LEADING OFF --

- Arkansas completes its 11-game homestand Tuesday and Wednesday when SWAC opponent, Grambling State, visits Baum Stadium for a two-game series. Grambling State is the second opponent for Arkansas this season from the SWAC (Miss. Valley St.).
- The Razorbacks are fresh off a three-game sweep of Western Illinois, its third weekend sweep of the season and fourth weekend series win, which includes the three wins at the Houston College Classic. Arkansas benefitted from good pitching performances on all three days, including a combined two-hitter in the Sunday finale, anchored by freshman Barrett Loseke.
- Senior infielder Rick Nomura seemed to break out of his hitting slump as he hit his second home run of the season in Arkansas' 9–3 win over the Leathernecks Saturday to secure the series win. Nomura went 4–for–5 in the game, a career–high in hits and scored three runs, while driving in two. Over his last four games, the Hawaiian has gone 7–for–11 (.636) at the plate, driving in seven runs and hitting two home runs.
- Arkansas pitchers Dominic Taccolini and Zach Jackson combined for one of the best performances on the mound this season when the two hurlers combined for a season-high 14 strikeouts Friday against Western Illinois. Taccolini turned in his second seven inning outing of the year, striking out nine (tying career-high) and had a no-hitter through the sixth inning. Jackson struck out five batters in his own right over the game's final three innings.
- Freshman Barrett Loseke was given the opportunity for his first career start Sunday in the series finale against Western Illinois. Loseke didn't disappoint going a season-long four innings, while only giving up one hit with no runs. Over the 10 innings he's pitched this season, Loseke has yet to give up a run.

Two-Baggers For Bonfield

- Over just the last two games, sophomore Luke Bonfield has been on a mission at the plate. In his last seven at-bats, he has recorded five hits, three RBI and three doubles.
- Bonfield has been hot and cold with the bat since the start of the season. He went 5-for-12 (.417) through his first three starts this season, highlighted by a 3-for-5 day with 5 RBI vs. Mississippi Valley State (2/23).
- Over the next six games, Bonfield struggled to get any momentum, notching only two hits and no RBI, including going O-for-4 in the series opener against Western Illinois.
- Now, Bonfield has upped his average to .343 and his four doubles is tied for the second-highest on the team.
- His three RBI on Sunday vs. Western Illinois tied his season-high and were the only three run Arkansas scored in the shutout.

Spanberger Don't Like Singles – #BergerBomb

- There's no question when one looks at Chad Spanberger that he can hit it a long way.
- The slugger has started five games this season and while, he only has four hits, all of his hits have been home runs or doubles.
- Spanberger hit his first career home run back during the Eastern Illinois series; a pinch-hit bomb that sent the game to extra-innings.
- Since then, Spanberger 3-for-13, but he turned in a career 2-for-5 day on Saturday against Western Illinois, that included four RBI, a double and a home run.
- The four RBI set a new career—high for Spanberger as he drove in four of Arkansas' nine runs that day.

Razorback History vs. Grambling State

Arkansas and Grambling State have only played three times in the all-time series. The Hogs and Tigers first met back in 2010 in the NCAA Fayetteville Regional. Grambling State was the SWAC champion that year, but the Razorbacks put 19 runs on the board to win the regional opener, 19-7.

Since then, the two teams have only played twice during a two-game midweek series in 2014 with Arkansas taking both by a combined score of 12-3.

Van Horn by the Numbers

- Dave Van Horn made his sixth career appearance in the College World Series during the 2015 season, more than any other head coach in the SEC.
- In his 13 seasons at Arkansas, Van Horn has led the Razorbacks to four College World Series appearances, five Super Regionals and 13 NCAA Tournament berths.
- The skipper eclipsed the 500-win mark at Arkansas on April 5 against Auburn and has a total of 541 wins, averaging more than 40 wins per season.

Seeing Double - Arkansas and Double Plays

- · Arkansas' infield has been one of the best in the nation so far this year and the numbers don't lie. 18 double plays have been turned by the Hogs through the season's first 16 games, that's averaging just over one double play a game.
- · The Hogs turned four double-plays in the three-game series with Western Illinois, two each on Friday and Sunday, marking the third and fourth game this year that Arkansas has had multiple double-plays in a game.
- The season-high three double plays came on the final day of the Houston College Classic when the Razorbacks defeated Texas A&M at Minute Maid Park, 10-6.
- Arkansas has turned at least one double play in nine of its last 10 games.

Dominic Taccolini Easing Into Arkansas Ace

- Junior pitcher Dominic Taccolini continued his strong start to the 2016 season last week, making his fourth Friday start in a row.
- · For the second time this year, Taccolini threw seven strong innings on Friday against Western Illinois, allowing just two hits and one earned run, while tying a career-high in strikeouts with nine.
- Taccolini had a no-hitter through six innings Friday, but gave up his first hit in the seventh, which then led to the Leathernecks first run of the game

- In each of his four starts this season, Taccolini has yet to allow more than two runs.
- Taccolini has also limited his walk totals significantly as he has allowed just five walks combined in all four of his starts, tying him for the 11th-lowest total in the SEC.

Loseke Leads Pitching Charge on Sunday

- Five Razorback pitchers combined for a two-hitter Sunday afternoon, helping to earn the sweep of Western Illinois, winning 3-0 at Baum Stadium.
- Led by freshman Barrett Loeske, who got the start and went four strong innings, the Razorback pitchers of Loeske, Kacey Murphy, Josh Alberius, Ty Harris, Doug Willey and Jordan Rodriguez, combined to give up no runs on two hits, walking two and striking out 10.
- Loeske got the win Sunday afternoon, his first of the season in his first career start, allowing just one hit over the four innings of work, walking one and striking out four.
- Loseke has yet to allow a run this season in over 10 innings pitched. He's struck out 11 in the process and is one of five Arkansas pitchers with 10 or more strikeouts this season.

Scouting Grambling State

- Grambling State is coached by James Cooper, who is in his fourth season as the Tigers' head coach.
- Cooper was the 33rd round draft pick of the Houston Astros in 2004.
- Daniel Barnett leads all Grambling State hitters with a .420 average. Barnett has 21 hits in 50 atbats, eight for extra-bases and 15 RBI.
- He along with Darien Brown are the only two Tigers' hitters with a .400 average or higher and 20 or more at-bats. Brown is batting .409 in 10 games played with nine hits, one double and three RBI.
- Issac O'Bear leads all Tiger pitchers as he has made four starts, going 2-2 with a 5.64 ERA. O'Bear has given up just 14 earned runs in 22.1 innings pitched and struck out eight.
- Tanner Raiburn has been the Tigers other strong starting pitcher, but has struggled to keep the earned runs down. Raiburn has a 10.80 ERA in four starts, going 0-3, but leads the team with 14 strikeouts.

Quick Hits

 The Razorbacks have won 40 or more games in six of the last seven seasons.

- Arkansas is the only team in the SEC to advance to each of the last 14 NCAA Regionals, and head coach Dave Van Horn is the only current head coach in the league to make six appearances in the College World Series.
- · Arkansas had four players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft, as Andrew Benintendi went seventh overall to the Boston Red Sox, Trey Killian went in the ninth round to the Colorado Rockies, Bobby Wernes went in the 30th round to the Houston Astros and Tyler Spoon went in the 35th round to the Boston Red Sox. The Razorbacks have had 21 players drafted in the last three years.

The Road To Omaha

- · The Razorbacks are one of just five teams in the nation to advance to the NCAA Tournament each of the last 14 years. Arkansas is joined by Cal State Fullerton, Florida State, Miami (Fla.) and Rice as the only programs to accomplish the feat.
- The Razorbacks are one of 10 teams in the country to advance to at least three of the last seven College World Series, joining Florida, LSU, North Carolina, South Carolina, TCU, Texas, UCLA, Vanderbilt and Virginia.

- Arkansa finished No. 2 in the country in average attendance for the third straight year with 8,290 fans per game in 2015. The Razorbacks posted school records in actual attendance and tickets sold
- The actual crowd of 12,167 against Missouri State on June 6 was the largest crowd in Baum Stadium history. The 12,167 fans also marked the third largest Super Regional crowd in NCAA history.
- After setting the Baum Stadium attendance record in game one of the Fayetteville Super Regional with 11,869, Razorback fans followed suit Saturday, breaking the record in less than 24 hours with 12,167 on hand. In the Fayetteville Super Regional, three of the top four attendance marks at the eight Super Regional sites were all at Baum Stadium, totaling 35,730 over the three games. Game 1: 11,869 | Game 2: 12,167 | Game 3: 11,694
- The three NCAA Fayetteville Super Regional crowds marked the three largest crowds in Baum Stadium history.
- Arkansas was home to three of the top four postseason crowds in 2015 during Regionals and Super Regionals.
- The 12,589 tickets sold against Mississippi State on April 25 marked the 14th largest on-campus crowd in NCAA history.

Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic

All three of Arkansas' games against No. 20 Rice, No. 12 Houston and No. 25 Texas Tech at the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic held at Minute Maid Park in Houston next weekend can be seen on national TV. All three of Arkansas' games will be live nationally on MLB Network, but blacked out in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana and New Mexico. The games will be broadcast in those aforementioned states on Cox Sports or Root Sports Southwest found on AT&T U-Verse (Ch. 758 and Ch. 1758) and DirecTV (Ch. 674).

Now entering his 14th season at the helm of the Arkansas baseball program in 2015-16, head coach Dave Van Horn continues to elevate the Razorbacks to one of the nation's premier teams year in and year out. Over his first 13 seasons, Van Horn has led Arkansas to four College World Series appearances, 13 NCAA Tournament berths, one Southeastern Conference overall title, three SEC Western Division championships and a total of 524 wins, averaging more than 40 wins a season.

The Razorbacks defied all the odds in 2015, rebounding from a 15-15 record on April 4 to win 18 of their final 25 regular season games and surge into postseason play. After going 2-2 in the SEC Tournament, Arkansas became one of five teams in the country to advance to 14 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, claiming the No. 2 seed in the Stillwater Regional hosted by Oklahoma State.

In what is likely Van Horn's best coaching job in his 27-year career, the Razorbacks went 3-0 in the Stillwater Regional and came back home to host the second Super Regional in program history, knocking off Missouri State in three games for the most improbable College World Series appearance in Arkansas' storied history. Van Horn made his sixth trip to Omaha, including his fourth as the Razorback skipper. He currently has more College World Series appearances than any head coach in the SEC.

During the run to Omaha, sophomore outfielder Andrew Benintendi put together arguably the finest season in Razorback history. Benintendi became the first Arkansas player to win the Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's best amateur player. He also won the Dick Howser Trophy and was named Baseball America Player of the Year and Collegiate Baseball Player of the Year as the nation's best collegiate player.



GAME CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact John Thomas to request individual game credentials for Razorback baseball home games. Credential requests should be made no later than noon (CT) the day before the scheduled contest and should be directed by e-mail to John Thomas. Credential requests for away games should be made to the communications contact of the home team. Only fully accredited personnel directly involved in the coverage of the game will be admitted. Credentials are non-transferable.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Please direct all requests for interviews with coaches and players to John Thomas. For home SEC weekends, Coach Dave Van Horn will hold his weekly press conference on Thursday with players and assistant coaches available prior to Thursday's practice. On road SEC weekends, Coach Van Horn will hold his weekly press conference on Wednesday with players and assistant coaches available prior to Wednesday's practice. Players are not available for interviews on gamedays, except for post–game interviews. Post–game press conferences are held in the indoor batting cages located down the third base line. Coach Van Horn will address the media first, followed by the two or three most requested Razorback players. In the event of a doubleheader, the only Arkansas player available between games for interviews is the starting pitcher of game one. The Arkansas clubhouse is off limits to the media at all times.

E-MAIL UPDATES

Members of the media may request to be added to the Arkansas communications baseball e-mail group. Subscribers will receive game notes, game stories and other information. To subscribe, send a request to John Thomas. Please identify yourself and your organization in your request as this service is only available to members of the media.

GAMEDAY MEDIA SERVICES

The Arkansas communications staff provides scorecards, rosters, updated statistics and results for each team in the Baum Stadium press box prior to home games. Box scores, play-by-play and any postgame notes are disseminated approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game. An Associated Press-style game story is also produced by the communications office. Members of the media may request these stories be sent to their organization via e-mail by contacting a member of the communications office.

RAZORBACK SPORTS NETWORK

For the 24th consecutive season, every pitch of the Arkansas baseball season can be heard on the Razorback Sports Network from IMG College. The network spans the state of Arkansas and can also be heard in neighboring states as well as across the globe via the internet. The Razorback Baseball Radio Network is one of the largest collegiate baseball radio networks in the nation. With more than 20 affiliates, Razorback baseball games are never more than a dial away no matter where an Arkansas fan resides.

No cameras are allowed on the Baum Stadium playing surface during games. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo wells at the end of each dugout and behind home plate.
