► BY THE NUMBERS

18

» Mercedes Russell is only 18 rebounds away from becoming the sixth Lady Vol to record 1,000 during her career. She enters the game with 982.

20

» When Tennessee and Arkansas face off Thursday night, the Lady Vols will be trying to reach the 20-win plateau in a season for the 42nd-consecutive year.

» No. 21 for the Lady Vols needs only 21 points to reach the 1,500 mark for her career. She is close to becoming the sixth Lady Vol ever to score 1,500 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

TEAM NOTES

TENNESSEE VS. ARKANSAS

■ No. 11/11 Tennessee (19-4, 7-3 SEC) is back on the road Thursday night, traveling to Fayetteville to take on the Arkansas Razorbacks (12-11, 3-7 SEC) at Bud Walton Arena.

■ This will mark the Lady Vols' first visit to UA since Jan. 14, 2016, when they dropped a 64-59 decision to the home team.

■ Points have been hard to come by for the visiting teams in this series of late, with UT scoring 60, 60 and 59 in its last three trips to Bud Walton and UA tallying 60, 57 and 46 in its last three treks to Thompson-Boling Arena.

■ Tennessee has won two straight and three of its last four recently after dropping three of four vs. a quartet of ranked foes.

■ The Lady Vols are coming off a road win on Sunday, scoring 31 points in the fourth quarter to gain a season sweep and extend a series win streak vs. Vanderbilt to nine games, 74-64.

■ Arkansas, meanwhile, has won only twice in its last nine games, but it halted a four-game losing skid on Sunday with a breakthrough road win at Alabama.

■ The Razorbacks also own a road win against Auburn this season.

42ND STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASON IN SIGHT

■ UT takes aim at victory number 20 this season, and it will have to go through Arkansas to get it.

■ The Lady Vols are seeking to hit 20 for the 42nd consecutive season.

■ When UT reaches 20 wins, it will have matched its victory total from last season's 20-12 campaign.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

■ Brett Dolan (play-by-play) Kikko Haydar (analyst) and Haley Maxwell (reporter) will describe the action for the UT-Arkansas online broadcast on SECn+.

■ Mickey Dearstone is handling the call for IMG College/Lady Vol Network radio/online broadcasts for the 19th season. A link to the live audio stream can be found on each game's Hoops Central page or the Lady Vol schedule on UTSports.com.

■ Air time for games on the Lady Vol Radio Network generally occurs 30 minutes prior to tip-off.

UT'S UPCOMING SCHEDULE

■ Tennessee is in a stretch where it is playing three out of four games on the road, with the Arkansas contest serving as the final date.

■ UT began at LSU, hosted A&M and visited Vandy on Sunday.

■ The Lady Vols are back home this Sunday, as Georgia comes to Rocky Top for the annual "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game at 3 p.m. ET on the SEC Network.

■ UT will play two in a row at home, hosting Alabama next Thursday (6:30 ET, SEC Network).

■ In another scheduling note, UT's Feb. 18 game at Missouri has been set for 1 p.m. CT (2 ET) on ESPNU.

TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY

■ UT is 384-67 in SEC regular-season games through the Vanderbilt match-up, winning 18 championships and capturing 17 SEC tourney titles through the years.

■ During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 67-23 in league games, making Warlick the top-ranked active SEC coach in terms of winning percentage in league play at .744 among coaches with at least one season at a school.

■ South Carolina's Dawn Staley is the next coach behind Warlick at .684 (104-48), followed by UK's Matthew Mitchell at .639 (106-60).

■ In only her sixth year as a head coach, Warlick already ranks fourth in total league wins among active SEC coaches and has won regular season titles in 2013 and 2015, and a tourney crown in 2014.

■ Warlick is 80-27 in non-conference games.

RPI WATCH / STRENGTH OF SKED.

■ Tennessee ranks No. 11 in the NCAA Women's Basketball RPI, as of the Feb. 5 report.

■ Below are 15 teams (17 games when UT meets South Carolina for the second time) on UT's schedule this season that are ranked in the top 100. The teams the Lady Vols already have played are underlined.

■ Based on cumulative opposition (past and future opponents, Tennessee is No. 13 this week in the NCAA Toughest Schedule Report.

BRACKETOLOGY SAYS...

■ ESPN's Charlie Creme has UT projected for a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and slotted in the Spokane Regional in his Feb. 5 edition of Bracketology.

■ Creme has the Lady Vols hosting a first round game vs. No. 14 Drake and meeting either No. 6 Duke or No. 11 Quinnipiac in the second round.

UT VS. RANKED/UNRANKED FOES

■ Tennessee is 5-3 this season vs. ranked opponents, including 2-2 vs. top-10 foes and 1-2 vs. top-five teams.

■ The Lady Vols were 5-4, 4-2 and 2-2 last year vs. ranked, top-10 and top-five squads.

■ Over the past two years, UT is 10-7 vs. ranked, 6-4 vs. top-10 and 3-4 vs. top-five opponents.

■ UT is 14-1 vs. unranked teams this season and had won 14 in a row vs. squads outside the top 25, including last year's NCAA First Round win over Dayton, until LSU knocked off the Lady Vols in Baton Rouge on Jan. 28.

BASKETBALL ROLLING AT ROCKY TOP

■ Both of Tennessee's basketball teams are ranked among the top 15 in their respective AP Polls, with the Lady Vols standing 11th and the Vols ranked No. 15 in the men's AP Poll.

■ The women are 19-4 and the guys are 18-5, combining for a 37-9 overall mark, including 21-3 at home this season.

■ Ohio State, Duke and Michigan also have both the men's and women's program's ranked this week.

■ Jaime Nared (26.5 ppg., 10.0 rpg., 52% FG, 84% FT) was named the SEC Player of the Week on

Tuesday, while Anastasia Hayes (13.0 ppg., 4.5 rpg., 50% FG, 50% 3FG) was named the SEC Freshman of the Week.

■ Hayes, Renna Davis and Evina Westbrook make Tennessee the only school to have three SEC Freshman of the Week honorees.

■ Mercedes Russell is 18 rebounds shy of 1,000 and 21 points short of 1,500 for her career.

■ She is on track to become only the sixth Lady Vol to reach 1,500 points and 1,000 rebounds. The others in that club are Chamique Holdscaw, Glory Johnson, Bashaara Graves, Sheila Frost and Tamika Catchings.

■ Holly Warlick is three wins shy of her 150th career victory.

■ Evina Westbrook's 5.0 assists-per-game average ranks No. 1 all-time by a UT freshman.

■ Only five players in Lady Vol history have averaged 5.0 assists for a season, including Dawn Marsh (three times), Holly Warlick (twice), Ariel Massengale, Michelle Marciniak and Lea Henry.

■ UT has led every game this season at the half except for two. UT trailed Mississippi State by 13 and was tied vs. Auburn.

■ UT's roster features seven players 6-2 or taller, tying the 2004-05 team as the second tallest in Lady Vol history behind the 2014-15 unit that boasted eight.

■ Tennessee is 17-1 when it outrebounds its opponents and 1-3 when it doesn't.

■ UT is 17-0 when leading with 5:00 left in the game and 1-4 when trailing at that point.

■ The Lady Vols have allowed only five opponents to score more than 71 points (Marquette - 99, Texas - 75, Vandy - 73, A&M - 79, Notre Dame - 84) and have allowed only six teams to shoot better than 41 percent from the field (Vanderbilt in Knoxville, .491; Texas A&M, .484 in Knoxville; Notre Dame, .478; Vanderbilt, .469; Marquette, .437; and Miss. State, .418).

■ After turning the ball over 28 times vs. Notre Dame, UT has averaged 13.4 turnovers in its last five contests.

■ Holly Warlick has started the same five players every game thus far. That quintet includes Jaime Nared and Renna Davis at the forward positions, Mercedes Russell at center and Evina Westbrook and Meme Jackson at guard.

■ It's the longest Tennessee has opened a season with the same starting five since at least the 1977-78 season. Box scores that season and prior do not indicate who started.

■ In Lady Vol history, the most recent long streak for the same starting five reached 11 games in 2007-

08, when Pat Summitt chose the same lineup of Candace Parker, Angie Bjorklund, Nicky Anosike, Shannon Bobbitt and Alexis Hornbuckle to report for the opening tip. UT went 10-1 in that span and won the NCAA title with a 34-3 record and the SEC title with a 14-0 mark. In game 12, in the team's visit to Chicago, Parker missed curfew and didn't get the starting nod vs. DePaul on Jan. 2, 2008.

■ UT has three players who've logged 40+ minute games, including Jaime Nared (7), Mercedes Russell (2) and Evina Westbrook (1).

■ Tennessee is averaging 79.0 points and giving up 77.0 vs. ranked teams, and those numbers are 81.4 to 58.6 vs. unranked foes.

■ On the boards, the Lady Vols have 46.9 to 34.6 advantage vs. unranked teams but only a 41.2 to 39.8 edge vs. ranked programs.

■ UT is averaging 83.6 and allowing 60.8 in home games. On the road, it's 75.1 to 68.5.

■ Tennessee has owned a double-digit advantage at the intermission in 11 contests.

■ UT has three starters averaging double figures in scoring, including seniors Jaime Nared (17.5) and Mercedes Russell (16.8), and freshman Rennie Davis (10.9). Freshmen Anastasia Hayes (9.9) and Evina Westbrook (9.2) are on the brink of double digits.

■ Tennessee has outscored its opponents in the points-in-the-paint category in 16 of 23 games, averaging a 41.1 to 32.3 difference.

■ The Lady Vols bested their foes in second chance points 14 times and tied on three occasions.

■ Tennessee has won the points on fast break war in 17 games, averaging 13.2 per contest. In losses, that number is 9.8.

NATIONALLY-NOTABLE STATS

■ UT is No. 1 nationally in free throw attempts (561) and No. 2 in free throws made (398).

■ UT is No. 4 in defensive rebs. per game (31.0).

■ Mercedes Russell is No. 4 in field goal pct. (63.9), while UT is 18th as a team (46.8).

■ The Lady Vols are No. 6 in rebounds per game (44.96) and No. 10 in total rebounds (1,034).

■ Jaime Nared is No. 8 in free throws made (132).

■ Tennessee scored the highest point total in the NCAA this season, hitting 133 vs. Troy on Dec. 6. Interestingly enough, Troy ranks No. 2, tallying 130 points vs. Montevallo three days later on Dec. 9.

■ Mercedes is No. 1 overall in the league in field goal percentage (63.9) and Rennie Davis is No. 2 among freshmen (49.5).

■ Evina Westbrook is No. 2 overall in assists (5.0), standing No. 1 among freshmen while Anastasia Hayes is No. 3 (3.3) among rookies.

■ Rennie Davis is No. 2 among freshmen in rebounds per contest at 7.2.

1,500/1,000 WATCH FOR RUSSELL

■ Mercedes Russell is on track to become only the sixth player in Lady Vol history to reach the 1,500-mark in both scoring and rebounding.

■ Russell currently has 1,479 points and 982 rebounds through 23 games, needing 21 points and 18 boards to reach the 1,500/1,000 club.

■ She stands 24th on the school's all-time scoring list, with Dena Head (23rd, 1,483), Daedra Charles (22nd, 1,495), Michelle Snow (21st, 1,497) and Gwen Jackson (20th, 1,508) just ahead of her.

■ Russell is seventh in career rebounds, just behind Mary Ostrowski (6th, 994) and Tamika Catchings (5th, 1,004).

UT-ARKANSAS SERIES NOTES

■ Tennessee holds a 29-3 all-time record vs. Arkansas, dating back to Feb. 29, 1992, when UT prevailed, 105-59, in the initial meeting.

■ The Lady Vols are 14-1 in Knoxville, 13-2 in Fayetteville and 2-0 at neutral sites.

■ Tennessee is 1-0 in overtime and 2-0 in the postseason vs. UA, meeting for the first time in SEC Tournament play in 2016. UT prevailed, 68-51, in the second round in Jacksonville, Fla., on March 3 of that year.

■ UT is 6-1 vs. the Razorbacks during the Holly Warlick era, including 3-0 at home, 2-1 on the road and 1-0 in SEC Tournament play.

■ All three road games in the series under Warlick have been close, with UT winning by six in 2013 (60-54) and by nine in 2015 (60-51), while losing by five (59-64) in 2016.

■ Since then, however, UT has won by 18 at home, by 17 in the SEC Tournament and by 13 at home vs. Arkansas.

■ UT's only setback to the Razorbacks in Knoxville came at Thompson-Boling Arena on Feb. 23, 2012, when Arkansas walked away with a 72-71 overtime victory and ended an 18-game Lady Vol winning streak in the series.

■ A 75-57 triumph over Arkansas in Knoxville on Feb. 4, 2016, gave Holly Warlick the 100th win of her head coaching career in year number four at Tennessee.

■ Despite the series disparity, Tennessee has overcome some significant deficits to claim some recent wins vs. UA.

■ UT overcame a nine-point second-half gap in Fayetteville on Jan. 11, 2015, to win, 60-51; an eight-point first-half deficit to win 70-60 in Knoxville on Jan. 30, 2014; and an 11-point second-half gap on Feb. 24, 2013, in Fayetteville to win, 60-54.

■ The last time the two teams faced each other as ranked squads was in 2003 when #4-ranked Tennessee won, 92-79, over #12-ranked Arkansas in Fayetteville.

■ No. 1/1 Tennessee and unranked Arkansas met in an NCAA Final Four semifinal game in Kansas City, Mo., on March 27, 1998, and the Lady Vols cruised past the Razorbacks, 86-58, en route to their perfect 39-0 season.

■ Tennessee has had one player from the state of Arkansas in its history. Standout Shekinna Stricklen (2008-12) hailed from Morrilton, Ark.

LAST MEETING BETWEEN UT AND UA

■ Led by Mercedes Russell's 15th double-double of the season, Tennessee took care of business over Arkansas, 59-46, in Thompson-Boling Arena on Feb. 19, 2017.

■ After a 2:52 scoring drought by UT to start the first quarter, Russell got things going for the Lady Vols (17-10, 8-6 SEC) by scoring the first five points. She finished the day with 13 points and 10 rebounds, passing Candace Parker for the third most double-doubles by a junior in Tennessee history.

■ Jaime Nared broke out of her recent shooting slump to account for a game-high 19 points behind 3-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. She added nine rebounds and two steals in the contest despite early foul trouble.

■ All-SEC forward Jessica Jackson shouldered much of the scoring burden for the Razorbacks (13-14, 2-12 SEC), accounting for 18 points on 7-of-11 shooting, including 4-of-5 from behind the arc. However, Tennessee's defense kept the remaining Razorbacks in check, with Jackson's teammates shooting just 33 percent from the field. Malica Monk was the only other Razorback who scored in double figures with 11.

■ Alexa Middleton started slow in the game but picked up momentum in the second quarter, connecting on her first 3-pointer with 2:36 remaining in the period. She continued to serve as a spark for Tennessee's offense in the second half, finishing the contest with 15. Sunday marked the third consecutive game Middleton has recorded double-digit scoring and the ninth time this year.

LAST TIME IN FAYETTEVILLE

■ Second-half turnovers proved troublesome for No. 13/15 Tennessee on Jan. 14, 2016, and the Lady Vols' late rally fell short in a 64-59 loss to Arkansas at Bud Walton Arena.

■ Diamond DeShields paced Tennessee (11-5, 2-2 SEC) with 14 points on 6-of-16 shooting, but the Lady Vols committed 15 of their season-high 24 turnovers in the second half as Arkansas (7-10, 1-3 SEC) seized control of the game.

■ Mercedes Russell posted a double-double with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

■ After trailing by 11 points at halftime, Arkansas opened the third quarter red hot with a 17-2 run, capitalizing on five-straight Tennessee turnovers early on to take a 38-34 lead. Jackson scored 10 points in the third quarter as the Razorbacks played with renewed confidence and headed to the fourth up 43-40.

■ Arkansas' Jessica Jackson made all four of her free throws in the final 20 seconds to hold off UT's late comeback attempt. Jackson led all scorers with 25 points on 7-of-18 shooting and went 3-of-7 from 3-point range.

ABOUT ARKANSAS

■ Arkansas, picked to finish 14th in the SEC by both the coaches and media, stands in 10th place entering this game at 12-11 overall and 3-7 in the SEC.

■ The Razorbacks returned three starters and seven total letterwinners from last season's squad, which finished 13-17 overall and 2-14 in the SEC in 14th place.

■ UA replaced Jimmy Dykes with Arkansas native and graduate (1993) Mike Neighbors as head coach.

■ Neighbors was 98-41 at Washington from 2014-17, guiding the Huskies to the 2016 NCAA Final Four and a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances.

ARKANSAS LAST TIME OUT (ARK 74, BAMA 66)

■ Senior Devin Cospier led four Razorback women's basketball players in double-figure scoring in a 74-66 Southeastern Conference win over Alabama in Tuscaloosa on Sunday.

■ Vanderbilt was led in scoring by freshman Chelsie Hall who had 19 points, six rebounds and five assists.

NARED ADDING ON TO 1,000/500

"BIG GAME" JAIME NARED

■ Jaime Nared leads the Lady Vols with 17 games of 20 or more points during her career and nine this season.

■ Nared also has a knack for making big plays and playing big in big games.

■ Last season vs. Notre Dame she hit a jumper with 10.3 seconds remaining to lift the Lady Vols to a 71-69 upset of No. 6/6 Notre Dame.

■ She had 27 points and hit the game-winning free throws in the closing seconds of last season's win over No. 4 South Carolina.

■ She scored 30 last season in an upset of #3/2 Mississippi State and tossed in 28 vs. Louisville in the NCAA Tournament Second Round.

■ This season, she was critical in the victory over No. 2/4 Texas, posting a double-double of 15 points and 12 rebounds. She also had 28 points vs. Stanford, 21 vs. South Carolina and 23 vs. Texas A&M at home.

KEY IMPACTS FROM NEWCOMERS

■ UT features three SEC All-Freshman candidates on its 2017-18 roster and a junior college transfer who have made key impacts to this team.

■ Tennessee's trio of forward Renna Davis (10.9 ppg., 7.2 rpg.), guard Anastasia Hayes (9.9 ppg, 2.7 rpg., 3.3 apg.) guard Evina Westbrook (9.2 ppg., 3.0 rpg., 5.0 apg.) have helped fuel UT's 19-4 start, with Davis and Westbrook starting every game and Hayes serving as Holly Warlick's usual first choice off the bench.

■ A total of 14 true freshmen (adding redshirt freshman Candace Parker makes it 15) have scored in double figures in their first seasons as Lady Vols. UT has three chasing that goal this year in Davis, Westbrook and Hayes.

■ Only three times before have two freshmen on the same team at UT scored in double figures for a season, but three players on the same squad have never accomplished that feat.

■ Those doing it on the same team were Shekinna Stricklen (13.3) and Glory Johnson (10.2) in 2008-09, Tamika Catchings (18.2) and Semeka Randall (15.9) in 1997-98 and Bridgette Gordon (14.2) and Sheila Frost (12.2) in 1985-86.

■ Davis is averaging 7.2 rebounds per game, which ranks sixth among all-time Lady Vol freshmen for a season average behind Sheila Frost (9.4), Chamique Holdscraw (9.1), Candace Parker (8.3), Bashaara Graves (8.3) and Tamika Catchings (8.0).

■ Hayes has hit double figures 14 times, followed by Davis (13) and Westbrook (10).

■ Davis has four double-doubles to her credit, pulling down double-digit rebound totals seven times.

■ Two-time JUCO All-American Cheridene Green averages 4.8 points and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 57% from the field. She has scored in double figures four times and has pulled down double-digits in rebounds twice.

GETTING OFF TO GREAT STARTS

■ Tennessee has made a habit of getting off to great starts. A 508-322 first quarter tally over opponents backs that up.

■ UT has led at the end of the first quarter in 19 of 23 games, and it has led in seven SEC games while trailing in two (at A&M, MSU) and tying in one (vs. Vandy).

■ Tennessee scored 30 points in the first quarter to Ole Miss' 20, tying the most points the Lady Vols have ever scored in any quarter against an SEC opponent.

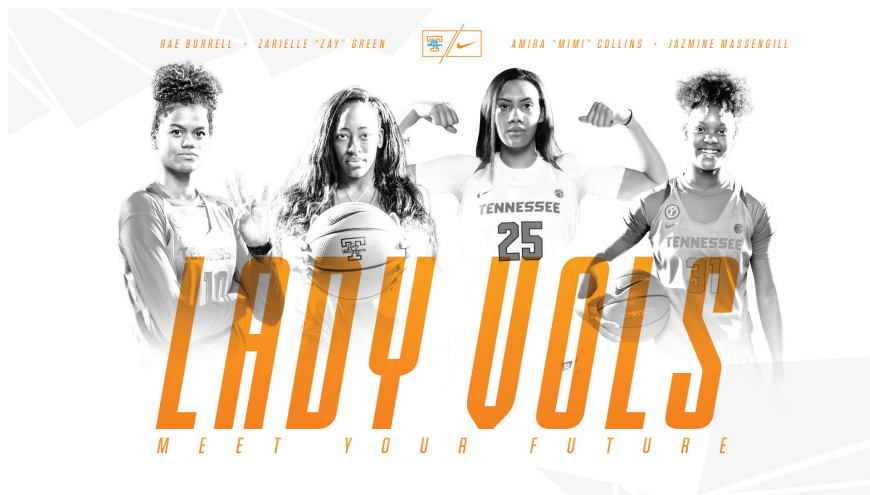

■ Against Troy, Tennessee had a 16-0 spree spanning the third and fourth quarters. UT also had a 16-0 first-quarter spurt vs. Long Beach State.

■ A 15-0 run in the first quarter vs. UCA flipped a 6-5 Sugar Bears lead into a 20-6 Lady Vols advantage.

■ Against Marquette, UT opened the game on a 10-0 spurt and later used a 14-0 blitz to come from seven down.

■ UT had 12-0 runs vs. Alabama State and Troy (1Q, opened those games) as well as Wichita State (spanning 1Q-2Q).

■ The Big Orange used an 11-0 burst to push ahead of Notre Dame, 27-10 in the first quarter and an 11-0 fourth-quarter spurt to blow past Texas A&M in Knoxville.

■ Tennessee used an 11-0 run vs. Oklahoma State, bridging the first and second quarters, to extend its lead to 25-10 over the Cowgirls. UT also had 11-0 sprees vs. Wichita State (3Q), South Dakota (spanning 2Q-3Q) and LBSU (3Q).

■ UT had a 10-0 second-quarter run vs. Stanford to push the lead to 36-20 at the half.

■ Tennessee burst out to a 10-0 lead on Kentucky at Rupp Arena en route to a 26-7 first quarter.

■ UT used a 10-0 fourth quarter run vs. Vandy to turn a five-point edge into a 15-point lead and eventual 13-point victory over the Commodores.

■ UT used a 10-0 fourth quarter run to spur a 13-2

surge in the final 2:00 to close out a win vs. Auburn.

■ Conversely, the biggest runs UT has given up in 2017-18 have been a 14-0 fourth quarter run by Notre Dame, a 14-0 run by Ole Miss to close out the first half, a 12-0 run by Marquette spanning the second and third quarters and a 12-0 Notre Dame run in the fourth period.

STREAK BUSTERS

■ Tennessee has put an end to some negative streaks this season and last, as the Lady Vols climb back into the national conversation.

■ Last season, UT ended a six-game losing streak in the Notre Dame series, defeating the #6/6 Fighting Irish in Knoxville.

■ The Lady Vols ended a three-game skid vs. Texas this season with a home victory over the No. 2/4 ranked Longhorns.

■ UT ended a five-game venue losing skid at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, winning there for the first time since Dec. 4, 2005, with an 83-71 defeat of the No. 18/24 Cardinal on Dec. 21.

■ UT ended a two-game losing streak at Rupp Arena (the Kentucky women usually play in Memorial Coliseum) and beat UK in Lexington for only the third time in the last seven visits.

■ The Lady Vols brought an end to two more bad jags a year ago, ending three-game dry spells vs. #3/2 Mississippi State and #4/4 South Carolina, both on the road.

FIRST NO. 1 SIGNING CLASS SINCE '08

■ Tennessee's 2017 women's basketball signing class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by several recruiting services, including espnW HoopGurlz and Prospectsnation.com.

■ The class is the highest rated of the Holly Warlick era, which was preceded by the No. 3 group from 2013 and a No. 6-rated class in 2014.

■ UT last signed a No. 1 class in 2008, when Glory Johnson (No. 3), Amber Gray (No. 4), Shekinna Stricklen (No. 8), Alicia Manning (No. 15), Alyssia Brewer (No. 20) and Briana Bass (No. 33) joined a program led by Pat Summitt with Warlick and current assistant Dean Lockwood as assistants.

■ UT signed four players, with each one ranked among the top 11 players in the country by Prospectsnation.com. Three of the four were rated in the top 12 by espnW HoopGurlz, with the other player ranked at No. 57.

■ New to the program are 6-0 guard Evina Westbrook of Salem, Ore./South Salem H.S. (No. 1 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 2 by Prospectsnation.com and espnW HoopGurlz), 5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes of Murfreesboro, Tenn./Riverdale H.S. (No. 6 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 9 by espnW HoopGurlz), 6-2 wing RENNIA DAVIS of Jacksonville, Fla./Ribault H.S. (ranked No. 9 overall by Prospectsnation.com and No. 12 by espnW HoopGurlz) and 6-4 post player Kasiyahna Kushkituah of Atlanta, Ga./St. Francis H.S. (No. 9 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 11 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 57 by espnW HoopGurlz).

■ Westbrook was picked by Sports Illustrated as the preseason 2018 Freshman of the Year.

■ Under Holly Warlick, the Lady Vols were No. 3 in 2013, No. 6 in 2014, No. 13 in 2015 (signed #12 & #49 players), not ranked in 2016 (three late signees, including JUCO All-American Cheridene Green), and No. 1 in 2017.

■ The 2013 class included No. 1 Mercedes Russell, while the 2014 group had No. 6 Jaime Nared.

UT FOLLOWS WITH NO. 3 2018 CLASS

■ After landing the nation's number one class in 2017, Tennessee followed that up with a class ranked as high as No. 3 by recruiting experts.

■ These are the best back-to-back signing classes for UT since a No. 5-rated unit in Pat Summitt's final season (2012 signing class) and a No. 3 collection in Warlick's first year as head coach (2013 signing class/Mercedes Russell - No. 1).

■ Zarielle "Zay" Green, a 6-0 guard from Duncanville, Texas (Duncanville H.S.); Jazmine Massengill, a 6-0 point guard from Chattanooga (Hamilton Heights Christian Academy); and Amira "Mimi" Collins, a 6-3 forward from Waldorf, Md. (Paul VI Catholic H.S. [Fairfax, Va.]) signed Nov. 8. Rae Burrell, a 6-1 wing from Henderson, Nev. (Liberty H.S.) made it official on Nov. 10.

■ Green is the highest ranked player, standing 9th by Blue Star, No. 13 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 23 by ProspectsNation.com. She committed on Oct. 23 after making Knoxville her final visit.

■ Massengill is next, coming in 11th by ProspectsNation.com, No. 22 by Blue Star and No. 26 by espnW HoopGurlz. She made her intention to attend UT known on Jan. 15, 2017.

■ Collins, UT's first commitment of the group back on Dec. 7, 2016, is ranked No. 9 by ProspectsNation.com, while Blue Star and espnW HoopGurlz slot her at No. 50 and No. 69, respectively.

■ Burrell closed out UT's four-player class, committing on Nov. 6 following a visit to campus Nov. 3-5. A player whose stock is on the rise after an impressive summer tournament showing, she is rated No. 44 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 119 by ProspectsNation.com.

■ UT had a chance to end a three-game road losing skid at Notre Dame, but it will have to wait until next time to halt what is now a four-game slide at Purcell Pavilion.

■ Tennessee ended a two-game skid vs. Texas A&M.

COMEBACKS/LEADS/DEFICITS

■ UT has seven wire-to-wire wins this season, coming against James Madison, Oklahoma State, South Dakota, Alabama State, Troy, Texas and Kentucky.

■ Tennessee has trailed in 16 games this season and came back to win in all but four of them (A&M-road, N.D., MSU, LSU).

■ UT has led at the half in 21 games, posting an 18-3 record in those games. The losses were at A&M, at Notre Dame and at LSU.

■ UT trailed MSU at the half (-13) and lost and was tied at the half vs. Auburn and won.

■ The largest first-half deficit was 13 (MSU), while the largest second-half deficit was 16 (ND).

■ The largest deficit overcome to win this season was seven in the third period vs. Marquette.

■ UT came from eight down vs. Texas A&M in the second quarter, went to overtime and lost by three.

■ UT relinquished leads of 23 (2Q, N.D.), 10 (2Q, LSU), 5 (3Q, TAMU) and 2 (1Q, MSU) in losing games.

■ Tennessee has overcome three fourth-quarter deficits: Marquette (-5/8:07); Auburn (-4/4:26); Vanderbilt2 (-1, 5:24); and one in overtime: Marquette (-1/1:11) to win this year.

■ The biggest deficit (23) and halftime deficit (20) ever overcome for a victory by UT were vs. Rutgers (55-51) on Jan. 3, 2009.

■ The largest deficit overcome for a win with Warlick as coach was vs. Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., on March 28, 2015, with UT trailing by 17, 57-40, with 6:34 remaining in the NCAA Sweet 16.

■ UT also rallied from 17-down for a 52-46 win over Virginia in the 1996 Elite Eight to reach the Final Four and win the Lady Vols' fourth NCAA title.

■ The biggest first-half deficits overcome for wins in the Warlick era were 15 in the first half at Alabama (Feb. 2, 2014) and vs. LSU (March 7, 2014) in the SEC Tournament.

■ The largest home halftime deficit overcome (13) during Warlick era was vs. Notre Dame on Jan. 16, 2017, while the biggest road halftime deficit overcome (12) was at Middle Tenn. on Nov. 8, 2013.

■ The largest positive turnaround (25 points) of the Warlick era occurred when Alabama led Tennessee by 15 in the first half and then trailed UT by as many as 16 in the second half (31) en route to a 10-point UT win (25-point final overall turnaround).

■ The largest negative turnaround game under Warlick came on Jan. 18, 2018, when #6/7 UT led #5/5 Notre Dame by 23 with 7:03 left in the second quarter, trailed by 16 with 15 seconds left (39) and wound up losing by 14 for a final 37-point reversal.

■ In SEC play, the largest negative turnaround came on Jan. 19, 2017, when UT led by 17 in the first quarter and trailed by 23 in the fourth (40) before losing by 16 at Auburn for a 33-point turnaround.

■ Other negative turnaround games under Warlick occurred vs. #2/2 Notre Dame on Jan. 20, 2014 (28), when UT led by 12 in the first half and trailed by as many as 17 in the second half on its way to a 16-point loss. On Jan. 18, 2016, UT led N.D. by four and trailed by 25 (29) before losing by 13 (17). On Jan. 28, UT led LSU by 10 in the second quarter, trailed by 14 in the fourth and lost by 11.

■ UT's largest margin of victory under Holly Warlick was 68 (110-42) vs. Lipscomb on Dec. 29, 2013.

■ Tennessee's highest point total scored under Warlick was 131 vs. Troy on Dec. 6, 2017 (131-69).

■ The largest margin of defeat during the Warlick era was 23 at #3/3 Baylor (53-76) on Dec. 18, 2012. That game also produced the worst halftime deficit in school history (25).

■ The largest margin of defeat at home was 22 vs. Baylor (88-66, Dec. 4, 2016).

■ The lowest point total in UT's modern day history came at home vs. Virginia Tech (43) on Dec. 6, 2015.

■ The lowest point total by a foe during the Holly Warlick era was 34 by Central Arkansas on Nov. 30, 2017.

2-0 vs. Wichita State (Jody Adams, Bridgette Gordon) and 3-2 vs. Ky. (Shalon Pillow, Kyra Elzy, Niya Butts).

■ **Against teams with former Tennessee staff members coaching, Warlick is 21-8**, including 0-2 vs. Alabama (Brian Johnson), 1-0 vs. Appalachian State (Angel Elderkin), 6-3 vs. Ky. (Matthew Mitchell, Kyra Elzy, Amber Smith), 2-0 vs. Lipscomb (Greg Brown), 5-2 vs. LSU (Nikki [Caldwell] Fargas, Tasha Butts, Mickie DeMoss), 2-0 vs. North Carolina (Sylvia Hatchell), 1-0 vs. South Carolina (Jolette Law) and 4-0 Vanderbilt (Carolyn Peck).

■ **Against former Lady Vols as head coaches, Warlick is 9-3**, including 5-3 vs. Nikki [Caldwell] Fargas (LSU), 1-0 vs. Tonya Edwards (Alcorn St.) and 2-0 vs. Jody Adams (Wichita State).

DEFENSIVELY SPEAKING

■ On the season, Holly Warlick's squad has held opponents to an average of 65.0 points per game, with nine foes failing to score more than 61 and only five scoring above 71 (Marquette, 99, in OT; Texas, 75; Vanderbilt, 73; Texas A&M, 79 (OT); and Notre Dame, 84).

■ **UT has held 17 opponents to 41 percent or lower field goal percentage this season.**

■ The Lady Vols held Texas A&M to only eight points in the final stanza on Feb. 1, scoring 25 of their own to blast open a tight game and win, 82-67.

■ Tennessee faced foes who entered scoring 91.8 (Troy) and 93.0 (Texas) points per game and held those squads to 69 and 75, respectively.

■ The Lady Vols held S.C., which was averaging 82.1 ppg. to 70 and 40.6 percent shooting. Star A'ja Wilson missed that game, however, due to injury.

■ UT held Texas A&M to 36.5 percent from the field in College Station.

■ Troy hit only 29 percent from the field vs. UT, while Texas shot 36.8 percent.

■ UT held Stanford to 39.7 on its home floor.

■ Tennessee set a school record for fewest points allowed in a second half, giving up only 10 to Central Arkansas on Nov. 30.

■ All 10 of those points came in the third quarter, as the Lady Vols shut out the Sugar Bears in the final stanza, marking the first time UT had "pitched a shutout" in a quarter.

■ UCA finished with 34 points for the game, marking the 10th-lowest total ever scored by a Tennessee foe.

■ UT forced Central Arkansas and Alabama State into 24 and 23 turnovers, respectively. Those totals are the highest this season.

FRESHMEN STARTERS

■ Tennessee has started freshmen Evina Westbrook and Rennia Davis the first 23 games this season.

■ Only four times in history have the Lady Vols started two freshmen in the season opener, with that occurring this season as well as in 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, Bridgette Gordon) and 1980-81 (Pat Hatmaker, Mary Ostrowski).

■ Head coach Holly Warlick now has started five freshmen in season openers during her first six seasons, including Andraya Carter (2012-13 vs. Chattanooga), Alexa Middleton (2013-14 vs. Penn), Te'a Cooper (2015-16 vs. Central Arkansas) and Rennia Davis and Evina Westbrook (2017-18 vs. ETSU).

■ Freshman guard Anastasia Hayes is one of the team's leading scorers and is second in assists, providing Tennessee with a starting-caliber guard coming off the bench.

■ There have been five previous years where multiple freshmen have been listed among the team's primary starters for the season, one of which included three newcomers (1984-85) in the starting lineup of record for the year.

■ Those years included 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 2004-05 (Nicky Anosike, Alexis Hornbuckle), 1997-98 (Tamika Catchings, Semeka Randall), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, Bridgette Gordon) and 1984-85 (Karla Horton, Dawn Marsh, Kathy Spinks). The 2004-05 season would most likely have had a third rookie starter if Candace Parker hadn't sat out due to injury.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE LADY VOLS

■ Tennessee returns two starters (Mercedes Russell, Jaime Nared) and another part-time starter (Meme Jackson) from last year's squad, which wound up 20-12 after falling in the NCAA Second Round. The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris.

■ This year's newcomers include the nation's No. 1 ranked recruiting class as well as a two-time JUCO All-American forward who redshirted last season due to a knee injury.

■ UT's consensus No. 1-ranked freshman class includes the No. 2 (6-0 guard Evina Westbrook), No. 7 (5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes), No. 12 (6-2 wing Rennia Davis) and No. 57 (6-4 center Kasiyahna Kushkituah) players in the nation, as ranked in the HoopGurlz espnW 100. All four players were McDonald's All-Americans and are expected to see extensive playing time in their first collegiate season. Davis and Westbrook, as a matter of fact, earned starts in the Carson-Newman exhibition game.

■ Redshirt junior Cheridene Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before redshirting at Tennessee last season. The power forward should offer immediate help inside.

■ The 2016-17 Lady Vols defeated three of the four teams in last year's NCAA Final Four (Stanford, South Carolina, Mississippi State) and also toppled Elite Eight squad Notre Dame as well.

■ The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ UT lost starting guards Jordan Reynolds (WNBA 2nd Round) and Diamond DeShields (signed pro contract in June) as well as reserve forward Schaquilla Nunn (WNBA 3rd Round) to the professional ranks. Guard Alexa Middleton, a part-time starter, and redshirt sophomore guard Te'a Cooper are no longer with the program. Cooper missed all of last season with a knee injury.

BREAKING DOWN THE RETURNEES

■ Senior Mercedes Russell, a 6-foot-6 center from Springfield Ore., and classmate Jaime Nared, a 6-2 wing from Portland, Ore., are Tennessee's top returning players and should be in the conversation for All-SEC and All-America honors.

■ Russell and Nared are preseason first-team All-SEC picks by the coaches this season.

■ Additionally, Russell was a member of the five-player All-SEC First Team, as chosen by the media, and was a third-team preseason All-America pick by College Sports Madness.

■ Russell was named to the Preseason Lisa Leslie Award and Wade Trophy Watch Lists, while Nared was picked for the Preseason Cheryl Miller Award Watch List. Both players were on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason & Midseason Lists and the Citizen Naismith Trophy Watch List.

■ Russell was second on the team in scoring (16.1 ppg.) and led the squad in rebounding (9.7) a year ago while setting a Tennessee record for a junior with 19 double-doubles. She was named an honorable mention All-American by AP and the WBCA as well as earning second-team All-SEC.

■ Russell now ranks third at UT with 41 career double-doubles, a total that ranks her second among active SEC players behind South Carolina's A'ja Wilson (46).

■ Nared, meanwhile, was third in scoring and second in rebounding for UT last season with 15.6 points and 6.9 rebounds per contest. She was second on the squad with 37 three-pointers and had eight double-doubles as a junior.

■ A second-team All-SEC pick by the coaches last season, Nared hit the game-winning shot vs. #6/6 Notre Dame and game-clinching free throws vs. #4/4 South Carolina and #17/23 Kentucky in 2016-17. She also had a career-high 30 points in UT's upset of #3/2 Mississippi State in Starkville and 28 vs. #13/12 Louisville in the NCAA Second Round.

■ Junior guard/forward Meme Jackson started 19 games a year ago and averaged 4.7 points and 1.8 rebounds while ranking fourth on the team with 24 three-pointers. Jackson is one of the team's quickest defenders and should help set the tone on that end this season.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar, who has hit 50 three-pointers over the past three seasons, and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris, who saw limited action a year ago but hopes to add depth in the paint in 2017-18.

GREEN READY AFTER REDSHIRT YEAR

■ Redshirt junior forward Cheridene Green is ready to play after sitting out last season rehabbing a knee injury suffered in 2015-16.

■ The 6-3 Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before having her season ended prematurely. She redshirted at Tennessee last season, and the power forward should offer immediate help inside for the Lady Vols.

■ Green was a first-team All-America selection in 2015-16 and second team in 2014-15.

HAS HAD A LADY VOL ON IT**

VOL SCHOLAR PATCHES

■ Five of 10 players on this year's team are eligible to wear the Vol Scholar patch, which is an insignia on the back of the uniform that recognizes a student-athlete's academic success.

■ The patch is awarded to sophomore-and-above student-athletes who have earned either a cumulative 3.0 or a semester 3.0 in either of the previous two terms.

■ Kortney Dunbar, Kamera Harris, Meme Jackson, Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell currently wear the patch on their uniforms.

■ She ranked first in the NJCAA in rebounds, third in blocks and eighth in scoring in 2015-16.

■ Green, from London, England, is the first international player in Lady Vol history and the fifth junior college transfer for the program, joining Zandra Montgomery (1977), Shannon Bobbitt (2006), Alberta Auguste (2006) and Jasmine Phillips (2012).

NARED, RUSSELL REPRESENT USA

■ Seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell were members of the USA U23 National Team that won the U24 Four Nations Tournament over the summer in Tokyo, Japan.

■ The Lady Vol duo started all three games and helped the USA defeat Australia on Aug. 12, 78-60; Canada on Aug. 13, 107-61; and host country Japan, 103-71, on Aug. 15.

■ Russell (6.3 rpg.) and Nared (5.0) were the team's top two rebounders on a 12-player roster with minutes distributed evenly.

■ Nared averaged 7.3 points per game, shooting 44 percent from the field, 33 percent on threes and 75 percent from the free throw line.

■ Russell tossed in 5.3 points per contest, shooting a team-leading 64 percent from the field.

■ It marked Russell's fourth appearance internationally with USA Basketball, while Nared enjoyed her first experience.

SENIORS DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS

■ Seniors Mercedes Russell and Jaime Nared had opportunities during the offseason to develop their leadership skills.

■ Nared capped a year of membership in the VOLeaders Academy with a leadership trip to Vietnam this summer, where UT student-athletes worked with children in orphanages, volunteered at sport skill camps and visited with university students.

■ The VOLeaders Academy, a first-of-its-kind program, is a dynamic partnership between the UT Center for Leadership and Service, the Center for Sport, Peace and Society and the Tennessee Athletics Department.

■ Now in its second year, the program aims to inspire student-athletes to find ways to use their passion of sport and their influence to enact positive change that transcends their athletic success.

■ Russell, meanwhile, was one of 68 SEC student-athletes participating in a joint meeting of the SEC Student-Athlete Leadership Councils and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) in July.

■ This marked the first joint meeting of these groups since they were introduced by Commissioner Greg Sankey in 2016. Leadership councils for the sports of football and men's and women's basketball were created to provide student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and conference office staff.

ALWAYS A CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

■ Tennessee's 2017-18 regular-season schedule will include 21 of 29 games vs. teams that saw postseason action a year ago.

■ Sixteen of those games are vs. 2017 NCAA

Tournament teams, including NCAA national champion South Carolina (home and away), NCAA runner-up Mississippi State (home) and a third Final Four team in Stanford (away).

■ UT will play three defending regular-season league champions in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC) and Central Arkansas (Southland) during the 2016-17.

■ The Lady Vols must face seven defending conference tourney champs in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC), Central Arkansas (Southland), Stanford (Pac-12), Marquette (BIG EAST), Long Beach State (Big West) and Troy (Sun Belt).

■ Tennessee opens the season with seven of its first 10 games at home and the other three taking place in the Riviera Division at the Cancun Challenge in Mexico Nov. 23-25.

■ UT made its second in-season trip outside the U.S. during the Holly Warlick era and third overall, winning the Cancun Challenge Riviera Tournament with a 3-0 record. UT went 2-0 to win the Lucaya Division championship at the Junkanoo Jam at Freeport, Bahamas, during the 2013-14 season and went 3-0 during a tour of Italy during the summer of 2015.

■ UT will have 15 televised games, including seven on ESPN networks, seven on the SEC Network and another on the Pac-12 Networks. The other 14 games will be streamed live by various entities, including 11 of them on SECN+.

SIX McDONALD'S A-As ON ROSTER

■ Tennessee has six McDonald's All-Americans on its 2017-18 roster.

■ Those players are seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell as well as freshmen Rennia Davis, Anastasia Hayes, Kasiyahna Kushkituah and Evina Westbrook.

■ This is the first time an entire Lady Vol signing class consisted only of McDonald's All-Americans.

■ The total of four McDonald's honorees ranks behind only the five in the 2004 and 2008 classes.

■ Russell was the 2013 McDonald's Game MVP, leading the West to victory with 16 points.

■ Nared led the West to a win in 2014 with 15 points but came up just short in MVP voting.

■ Davis, Hayes and Kushkituah helped the East defeat Westbrook's West squad, 80-74, in Chicago on March 29, 2017.

■ Tennessee now has had 31 McDonald's All-Americans on its rosters through the years.

■ Holly Warlick has signed nine McDonald's All-Americans as head coach and added another via transfer for 10 in her sixth season as head coach.

LADY VOL LEGEND JOINS STAFF

■ Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Bridgette Gordon, who helped Tennessee capture the first two of its eight NCAA titles as a student-athlete, returned to her alma mater as an assistant on July 20, 2017.

■ Gordon, a 1988 U.S. Olympic gold medalist with 15 years of experience in the coaching ranks, came to Rocky Top from Wichita State, where she spent seven seasons, including the last three as the recruiting coordinator.

■ Gordon, who served as associate head coach a year ago, helped WSU land the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history when Blue Star Basketball rated the 2012-13 signing group at No. 47 in the nation.

■ In addition to her work as a gifted recruiter, Gordon helped the Shockers make their first three appearances ever in the NCAA Tournament while capturing the program's first three regular- and post-season conference championships. The Shockers advanced to postseason play five times during her stint in Wichita.

■ Prior to her role at WSU (2010-17), Gordon was

an assistant and recruiting coordinator at Georgia State (2007-10) and at Stetson (2001-06) as well as serving as a WNBA scout in 2006-07.

UT CONTINUES WNBA PIPELINE

■ Jordan Reynolds and Schaquilla Nunn became the 43rd and 44th Tennessee Lady Volunteers to become WNBA players.

■ Reynolds was taken with the 19th pick of the second round by the Atlanta Dream, while Nunn was chosen 25th overall in the third round by the San Antonio Stars during the April 2017 draft.

■ They became the 38th and 39th players in UT history and the seventh and eighth coached by Holly Warlick to be drafted by a WNBA team.

■ Warlick's draftees include Reynolds and Nunn (2017), Bashaara Graves (2016), Cierra Burdick, Isabelle Harrison and Ariel Massengale (2015), Meighan Simmons (2014) and Kamiko Williams (2013).

■ Diamond DeShields, a 2017 graduate, signed with a professional team in Turkey, while 2016 graduate Nia Moore signed with a team in Poland.

LADY VOLS HAVE WON 35 SEC TITLES

■ Tennessee has won a combined total of 35 SEC Championships, claiming its 18th all-time SEC regular-season title in 2014-15.

■ That regular season co-championship came on the heels of Tennessee's SEC Tournament title during the 2013-14 campaign.

■ The Lady Vols have won SEC regular-season championships in four of the past eight seasons.

■ UT has 17 league tournament titles to its credit, including three straight from 2010 to 2012 and four of the last eight.

■ Since 1985, there have been only seven seasons where Tennessee didn't win at least a regular season or tournament title. Those came in 1986, 1987, 1991, 1997, 2009, 2016 and 2017.

■ The Lady Vols have swept SEC regular-season and tournament championships on eight occasions. Those years included 1980, 1985, 1994, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2010 and 2011.

■ Tennessee stands first in regular season and tournament titles in conference history with Georgia ranking second with seven regular season trophies and Vanderbilt standing sixth in tourney hardware with six pieces.

UT HAS MADE ALL 36 NCAA BRACKETS

■ UT is the only team to have played in all 36 NCAA Division I women's basketball tournaments.

■ The Lady Vols are 124-28 all-time in NCAA play, making the Elite Eight in three of the past five seasons.

■ UT has been to 34 Sweet 16s, 28 Elite Eights and 18 NCAA Final Fours in 36 seasons of NCAA play.

■ The Big Orange program ranks second in NCAA Division I women's basketball with eight national championships (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008).

In year six at the helm of Tennessee women's basketball, Holly Warlick has built a very impressive résumé in her young head coaching career. Her worksheet contains accomplishments few coaches have achieved in their entire careers, much less as first-time head coaches.

Those successes verify that Warlick was the right choice to take the reins at Tennessee and that she and her staff have the acumen to run a championship program. A disciple of the legendary Pat Summitt, Warlick has maintained the core values of her former coach, co-worker and friend while at the same time employing her own personality, style and competitive energy to coach today's players.

Whether as an All-America player from 1976-80, an assistant and associate head coach for 27 seasons from 1985 to 2012, or head coach from 2012 to present, Warlick has thrived during her more than three decades in the spotlight at Rocky Top. She enters her sixth year as head coach and 37th season of overall affiliation with the program hoping to build upon last season's NCAA Second Round finish.

Warlick was announced as head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as women's hoops legend Pat Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture the following day at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

Since that day, Warlick and her staff have worked tirelessly to maintain the program's lofty expectations. Despite being picked to finish as low as fifth in the SEC and 20th nationally, her first squad won the 2013 SEC regular season title and made the NCAA Elite Eight, finishing 27-8/14-2 despite injuries that forced players to miss a combined 53 games. Her 2014 edition went 29-6/13-3, winning an SEC Tournament title and making it to the NCAA Sweet 16.

In 2015, her third team reached the 30-win plateau at 30-6/15-1, claiming a share of the regular-season SEC crown and charting the second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in her three seasons. Her last two units have finished 22-14 and 20-12, advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight and Second Round, respectively.

During Warlick's first five seasons, eight Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Jordan Reynolds (2nd Rd.) and Schaquilla Nunn (2nd Rd.) were selected in 2017; Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd.)

went in 2016; Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd.), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd.) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd.) were chosen in 2015; Meighan Simmons (3rd Rd.) was taken in 2014 and Kamiko Williams (2nd Rd.) was selected in 2013. Simmons was twice named SEC Player of the Year (2013, 2014) during her UT career.

On the international scene, Warlick is a gold medal coach, and two of her players joined her in earning that hardware. Warlick served as an assistant, while Mercedes Russell and Diamond DeShields played on the undefeated (6-0) 2015 USA World University Games Team in South Korea.

From 2012-17, Tennessee also has produced in the classroom, with 15 players earning a total of 32 spots on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In 2015, Cierra Burdick became Warlick's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, garnering second-team honors and also being named a UT Torchbearer, the most prestigious accolade a student at Tennessee can receive.

Warlick has been recognized personally for her performance. In 2013, members of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named her the Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year. She was selected by the AP and league coaches as the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Coach of the Year, and members of the Tennessee Sports Writers Association also chose her as TSWA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year that season.

In May 2017, Warlick was recognized for her years of distinguished leadership, volunteer activities, philanthropic work and professional accomplishments that have contributed to improving the quality of life in Tennessee. She was named the 2017 Tennessee Woman of Distinction at the 32nd annual Chattanooga Women of Distinction Awards luncheon.

Warlick and her staff also continue to build for the future on the recruiting trail. They have welcomed 10 McDonald's All-Americans in five signing classes (through spring 2017) and feature two of the top players in the 2013 (Mercedes Russell, No. 1) and 2014 (Jaime Nared, No. 6) signing classes. All four members of the No. 1-ranked 2017 signing class were McDonald's All-Americans, including the No. 2 player in Evina Westbrook and the No. 7 rated standout in Anastasia Hayes.

After Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball as an assistant on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23, 2011, announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, an SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

It's worth noting that Warlick was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she had held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first

time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki (Caldwell) Fargas, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

Warlick and Fargas created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$150,000. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips from the Badlands to Las Vegas and from Knoxville to Key West, Fla., New Orleans, Niagara Falls and, most recently in 2013 and 2014, Panama City, Fla.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Fargas presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund. At Tennessee's "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 17, 2013, three checks worth \$15,000 were presented by Champions for a Cause to the UT Breast Health Outreach Program, Kay Yow Cancer Foundation and the Brady James Foundation to help raise money for breast cancer research. Those presentations to organizations have become an annual event, thanks to fundraising efforts and the generosity of many.

Warlick also presented a special pink basketball to her sister, Marion Ferrill, prior to the start of that game in 2013. Ferrill was diagnosed with breast cancer in the fall of 2012 and was pronounced cancer free on Sept. 30 after undergoing surgery shortly after her diagnosis.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors, it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT.

It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as an All-America Lady Vol point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard ever to play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

WARLICK RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S TOP COACHES

- *Holly Warlick's 128-46 record over the past five years ranks her 10th among Power Five women's coaches.*

- *UT ranks eighth among Power Five schools with a 12-5 NCAA Tournament record during the past five seasons.*
- *Warlick's career SEC (.750, 60-20) winning percentage ranks her first among all SEC women's head coaches.*
- *Tennessee has claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first five seasons, winning regular-season crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.*

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees enshrined into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School, it was a dream-come-true.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including the 2016-17 season, Warlick has invested 36 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team as an assistant came from her work with the guards. Simmons, Ariel Massengale, Shekinna Stricklen, Kara Lawson, Angie Bjorklund and Shanna Zolman are just a few of the successful players Warlick helped recruit and coach as an assistant coach.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who ended up walking on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball.

Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (number 22) at the end of her career in 1980. Bearden, her prep alma mater in Knoxville, retired Warlick's high school jersey (also No. 22) prior to a home football game on Oct. 26, 2012.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 36 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player (1977, 1979, 1980) or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior season.

As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).

A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick possesses vast international playing experience as well. In addition to being a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, which did not compete in the Moscow Olympics, Warlick and the 1980 U.S. team won gold at the 1980 FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

She also captured a gold medal playing for the USA at the 1979 FIBA World Championship, marking the first gold medal for the USA at the FIBA World Championships since 1957 and breaking a streak of five-straight golds by the USSR, a silver medal at the 1979 Pan American Games and gold at the 1979 R. William Jones Cup. Additionally, she served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the distinct honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville as it made its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga.

Post-collegiately, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Fargas.
