WELCOME BACK TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD

- → The Razorbacks opened up the 2019–20 season in front of 6,801 fans at Bud Walton Arena last Friday, where they beat New Orleans 82-52.
- → That crowd was the 22nd largest ever to watch a women's basketball game in Bud Walton Arena.
- → Arkansas won its eighth straight opening-day game. Their last loss in an opener came against Minnesota in 2011.

REBOUNDING RAMPAGE

- → Taylah Thomas was simply unstoppable on the glass against New Orleans, pulling down 21 rebounds in her first game of the season.
- → Thomas nearly broke Arkansas' all-time record for total rebounds in a game, but she fell one short of Shelly Wallace's record (22, vs. SMU, 2/13/88).
- → Despite falling short of the all-time milestone, Thomas shattered her career highs in total rebounds (21 vs. 12), defensive rebounds (14 vs. 9) and offensive rebounds (7 vs. 5).
- → Thomas joined exclusive company with her 20+ rebounds, becoming just the fifth Razorback ever to grab 20 or more rebounds in a game.
- → The most recent 20+ rebound performance prior to Thomas actually also came against New Orleans, when Melissa Wolf brought down 20 boards against the Privateers on December 30, 2015.
- → Dating back to last season, Arkansas' 49 rebounds were the most in a game for the Hogs since they pulled down 52 against UAB.

WALKING BUCKET

- → Chelsea Dungee continues to score the ball for the Hogs, picking up right where she left off in game one of the 2019-20 season.
- → Going back to last season, Dungee has now scored in double-digits in 18 straight contests.
- → Dungee has scored 20+ in 21 of her 38 games since arriving in Fayetteville.

FREE THROW PHENOM

- → Chelsea Dungee continues to be excellent at getting to the free throw line.
- → She shot 13 freebies against New Orleans, making ten of them. It was the eighth time in her Arkansas career where she has made 10+ free throws in a game.
- → Dungee broke the Arkansas record for free throws made in a single-season last year, putting down 229 of them. She also broke the free throws made record for both a single game (17) and in a quarter (nine) against Auburn last season.

SHARING THE SUGAR

- → Five different Razorbacks scored in double figures in the opener.
- → Dungee led the way with 22, but Ramirez had 12, Tolefree and Daniels each chipped in with 11 and Thomas scored 10.
- → That only happened three times during the 2018–19 season.
- → The Razorbacks were a perfect 3-0 in those contests.

RECHARGED RAMIREZ

- → Coach Neighbors added an absolute weapon in Amber Ramirez, who will be able to play after sitting out all of last season after transfering from TCU.
- → Ramirez, a former five-star recruit, McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic participant, will give the offense another weapon.
- → While at TCU, Ramirez averaged 9.6 points per game over her 59 appearances. She also tallied 28 starts, 23 of which came in 2017–18.
- → During her sophomore season, Ramirez's numbers jumped across the board. She poured in 10.4 points per game in 24.9 minutes per game.
- → Her shooting, especially from deep, was on display during her sophomore season, as she shot a staggering 39.2 percent from range.
- → Ramirez scored in double-digits in her Arkansas debut, going for 12 points. She picked up all 12 of those points from deep, going 4 of 9 from deep.

BENCH MOB

- → Four of five starters from last season's team return to the Hill for the 2019–20 season, but the Razorbacks will also have a lot of depth this season.
- → A'Tyanna Gaulden returns, reprising her role as an impactful sixth-man. She averaged five points in 13 minutes per game last season.
- → Taylah Thomas also returns, giving the coaching staff versatile depth in the front court. Thomas's 5.0 rebounds per game was the second highest total on the roster last season. Neighbors has singled her out as one of, if not the most, improved players on the team.
- → Meanwhile, Neighbors and his staff are adding the country's 15th-best recruiting class, comprised of Makayla Daniels, Marquesha Davis, Destinee Oberg and Ginger Reece.
- → On top of all that, Erynn Barnum, a 6–2 forward out of Little Rock who sat out last season, and the aforementioned Ramirez, will also join the rotation.

THE FAB FOUR

- → Arkansas' 2018 recruiting class was the 15th-ranked group in the country.
- → They were tabbed as the fourth-best class in the SEC, trailing only powerhouses South Carolina, Tennessee and Mississippi State.
- → Daniels, a guard out of Frederick, Maryland, provides even more scoring punch from the guard spot for the Hogs.
- → She won two state titles in high school, including a 47-point performance in the final as a sophomore.
- → Davis, a local product, brings athleticism and length to a team that will rely on her stout defense and rebounding.
- → Davis can score the ball too, though, evidenced by her breaking the Springdale High School single-season record during the 2017–18 season.
- → Oberg, meanwhile, was rated as a 4.5 star prospect and the No. 6 post player in the 2019 class, giving the Hogs some size.
- → The No. 59 prospect when she committed, Reece gives the Razorbacks a forward that can stretch the floor.

→ Dungee's 17 made free throws against Auburn is tied for the second-most in a game in the SEC.

→ Her 229 free throws in a season is the second highest total in a single season in the SEC. Wendy Scholtens, VU, 1990, holds the record with 236 makes.

→ That free throw total was also the most by anyone in the Power-5 last season. It was also the second-most

PRESEASON POLLS

- → Arkansas was picked to finish fifth in the SEC's Preseason Media Poll, its highest voted finish since 1998–99.
- → South Carolina, Texas A&M, Mississippi State and Kentucky were picked to finish above the Razorbacks.
- → The Hogs were also picked fifth in the SEC's Coaches' Poll.
- → Chelsea Dungee was placed on the SEC's Preseason First-Team by both the media and the coaches.
- → She was also one of two players to receive votes for the preseason Conference Player of the Year in both polls, joining Chennedy Carter of Texas A&M.

REVIEW: ARKANSAS VS. NEW ORLEANS

- → Arkansas tallied its first win of the season against New Orleans, beating the Privateers 82–52.
- → Taylah Thomas nearly broke the Arkansas single-game rebounding record, pulling down 21 of them.
- → It was also the first career double-double for Thomas (10 points, 21 rebounds).
- → Chelsea Dungee led all scorers with 22 points, ten of which came at the free throw line.
- → Dungee nearly had a double-double herself, as she pulled down eight rebounds. She also led the team in assists (4).
- → Ramirez had a solid debut for the Razorbacks, chipping in 12 points (4–9 3PT). She also registered two assists and swiped four steals.
- → Makayla Daniels reached double—digits in her Arkansas debut, going for 11 points while tying for the team lead in steals, nabbing four of them.

PROLONGED POSTSEASON

- → The Razorbacks put together one of the best postseasons in program history last season.
- → First, they went through the SEC Tournament, entering as a 10 seed and making it all the way to the championship game.
- \rightarrow To get there, the Razorbacks had to beat Georgia, South Carolina and Texas A&M.
- → With their three wins in the tournament, Arkansas became the lowest seeded team ever to make it to the SEC Tournament Final.
- → Following their SEC run, the Hogs returned to Fayetteville to host three rounds of the WNIT.
- → They got two wins in Bud Walton during the WNIT, winning an OT thriller against Houston followed by a blowout of UAB. The Hogs narrowly fell to TCU in round three.
- → The Hogs' five wins in the 2019 postseason are the most since they won five straight to claim the WNIT title back in 1999.

WHAT'S HE SAYIN?

Don't be alarmed if you don't understand what Head Coach Mike Neighbors is saying on the bench. He has a language all his own.

Coach Neighbors plays "Positionless Basket-ball". Instead of having guards, forwards and centers, he has Rabbits, Rackers, Locks and Dragons.

- → Mason is currently tied with Jhasmin Bowen with 861 career points.
- → Dungee, despite only playing for the Hogs for one season, already has 781 career points. She is currently 39th all–time in points scored.

THREE & FREE

- → The Razorbacks' offense was great from deep and at the charity stripe last season.
- \rightarrow The Hogs made 296 shots from range last season, 59 more than the previous program record, which was set during the 2017–18 season.
- → That mark was tops in the SEC last season.
- → The Hogs were also second in the SEC and sixth in the NCAA in free throws made during 2018–19, putting down 518 of their 710 attempts (.730)
- → Chelsea Dungee, who made 229 of those, led all Power-5 players in the free throws made last season.

WATCH LIST SZN

- → Dungee was recently named to the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Preseason Watch List.
- \rightarrow She is one of just 20 players in the nation to make the list, which highlights the top shooting guards in the country.
- ightarrow Dungee was also named to espnW's Top-25 Players List. She came in at No. 18.
- → The redshirt junior guard was also placed on the Wooden Award Preseason Top 30 and on the Naismith Trophy Preseason Top 50.

DON'T SLEEP ON THE SCHEDULE

- → While there may not be many big names on the Razorbacks' non-conference schedule, there are some good teams.
- → The Hogs will face off against five teams during the non-conference portion of the slate that played in the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- → Of those five games, two will come at home (Belmont, Kansas State), one will come on the road (Cal) and two will be played at neutral sites (Fordham, Little Rock).
- → The SEC schedule will be tough as normal, but the opening stretch for the Razorbacks will be especially tough.
- → The Hogs open conference play with Texas A&M, who has been projected to win the league by the coaches.
- → That second road game of the season will be at South Carolina, who was picked by the media to win the conference.

GETTIN' AFTER THE GLASS

- → The Razorbacks will bring a renewed focus to rebounding the basketball this season.
- \rightarrow The Hogs got bigger up front during the offseason, bringing in Erynn Barnum (6–2) and freshman Destinee Oberg (6–3)
- → Marquesha Davis (6-0) and Makayla Daniels (5-8) are also good rebounding guards.
- → Neighbors also added Chantel Osahor, one of the NCAA's best rebounders ever, and a former All–American for him at UW, to help coach up his team on the boards this season.

WELCOME TO KIARA'S BLOCK PARTY

- → Kiara Williams was great as a rim protector last season, totaling 54 blocked shots, which was the fourth-most by a Razorback in a single season.
- \rightarrow Williams was just four blocks away from the top three.
- → With her performance last season, Williams is now in the Top 10 on the career blocked-shots list, with 88 denials. She is averaging a block per game over her 88 game career.
- → Part of her great season turning people away at the rim was her defensive masterpiece at Kentucky, a game in which she set a new record for blocked shots in a quarter (4).
- → Williams completely controlled the paint in that game vs. the Wildcats, finishing with 17 total rebounds and seven blocks, just two shy of the all-time single-game record.

HEART-RACIN' HOGS

- ightarrow Several of Arkansas' games last season came down to the final moments.
- → Early in the season, Alexis Tolefree drilled a midrange shot to help the Hogs escape UT

Arlington with a 66-65 win.

- → A few weeks later, A'Tyana Gaulden forced a turnover with the Hogs trailing Wisconsin by one with just 11 seconds to go. Malica Monk layed the ball in with just over four seconds left to give the Razorbacks the win.
- → Monk again came up big against Tulsa, putting down a layup in the lane to put the Hogs up 61– 59 with eight seconds left.
- → Coach Neighbors' Hogs beat Tennessee on Rocky Top courtesy of clutch buckets from Chelsea Dungee and Malica Monk. Dungee got to the rack to make it 78–77 with :23 left, while Monk pulled up in the paint with :04 left to win it, 80–79.
- → Dungee buried a clutch three against Texas A&M in the semifinal at the SEC Tournament to push the Hogs to the Tournament Final.
- → That three would cap off a remarkable 17–0 run that lasted for over six minutes.

2018-19: A RECORD BREAKING SEASON

- ightarrow The 2018–19 season for the Razorback was a good one for Neighbors & Co.
- → Neighbors' bunch set the single-season scoring record (2,736 points), breaking the previous mark (2,558), which had stood since 1981-82.
- → The Razorbacks also broke the following single-season team records last year: 3 PT FG (296), 3 PT FG attempted (922), games played (37) and minutes played (7425).

REVIEW: EXHIBITION NO. 1 - PITTSBURG STATE

- → The Razorbacks beat Pittsburg State in their first exhibition game of 2019, 97–63.
- → The Hogs were led by Chelsea Dungee, who put up an efficient 26 points, shooting 10 of 14 from the field and 5 of 6 from the stripe.
- → Amber Ramirez was great in her Razorback debut, going for 23 points, 15 of which came from deep (5–9 3PT). Ramirez put on a show in the first half, scoring 19 points.
- \rightarrow Ramirez's five treys were the second most ever by a Hog in an exhibition game (Cosper, 6, 11/2/17, Northeastern State).
- → Freshman guard Makayla Daniels had a great debut in her own right, scoring 17 points in her first start.
- → Daniels finished the game shooting a whopping 75 percent from the field, and a perfect 4 of 4 at the free throw line. Daniels also led the hogs with four steals.
- → Taylah Thomas performed well after getting the start, chipping in six points and seven rebounds.
- → Alexis Tolefree also reached double-figures in the win, scoring 13 points on 5 of 9 shooting.
- → Kiara Williams was a force on the glass during

her 11 minutes played, pulling down seven rebounds, tied for the team lead.

REVIEW: EXHIBITION NO. 2 - OKLAHOMA CITY

- → The Razorbacks took down the Oklahoma City Stars, 77–62, in the exhibition finale.
- → Dungee was great once again for the Hogs, going for 31 points on 9 of 13 shooting.
- → Dungee was also a stellar 6 of 9 from deep, while also going 7 of 8 at the line.
- \rightarrow To top it all off, Dungee also pulled down six total rebounds, tied for the team lead.
- → Ramirez joined Dungee in double-figures, scoring 15 points, including 12 in the third quarter.
- → Makayla Daniels and Taylah Thomas both showed quick hands in the win, as both nabbed three steals each.
- \rightarrow 1,597 fans showed up to the game, the highest attendance for an exhibtion game since 2015.

STAYED HOME

- → Six of Arkansas 16 players went to high school in the Natural State.
- → Both Erynn Barnum and Kiara Williams went to Little Rock Central High School.
- → Alexis Tolefree, who went to junior college in Mississippi, grew up in Conway, Ark, and went to Conway High School
- → Freshmen Avery Hughes and Marquesha Davis, meanwhile, stayed close to home. Hughes went to Bentonville High School while Davis went to Springdale High School.
- $\ensuremath{\rightarrow}$ Grayce Spangler went to Fayetteville High School.

ROOKIE NOD TO NAISMITH NOMINEE

In four short years Mike Neighbors went from a Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year nominee in 2014, to a Naismith Women's College Coach of the Year national semifinalist in 2017.

Neighbors guided UW to a historic campaign in 2016–17 leading the Huskies to 27 wins, its second most in program history, and he was just one shy of the all–time school record set in 1990 (28).

Picked to place third in the Pac-12 in the preseason poll, UW tied for second in the league with a 15-3 record, its best conference finish since 2003. The Huskies' 15 conference wins tied for third most in program history. Washington, who entered conference play with the program-best 12 non-conference wins, clinched its first-ever bye in the first round of the Pac-12 Tournament. Washington put together an 11-game win streak and a six-game win streak in Pac-12 play in 2016-17.
