## POSTGAME NOTES: NO. 9 AUBURN 34, ARKANSAS 3

### PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorback wore cardinal helmets, white jerseys and cardinal pants against Auburn.
- Auburn won the coin toss and elected to defer to the second half. Arkansas received the opening kickoff defended the south end zone.
- Arkansas captains for the game were Jared Cornelius, Santos Ramirez, Randy Ramsey and Hjalte Froholdt.

### GENERAL NOTES

- Arkansas opened its SEC schedule at Auburn. The last time Arkansas began conference play at Auburn was 2014.
- Arkansas has not won an SEC opener overall since 2010. The last time Arkansas won an SEC opener on the road was 2010 at Georgia.

### DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Arkansas forced five 3-and-outs drives versus Auburn to run its season total to 17.
- Arkansas was down 17-0 at the half. However, on the three scoring drives, the Tigers only needed a combined 37 yards (27-yard TD drive; 1-yard FG drive and 9-yard TD drive).
- Auburn's best drive of the first half, 9-plays for 67 yards, ended as Arkansas forced a turnover on downs. Other than that 67-yard drive, Auburn only managed 24 plays for 68 yards.
- In the third quarter, Auburn's offense only ran 13 plays for 25 yards, including two 3-and-outs.

### SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Reid Bauer booted a 43-yard punt in the second quarter, the true freshman's best of the season and second-longest of the season by a Razorback. He added punts of 41 and 42 yards.
- Connor Limpert split the uprights from 29-yards to give Arkansas its first points. Limpert is a perfect 5-for-5 from inside 35 yards this season.
- Arkansas allowed a 96-yard kickoff return. It was the first kick return by an opponent since Christian Kirk of Texas A&M (Sept. 23, 2017) had a 100-yard return.

### CHAD MORRIS NOTES

- The 225 total yards allowed is the second-fewest by a Chad Morris coached team.
- The 91 yards rushing allowed in the fifth-fewest by a Chad Morris coached team.
- The 134 yards passing allowed the eighth-fewest by a Chad Morris coached team.

### PLAYER NOTES

- Hjalte Froholdt made his 29th consecutive start, the longest streak among current Razorbacks. However, he moved to left guard, where he made 25 consecutive starts over the 2016 and '17 seasons, for this game. Ty Clarry starting at center.
- Fellow offensive lineman Johnny Gibson made his 19th consecutive start, second-best on the team.
- Colton Jackson, at left tackle, made his first start of the season.
- Santos Ramirez, De'Jon Harris and T.J. Smith made their 16th consecutive starts, tied for the most on the defensive side of the ball.
- Two players in the defensive backfield - sophomore Derrick Munson and redshirt freshman Jarques McClellion - made their first career starts.

#### DL McTelvin Agim

- Recorded his first sack of the season. He has had at least a half TFL in all four games this season..

#### RB Rakeem Boyd

- Had a 45-yard rush on Arkansas' first play of the second half, his longest career rush and second-longest rush by a Razorback this season.
- He finished with 8 rushes for 69 yards. He entered the game with 13 attempts for 79 yards for the season.
- He added a 33-yard reception, entering the game with two catches for eight yards..

#### WR Jared Cornelius

- Dating back to 2016, has 28 of his 41 career catches have resulted in a first down or touchdown, including 2 of 2 at Auburn.
- Had multiple catches in back-to-back games since Nov. 19 and 25 of 2016.

#### DL Kamren Curl

- His previous season high was five (North Texas) and (previous) career-best was eight (Texas A&M, 2017).
- Logged a team-best eight tackles in the first half. He finished with a career-high nine tackles. It's the second time in his career to lead the team in tackles.

#### LB Dre Greenlaw

- Made his return to the lineup after missing the last two-plus games. He left the season opener after tallying 10 tackles in the first quarter versus Eastern Illinois.
- He made his 32nd career start, the most among active Razorbacks.
- He recorded a sack in the second quarter, his first of the season and third of his career.

#### DB Ryan Pulley

- Recorded his first career sack, a loss of five yards, in the second quarter.

**DL Randy Ramsey**

- Recorded his first sack of the season, which led to an Auburn punt in the third quarter.

**WR Deon Stewart**

- Caught a 38-yard pass on 3rd-and-11 in the first quarter. The reception tied a career high and he entered the game with just 22 yards (on four receptions)..

**QB Ty Storey**

- Completed a career-high 13 passes while attempting a career-high 31.
