

Versus Rogers State

- This will be the first meeting between Arkansas and Rogers State.

Up Next, Exhibition at #12 Texas

- Arkansas will travel to the University of Texas for a men's basketball charity exhibition game on Saturday, Oct. 29, at the Longhorns' new Moody Center. Tip time has been set for 3 pm (CT).
- As the home team, Texas has chosen to donate proceeds to a pair of organizations supporting social justice equity and educational opportunities for youth in Central Texas communities, Seedling Foundation and Break the Pipeline.
- The exhibition will be the first public event at the Moody Center - the Longhorns' new home for basketball.
- This will mark the third time Arkansas has played a NCAA Division I opponent in an exhibition game - all coming during the Eric Musselman era. The Razorbacks hosted and defeated North Texas, 68-60, last season and took down Little Rock, 79-64, in the game to dedicate Nolan Richardson Court in Bud Walton Arena on Oct. 20, 2019.
- It will be the first time since the 1991-92 season the Razorbacks have played an exhibition off campus when the Hogs faced the German National team in Little Rock on Nov. 20, 1991. The last - and only other - time Arkansas played an exhibition outside the Natural State was the 1978-79 season when Arkansas faced Athletes in Action in Anaheim, Calif., on Dec. 9, 1978.
- This season is the 100th basketball season for the Razorbacks and the Arkansas-Texas rivalry dates back to the Hogs' first season of basketball, 1923-24. Arkansas leads the all-time series versus the Longhorns, 87-68, but trail Texas, 43-27, in games played in Austin. The programs have only met six times since Arkansas left the Southwest Conference. The last meeting between the programs was the 2018-19 season opener at Fort Bliss in El Paso, Texas, for the ESPN Armed Forces Classic. Texas won 73-71 in overtime.

- Overall, it marks the seventh time the Razorbacks were among the nation's top 10 in the AP preseason poll, including being the top-ranked team in the nation

for that 1994-95 season. Since the 1977-78 season, Arkansas has landed inside the AP preseason top 25 on 17 occasions, including last year's preseason ranking of #16.

- Six Razorback regular-season opponents appear in the AP preseason top 25 including #4 Kentucky, #5 Baylor, #11 Tennessee, #15 Auburn, #20 Alabama and second-round Maui Jim Maui Invitational opponents #5 Creighton or #25 Texas Tech.
- Also in the top 25 is #12 Texas, who Arkansas will face in a preseason charity exhibition game in Austin on Oct. 29, as well as other possible Maui Invitational opponents #17 Arizona and #19 San Diego State. Three teams on the Razorback schedule were listed among those receiving votes including Texas A&M (#26), possible Maui Invitational opponent Ohio State (#35) and Florida (#39).

Razorbacks Picked 2nd in SEC Preseason Poll; Smith Honored

- The Arkansas men's basketball team was picked to finish second for the 2022-23 season and freshman guard Nick Smith Jr. was selected first team preseason All-SEC by a select panel of both SEC and national media members.
- The #2 SEC preseason rank is the highest for the Razorbacks since being picked to win the Western Division prior to the 2007-08 season. Team points were compiled on a 14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis. Each media member also voted for a five-player All-SEC Team. Ties were not broken.
- **Smith is the first Razorback freshman to earn preseason All-SEC** (first or second team) and becomes the 11th Razorback to earn first team preseason All-SEC honors joining Todd Day (1991-92), Scotty Thurman (1993-94 and 1994-95, Corliss Williamson (1993-94 and 1994-95), Joe Johnson (2000-01), Ronnie Brewer (2005-06), Patrick Beverley (2007-08), BJ Young (2012-13), Bobby Portis (2014-15), Moses Kingsley (2016-17) and Daniel Gafford (2018-19).

Smith Racks Up Numerous Preseason Honors

- Nick Smith Jr., was honored three times by CBSsports.com as he was named preseason National Freshman of the Year, preseason All-American (second team) and the SEC preseason Freshman of the Year.
- The Jacksonville product was also selected as the preseason National Newcomer of the Year by Blue Ribbon magazine earlier this fall. CBS stated, "Smith is in a class that includes two other five-stars who are top-five ranked signees in program history – Anthony Black and Jordan Walsh – so he very well may have some competition even on his own team to earn Freshman of the Year honors."
- Smith was one of three freshmen on the 15-man All-American team along with third team picks Keyonte George (Baylor) and Derek Lively II (Duke).
- Nine others were **contenders** for CBSSports.com **SEC Freshman of the Year including Razorbacks Black and Walsh.**

Razorbacks Draw Baylor Big 12/SEC Challenge

- In a rematch of the 2021 NCAA Elite 8 meeting, Arkansas will face Baylor as part of the 2023 SEC/Big 12 Challenge. The contest will be played on Jan. 28, 2023, in Waco, Texas.
- Overall, the 10th annual SEC/Big 12 Challenge will feature 10 games played on the same day (Saturday, Jan. 28, 2023) in a matchup of two premier college basketball conferences. ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU will once again televise the Challenge.
- Arkansas will play in its ninth consecutive Challenge. The Razorbacks are 4-4 in such games.
- Arkansas helped the SEC win last year's Challenge, 6-4, with a 77-68 home victory over West Virginia. It was the second year in a row the SEC won the Challenge. The SEC has lost the Challenge just one time in the last six years.

RAZORBACKS AND BEARS

- The Arkansas and Baylor rivalry dates back to the Razorbacks' first season of basketball (1924-24) when both schools were members of the Southwest Conference. The teams have met on 144 previous occasions, making the Bears fourth (tied) among Arkansas' most common opponents behind Texas A&M (161), Texas (155) and SMU (155) while being tied with Rice (144). Arkansas owns a 96-48 advantage in the series, including a 37-32 mark in games played in Waco. However, the teams have only played three times since 1990-91 after Arkansas left the SWC for the SEC and all three were on neutral courts - Jan. 5, 2008, in Dallas; Dec. 20, 2009, in North Little Rock; and Mar. 29, 2021, in Indianapolis.

- Only school with **SIX** on the ESPN Top 100 **AND** Sports Illustrated All-American SI99.
- First time to sign two – much less three – 5-stars (Nick Smith Jr., Jordan Walsh and Anthony Black) in the same class.
- In fact, Arkansas now has only signed seven, 5-stars since 2004. Smith, Walsh and Black are the only Razorback signees to rank among the ESPN top 15 (dating back to 2007).



MUSSELMAN AT A GLANCE

- Eric Musselman was named Arkansas' 13th head men's basketball coach on April 7, 2019. He has over 30 years of coaching experience, including his seven as a collegiate head coach and 14 as a professional head coach.
- In his first seven years as a collegiate head coach, Musselman has won at least 20 games each season (24, 28, 29, 29, 20, 25 and 28), advanced to all six postseasons played (including five straight NCAA tournaments) and reached three NCAA Sweet 16's, including an Elite 8 appearances with the Hogs in 2021 and '22. Prior to entering the collegiate head coaching ranks, Musselman was a head coach for seven professional teams, including two seasons with the Golden State Warriors (2002-04) and one with the Sacramento Kings (2006-07). He won over 550 games as a professional head coach with a combined pro winning percentage of .626 (553-330).
- Musselman played collegiately at the University of San Diego and helped the Toreros to NCAA Tournament berths in 1984 and 1987. He was recipient of the program's Bugelli Leadership Award as a senior.
- Musselman is married to Danyelle Sargent Musselman, who has worked at ESPN, Fox Sports and the NFL Network as a broadcaster. Musselman has two sons, Michael and Matthew, and the couple has a daughter, Mariah.
- Musselman's father Bill was also an NBA head coach and they were the first father-son combination to become head coaches in the NBA.

MUSSELMAN DID YOU KNOWS

- Named General Manager of CBA's Rapid City Thrillers at age of 22. The next year, became head coach of the Thrillers at he age of 23, the youngest coach in CBA history.
- From 1990-1997, had 26 players called up to the NBA, the highest number in the league during that span.
- Is the only person in CBA history to coach in five league All-Star Games (1990, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1997)
- The first coach in professional basketball history to win 100 games by the age of 28.
- At the age of 37, named head coach of the Golden State Warriors and was the youngest head coach ever hired by an NBA team at the time.
- He and his father, Bill, were first father-son combination to both become head coaches in NBA history.
- In 2003, was runner-up to Gregg Popovich for NBA Coach of the Year Award voting (231 points, including 26 first-place votes).
- Is the CBA's third all-time winningest coach (270-122 in seven seasons) and the most successful coach (54-3 in two seasons) in the history of the United States Basketball League.
- Led CBA in scoring (116.7 ppg) in 192-93 and was 2nd in NBA in scoring (102.4 ppg) in 2002-03.
- Only needed 130 games to win his 100th game as a collegiate head coach. He was the 27th-fastest coach in NCAA history to reach 100 wins but was the ninth-fastest since 1970.
- In his first season at Arkansas, the Razorbacks led the NCAA in 3-point field goal percentage defense while Arkansas led the NCAA in both free throws made and attempted in 2022.
