QUICK KICKS

>> Arkansas secured the eight-seed of the 2017 SEC Tournament with a 4-5-1 conference record. With wins over nine-seed Ole Miss, one-seed South Carolina, and advancing past Vanderbilt on PK's, the Razorbacks are in the final for the second-straight year.

>> This is the fourth tournament final appearance in program history. Arkansas has never won the SEC Tournament.

>> The win over South Carolina was Arkansas' third victory over a top-five program in the last two seasons and the first over the Gamecocks since 2005.

>> Of Arkansas' 11 wins this season, nine have come by way of a shutout and all 13 points in conference play were by shutout also. Arkansas' 10 shutouts are good for second in the SEC and tie for the most in school history (2009).

>> In nine of those shutouts, the Razorback defense has held opponents to 17 shots or less and a .338 shot on goal percentage. Redshirt junior goalkeeper Jordan Harris has eight full shutouts this year.

>> Arkansas is the lowest-seeded team to ever reach the SEC Tournament final and the only team to ever reach the final from a bottom-four seed since the tournament field expanded in 2012.

>> Since Colby Hale became the head coach in 2013, Arkansas has only missed the SEC Tournament one time.

>> Freshman Parker Goins still leads the team in goals (8) and points (22) heading into the conference tournament. Both are top-five totals among all SEC players.

>> With its win over Ole Miss on Sunday, Arkansas secured its ninth 10-win season in school history and third under head coach Colby Hale.

>> 22 of Arkansas' 42 goals this season have come from freshmen. Freshmen Parker Goins (8) and Taylor Malham (6) lead all Razorback goal scorers this year.

RAZORBACK NOTES

Arkansas Going For First Tournament Championship

>> For the second-straight year, Arkansas has found itself in the SEC Tournament championship game, winning three games in five days as the eight-seed in the field.

>> Arkansas is the lowest seed in tournament history to ever reach the final.

>> Sunday's match against Texas A&M will be Arkansas' fourth tournament final appearance in program history, tying for third-most in league history (Florida, 17; Auburn, 5; Vanderbilt, 4; Tennessee, 4; Texas A&M, 4)

>> Arkansas has only allowed one goal so far in the tournament over three matches, the lowest average (0.33) of any team that reached the semifinals.

>> Sophomore Kayla McKeon has recorded a point in every match of the tournament, including scoring the lone goal in the 1-1 tie with Vanderbilt in the semifinals.

>> McKeon's four points in three tournament games currently ties for second among all players in the field.

Record Watch - Jessi Hartzler Running Up Career Charts

>> Over the last four years, senior Jessi Hartzler has proven to be one of the best Razorback soccer players in recent history.

>> Hartzler has played in 84 career games going into Sunday's SEC Tournament match. She's currently fourth all-time in school history in matches played and is one away from tying Alexandra Fischer (2013-16) for third all-time.

>> Lindsay Mayo holds the Razorback all-time record with 90 matches played in a career.

>> Hartzler also has six game-winning goals in her career, with two coming this season. With one more game-winner, she would tie for eighth all time with Christina Burger (2002-06).

Arkansas Ties School Record With 10th Shutout

>> A 53rd minute goal by sophomore Tori Cannata followed by a great defensive stand allowed Arkansas to knock off top-seed South Carolina, 1-0, in the Southeastern Conference Tournament quarterfinals Tuesday night at the Orange Beach Sportsplex.

>> Cannata found herself in the right place at the right time after a deflection from Kayla McKeon in the middle of the box to fire home her first goal of the year. It was her second goal of her career and first game winner.

>> The defense withstood a South Carolina onslaught of 20 shots, four that were on target. Redshirt junior goalkeeper Jordan Harris came up with three saves in the match, notching her seventh win of the year.

>> It's Arkansas' 10th shutout of the campaign, tying the school record for the most clean sheets in a single season (2009).

>> It was also the first win over South Carolina since 2005 and just the fourth win over the Gamecocks in the all-time series dating back to 1995.

>> Tuesday's match was Arkansas' 10th match of the year decided by one goal and fourth match that had the Razorbacks coming out on the winning side. The three shots was also Arkansas' lowest shot output in a match this season. In games that its totaled 10 shots or less this season, Arkansas is 3-4-1.

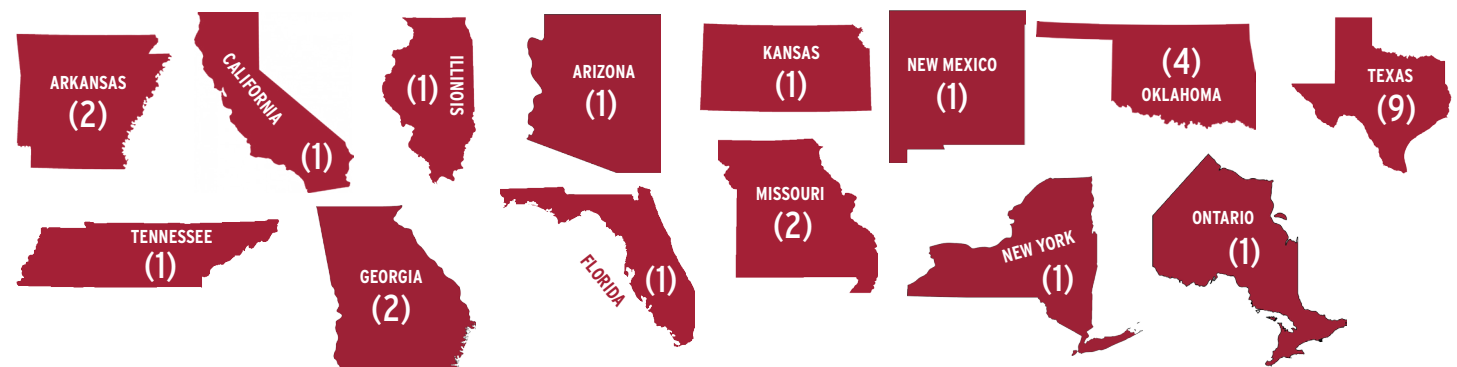

PLAYERS BY STATE

After a historic 18-5-1 season marked by several program milestones, Hale and Razorback Soccer concluded its 2016 season ranked No. 19 on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) top 25 poll after peaking at No. 11 following a school-record eight-straight wins from Sept. 9, 2016 to Oct. 9, 2016.

Hale guided the team to their first win against a top-10 opponent against then-No. 2-ranked Duke on Aug. 26 in front of a record-breaking crowd at Razorback Field. Arkansas would also upset then-No. 4-ranked Florida 2-1 on Sept. 16 at home for the program's first victory against the Gators.

These two wins against top-five programs and other quality opponents would catapult Arkansas to its highest NCAA RPI ranking in school history, topping out at No. 9 on Sept. 28.

Hale would also gain the unique honor of being Arkansas' winningest soccer coach after earning his 46th career win as a Razorback following a 1-0 victory over North Texas on Sept. 11. He would later lead the team to its fourth SEC Tournament, and following wins against Vanderbilt and Auburn in the quarterfinals and semifinals, Arkansas competed in its first SEC Tournament championship match since 1996. The Razorbacks also earned their third NCAA Tournament bid in four years and hosted the program's first NCAA Tournament match at home in school history.

Soccer completed the 2015 season at 6-11-1. Season highlights included a 2-2 tie in double-overtime against No. 10 South Carolina on Oct. 2, the program's first result against a top-10 program since 2007; the selection of hybrid defender/midfielder Carly Hoke as the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year; and senior defender Teni Butler being named by the Razorback Foundation as a Red Tie Co-Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Home attendance was also strong for a second consecutive year, with the all-time attendance mark at Razorback Field topped on Aug. 23 against TCU.

Hale and the Razorbacks finished the 2014 season with a 9-7-6 overall mark, giving the program its first back-to-back winning season since the 2008 and 2009 seasons. Arkansas was also the No. 9 seed in the conference tournament and earned the program's second consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament (second in school history). After picking up a 3-2 overtime victory at Oklahoma in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, the Razorbacks fell at No. 3 Stanford, 1-0, in the Round of 32 to end the season.

In just his second season at the helm, Hale posted the most successful season in Razorback soccer history at 15-8-1, leading his team to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's 28 year history. In the team's tournament debut, Hale guided the Razorbacks past Oklahoma State and St. John's to the final round of 16.

Hale had a plan to take the program to the next level and set the bar high in his first season at Arkansas. In the 2012 preseason, he talked about the team's "identity" and "blue collar mentality," and how the Razorbacks would be dependent on a team concept and not the play of two or three stars. Hale and the Razorbacks saw the results of that blue collar mentality and hard work pay off with a dramatic turnaround.

The Razorbacks were 4-14-0 and 2-9-0 in the Southeastern Conference the year before Hale arrived on campus (2011). In 2012, with a senior class of just two - Andrea Carlson and Allie Chandler - Hale led the Razorbacks to a 9-10-1 overall record and 6-6-1 finish in the SEC.

That step led to a 4.5 game improvement from 2011, including four more wins in conference play.

Hale became just the third of eight Arkansas soccer head coaches to win his first game as coach, topping Austin Peay 2-1 at home on Aug. 17 2012. Two days later, the Razorbacks followed up with their first big win of the season by beating Texas 1-0 for the first time in program history in Fayetteville.

Prior to landing the top spot at Arkansas, Hale, one of the nation's fastest rising assistant coaches, helped guide multiple programs to success on the field and in the classroom. He moved to Arkansas after spending the previous nine seasons at the University of Central Florida (UCF), helping the Knights to 130 wins (130-50-22) with six conference championships (four Conference USA, two Atlantic Sun), seven NCAA Tournament bids and eight wins in the postseason. In seven years at Conference USA, UCF was 56-11-9 with four league titles.

RAZORBACK NOTES

Keeping It Clean

>> Nine of Arkansas' 11 wins have been of the shutout variety this season.

>> Overall, Arkansas has 10 clean sheets, which ties the school record for most shutouts in a season (2009).

>> Redshirt junior Jordan Harris has been in goal for the last seven shutouts including the scoreless tie at Vanderbilt (Sept. 21).

>> In the nine shutout victories, Arkansas has scored in the first half seven of those times.

>> The Arkansas defense has allowed 10 or more shots in eight of those shutouts, but has yet to allow more than five shots on goal in any of those matches.

Jordan Harris Steps Up

>> Since taking over starting goalkeeper duties in the SEC opener, redshirt junior Jordan Harris has racked up seven full shutouts and has allowed just 11 goals.

>> Harris tied a season-high five saves against Vanderbilt, and again on Tuesday against No. 3 South Carolina in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals.

>> With eight total shutouts on the year, Harris ranks second in the SEC in clean sheets.

>> Harris' goals against average (0.69) is currently on pace to be one of the best in a season in school history. Britni Williams currently holds the single-season record with a 0.82 GAA in the 2009 season. That year, Williams allowed only 16 goals in 19 matches with 98 saves.

More Than A Goal Scorer

>> In 2016, Stefani Doyle scored six times with three assists for 15 points as a freshman.

>> This year, Doyle still has four goals, but

has been more of a weapon in the run of play as she ties for the team lead with six assists and is second on the team with 14 points.

>> Doyle's nine career assists is already the most among all active Razorbacks and is one assist away from entering the top-11 in program history for assists in a single season.

>> Over the last two seasons, Doyle has racked up 29 points', 15 coming in her freshman season. In matches that she totals at least one point, Arkansas is 12-4.

Continuing The Trend

>> Since Colby Hale arrived as head coach, a major emphasis has been put on the fan experience. The fans have responded as 2016 was the program's highest-attended season since its inception in 1986.

>> This year, in the home opener against Penn State, Arkansas drew 3,401 fans, breaking the single-game Arkansas record for the fourth-straight season.

>> Arkansas had its fifth match of 1,000 or more fans when it hosted No. 3 South Carolina two weeks ago. 1,325 fans were in attendance, the third-highest attended game this season.

>> Last year 15,115 fans entered Razorback Field over 11 home games, good for an average of 1,374. That average was the 11th-highest in the nation and third-highest in the SEC.

>> Arkansas currently ranks 10th in the nation in average attendance (1,354) and 8th in total attendance (13,538). Those totals are fourth-highest in the SEC.

Goins Continues Strong Freshman Year

>> Freshman Parker Goins was tabbed as the SEC Freshman of the Week after scoring two game-winning goals against Mississippi State and Oral Roberts.

>> Goins currently leads the Razorbacks with eight goals on the year, which is good for a tie for fourth in the SEC.

>> Her eight goals are the second most by an Arkansas freshman in the last 21 years, trailing current sophomore Kayla McKeon, who had nine goals a year ago in her freshman year.

Right Place, Right Time

>> Freshman Taylor Malham and Parker Goins have been coming up clutch this year, scoring seven of Arkansas' 11 game-winning goals this year.

>> Malham's scores were crucial in the 2-0 win over North Texas (8/20) and the 2-0 win over James Madison (9/1).

>> She followed that with her second goal in as many matches as she rocketed home the lone goal in the 1-0 victory over Ole Miss in the SEC Tournament First Round.

>> Goins' game-winners came against Abilene Christian, Mississippi State, Oral Roberts, and LSU. She is currently tied for second in the SEC with four game-winning goals.

Goal Fest To A New Level

>> Arkansas didn't have too much of a problem with visiting SWAC opponent Mississippi Valley State. However, what was surprising was the margin of victory.

>> The Razorbacks defeated the Devilettes, 11-0, tying for its largest goal output in program history.
>> The 11 goals were the most Arkansas has scored in a single game since 2004 and it was the most by an SEC team since 2005.
>> Eight different players scored at least once and 13 players recorded at least one point in the match.

>> The 11 Arkansas goals ties for the third-highest scored by any team in the nation in a match this season.

>> 22 of those 42 goals have come from freshman, including eight from Parker Goins and six from Taylor Malham, which lead the team.

>> The 22 freshmen goals are the second-most of any SEC team this year.

>> In seven of its 11 wins, Arkansas has scored at least twice. Two of those wins (Abilene Christian, Mississippi Valley State), Arkansas scored six or more goals.

>> 12 different Razorbacks have scored at least one time this season, including seven freshmen. 17 different players have recorded at least one point through the 20 matches.

Goins Named To Top Drawer Soccer Freshman Preseason Best XI

>> Freshman forward Parker Goins was named to Top Drawer Soccer's Freshmen Best XI prior to the season.

>> Goins, a native of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, is a four-star recruit out of Union High School, where she was ranked as the No. 26 player in the nation by IMG Academy and one of three high school athletes to participate in the U.S. team camp prior to the 2018 FIFA U-20 World Cup.

Goins' Four Goals Lead Razorbacks Past Abilene Christian

>> Freshman Parker Goins had yet to score a goal through the season's first three matches, but broke out of that slump in a huge way against Abilene Christian.

>> Goins scored the first four of Arkansas' six goals in the match as part of a huge 6-1 victory for the first win at Razorback Field in 2017.
>> The performance marked the first time a Hog player scored a hat trick since Ashleigh Ellenwood in 2015 and the first four-goal game since Julie Williford in 2001.

>> Goins is only the second freshman in school history to score four goals in a game, joining Mary Howard from the 1987 season.

>> Goins is one of eight players in the nation to score four goals in a game this season.

>> Her eight goals last year was a career-high and four of her goals were game-winners.

>> Hartzler earned NCAA National Player of the Week honors after scoring the game-winner over No. 4 Florida and went on to be named a second team All-SEC and NSCAA All-South Region player.

Racking Up The Wins

>> Since being hired as the eighth head coach in program history, Hale has already racked up more wins than any coach in the 32 years of the program.

>> With the 1-0 win over LSU, Hale now has 68 career wins as a head coach, all at Arkansas, 23 more than the previous record held by Janet Rayfield (45).

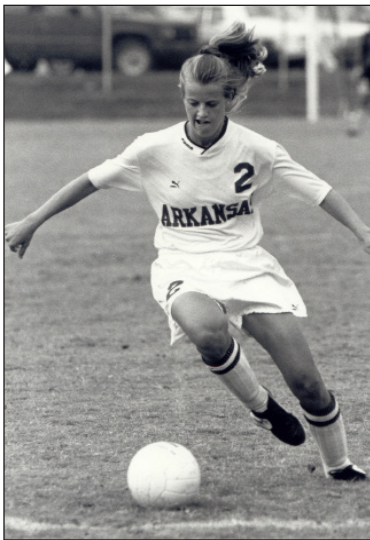
