

Q. (No microphone.)

STACY LEWIS: It was a difficult putt. It broke a lot and it was pretty tracked up there at the end of the day, and it was a 50/50 putt, and I think the crowds blew it in there on the backside.

Q. Tell us about No. 17, the loudest hole on Tour.

STACY LEWIS: Yeah, 17 is actually playing really hard today. It's playing 158 into the wind, and so you're looking at a 60, 65 shot and adrenaline going, my 7-iron kinda barely got to the green, and when that putt went in, it was awesome. That's kinda why you play, for those moments. I'm just glad I could give the fans a birdie and give 'em something to cheer for.

Q. About how long was it?

STACY LEWIS: I don't know, probably about 20 feet or so.

Q. You go from almost disappointment to excitement there with that putt the way it turned in. The round in general and how that finish felt?

STACY LEWIS: Yeah, the round was a bit up and down. Kinda felt like I was struggling a little bit coming in, so that's why the last two birdies were extremely important to me, because I kind of felt like the momentum was going the other way, so I felt like I got the momentum back and can hopefully post another good one tomorrow.

Q. Did that high score that was posted today put a little bit of pressure on you?

STACY LEWIS: It did. I was shocked, actually when we got on the course to see 16-under on the board. I mean, I know this golf course is gettable, but that's playing some really great golf, so there was a little bit of pressure to go shoot a low number, and I still feel like I did that.

Q. The task of chasing 16-under tomorrow is it completely out of your mind, or are you just focused on you?

STACY LEWIS: I think I play a round like I played the last couple of days, really. That's all I can do, and hope for some help, you know, in those situations. I think she shot 10-under today. Those rounds are hard to follow up. I know what that is like. I just felt like if I could get close and a good round tomorrow, you never know what is going to happen.

Q. How big was it for you to put two rounds back-to-back two good rounds heading into tomorrow?

STACY LEWIS: It's huge, especially -- you know, my mind is on the Major next week, too, so I'm just trying to clean the rounds up. But I played two really solid rounds. Haven't had to fight too much, make too many par putts. I'm just excited where my game is at. The putting feels like it's coming around and that's kinda what I've been looking for the last month.

Q. You're in a similar position now than you were in 2014, maybe one shot difference, again, just play your game, let chips fall and sports take care of themselves, I guess?

STACY LEWIS: Yeah, I mean, there's -- in this game I can't control what anybody else does. I can control how I handle myself and how I play. I'm going to play aggressively and play like I've been playing, and, you know, I'm playing well enough to come from five back. It can be done. If So Yeon goes out there and shoots 65, there is not a whole lot we can do, but if she shoots 1- or 2-under, I think somebody can catch her.
