berth before both the Big Ten and NCAA Tournaments were canceled due to the CO-VID-19 pandemic.

Keith Urgo, who was recognized as one of the nation's top assistant coaches in 2019-2020, was named head coach at Fordham in April of 2022 after serving as the associate head coach at Fordham in 2021-2022.

In his first year at Fordham, Urgo helped the Rams to an amazing turnaround as Fordham recorded a 16-16 overall record, a 14-win improvement from 2020-2021. The Rams won a second round Atlantic 10 Tournament game and reached the Quarterfinals for the first time since 2007 and opened Atlantic 10 regular season play 2-0 for the first time since joining the conference in 1995. Defensively, the Rams ranked 44th Best Defense in the NCAA, the best ranking Fordham history.

Urgo brought a plethora of experience to Rose Hill, including ten seasons at Penn State University. In his time with the Nittany Lions, he earned credit for his efforts to assemble a talented team on the basketball court and build a strong foundation for the Penn State program.

After arriving at State College in 2011 from Villanova University, Urgo was quickly promoted to associate head coach in 2013. He brought the Wildcat game plan with him to Penn State as the upward trajectory of Nittany Lion basketball was the product of a purposeful plan with unwavering belief and work ethic, with the goal of getting better each and every day. The improvements and progress were steady over his ten years, culminating with two 20-win seasons in the last three years, and a lengthy list of both team and individual accomplishments.

In addition to the 21 overall wins and 11 Big Ten Conference wins, the totals in 2019-20 included eight-straight league wins to set the program's record for longest Big Ten win streak. Consecutive victories over four ranked teams set another record as the Nittany Lions were positioned for an NCAA Tournament

With 76 wins over Urgo's final four seasons, the Nittany Lion seniors, led by two-time All-Big Ten first-team selection Lamar Stevens, became Penn State's winningest class, which included the 2018 National Invitation Tournament championship and 12 wins over ranked teams during that timeframe. PSU earned a national ranking from the Associated Press for the first time since 1996 and spent 10 weeks in the polls, rising as high as No. 9.

Penn State's transformation began with successes in the recruiting arena and Urgo's ability to cultivate relationships translated to the two 20-win seasons as well as the Nittany Lions' first NBA draft pick in more than 20 years. The Washington, D.C., native was responsible for some of Villanova's best recruiting classes, including the Wildcats' third-ranked 2009 class with four ESPNU top-100 signees, a No. 2 class in 2010, and a top-20 rated 2011 class.

At the forefront of Penn State's recruiting efforts, Urgo has identified prospects, brought them into the program and helped further their development on the court. In fall 2018, ESPN ranked the Penn State coaching staff No. 7 among high-major programs for the ability to develop talent.

The 2017-18 season witnessed Penn State's highly regarded recruiting classes transfer their success to the win column with 26 victories, the second-highest total in program history, an appearance in the Big Ten semifinals at Madison Square Garden, and Penn State's second National Invitation Tournament championship.

- The last Fordham win over a Top-25 team was a 60-54 win over #21/22 Harvard in 2011.
- The highest ranked team that the Rams defeated was fifth-ranked USC at the 1974 Holiday Festival (12/30/74).

LAST TIME OUT

- Fordham head men's basketball coach Keith Urgo waited a long time for tonight. Ever since he accepted a position as an assistant coach at Gonzaga High School in Washington, D.C., he dreamed of being a college head coach. That dream came true tonight as Urgo led the Rams to an 88-74 win over Dartmouth College in the Rose Hill Gym.
- The Fordham offense was led by grad student guard Darius Quisenberry, who scored a team-high 20 points, while grad student forward Khalid Moore netted 18 in his Fordham debut, shooting 8-for-11 from the field and adding a game-high seven rebounds.
- The Rams got off to a slow start, trailing 10-0 2:19 into the contest but netted the next ten points to knot the game at ten on a Quisenberry three at the 15:07 mark.
- The Big Green took a five-point lead, 25-20, later the first half before the Rams used a 17-5 run to a 37-30 lead on a Patrick Kelly basket with 4:21 remaining in the half.
- Dartmouth opened the second half cutting the Fordham lead to two, 45-43, but 13 unanswered Fordham points made it a 58-43 game with 15:42 left.

FORDHAM IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Rams are now 78-36 (.684) in season openers since 1908, 83-20 (.806) in home openers.
- The Rams have won the past two openers and four of the past five, including an 88-74 win over Dartmouth this year.
- The opener this year on November 7 was the second earliest season opener in Fordham history (the Rams opened the 2018-2019 season on Nov. 6).

HEAD COACHING DEBUTS

- Fordham head coach **Keith Urgo** became the second consecutive Fordham head men's basketball coach to win in his Ram debut.
- Last year, Kyle Neptune became the first Fordham head men's basketball coach to win in his debut since 1986 when Bob Quinn directed the 1986-1987 squad to an 81-68 win over Monmouth.

NEW FACES

- It may take a few games for Fordham fans to recognize the 2022-2023 men's basketball team as there are nine new faces on the squad.
- Among the nine new faces is one Division I grad transfer and seven true freshmen.

FORDHAM FIRST IN THREE-POINTERS

Did you know???? Fordham was the first team in the NCAA to use the three-point shot? The first time a three-point shot was used experimentally in a game was on February 7, 1945 when Columbia defeated Fordham, 73-58. The three-point line was set at 21 feet from the basket and Columbia scored 11 "long goals" to Fordham's nine. Also, free throwers had an option to take their shots from the regular 15-foot distance for one point or from 21 feet for two points. Eight "long fouls" were made during the game.

The game also featured a 12-foot wide free throw lane, a move that would be adopted by the NCAA eleven years later.

- The grad transfer is forward Khalid Moore, a product of Molloy High School in Queens, who played for four years at Georgia Tech.
- The seven true freshman include forwards Angel Montas and Romad Dean; guards Will Richardson, Noah Best, Wayne Franklin, and Luke Hardenburg; and center Elijah Gray and they are joined by sophomore Brian Nussbaum.
- Fordham returns eight players from the 2021-2022 roster in grad students Darius Quisenberry, senior Rostik Novitskyi, juniors Antrell Charlton, Kyle Rose, Abdou Tsimbila, and Albe Evans, and sophomores Patrick Kelly and Zach Riley.

QUISENBERRY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ATLANTIC 10

- Fordham grad student guard **Darius Quisenberry** was named Third Team Preseason All-Atlantic 10 in October.
- He is the first Ram to earn preseason All-Atlantic 10 honors since Joseph Chartouny in
- A transfer from Youngstown State, Quisenberry continued his torrid scoring pace in his first year with the Rams in 2021-2022.
- He finished the season as Fordham's second leading scorer, and ranked sixth in the Atlantic 10, with a 16.2 ppg scoring average, and scored in double figures in 22 games and averaged 3.8 rpg to go with 52 assists and 38 steals.



• Over his collegiate career, Quisenberry, a two-time All-Horizon League selection, has scored more than 1,600 points, setting a Youngstown State freshman record with 441 points in 2018-2019.

RAMS SHINE IN 2021-2022

- The Fordham Rams enjoyed a successful 2021-2022 season, finishing 16-16 overall and 8-10 in the Atlantic 10, a stark improvement from the 2020-2021 team which finished 2-12 overall, 2-11 in the conference.
- The 16 wins were the most for the Rams since the 2015-2016 squad went 17-14 and the eight Atlantic 10 wins matches that 2015-2016 team.
- The 14-game improvement was the best single-season improvement in recent Fordham basketball history.
- Other highlights from the 2021-2022 season include:
 - Winning a second round Atlantic 10 Tournament game to reach the Quarterfinals for the first time since 2007.

• He's back at it this year, scoring 16 points and adding three rebounds, three assists, and one steal in the opener versus Dartmouth.

ROSE BLOOMS

- Last year, Fordham guard **Kyle Rose** showed improvement from his freshman year.
- On the year, Rose averaged 7.5 ppg and 3.3 rpg to go with 40 assists and 40 steals.
- He averaged 1.6 ppg in 2019-2020 and improved to 5.3 ppg in 2020-2021.
- Rose had a career night against St. Thomas on November 15, netting 22 points and grabbing six rebounds, both career-highs, in the 84-78 win.
- He shot 6-for-10 from behind the arc and 7-for-11 from the field.
- Rose opened the 2022-2023 season on a high note, scoring eleven points and adding two steals.

OVERSEAS RAMS

- Fordham has numerous former Rams playing professionally overseas.
- The list includes Chuba Ohams, Javonte Hawkins, and Ryan Rhoomes (France), Bryant Dunston and Erten Gazi (Turkey), Christian Sengfelder (Germany), David Perkarek (Czech Republic), Will Tavares (Bulgaria), Chris Gaston (Bolivia), and Brandon Frazier (Mexico).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

- Fordham University's home court, the Rose Hill Gymnasium which was named as one of the four "Cathedrals of College Basketball" by ESPN The Magazine, is the oldest gym still being used by an NCAA Division I basketball team. The 3,200-seat gym opened on January 16, 1925 for a game between Fordham and Boston College. The Rams took the opener 46-16 in a game refereed by one of the University's most prominent alumni, "The Fordham Flash", Frankie Frisch.
- The Gym was one of the largest on-campus facilities at the time it was built, earning the nickname "The Prairie" because of its large floor space. The original configuration had no end zone stands and a seating capacity of 2,100 but several standing room crowds of 6,000 were reported in the late 1920's. Since its opening in 1925, the gym has seen numerous renovations, adding new seating, scoreboards and public address systems.
- The arena has been in continuous use by Fordham's basketball teams since its opening with the exception of the World War II years, when it was used for a barracks.
- The Rose Hill Gym has been the site of many legendary college and high school basketball games including Kareem Abdul Jabbar's final high school game and the 1988 Tolentine-Archbishop Molloy Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Championship game, billed by the New York Newsday as the "Best High School Game of the 80's".
- The Rose Hill Gym has been named as one of the Top Ten arenas by USA Today and was featured in the 2011-12 ESPN The Magazine College Basketball issue as one of four Cathedrals of College Basketball.

WHAT'S NEXT?

- The Rams return to the historic Rose Hill Gym to host the University of New Hampshire on Tuesday, November 15 at 7:00 p.m.
- It will be the second meeting between Fordham and New Hampshire on the hardwood
- The Rams took the first meeting, 60-56, on December 23, 2008 in the Rose Hill Gym.
- Fordham is 16-4 all-time against schools currently in the America East.
