LEADING OFF

» The Wildcats went 2-3 at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational last week, improving to 7-3 on the season.

» Arizona took down its first ranked opponent of the season when it upset then-No. 8 Virginia Tech 6-2 in the Clearwater Invitational.

» After the second weekend, Arizona is ranked No. 13 in the NFCA Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the USA Softball Top 25.

» Through two weekends of play, Arizona leads the Pac-12 in batting average [.392] and on-base percentage [.470]. The Wildcats' batting average ranks third in the NCAA.

» Junior third baseman Blaise Biringering has been steady for Arizona through the first two weeks of the season. She has a 10-game hitting streak and drove in six runs while batting .375 at the Clearwater Invitational.

» Biringering helped the Wildcats secure the upset over the Hokies with a three-run homer - her first home run of the season.

» Arizona's freshmen showed off at the Clearwater Invitational. Three of Arizona's seven freshman ranked in the top five in batting average on the team during the Clearwater Invitational. Kaiah Altmeyer and Taylor Biehl hit .500 during the tournament and Olivia DiNardo ranked

fifth on the team in batting average [.294].

» Freshman left fielder Dakota Kennedy hit her first and second career triples in the same day at the Clearwater Invitational. She hit her first in Arizona's game against Texas A&M and hit her second career triple in the next game against Mississippi State.

» Kennedy also hit her first career double in Arizona's upset over then-No. 8 Virginia Tech. She was the first to score when Allie Skaggs brought her home with a double.

» Olivia DiNardo was on fire against Virginia Tech. The freshman designated hitter blasted her first career homer - a solo shot - and her first career double to help Arizona upset the Hokies.

» The Wildcats were the only team ranked in the preseason Top 25 polls to run-rule every game of opening weekend.

» Arizona scored 63 runs during opening weekend - only 10 of which were scored on four home runs.

» Head coach Caitlin Lowe is in her second season at the helm of Arizona Softball. The legendary player and Hall-of-Famer was announced as head coach following the retirement of Mike Candrea and she holds a 46-25 record at Arizona.

» The Wildcats will close out their two-week road trip at the Razorback Invitational hosted by Arkansas.

» This is Arizona's first appearance at the Razorback Invitational.

- » Arkansas returns 14 letterwinners from last season's SEC Championship team.
- » The Razorbacks are 8-2 through the first two weeks of 2023. Last week, they went 3-2 at the Clearwater Invitational, losing to Duke and Florida State.
- » Arkansas is led by Rylin Hedgecock who is batting .480 with three home runs and Robyn Herron who has a 0.86 ERA.
- » **Series History:** The Wildcats and the Razorbacks have met three times and Arizona holds a 3-0 record in the series.

- » The Bulldogs went 2-3 on opening weekend, picking up two wins against Iowa State at the UNI-Dome Tournament.
- » Drake is led by Aubree Beitzinger who is batting .500 and Mackenzie Hupke who has a 1.00 ERA.

NFC: #13 • USA Softball: #19

- » The Cats are ranked #13 in the NFCA poll and #19 in the USA Softball poll after the second week of the season.
- » Arizona was one of six Pac-12 teams in the NFCA and USA Softball preseason polls.
- » **Preseason:** UA started the season ranked 12th in the NFCA poll and 15th in the USA Softball poll.

STELLAR SKAGGS

- » Junior All-American Allie Skaggs is batting .333 to open the season with a .400 on-base percentage.
- » The second baseman has four doubles this season - three during opening weekend and one at the Clearwater Invitational - to lead Arizona and rank fourth in the Pac-12.
- » She earned her first NFCA All-American nod when she was named second-team at-large in 2022. Skaggs was named first-team NFCA All-West Region and second-team All-Pac-12 for her impressive work at the plate in 2022.
- » Skaggs finished the 2022 season leading Arizona and the Pac-12 with 24 home runs, and tied for fifth in the NCAA in home runs. She ranked 12th in Arizona history for home runs in a single season.
- » Skaggs cemented herself in the Arizona record books when she tied the program record for home runs in a single game with three homers in the second game against UTEP. She joins Wildcat legends Jessie Harper, Katiyana Mauga, Lini Korja, Stacie Chambers, Jenny Dalton-Hill and many more in the three-homers-in-a-game club.

- » Her 24 home runs in the 2022 season is tied for 12th place in Arizona history for single-season home runs.

SMOOTH JAZ

- » Junior Jasmine Perezchica picked up right where she left off, batting .529 through the first two weeks of the season.
- » She led Arizona with a .750 batting average after going 9-for-12 and scoring 11 runs during opening weekend.
- » She has an on-base percentage of .619 to lead the team.
- » Perezchica earned third-team NFCA All-West and third-team All-Pac-12 honors for her steady work at the plate and on the field.
- » She hit two doubles and one triple, with 13 RBI in 2022.
- » Perezchica had a career high on-base streak of 24 games that lasted from the first game of the season on February 10-March 19.

SCUP, THERE IT IS

- » Junior Carlie Scupin is batting .355 through the first two weeks of 2023. She has hit four home runs and has driven in a conference-leading 17 RBI.
- » After the second week, Scupin has a .774 slugging percentage to lead the team and rank second in the Pac-12.
- » She dominated the plate last season and finished second on the team in batting average [.369]. She had a slugging percentage of .765 to rank second on the team, seventh in the Pac-12, and 49th in the NCAA.
- » Scupin ranked third on the team with 19 home runs and second with 58 RBI - and ranked fifth in the conference in home runs and RBI in 2022.
- » She hit 14 doubles to lead the team and rank fourth in the Pac-12 last season.
- » Scupin's 19 home runs in 2022 tied for 29th in Arizona history for single season home runs.
- » Scupin eclipsed her home run total [9] for the 2021 season in the first five weeks of the 2022 season.

PACHO POWER

- » Fifth-year senior Izzy Pacho emerged as one of Arizona's power hitters in 2022 and she didn't miss a beat to open the 2023 season.
- » In her first at-bat of 2023, she hit a grand slam to help Arizona win its first game of the season.
- » She finished the season with 11 home runs to rank fourth on the team and 18th in the Pac-12.
- » Pacho ranked third on the team and ninth in the Pac-12 with 64 hits last season.
- » Pacho hit the game-winning home run in Arizona's first win over Mississippi State. Her solo bomb in the top of the eighth inning pushed Arizona past the Bulldogs to take the 1-0 lead in the Starkville Super Regional.
- » She ranked second on the team with 13 doubles in 2022. Pacho also had a triple and drove in 37 runs with 112 total bases.

NOTHIN' BUT NETZ

- » Junior pitcher Devyn Netz is leading Arizona with a 4-2 record and a 1.79 ERA through 27.1 innings pitched.
- » She threw a complete-game gem in Arizona's upset over then-No. 8 Virginia Tech, striking out a season high six batters and allowing only two runs - one earned and one unearned.
- » Netz had a breakout postseason run in 2022. She had a 1.22 ERA and only allowed four runs across 23.0 innings during Arizona's run to the WCWS.

- » In 2022, Netz led Arizona in ERA [3.45], wins [15], saves [3], and batting average against [.246].
- » Netz's older brother Dawson is also a student-athlete at Arizona. Dawson is a pitcher on Arizona's baseball team.

WILDCATS RAKE IN PRESEASON AWARDS

- » **USA Softball Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List:** First baseman Carlie Scupin was named to the USA Softball Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List for the first time in her career.
- » **Preseason All-Pac-12:** Allie Skaggs and Carlie Scupin were named to the first-ever preseason All-Pac-12 team.
- » **Softball America Preseason All-American:** Two Wildcats were tabbed Preseason All-Americans by Softball America. Allie Skaggs was named first team (UTL) and Carlie Scupin was named second team (1B).
- » **D1 Softball Preseason All-American:** Allie Skaggs was tabbed as a second team Preseason All-American at second base by D1 Softball.
- » **Softball America Preseason College Top 100:** Arizona placed two Wildcats on the Softball America Preseason College Top 100 list.

THE LOWE ERA

- » Wildcat All-American, Olympian, and softball legend Caitlin Lowe is in her second season as the head coach of Arizona Softball.
- » In her first year, she led Arizona to its third-straight Women's College World Series. She is the first head coach to lead their team to the WCWS in their first year as head coach and the only female to lead their team to the WCWS in their first-year.
- » In Arizona's first game of the 2022 season, the Wildcats beat Southern Utah 22-1 which was the largest opening day victory in program history.
- » Following an 0-8 start to Pac-12 play, Lowe and the Wildcats turned it around after winning the final game of the Washington series to finish the regular season 14-8 and 6-2 in the postseason.
- » She picked up her first conference series win over then-No. 17 Oregon after going 2-1 on the weekend. The Wildcats won the first game of the series 11-8 and won the final game 12-4 in five innings.
- » Lowe won her first WCWS game as a head coach when Arizona beat Oregon State in Friday's elimination game.
- » Lowe has been on the coaching staff at her alma mater since 2014, learning under former head coach Mike Candrea. During her time on staff, the Wildcats have been to eight super regionals and advanced to the WCWS three times.

» The two-time national champion, four-time All-American, and Hall-of-Famer is set to lead the Wildcats into the new era.

MOWATT MAGIC

» Wildcat All-American Taryne Mowatt returned to her alma mater to be the pitching coach in the fall of 2017 prior to the 2018 season and has had an immeasurable impact on UA's pitchers in her three-plus seasons in Tucson.

» In her five full seasons as pitching coach, UA has put up ERAs of 1.94 [2018], 1.59 [2019], 1.73 [2020], 2.22 [2021], and 3.70 [2022]. Prior to Mowatt's return, the last time UA had three straight sub-2.00 ERAs were Mowatt's last three seasons in the circle [2006-2008].

HOME RUN U

» Arizona's historical dominance in the sport of softball extends to many facets of the game, but no stat has been dominated by any team much like the Wildcats have owned the long ball.

» The Wildcats have hit 2,426 home runs since softball became a Division I sport in 1982, by far the most of any team in NCAA history.

» The Wildcats have hit at least 100 home runs seven times in school history. Only one other school in the country has more than three 100-plus home run seasons.

» Arizona had three former players three different Olympic rosters at the Tokyo Olympics. Catcher Dejah Mulipola competed for Team USA. Taylor McQuillin and Danielle O'Toole competed for Mexico.

TEAM USA

» Former Wildcat stars Dejah Mulipola and Alyssa Denham competed with the U.S. Women's National Team roster for the 2022 World Games in Birmingham, Alabama. The battery helped Team USA win the gold medal at the World Games.

THE CONFERENCE OF CHAMPIONS

» The Pac-12 was once again the premiere conference for softball in 2022, dominating the top 15 in the NFCA Top 25 all season long.

» The Pac-12 had three of the top eight teams in the final NFCA Top 25 and had four top-15 teams the majority of the season. The SEC had just two top-10 teams in the final NFCA Top 25, but received four of the top 11 seeds in the NCAA Tournament.

» The Pac-12 had one of the three finalists for USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, including the 2022 Pac-12 Player of the Year, Baylee Klingler.

» Five of the 12 players drafted in the first ever Athletes Unlimited Collegiate Draft in 2021 were from the Pac-12, including three from Arizona: Alyssa Denham, Jessie Harper and Dejah Mulipola.

» The Pac-12 had the only three active U.S. Olympians in last summer's Tokyo Olympic Games and has eight total current/former players on the roster.

» Historically, the Pac-12's dominance of NCAA Softball is staggering. The conference has won 24 NCAA Titles, by far the most in NCAA history. Both Arizona [8] and UCLA [12] have more titles individually than any other conference has total.

» The Pac-12 has produced 18 Honda Sport Award winners and more than 200 All-Americans.

» The conference has had two of the final four teams in the NCAA Tournament in three of the last five Women's College World Series.

Built in 1993, Rita Hillenbrand Memorial Stadium was the first of its kind and became the model that programs across the country emulated. For 26 seasons, the sport's original mecca stood as a historical setting to watch some of the best softball in the nation.

After just over a quarter century of dominance, the legendary stadium underwent a complete renovation from foul pole to foul pole, transforming the iconic venue into a state-of-the-art modern facility with modern amenities for fans and players alike.

The 2019 updates included brand new infield bleachers, including 100 additional seats, backed by a two-level, enclosed press box. Shade structure down both baselines and off the press box will provide cover from the Tucson sun for the majority of the infield seating.

For the players, widened dugouts with a restroom on both the home and visiting sides will improve the gameday experience. Also included in the renovations were new bullpens as well as a new outfield wall.

The 2019 renovations pair with the Lapan Family Center, Arizona's state-of-the-art team room and locker room erected in 2015, make Arizona's softball facility the standard, just as it was in year 1 in 1993.

Additional fan amenities include a renovated concourse, with a brand new entrance area and updated concession stands and restrooms. Pole-free netting will provide fans with improved sightlines from all infield seats.

Whether they come out to the tune of 3,541 for an exhibition pitting Team USA against Arizona, or for a Wildcats' regular-season game, the Arizona fans have proved themselves as some of the best in the country.

In 2017, the stadium's all-time attendance reached surpassed the 1,000,000 mark. The stadium opened in 1993 with 8,808 fans attending 12 home dates. Now, nearly three decades later, Hillenbrand has attracted over 50,000 fans in eight of the last nine seasons.

One reason for the stadium's appeal obviously is the Cats' typical home success. UA has played to a **813-114** record at home. That's 80 victories in every 100 games. In 2002, UCLA snapped a remarkable 70-game home field winning streak the Cats had built, which remains the national record.

That fan support underscores the attraction of UA softball and its home field, named in honor of the late Rita Hillenbrand, sister of the late Wildcat benefactor William G. Hillenbrand and his wife, Doby [Delores D.]. The couple financed the stadium

and initial landscaping project, and the Hillenbrand family has continued to contribute funds to support Arizona softball and Wildcat athletics.

The family has provided tremendous support for a number of UA athletic programs through gifts to develop and support the UA's aquatic center, the baseball stadium and Arizona's football program. Another focal point in daily Wildcat athletics is the John W. Hillenbrand Meeting Center, named in memory of Bill's late father. That facility gave the athletics department a main auditorium, a half dozen classrooms and meeting rooms, and various office spaces used for the athletics department's mentoring programs and its Commitment to Athletes' Total Success [C.A.T.S.] program.

The NCAA has found the facility to be a quality site for postseason play as well, with The University of Arizona playing host to NCAA Regionals in 26 of the stadium's 31 years of existence. National television networks have also found the Wildcats and the stadium to be attractive to their audiences for a number of broadcasts since the facility was built for the 1993 season, including 100s of nationally televised contests in the last 10 years. All games attract a solid contingent of fans, area television and print reporters.

Hillenbrand Stadium and its success in helping bring Division I collegiate softball into increased national focus made it a national model in the early 1990s for dynamic softball programs. As on-campus college softball facilities go, it had elite status for several years until it engendered considerable copying. Today, major universities around the country are putting their teams in facilities with style and substance.

But Hillenbrand maintains one special feature, which makes it second to none — the infield, outfield and foul territories provide a top playing surface. Tucson's climate and round-the-year maintenance keep the facility in game-ready condition more than 300 days per year. Aside from the .876 home winning percentage, Arizona and visiting teams alike enjoy the facility for its playing surface. In 2004 and again in 2008, the infield was rebuilt with new clay and soil composition.

The University of Arizona softball program moved into the facility for the 1993 season and went out and proved it was equal to the trappings by winning consecutive NCAA championships and leading the nation in attendance in 1994 and 1995. UA added another back-to-back NCAA title splurge in 1996 and 1997, a sixth title in 2001, and the most recent back-to-back championships in 2006 and 2007. The outfield wall is festooned with those and other championship banners. UA also has won 10 conference titles since moving into Hillenbrand Stadium. The Cats also led the nation in attendance for three years from 2000-2002. Arizona has led the conference in attendance 12 of the past 16 seasons.

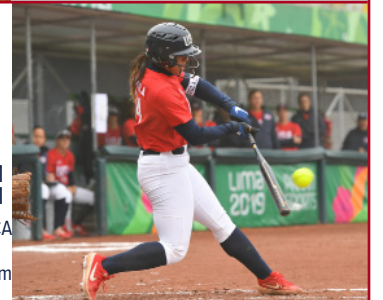

Caitlin Lowe wrapped up her first season as the head coach of the University of Arizona softball team at the 2022 Women's College World Series. Lowe returned to her alma mater in 2012 after a hall-of-fame professional career and a successful international career with USA Softball.

One of the best centerfielders and leadoff hitters in the sport's history, Lowe has become an even better coach, working with UA's outfielders and offense.

Since Lowe joined the coaching staff in 2014, Arizona has won 40 or more games in eight of the nine seasons, advancing to super regionals every year, including back-to-back-to-back trips to the Women's College Series in 2019, 2021, and 2022. She also helped guide the Wildcats to the Pac-12 Championship in 2017, the program's 12th conference title.

In her first year at the helm of Arizona Softball, Lowe guided the Wildcats to their third-consecutive WCWS appearance. She became the first head coach in their first year to lead their team to the WCWS since the tournament expanded past 16 teams in 1988, and the first female head coach to do so in WCWS history. Following an 0-8 start to Pac-12 play, Lowe coached Arizona to their 35th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance and 25th overall WCWS appearance.

In Lowe's first game as head coach, the No. 9 Wildcats beat Southern Utah 22-1 in five innings, the largest opening day victory in school history.

Lowe, whose specialty is her work with the UA short-gamers, has mentored two of the last three Pac-12 batting champions. Reyna Carranco earned the distinction in 2019 before Janelle Meoño won the award in 2021. Meoño, the 2021 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, became the first UA freshman to hit .400 in a season [.439] since Lowe did it herself in 2005 [.437].

In 2017, with her defensive expertise guiding the way, Arizona's three starting outfielders combined for one total error and had the best outfield fielding percentage [.994] in school history. That helped the Wildcats finish 52-9 and win their 11th conference championship. Lowe and the UA coaching staff was named NFCA Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2019, Arizona's outfielders combined to post a .968 fielding percentage with 10 outfield assists, led by first-team All-American centerfielder Alyssa Palomino-Caragoza, who did not commit an error in 71 defensive chances. Lowe also helped mentor Reyna Carranco to the Pac-12 batting title. The Wildcats went 48-14 and went to the Women's College World Series.

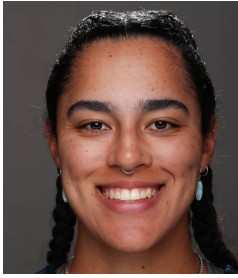
