one earned run and one walk. McKinney was locked in for his final five innings of work as he retired the final 15 of 17 batters he faced.

Arledge Doesn't Want to Sit On The Bench

• Junior college transfer Jake Arledge made the most of his three weekend starts against Eastern Illinois.

• Arledge hit .429 with a triple and two home runs over the three-game series.

• Both of his long balls came in game two against Eastern Illinois as Arledge went 3-for-6 in the game with four runs scored and three RBI.

• Arledge is the third Razorback to have a multi-home run game this season (Shaddy - MVSU; Bernal - Houston).

Power Up! Hog Offense Doesn't Slack

• The Razorbacks didn't put up as many runs last weekend as was seen at the Houston College Classic, however, the pace the offense has put up runs this year is still at a high rate.

• In its three games against Eastern Illinois, Arkansas scored 17 runs. Overall this season, the Hogs have scored 105 runs.

• The 105 runs is the second-highest total in the SEC (Texas A&M, 110) and has Arkansas as just one of four teams in the conference with 100 or more runs scored.

Dominic Taccolini Easing Into Arkansas Ace Role

• Junior pitcher Dominic Taccolini earned his third win in as many starts Friday against Eastern Illinois,

• Going five innings strong, scattering four hits and only allowing two earned runs with five strikeouts, Taccolini was solid for the third-straight week.

• In each of his three starts this season, Taccolini has yet to allow more than two runs.

Razorback History vs. Gonzaga

Arkansas' series history against Gonzaga is not very extensive until recently. The Hogs and Bulldogs have faced off with each other five times in the last four seasons, four of those meetings occurring in Fayetteville. Before the 2012 season, the two teams only played twice, in 1990 and 1992. Gonzaga actually owns the advantage in the all-time series, 4-3, and is the winner of the last three meetings.

Last season, the Bulldogs took both contests of a midweek series, winning 6-2 and 15-5 at Baum Stadium.

Van Horn by the Numbers

• Dave Van Horn made his sixth career appearance in the College World Series during the 2015 season, more than any other head coach in the SEC.

• In his 13 seasons at Arkansas, Van Horn has led the Razorbacks to four College World Series appearances, five Super Regionals and 13 NCAA Tournament berths.

• The skipper eclipsed the 500-win mark at Arkansas on April 5 against Auburn and has a total of 541 wins, averaging more than 40 wins per season.

• Taccolini has also limited his walk totals significantly as he has allowed just three walks combined in all three of his starts, tying him for the seventh-lowest total in the SEC.

Razorbacks Walk-Off With Series Win on Sunday

• 12th-ranked Arkansas didn't need extra innings Sunday afternoon at Baum Stadium, getting a walk-off walk from senior Cullen Gassaway with the bases loaded in the ninth inning to send the Razorback crowd home happy with a 3-2 and series victory over Eastern Illinois.

• Arkansas (10-2) was down 2-1 for the majority of the game before tying it up in the bottom of the seventh on a sacrifice fly by Jake Arledge to score Michael Bernal. In the ninth, Tucker Pennell led off the frame with a single up the middle and was pinch run for by Darien Simms. The Hogs got a good sacrifice bunt by Eric Cole to move the runner to second and later third base on a wild pitch.

• Eastern Illinois' (1-10) pitcher, Jason Euler, walked three batters in the inning including the final batter in Gassaway that brought home the winning run. After the sacrifice bunt, Arledge walked and then Eagan was intentionally walked to load the bases. Gassaway only saw five pitches in his winning at-bat as Euler could not find the strike zone allowing the winning run to score without a batted ball.

• For the most part, the offensive end for the Hogs was a little quieter Sunday than on most

days. Only Pennell recorded a two-hit ball game, going 2-for-3 with a run scored and a walk for his third two-hit game this season. Pennell was a key component of Arkansas scoring the game-tying run in the seventh and the game-winning run in the ninth as his single and double both got rallies going that led to key runs.

The Road To Omaha

- The Razorbacks are one of just five teams in the nation to advance to the NCAA Tournament each of the last 14 years. Arkansas is joined by Cal State Fullerton, Florida State, Miami (Fla.) and Rice as the only programs to accomplish the feat.

- The Razorbacks are one of 10 teams in the country to advance to at least three of the last seven College World Series, joining Florida, LSU, North Carolina, South Carolina, TCU, Texas, UCLA, Vanderbilt and Virginia.

Previewing the Arkansas Rotation

- Lefty freshman Weston Rogers gets the call for his third-straight midweek start Tuesday against Gonzaga.

- Rogers, who already has starts against Mississippi Valley State and Louisiana Tech, has compiled a 2.84 ERA in four appearances, throwing 6.1 innings with two earned runs allowed and striking out eight.

- Last week against Louisiana Tech, Rogers threw 2.2 innings, while giving up just three hits with two earned runs and walking one batter. Rogers wasn't part of the decision as the Hogs dropped the game, 3-2.

- Arkansas head coach Dave Van Horn has not announced who will start Wednesday's game two against Gonzaga.

Scouting Gonzaga

- The Bulldogs had an up-and-down weekend in Fort Worth. They began the three-game series at No. 7 TCU on a high, coming back with two runs in the seventh inning to beat the Horned Frogs 4-3 as starter Brandon Bailey pitched 7.0 innings, striking out nine to earn the win. TCU won the series with big wins on Saturday and Sunday, however, including putting up 16 runs during the Sunday's rubber match.

- Head coach Mark Machtolf enters his 13th season at the helm of the program. He's put together a 353-304-2 record (including this season's results) as manager and is the second in program history in terms of wins and win percentage (.537). He's also second-longest tenured coach in program history behind Steve Hertz (24 years, 1978, 1982-2003). Before becoming head coach, Machtolf was an assistant for 13 years as well; this is his 26th season with Gonzaga baseball.

- Gonzaga went 24-28 last season with a 13-14 West Coast Conference record. The Bulldogs finished sixth in the league standings, missing out on the WCC tournament for the first time in its three-year history. They return seven starting position players and one full-time starting pitcher from 2015.

Quick Hits

- The Razorbacks have won 40 or more games in six of the last seven seasons.

- Arkansas is the only team in the SEC to advance to each of the last 14 NCAA Regionals, and head coach Dave Van Horn is the only current head coach in the league to make six appearances in the College World Series.

- Arkansas had four players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft, as Andrew Benintendi went seventh overall to the Boston Red Sox, Trey Killian went in the ninth round to the Colorado Rockies, Bobby Wernes went in the 30th round to the Houston Astros and Tyler Spoon went in the 35th round to the Boston Red Sox. The Razorbacks have had 21 players drafted in the last three years.

The Baum Way

- Arkansas finished No. 2 in the country in average attendance for the third straight year with 8,290 fans per game in 2015. The Razorbacks posted school records in actual attendance and tickets sold for a single game.
- The actual crowd of 12,167 against Missouri State on June 6 was the largest crowd in Baum Stadium history. The 12,167 fans also marked the third largest Super Regional crowd in NCAA history.
- After setting the Baum Stadium attendance record in game one of the Fayetteville Super Regional with 11,869, Razorback fans followed suit Saturday, breaking the record in less than 24 hours with 12,167 on hand. In the Fayetteville Super Regional, three of the top four attendance marks at the eight Super Regional sites were all at Baum Stadium, totaling 35,730 over the three games. Game 1: 11,869 | Game 2: 12,167 | Game 3: 11,694
- The three NCAA Fayetteville Super Regional crowds marked the three largest crowds in Baum Stadium history.
- Arkansas was home to three of the top four postseason crowds in 2015 during Regionals and Super Regionals.
- The 12,589 tickets sold against Mississippi State on April 25 marked the 14th largest on-campus crowd in NCAA history.

Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic

All three of Arkansas' games against No. 20 Rice, No. 12 Houston and No. 25 Texas Tech at the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic held at Minute Maid Park in Houston next weekend can be seen on national TV. All three of Arkansas' games will be live nationally on MLB Network, but blacked out in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana and New Mexico. The games will be broadcast in those aforementioned states on Cox Sports or Root Sports Southwest found on AT&T U-Verse (Ch. 758 and Ch. 1758) and DirecTV (Ch. 674).

Benintendi was selected by the Boston Red Sox with the seventh overall pick in the 2015 MLB Draft. He was the third-highest draft pick in program history and the eighth Razorback to be taken in the first round.

Now entering his 14th season at the helm of the Arkansas baseball program in 2015-16, head coach Dave Van Horn continues to elevate the Razorbacks to one of the nation's premier teams year in and year out. Over his first 13 seasons, Van Horn has led Arkansas to four College World Series appearances, 13 NCAA Tournament berths, one Southeastern Conference overall title, three SEC Western Division championships and a total of 524 wins, averaging more than 40 wins a season.

The Razorbacks defied all the odds in 2015, rebounding from a 15-15 record on April 4 to win 18 of their final 25 regular season games and surge into postseason play. After going 2-2 in the SEC Tournament, Arkansas became one of five teams in the country to advance to 14 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, claiming the No. 2 seed in the Stillwater Regional hosted by Oklahoma State.

In what is likely Van Horn's best coaching job in his 27-year career, the Razorbacks went 3-0 in the Stillwater Regional and came back home to host the second Super Regional in program history, knocking off Missouri State in three games for the most improbable College World Series appearance in Arkansas' storied history. Van Horn made his sixth trip to Omaha, including his fourth as the Razorback skipper. He currently has more College World Series appearances than any head coach in the SEC.

During the run to Omaha, sophomore outfielder Andrew Benintendi put together arguably the finest season in Razorback history. Benintendi became the first Arkansas player to win the Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's best amateur player. He also won the Dick Howser Trophy and was named Baseball America Player of the Year and Collegiate Baseball Player of the Year as the nation's best collegiate player.

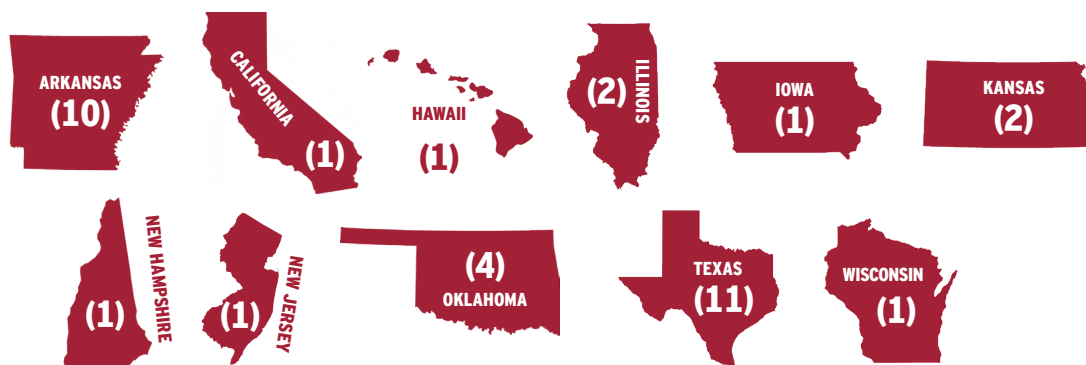

Players are not available for interviews on gamedays, except for post-game interviews. Post-game press conferences are held in the indoor batting cages located down the third base line. Coach Van Horn will address the media first, followed by the two or three most requested Razorback players. In the event of a doubleheader, the only Arkansas player available between games for interviews is the starting pitcher of game one. The Arkansas clubhouse is off limits to the media at all times.
