Iron sharpens iron. Is it this ideal that is the foundation for the toughest non-conference schedule in UC Davis basketball's history.

Facing the toughest available competition is what everyone on roster wanted this season to best prepare themselves for the Big West Conference Tournament; to help accomplish this goal, the players wanted to face as many Power Five teams as possible.

The first of four such games will take place on Monday, Nov. 12, when the Aggies head to Fayetteville, Ark., to face the Arkansas Razorbacks for the first time in nearly a decade.

UC Davis last faced the Razorbacks on Nov. 20, 2008, in a game that also took place on their home court.

After falling to Texas on Friday in its season opener, Arkansas will host the Aggies in its 2018-19 home opener.

UC Davis basketball fans can follow the action from Bud Walton Arena on the SEC+ Network, which is available on WatchESPN.com. Brett Dolan and Kikko Hayday will call the action courtside for this internet broadcast.

Scott Marsh will also provide a call of the Aggies' inaugural road game of the year on 1380 AM KTKZ.

This is the first game of a season-long five-game road swing for UC Davis, one that will continue this weekend in Arlington, Texas, when it faces Texas A&M Corpus Christi and UT Arlington this Saturday and Sunday in a neutral-site and road matchups, respectively.

Following this weekend's games, the team will experience a quick turnaround since it will head to the Golden 1 Center on Nov. 20 (just over two days after everyone returns from Texas) to face cross-Causeway rival Sacramento State in this year's rivalry game.

Following that yearly tradition at the downtown state-of-the-art home of the Sacramento Kings, UC Davis will spend Thanksgiving together before facing Indiana, for the first time in program history, the following day.

PLAYER SNAPSHOTS

#0 TJ SHORTS II: Big West Conference Preseason Team selection is the leader of this squad, and is one of five seniors on this year's roster.

Only received one offer out of high school (Tustin HS '15), and that was from Hope International, a NAIA school located across the street from Cal State Fullerton. Playing for the only D-I school that offered while he competed at Saddleback College (Mission Viejo, Calif.).

#1 Damion SQUIRE: One of the team's four newcomers represented Team Quebec in the Canada Games and led his team to a berth in the semifinals and national finals.

#2 Stefan GONZALEZ: Junior transfer from Saint Mary's will make his UC Davis debut this season after redshirting last year.

#3 Gio NELSON: Will make his UC Davis debut this season after redshirting last year.

#5 Siler SCHNEIDER: Earned All-Big West accolades for the second year in a row when he was named to the league's Second Team last year.

#11 Caleb FULLER: Led Barking Abbey School to a league title last season; averaged 8.6 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game, and shot .538 overall.

Represented Great Britain at the European Championships for the third time last summer; he competed on its U18 roster in 2017 and the U16 squad in 2015.

#13 Matt NEUFELD: Scored 11 points on 4 of 6 shooting vs. San Diego (11/9), his second game as an Aggie

#20 B.J. SHAW: One of UC Davis' four newcomers.

#21 Colin RUSSELL: One of the team's five-member senior class.

#22 Joe MOONEY: UC Davis' sharpshooter is one of 10 upperclassmen on this year's roster; finished with 13 points when the Aggies hosted San Diego last Friday.

#23 Rogers PRINTUP: Led Team USA to gold at the 2018 World Deaf Basketball Championships, hosted by Gallaudet University last summer.

#25 AJ JOHN: Responsible for nearly one-third of his team's rebounds vs. San Diego; he finished with a game-high nine of UC Davis' 30 boards that night.

#30 Cameron BA: One of UC Davis' four newcomers

#42 Jonah UNDERWOOD: One of UC Davis' four redshirts from last season who will make their debut in '18

#44 Garrison GOODE: Started all 32 games played last season and averaged 28.3 minutes par game. Basketball fans, and pundits alike, respect his ability to make hustle plays down low, draw (and neutralize) opposing big men and establish a presence in the paint all game long.

SENIOR POINT GUARD TJ SHORTS II - WINNER

Following the 2017-18 season, UC Davis point guard TJ Shorts II became the first player in Big West Conference history named Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year in the same season.

Over the last four weeks of the season, Shorts II averaged 21.0 points, 5.4 assists and 5.8 steals per game, all team highs, shot .566 from the floor, .400 from three, and .788 at the line to lead UC Davis to its third league championship in the last four seasons, and the team's third postseason tournament appearance in the same timespan.

Shorts II finished his first year at UC Davis with the following NCAA rankings: No. 39 in free throw attempts (212), No. 42 in total steals (63), No. 46 in steals per game (1.91), No. 55 in free throws made (158)



Shorts II at a Glance

- Hails from Tustin, Calif.
- Transferred from Saddleback College (Mission Viejo, Calif.) to UC Davis before the 2017-18 season
- Set a new UC Davis record in steals; his 63 were nearly 30 percent of the team's total for the year
- Ranked No. 2 in assists (4.4/gm.), No. 3 in assist/ turnover ratio (1.8), No. 7 in scoring (15.1 ppg) and field goal percentage (.521) among all Big West players
- · Shorts made clutch plays when needed; his knack for stepping up when it counted the most led them to victories in 9 of their last 11 regular season games
- Hit two game-winning shots throughout league play during his team's championship run (scan QR code to view), baskets that propelled the Aggies to their third league championship in the last four seasons





- Averaged 12.3 points, 3.9 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game for a Saddleback College team that advanced to the 2016 CCCAA State Championship
- Shot .492 overall, .800 at the line and .543 from three
- Saddleback College posted a combined 55-7 record with Shorts II on roster
- All-State First Team and Orange Empire Conference Most Valuable Player honoree
- Two-time Orange Empire Conference First Team selection
- Tustin High School won three straight Empire League Championships and advanced to the CIF Southern Section's semifinal round in each of his final two seasons
- Averaged 17.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game
- Earned MVP All-CIF Southern Section and All-Empire League first team accolades
- Received the school's Scholar-Athlete Award and named to the Principal's Honor Roll and Superintendent's Honor Roll all four years

- In addition to opening the season against two West Coast Conference schools — and playing another in its penultimate non-conference road game — the Aggies' schedule is loaded with Power Five teams
- UC Davis' first road game, slated for Nov. 12, will mark the team's first visit to Arkansas, and first game against a SEC opponent, since Nov. 20, 2008

- · As a representative of Team USA at the World Deaf Basketball Championships, hosted by Gallaudet University last July, junior guard Rogers Printup led his team to a gold in this international tournament
- Printup learned after Team USA's 81-63 victory vs. Japan, in the championship game, that he was named to the Best Five Team for the Men's 2018 U21 World Deaf Basketball Championships — a group that features the tournament's five strongest overall performers
- A After defeating Israel, 103-24 in its opening game, Team USA collected additional wins against Australia (95-28), Ukraine (93-48) — which included a game-high 20-point performance from Printup — Lithuania (113-39), Canada (126-23) and a thrilling 78-73 result against Spain, which allowed the hosts to earn an opportunity to compete for gold

FOUR OF THE AGGIES' GAMES ADDED TO **ESPN'S WILD CARD SCHEDULE**

- · ESPN and its family of networks will air as many as four UC Davis basketball gamed throughout league competition as part of its Big West men's basketball Wild Card schedule
- The defending conference champions have two of their home games, and pair of road games on this slate: at UC Santa Barbara on Feb. 9 and Cal State Fullerton on Feb. 21; potential home broadcasts include games against Long Beach State (Feb. 16) and UC Irvine (Feb. 28)
- · Official selections for the network's Wild Card games will take place three weeks prior to each matchup

IT SEEMS LIKE YESTERDAY, NOT 21 YEARS AGO

- The 2018-19 season will mark the 21st anniversary of UC Davis basketball's Division II National Championship season
- UC Davis finished with a 31-2 overall record, won all 14 games against Northern California Athletic Conference teams, and all 17 home games played throughout the regular season and playoffs
- Current UC Davis assistant coach Kevin Nosek competed for the Aggies that season

SACRAMENTO BASKETBALL CALLS DAVIS ITS HOME

• When the 2018 National Invitation Tournament field was announced on March 11, 2018, the Aggies' 22 wins were one more than the Sacramento Kings' total

NOW KNOWN AS THE AGGIE BLUE AND **GOLDEN 1 CENTER**

- For the third time in as many seasons, UC Davis and Sacramento State will square off inside the Golden 1 Center for this year's Causeway clash on Nov. 20, 2018
- The Aggies recorded a 64-47 win on Nov. 21, 2017, in last year's rivalry game — the second to take place in the state-of-the-art Downtown Sacramento arena
- In the first-ever college basketball game to take place inside the Sacramento Kings' home, UC Davis also defeated Sacramento State, 81-72
- In last year's rivalry matchup, UC Davis broke an 8-8 tie with 11:31 remaining in the first half, and never relinquished its lead
- The Hornets came within two points of the Aggies late in the second half before UC Davis clinched the win by scoring 15 unanswered points
- The Aggies have now won the last three straight rivalry games and four of the last six
- The 17-point margin of victory is the largest by either team since the 2008 season, when Sacramento State defeated the Aggies by 20 on its home court
- · This is the largest rivalry margin of victory for the Aggies since 1996 when they recorded a 74-50 victory inside the Pavilion

- Junior guard TJ Shorts II recorded the second triple-double in UC Davis' Big West era (since 2007) by finishing with 10 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists (the last two are career highs) at Cal Poly (2/15/18)

THE HOME OF BIG WEST BASKETBALL

- Since head coach Jim Les took the helm of the men's basketball program on May 5, 2011, he and his staff have turned UC Davis into the home of Big West basketball
- Highlighted by their appearance in the 2017 Division I NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, the Aggies advanced to postseason play in three of the last four seasons
- Starting with their first, earned during the 2014-15 season, the Aggies won three Big West Conference championships within a four-year timespan
- UC Davis also posted three 20-win seasons in the last four years
- The Aggies have rightfully earned their spot on college basketball's national map, and continue to strengthen their status on a yearly basis, as evident by the quality of opponents on this season's schedule
- The Pavilion has turned into the biggest home court advantage for any Big West school since Coach Les took over the program: In addition to posting two perfect home records within a three-year timespan (14-0 in 2014-15 and 11-0 in '16-'17, the Aggies entered their 2018-19 season opener, at home vs. San Francisco, with 21 wins in their last 23 played on Hamilton Court
- Last season, no school earned more All-Big West accolades than UC Davis
- Among that group of 2017-18 award winners was senior point guard TJ Shorts II, the first player in league history named Big West Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year in the same season
- Coach Les became the 12th individual in league history to earn multiple Coach of the Year awards
- Coach Les has now coached two Big West Players of the Year and three Big West Newcomers of the Year

GOODBYE RPI, COLLEGE BASKETBALL'S NEW RANKING SYSTEM IS HERE

- The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee has a new tool that should (hopefully) crystallize the ranking system before the selection and seeding of teams for the 2019 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament: the NET
- The NCAA Evaluation Tool, or NET, is the new barometer for the committee, and includes the NCAA Evaluation Tool, which will be known as the NET, relies on game results, strength of schedule, game location, scoring margin, net offensive and defensive efficiency, and the quality of wins and losses
- The existing quadrant system still will be used on team sheets, with the NET replacing the Rating Percentage Index to sort games based on the opponent's ranking:

Quadrant 1: Home 1-30, Neutral 1-50, Away 1-75 Quadrant 2: Home 31-75, Neutral 51-100, Away 76-135 Quadrant 3: Home 76-160, Neutral 101-200, Away 135-240

Quadrant 4: Home 161-353, Neutral 201-353, Away 241-353

 The RPI was first used in 1981 and was developed by the NCAA to provide supplemental data to the Men's Basketball Committee, which is responsible for selecting at-large teams and seeding and bracketing teams in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship each year

 The RPI still will be used by other Division I sports committees, including the Women's Basketball Committee for the 2018-19 season

UC Davis punched its ticket to the Big Dance for the first time in 2017 when the Aggies defeated UC Irvine, 50-47, in a Big West Conference Tournament championship thriller in 2017. After making its NCAA Tournament debut in Dayton, Ohio, with a 67-63 victory vs. North Carolina Central in the First Four, the Aggies advanced to the Midwest Region First Round and drew Kansas as its opponent.

Big West basktball has called Davis its home in recent seasons: In addition to its three Big West titles and three postseason appearances in the last four years, UC Davis posted three 20-win seasons during that same timespan and turned the Pavilion into one of the strongest home court advantages among all BWC teams.

It is this uncommon commitment towards student-athletes that led to the creation of the Aggie EVO System, a multi-faceted student-athlete outcomes program focused on preparing young men and women for a successful launch after graduating from the sixth-ranked public school in the nation.

We define launch as moving beyond graduation into a meaningful professional path that builds on the college experience, sets a graduate on a path of financial and social well-being and effectively replaces the sport as the primary piece of their identity.

The Aggie EVO System ("EVO" is shorthand for a student-athlete's "evolution" during college) is an important part of the student-athlete experience at UC Davis – just like weights and conditioning, attending class or getting athletic medicine treatment. This unprecedented program was designed to focus on four key elements to help UC Davis student-athletes prepare for future success by helping them better "know and navigate the World of Work":

- SKILLS that employers want and will make student-athletes even more effective in their sports: self awareness, emotional intelligence, social/ cultural competence and leadership.
- KNOWLEDGE of what careers and paths are out there (we call this the "World of Work"), what fits one's interests and abilities, who in our gigantic network can advise and guide them and each individual can navigate a path to get there.
- OPPORTUNITIES to enjoy internships, jobs and other learning opportunities through a powerful network of Aggie alums. Student-athletes hear from and meet alums in a wide variety of fields, attend recruiting events and visit members of the EVO Pro network at companies in San Francisco, Silicon Valley, and Sacramento.
- TOOLS that student-athletes need to secure these opportunities. We require a few more basic tools or updates each year they are on campus. This includes resumes and cover letters, LinkedIn profiles, interviewing skills, business cards, professional headshots, and anything else that helps student-athletes prepare for a more successful launch.

HEAD COACH JIM LES



JIM LES Head Coach Eighth Season Bradley '86 @CoachJimLes

Since Jim Les became the 23rd head coach in UC Davis' history on May 5, 2011, the Aggies posted their best records as a Division I program, won every game played on Hamilton Court twice within a three-year timespan, captured their first Big West Conference championship, Big West Tournament championship, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

The program's championship tradition continued in 2018 when the Aggies won their third Big West title within the last four seasons, and earned another trip to the postseason.

In addition to numerous championships and playoff appearances, Les also created a unique home court advantage like no other team in the conference. In the last four years, no mainland squad boasts more home wins than the Aggies; during that same timespan, no Big West team holds a higher home win percentage than UC Davis.

UC Davis' historic 2017 NCAA Tournament run, which started with a come-from-behind victory against the defending league champions, continued with another win in the NCAA First Four vs. North Carolina Central and a matchup against Kansas in the Midwest Regional First Round, are the latest accomplishments for a program that has a well-deserved reputation for succeeding in the classroom, on the court, and in the community — all earned throughout Les' six years on campus.

The 2014-15 Big West Coach of the Year led UC Davis to its first-ever Big West Conference championship and its inaugural postseason berth as a D-I team when the Aggies faced Stanford in the opening round of the National Invitation Tournament. That appearance capped a season that included new school records for the most overall, home, road, conference and non-conference wins.

For the first time in school history, UC Davis ended the season as the NCAA's national team three point champions by virtue of its .447 shooting percentage the highest mark recorded by any team since the three-point line was pushed back to its current distance. Corey Hawkins, the country's No. 1 three-point shooter with his .488 percentage brought the team's first-ever individual title to Davis; combined, the 2014-15 squad recorded the highest three-point team percentage since 1994.

As the only team in the nation to hold top five three-point and overall field goal percentages on a weekly basis, men's basketball posted a +16 win differential - a Big West Conference record and the nation's No. 1 turnaround.

Under Les' tutelage, no league team collected more all-conference and specialty awards that UC Davis - home of the Big West Coach of the Year, Player of the Year (Hawkins) and Sixth Man of the Year (Josh Fox). This season marked the first occasion that an Aggie received each award.

This accomplishment took place once again in 2017-18 when the Aggies collected more all-league hardware than any other team. Included in that year's honor roll were three of the Big West's top individual awards: Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year — both won by TJ Shorts II, who became the first player in league history to win its top two individual honors — and Coach of the Year.

The following season, no team was more dominant on defense than UC Davis. In addition to posting the lowest scoring average in the league, both overall and during conference play, the Aggies set new program records in all major rebounding categories and by holding opponents to season-low percentages, both overall and from three-point territory.

Les came to the Aggies after spending nine years as the head coach at his alma mater, Bradley University, where he won more than 150 games and led the Braves to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. In all, Les possesses nearly 30 years of successful playing and coaching experience in both the collegiate and professional ranks.

Les is no stranger to the Sacramento area, having spent four years as a player with the Sacramento Kings, followed by three seasons as an assistant for the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs. After a nine-year professional playing career, which included seven seasons in the National Basketball Association, Les enjoyed a successful venture into the financial world before returning to his basketball roots. After three years spent with the Monarchs, Les returned to Bradley and was named the 12th men's basketball coach in Braves history on April 7, 2002.

In his first head coaching position, Les' resume continued to build at Bradley. The Braves averaged better than 20 wins in five seasons from 2005 to 2010, while racking up 10 postseason wins throughout that time. Along the way, Les became the first coach to win games in four different postseason tournaments in NCAA history.

HEAD COACH JIM LES/COACHING STAFF

Les' coaching career has been defined by more than just wins and losses, however. Of the 26 seniors he has coached in his first nine years, 24 have earned their degrees, while the other two are currently playing professional basketball overseas. Under Les' direction, Bradley set a program record for grade point average and had 11 team members earn a spot on the Bradley Athletic Director's Honor Roll during the 2009-10 academic year for posting a minimum 3.0 semester GPA during at least one of the two grading periods

Inheriting a team that produced a 9-20 record during the 2001-02 season, Les laid a solid foundation for a program that re-emerged as a force in the Missouri Valley Conference. Les finished with a 152-140 record in nine seasons as Bradley's head man, having directed the Braves to the Sweet 16s of the 2006 NCAA Tournament and 2007 National Invitation Tournament, followed by runner-up finishes in the inaugural College Basketball Invitational (2008) and CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (2009).

In 2005-06, Les' veteran Braves were able to find their stride down the stretch and play their way into the postseason picture by winning 13 of their last 17 contests, including a seven-game win streak that took the team all the way to the MVC Tournament championship game. Bradley went on to win a pair of NCAA Tournament games, defeating No. 4 seed Kansas (77-73) and fifth-seeded Pittsburgh (72-66) at the Palace of Auburn Hills to make its first Sweet 16 appearance since 1955.

Les began his college career at Cleveland State, but transferred to Bradley during the winter break of his sophomore season. Once in the Bradley fold, Les led the Braves to a 60-27 (.690) record in his 87 games, consecutive trips to the postseason (1985 NIT and 1986 NCAA Tournament) and one of the greatest seasons in the history of both Bradley and Valley men's basketball.

The 1985-86 squad won the MVC regular season title with a perfect 16-0 league record and it remains the last Valley team to post an undefeated conference slate. Although the Braves lost the MVC Tournament championship game at Tulsa, Bradley earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, where the Braves lost to eventual national champion Louisville in the second round. Bradley's 83-65 victory versus UTEP in the first round of the 1986 West Regional, however, was the program's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1955.

During Bradley's memorable 1985-86 season, Les averaged 14.2 points and led The Valley with 7.9 assists per game. In addition to being named MVC Player of the Year in 1986, the 5-foot-11 point guard won the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Hall of Fame Award as the nation's best player less than 6-feet tall.

Les was inducted into the Bradley Athletics Hall of Fame Feb. 7, 1998. He also has been inducted into the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the Greater Peoria Sports Hall of Fame and the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame. Additionally, Braves fans voted Les one of the 15 greatest players in program history during the celebration of Bradley's first 100 basketball seasons.

Following his senior season, Les was a third-round (70th overall) selection by the Atlanta Hawks during the 1986 NBA Draft. He went on to play seven seasons for Utah, the Los Angeles Clippers, Sacramento and Atlanta. He led the NBA in 3-point field goal percentage (.461) during the 1990-91 season and he was the runner-up to Chicago's Craig Hodges in the AT&T Long Distance Shootout during the 1992 NBA All-Star Weekend. Among the coaches for whom Les played during his NBA career are Lenny Wilkens, Jerry Sloan and Dick Motta, three of the winningest coaches in NBA history.

Originally from the Chicago suburb of Niles, Ill., Les is married to the former Jodi Martineau. The couple has three children: son Tyler and daughters Amber and Hannah.



KEVIN NOSEK

Associate Head Coach 17th Season UC Davis '99

Kevin Nosek, who brings two decades of experience as either a UC Davis assistant coach or student-athlete, is in his 17th season as a member of the men's basketball staff, following one of the most successful years in the program's history.

Under Nosek's tutelage, UC Davis earned its third Big West championship in the last four seasons and advanced to postseason play for the third time in that same timespan.

With Nosek on staff, the 2016-17 team not only earned its first berth in the NCAA Tournament, thanks to a come-from-behind victory in the championship game of the Big West Tournament (collecting the program's first tourney title in the process), but captured its first Division I postseason victory at the NCAA First Four. With their win over North Carolina Central, the Aggies advanced to the Midwest Regional First Round where they faced Kansas.

He began his Aggie coaching career in 1999-2000 after competing for UC Davis all four seasons on campus as a student-athlete. After serving a threeyear stint as head coach at Menlo College, Nosek returned to the Aggies in 2006-07. He assists in all aspects of the program.

Nosek, a true veteran of the men's basketball staff whose connection to the program dates back to his youth days, first served as a ball boy for Bob Hamilton's teams in the late 1980s. Since his return in 2006, he has been instrumental in helping the program complete its transition to Division I, a process that includes the program's first official D-I and Big West Conference season in 2007-08.

After starring at nearby Davis Senior High, Nosek played for UC Davis from 1996-99, highlighting his career with a NCAA Division II national championship in 1988. He enjoyed his best collegiate game during his senior year, when he hit 4 of 5 from three-point range en route to a career-high 12 points against Holy Names. Perhaps as a premonition of things to come, his teammates dubbed him "Coach Nosek" for his unrelenting diligence both on and off the court.

Nosek remained with the Aggie program as an assistant to Brian Fogel from 1999-2003. In his four seasons, the Aggies compiled a 67-23 record and qualified for the NCAA D-II West Regional (1999-2000).

Following his first tenure at UC Davis, Nosek earned his first collegiate head-coaching role when he took the helm of the men's basketball program at Menlo College. In three seasons with the Oaks, he turned around a program that finished 4-22 his first season, to one that posted a 17-11 mark and its best record in seven years. The Oaks advanced to the Cal Pac Conference Tournament semifinal game during the 2004-05 season and reached the title game the following year.

Nosek's Menlo tenure included a roster that led all D-II teams in rebound defense, also ranking among the nation's leaders in rebound margin and field goal percentage defense.

Nosek graduated from UC Davis in June of 1999, earning his bachelor's degree in organizational studies. He received his masters in sport coaching from the United States Sports Academy shortly thereafter.

Nosek and his wife, Nicole reside in Davis. They have two daughters, Maya and Grace, and a son, Derek.







KYLE VOGT

Assistant Coach Seventh Season Lakeland '02

Kyle Vogt enters his seventh season at UC Davis, following two of the program's most successful years, as an assistant coach after being hired in June, 2012. In his role, he assists in all areas of the Aggies' program, specializing in defensive schemes, perimeter play and development, recruiting and opponent scouting.

With Vogt on the sidelines, the 2016-17 team not only won its first-ever Big West Tournament championship, earning the league's automatic NCAA Tournament bid in the process, but captured its inaugural Division I postseason win by defeating North Carolina Central in a First Four matchup.

That result allowed the Aggies to advance to the Midwest Regional First Round where they faced Kansas for the first time in school history.

With Vogt on the sidelines, UC Davis collected its third Big West championship as part of the 2017-18 season, and advanced to postseason play once again when it faced Utah in the National Invitation Tournament.

That appearance marked the program's third postseason berth in the last four seasons.

Vogt brings an 11-year coaching career to UC Davis that including stops at UW Platteville (2003-04), Bradley ('04-'11) and Western Illinois ('11-'12). Vogt has been a part of five postseason teams throughout those 11 years, including Bradley's 2006 Sweet 16 run. In back-to-back years, teams Vogt coached set single-season school records for the most Division I wins - 18 at Western Illinois and 14 at UC Davis.

"I am very excited to add Kyle to our staff," said head men's basketball coach Jim Les shortly after Vogt's hiring. "He is an accomplished Division I assistant that brings with him great knowledge and enthusiasm. He will be a tremendous asset to our staff and an excellent resource for our players both on and off the floor."

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Vogt graduated from Lakeland College in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in marketing. An outstanding player for the Muskies, Vogt was a three-time all-conference performer and scored 1,123 points throughout his career. He is ranked No. 2 all-time with 183 three-point field goals and was amongst the Div. III national leaders in three-point percentage during both his junior and senior seasons.

Vogt and his wife, Erin, live in Davis with their three children: Jackson, Nolan and Avery.



JONATHAN METZGER-JONES

Assistant Coach Third Season Pacific '02

Jonathan Metzger-Jones was hired as an assistant coach at UC Davis on June 16, 2016. In his time with the program, he helped lead the Aggies to the best two-year stretch in their Division I history. In addition to its back-to-back postseason appearances, which includes a Big West Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 2017, followed by a Big West regular season championship and National Invitation Tournament appearance in 2018, both seasons ended with the Aggies winning 22 or more games.

The 2017 postseason run began with a come-from-behind victory in the championship game of the Big West Tournament — the first time UC Davis advanced to the NCAA Tournament in school history by earning the conference's automatic bid. By defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four, the Aggies advanced to the Midwest Regional First Round and faced Kansas in the inaugural head-to-head meeting in school history.

After winning the Big West's regular season championship, on the final day of league play with a double-overtime win on the road at conference rival UC Irvine, the 2017-18 season culminated with another postseason appearance when the Aggies faced Utah in the first round of the NIT.

Metzger-Jones arrived at UC Davis after spending five seasons as an assistant coach at Montana. Throughout his tenure in Missoula, the Grizzlies won three Big Sky regular season championships and advanced to postseason play on four occasions. In addition to competing in the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Tournaments, Metzger-Jones' teams also competed in the 2015 National Invitation Tournament and 2016 College Basketball Invitational.

With Metzger-Jones on staff, Montana won 20 or more games in four of five years. Under his tutelage, 17 Grizzlies earned All-Big Sky Conference honors -- a list that includes Kareem Jamar (2013 Big Sky Conference MVP), Will Cherry (Cleveland Cavaliers), Jordan Gregory and Martin Breunig. All four players received NABC All-District recognition.

While at Montana, Metzger-Jones was tasked with recruiting, player skill development, opponent scouting, in-game strategy, scheduling, the program's fundraising efforts and player academics — an area that saw the Grizzly basketball team post its highest cumulative GPA in program history.

Before he joined the Grizzlies' staff, Metzger-Jones helped lead UC Santa Barbara to its most successful stint in program history. Over the course of his four years the Gauchos won the 2008 and 2010 Big West regular season titles, consecutive Big West Tournament championships and the program's first-ever back-to-back berths at the NCAA Tournament in 2010 and 2011. UCSB also qualified for the 2008 NIT.

While at Santa Barbara, Metzger-Jones recruited and mentored Orlando Johnson, James Nunnally and Alan Williams. Johnson and Williams received Big West MVP distinction in 2010 and 2014 respectively; all three have NBA experience.

Metzger-Jones played two seasons at Pacific, was named co-captain as a senior and etched his name in the Tigers' records book as one of the program's top 10 three-point shooters when he graduated in 2002 with a bachelor of science degree in business administration.

Afterwards, he spent three seasons playing professionally in Europe with stops in Switzerland, Denmark and Finland.

Upon his return to the United States, Metzger-Jones started his coaching career as Cal State Fullerton's director of basketball operations..

Metzger-Jones is married to the former Alison Keck. The couple has one son, Jason.
