POSTGAME NOTES: LSU 27, ARKANSAS 24

PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, cardinal jerseys and white pants.
- LSU won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.
- Arkansas' captains for the season are Rakeem Boyd, Feleipe Franks, Grant Morgan and Jonathan Marshall. Morgan was the Razorback's coin toss representative.
- Weather 64 degrees, no wind.

GENERAL NOTES

- Saturday marked the 66th time Arkansas and LSU have met on the gridiron and just the sixth time in Fayetteville. The Razorbacks are now 22-42-2 all-time against the Tigers.
- The announced attendance for the game: 16,500

• On the defensive side of the ball, DE Taurean Carter made his first career start.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

WR Treylon Burks posted the first Arkansas TD of the game and made his sixth scoring grab of the year on a 65-yard reception. Per Athlyte, the sophomore eclipsed 1,000 career receiving yards, matching Boo Williams (1999-00) as the fastest Hog receiver to 1,000 yards (18 games) since 1997. It capped off Arkansas' third touchdown scoring drive of 90+ yards this season.
 QB Feleipe Franks scored Arkansas' second TD with 3:44 on the clock in the second quarter, on a 10-yard rush - his first rushing TD of the season and ninth of his career. It's Arkansas'

second QB rushing touchdown of the year (K.J. Jefferson at Florida).
RB Trelon Smith scored a one-yard TD run giving Arkansas a 21-20 lead with 1:04 left to go in the third quarter. It capped off a 95-yard drive, which is tied for the team's longest of the year and is the fourth TD scoring drive of 90+ yards this season.

- Arkansas out-gained LSU, 443-419.
- The Razorbacks were 1-for-1 on fourth down conversions.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Jonathan Marshall (DT), Grant Morgan (LB), Jalon Catalon (SS) and Greg Brooks Jr. (NB) are the only Razorbacks to start all eight games this season.
- ^ Brooks has started a team-best 20 consecutive games.
- Grant Morgan became the first Razorback with back-to-back games with at least 15 tackles since 2003.
- Montaric Brown (forced) and Myles Slusher (recovery) teamed up to produce a turnover in the second guarter.
- ^ Arkansas entered the game fifth in the NCAA / 1st in the SEC in turnovers forced (16).
- The team broke up a season-high five passes (Grant Morgan, Hudson Clark, Bumper Pool, Jonathan Marshall, Montaric Brown).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- K A.J. Reed made a 22-yard field goal in the rain with 12:42 left in the fourth guarter, extending Arkansas' lead, 24-20.
- P Reid Bauer kicked seven times for 332 yards (47.4 ypp) with a long of 58 yards with two being downed inside the 20.

PLAYER NOTES

WR Treylon Burks

- Made a team-high five catches for 90 yards.
- Scored his sixth TD of the season sixth of his career on a 65-yard reception in the first quarter.
- Has scored at least one receiving touchdown in four of his last five games.
- Per Athlyte, the sophomore eclipsed 1,000 career receiving yards, matching Boo Williams (1999-00) as the fastest Hog receiver to 1,000 yards (18 games) since 1997.

QB Feleipe Franks

- Completed 17-of-26 passes for a career-high 339 yards with one touchdown.
- Ran 14 times for 43 rushing yards and was the team's leading rusher.
- Scored his first rushing TD of the season ninth of his career on a 10-yard rush in the second quarter.
- Threw his 17th TD pass of the year, a 65-yard completion in the first quarter to Treylon Burks.
- Registered four completions of 50 or more yards to Mike Woods (2x), Treylon Burks and T.J. Hammonds.
- Completed 6-of-6 passes for 139 yards in the third guarter.
- Posted his second 300+ yard passing game of the year and the first 300+ yard game by a Razorback OB against LSU since Tyler Wilson in 2012 (369 yards).
- Has thrown for 200+ yards in the first eight games of the year, the first Arkansas QB to accomplish the feat since at least 2000.



WR T.J. Hammonds

• Made one catch for 51 yards and ran one time for 29 yards.

• Both his 51-yard grab and 29-yard rush are season-highs.

RB Trelon Smith

- Rushed 11 times for 28 yards and a TD. Also made two catches for 19 yards.
- Scored a one-yard TD rush in the third quarter, his second of the year, to give Arkansas a 21-20 lead.

WR Mike Woods

- Made four catches and led the team with a career-high 140 yards (35.0 ypc). He made two catches of 50 of more yards.
- Registered 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games for the first time in his career, and the second time by a Razorback receiver this season (Treylon Burks).
- Posted the first 100+ yard receiving game by a Razorback against LSU since Cobi Hamilton (164 yards) in 2010.
- First Hog to average over 30 yards per catch while making at least four catches in a game since Cobi Hamilton against Rutgers in 2012 (10 catches 30.3 ypc).

NB Greg Brooks Jr.

• One of four Razorbacks to start all eight games this season and has a team-best streak of 20 consecutive starts.

CB Montaric Brown

- Forced a fumble that resulted in a turnover in the second quarter. It was his first career forced fumble.
- Tied his season high with five tackles his second straight game with five stops.
- Had his third PBU of the season.

DT Taurean Carter

- The redshirt freshman made his first career start.
- Tied his season high with three tackles.

S Jalen Catalon

- One of four Razorbacks to start all eight games this season.
- Finished with a career-high 16 tackles, including a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss.
 - ^ Recorded double-digit fackles for the sixth time this season.
 ^ Had five tackles (three solo) with a tackle for loss in the first quarter alone, finishing with eight in the first half.
- Of his 15 tackles, five were solo.
 - ^ Entering the game, Catalon led all freshman nationally with 40 solo tackles.

BS Joe Foucha

- Forced his first fumble of the season and second of his career.
- Finished with eight tackles, his third straight game with as many as eight stops.

SS Myles Mason

- Made his third start of the season and second consecutive.
- Finished with eight tackles one shy of his previous career-high nine vs Ole Miss. Entered game with 14 on the season.
- ^ Tallied seven, first-half tackles

DT Jonathan Marshall

- One of four Razorbacks to start all eight games this season.
- Had four tackles three solo with a TFL.
- Logged his first career PBU.
- Tied his career-high two QBH.
- First time this season he had at least four tackles, a TFL, PBU and QBH in the same game.

DT Marcus Miller

- Saw action for the second time this season (also playing at Florida)
- Recorded his first tackles of the season, finishing with a career high six.
- Played in two games last season as a true freshman, getting one tackle (a TFL at Kentucky).

LB Grant Morgan

- One of four Razorbacks to start all eight games this season.
- Became the first Razorback with back-to-back games with at least 15 tackles since 2003.
- Led the team in tackles for the fourth time this season.
- Tied his career high with 19 tackles.
- ^ Recorded double-digit tackles for the sixth time this season.
- ^ Tallied 15-plus tackles for the fourth time this season.
- ^ Had eight, first-half tackles.
- Entering the game, Morgan led the SEC and was sixth nationally averaging 12.1 tackles per game.

LB Bumper Pool

- Had 11 tackles and a PBU.
- ^ Recorded double-digit stops for the fifth time this season.
- ^ Entering the game, averaged of 11.8 tackles per game to rank second in the SEC and seventh nationally.

BS Myles Slusher

- Recovered a fumble (forced by Montaric Brown) that resulted in a turnover in the second quarter. It was his second fumble recovery of the season.
- Finished with a career-high five tackles, all solo stops. (Entered the game with 10 tackles for the season.)

DL Mataio Soli

- Made his first start of the season and the 12th of his career.
- Credited with his first QB Hurry of the season and the third of his career.
